GAME SUMMARY

NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (10-3) vs. MIAMI DOLPHINS (7-6)

Sunday, Dec. 14, 2014 • Gillette Stadium (68,756) • 1:00 p.m. ET

The New England Patriots got back on the winning track with a 23-14 victory over the San Diego Chargers at Qualcomm Stadium to improve to a 10-3 record. The Patriots have now reached at least 10 regular-season wins for 12 consecutive years. Only the San Francisco 49ers (1983-1998) have a longer streak with 16 consecutive 10-win seasons.

A win or tie over Miami this week will give the Patriots their sixth straight AFC East Title and their 14th division crown since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994.

If the Patriots win the division, they will join the Los Angeles Rams (7; 1973-79), Pittsburgh Steelers (6; 1974-79) and the Minnesota Vikings (6; 1973-78) as the only teams since the merger with at least six straight division titles.

The Patriots dropped the season opener at Miami, 33-20, on Sept. 7. New England has not been swept in their season series with a divisional opponent since 2000, when they lost both games to Miami and to the New York Jets.

Since 2001, the Patriots are 65-18 (.783) against AFC East opponents, compiling the best intra-division record of any team in the NFL. The Patriots have won 16 straight home games against AFC East opponents and are now 32-5 against the AFC East at Gillette Stadium.

BROADCAST INFORMATION

TELEVISION: This week's game will be broadcast by CBS and can be seen locally on WBZ-TV Channel 4 in Boston. Ian Eagle will handle play-by-play duties with Dan Fouts as the color analyst. Jenny Dell will work from the sidelines. The game will be produced by Mark Wolff and directed by Bob Fishman.

NATIONAL RADIO: This week's game will be broadcast to a national audience on ESPN Radio. Marc Kestecher and Bill Polian will call the game. Ian Fitzsimmons will report from the sidelines.

LOCAL RADIO: 98.5 FM, The Sports Hub, is the flagship station for the Patriots Radio Network. Play-by-play broadcaster Bob Socci will call the action along with former Patriots quarterback Scott Zolak, who will provide color analysis.

PATRIOTS LOOK TO LOCK UP AFC EAST

With a win or tie this week, New England will earn its 14th AFC East title since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994 and 12th since Bill Belichick took over as head coach in 2000. Over the past 20 years, no other NFL team has won as many division crowns as the Patriots.

SERIES HISTORY



The New England Patriots and Miami Dolphins will square off for the 99th time, including three playoff games, in their 49th year as division foes and for the second of two meetings in 2014.

Miami snapped the Patriots 10-game winning streak on kickoff weekend after overcoming a 20-10 halftime deficit to win 33-20 at SunLife Stadium on Sept. 7, 2014.

The Patriots will attempt to avoid a series sweep by Miami for the first time since the 2000 season. The Patriots have not been swept in their season series with a division opponent since being swept by the Dolphins and the Jets in 2000.

The Patriots also enter this week's game with 16 straight home wins against AFC East opponents, second in NFL history to 18 by Green Bay (1994-98) and 17 by Buffalo (1988-92).

The teams split the annual series in 2013. The Patriots extended their streak to seven straight wins over Miami after a 27-17 victory at Gillette Stadium in the first meeting on Oct. 27, 2013 but dropped the rematch in Miami on Dec. 15, 2013 with a 24-20 loss.

The Dolphins and Patriots met for the first time in 1966 and began playing twice a year during the regular season in 1967, except in 1982 during the strike year. The Patriots swept the series nine times.

The Patriots have had the upper hand at home against Miami, holding a 30-17 record in games played in New England in the regular-season, including a 10-2 record at Gillette Stadium. But the Patriots are only 15-34 all-time in Miami, including two postseason games.

The two have played three times in the postseason with New England holding a 2-1 advantage.

★ Since Bill Belichick became Patriots head coach in 2000, New England is 18-11 (.621) against the Miami Dolphins.

★ Since 2000, the Patriots are 67-24 (.736) against AFC East opponents. The Patriots are 18-11 against the Dolphins over that span and are 20-9 against the New York Jets and 26-3 against the Buffalo Bills in that time. The Patriots were 3-1 against Indianapolis from 2000 through 2001 when they were in the AFC East.

★ The Patriots have not been swept in their season series with a divisional opponent since 2000, when they lost both games to Miami and also to the New York Jets.

