#### NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (2-1) at KANSAS CITY CHIEFS (1-2) Monday, Sept. 29, 2014 • Arrowhead Stadium (79,451) • 8:30 p.m. ET

The New England Patriots went over the .500 mark last week with a 16-9 win against the Oakland Raiders in the 2014 home-opener. The win was Brady's 150th career regular-season victory as a starting quarterback and he joined Brett Favre (186) and Peyton Manning (169) as the only quarterbacks to accomplish the feat. Brady (49,781) needs 219 passing yards to become the sixth NFL player with 50,000 passing yards.

This week, the Patriots will play against the AFC West for the second straight week when they travel to face the Kansas City Chiefs at Arrowhead Stadium on Monday Night Football.

The Patriots will play the Chiefs for the second straight time on Monday Night Football. The last time the two teams played was on Monday night on Nov. 21, 2011 at Gillette Stadium with the Patriots taking a 34-3 victory. It will be the fourth time overall that the Patriots and Chiefs will play on Monday Night Football.

The Patriots will travel to Kansas City for the first time since 2005 when the Chiefs pulled out a 26-16 win on Nov. 27, 2005.

**NATIONAL RADIO:** This week's game will be broadcast to a national audience by **Westwood One Sports**. **Kevin Harlan** and **Kurt Warner** will call the game. **Laura Okmin** will provide sideline analysis.

**LOCAL RADIO:** 98.5 FM, The Sports Hub, is the flagship station for the **Patriots Radio Network**. Play-by-play broadcaster **Bob Socci** will call the action along with former Patriots quarterback **Scott Zolak**, who will provide color analysis.

### BRADY SHINES ON MONDAY NIGHT

Brady is tied with Steve Young for third place with 42 touchdown passes on Monday Night Football, behind Brett Favre (69) and Dan Marino (74). Young threw 42 touchdown passes in 25 Monday night games, while Brady has 42 touchdowns in just 18 games.

# ROBERT KRAFT

## News & Notes

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. Now in his 21st season of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.238 pct.) and logging the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994,



Kraft announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles (13), conference crowns (6) and Super Bowl championships (3) than any other NFL team. The Patriots have made six Super Bowl appearances since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other team has earned more than four berths. In Kraft's 20 seasons, the Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 15 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons.

## 219 GAME SELLOUT STREAK

In the early 1990's, the Patriots seemed destined for relocation until Robert Kraft's purchase of the team rejuvenated local interest. In 1991, the season ticket base was just 17,635, barely enough to support the club. Now, the season tickets are capped and more than 50,000 fans are on a season ticket waiting list. The Patriots have sold out 219 consecutive home games, including playoff and preseason games (dating back to the 1994 season opener).

## KRAFT PRODUCES MORE WINS THAN EVERY OTHER PATRIOTS OWNER COMBINED

# BILLY SULLIVAN THE FOOLISH CLUB LAMAR HUNT

THE FOOLISH CLUB

Patriots founder Billy Sullivan and Chiefs founder Lamar Hunt were close friends who spearheaded the expansion and development of pro football.

When Lamar Hunt was denied in his bid to acquire an NFL expansion franchise in 1959, he embarked on a "foolish" endeavor - attempting to organize an independent professional football league that would compete directly with the NFL. Hunt contacted several other businessmen and was able to get commitments from seven other investors across the country - Bud Adams Jr. (Houston), Harry Wismer (New York), Bob Howsam (Denver), Barron Hilton (Los Angeles), Ralph Wilson Jr. (Buffalo), F. Wayne Valley (Oakland) and Billy Sullivan (Boston) - to form the American Football League (AFL). The original eight called themselves "The Foolish Club" because it seemed imprudent to take on the wildly successful NFL when several challengers had already failed. But Hunt's vision and leadership helped set the AFL apart from previous leagues. He sought to grow and market the game by sending scouts to historically black colleges, putting names on the backs of jerseys and securing lucrative television contracts for the AFL, among other innovations. After moving his team to Kansas City in 1963, Hunt, along with Sullivan and the other owners, helped negotiate a merger between the AFL and NFL in 1966 that established the foundation for the modern NFL. Hunt even offered a name for the championship game to be played between the winners of the two leagues - the "Super Bowl."

### KIND WORDS

Sullivan presented Hunt at his Pro Football Hall of Fame induction in 1972, where both expressed their admiration and respect for one another (adjacent quotes). Later, following Sullivan's passing in 1998, Hunt was chosen to give one of the eulogies at his funeral.

