NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (6-0) vs. MIAMI DOLPHINS (3-3) Thursday, Oct. 29, 2015 • Gillette Stadium (66,829) • 8:25 p.m. ET

The New England Patriots will play their second game in five days when they host AFC East rival Miami on Thursday Night Football. The Patriots will be playing in their second game on Thursday night in 2015. The Patriots kicked off the season as part of the NFL's Kickoff celebration as defending Super Bowl Champions and beat Pittsburgh, 28-21, on Sept. 10 at Gillette Stadium. It is the first time in team history that the Patriots will play in two Thursday games. Tom Brady is 8-0 all-time when starting on Thursday.

The Patriots improved to 6-0 with a 30-23 win last Sunday against the New York Jets and will look to start the year at 7-0 for the second time in team history and for the first time since 2007

Since 2001, the Patriots have the NFL's top divisional record with a 69-19 (.784) mark. Indianapolis is second with a 66-23 (.742) record.

The Patriots have scored 30 or more points in five straight games. The streak is the longest for the Patriots since 2011, when they had a streak of six such games.

BROADCAST INFORMATION

TELEVISION: This week's game will be broadcast by CBS/NFL Network and can be seen locally on WBZ-TV Channel 4 in Boston. Jim Nantz will handle play-by-play duties with Phil Simms as the color analyst. Tracy Wolfson will work the sidelines. The game will be produced by Lance Barrow and directed by Mike Arnold.

NATIONAL RADIO: This week's game will be broadcast to a national audience on Westwood One Radio. Ian Eagle and Boomer Esiason will call the game.

LOCAL RADIO: 98.5 FM, The Sports Hub, is the flagship station for the Patriots Radio Network. Play-by-play broadcaster Bob Socci will call the action along with former Patriots quarterback Scott Zolak, who will provide color analysis. Produced by Marc Cappello.

DIVISIONAL DOMINANCE

The New England Patriots own a 69-19 (.784) record in regular-season AFC East games since the beginning of the 2001 season, compiling the best intra-division record of any team in the NFL.



SERIES HISTORY



The New England Patriots and Miami Dolphins will square off for the 100th time, including three playoff games, in their 50th year as division foes and for the for the first of two meetings in 2015. The Patriots will travel to Miami to play at Sun Life Stadium in the final game of the regular season on Jan. 3, 2016.

Miami snapped the Patriots 10-game winning streak on on opening day in 2014 after overcoming a 20-10 halftime deficit to win 33-20 at SunLife Stadium on Sept. 7, 2014. The Patriots avenged that loss with a 41-13 victory over Miami in the second meeting, which was played at Gillette Stadium on Dec. 14, 2014.

The Patriots have had the upper hand at home against Miami, holding a 31-17 record in games played in New England in the regular-season, including an 11-2 record at Gillette Stadium. But the Patriots are only 15-34 all-time in Miami, including two postseason games. Miami beat the Patriots at Gillette Stadium for the first time in the final game of the 2005 season, 28-26, when Patriots starting QB Tom Brady was pulled out of action after the first quarter. Miami also beat the Patriots, 38-13, at Gillette Stadium, on Sept. 21, 2008.

The Dolphins and Patriots met for the first time in 1966 and began playing twice a year during the regular season in 1967, except in 1982 during the strike year. The Patriots swept the series nine times.

The two have played three times in the postseason with New England holding a 2-1 advantage.

Tom Brady owns an 18-8 record when playing against Miami. While he is 12-1 against Miami in home games, including wins in the last eight games, Brady is just 6-7 in games played in Miami.

★ Brady's only home loss to Miami was on Jan. 1, 2006 in the final game of the 2005 season when the Patriots had already locked up the AFC East title and Brady played in the first guarter before being relieved by backup Matt Cassel.

PASSING PERFORMANCES

Tom Brady is scheduled to start at quarterback against Miami for the 27th time and has compiled an 18-8 record in his previous 26 starts against the Dolphins. Brady is 63-16 in his career as a starter in the regular-season against AFC East opponents, with eight of the 16 losses coming to the Dolphins. One of those losses was in the final game of the 2005 season when Brady was pulled after the first quarter.

The Patriots got the ball back with 1:59 to play in the half and a 21-yard pass play from Brady to Edelman helped get the Patriots in position for a 45pass play from brady to Edelman helped get the Patriots in position for a 45-yard field goal by Gostkowski with six seconds to play for a 20-10 first-half lead. Miami scored on three straight third-quarter drives and limited the Patriots to just seven total plays to take a 23-20 lead. After taking the second half kickoff 66 yards and scoring on a field goal, the Dolphins forced and recovered a fumble on a 3-yard sack by Wake at the New England 34-yard line. Three plays later, Tannehill connected with Wallace on a 14-yard touchdown pass to tie the game at 20. the game at 20.

