SERIES INFORMATION

The Detroit Lions take on the New England Patriots on Sunday at Gillette Stadium with kickoff slated for 1:00 p.m. ET. The Lions will be looking to bounce back after falling to the Arizona Cardinals, 14-6 while the Patriots are eyeing their seventh straight win after knocking off the Indianapolis Colts, 42-20. Detroit and New England meet Sunday for only the 11th time in series history. The two teams faced off in their inaugural contest on September 26, 1971 as the Lions won, 34-7. In the teams' most recent meeting on November 25, 2010, the Patriots defeated the Lions, 45-24 in Detroit.

A TRIBUTE TO MR. FORD



William Clay Ford

(1925-2014)

Detroit Lions

Owner and Chairman, 1964-2014

Beginning Week 1 this season, the Detroit Lions introduced a special jersey patch displaying the letters “WCF” in honor of the franchise’s late owner, Mr. William Clay Ford. The patch will appear on the left shoulder of all Lions players’ jerseys for the 2014 season as a tribute to one of the NFL’s original statesmen.

Mr. Ford passed away on March 9 at the age of 88 and owned and directed the Lions franchise during a span of 50 years. Through five decades, his unwavering leadership provided stability to an organization, its fans and the community when most professional sports franchises cycled through numerous ownership changes and franchise moves. Mr. Ford remained steadfastly committed to ensuring the Lions were always a vital component to the Detroit community and the state of Michigan.

THE NFL REMEMBERS MR. FORD

NFL Commissioner Roger Goodell: “For five decades, Mr. Ford’s passion for the Lions, Detroit, and the NFL was the foundation of one of the NFL’s historic franchises. As an NFL owner, Mr. Ford helped bring the NFL through enormous periods of change and growth, always guided by his commitment to what was best for the NFL and his beloved Lions. All of us in the NFL extend our heartfelt sympathy to Mr. Ford’s wife Martha, Bill Ford, Jr. and the entire Ford family.”

Dallas Cowboys Owner Jerry Jones: “I’ve literally been at owners (meetings) when an owner came up and met Mr. Ford for the first time, and the owner was a new owner in the NFL. I was standing right with him and the owner talked about how his granddad had been a Ford dealer in Texas, in the depths of Texas, and he literally teared up when he talked about what Ford, what the brand and what the individuals stood for and had stood for in his evolving to the point that he could buy an NFL football team. He actually teared up and showed that kind of emotion, and that was (former Minnesota Vikings owner) Red McCombs.”

Late Buffalo Bills Owner Ralph Wilson, Jr.: “I was deeply saddened to hear of the passing of Bill Ford. He was a man of great integrity who loved his family and his Lions. Bill was well respected within our league as well as the city of Detroit and his contributions to both were numerous. We have all lost a good friend with his passing. My deepest sympathies and condolences go out to his family and many friends.”

Lions Hall of Fame TE and Assistant Director of Pro Personnel Charlie Sanders: “I’ve always just enjoyed being around him just to watch him laugh. He was a cheerful owner, you know, upbeat, always positive. I have a lot of memories, but when I think of him I just think of a man that was very fair and enjoyed people and enjoyed people that had the same desires that he had. Most of those are centered around the Detroit Lions organization.”

Former Lions WR Herman Moore: “Every single game that he was in the locker room, we at least spoke, or he would be in the locker room. I appreciated that from our owner. That’s a real moment that fans don’t know about — the commitment that he would show to us players.”



WELCOME, HEAD COACH JIM CALDWELL

As the Lions' new head coach, Jim Caldwell brings 37 years of coaching experience to Detroit, including 13 previous years in the NFL and 24 years on the college level. Two Super Bowl titles and three appearances in the NFL's championship game highlight his coaching resume, which includes leading the Indianapolis Colts to an AFC Championship and a berth in Super Bowl XLVI as head coach following the 2009 season.

