GAME SUMMARY

NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (12-4) vs. BALTIMORE RAVENS (10-6) Saturday, Jan. 10, 2015 • Gillette Stadium (68,756) • 4:35 p.m. ET

The New England Patriots will host the Baltimore Ravens in a Divisional Playoff game on Sat., Jan. 10, at Gillette Stadium. The Ravens advanced to the second round of the playoffs after a 30-17 victory at Pittsburgh last Saturday. This week's game will be the third postseason meeting between the two teams, including a Wild Card game in 2009 and AFC Championship games in 2011 and 2012. The Patriots are 1-2 in those three postseason games.

The Patriots will try to advance to the AFC Championship Game for the fourth straight season, joining Oakland (5-1973-77), Philadelphia (4-2001-04), Buffalo (4-1990-93) and Dallas (4-1970-73 and 1992-95) as the only teams to reach at least four straight conference championship games.

The Patriots finished the 2014 regular season with a 12-4 record and the top seed in the conference, securing home-field advantage throughout the AFC Playoffs. The Patriots have now earned the number one seed five times (2014, 2011, 2010, 2007 and 2003). New England's 12 wins mark the ninth time in franchise history the Patriots have recorded 12 or more victories in the regular season, and it is the ninth time in the last 12 years the Patriots have had at least 12 regular-season wins. The Patriots have won at least 12 games for five straight year.

The Patriots earned a first-round bye in 2014 and lead the NFL with 10 first-round byes since the current NFL playoff format was instituted in 1990. New England has earned a firstround bye for the fifth consecutive season, becoming the first team to accomplish that feat. Dallas and San Francisco earned four straight byes from 1992 through 1995.

<u>TELEVISION</u>: This week's game will be broadcast by **NBC** and can be seen locally on **WHDH Channel 7** in Boston. Al Michaels will handle play-by-play duties with **Cris Collinsworth** as the color analyst. **Michael Tafoya** will work from the sidelines. The game will be produced by **Fred Gaudelli** and directed by **Drew Esocoff**.

<u>NATIONAL RADIO</u>: This week's game will be broadcast to a national audience by **Westwood One Sports**. Ian Eagle and Boomer Esiason will call the game with Tony Boselli providing sideline analysis.

LOCAL RADIO: 98.5 FM, The Sports Hub, is the flagship station for the **Patriots Radio Network**. Play-by-play broadcaster **Bob Socci** will call the action along with former Patriots quarterback **Scott Zolak**, who will provide color analysis.

ANNUAL ACHIEVEMENT

The Patriots have won more than half of their games for the 14th straight year with a 12-4 record in 2014. They are the first team to win more than half of their games in 14 straight seasons since free agency began in 1993. New England also became the third team to win more than half of their games in 14 straight seasons since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, joining the 49ers (16 straight from 1983-98) and the Cowboys (16 straight from 1970-85). The Patriots have now won nine or more games in 18 of the 21 seasons Robert Kraft has owned the team.

<u>ROB GRONKOWSKI</u>

Rob Gronkowski became the second-fastest player (tied with Randy Moss) in NFL history to reach 50 touchdown receptions in the team's 43-21 win vs. Denver (11/2). The previous week, Gronkowski caught three touchdown passes from Tom Brady to set a franchise record for most touchdown connections between a quarterback and receiver in the team's 51-23 win vs. Chicago (10/26). The jersey and gloves he wore for both games are on display at The Hall.



<u>STEPHEN GOSTKOWSKI</u>

Stephen Gostkowski became the Patriots all-time leader in points, passing Adam Vinatieri (1,158), with a 35-yard field goal in the Week 15 win vs. Miami (12/14). His game-worn jersey and the ball he kicked to become the Patriots all-time leading scorer are on display at The Hall.

TOM BRADY

Tom Brady became the sixth player in NFL history to reach 50,000 career passing yards after completing 23-of-35 passes for 292 yards and two touchdowns in the win vs. Cincinnati (10/5) on NBC's "Sunday Night Football." He was the fourth fastest to reach the mark, doing so in his 198th game. Brady's jersey from that game as well as the ball he threw to reach that milestone are on display at The Hall.