The New England Patriots clinched the AFC East for the sixth straight sea-son and for the 14th time in the 21-year tenure of Robert Kraft with a 41-13 victory over the visiting Miami Dolphins.

After taking a 14-13 lead into halftime, the Patriots scored 24 points in the third quarter by scoring on all four of their drives in that frame. It was the most third-quarter points in team history.

The game got off to an inauspicious start for the Patriots. On the game's first play from scrimmage, Miami QB Ryan Tannehill completed a 50-yard pass to WR Mike Wallace for a first down at the New England 30-yard line. The Patriots defense held forced Miami to attempt a 41-yard field goal, but LB Jamie Collins blocked the attempt and CB Kyle Arrington returned the ball 62 yards for a touchdown and a 7-Ò lead.

A QB Tom Brady interception helped position Miami for a 24-yard field goal later in the first quarter to make it 7-3.

Midway through the second quarter, S Duron Harmon picked off a Tannehill pass and returned it 60 yards to the Miami 8-yard line to set up a 3-yard touch-down run by RB Shane Vereen to make it 14-3. Miami responded by scoring on their next two drives with a field goal and a touchdown right before half to cut the lead to 14-13 heading into halftime.

The Patriots took complete charge of the game in the third quarter. On the first play of the second half, Brady hit TE Rob Gronkowski for a 34-yard gain to the Miami 45-yard line. The big play pushed Gronkowski over 1,000 yards for the season for his second career 1,000-yard campaign. Facing a third-and-11 from the Miami 20-yard line later in that series, Brady scrambled for a 17-yard gain and a first down at the 3-yard line. That set up a 3-yard touchdown run by RB LeGarrette Blount for a 21-13 lead.

After stopping the Dolphins on three straight plays, the Patriots moved to the 17-yard line where K Stephen Gostkowski drilled a 35-yard field goal for a 24-13 lead. Gostkowski's field goal pushed him past K Adam Vinatieri for the franchise lead in total points.

The Patriots then scored 10 points in 13 seconds to put the game out of reach. S Patriots Chung intercepted a Tannehill pass at the Miami 37 yard line and returned it 10 yards for a New England first down at the Miami 27-yard line. On the next play, Brady connected with Gronkowski on a 27-yard touchdown pass to make it 31-13.

Just over three minutes later, after another three-and-out by the Patriots defense, the Patriots took advantage of a 34-yard punt and a 13-yard return by WR Danny Amendola to start a drive at midfield. A 35-yard pass from Brady to Gronkowski helped the Patriots reach the 6-yard line. On the next play, Brady threw a 6-yard touchdown pass to WR Julian Edelman for a 38-13 lead heading into the fourth quarter.

Midway through the fourth quarter Gostkowski hit a 36-yard field goal to make it 41-13.

The Patriots defense has now gone four straight weeks without allowing a second half touchdown, including two straight weeks with no points in the second half.

Brady lost his second fumble on a sack by Wake on a fourth-down play from the New England 18-yard line with 3:10 to play, leading to a Miami field goal and a 33-20 lead.

The New England Patriots entered the fourth quarter down 17-16 and fell behind 20-16 at home against the New York Jets before scoring on their only two drives of the fourth quarter to take the lead and held on for a 30-23 victory to improve to a 6-0 record. It is the third time in team history and the first since 2007 that the Patriots have begun a season with a 6-0 record.

QB Tom Brady connected on 14-of-17 passes for 150 yards and two touchdowns in the fourth quarter to rally from the 20-16 deficit. Brady finished the game 34-of 54 for 355 yards and threw at least two touchdowns for the sixth time in 2015. Brady also scored on a 1-yard touchdown run on a fourth-andgoal from the 1-yard line in the second quarter.

TE Rob Gronkowski had a career-high 11 receptions for 108 yards, including a 15-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter that gave the Patriots a 30-20 lead with 1:13 left to play. WR Danny Amendola caught eight passes for 86 yards, including an 8-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter that gave New England a 23-20 lead.

After Gronkowski's touchdown made it 30-20, the Jets rallied in the final minute, moving to the New England 37-yard line where they kicked a 55-yard field goal on a first down play with 23 seconds to play to make it 30-23. The Jets recovered the onside kick attempt on the ensuing drive and moved to the 37-yard before a false start penalty forced a time run off to secure the Patriots victory.

The Patriots defense held Jets RB Chris lvory to just 41 yards on 17 attempts for a 2.4-yard average, after he entered the game as the NFL's leading rusher. The Jets defense entered the game first in the NFL and limited the Patriots to just nine rushing attempts for 16 yards for a 1.8-uard average.

