NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (11-2) vs. TENNESSEE TITANS (3-10) Sunday Dec. 20, 2015 • Gillette Stadium (66,829) • 1:00 p.m. ET

The New England Patriots' 27-6 victory over the Houston Texans clinched a playoff spot for the 17th time in the 22 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team and the New York Giants' victory over the Miami Dolphins on Monday night gave the Patriots the AFC East title. The Patriots have now won the AFC East for seven straight seasons, the longest streak in AFC East division history. The Patriots join the Los Angeles Rams (7, 1973-79) for the most consecutive division titles in NFL history. The Patriots have won 13 of the last 15 division crowns and it is the 15th division title under the ownership of Robert Kraft.

Bill Belichick now has thirteen 11-win seasons, including 12 with the Patriots, tying Don Shula for the most 11-win seasons by a head coach.

The Patriots can become the second NFL team to win 12 games in six straight seasons with a win this week. Indianapolis had seven straight 12-win seasons from 2003-09.

<u>NATIONAL RADIO</u>: This week's game will be broadcast to a national audience on **Westwood One Sports. John Sadak** and **Ross Tucker** will call the game.

LOCAL RADIO: 98.5 FM, The Sports Hub, is the flagship station for the **Patriots Radio Network**. Play-by-play broadcaster **Bob Socci** will call the action along with former Patriots quarterback **Scott Zolak**, who will provide color analysis. Produced by **Marc Cappello**.

PATS AIM FOR 12-WIN PLATEAU

The Patriots have won at least 12 games nine times in team history, including five straight seasons from 2010-14. A win vs. Tennessee would tie Denver for third-most since the NFL merger.

SERIES HISTOR



The New England Patriots and Tennessee Titans (formerly the Houston Oilers) will play for the 41st time since the two charter members of the American Football League began play in 1960. The Patriots and Oilers played twice each year from 1960-1969 in the AFL, and have played 20 times since the AFL-NFL merger in 1970. In those 20 post-merger games, the Patriots have a 13-7 record, including a 1-1 mark in playoff games.

New England leads the overall series, 23-16-1 and owns an 11-3 record against the Titans franchise since 1981.

The last time Tennessee traveled to New England came during the 2009 season when the Patriots beat Tennessee, 59-0, in a game played in the snow at Gillette Stadium on Oct. 18, 2009.

The last time the two teams played was on opening day of the 2012 season when the Patriots pulled away with a 34-13 victory on Sept. 9, 2012.

The Patriots and the Tennessee franchise met two times in the postseason. In 1978, The Houston Oilers beat New England 31-14 in an AFC Divisional matchup at Foxborough. The Patriots beat the Titans, 17-14, in a 2003 postseason game to advance to the AFC Championship game.

The New England Patriots extended their streak to nine straight opening-day wins with a 34-13 victory over the Tennessee Titans at LP Field.

The Patriots defense held the Titans to just 20 yards rushing on 16 attempts, including holding RB Chris Johnson to just four yards.

The Patriots 2012 draft was heavy on defense and the rewards were evident with the Patriots first three draft picks playing a role in two defensive turnovers. The first-round tandem of DE Chandler Jones and LB Dont'a Hightower played a key role in a second-quarter touchdown. Jones forced a fumble on a 6-yard sack of QB Jake Locker on a play from the Tennessee 7-yard line and Hightower recovered the loose ball and scored on a 6-yard return. On the first series in the second quarter, second-round pick DB Tavon Wilson intercepted a pass in the end zone that was tipped by CB Kyle Arrington.

Tom Brady completed 23-of-31 passes for 236 yards and two touchdowns, and RB Stevan Ridley rushed for 125 yards on 21 carries for a 6.0-yard average.

Tennessee took the opening kickoff and converted a key third down and a fourth-and-1 en route to a 12-play, 70-yard drive that ended with a 28-yard field goal.

Later in the first quarter, Brady got the Patriots on the board with a 23-yard touchdown pass to TE Aaron Hernandez for a 7-3 New England lead. Brady completed a 28-yard pass to TE Aaron Hernandez to get the Patriots into scoring position during that possession.