COACHING OVERVIEW

- Hired as head coach for the Detroit Lions January 14, 2014.
- Coached in three Super Bowls with Indianapolis (XLI and XLIV) and Baltimore (XLVII) and won two Super Bowl titles (Indianapolis and Baltimore).
- In first year as head coach in Indianapolis (2009), he won the AFC Championship and led the franchise to Super Bowl XLIV. He became the first NFL coach to win his first 14 games and the fifth rookie head coach to reach the Super Bowl.
- One of four head coaches to produce 24+ regular-season wins and a Super Bowl berth in their first two career seasons as head coach.
- Holds a 26-22 (.542) regular-season record in three seasons as an NFL head coach, including two seasons with at least 10 wins.
- Led the Colts to two consecutive AFC South division titles in 2009 and 2010.
- In eight of the 10 seasons Caldwell coached in Indianapolis, the Colts ranked in the Top-10 in total offense eight times and six times in the Top-5.
- From 2003-09, Caldwell was the Colts quarterbacks coach and was also promoted to assistant head coach and associate head coach during that time. He worked closely with QB Peyton Manning and the team's quarterbacks. During that span, Indianapolis set NFL records with seven consecutive seasons finishing with 11+ wins (6, Dallas 1976-81) and 12+ victories (4, Dallas, 1992-95).
- Two of his quarterbacks, Manning (Super Bowl XLI) and Ravens QB Joe Flacco (Super Bowl XLVII) were named Super Bowl MVPs following their teams' respective championship runs.
- Led the Ravens offense to a 5-2 record after taking over as offensive coordinator late in the 2012 season as the team averaged 400.6 yards per game during that span.

ASSEMBLING HIS TEAM

In his first season in Detroit, Caldwell wasted no time putting together his coaching staff. Headlining that search were the additions of defensive coordinator **Teryl Austin** and offensive coordinator **Joe Lombardi**, each of whom have won a Super Bowl with Baltimore and New Orleans, respectively. Combined, six of the 10 new Lions assistant coaches have won a Super Bowl championship.

LIONS COACHES - FIRST NINE GAMES

- With a win in Week 10, Caldwell earned the most wins through nine games for a Lions head coach in his first season with the club since the team moved to Detroit in 1934. He surpassed the six wins through nine games garnered by Dutch Clark in 1937 (6-3), Gus Henderson in 1939 (6-3) and Buddy Parker in 1951 (6-2-1).
- Since the franchise originally started in Portsmouth (Ohio) in 1930, Caldwell's 7-2 record is second-best for a Lions head coach in his first year with the club behind Patsy Clark in 1931 (8-1) when the team was the Portsmouth Spartans.
- For Caldwell, this marks the third time in his four seasons as an NFL head coach that he won six or more games in the first nine games of the season (9-0, 2009; 6-3, 2010).

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

WIN THE QUARTER

Ten games through the season the Lions find themselves in another familiar situation: 1-1 in the quarter following a tough loss. In the two previous losses the Lions endured, the team was able to bounce back against their upcoming opponent and avoid losing back to back games for the first time under Head Coach **Jim Caldwell**. The message Caldwell sent to his players was one that preached a mantra of, 'Fix and forget.'

Caldwell on if the message to the players after the loss to Arizona is to have a short memory: "I think there's no question about it. There's nothing you can do about that game. We don't dwell on it, but we do look at where we are, we do go through the game and point out our mistakes with brutal honesty. We don't short-change it, we talk to them directly. You've got to get those things fixed, things that you can get fixed, you've got to get them fixed. You've got to get them fixed in a hurry otherwise you're going to see them again week after week."

With four out of the remaining six games on the Lions' schedule being between divisional opponents and one against the AFC-leading Patriots, the Lions understand that no game is bigger than the next. Caldwell's emphasis and belief in winning each quarter of the season has trickled down to the players and leaves an encouraging feeling within the locker room.

Caldwell on winning the season quarters: "The first game of the season we won, the second game of the season we lost. We were at 1-1 in the first quarter and the guys were able to bounce back. They had to bounce back against a very good football team in the first quarter, that was Green Bay. So, we're going to have to get ourselves in position to bounce back against a very good football team in New England."

CB Rashean Mathis on having most of the season left to play: "Exactly, at the end of the day this still counts as one, whether we won or lost it. Unfortunately we lost it today so it's just one loss. We still control our own destiny. We still have a lot of games ahead of us."

As Detroit sets its focus in on a trip to New England to face the Patriots this Sunday, the Lions will look to bounce back, led by their quarterback **Matthew Stafford**. Stafford addressed the need to start faster in upcoming games and acknowledged that it starts with Week 12 in Foxborough.

Stafford on bouncing back after the loss to Arizona: "It's one week, it's one game. We just have to find a way to get better. We'll come back, look at the tape and get ready for the next one. Win, lose or draw, that's our motto every week."