★ Tom Brady owns a 17-8 record when playing against Miami. While he is 11-1 against Miami in home games, including wins in the last seven games, Brady is just 6-7 in games played in Miami.

★ Brady's only home loss to Miami was on Jan. 1, 2006 in the final game of the 2005 season when the Patriots had already locked up the AFC East Title and Brady played in the first quarter before being relieved by backup Matt Cassel.

PASSING PERFORMANCES

Tom Brady is scheduled to start at quarterback against Miami for the 26th time and has compiled a 17-8 record in his previous 25 starts against the Dolphins. Brady is 61-15 in his career as a starter in the regular-season against AFC East opponents, with eight of the 15 losses coming to the Dolphins. One of those losses was in the final game of the 2005 season when Brady was pulled after the first quarter.

The New England Patriots lost on kickoff weekend for the first time in 10 years after squandering a 20-10 halftime lead in a 33-20 loss at Miami.

The Miami Dolphins scored 23 unanswered points in the second half, forced two fumbles on sacks of QB Tom Brady by DE Cameron Wake to lead to 10 points, and limited the Patriots to just five first downs and 67 total yards. Miami outgained New England 222-67 in the second half. Brady was 19-of-29 for 187 yards in the first half, and he was limited to just 10 completions on 27 attempts for 62 yards in the second half, including 6-of-20 for 31 yards in the fourth quarter.

After scoring on four-of-six drives in the first half, the Patriots had just one of their six second half drives go longer than four plays. Miami initially jumped to a 7-0 lead after a bad snap led to a blocked punt on the game's opening drive, allowing the Dolphins to start a drive at the New England 15-yard line. Three plays later, QB Ryan Tannehill threw a 4-yard touchdown pass to RB Lamar Miller for a 7-0 lead.

New England responded with scoring drives on their next three series to take a 17-7 lead. Brady led the Patriots on a 13-play, 80-yard drive that ended with a 2-yard touchdown run by RB Shane Vereen to tie the game at seven.

The Patriots defense ended the next three Miami drives with forced turnovers, leading to 10 points. Following a short pass from Tannehill to WR Mike Wallace across the middle, LB Jamie Collins laid a hit that forced a fumble that was recovered by LB Jerod Mayo to give the Patriots a first down at the Miami 35-yard line. That drive stalled at the 29-yard line, where K Stephen Gostkowski drilled a 47-yard field goal for a 10-7 lead. Miami's ensuing drive ended when Tannehill was intercepted by CB Alfonzo Dennard at the New England 6-yard line on a deep pass. A 44-yard completion from Brady to WR Julian Edelman helped set up a 6-yard touchdown pass from Brady to TE Rob Gronkowski for a 17-7 lead.

Miami's next drive ended when DB Logan Ryan forced a fumble on a hit to RB Lamar Miller, allowing CB Darrelle Revis to recover at the Miami 47-yard line. The Patriots failed to take advantage of that turnover and were forced to punt.

A 15-yard roughing the passer penalty on the next series helped aid an 11-play, 55-yard Miami drive that ended in a field goal to close the gap to 17-10.

The Patriots got the ball back with 1:59 to play in the half and a 21-yard pass play from Brady to Edelman helped get the Patriots in position for a 45-yard field goal by Gostkowski with 6 seconds to play for a 20-10 first half lead. Miami scored on three straight third-quarter drives and limited the Patriots to just seven total plays to take a 23-20 lead. After taking the second half kickoff 66 yards and scoring on a field goal, the Dolphins forced and recovered a fumble on a 3-yard sack by Wake at the New England 34-yard line. Three plays later, Tannehill connected with Wallace on a 14-yard touchdown pass to tie the game at 20.

The Miami defense stopped the Patriots on three-straight plays and engineered a drive to the New England 3-yard line to set up a field goal and a 23-20 lead heading into the fourth quarter.

Miami RB Knowshon Moreno, who gained 134 yards on 24 carries for a 5.6-yard average, led a Dolphins rushing attack that gained 191 yards. He scored on a 4-yard run late fourth quarter to culminate a 12-play, 85-yard drive that pushed Miami to a 30-20 lead.

Brady lost his second fumble on a sack by Wake on a fourth-down play from the New England 18-yard line with 3:10 to play, leading to a Miami field goal and a 33-20 lead.