After taking a 14-3 lead in the second quarter on the Hightower fumble return, the Patriots next possession ended in a 2-yard touchdown pass from Brady to Gronkowski to culminate a 12-play, 67-yard drive to help put the Patriots in front, 21-3, at halftime.

The Titans scored their only touchdown of the day on their first possession of the second half. Locker completed passes of 35 and 16 yards before a 29-yard touchdown pass to WR Nate Washington to close the gap to 21-10.

A 15-yard run by Ridley later in the third quarter helped get the Patriots in position for his 1-yard touchdown run and a 28-10 New England lead heading into the final quarter.

After Tennessee added a 24-yard field goal, the Patriots added field goals of 25 yards and 31 yards by K Stephen Gostkowski on New England's final two offensive drives to secure the victory.

The New England Patriots clinched a playoff spot for the 23rd time in team history and for the 17th time in the 23 years that Robert Kraft has owned the team, with a 27-6 victory over the Houston Texans NRG Stadium in a Sunday Night Football game.

The Patriots defense held Houston to seven first downs, 189 total yards and registered six sacks and 10 quarterback hits. DL Jabaal Sheard had two strip sacks and one of his forced fumbles was recovered by rookie DL Malcom Brown at the Houston 7-yard line to help set up a touchdown. The Patriots defense held Houston to three first downs and 53 total yards in the second half.

Quarterback Tom Brady and TE Rob Gronkowski led the way on offense. Brady threw two first-half touchdowns and went over 4,000 passing yards for the fifth straight season and for the eighth time in his career. Gronkowski returned to action after missing one game with a knee injury. He finished the game with four receptions for 87 yards with one touchdown and went over the 1,000-yard mark for the third time in his career and reached double-digit touchdowns for the fifth time, the most among all NFL tight ends.

Brady completed a 45-yard pass to Gronkowski on the Patriots' first scoring drive to get to the Houston 7-yard line and set up a 2-yard touchdown pass to WR Keshawn Martin. The teams exchanged field goals on the next three series for a 10-6 New England lead in the second quarter. The Patriots got the ball with 2:45 left in the first half and executed a perfect two-minute drill, reaching the Houston 1-yard line where Brady connected with Gronkowski on a touchdown pass for a 17-6 halftime lead.

New England took the second half kickoff and marched into Houston territory to set up a 49-yard field goal by K Stephen Gostkowski to extend their lead to 20-6.

Houston failed to take advantage when they recovered a muffed punt by Martin at the New England 21-yard line. They reached the 15-yard line and attempted to convert a a fourth-and-4 that ended in an incomplete pass.

Sheard forced a fumble on a 7-yard sack of Houston QB Brian Hoyer early in the fourth quarter that was recovered by the Patriots at the Houston 7-yard line. Three plays later, RB James White punched it into the end zone for a 27-6 lead.



PATS CLINCH PLAYOFF BERTH

New England has now qualified for the playoffs 23 times in its 56-year history. The Patriots have earned 17 playoff berths in the 22 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, a dramatic contrast to the six total playoff berths the team earned in its first 34 years of existence.

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. Now in his 22nd season of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games [.238 pct.] and logging the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft

announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles (15), conference crowns (7) and Super Bowl championships (4) than any other NFL team. Super Bowl XLIX was the seventh Super Bowl appearance since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other team has earned more than four berths. In Kraft's 22 seasons, the Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 17 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons.

The Patriots have sold out 237 consecutive home games, including playoff and preseason games (dating back to the 1994 season opener).

MILESTONE WIN FOR KRAFT

The victory over the New York Jets (12/21/14) was the 250th win under Robert Kraft. His 250 wins in his first 368 total games tied Chicago's George Halas for the fastest an owner has reached 250 victories.

CONTINUITY BREEDS SUCCESS

New England is the second team (1970s Pittsburgh Steelers) in NFL history – and first in 35 years – to win four Super Bowls with the same owner (Robert Kraft), head coach (Bill Belichick) and quarterback (Tom Brady).