BILL BELICHICK

Bill Belichick earned his 200th regular season victory as a head coach after the Patriots' 30-7 win at Minnesota on Sept. 14, 2014. He became just the sixth NFL head coach to reach that mark, joining Don Shula (328), George Halas (318), Tom Landry (250), Curly Lambeau (226) and Marty Schottenheimer (200). Belichick's headset from that landmark win is on display at The Hall.

JONAS GRAY

Jonas Gray earned AFC Offensive Player of the Week honors for Week 11 after rushing for 201 yards and a team-record four rushing touchdowns in the team's 42-20 win at Indianapolis (11/16). Gray scored one touchdown in each quarter and is the only Patriots player to rush for 100 yards in each half of a game. His game-worn jersey and the ball from his record-breaking fourth touchdown, along with the *Sports Illustrated* cover commemorating his performance, are on display at The Hall.



CHRIS JONES

Chris Jones blocked a game-winning field goal attempt to preserve a Patriots' 27-25 win vs. N.Y. Jets in Week 7 (10/16) on "Thursday Night Football." The gloves that he wore in that game as well as the ball he blocked are on display at The Hall.







ROBERT KRAFT

SERIES HISTORY



The Patriots and Ravens have squared off eight times in the regular season and three times in the postseason, including two straight AFC Championship Games in 2011 and 2012, since the Baltimore franchise was founded following the Cleveland Browns' move to Baltimore in 1996. All three postseason games have been played at Gillette Stadium. The Patriots are 1-2 against Baltimore all time in postseason play.

The teams last met in the regular season last year in Baltimore on Dec. 22, with the Patriots taking a 41-7 victory.

The Patriots and Ravens played in their first postseason meeting following the 2009 season with Baltimore taking a 33-14 win in a Wild Card matchup at Gillette Stadium on Jan. 10, 2010. The Patriots avenged that loss in the 2011 AFC Championship Game with a 23-20 victory over the Ravens at Gillette Stadium on Jan. 22, 2012, to advance to Super Bowl XLVI. The teams met for the second straight season in the 2012 AFC Championship Game at Gillette Stadium on Jan. 20, 2013, with Baltimore getting revenge for the 2011 AFC Championship loss with a 28-13 win to advance to the Super Bowl.

The Patriots are 7-1 all-time against Baltimore in the regular season, including 4-0 in home games.

The first meeting between the teams came during the Ravens' first season in Baltimore, when the Patriots prevailed 46-38 on Oct. 6, 1996. The 84 total points scored by both teams in that game rank as the second-highest total number of points in a game in Patriots history to the 86 points in a 43-43 tie with Oakland in 1964.

PATRIOTS VS. RAVENS PREDECESSORS

From 1970-83, the Patriots faced the Baltimore Colts 27 times, posting a 12-15 record in those games. The Colts moved to Indianapolis prior to the 1984 season and Baltimore was without an NFL team until the Cleveland Browns moved to Baltimore and became the Ravens in 1996. Prior to the move, the Patriots were 4-11 against the Browns, including a 2-4 record against Cleveland while Bill Belichick was the Browns' head coach from 1991-95.

PASSING PERFORMANCES

Tom Brady is slated to start against Baltimore in the postseason for the fourth time. He is 1-2 against the Ravens in the playoffs and 5-1 against them in the regular season.

The New England Patriots put on a performance worthy of a division champion as they breezed to a 41-7 victory over the defending Super Bowl Champion Baltimore Ravens. The Patriots were assured of their fifth straight AFC East title before the game started when Miami lost at Buffalo. It was the 21st time in its history and 15th time under owner Robert Kraft that New England qualified for the postseason. It was the 11th division crown for Bill Belichick, tying Don Shula for the most division titles since the 1970 merger.

Tom Brady also set a new NFL record with his 11th division title.

Rookie CB Logan Ryan had two interceptions, RB LeGarrette Blount had two rushing touchdowns and the Patriots snapped a four-game winning streak by Baltimore. The Patriots scored 21 points in the fourth quarter, including two defensive touchdowns to finish the rout.

After Blount scored his second TD on a 7-yard run with 2:05 to play to make it 27-7, DE Chandler Jones recovered an errant snap that eluded backup QB Tyrod Taylor that rolled into the end zone where he recovered the ball. S Tavon Wilson capped the scoring on the ensuing drive when he intercepted Taylor and returned the pick 74 yards for a score to make it 41-7.