### SERIES HISTORY



The Patriots and Chiefs will renew acquaintances for the 33rd time overall and for the second straight time on Monday Night Football. The last time the two teams played was on Monday night on Nov. 21, 2011 at Gillette Stadium with the Patriots taking a 34-3 victory.

The Patriots will travel to Kansas City for the first time since 2005 when the Chiefs pulled out a 26-16 win on Nov. 27, 2005.

Kansas City holds a 16-13-3 edge against New England, including a 10-3-1 advantage in games played in Kansas City and a 4-1 record at Arrowhead Stadium.

The New England Patriots beat the Kansas City Chiefs, 34-3, in a Monday Night Football game at Gillette Stadium. The victory improved the Patriots to a 7-3 record to give them a share for the best record in the AFC and a two-game lead in the AFC East.

Tom Brady threw two touchdown passes to TE Rob Gronkowski, CB Kyle Arrington intercepted two passes and WR Julian Edelman returned a punt 72 yards for a touchdown.

The Patriots got off to a slow start with three punts and a fumble in their first four series. But after falling behind 3-0 in the first quarter, Brady led the Patriots on two scoring drives to end the first half with a 10-3 lead.

Brady connected with Gronkowski on a 52-yard score when the tight end caught the ball over the middle and scrambled the final 30 yards down the sideline. Arrington, who tied the NFL with seven interceptions, picked off his first pass of the night on the ensuing drive and returned it 28 yards to midfield to help set up a 21-yard field goal by K Stephen Gostkowski for a 10-3 halftime lead.

The Patriots got the ball to start the second half and went 85 yards on nine plays before Brady connected with Gronkowski on a 19-yard touchdown pass for a 17-3 lead. It was Gronkowski's 10th touchdown catch of the season to pull within three of the single-season tight end record of 13 touchdown receptions held by Antonio Gates of San Diego and Vernon Davis of San Francisco.

The Patriots defense forced Kansas City to punt on the next series and Edelman got his second punt return touchdown of his career as the Patriots jumped to a 24-3 lead with 9:24 left in the third quarter on a 72-yard touchdown return.

Arrington picked off another pass on the following series and the Patriots converted the turnover into a 19-yard field goal for a 27-3 lead heading into the fourth quarter. The Patriots finished the scoring on rookie Shane Vereen's first NFL touchdown on a 4-yard run with 1:01 left.

### RETURN TO ARROWHEAD

The Patriots haven't played in Kansas City since 2005. The Patriots have played in every NFL city over that time span, with the exception of St. Louis as the Patriots were the away team vs. the Rams in London in 2012. The Patriots last visit to St. Louis was in 2004.

### PATRIOTS VS. CHIEFS ON MNF

This week's game will be the fourth time that the Patriots and Chiefs have played on Monday Night Football and their second straight meeting on Monday Night Football following a 34-3 Patriots in 2011 at Gillette stadium.

The New England Patriots needed a last minute defensive play to secure a 16-9 victory over the Oakland Raiders in the 2014 home-opener to improve to a 12-1 record in home openers at Gillette Stadium.

Defensive lineman Vince Wilfork intercepted a QB Derek Carr pass at the New England 10-yard line with 51 seconds to play to secure the win. The Raiders drove to the Patriots 6-yard line and had a game-tying touchdown run by RB Darren McFadden called back due to a holding penalty. On the next play, Wilfork recorded his third career interception and his second against the Raiders. DB Logan Ryan jarred the ball loose from the intended receiver WR Denarius Moore, allowing Wilfork to make the pick.

The Patriots reached the red zone four times in the game, but were held to just one touchdown. New England was held to field goals on two drives that ended at the Oakland 2-yard line. The Patriots defense held Oakland out of the end zone, limiting them to just three field goals.

Brady, who finished the game 24-of-37 for 234 yards with one touchdown, earned his 150th career win to become just the third NFL quarterback with at least 150 career wins, joining Brett Favre and Peyton Manning.

WR Julian Edelman led the team with 10 receptions for 84 yards, registering his fourth 10-reception game. He also extended his streak to nine games with at least six catches.

After Oakland took a 3-0 lead in the first quarter on a 49-yard field goal by K Sebastian Janikowski, New England scored 10 points in the last 4:14 of the second quarter to take a 10-3 halftime lead. QB Tom Brady engineered a 15-play, 84-yard drive that ended when he completed a 6-yard touchdown pass to TE Rob Gronkowski to take a 7-3 lead. After stopping the Raiders on three straight plays, the Patriots took advantage of a 22-yard punt and began a drive at the 50-yard line with 2:45 to play in the first half. A 16-yard pass from Brady to Gronkowski helped the Patriots on a drive that was stalled at the 2-yard line to set up a 21-yard field goal by K Stephen Gostkowski on the last play before the intermission.