KRAFT PRODUCES MORE WINS THAN EVERY OTHER PATRIOTS OWNER COMBINED

The Patriots have 264 wins overall under Robert Kraft. He has produced more victories than every other Patriots owner combined. Under Kraft, the Patriots are 264-121 overall since he purchased the team in 1994. Kraft's predecessors in the owner's office went 225-276-9 in the 34 years prior to his purchase of the team.



In the Divisional Round of the 2003 NFL playoffs, the Tennessee Titans traveled to Foxborough to take on the Patriots in the freezing cold. Game time temperature was a bone-chilling 4 degrees, marking the coldest Patriots game ever played.


In one of the coldest games in NFL history, with temperatures reaching 4 degrees, the weather-tested Patriots outlasted the Titans to earn a ticket to the AFC Championship Game. The game's first score came on a 41-yard strike from Tom Brady to Bethel Johnson for a touchdown. The NFL's co-MVP Steve McNair struck back quickly, driving his team down the field to set up a 5-yard touchdown run by Chris Brown to tie the game. On the following drive, the Patriots marched down to the Titans 26-yard line, but no points were scored as Adam Vinatieri missed a 44-yard field goal attempt in the freezing cold. New England TENNESSEE TITANS recovered on the next play when safety Rodney Harrison intercepted a McNair pass. This time the Patriots capitalized with a 1-yard touchdown run by Antowain Smith to re-take the lead. The Titans tried to 284 strike one more time before the end of the half, but the Patriots special teams unit kept points off the board, blocking Gary Anderson's 31-yard field goal attempt. At the beginning of the third quarter, Tennessee successfully tied up the game with a 70-yard scoring drive capped off 18-26 by an 11-yard McNair touchdown pass to Derrick Mason. The teams spent the rest of the third quarter exchanging punts. Midway through the fourth quarter, the Patriots got the ball back with good field position on the Titans 40-yard line, thanks to a 10-yard punt return from Troy 4-20 Brown. They traveled just 13-yards down the field, but it was enough to set up a game-winning 46-yard Adam Vinatieri field goal with 4:02 remaining. With the Titans unable to answer, the Patriots punched 14 their ticket to the AFC Championship Game, en route to a Super Bowl victory.

STADIUM UPGRADES

PATRIOTS GAME DAY EXPERIENCE REMAINS A CUT ABOVE

Since the team played its inaugural regular-season game at Gillette Stadium against the Steelers in September 2002, the Patriots organization has continued to renovate and install new amenities to ensure that fan satisfaction remains at the forefront of the venue. In 2015, the Kraft family has made some of its most significant and innovative capital improvements to date, with the addition of three new facilities within the stadium: the Optum Field Lounge, the Cross Insurance Pavilion and Business Center and the DraftKings Fantasy Sports Zone, as well as a major expansion to the signature bridge and the addition of more in-bowl LED ribbon boards.

OPTUM FIELD LOUNGE

Offering a game day experience unlike any other, the Optum Field Lounge brings its members closer to the action than ever before with an on-field, outdoor patio and lounge located in the south end zone. Inside, members will enjoy an upscale, climate-controlled space featuring a 9-foot-by-32-foot high-resolution media wall, HD screens, premium food and bar service and private restrooms. On game days, Patriots season ticket members, who have also paid an Optum Field Lounge membership fee, can come and go between their seats and the venue throughout the game. Members can access the lounge beginning three hours prior to kickoff and stay one hour after the game. On non-game days, the space will be utilized for a variety of events, functions and parties, including dinner receptions and business meetings.



CARMAX BRIDGE

Since opening Gillette Stadium in 2002, the iconic bridge and lighthouse have stood to represent the home of the Patriots while paying homage to its deep New England roots. The newly expanded CarMax bridge is four times wider and gives fans plenty of room to gather on game days to hang out and watch the action while improving the concourse's foot traffic.