The Patriots scored 41 points against a Baltimore defense that entered the game allowing just 14.3 points per game at home.

The Patriots took a 17-0 lead in the second quarter and extended the lead to 20-0 in the third quarter behind a defense that forced four turnovers and registered four sacks.

New England took a 7-0 lead on its second offensive possession when Blount finished a 6-play, 64-yard drive with a 1-yard touchdown run. The Patriots quickly got the ball back three plays later when QB Joe Flacco was intercepted by Ryan to give New England a first down at the Baltimore 47-yard line. A 34-yard pass from Brady to WR Danny Amendola helped get into position for Brady's 4-yard touchdown pass to RB Shane Vereen for a 14-0 first quarter lead.

The Patriots extended their lead to 17-0 on the first play of the third quarter when K Stephen Gostkowski drilled a 45-yard field goal. Midway through the third quarter Ryan intercepted Flacco for the second time and allowed the Patriots to start a drive at the Baltimore 43-yard line. That turnover helped lead to a 42-yard field goal by Gostkowski for a 20-0 New England lead.

Baltimore, who finished O-for-3 on fourth down, reached the New England 4-yard line late in the third quarter but DE Rob Ninkovich and S Duron Harmon stopped RB Ray Rice for no gain to end the scoring threat. New England caught a break in the beginning of the fourth quarter when Baltimore reached the New England 19-yard line. Ravens K Justin Tucker missed on a 37-yard field goal to end a streak of 33 straight successful attempts.

Flacco engineered a 9-play, 90-yard drive on the next series that ended with a 1-yard touchdown run by Flacco. But any chance of a comeback ended on the next offensive series when Flacco failed to connect on a pass to TE Dennis Pitta on fourth-and-10 from the Baltimore 48-yard line with just under seven minutes to play. New England responded by marching 48 yards on nine plays before Blount's 7-yard run made it 27-7 with 2:10 to play.

Baltimore QB Joe Flacco threw two fourth quarter touchdown passes to WR Anquan Boldin to help the Ravens overcome a six-point halftime deficit and win the AFC Championship with a 28-13 victory over the New England Patriots.

Stephen Gostkowski's 31-yard field goal in the middle of the first quarter capped a 67-yard drive to give New England a 3-0 lead. A 17-yard pass from Flacco to TE Dennis Pitta sparked a 9-play drive that culminated with a 2-yard touchdown run by RB Ray Rice for a 7-3 lead in the second quarter.

New England answered with an 11-play, 79-yard drive in which QB Tom Brady completed 5-of-6 passes, including a 1-yard touchdown pass to WR Wes Welker for a 10-7 lead. The Patriots defense forced a three-an-out on the next series and got the ball back with 2:32 left in the first half. On a fourth-down play from the Baltimore 34-yard line, RB Danny Woodhead took a direct snap and ran seven yards for the first down. Gostkowski finished that drive with a 25-yard field goal as time expired in the first half to give the Patriots a 13-7 advantage.

In the middle of the third quarter, Baltimore took the lead when they marched 87 yards in 10 plays before Flacco threw a 5-yard touchdown pass to Pitta that gave the Ravens a 14-13 lead.

After stopping the Patriots on the next series, WR Torrey Smith's 23-yard reception highlighted a 63-yard drive that ended in a 3-yard touchdown pass from Flacco to Boldin in the fourth quarter to extend Baltimore's lead to 21-13.

A big hit on RB Stevan Ridley forced a fumble on the next series, allowing Baltimore to recover at the New England 47-yard line. That led to an 11-yard touchdown pass from Flacco to Boldin for a 28-13 lead.

New England drove into Baltimore territory three times in the fourth quarter but was intercepted twice and failed on a fourth-down attempt one time.

Brady finished the game 29-of-54 for 320 yards with one touchdown and two interceptions.

He later served as an assistant coach at Connecticut from 1987-91 and as defensive coordinator at Maine in 1993.