Oakland scored field goals on their first two drives in the third quarter to close the gap to 10-9 heading into the final quarter.

Brady completed a 20-yard pass to TE Tim Wright and a 16-yard pass to WR Kenbrell Thompkins on a drive that ended with a field goal after failing to score a touchdown on a first-and-goal from the Raiders 2-yard line. The Patriots scored on their next drive with a 36-yard field goal for a 16-9 lead to close out the scoring.

### WELCOME HOME COOKIN'

With the win over Oakland, the Patriots improved to 12-1 in home openers since Gillette Stadium opened in 2002. The Patriots won their first 10 openers at Gillette before suffering their first loss, a 20-18 defeat to the Arizona Cardinals on Sept. 16, 2012. Overall, the Patriots are 30-25 home openers.

### EDELMAN GOOD FOR A HALF DOZEN

Julian Edelman has at least six receptions in his last nine regular-season games. He closed out the 2013 season with six straight games with at least six catches and extended his streak to nine with at least six receptions in the first three games in 2014. It is the longest streak in the NFL and the longest streak for the Patriots since Wes Welker put together a team record streak of 12 (2007-08), 11 (2008-09) and 10 (2012) such games.

Stephen Gostkowski was three-for-three on field goals against the Raiders and has made all eight of his attempts in 2014. His first four field goals were all from greater than 40 yards. He drilled a 47 and 45-yard field goal in the season-opener at Miami and connected on a 48-yarder in the first quarter and a 47-yarder in the third quarter at Minnesota. ### 3X COACH OF THE YEAR

The Associated Press named Bill Belichick the NFL's Coach of the Year in 2010, the third time that Belichick earned the honor. He was also named Coach of the Year following the 2003 and 2007 seasons, joining Don Shula (4-time winner) and Chuck Knox as the only three-time winners.

### BELICHICK ADDED TO HIS RECORD IN 2013

Bill Belichick has coached the Patriots to 11 straight seasons with 10 or more wins after reaching his 10th win of the 2013 season vs. Cleveland on Dec. 8, adding to his NFL record streak. In 2011, Belichick became the first coach in NFL history with nine straight seasons with at least 10 victories. 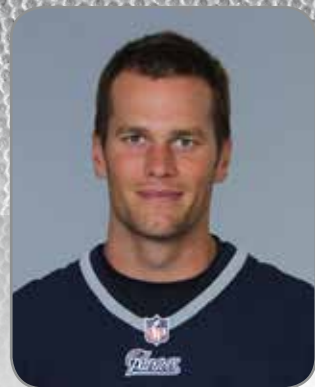

Previously, the longest kickoff return for a Patriots offensive lineman was a 27-yard return by G Stephen Neal vs. Pittsburgh (11/30/08). Connolly's previous best was a 16-yard return vs. Miami (11/8/09).

Edelman began his college football career with a year at the College of San Mateo (Calif.) before transferring to Kent State where as a senior he completed 56 percent of his passes (153 of 275 passes for 1,820 yards) with 13 touchdowns. He was also the leading rusher, gaining 1,551 yards on 215 attempts (an average of 7.5 yards per carry) and scoring 13 touchdowns. His offensive numbers broke Kent State's single-season record for total offense set by Joshua Cribbs in 2003. Said head coach Bill Belichick on the versatility of Edelman: "He played the quarterback position in college at Kent State and all the positions really that he's played in the NFL – covering kicks, returning kicks, slot receiver, outside receiver, slot defender – he didn't do any of those things in college. I think that really speaks to his versatility and how much he's grown as a player and how many things he's learned how to do that he really didn't have much experience with in college. I'd say that's pretty unusual, especially to be as competent in them as he is."

## EDELMAN TAKES HIS FATHER'S ADVICE

If there is one thing Julian Edelman has never lacked, it's athletic ability. A dual-threat quarterback at Kent State and former baseball standout in high school, Edelman once wowed Toronto Blue Jays players with his impressive footwork while fielding ground balls in an appearance at batting practice in 2011.