CROSS INSURANCE PAVILION

A first of its kind function facility, the Cross Insurance Pavilion & Business Center will be utilized on game days for exclusive pregame hospitality events 2 ½ hours prior to kickoff on Patriots game days. Then, 30 minutes prior to kickoff, the venue will transform into a gathering area open to all ticketed fans inside the stadium. On non-game days, the space and open floor plan will host a variety of functions, from trade shows, car displays and business meetings to proms, galas and din ner receptions. The new venue features a pre-function mezzanine area, outdoor terrace and access to the stadium's main concourse. Inside features 24-foot high ceilings, state-of-the-art audio visual capabilities with Bose sound system, a 24-foot video screen and LED HDTVs and classic furnishings with mahogany finish.



DRAFTKINGS FANTASY SPORTS ZONE

Among the most innovative amenities offered at the stadium is the DraftKings Fantasy Sports Zone located in the southwest corner of the main concourse. This high-tech sports bar offers excellent food choices, DraftKings beer selections of the day and an impressive array of nearly 40 HDTVs to capture all of the NFL and fantasy football action in real time. This venue will keep football and fantasy sports fans up to date with live fantasy scoring updates and the NFL RedZone. Additionally, when the weather is nice, the sports zone is open to the field. During inclement games, the glass front wall closes to keep the space warm and dry while still connecting fans to the action on the field. The Draft-Kings Fantasy Sports Zone is open to all ticketed patrons inside the stadium.



LED RIBBON BOARDS

Information is power! With the addition of more LED ribbon boards, Patriots fans will be the most powerful in the league. Fantasy information, scores from around the league and real-time stats are just some of the information to which fans will have access. Taking it to the next level, starting in 2015 fans will know things like who is the fastest player on the field at any given time and which players are lined up for the start of plays.





Said Amendola on wearing Brown's jersey #80: "I talked to (Troy Brown) a little bit before I came here. I told him he's one of the greatest ever, and it's an honor to wear No. 80. I'm going to try to represent it the best I can."

AMENDOLA GOES OVER 100 YARDS

WR Danny Amendola had his seventh 100-yard day and his fifth with the Patriots after finishing with 9 receptions for 117 yards vs. Buffalo[11/23/15]. It was his second of 2015 (105 at Indianapolis 10-18-15). He had three 100-yard days in 2013 during his first season with the Patriots.

FOOTBALL FAMILY TRADITION

Bolden's grandfather, Frank Pitts, played 10 years in the NFL (1965-74) as a receiver for Kansas City, Cleveland and Oakland. He was with Kansas City for two Super Bowls, losing Super Bowl I and winning Super Bowl IV. Said Bolden about his grandfather, "I remember being six years old, him popping in a highlight film of Super Bowl I and IV. I've seen that tape at least 500 times."

BOLDEN BLOCK PARTY

Brandon Bolden blocked his first NFL punt in the second quarter at San Diego (12/7/14) to give the Patriots a first down at the Chargers 25-yard line. It was the Patriots first blocked punt since Patrick Chung blocked a punt at Miami on Oct. 4, 2010.



OVERCOMING ADVERSITY

On April 20, 2011, just days before Texas Christian offensive line prospect Marcus Cannon was to enter the NFL Draft, he was diagnosed with non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, a treatable form of cancer found in lymph tissue. A little more than one week later, the Patriots selected Cannon in the fifth round (138th overall) of the draft with the knowledge of his illness. The Patriots placed Cannon on the Reserve/Non Football Injury list to start the 2011 season while he received treatment and recovered. Cannon was activated to the 53-man roster later that year and is now in his fifth season with the team. Cannon made a full recovery and was named the Patriots 2011 Ed Block Courage Award winner - an annual award presented to select players in the National Football League who are voted by their teammates as role models of inspiration, sportsmanship and courage.