RESTOCKING ON OFFENSE

One of the many lessons learned by the Detroit Lions this season was how to win with some of the team's top performers out with injuries.

The Lions have not had the majority of their starting lineup on offense since Week 5 vs. Buffalo. However, over the past six weeks Detroit has seen new faces emerge as play makers, and now the challenge becomes implementing the regular starters back into the mix.

Offensively, the Lions have missed weapons such as top WR **Calvin Johnson** and the trio of tight ends including **Eric Ebron**, **Joseph Fauria** and **Brandon Pettigrew** for multiple weeks combined. But as the schedule hits mid-November, Detroit is finally getting their offensive pieces back, just in time for a run at the playoffs.

Caldwell on having four tight ends healthy: "It gives you more options. We've been in a situation the last few weeks where we've been a bit limited. Typically, you go in with three, sometimes with four depending upon your needs and who you're playing. It gives us some good options of guys."

During the team's four-game winning streak prior to Arizona, the Lions saw players such as WR **Golden Tate** and RB **Theo Riddick** step in to more prominent offensive roles. From Weeks 5 through 10, Tate caught 42 passes for 592 yards and three touchdowns, while Riddick made big plays on Detroit's final drives in comeback wins in Weeks 9 and 10.

However, in the team's most recent loss at Arizona, the Lions took a step backwards offensively and struggled to get the ball into the hands of their go-to guys. The loss against the Cardinals served as a reminder of how this team still needs to gel offensively, particularly when it matters most late in the season. However, Offensive Coordinator **Joe Lombardi** sees this as a very good problem to have.

Lombardi on how the offense changes now that the tight ends are starting to get healthy: "I think the receiving abilities that Eric (Ebron) and Joe (Fauria) have, getting them back opens up some things in the offense. Those guys have looked healthy this week so more players that can do some things."

The Lions have the next six weeks to build chemistry offensively, but the team will have to do it on the fly. The pieces are there according to Johnson, it's now just a matter of putting the right players in the right place and executing.

Johnson on what the offense needs to do better: "Really, it boils down to execution. Whether it's a penalty here, all of that's a part of execution and it's a broad term, I guess you could say, but that's really what it boils down to. Like I just said, when our defense is able to 14, we have to be able to put up some points and win those games."

STARTING AND STOPPING THE RUN GAME

Detroit's defense was as dominant as it has been all season against the Cardinals, despite allowing two early scores in the first quarter. Led by the defensive line, the defense allowed Arizona to rush for only 46 yards. By doing so, the Lions now have only allowed just 688 yards on the ground this season through 10 games, which is the lowest total by the club in the first 10 games of a season since at least 1940.

In a game where the Lions defense allowed very few rushing yards, the team also saw an emergence of their own rushing game. In Week 11 the Lions rushed for a season-high 98 yards with RB **Joique Bell** tallying 85 of those yards, as Bell seemed to hit his stride against a stout Cardinals defense.

Caldwell on why Bell was successful during the Arizona game: "I think the last couple of weeks he's been setting the tone. He's a reckless runner, he's got power, he's deceptively elusive, and I think he does a good job. He wants the ball in his hands and he's been able to make some great runs and make some tough catches when he's had to. He did a nice job on the screen so I think he's performing well."

Bell's 33-yard rush in the first quarter at Arizona (11/16) was the second-longest rush of his career, behind only his 67-yard rush vs. Indianapolis December 2, 2012. Bell's 33-yard rush was also the team's longest rush of the season and longest since RB **Reggie Bush**'s 39-yard run vs. Tampa Bay November 24, 2013. He recorded rushes of 33 and 21 yards against the Cardinals, marking the second time in his career he has registered two 20+-yard rushing attempts in his career (26, 22t vs. Houston 11/22/12).

Bell's tough running has elevated his teammates' play offensively, but when asked what was working for him against the Cardinals, Bell chose the humble response and focused rather on the larger focus of the offense.

Bell on what was working for him against the Cardinals: "Nothing. I don't know what the personal stats are, but I know we need to pick it up and start executing better. The defense played a major job. We started slow, the defense came back up and in the second half shut them out. Offensively we have to do something."

STAFFORD'S GAME-WINNING DRIVES

Throughout his career, Stafford has proven the ability to bring the team from behind to claim victory and perform great in the closing minutes of the game.