This natural ability may have been overlooked by NFL scouts, who let him fall to the Patriots in the seventh round of the 2009 NFL Draft. Edelman remains focused on the lessons his father, Frank Edelman, taught him at a young age. "I'm still constantly trying to learn," Edelman told the *Boston Herald*. "My dad always put it in my head, when you're green, you're growing, when you're ripe, you're lost. When you're done learning, you're done."

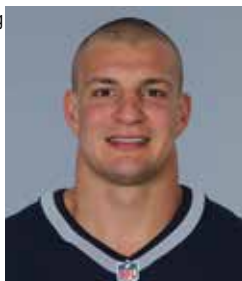

### SLATER'S EMERGENCE WAS SPECIAL

Bill Belichick acknowledged Matthew Slater's role as a gunner on special teams: "Matt is one of the best in the league," Belichick said. "Any time the punt return team has to double somebody, that makes it one less guy they can use somewhere else in the return. He almost always draws two guys out there unless they're in an eight-man rush. Most of the time, there's two guys out there – fourth-and-short, where they're trying to protect the box – but he draws a lot of double teams, and deservedly so. He does an outstanding job of covering punts."

### ELECTED TEAM LEADER

Patriots wide receiver Matthew Slater has been named to three straight Pro Bowls (2011-13) for his special teams work, but perhaps more revealing of his value to New England is the fact that he has been elected a captain by his teammates for the fourth straight season in 2014.

The special teams ace was willing to share his advice on being a great captain with high school football players in a story published by *The Boston Globe*. "I think first and foremost, you have to be able to put others before yourself. Being a captain and leadership is about serving, and to me, that means a great deal of sacrifice – putting aside personal agendas for the greater common goal. Leadership is equated with sacrifice. I think you have to be willing to do whatever it takes for the unit to succeed. I think you need to lead by example. A lot of times, it's about what you do, not what you say."

### SLATER ON BILL BELICHICK

"Guys have really bought into what we're trying to do here and believing in the goals that we've set to accomplish. We try not to acknowledge all the noise and hype surrounding ballgames. We prepare ourselves to have success by the way we work day-in and day-out on the field and in the meeting room, but it definitely starts with our leadership on this team."

## T NATE SOLDER

### 2011 FIRST ROUND PICK NATE SOLDER

It only took a day for Nate Solder to decide to change from his lifelong position of tight end to tackle after playing his freshman year at Colorado as a tight end. "My coaches came to me and said, 'You'd be an all right tight end, but you'd be an even better tackle,'" he told the *Boston Globe*. "I've always wanted to be great, so that's why I moved to tackle."

He added over 30 pounds after his redshirt freshman season and was named the team's starting left tackle. He played in 2,540 of 2,542 offensive plays over the next three seasons at Colorado and became an immediate contributor on the Patriots offensive line at right tackle as a rookie before moving to left tackle.

## WR KENBRELL THOMPKINS

### THOMPKINS' SPECIAL CONNECTION

Florida judge Dennis Murphy will never forget Kenbrell Thompson. This is especially true now, as Murphy keeps an autographed picture of Thompson on his desk from Thompson's playing days at El Camino Community College. The picture was a gift from Thompson, who has Murphy to thank for granting him special probation conditions after a drug charge in 2007 that allowed Thompson to leave his crime-riddled neighborhood in Miami, Fla. and attend El Camino. "I'm a firm believer in giving youth a chance to try and turn it around," Murphy told *The Boston Globe*.

After being arrested seven times between the ages of 15 and 18, Thompson excelled at El Camino and went on to play at the University of Cincinnati en route to fulfilling his NFL dream. Thompson earned his degree from Cincinnati in criminal justice.

## RB SHANE VEREEN

### VEREEN SETS TWO RECORDS IN ONE GAME

Shane Vereen had 12 receptions for 153 yards vs. Cleveland on Dec. 8, 2013, setting a single-game franchise record for most receptions and most receiving yards by a running back.

## RYAN WENDELL LEADS THE NFL IN PLAY SNAPS IN 2012

Ryan Wendell played a league-high 1,249 snaps in 2012 and it helped earn him a spot on the USA Today All-Joe team. Said Wendell: "I think first it says a lot about the organization, our training staff and our strength training coaches, that they do everything they can all season and all off-season and during the spring to keep us healthy throughout the whole season. I think it says more about them than it does about me individually."



## WHAT'S IN A NUMBER?

When Arrington was first making the transition from Hofstra to the NFL in 2008, he was assigned jersey No. 42. At that point in his career, he was cut by both the Eagles and Buccaneers. When Arrington first arrived in New England as a practice squad player in 2009, he initially donned No. 27. But when No. 24 became available, a result of Jonathan Wilhite leaving in free agency after the 2010 season, Arrington pounced on it.