FROM STANDOUT QB TO WR

Edelman began his college football career with a year at the College of San Mateo [Calif.] before transferring to Kent State where as a senior he completed 56 percent of his passes (153 of 275 passes for 1,820 yards) with 13 touchdowns. He was also the leading rusher, gaining 1,551 yards on 215 attempts (an average of 7.5 yards per carry) and scoring 13 touchdowns. His offensive numbers broke Kent State's single-season record for total offense set by Joshua Cribbs in 2003. Said head coach Bill Belichick on the versatility of Edelman: "He played the quarterback position in college at Kent State and all the positions really that he's played in the NFL – covering kicks, returning kicks, slot receiver, outside receiver, slot defender – he didn't do any of those things in college. I think that really speaks to his versatility and how much he's grown as a player and how many things he's learned how to do that he really didn't have much experience with in college. I'd say that's pretty unusual, especially to be as competent in them as he is."

EDELMAN TAKES HIS FATHER'S ADVICE

If there is one thing Julian Edelman has never lacked, it's athletic ability. A dual-threat quarterback at Kent State and former baseball standout in high school, Edelman once wowed Toronto Blue Jays players with his impressive footwork while fielding ground balls in an appearance at batting practice in 2011.

This natural ability may have been overlooked by NFL scouts, who let him fall to the Patriots in the seventh round of the 2009 NFL Draft. Edelman remains focused on the lessons his father, Frank Edelman, taught him at a young age. "I'm still constantly trying to learn," Edelman told *The Boston Herald*. "My dad always put it in my head, when you're green, you're growing, when you're ripe, you're lost. When you're done learning, you're done."





ELECTED TEAM LEADER

Patriots wide receiver Matthew Slater has been named to four straight Pro Bowls (2011-14) for his special teams work, but perhaps more revealing of his value to New England is the fact that he was elected a captain by his teammates for the fifth straight season in 2015.

The special teams ace was willing to share his advice on being a great captain with high school football players in a story published by *The Boston Globe.* "I think first and foremost, you have to be able to put others before yourself. Being a captain and leadership is about serving, and to me, that means a great deal of sacrifice – putting aside personal agendas for the greater common goal. Leadership is equated with sacrifice. I think you have to be willing to do whatever it takes for the unit to succeed. I think you need to lead by example. A lot of times, it's about what you do, not what you say."

SLATER'S EMERGENCE WAS SPECIAL

Bill Belichick acknowledged Matthew Slater's role as a gunner on special teams: "Matt is one of the best in the league," Belichick said. "Any time the punt return team has to double somebody, that makes it one less guy they can use somewhere else in the return. He almost always draws two guys out there unless they're in an eight-man rush. Most of the time, there's two guys out there — fourth-and-short, where they're trying to protect the box — but he draws a lot of double teams, and deservedly so. He does an outstanding job of covering punts."

SLATER ON BILL BELICHICK

"Guys have really bought into what we're trying to do here and believing in the goals that we've set to accomplish. We try not to acknowledge all the noise and hype surrounding ballgames. We prepare ourselves to have success by the way we work day-in and day-out on the field and in the meeting room, but it definitely starts with our leadership on this team."

JAMIE COLLINS' JOURNEY



The road to the NFL has been anything but easy for linebacker and 2013 second-round draft pick Jamie Collins. The youngest of five siblings growing up in Meadville, Miss., Collins lost both of his parents when he was six years old and was raised by one of his sisters, who was in her mid 20s.

Collins turned to football as an outlet to help him through the tough times. "It means a lot. It's my living." Collins told *The Boston Herald.* "It kept me on track." Collins' resiliency in dealing with adversity has made a lasting impact on fellow Mississippi native Stevan Ridley, who grew up 30

miles west of Meadville in Natchez, Miss., and got to know Collins through a family friend. "What I've known about him, he really has been a strong person," Ridley told the *Herald*. "Anybody that's gone through the things that he's gone through and can still find a way to be successful on the football field, you have to be mentally tough. That's what he's kind of done as a teammate here. He's come in here and accepted his role and did a pretty good job as a rookie."

COLLINS RECORDS FIRST INT

LB Jamie Collins intercepted a Kyle Orton pass in the win at Buffalo (10/12/14), marking his first regular-season interception. He had his second of the year at the Jets on Dec. 21, 2014. His first career pick came in the 2013 AFC Divisional Playoff vs. Indianapolis (1/11/14).