DE Chandler Jones forced a fumble on a 2-yard sack of Jets QB Ryan Fitzpatrick on the game's second play, and LB Dont'a Hightower recovered at the Jets 19-yard line. That helped lead to a 38-yard field goal for a 3-0 lead. The Jets scored the game's next 10 points with a field goal on their next possession and then finished a 14-play, 83-yard drive with a touchdown for a 10-3 second quarter lead.

Brady tied the game at 10 midway through the second quarter with his 1-yard touchdown on a fourth-down sneak and then the Patriots took a 13-10 halftime lead when K Stephen Gostkowski connected on a 46-yard field goal with 2:05 left to play.

The Patriots opened the third quarter with a 65-yard drive that ended with a field goal for the first points given up by the Jets in the third quarter all season to make it 16-10. But, the Jets scored on the their next two drives to make it 20-16 early in the fourth quarter.



Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. Now in his 22nd season of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games [.238 pct.] and logging the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft



announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles [14], conference crowns [7] and Super Bowl championships [4] than any other NFL team. Super Bowl XLIX was the seventh Super Bowl appearance since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other team has earned more than four berths. In Kraft's 21 seasons, the Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 16 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons.

MILESTONE WIN FOR KRAFT

The victory over the New York Jets (12/21/14) was the 250th win under Robert Kraft. His 250 wins in his first 368 total games tied Chicago's George Halas for the fastest an owner has reached 250 victories.

CONTINUITY BREEDS SUCCESS

New England is the second team (1970s Pittsburgh Steelers) in NFL history – and first in 35 years – to win four Super Bowls with the same owner (Robert Kraft), head coach (Bill Belichick) and quarterback (Tom Brady).

KRAFT PRODUCES MORE WINS THAN EVERY OTHER PATRIOTS OWNER COMBINED

The Patriots have 259 wins overall under Robert Kraft. He has produced more victories than every other Patriots owner combined. Under Kraft, the Patriots are 259-119 overall since he purchased the team in 1994. Kraft's predecessors in the owner's office went 225-276-9 in the 34 years prior to his purchase of the team.



WILLIE MCGINEST



On Aug. 5, 2015, former Patriots linebacker Willie McGinest was inducted as the 24th member of the Patriots Hall of Fame. During his 12-year career in New England, the defensive cornerstone helped the Patriots to nine winning seasons, six division titles, four conference championships and three Super Bowl victories. A two-time Pro Bowler, McGinest is the NFL's all-time leader in postseasons sacks [16] and sacks in a single postseason game [4½ in 2005]. McGinest joined the Patriots as the first player drafted under the ownership of Chairman and CEO Robert Kraft, and together, they would quickly help transform the struggling 5-11 Patriots into a playoff-contending organization.

McGinest's strong work ethic and versatility made him a unique weapon for the Patriots defense. He possessed the size and strength to run like a defensive end and rack up sacks, but his quickness and athleticism allowed him to drop back into coverage. On top of his many accolades and impressive statistics, the fourth-overall pick of the 1994 NFL Draft brought heart and leadership to the Patriots defense.

PATRIOTS GAME DAY EXPERIENCE REMAINS A CUT ABOVE

Since the team played its inaugural regular-season game at Gillette Stadium against the Steelers in September 2002, the Patriots organization has continued to renovate and install new amenities to ensure that fan satisfaction remains at the forefront of the venue. In 2015, the Kraft family has made some of its most significant and innovative capital improvements to date, with the addition of three new facilities within the stadium: the Optum Field Lounge, the Cross Insurance Pavilion and Business Center and the DraftKings Fantasy Sports Zone, as well as a major expansion to the signature bridge and the addition of more in-bowl LED ribbon boards.

OPTUM FIELD LOUNGE

Offering a game day experience unlike any other, the Optum Field Lounge brings its members closer to the action than ever before with an on-field, outdoor patio and lounge located in the south end zone. Inside, members will enjoy an upscale, climate-controlled space featuring a 9-foot-by-32-foot high-resolution media wall, HD screens, premium food and bar service and private restrooms. On game days, Patriots season ticket members, who have also paid an Optum Field Lounge membership fee, can come and go between their seats and the venue throughout the game. Members can access the lounge beginning three hours prior to kickoff and stay one hour after the game. On non-game days, the space will be utilized for a variety of events, functions and parties, including dinner receptions and business meetings.



CARMAX BRIDGE

Since opening Gillette Stadium in 2002, the iconic bridge and lighthouse have stood to represent the home of the Patriots while paying homage to its deep New England roots. The newly expanded CarMax bridge is four times wider and gives fans plenty of room to gather on game days to hang out and watch the action while improving the concourse's foot traffic.