SEASON OPENER STREAK ENDS

The Patriots ended a 10-game winning streak on kickoff weekend. It was their first loss in the opener since a 31-0 loss at Buffalo on Sept. 7, 2003.

SNOWPLOW GAME

DEC. 12, 1982

Before the Pats-Dolphins game on Dec. 12, 1982, a nor'easter dumped so much snow on Schaefer Stadium in Foxborough that the Patriots offered \$10 and a free ticket to those willing to shovel out the seats. The inclement weather and field conditions led to a scoreless game through 3½ quarters. With just under five minutes to play, New England was in position for a 33-yard field-goal attempt, when head coach Ron Meyer motioned for snowplow operator Mark Henderson to go out and clear a spot for the kicker. Henderson, who was working his first game on work release for a burglary charge, hopped on a John Deere tractor and cleared the 20-yard line, veering left at midfield around the 23-yard line, where the hold and kick would be taken. Patriots K John Smith split the uprights, and New England held on for an improbable - and controversial - 3-0 win. Henderson's midfield maneuver drew the ire of Dolphins coaches and players, but in doing so, he also cemented his place in Patriots lore.

While the "Snowplow" game against Miami in 1982 and the "Tuck Rule" game against Oakland in the 2001 playoffs are certainly the most famous Patriot wins in the snow, New England has been historically great in wintry conditions.

In addition the two aforementioned wins, the Patriots are undefeated at home when it snows, compiling an 11-0 all-time record. Bill Belichick has also been unbeatable in the snow as Patriots head coach, as he is 12-0 all-time in snow games.

The New England Patriots clinched their 12th straight 10-win season for the second-longest streak in NFL history following a 23-14 victory over the San Diego Chargers at Qualcomm Stadium to improve to 10-3 for the season.

The Patriots spent the entire week in San Diego following a loss at Green Bay in the previous game and the work week turned out quite well for the Patriots, who overcame a 14-13 deficit heading into the final quarter with a 10-point fourth quarter.

The Patriots defense gave up just one touchdown and held the Chargers to just 13 first downs and only 216 total yards of offense. San Diego QB Philip Rivers was limited to just 189 yards. San Diego scored one of their touchdowns on a 53-yard fumble return following a reception by WR Brandon LaFell. The Patriots defense held San Diego scoreless in the second half.

Tom Brady continued his stellar play in the month of December, improving to a 46-7 (.868) December record, the best record in December among quarterbacks with at least 25 starts.

Brady completed 28-of-44 passes for 317 yards with two touchdown passes, a 14-yarder to TE Rob Gronkowski in the second quarter and a 69-yarder to WR Julian Edelman in the fourth quarter.

The game had many momentum shifts with fumbles returned for a touchdown, interceptions and a blocked punt.

After the Patriots took a 3-0 lead on a 22-yard field goal by K Stephen Gostkowski on their first drive of the game, San Diego scored 14 points in two minutes and 33 seconds to take a 14-3 lead. Rivers culminated an 11-play, 80-yard drive with a 15-yard touchdown pass to WR Malcom Floyd early in the second quarter. On the Patriots ensuing drive, Brady completed a pass to LaFell but S Jahleel Addae forced a fumble that was recovered by S Darrell Stuckey, who raced 53 yards for a touchdown and a 14-3 lead.

After Gostkowski drilled his second 22-yard field goal in the second quarter to make it 14-6, RB Brandon Bolden blocked a San Diego punt on the next series that gave the Patriots a first down at the San Diego 25-yard line. That helped set up a 14-yard touchdown pass from Brady to Gronkowski to close to within 14-13. It was Gronkowski's 10th touchdown of the 2014 season as he became the first NFL tight end with four seasons of 10 or more touchdown receptions.

New England got the ball back with 1:32 to play and moved to the San Diego 18-yard line with a chance to take a lead heading into halftime. However, Brady's pass intended to Gronkowski in the end zone was intercepted by the Chargers at the 4-yard line.

After a scoreless third quarter, the Patriots opened the fourth quarter by moving to the San Diego 20-yard line, where Gostkowski drilled a 38-yard field goal to give New England a 16-14 lead.

Midway through the fourth quarter, Brady hit Edelman on a short pass over the middle. Edelman broke a tackle and raced 69 yards for a touchdown. Edelman finished with eight receptions for 141 yards and one touchdown.