COLLINS SETS CAREER HIGH

LB Jamie Collins set a career high with 2 1/2 sacks in the win at Buffalo on Sept. 20, 2015. It was his second career multi-sack game. He registered his first NFL two-sack game with at San Diego (12/7/14).

TEAM LEADER

Collins had a standout second season in 2014. He led the team in total tackles (109), forced fumbles (4) and fumble recoveries (2), and tied for the team lead in interceptions (2).

COLLINS BLOCKS FIRST XP SINCE 2008

LB Jamie Collins blocked a fourth quarter extra point at Indianapolis (10/18/15). It was the Patriots first blocked extra point since Vince Wilfork blocked a PAT at Oakland on Dec. 14, 2008. It is Collins' second blocked kick. He blocked a field goal attempt vs. Miami on Dec. 14, 2014.





WEARING BRUSCHI'S JERSEY #54

As a first round draft pick, Dont'a Hightower is used to high expectations. Hightower went to training camp with jersey #45 but was switched to jersey #54 prior to the start of his rookie year in 2012. Former LB Tedy Bruschi wore #54 for 13 seasons.

Hightower understands the importance of the number and hopes to live up to its legacy. "I definitely feel honored to be able to wear this number," Hightower said. "I've read that Tedy didn't want it to be retired and he hoped another



linebacker would come in and be able to wear this number and be able to play as well. I feel honored. Tedy was a great player, and he means a lot to this organization. I'm definitely proud to be able to wear this number."

HIGHTOWER HAS A CAREER FIRST

LB Dont'a Hightower registered his first career two-sack game at Minnesota [09/14/14].

HIGHTOWER SETS CAREER HIGH

LB Dont'a Hightower registered a 9-yard sack of Green Bay QB Aaron Rodgers [11/30/14] in the second quarter to set a career high with 4½ sacks in 2014. He finished the year with six. His previous best was four sacks as a rookie in 2012.

JONES ACHIEVES TRIFECTA

DL Chandler Jones blocked a second-quarter Minnesota [9/14/14] 48yard field goal attempt, recovered the loose ball and returned it 58 yards for a touchdown. It was the fifth blocked field goal returned for a touchdown in Patriots history and the first returned for a touchdown since S Patrick Chung blocked a field goal attempt that was returned 35 yards for a touchdown by DB Kyle Arrington at Miami on Oct. 4, 2010. It is the second field goal block by Jones. He blocked a 39-yard attempt vs. Miami on Oct. 27, 2013. It was Jones' second career touchdown. He recovered an errant shotgun snap squibbed into the end zone at Baltimore on Dec. 22, 2013.

JONES SNAPS A SELFIE

When training camp practice ends at Gillette Stadium, the first wave of players quickly head into the locker room to shower and recover from the tough workout, but Chandler Jones is almost never among them. He is autographing footballs, snapping selfies and chatting with as many fans as he can before he makes his way into the building to rest his body and escape the heat. The Super Bowl Champion defensive end enjoys engaging his fans because he remembers a time when he was the one cheering from a distance.

"I feel like it was just yesterday when I was one of those fans," Jones said to ESPN's Mike Reis. "I didn't have access to an NFL team, but I was the guy that was on Twitter that was like, 'Oh my God, he tweeted me' or 'He shouted me out.' I was that person. So for me to have an opportunity to do that to people, I try to do that whenever I can. You see fans out there, they're sitting in the rain, they're sitting in the heat, sweating, they're drenched, and they're just yelling your name the whole practice. The least I can do is go over there and say hi and take some selfies and sign a few things. I love it. It's great."

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Chandler Jones was named AFC Defensive Player of the Week for his performance in the Patriots' 30-7 victory at Minnesota on Sept. 14, 2014. It was the first time in Jones' career that he has received an AFC Player of the Week honor. He was named AFC Defensive Player of the Month for November last season and NFL Defensive Rookie of the Month in September 2012.