Ravens defensive line coach Clarence Brooks attended New Bedford (Mass.) HS, where he lettered in football and track and field. He played collegiately as an offensive guard at the University of Massachusetts from 1970-72 and served as a team captain in his final season. Brooks launched his coaching career as the defensive ends coach for Massachusetts from 1976-80.

Ravens guarterbacks coach Rick Dennison began his coaching career as the head coach for Suffield (Conn.) Academy from 1992-94.

Ravens senior offensive assistant Craig Ver Steeg served as Harvard's \star passing game coordinator, quarterbacks coach, wide receivers coach and recruiting coordinator from 1994-95.

Ravens defensive assistant Matt Weiss played baseball and football at Hopkins School in New Haven, Conn., where he quarterbacked the team to a 12-0 record and New England Prep School Class C Championship his senior vear.

Patriots head coach Bill Belichick was raised in Annapolis, Md., where his father, Steve, served as head football coach for the Naval Academy. Belichick was a standout prep athlete at Annapolis HS, where he has since been inducted into the school's Hall of Fame.

Patriots CB Kyle Arrington was born in Accokeek, Md. and attended Gwynn Park HS in Brandywine, Md., where he played football, basketball and ran track. Arrington led Gwynn Park to a regional championship and earned second-team all-county honors during his senior season.

Patriots defensive assistant Brendan Daly served as a graduate assistant at the University of Maryland in 2000.

Ravens defensive coordinator Dean Pees served as linebackers coach for the Patriots from 2004-05 before being promoted to defensive coordinator, a role he held through the 2009 season.

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. Now in his 21st season of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games [.238 pct.] and logging the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994,

Kraft announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles (14), conference crowns (6) and Super Bowl championships (3) than any other NFL team. The Patriots have made six Super Bowl appearances since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other team has earned more than four berths. In Kraft's 21 seasons, the Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 16 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons.

MILESTONE WIN FOR KRAFT

The victory over the New York Jets (12/21/14) was the 250th win under Robert Kraft. His 250 wins in his first 368 total games tied Chicago's George Halas for the fastest an owner has reached 250 victories.



Kraft's success as an owner has brought the Patriots a great increase in national recognition. Prior to Kraft's ownership, the Patriots had been featured on the cover of just four issues of Sports Illustrated [1966, 1977, 1981 and 1986). Since 1994, New England has graced the cover a total of 29 times, including 17 that feature Tom Brady alone.







RECORD HOME STREAK ENDS

New England's loss to Buffalo ended a streak of 35 straight wins at home against AFC opponents. The 35 straight home wins against a conference foe is the longest in NFL history (following the 1970 merger). The Miami Dolphins are second in NFL history with 21 straight home conference wins (1971-1974). Prior the loss to Buffalo, the Patriots last loss at home against an AFC opponent was a 33-10 loss vs. Pittsburgh on Nov. 30, 2008.

BILLS SNAP PATS HOME WIN STREAK

Prior to the loss to Buffalo, the Patriots had won 17 consecutive home games against AFC East opposition. Before the loss to Buffalo, the last time the Patriots lost a home game against an AFC East opponent was on Nov. 13, 2008, when the New York Jets left Gillette Stadium with a 34-31 overtime win. The Patriots' 17-game streak ties Buffalo's 17 straight home divisional wins from 1988-92 for the second longest since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger. The Patriots earned a first-round bye in the 2014 NFL playoffs and lead the NFL with 10 first-round byes since the current NFL playoff format was instituted in 1990. BOUNCE BACK PATS

Since the beginning of 2003, the Patriots are 37-4 (.902) in regular-season games following a loss, including 10 straight wins following a defeat since 2012. The Patriots have dropped back-to-back regular season games just four times since 2003 (2006, 2009, 2011 and 2012). As a starter in his career, Tom Brady is 38-8 in games following a loss.

SECOND-HALF LOCKDOWN

The Patriots have won 74 straight home games when leading at halftime, adding to their NFL record. The last Patriots loss at home after leading at halftime was on Dec. 24, 2000 (vs. Miami), when the Patriots lost 27-24 after leading 21-17 at halftime. New England has never lost a game at Gillette Stadium when leading at halftime, going 66-0 since 2002.