CROSS INSURANCE PAVILION

A first of its kind function facility, the Cross Insurance Pavilion & Business Center will be utilized on game days for exclusive pregame hospitality events 2 $1\!\!/_2$ hours prior to kickoff on Patriots game days. Then, 30 minutes prior to kickoff, the venue will transform into a gathering area open to all ticketed fans inside the stadium. On non-game days, the space and open floor plan will host a variety of functions, from trade shows, car displays and business meetings to proms, galas and din ner receptions. The new venue features a pre-function mezzanine area, outdoor terrace and access to the stadium's main concourse. Inside features 24-foot high ceilings, state-of-the-art audio visual capabilities with Bose sound system, a 24-foot video screen and LED HDTVs and classic furnishings with mahogany finish.



DRAFTKINGS FANTASY SPORTS ZONE

Among the most innovative amenities offered at the stadium is the DraftKings Fantasy Sports Zone located in the southwest corner of the main concourse. This high-tech sports bar offers excellent food choices, DraftKings beer selections of the day and an impressive array of nearly 40 HDTVs to capture all of the NFL and fantasy football action in real time. This venue will keep football and fantasy sports fans up to date with live fantasy scoring updates and the NFL RedZone. Additionally, when the weather is nice, the sports zone is open to the field. During inclement games, the glass front wall closes to keep the space warm and dry while still connecting fans to the action on the field. The Draft-Kings Fantasy Sports Zone is open to all ticketed patrons inside the stadium.



LED RIBBON BOARDS

Information is power! With the addition of more LED ribbon boards, Patriots fans will be the most powerful in the league. Fantasy information, scores from around the league and real-time stats are just some of the information to which fans will have access. Taking it to the next level, starting in 2015 fans will know things like who is the fastest player on the field at any given time and which players are lined up for the start of plays.

Since the beginning of 2003, the Patriots are 37-4 (.902) in regular-season games following a loss, including 10 straight wins following a defeat since 2012. The Patriots have dropped back-to-back regular season games just four times since 2003 (2006, 2009, 2011 and 2012). As a starter in his career, Tom Brady is 38-8 in games following a loss.

SECOND-HALF LOCKDOWN

SCORING FLURRY

The Patriots scored three touchdowns in a 57-second span during the final two minutes of the first half against Chicago on Oct. 26, 2014 to turn a 17-7 lead into a 38-7 cushion. It was the fastest three-touchdown flurry in the NFL since the Patriots had three touchdowns in 52 seconds against the New York Jets on Nov. 22. 2012. The Patriots are one of three teams to score three touchdowns in under a minute since the 1970 merger, and are the only team to have achieved the feat twice.

HOW THE PATRIOTS SCORED THREE TOUCHDOWNS IN 57 SECONDS:

Rob Gronkowski got the scoring started by hauling in a 2-yard touchdown pass from Tom Brady with 1:57 left in the first half to make the score 24-7 and cap off a 10-play, 80-yard drive.

After the Patriots defense forced a quick three-and-out, a 42-yard Julian Edelman punt return gave New England possession at the Chicago 9-yard line, and Brady found Brandon LaFell for a 9-yard touchdown on the next play to give the Patriots a 31-7 lead with 1:07 left in the first half.

On the Bears' first play following the LaFell touchdown, Zach Moore forced a Jay Cutler fumble that was recovered by Rob Ninkovich and returned for a 15yard touchdown and a 38-7 Patriots lead with 55 seconds left in the first half.

SCORING PACE

The Patriots have scored 213 total points so far in 2015, putting them on pace to finish with 568 points, which would be second in team history. The Patriots have scored 24 touchdowns so far in 2015, putting them on pace to finish with 64, which would be the fourth most in team history.

STEPHEN GOSTKOWSKI

Stephen Gostkowski led the NFL with 156 points. It was the third straight season that he has led the NFL in scoring (2012, 2013 and 2014). He also led the NFL in scoring in 2008. He joins Don Hutson (5) and Gino Cappelletti (5) as the only NFL players to lead the NFL in scoring in at least four seasons. Gostkowski made 94.6 percent of his field goals in 2014 (35-of-37), setting a new team record for field goal percentage in a single reason. The previous best was 93.9 by Adam Vinatieri (31-of-33) in 2004.

SIXTH STRAIGHT TITLE

The Patriots have won six straight AFC East titles, the longest streak in AFC East history. BY THE NUMBERS

2 Stephen Gostkowski executed a successful onside kick in a victory vs. Cleveland (12/8/13) for only the second time in team history. The first came when Jim Lee Hunt recovered a Gino Cappelletti kick at the end of the first half in a 26-10 win vs. the NY Jets (9/27/64).