10 WINS FOR 12TH STRAIGHT YEAR

New England has reached at least 10 regular-season wins for the 12th consecutive season after the win against San Diego. The Patriots and the San Francisco 49ers (16) are the only teams to have at least 10 straight seasons with 10 or more wins.

ROBERT KRAFT

News & Notes

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. Now in his 21st season of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.238 pct.) and logging the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994,



Kraft announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles (13), conference crowns (6) and Super Bowl championships (3) than any other NFL team. The Patriots have made six Super Bowl appearances since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other team has earned more than four berths. In Kraft's 20 seasons, the Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 15 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons.

only loss during the Bill Belichick era came at Miami on Dec. 20, 2004, when Corey Dillon rushed for 121 yards on 26 carries and the Patriots lost to the Dolphins, 29-28. Since then, New England is 27-0 with a 100-yard rusher.

GROUND CONTROL

★ Bill Belichick (228) is in fifth place all time on the NFL wins list. He needs one more win to tie Curly Lambeau (229) for fourth place.

★ Brady (4,343) reached 4,000 passing yards in 2013 for the sixth time in his career. He joins Dan Marino (6), Brett Favre (6), Drew Brees (8) and Peyton Manning (13) as the only players to have at least five seasons with 4,000 passing yards. Brady has 3,560 passing yards so far in 2014 and is on pace to finish with 4,382 yards passing.

★ Brady (158) led the Patriots to his 150th career regular-season win, joining Brett Favre (186) and Peyton Manning (177) as the only NFL quarterbacks with at least 150 career wins as a starter.

★ Brady is one of eight NFL quarterbacks with 200 career starts. His 155 wins in his first 200 starts is the most in NFL history. Peyton Manning is second with 136 wins in his first 200 starts.

JULIAN EDELMAN

★ Julian Edelman finished with 105 receptions in 2013 to join Wes Welker (2007-09, 11-12) and Troy Brown (2001) as the only Patriots players to reach 100 receptions in a season. Edelman averaged 6.4 receptions per game in 2013. Edelman leads the team with 85 receptions and needs to average five receptions in the final three games for his second straight 100-catch season.

★ Edelman finished with 1,056 receiving yards in 2013 to become the 10th Patriots player to register a 1,000-yard season. He has 884 yards in 2014 and needs to average 39 yards in the final three games to reach 1000 yards.

★ Edelman returned a second quarter punt 84 yards for a touchdown vs. Denver Nov. 2 and now has a franchise-best four punt returns for a touchdown.

OFFENSIVE RESURGENCE

The Patriots entered Week 5 with a 2-2 record and the 29th-ranked offense in the NFL that was averaging only 20.0 points per game. Since then, New England has gone 8-1, jumped 23 spots to the sixth-ranked offense in the league and averaged 30.8 points per game over that stretch.

BOUNCE BACK PATS

Since the beginning of 2003, the Patriots are 37-4 (.902) in regular-season games following a loss, including 10 straight wins following a defeat since 2012. The Patriots have dropped back-to-back regular season games just four times since 2003 (2006, 2009, 2011 and 2012). As a starter in his career, Tom Brady is 38-8 in games following a loss.

PATS TAME LIONS TOP-RANKED DEFENSE

The Patriots scored 34 points against a Lions defense which entered the game allowing an NFL-low 15.6 points per game. PILING UP THE RECEIVING YARDS

Rob Gronkowski and Brandon LaFell each broke the 100-yard receiving mark in the win vs. Chicago (10/26). Peyton Manning on Bill Belichick

"Coach Belichick is the best coach that I've ever competed against. I think it's safe to say he'll go down as the greatest NFL coach of all-time. His teams are always well-coached, always well-disciplined, and you know it's going to be a 60-minute fight. To me, that speaks to his coaching."

ELITE COMPANY

Bill Belichick is one of nine NFL head coaches to win three or more championships since the league began postseason play in 1933, but the only one to win three in four years. 3X COACH OF THE YEAR

The Associated Press named Bill Belichick the NFL's Coach of the Year in 2010, the third time that Belichick earned the honor. He was also named Coach of the Year following the 2003 and 2007 seasons, joining Don Shula (4-time winner) and Chuck Knox as the only three-time winners.