The reason is that it reflects how he's flipped his NFL fortunes - from a No. 42 struggling to hang on to a No. 24 who has carved out a role on a winning team. Arrington moved from 24 to 25 in an agreement with Adrian Wilson in 2013 to accommodate the veteran's desire to keep the same jersey he had worn during his 12-year NFL career.



## JAMIE COLLINS' JOURNEY

The road to the NFL has been anything but easy for linebacker and 2013 second-round draft pick Jamie Collins. The youngest of five siblings growing up in Meadville, Miss., Collins lost both of his parents when he was six years old and was raised by one of his sisters, who was in her mid 20s.

Collins turned to football as an outlet to help him through the tough times. "It means a lot. It's my living," Collins told the *Boston Herald*. "It kept me on track." Collins' resiliency in dealing with adversity has made a lasting impact on fellow Mississippi native Stevan Ridley, who grew up 30 miles west of Meadville in Natchez, Miss., and got to know Collins through a family friend. "What I've known about him, he really has been a strong person," Ridley told the *Herald*. "Anybody that's gone through the thing that he's gone through and can still find a way to be successful on the football field, you have to be mentally tough. That's what he's kind of done as a teammate here. He's come in here and accepted his role and did a pretty good job as a rookie."



## WEARING BRUSCHI'S JERSEY #54

As a first round draft pick, Dont'a Hightower is used to high expectations. Hightower went to training camp with jersey #45 but was switched to jersey #54 prior to the start of his rookie year in 2012. Former LB Tedy Bruschi wore #54 for 13 seasons.

Hightower understands the importance of the number and hopes to live up to its legacy. "I definitely feel honored to be able to wear this number," Hightower said. "I've read that Tedy didn't want it to be retired and he hoped another linebacker would come in and be able to wear this number and be able to play as well. I feel honored. Tedy was a great player, and he means a lot to this organization. I'm definitely proud to be able to wear this number."



## FOLLOWING IN BROTHERS' FOOTSTEPS

Chandler Jones has two brothers, Arthur, a fifth-round NFL Draft selection by the Baltimore Ravens in 2010 (currently with the Indianapolis Colts), who was a Syracuse defensive tackle, and Jon "Bones" Jones, a UFC fighter and the reigning Lightweight Champion.

## DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Chandler Jones was named AFC Defensive Player of the Week for his performance in the Patriots' 30-7 victory at Minnesota on Sept. 14. It is the first time in Jones' career that he has received an AFC Player of the Week honor. He was named AFC Defensive Player of the Month for November last season and NFL Defensive Rookie of the Month in September 2012.

Jones blocked a 48-yard field goal attempt and returned it 58 yards for a touchdown to give New England a 24-7 halftime lead. He also finished the game with eight total tackles and his fifth career two-sack game.

The last time the Patriots earned an AFC Defensive Player of the Week honor was Week 10 of the 2011 season when Andre Carter tied a team record with four sacks at N.Y. Jets (11/13/11).

## JONES ACHIEVES TRIFECTA

DL Chandler Jones blocked a second-quarter Minnesota 48-yard field goal attempt, recovered the loose ball and returned it 58 yards for a touchdown. It is the fifth blocked field goal returned for a touchdown in Patriots history and the first returned for a touchdown since S Patrick Chung blocked a field goal attempt that was returned 35 yards for a touchdown by DB Kyle Arrington at Miami on Oct. 4, 2010. It is the second field goal block by Jones. He blocked a 39-yard attempt vs. Miami on Oct. 27, 2013. It is Jones' second career touchdown. He recovered an errant shotgun snap squibbed into the end zone at Baltimore on Dec. 22, 2013.



## THIRD TEAM'S A CHARM

Chris Jones had an early introduction to failure in the NFL. Taken behind 37 other defensive linemen in the 2013 NFL Draft, the defensive tackle was cut by two teams over a span of just 11 days. After selecting him in the sixth round with the 198th overall pick, the Houston Texans cut Jones on Aug. 31. Jones signed with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers on Sept. 1, but lasted only 10 days, as the Buccaneers released him on Sept. 10. Rather than be deterred by these early disappointments, however, Jones maintained a positive outlook when he signed with the Patriots on Sept. 11, and it has paid off in a big way. Thrust into a starting role after key injuries to the defensive line, Jones finished his rookie season with six sacks.