3X COACH OF THE YEAR

The Associated Press named Bill Belichick the NFL's Coach of the Year in 2010, the third time that Belichick earned the honor. He was also named Coach of the Year following the 2003 and 2007 seasons, joining Don Shula (4-time winner) and Chuck Knox as the only three-time winners.

BELICHICK ADDED TO HIS RECORD IN 2014

Bill Belichick has coached the Patriots to 12 straight seasons with 10 or more wins after reaching his 10th win of the 2014 season at San Diego (12/7/14), adding to his NFL record streak. In 2011, Belichick became the first coach in NFL history with nine straight seasons with at least 10 victories. George Seifert has the second most consecutive 10-win seasons with eight from 1989-1996 for San Francisco.

DIVISION TITLES RECORD

Bill Belichick guided the Patriots to the AFC East title in 2014. His 12 division titles are the most by a head coach since the 1970 merger. Don Shula is second with 11 division titles since the merger.

FIRST WITH 14 WINS IN 4 SEASONS

Bill Belichick guided the Patriots to an NFL-best 14-2 record in 2010, becoming the first head coach ever to win at least 14 regular-season games in four separate seasons. Only four other coaches — San Francisco's George Seifert (3), Washington's Joe Gibbs (2), Chicago's Mike Ditka (2) and Miami's Don Shula (2) — have more than one 14-win season.

Super Bowl XLIX was Bill Belichick's ninth Super Bowl in his career, the most appearances by an NFL coach in history.








CAREER NOTES

BRADY BEATS EVERYBODY

Since the win vs. Denver on Nov. 2, 2014, no NFL team can claim a winning record against Tom Brady. Conversely, Peyton Manning has a losing record against five teams and Brett Favre had a losing record against seven teams in his career. Brady has a career .500 record against six teams and a winning regular-season record against the 25 teams.

He is undefeated against eight teams – Atlanta (4-0), Chicago (4-0), Dallas (4-0), Detroit (4-0), Jacksonville (5-0), Minnesota (4-0), Philadelphia (3-0) and Tampa Bay (3-0). Brady is most successful against Buffalo, with a 24-3 career record and the non-divisional team he has beaten the most is Indianapolis (9-3).

NO PLACE LIKE HOME

Tom Brady made his 100th career home start against Chicago on Oct. 26, 2014. The win over Chicago gave Brady an 87-13 home record in his first 100 home starts, the best in NFL history since the merger for a quarterback with at least 50 starts.


On April 20, 2011, just days before Texas Christian offensive line prospect Marcus Cannon was to enter the NFL Draft, he was diagnosed with non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, a treatable form of cancer found in lymph tissue. A little more than one week later, the Patriots selected Cannon in the fifth round (138th overall) of the draft with the knowledge of his illness. The Patriots placed Cannon on the Reserve/Non Football Injury list to start the 2011 season while he received treatment and recovered. Cannon was activated to the 53-man roster later that year and is now in his fifth season with the team. Cannon made a full recovery and was named the Patriots 2011 Ed Block Courage Award winner - an annual award presented to select players in the National Football League who are voted by their teammates as role models of inspiration, sportsmanship and courage.

FROM STANDOUT QB TO WR

Edelman began his college football career with a year at the College of San Mateo [Calif.] before transferring to Kent State where as a senior he completed 56 percent of his passes (153 of 275 passes for 1,820 yards) with 13 touchdowns. He was also the leading rusher, gaining 1,551 yards on 215 attempts (an average of 7.5 yards per carry) and scoring 13 touchdowns. His offensive numbers broke Kent State's single-season record for total offense set by Joshua Cribbs in 2003. Said head coach Bill Belichick on the versatility of Edelman: "He played the quarterback position in college at Kent State and all the positions really that he's played in the NFL – covering kicks, returning kicks, slot receiver, outside receiver, slot defender – he didn't do any of those things in college. I think that really speaks to his versatility and how much he's grown as a player and how many things he's learned how to do that he really didn't have much experience with in college. I'd say that's pretty unusual, especially to be as competent in them as he is."

EDELMAN TAKES HIS FATHER'S ADVICE

If there is one thing Julian Edelman has never lacked, it's athletic ability. A dual-threat quarterback at Kent State and former baseball standout in high school, Edelman once wowed Toronto Blue Jays players with his impressive footwork while fielding ground balls in an appearance at batting practice in 2011.