IMPRESSIVE DEFENSIVE STRETCH

In a five-game stretch, the Patriots faced Denver's Peyton Manning, Indianapolis' Andrew Luck, Detroit's Matthew Stafford, Green Bay's Aaron Rodgers and San Diego's Philip Rivers and the defense held those teams to an average of 16.6 points per game (San Diego scored one touchdown on a fumble return), while pitching a 4-1 record.

SOLID SECOND-HALF DEFENSE

The Patriots defense shut out the Bills in the second half of the regular-season finale, marking the sixth straight game without allowing a second-half touchdown. The last time the Patriots allowed a second-half touchdown was in the fourth guarter of the win vs. Indianapolis on Nov. 16. GROUND CONTROL

The Patriots rushed for 200 yards in a game two times in 2014 with 220 yards in the win vs. Cincinnati on Oct. 5 and 246 yards in the win at Indianapolis on Nov. 16. The Patriots are 65-7 all-time when rushing for 200 yards or more and are 12-0 under Bill Belihcick when rushing for 200 yards or more.

SEASON-HIGH OUTPUT

The Patriots scored a season-high 51 points vs. Chicago on Oct. 26, 2014. It is the seventh time the Patriots have scored at least 50 points in the last eight seasons (2007-14). In that span, no other team has more than three games with 50 points.

HALF-CENTURY CLUB

The Patriots scored 51 points against the Bears (10/26), marking the 13th time in franchise history that they have broken the 50-point barrier. New England has topped 50 points eight times since 2007. The Patriots' franchise record for most points in a game is 59, achieved twice - on Nov. 18, 2012 against Indianapolis (59-24) and on Oct. 16, 2009 vs. Tennessee (59-0).

PILING UP THE RECEIVING YARDS

Rob Gronkowski and Brandon LaFell each broke the 100-yard receiving mark in the win vs. Chicago (10/26). It was the only time this season that the Patriots had two 100-yard receivers and the 34th time in team history that the feat has occurred. The last time the Patriots had two 100-yard receivers in a game was on Dec. 15, 2013, at Miami, when Julian Edelman (139) and Danny Amendola (131) each broke the 100-yard mark.

PATS TAME LIONS TOP-RANKED DEFENSE

The Patriots scored 34 points against a Lions (11/23) defense which entered the game allowing an NFL-low 15.6 points per game. Prior to the Patriots-Lions game, the highest point total allowed by the Lions was 24 points to the Carolina Panthers on Sept. 14. Entering the game, Detroit also allowed an NFL-low 290.3 yards per game, and New England totaled 439 yards in the victory.

THIRD QUARTER SCORING RECORD

The Patriots scored 24 points in the third guarter vs. Miami (12/14/14), marking the highest scoring total in team history in the third quarter. The previous high was a 22-point third quarter vs. the Dallas Texans on Nov. 18, 1960.

Stephen Gostkowski executed a successful onside kick in a victory vs. Cleveland (12/8/13) for only the second time in team history. The first came when Jim Lee Hunt recovered a Gino Cappelletti kick at the end of the first half in a 26-10 win vs. the NY Jets (9/27/64).

Jonas Gray is the third player in NFL history to have at least 37 carries, 200 yards rushing and four rushing touchdowns in a single game, joining Mike Anderson of Denver in 2000 and Corey Dillon of Cincinnati in 1997. Gray gained 201 yards rushing on 37 carries with four touchdowns in the win at Indianapolis on Nov. 16.

The Patriots scored 31 points in the second quarter of the 51-23 win vs. Chicago (10/26/14), marking the fourth time in team history that the team has scored 30 or more points in a quarter.

The Patriots became the first team in NFL history in 2014 to earn five straight first round byes. Dallas and San Francisco earned four straight byes from 1992 through 1995.

The Patriots blocked five total kicks in $\overline{2014}$ with four field goals and one punt and returned two of the blocked field goals for touchdowns. 5

The Patriots finished with a 12-4 record in 2014. It is the ninth time in team history that the team won 12 or more wins and the fifth straight season that the team has had 12 or more wins.







2013 and now, 2014. Brady finished the season with 4,109 yards and 33 touchdown passes. He joined Drew Brees (9) and Peyton Manning (14) as the only NFL players to have at least seven seasons with 4,000 passing yards. Brady also guided the Patriots to their 12th division title of his career, the most by a quarter-back in NFL history.