- Thus far, Stafford has led the Lions to 15 victories when trailing or tied in the fourth quarter or overtime. He has six career game-winning touchdown passes with less than one minute to play in fourth quarter (franchise record) and six after the two-minute warning.
- Down 16-13 with 3:13 left to play in Week 10 vs. Miami (11/9), Stafford led the team on an 11-play, 74-yard drive that was capped off with an 11-yard touchdown pass to RB Theo Riddick. Stafford escaped the pocket and threw against his body as Riddick grabbed the game-winning score in the left corner of the end zone.
- The Lions' comeback win over Atlanta in Week 8 (10/26) marked the second time in Stafford's career that he has led a fourth-quarter game-winning drive that ended on the scoring play as time expired at the end of regulation. The other occasion came on his first career game-winning drive as a rookie when he threw a one-yard pass to defeat the Cleveland Browns on November 22, 2009.
- Stafford threw a five-yard touchdown pass to WR Corey Fuller with 1:48 to play, setting up K Matt Prater's extra-point conversion in the Lions' 24-23 victory over the Saints in Week 7 (10/19). That was Stafford's sixth game-winning TD pass inside the two-minute warning of the fourth quarter, the most in NFL history in a player's first six seasons in the league. PASSING PRIDE - CAREER

Among Lions QBs, Stafford has passed his way into Lions lore by becoming the franchise leader in multiple categories.

CAREER YARDS

With 20,136 career passing yards, Stafford is the Lions' all-time leader in career yards and the only Lions QB to reach 20,000 career yards. With 362 in Week 11 at Pittsburgh last season (11/17/13), Stafford broke the previous record of 15,710 held by Layne, which has stood for 55 seasons (1958). Stafford achieved this record in only 55 career games. Layne reached 15,710 yards in 97 career games.

➤ On Stafford's 30-yard completion to WR Golden Tate in the second quarter at Arizona (11/16), he surpassed 20,000 career passing yards. By reaching 20,000 career passing yards in his 71st career game, he set a new NFL record reaching that mark in the fewest career games. (Courtesy Elias Sports Bureau). He broke the previous record set by Hall of Fame QB Dan Marino who accomplished this feat in 74 career games. Only two other players besides Stafford (71) and Marino (74) have reached 20,000 career yards in fewer than 80 games, including QB Kurt Warner (76) and QB Peyton Manning (78).

➤ Stafford threw for 280 yards in the team's 20-16 win over Miami (11/9), and charted 19,953 passing through his first 70 career games. He has totaled the most passing yards in NFL history through 70 career games, which includes 774 passing yards more than Dolphins Hall of Fame QB Dan Marino (19,179) who has the second-most through 70 games. Stafford was just 47 yards shy of becoming the first player in NFL history with 20,000 passing yards through his first 70 career games.

MEGATRON UNMATCHED

Eighth-year WR **Calvin Johnson** has produced some of the most prolific numbers among receivers in NFL history over the past three seasons and has continued to establish himself in 2014 as perhaps the best receiver in the League. Johnson has earned starting nods for the past four Pro Bowls and was named AP All-Pro in each of the past three seasons, including 2013.

- In true Megatron form, Johnson returned from injury in Week 10 vs. Miami (11/9) after missing three games and recorded seven receptions for 113 yards and one touchdown. Toward the end of the first quarter, Johnson and Stafford connected on a 49-yard touchdown pass as Johnson muscled his way past Miami CB Brent Grimes to bring it down.
- Johnson led all receivers in Week 2 at Carolina (9/14) with six receptions for 83 yards (13.8 avg). He reached 108-consecutive games with a reception, breaking WR Herman Moore's previous franchise record of 107 games.
- Johnson wasted no time flexing his muscles in the Lions' Monday Night win over the Giants in Week 1 (9/8) as he led all receivers with seven receptions for 164 yards and two touchdowns, including a 67-yard TD catch from QB Matthew Stafford on the opening drive of the game.

ALL-TIME RECEIVING

REACHING 10,000 CAREER YARDS

- Currently with 9,848 career receiving yards, Johnson needs only 152 yards to reach 10,000 yards and become the only player in Lions history to reach that mark.

- Johnson registered 83 yards at Carolina and pushed his career total to 9,575 yards, becoming the sixth player in NFL history to surpass 9,500 yards in his first eight seasons.
- With 9,848 career yards, he ranks fifth among receivers in their first eight seasons despite having played in at least 11 fewer games than the second-lowest tally (124, WR Larry Fitzgerald) among the top six receivers.