This natural ability may have been overlooked by NFL scouts, who let him fall to the Patriots in the seventh round of the 2009 NFL Draft. Edelman remains focused on the lessons his father, Frank Edelman, taught him at a young age. "I'm still constantly trying to learn," Edelman told *The Boston Herald.* "My dad always put it in my head, when you're green, you're growing, when you're ripe, you're lost. When you're done learning, you're done."



SLATER'S EMERGENCE WAS SPECIAL

Bill Belichick acknowledged Matthew Slater's role as a gunner on special teams: "Matt is one of the best in the league," Belichick said. "Any time the punt return team has to double somebody, that makes it one less guy they can use somewhere else in the return. He almost always draws two guys out there unless they're in an eight-man rush. Most of the time, there's two guys out there — fourth-and-short, where they're trying to protect the box — but he draws a lot of double teams, and deservedly so. He does an outstanding job of covering punts."

ELECTED TEAM LEADER

Patriots wide receiver Matthew Slater has been named to four straight Pro Bowls (2011-14) for his special teams work, but perhaps more revealing of his value to New England is the fact that he was elected a captain by his teammates for the fifth straight season in 2015.

The special teams ace was willing to share his advice on being a great captain with high school football players in a story published by *The Boston Globe*. "I think first and foremost, you have to be able to put others before yourself. Being a captain and leadership is about serving, and to me, that means a great deal of sacrifice – putting aside personal agendas for the greater common goal. Leadership is equated with sacrifice. I think you have to be willing to do whatever it takes for the unit to succeed. I think you need to lead by example. A lot of times, it's about what you do, not what you say."

SLATER ON BILL BELICHICK

"Guys have really bought into what we're trying to do here and believing in the goals that we've set to accomplish. We try not to acknowledge all the noise and hype surrounding ballgames. We prepare ourselves to have success by the way we work day-in and day-out on the field and in the meeting room, but it definitely starts with our leadership on this team."



RYAN WENDELL LEADS THE NFL IN PLAY SNAPS IN 2012

Ryan Wendell played a league-high 1,249 snaps in 2012 and it helped earn him a spot on the *USA Today* All-Joe team. Said Wendell: "I think first it says a lot about the organization, our training staff and our strength training coaches, that they do everything they can all season and all off-season and during the spring to keep us healthy throughout the whole season. I think it says more about them than it does about me individually."

JAMIE COLLINS' JOURNEY



The road to the NFL has been anything but easy for linebacker and 2013 second-round draft pick Jamie Collins. The youngest of five siblings growing up in Meadville, Miss., Collins lost both of his parents when he was six years old and was raised by one of his sisters, who was in her mid 20s.

Collins turned to football as an outlet to help him through the tough times. "It means a lot. It's my living." Collins told *The Boston Herald.* "It kept me on track." Collins' resiliency in dealing with adversity has made a lasting impact on fellow Mississippi native Stevan Ridley, who grew up 30

miles west of Meadville in Natchez, Miss., and got to know Collins through a family friend. "What I've known about him, he really has been a strong person," Ridley told the *Herald*. "Anybody that's gone through the things that he's gone through and can still find a way to be successful on the football field, you have to be mentally tough. That's what he's kind of done as a teammate here. He's come in here and accepted his role and did a pretty good job as a rookie."

COLLINS RECORDS FIRST INT

LB Jamie Collins intercepted a Kyle Orton pass in the win at Buffalo (10/12/14), marking his first regular-season interception. He had his second of the year at the Jets on Dec. 21, 2014. His first career pick came in the 2013 AFC Divisional Playoff vs. Indianapolis (1/11/14).

COLLINS SETS CAREER HIGH

LB Jamie Collins set a career high with 2 1/2 sacks in the win at Buffalo on Sept. 20, 2015. It was his second career multi-sack game. He registered his first NFL two-sack game with at San Diego (12/7/14).

TEAM LEADER

Collins had a standout second season in 2014. He led the team in total tackles (109), forced fumbles (4) and fumble recoveries (2), and tied for the team lead in interceptions (2).

COLLINS BLOCKS FIRST XP SINCE 2008

LB Jamie Collins blocked a fourth quarter extra point at Indianapolis (10/18/15). It was the Patriots first blocked extra point since Vince Wilfork blocked a PAT at Oakland on Dec. 14, 2008. It is Collins' second blocked kick. He blocked a field goal attempt vs. Miami on Dec. 14, 2014.





WEARING BRUSCHI'S JERSEY #54

As a first round draft pick, Dont'a Hightower is used to high expectations. Hightower went to training camp with jersey #45 but was switched to jersey #54 prior to the start of his rookie year in 2012. Former LB Tedy Bruschi wore #54 for 13 seasons.