Jones blocked a 48-yard field goal attempt and returned it 58 yards for a touchdown to give New England a 24-7 halftime lead at Minnesota (9/14). He also finished the game with eight total tackles and his fifth career two-sack game.

The last time the Patriots earned an AFC Defensive Player of the Week honor was Week 10 of the 2011 season when Andre Carter tied a team record with four sacks at N.Y. Jets (11/13/11).



SURE TACKLER

Jerod Mayo had his fifth straight 100-tackle season and his second season with over 180 total tackles after finishing the 2012 season with 184 tackles, the fifth-highest single season tackle total in franchise history. Mayo registered at least 10 tackles in 10 games, including a season-high of 20 vs. the New York Jets (10/28/12).

DB Devin McCourty returned a first quarter interception 60 yards to the Minnesota (09/14/14) 1-yard line to set up a Patriots touchdown. It is the longest interception return of his career. He had a 50-yard return as a rookie in 2010 at Detroit (11/25) on Thanksgiving Day.



DOUBLE TROUBLE: DB DEVIN McCOURTY

After being selected by the Patriots in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft, DB Devin McCourty became part of a select group in league history. McCourty's identical twin brother, Jason, is a cornerback with Tennessee, selected in the sixth round of the 2009 NFL Draft. The two are the 12th set of twins to play in the NFL. Devin redshirted for the 2005 season and therefore was a year behind his brother in eligibility. McCourty is the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 1998-2000. His twin brother, Wasswa, played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox. The McCourty twins are one of two active sets of twins playing in the NFL.

WHERE DID HE COME FROM?

Rob Ninkovich's journey to the Patriots was not easy. He entered the league as a fifth-round pick by the Saints in 2006 and was waived four times by New Orleans and Miami before landing in New England on Aug. 2, 2009. He spent the 2009 offseason trying to make the New Orleans team as a long snapper. Before coming to the Patriots, he had appeared in just eight games over three seasons. He doubled that total in his first year in New England, appearing in 15 games in 2009 and his role on the team has grown since, earning a starting role at linebacker in 2010 and 2011 before moving to a starting role on the defensive line in 2011.

CRAZY EIGHTS

Ninkovich raised his 2014 total to a team-high of eight sacks in 2014. Ninkovich has had at least eight sacks in three consecutive seasons (8.0 in 2012, eight in 2013 and eight in 2014), becoming the first Patriots player to have at least eight sacks in three consecutive seasons since Pro Football Hall of Famer Andre Tippett achieved the feat from 1985-87 (1985, 16½, 1986, 9½ and 1987, 12½).

NINKOVICH SCORED AS A TE IN COLLEGE

Ninkovich played some at tight end in college at Purdue and caught two touchdown passes with a 2-yard touchdown pass from Buffalo QB Kyle Orton and a 1-yard touchdown pass from former New York Giants and Indianapolis QB Curtis Painter.

DB LOGAN RYAN AND DB DURON HARMON

CLASSMATES REUNITE IN NEW ENGLAND

Defensive backs Logan Ryan and Duron Harmon are used to working together. Ryan and Harmon began their college football careers together as members of the same recruiting class at Rutgers University and developed a close friendship during their four years in Piscataway, N.J. As fate would have it, Ryan and Harmon would begin their NFL journeys together as well when the Patriots selected the two defensive backs just eight picks apart in the third round of the 2013 NFL Draft.

Reunited once again, the former Scarlet Knights are excited and eager to make their mark, just as they did at Rutgers. "We talked before the draft and said how good it would be to play on the same team again, and for it to happen again, it's exciting and it's a blessing," Harmon told *The Boston Globe.* "It's great [we're contributing], because at the end of the day you want to play, and to contribute to a team like this, it's fun."

RYAN RETURNS... TO SCHOOL

When Logan Ryan decided to leave Rutgers and enter the NFL Draft after his redshirt junior season in 2012, he made a promise to his parents that after his rookie year, he would return to school and earn his degree.

Ryan kept his promise and graduated in the spring of 2014 with a degree in labor relations and a minor in psychology.