THROW IT TO JOE

An undrafted rookie in 2013, Fauria proved himself as a valuable weapon in the Lions' high-powered offense. With seven TDs in 2013, he set a franchise record for TD receptions by a rookie tight end and finished tied for sixth among all tight ends this season.

- Fauria caught one pass for 26 yards in Week 1 vs. the Giants (9/8), which marked the longest reception of his career. The pass was thrown five yards and he slashed through the defense for 21 yards after the catch.
- Fauria became the fourth tight end in team history in 2013 to record seven touchdown receptions in a season and the first Lions rookie since WR Roy Williams (8 in 2004) to catch seven in a season.

Lions fifth-year DT **Ndamukong Suh** continues to produce and disrupt opponent offenses. Suh finished the 2013 season ranking seventh among defensive tackles in combined sacks and tackles for loss on rushing plays with 11.5 and tied for sixth in tackles for loss with six.

- In the team's 20-16 win over Miami (11/9) and arguably his best game of the season so far, Suh garnered three tackles for loss, which marks the third time in his career he registered 3+ tackles for loss, including twice this season (3 at Min 10/12; 3 vs. Mia 11/9). Suh finished the game with four total tackles (three solo) and one sack (10 yards loss).
- With two sacks in Week 6 at Minnesota (10/12), Suh reached 30.5 career sacks and passed DT Shaun Rogers (29 sacks) for the most career sacks by a Lions defensive tackle. Suh accomplished this in 68 games, while Rogers completed his mark in 98 games with the Lions. His current total stands at 31.0 sacks (70 games).
- Since entering the League in 2010, Suh has the most combined sacks and TFLs on rushing plays by DTs with 58.5 (32.0 sacks, 26.5 TFLs). He also ranks first in sacks (32.0) and TFLs (26.5).

- Ansah was credited with six solo tackles, including a sack and two tackles for loss in the team's win over Miami (11/9). His six solo tackles set a new career high.
- Ansah led the Lions in Week 6 at Minnesota (10/12) with a career-high 2.5 sacks, five tackles and a career-high four tackles for loss. SERIES NOTES

➤ Detroit opened their series vs. the Patriots with a 34-7 victory on September 26, 1971 in Schaefer Stadium (renamed Foxboro Stadium). RB Steve Owens scored two touchdowns for the Lions, including a 74-yard touchdown catch from QB Greg Landry. The Lions also scored a defensive touchdown as LB Mike Lucci returned an interception 25 yards for a score.

➤ The fastest touchdown in Lions' history was scored against the Patriots. S Willie Clay (who later joined the Patriots as a free agent) recovered a New England fumble on the opening kickoff and returned it 15 yards for a touchdown only 11 seconds into the game on September 12, 1993.

➤ In the 1993 matchup, Detroit edged New England 19-16 in overtime. The win gave the Lions their first 2-0 start since 1985, and was clinched on Jason Hanson's fourth field goal of the game, a 38-yarder.

SUMMARY

The Detroit Lions opened their 2014 season at Ford Field against the New York Giants. QB Matthew Stafford and WR Calvin Johnson seemed to be in mid-season form as they connected on a 67-yard bomb to put the Lions up 7-0. Those two were just warming up because with 5:23 remaining in the first quarter Stafford, scrambling to his left and throwing back to his right, connected with Johnson for a 16-yard diving touchdown grab. That touchdown put the Lions up 14-0. The Giants wouldn't go away quietly, countering with their own score on a one-yard pass from QB Eli Manning to TE Larry Donnell. Detroit came out in the second half and extended their lead with two field goals by K Nate Freese, one of which was set up by a spectacular interception from Lions LB DeAndre Levy. With just under six minutes to go after a S Glover Quin interception, Stafford dazzled the crowd yet again with a five-yard scramble for the score to go up 27-7. The Giants responded with a score of their own with a one-yard run by RB Rashad Jennings to cut the lead to 27-14. Detroit would respond by putting together a 12-play drive that chewed up more than seven minutes on the clock and ended with a three-yard touchdown by RB Joique Bell. Up 33-14 the Lions decided to go for two points and converted on a Stafford pass to TE Joseph Fauria putting the game away. Lions LB DeAndre Levy led the team with 10 tackles and an interception.