Hightower understands the importance of the number and hopes to live up to its legacy. "I definitely feel honored to be able to wear this number," Hightower said. "I've read that Tedy didn't want it to be retired and he hoped another



linebacker would come in and be able to wear this number and be able to play as well. I feel honored. Tedy was a great player, and he means a lot to this organization. I'm definitely proud to be able to wear this number."

JONES ACHIEVES TRIFECTA

DL Chandler Jones blocked a second-quarter Minnesota [9/14/14] 48yard field goal attempt, recovered the loose ball and returned it 58 yards for a touchdown. It was the fifth blocked field goal returned for a touchdown in Patriots history and the first returned for a touchdown since S Patrick Chung blocked a field goal attempt that was returned 35 yards for a touchdown by DB Kyle Arrington at Miami on Oct. 4, 2010. It is the second field goal block by Jones. He blocked a 39-yard attempt vs. Miami on Oct. 27, 2013. It was Jones' second career touchdown. He recovered an errant shotgun snap squibbed into the end zone at Baltimore on Dec. 22, 2013.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Chandler Jones was named AFC Defensive Player of the Week for his performance in the Patriots' 30-7 victory at Minnesota on Sept. 14, 2014. It was the first time in Jones' career that he has received an AFC Player of the Week honor. He was named AFC Defensive Player of the Month for November last season and NFL Defensive Rookie of the Month in September 2012.

Jones blocked a 48-yard field goal attempt and returned it 58 yards for a touchdown to give New England a 24-7 halftime lead at Minnesota (9/14). He also finished the game with eight total tackles and his fifth career two-sack game.

JONES SNAPS A SELFIE

When training camp practice ends at Gillette Stadium, the first wave of players quickly head into the locker room to shower and recover from the tough workout, but Chandler Jones is almost never among them. He is autographing footballs, snapping selfies and chatting with as many fans as he can before he makes his way into the building to rest his body and escape the heat. The Super Bowl Champion defensive end enjoys engaging his fans because he remembers a time when he was the one cheering from a distance.

"I feel like it was just yesterday when I was one of those fans," Jones said to ESPN's Mike Reis. "I didn't have access to an NFL team, but I was the guy that was on Twitter that was like, 'Oh my God, he tweeted me' or 'He shouted me out.' I was that person. So for me to have an opportunity to do that to people, I try to do that whenever I can. You see fans out there, they're sitting in the rain, they're sitting in the heat, sweating, they're drenched, and they're just yelling your name the whole practice. The least I can do is go over there and say hi and take some selfies and sign a few things. I love it. It's great."



THIRD TEAM'S A CHARM

Chris Jones had an early introduction to failure in the NFL. Taken behind 37 other defensive linemen in the 2013 NFL Draft, the defensive tackle was cut by two teams over a span of just 11 days. After selecting him in the sixth round with the 198th overall pick, the Houston Texans cut Jones on Aug. 31. Jones signed with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers on Sept. 1, but lasted only 10 days, as the Buccaneers released him on Sept., 10. Rather than be deterred by these early disappointments, however, Jones maintained a positive outlook when he signed with the Patriots on Sept. 11, and it has paid off in a big way. Thrust into a starting role after key injuries to the defensive line, Jones finished his rookie season with six sacks.

Jones' sudden success may have come as a surprise to some, but not to Dave Clawson, Jones' college coach at Bowling Green. Jones was part of Clawson's first recruiting class and blossomed into an All-American and two-two time captain for the Falcons. "It's hard to talk about Chris without getting a little bit emotional," Clawson told the *The Boston Herald*, "because he was that special of a player and person in our program."

JONES SAVES THE DAY; EARNS AFC HONORS

Chris Jones blocked a 58-yard field goal attempt by the Jets on the final play of the game to preserve New England's 27-25 win (10/16/14). It was the first blocked field goal for the Patriots since Chandler Jones blocked a 48-yard try by Minnesota's Blair Walsh earlier this season. He was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance in the victory.





SURE TACKLER

Jerod Mayo had his fifth straight 100-tackle season and his second season with over 180 total tackles after finishing the 2012 season with 184 tackles, the fifth-highest single season tackle total in franchise history. Mayo registered at least 10 tackles in 10 games, including a season-high of 20 vs. the New York Jets (10/28/12).

DOUBLE TROUBLE: DB DEVIN McCOURTY

After being selected by the Patriots in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft, DB Devin McCourty became part of a select group in league history. McCourty's identical twin brother, Jason, is a cornerback with Tennessee, selected in the sixth round of the 2009 NFL Draft. The two are the 12th set of twins to play in the NFL. Devin redshirted for the 2005 season and therefore was a year behind his brother in eligibility. McCourty is the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 1998-2000. His twin brother, Wasswa, played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox. The McCourty twins are one of two active sets of twins playing in the NFL.