Jones' sudden success may have come as a surprise to some, but not to Dave Clawson, Jones' college coach at Bowling Green. Jones was part of Clawson's first recruiting class and blossomed into an All-American and two-time captain for the Falcons. "It's hard to talk about Chris without getting a little bit emotional," Clawson told the *The Boston Herald*, "because he was that special of a player and person in our program."



## MAYO A TACKLING MACHINE

Jerod Mayo had his fifth straight 100-tackle season and his second season with over 180 total tackles after finishing the 2012 season with 184 tackles, the fifth-highest single season tackle total in franchise history. Mayo registered at least 10 tackles in 10 games, including a season-high of 20 vs. the New York Jets (10/28/12). He matched his career-best with 10 games with 10 tackles.

## YOUNG LEADER

Jerod Mayo learned knowledge and discipline are the keys to success while spending afternoons with his three brothers under the supervision of their grandfather, Walter Johnson, a retired Air Force veteran of 30 years. While Mayo's mother worked two jobs, Johnson taught the boys discipline, responsibility and the value of life. Those lessons helped Mayo develop a work ethic and demeanor that has earned him the nickname of "Old Soul" from his teammates. His leadership skills and talent helped him become only the second Patriot to be named AFC Rookie of the Year, earning that title in 2008 to join Michael Haynes (1976).

## MAYO ON TEAM SUCCESS

Mayo, who serves as a defensive co-captain for New England, says the team's continued success is a result of the entire organization working towards one common goal.

"If you want to be a good football team, you'll never be stuck in rush-hour traffic," says Mayo. "You are the first one here and the last one to leave. I think guys really buy into that, guys that come from other teams, I think they follow the lead of the bulk of this team."

## DOUBLE TROUBLE: DB DEVIN McCOURTY

After being selected by the Patriots in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft, DB Devin McCourty became part of a select group in league history. McCourty's identical twin brother, Jason, is a cornerback with Tennessee, selected in the sixth round of the 2009 NFL Draft. The two are the 12th set of twins to play in the NFL. Devin redshirted for the 2005 season and therefore was a year behind his brother in eligibility. McCourty is the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 1998-2000. His twin brother, Wasswa, played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox. The McCourty twins are one of two active sets of twins playing in the NFL.

## A NOSE FOR THE FOOTBALL

## WHERE DID HE COME FROM?

Rob Ninkovich's journey to the Patriots was not easy. He entered the league as a fifth-round pick by the Saints in 2006 and was waived four times by New Orleans and Miami before landing in New England on Aug. 2, 2009. He spent the 2009 offseason trying to make the New Orleans team as a long snapper. Before coming to the Patriots, he had appeared in just eight games over three seasons. He doubled that total in his first year in New England, appearing in 15 games in 2009 and his role on the team has grown since, earning a starting role at linebacker in 2010 and 2011 before moving to a starting role on the defensive line in 2011.

## CRAZY EIGHTS

Ninkovich tied a career-high with eight sacks in 2013. He also had eight sacks in 2012. Ninkovich is the first Patriots player with back-to-back seasons with at least eight sacks since Willie McGinest in 1995 (11) and 1996 (9.5). He is the only player to accomplish the feat during Belichick's tenure as head coach in New England.

## NINKOVICH SCORED AS A TE IN COLLEGE

Ninkovich played some at tight end in college at Purdue and caught two touchdown passes with a 2-yard touchdown pass from Buffalo QB Kyle Orton and a 1-yard touchdown pass from former New York Giants and Indianapolis QB Curtis Painter.

Ryan strip-sacked Ryan Tannehill, forcing a fumble on a 10-yard sack that was recovered by Rob Ninkovich to give the Patriots possession at the Dolphins' 13-yard line in the third quarter. The play set up a 3-play, 13-yard drive that ended in Brandon Bolden's 2-yard touchdown run that tied the game at 17 in the third quarter. The play marked the second time in as many weeks that a Ryan turnover led to Patriots points. The previous week against the New York Jets, Ryan scored on a 79-yard interception return for a touchdown.



## JOE VELLANO IS ONE OF FOUR FATHER-SON DUOS TO BE NAMED ALL-AMERICANS AT THE SAME DIVISION I SCHOOL

Joe Vellano and his father, Paul, are one of only four father-son duos to be named All-Americans at the same Division I school. Solder started the first three games of the season at left tackle ... Started 15 regular season games and two playoff games at left tackle for New England in 2013 ... ## OL MARCUS CANNON