BELICHICK ADDED TO HIS RECORD IN 2014

Bill Belichick has coached the Patriots to 12 straight seasons with 10 or more wins after reaching his 10th win of the 2014 season at San Diego (12/7/14), adding to his NFL record streak. In 2011, Belichick became the first coach in NFL history with nine straight seasons with at least 10 victories. George Seifert has the second most consecutive 10-win seasons with eight from 1989-1996 for San Francisco.

IVY LEAGUE JOURNEY

An Ivy League defensive lineman standout at Brown, James Develin graduated in 2010 with a degree in chemical engineering and began lining up interviews with companies he felt might be best suited for the technical skills. However, Develin wanted to give football one last shot, and play in the NFL.

"Football is something that is not around your entire life," Develin told *The Boston Globe*. "I knew if I didn't give it my best shot to play football as a career, that I'd always regret it." Develin made the most of his opportunity by switching positions to fullback. Following stints in the Arena Football League and the now defunct United Football League, Develin caught on with the Cincinnati Bengals practice squad and eventually worked his way to the Patriots 53-man roster full-time in 2013.

EDELMAN TAKES HIS FATHER'S ADVICE

If there is one thing Julian Edelman has never lacked, it's athletic ability. A dual-threat quarterback at Kent State and former baseball standout in high school, Edelman once wowed Toronto Blue Jays players with his impressive footwork while fielding ground balls in an appearance at batting practice in 2011.

This natural ability may have been overlooked by NFL scouts, who let him fall to the Patriots in the seventh round of the 2009 NFL Draft. Edelman remains focused on the lessons his father, Frank Edelman, taught him at a young age. "I'm still constantly trying to learn," Edelman told the *Boston Herald*. "My dad always put it in my head, when you're green, you're growing, when you're ripe, you're lost. When you're done learning, you're done."

SLATER'S EMERGENCE WAS SPECIAL

Bill Belichick acknowledged Matthew Slater's role as a gunner on special teams: "Matt is one of the best in the league," Belichick said. "Any time the punt return team has to double somebody, that makes it one less guy they can use somewhere else in the return. He almost always draws two guys out there unless they're in an eight-man rush. Most of the time, there's two guys out there — fourth-and-short, where they're trying to protect the box — but he draws a lot of double teams, and deservedly so. He does an outstanding job of covering punts."



PATRIOTS OFFENSIVE NOTES

ELECTED TEAM LEADER

Patriots wide receiver Matthew Slater has been named to three straight Pro Bowls (2011-13) for his special teams work, but perhaps more revealing of his value to New England is the fact that he has been elected a captain by his teammates for the fourth straight season in 2014.

The special teams ace was willing to share his advice on being a great captain with high school football players in a story published by *The Boston Globe*. "I think first and foremost, you have to be able to put others before yourself. Being a captain and leadership is about serving, and to me, that means a great deal of sacrifice – putting aside personal agendas for the greater common goal. Leadership is equated with sacrifice. I think you have to be willing to do whatever it takes for the unit to succeed. I think you need to lead by example. A lot of times, it's about what you do, not what you say."

SLATER ON BILL BELICHICK

"Guys have really bought into what we're trying to do here and believing in the goals that we've set to accomplish. We try not to acknowledge all the noise and hype surrounding ballgames. We prepare ourselves to have success by the way we work day-in and day-out on the field and in the meeting room, but it definitely starts with our leadership on this team."



FIRST NFL TD

WR Brian Tyms scored his first NFL touchdown on a 43-yard reception from Tom Brady in the win at Buffalo (10/12). He entered the game with two career receptions for 12 yards in seven games.



2011 FIRST ROUND PICK NATE SOLDER

It only took a day for Nate Solder to decide to change from his lifelong position of tight end to tackle after playing his freshman year at Colorado as a tight end. "My coaches came to me and said, 'You'd be an all right tight end, but you'd be an even better tackle,'" he told the *Boston Globe*. "I've always wanted to be great, so that's why I moved to tackle."

He added over 30 pounds after his redshirt freshman season and was named the team's starting left tackle. He played in 2,540 of 2,542 offensive plays over the next three seasons at Colorado and became an immediate contributor on the Patriots offensive line at right tackle as a rookie before moving to left tackle.



VEREEN SETS TWO RECORDS IN ONE GAME

Shane Vereen had 12 receptions for 153 yards vs. Cleveland on Dec. 8, 2013, setting a single-game franchise record for most receptions and most receiving yards by a running back.