Ninkovich finished with a three-sack game for the first time in his career in the win at Buffalo (10/12/14), He has had two two-sack performances - vs. Miami (1/2/11) and at Carolina (11/18/13).

WHERE DID HE COME FROM?

Rob Ninkovich's journey to the Patriots was not easy. He entered the league as a fifth-round pick by the Saints in 2006 and was waived four times by New Orleans and Miami before landing in New England on Aug. 2, 2009. He spent the 2009 offseason trying to make the New Orleans team as a long snapper. Before coming to the Patriots, he had appeared in just eight games over three seasons. He doubled that total in his first year in New England, appearing in 15 games in 2009 and his role on the team has grown since, earning a starting role at linebacker in 2010 and 2011 before moving to a starting role on the defensive line in 2011.

CRAZY EIGHTS

Ninkovich raised his 2014 total to a team-high of 8.0 sacks in 2014. Ninkovich has had at least 8.0 sacks in three consecutive seasons (8.0 in 2012, 8.0 in 2013 and 8.0 in 2014), becoming the first Patriots player to have at least 8.0 sacks in three consecutive seasons since Pro Football Hall of Famer Andre Tippett achieved the feat from 1985-87 (1985, 16 1/2, 1986, 9 1/2 and 1987, 12 1/2).

NINKOVICH SCORED AS A TE IN COLLEGE

Ninkovich played some at tight end in college at Purdue and caught two touchdown passes with a 2-yard touchdown pass from Buffalo QB Kyle Orton and a 1-yard touchdown pass from former New York Giants and Indianapolis QB Curtis Painter.

DB LOGAN RYAN AND DB DURON HARMON

CLASSMATES REUNITE IN NEW ENGLAND

Defensive backs Logan Ryan and Duron Harmon are used to working together. Ryan and Harmon began their college football careers together as members of the same recruiting class at Rutgers University and developed a close friendship during their four years in Piscataway, N.J. As fate would have it, Ryan and Harmon would begin their NFL journeys together as well when the Patriots selected the two defensive backs just eight picks apart in the third round of the 2013 NFL Draft.

Reunited once again, the former Scarlet Knights are excited and eager to make their mark, just as they did at Rutgers. "We talked before the draft and said how good it would be to play on the same team again, and for it to happen again, it's exciting and it's a blessing," Harmon told *The Boston Globe.* "It's great [we're contributing], because at the end of the day you want to play, and to contribute to a team like this, it's fun."

RYAN'S FIRST PICK FOR SIX

Ryan returned his first NFL interception 79 yards for a touchdown N.Y. Jets on Oct. 20, 2013. RYAN RETURNS... TO SCHOOL

When Logan Ryan decided to leave Rutgers and enter the NFL Draft after his redshirt junior season in 2012, he made a promise to his parents that after his rookie year, he would return to school and earn his degree.

Ryan kept his promise and graduated in the spring of 2014 with a degree in labor relations and a minor in psychology.

"I committed to Rutgers, not only as a football player, but as a student, so I was going to make sure I finished that end too," Ryan told NJ.com.

"It's a big accomplishment in my life. I held my word to my parents and stuck with it and I'm fortunate. It took a lot of work, but I was able to go back and finish and walk in graduation."

FIRST NFL SACK RESULTS IN TURNOVER

Ryan forced a fumble on his first NFL sack vs. Miami (10/27/13), a week after returning his first career interception for a touchdown. Ryan strip-sacked Ryan Tannehill, forcing a fumble recovered by Rob Ninkovich that led in to a touchdown. The play marked the second time in as many weeks that a Ryan turnover led to Patriots points.



SHEARD ON MCGINEST

Jabaal Sheard may be a new face in the Patriots locker room, but he's certainly familiar with Patriots legend, Willie McGinest. Sheard, who is typically soft-spoken around the microphones, was very excited to express his admiration for McGinest following the veteran linebacker's induction to the Patriots Hall of Fame on August 5.

"That's a guy that I watch film on still to this day," Sheard said to the *Boston Globe.* "How he used to rush, how he'd attack, how he was relentless. It's amazing to be out here with him. The heart he had, that dog. He would get after the quarterback, get after the run. He was so into the team, whatever they asked him to do, he would do it."

It makes sense that Sheard would feel a connection to McGinest, given the players' similarities. Before coming to New England as a defensive lineman, Sheard played outside linebacker for Cleveland in Mike Pettine's hybrid 3-4 system. By adding Sheard to his roster, Bill Belichick brings flexibility and, hopefully some of that McGinest magic, back to the Patriots front seven.