Gostkowski was named to the Pro Bowl for the third time in his career and for the second straight season. He finished the season with an NFL-leading 156 points. He also led the NFL in points in 2008, 2012 and 2013, becoming just the third player to lead the NFL in points in at least four seasons. Gostkowski became the Patriots' all-time leading scorer vs. Miami (12/14) and currently has 1,179 career points. He was 35-of-37 on field goals in 2014 for a 94.6 field goal percentage, the highest field goal percentage in team history for a season.

Gronkowski was named to the Prow Bowl for the third time after being selected to the Pro Bowl in 2011 and 2012. He led all NFL tight ends in 2014 with 1,124 yards on 82 receptions with 12 touchdowns. He became the first tight end in NFL history with four seasons of 10 or more touchdowns. He is the second tight end in NFL history to have two 1,000-yard and 10-plus touchdowns in a single season.

Revis was named to his sixth career Pro Bowl and his sixth Pro Bowl in the last seven seasons. He was previously voted to the Pro Bowl following the 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2013 seasons. Revis leads the NFL with 123 passes defensed since he entered the NFL in 2007. He played a key role in a Patriots defense that is ranked 13th overall and eighth in the NFL by allowing just 19.6 points per game.

Slater earned his fourth consecutive Pro Bowl selection. A productive member of the Patriots special teams units since joining the squad as a fifth-round draft pick out of UCLA in 2008, Slater has become a leader after being voted special teams captain each of the last four years. He has now led the Patriots in special teams tackles for four of the last five seasons, including a team-high 14 in 2014.



The Associated Press named Bill Belichick the NFL's Coach of the Year in 2010, the third time that Belichick earned the honor. He was also named Coach of the Year following the 2003 and 2007 seasons, joining Don Shula (4-time winner) and Chuck Knox as the only three-time winners.

BELICHICK ADDED TO HIS RECORD IN 2014

Bill Belichick has coached the Patriots to 12 straight seasons with 10 or more wins after reaching his 10th win of the 2014 season at San Diego (12/7/14), adding to his NFL record streak. 

IVY LEAGUE JOURNEY

An lvy League defensive lineman standout at Brown, James Develin graduated in 2010 with a degree in chemical engineering and began lining up interviews with companies he felt might be best suited for the technical skills. However, Develin wanted to give football one last shot, and play in the NFL.

"Football is something that is not around your entire life," Develin told *The Boston Globe.* "I knew if I didn't give it my best shot to play football as a career, that I'd always regret it." Develin made the most of his opportunity by switching positions to fullback. Following stints in the Arena Football League and the now defunct United Football League, Develin caught on with the Cincinnati Bengals practice squad and eventually worked his way to the Patriots 53-man roster full-time in 2013.



He was also the leading rusher, gaining 1,551 yards on 215 attempts (an average of 7.5 yards per carry) and scoring 13 touchdowns. I'd say that's pretty unusual, especially to be as competent in them as he is."

EDELMAN TAKES HIS FATHER'S ADVICE

If there is one thing Julian Edelman has never lacked, it's athletic ability. A dual-threat quarterback at Kent State and former baseball standout in high school, Edelman once wowed Toronto Blue Jays players with his impressive footwork while fielding ground balls in an appearance at batting practice in 2011.

This natural ability may have been overlooked by NFL scouts, who let him fall to the Patriots in the seventh round of the 2009 NFL Draft. Edelman remains focused on the lessons his father, Frank Edelman, taught him at a young age. "I'm still constantly trying to learn," Edelman told *The Boston Herald.* "My dad always put it in my head, when you're green, you're growing, when you're ripe, you're lost. When you're done learning, you're done."



Bill Belichick acknowledged Matthew Slater's role as a gunner on special teams: "Matt is one of the best in the league," Belichick said. "Any time the punt return team has to double somebody, that makes it one less guy they can use somewhere else in the return. He almost always draws two guys out there unless they're in an eight-man rush. Most of the time, there's two guys out there — fourth-and-short, where they're trying to protect the box — but he draws a lot of double teams, and deservedly so. He does an outstanding job of covering punts."