CB KYLE ARRINGTON

WHAT'S IN A NUMBER?

When Arrington was first making the transition from Hofstra to the NFL in 2008, he was assigned jersey No. 42. At that point in his career, he was cut by both the Eagles and Buccaneers. When Arrington first arrived in New England as a practice squad player in 2009, he initially donned No. 27. But when No. 24 became available, a result of Jonathan Wilhite leaving in free agency after the 2010 season, Arrington pounced on it.

The reason is that it reflects how he's flipped his NFL fortunes – from a No. 42 struggling to hang on to a No. 24 who has carved out a role on a winning team. Arrington moved from 24 to 25 in an agreement with Adrian Wilson in 2013 to accommodate the veteran's desire to keep the same jersey he had worn during his 12-year NFL career.

ARRINGTON SCORES AGAIN

DB Kyle Arrington returned a Cincinnati (10/5/14) fumble forced by Brandon Bolden on a third-quarter kickoff 9 yards for a touchdown. It marked his third career touchdown. He returned a blocked field goal 35 yards for a touchdown at Miami (10/4/10) and returned his first career interception 36 yards for a touchdown vs. Green Bay (12/19/10).

LB JAMIE COLLINS

JAMIE COLLINS' JOURNEY

The road to the NFL has been anything but easy for linebacker and 2013 second-round draft pick Jamie Collins. The youngest of five siblings growing up in Meadville, Miss., Collins lost both of his parents when he was six years old and was raised by one of his sisters, who was in her mid 20s.

Collins turned to football as an outlet to help him through the tough times. "It means a lot. It's my living," Collins told *The Boston Herald*. "It kept me on track." Collins' resiliency in dealing with adversity has made a lasting impact on fellow Mississippi native Stevan Ridley, who grew up 30 miles west of Meadville in Natchez, Miss., and got to know Collins through a family friend. "What I've known about him, he really has been a strong person," Ridley told the Herald. "Anybody that's gone through the things that he's gone through and can still find a way to be successful on the football field, you have to be mentally tough. That's what he's kind of done as a teammate here. He's come in here and accepted his role and did a pretty good job as a rookie."

COLLINS RECORDS FIRST INT

LB Jamie Collins intercepted a Kyle Orton pass in the win at Buffalo (10/12), marking his first regular-season interception. His first career pick came last year in the AFC Divisional Playoff vs. Indianapolis (1/11/14).

DL DOMINIQUE EASLEY

EASLEY REGISTERS FIRST INT

2014 first round draft pick Dominique Easley registered his first NFL interception in the fourth quarter off QB Matt Cassel at Minnesota (09/14/14). It was his first interception since high school.

LB DONT'A HIGHTOWER

WEARING BRUSCHI'S JERSEY #54

As a first round draft pick, Dont'a Hightower is used to high expectations. Hightower went to training camp with jersey #45 but was switched to jersey #54 prior to the start of his rookie year in 2012. Former LB Tedy Bruschi wore #54 for 13 seasons.

Hightower understands the importance of the number and hopes to live up to its legacy. "I definitely feel honored to be able to wear this number," Hightower said. "I've read that Tedy didn't want it to be retired and he hoped another linebacker would come in and be able to wear this number and be able to play as well. I feel honored. Tedy was a great player, and he means a lot to this organization. I'm definitely proud to be able to wear this number."

HIGHTOWER HAS A CAREER FIRST

LB Dont'a Hightower registered his first career two-sack game at Minnesota (09/14/14).

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Chandler Jones was named AFC Defensive Player of the Week for his performance in the Patriots' 30-7 victory at Minnesota on Sept. 14, 2014. It is the first time in Jones' career that he has received an AFC Player of the Week honor. He was named AFC Defensive Player of the Month for November last season and NFL Defensive Rookie of the Month in September 2012.

Jones blocked a 48-yard field goal attempt and returned it 58 yards for a touchdown to give New England a 24-7 halftime lead at Minnesota (9/14). He also finished the game with eight total tackles and his fifth career two-sack game.

The last time the Patriots earned an AFC Defensive Player of the Week honor was Week 10 of the 2011 season when Andre Carter tied a team record with four sacks at N.Y. Jets (11/13/11).