"I committed to Rutgers, not only as a football player, but as a student, so I was going to make sure I finished that end too," Ryan told NJ.com.

"It's a big accomplishment in my life. I held my word to my parents and stuck with it and I'm fortunate. It took a lot of work, but I was able to go back and finish and walk in graduation."

RYAN'S FIRST PICK FOR SIX

Ryan returned his first NFL interception 79 yards for a touchdown N.Y. Jets on Oct. 20, 2013. The last Patriots player to return their first career interception for a touchdown was Kyle Arrington in 2010. SHEARD ON MCGINEST

Jabaal Sheard may be a new face in the Patriots locker room, but he's certainly familiar with Patriots legend, Willie McGinest. Sheard, who is typically soft-spoken around the microphones, was very excited to express his admiration for McGinest following the veteran linebacker's induction to the Patriots Hall of Fame on August 5.

"That's a guy that I watch film on still to this day," Sheard said to the *Boston Globe.* "How he used to rush, how he'd attack, how he was relentless. It's amazing to be out here with him. The heart he had, that dog. He would get after the quarterback, get after the run. He was so into the team, whatever they asked him to do, he would do it."

It makes sense that Sheard would feel a connection to McGinest, given the players' similarities. Before coming to New England as a defensive lineman, Sheard played outside linebacker for Cleveland in Mike Pettine's hybrid 3-4 system. By adding Sheard to his roster, Bill Belichick brings flexibility and, hopefully some of that McGinest magic, back to the Patriots front seven.



Gostkowski was 5-of-6 on 50 yard field goals in 2013, the most by a Patriots player in a single season. Gostkowski is 4-of-5 from 50 yards out so far in 2015. The NFL record for most successful 50-yard field goals in a season is 10 by Blair Walsh in 2012 with Minnesota.

AFC SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE MONTH

Gostkowski was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Month for September by the National Football League in 2015. It is the third time in his career that he has received the AFC Special Teams Player of the Month honor, Gostkowski was a perfect 7-of-7 on field goal attempts and 14-for-14 on extra points. He also finished the month of September first in the NFL with 35 total points and 18 touchbacks.

KICKING A CAREER HIGH

Stephen Gostkowski made five field goals vs. Cincinnati (10/5/14), setting a new career high for most field goals in a game. His previous career high was four field goals. Gostkowski's five field goals tie the second highest single-game total in Patriots history, trailing only Gino Cappelletti's six successful field goals on Oct. 4, 1964. The last time a Patriots player had five field goals in a game was on Nov.14, 2004, when Adam Vinatieri had five field goals vs. Buffalo.

TWO FROM 50-PLUS

Gostkowski drilled a 51-yard field goal and a 53-yarder vs. Arizona (9/16/12) and connected on two 53-yard field goals at Houston on (12/1/13). He is the first Patriots player to have two 50-yard field goals in the same game.

GOSTKOWSKI KICKS CAREER-LONG FG

Gostkowski connected on a career-long 57-yard field goal at Dallas on Oct. 11, 2015 to tie a franchise record. Adam Vinatieri kicked a 57-yarder at Chicago on Nov. 10, 2002. Gostkowski's previous long was a 54-yader vs. New Orleans (10/13/13).

 \star On the Bears' first play following the LaFell touchdown, Zach Moore forced a Jay Cutler fumble that was recovered by Rob Ninkovich and returned for a 15-yard touchdown and a 38-7 Patriots lead with 55 seconds left in the first half.

A COMEBACK FOR THE AGES

The Patriots came back from a 24-point deficit to defeat the Broncos, 34-31, in overtime in a Sunday Night Football matchup on Nov. 24, 2013, marking the largest comeback win in team history, after trailing 24-0 at halftime.

New England's previous best comeback win was from a 23-0 deficit to win, 38-23, vs. Seattle (9/16/84). The Patriots also came back from 22 points down to win at the New York Giants, 23-22 (12/21/96). The Patriots have come from 21 points down to win four times, most recently vs. Buffalo (1/1/12).