JONES ACHIEVES TRIFECTA

DL Chandler Jones blocked a second-quarter Minnesota 48-yard field goal attempt, recovered the loose ball and returned it 58 yards for a touchdown. It is the fifth blocked field goal returned for a touchdown in Patriots history and the first returned for a touchdown since S Patrick Chung blocked a field goal attempt that was returned 35 yards for a touchdown by DB Kyle Arrington at Miami on Oct. 4, 2010. It is the second field goal block by Jones. He blocked a 39-yard attempt vs. Miami on Oct. 27, 2013. It is Jones' second career touchdown. He recovered an errant shotgun snap squibbed into the end zone at Baltimore on Dec. 22, 2013.

MULTIPLE SACKS FOR JONES

Jones finished with his fifth career two-sack game at Minnesota (09/14/14). He had three two-sack games in 2013.



THIRD TEAM'S A CHARM

Chris Jones had an early introduction to failure in the NFL. Taken behind 37 other defensive linemen in the 2013 NFL Draft, the defensive tackle was cut by two teams over a span of just 11 days. After selecting him in the sixth round with the 198th overall pick, the Houston Texans cut Jones on Aug. 31. Jones signed with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers on Sept. 1, but lasted only 10 days, as the Buccaneers released him on Sept., 10. Rather than be deterred by these early disappointments, however, Jones maintained a positive outlook when he signed with the Patriots on Sept. 11, and it has paid off in a big way. Thrust into a starting role after key injuries to the defensive line, Jones finished his rookie season with six sacks.

Jones' sudden success may have come as a surprise to some, but not to Dave Clawson, Jones' college coach at Bowling Green. Jones was part of Clawson's first recruiting class and blossomed into an All-American and two-time captain for the Falcons. "It's hard to talk about Chris without getting a little bit emotional," Clawson told the *The Boston Herald*, "because he was that special of a player and person in our program."

JONES SAVES THE DAY; EARNS AFC HONORS

Chris Jones blocked a 58-yard field goal attempt by the Jets on the final play of the game to preserve New England's 27-25 win. It was the first blocked field goal for the Patriots since Chandler Jones blocked a 48-yard try by Minnesota's Blair Walsh earlier this season. He was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance in the victory.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: DB DEVIN McCOURTY

After being selected by the Patriots in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft, DB Devin McCourty became part of a select group in league history. McCourty's identical twin brother, Jason, is a cornerback with Tennessee, selected in the sixth round of the 2009 NFL Draft. The two are the 12th set of twins to play in the NFL. Devin redshirted for the 2005 season and therefore was a year behind his brother in eligibility. McCourty is the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 1998-2000. His twin brother, Wasswa, played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox. The McCourty twins are one of two active sets of twins playing in the NFL.

DB Devin McCourty returned a first quarter interception 60 yards to the Minnesota (09/14/14) 1-yard line to set up a Patriots touchdown. It is the longest interception return of his career. He had a 50-yard return as a rookie in 2010 at Detroit (11/25) on Thanksgiving Day.



A NOSE FOR THE FOOTBALL

Ninkovich has more opponent fumble recoveries (13) over the last five seasons (2010-2014) than any other NFL player. J.J. Watt is second during that time with 11 opponent fumble recoveries.



CAREER DAY IN BUFFALO

Ninkovich finished with a three-sack game for the first time in his career in the win at Buffalo (10/12), to add to two two-sack performances vs. Miami (1/2/11) and at Carolina (11/18/13).

WHERE DID HE COME FROM?

Rob Ninkovich's journey to the Patriots was not easy. He entered the league as a fifth-round pick by the Saints in 2006 and was waived four times by New Orleans and Miami before landing in New England on Aug. 2, 2009. He spent the 2009 offseason trying to make the New Orleans team as a long snapper. Before coming to the Patriots, he had appeared in just eight games over three seasons. He doubled that total in his first year in New England, appearing in 15 games in 2009 and his role on the team has grown since, earning a starting role at linebacker in 2010 and 2011 before moving to a starting role on the defensive line in 2011.

CRAZY EIGHTS

Ninkovich tied a career-high with eight sacks in 2013. He also had eight sacks in 2012. Ninkovich is the first Patriots player with back-to-back seasons with at least eight sacks since Willie McGinest in 1995 (11) and 1996 (9.5). He is the only player to accomplish the feat during Belichick's tenure as head coach in New England. He is leading the team with six sacks in 2014.

NINKOVICH SCORED AS A TE IN COLLEGE

Ninkovich played some at tight end in college at Purdue and caught two touchdown passes with a 2-yard touchdown pass from Buffalo QB Kyle Orton and a 1-yard touchdown pass from former New York Giants and Indianapolis QB Curtis Painter.

Ryan and Harmon began their college football careers together as members of the same recruiting class at Rutgers University and developed a close friendship during their four years in Piscataway, N.J. As fate would have it, Ryan and Harmon would begin their NFL journeys together as well when the Patriots selected the two defensive backs just eight picks apart in the third round of the 2013 NFL Draft.

Reunited once again, the former Scarlet Knights are excited and eager to make their mark, just as they did at Rutgers. "We talked before the draft and said how good it would be to play on the same team again, and for it to happen again, it's exciting and it's a blessing," Harmon told *The Boston Globe*. "It's great [we're contributing], because at the end of the day you want to play, and to contribute to a team like this, it's fun."

RYAN RETURNS... TO SCHOOL

When Logan Ryan decided to leave Rutgers and enter the NFL Draft after his redshirt junior season in 2012, he made a promise to his parents that after his rookie year, he would return to school and earn his degree.

Ryan kept his promise and graduated in the spring of 2014 with a degree in labor relations and a minor in psychology.

"I committed to Rutgers, not only as a football player, but as a student, so I was going to make sure I finished that end too," Ryan told NJ.com.

"It's a big accomplishment in my life. I held my word to my parents and stuck with it and I'm fortunate. It took a lot of work, but I was able to go back and finish and walk in graduation."

The play marked the second time in as many weeks that a Ryan turnover led to Patriots points.



REASONS FOR TEAM SUCCESS

Patriots Pro Bowl DL Vince Wilfork, who has served as a defensive captain for the Patriots for seven straight seasons, says the team's continued success is a result of the entire organization working towards one common goal:

"The Patriots are all about team, family and smart football players. They try to get good people here from coaches to guys who work in the front office to guys who put on this uniform. I think everybody has to have one goal in mind, and that's to be together. When you get an organization together that is seeking one goal, you can be pretty successful."

SEALED WITH A PICK

Vince Wilfork notched his third career interception (second vs. Oakland on Sept. 21) when he snared a pass that had been deflected in the final minute of the game. The play came with the Raiders having gained a first-and-goal and with Oakland trailing by seven points. Wilfork's last interception was also against Oakland, coming in a 31-19 New England victory in Oakland on Oct. 2, 2011.

THIRD TIME'S A CHARM

Vince Wilfork became the franchise's all-time leader in interceptions by a defensive lineman following his INT vs. Oakland. Wilfork became the first Patriots defensive lineman to have three interceptions.

Brady passed Dan Marino for third in NFL history with his 64th 300-yard game in the win at San Diego (12/7) ... Passed for 333 yards and four touchdowns in the win vs. Denver (11/2) ... Earned AFC Offensive Player of the Week honors after completing 30-of-35 passes for 354 yards and a season-high five touchdowns in the win vs. Chicago (10/26) ... His 85.7% completion rate was the second highest in franchise history and his five touchdown passes were his most since 2009 ... He became just the sixth player in NFL history to eclipse 50,000 career passing yards in the win vs. Cincinnati (10/5) ... He has thrown a touchdown pass in each of the first 13 games of the season and now has 389 for his career.

OL NATE SOLDER

Solder started the first 13 games of the season at left tackle ... Part of an offensive line that is tied for third in the NFL with 18 sacks allowed.



OL SEBASTIAN VOLLMER

Vollmer constitutes the right side of New England's 6-8 tackle bookends (along with LT Nate Solder) and has started at right tackle in the first 13 games of the 2014 season.

OL DAN CONNOLLY

Connolly has been one of the most versatile Patriots over the past six seasons, having started at center and both guard positions ... He has started 12 of 13 games this season - three at center and nine at left guard.

OL BRYAN STORK

Stork has started eight games at center, and with his start at Kansas City (9/29), he became the first Patriots rookie to start at center since Dan Koppen in 2003.

WR BRANDON LaFELL

Set career highs with 11 receptions for 124 yards, including a 19-yard touchdown, in the win vs. Chicago (10/26) ... He caught four passes for 94 yards and two touchdowns in the win at Buffalo (10/12) ...