ELECTED TEAM LEADER

Patriots wide receiver Matthew Slater has been named to four straight Pro Bowls (2011-14) for his special teams work, but perhaps more revealing of his value to New England is the fact that he has been elected a captain by his teammates for the fourth straight season in 2014.

The special teams ace was willing to share his advice on being a great captain with high school football players in a story published by *The Boston Globe*. "I think first and foremost, you have to be able to put others before yourself. Being a captain and leadership is about serving, and to me, that means a great deal of sacrifice – putting aside personal agendas for the greater common goal. Leadership is equated with sacrifice. I think you have to be willing to do whatever it takes for the unit to succeed. I think you need to lead by example. A lot of times, it's about what you do, not what you say."

SLATER ON BILL BELICHICK

"Guys have really bought into what we're trying to do here and believing in the goals that we've set to accomplish. We try not to acknowledge all the noise and hype surrounding ballgames. We prepare ourselves to have success by the way we work day-in and day-out on the field and in the meeting room, but it definitely starts with our leadership on this team."



FIRST NFL TD

WR Brian Tyms scored his first NFL touchdown on a 43-yard reception from Tom Brady in the win at Buffalo (10/12). He entered the game with two career receptions for 12 yards in seven games. In total for 2014, Tyms had all five recpetions for 82 yards, all coming against the Bills.



2011 FIRST ROUND PICK NATE SOLDER

It only took a day for Nate Solder to decide to change from his lifelong position of tight end to tackle after playing his freshman year at Colorado as a tight end. "My coaches came to me and said, 'You'd be an all right tight end, but you'd be an even better tackle," he told the *Boston Globe.* "I've always wanted to be great, so that's why I moved to tackle."

He added over 30 pounds after his redshirt freshman season and was named the team's starting left tackle. He played in 2,540 of 2,542 offensive plays over the next three seasons at Colorado and became an immediate contributor on the Patriots offensive line at right tackle as a rookie before moving to left tackle.



VEREEN SETS TWO RECORDS IN ONE GAME

Shane Vereen had 12 receptions for 153 yards vs. Cleveland on Dec. 8, 2013, setting a single-game franchise record for most receptions and most receiving yards by a running back.

Ryan Wendell played a league-high 1,249 snaps in 2012 and it helped earn him a spot on the *USA Today* All-Joe team. Said Wendell: "I think first it says a lot about the organization, our training staff and our strength training coaches, that they do everything they can all season and all off-season and during the spring to keep us healthy throughout the whole season. I think it says more about them than it does about me individually."



WHAT'S IN A NUMBER?

When Arrington was first making the transition from Hofstra to the NFL in 2008, he was assigned jersey No. 42. At that point in his career, he was cut by both the Eagles and Buccaneers. When Arrington first arrived in New England as a practice squad player in 2009, he initially donned No. 27. But when No. 24 became available, a result of Jonathan Wilhite leaving in free agency after the 2010 season, Arrington pounced on it.

The reason is that it reflects how he's flipped his NFL fortunes – from a No. 42 struggling to hang on to a No. 24 who has carved out a role on a winning team. Arrington moved from 24 to 25 in an agreement with Adrian Wilson in 2013 to accommodate the veteran's desire to keep the same jersey he had worn during his 12-year NFL career.

ARRINGTON SCORES AGAIN

DB Kyle Arrington has two touchdowns in 2014. He returned a Cincinnati fumble (10/5/14) forced by Brandon Bolden on a third-quarter kickoff 9 yards for a touchdown and returned a blocked field goal 62 yards for a touchdown vs. Miami (12/14). He has four career touchdowns. He returned a blocked field goal 35 yards for a touchdown at Miami (10/4/10) and returned his first career interception 36 yards for a touchdown vs. Green Bay (12/19/10).



JAMIE COLLINS' JOURNEY

The road to the NFL has been anything but easy for linebacker and 2013 second-round draft pick Jamie Collins. The youngest of five siblings growing up in Meadville, Miss., Collins lost both of his parents when he was six years old and was raised by one of his sisters, who was in her mid 20s.

Collins turned to football as an outlet to help him through the tough times. "It means a lot. It's my living," Collins told *The Boston Herald.* "It kept me on track." Collins' resiliency in dealing with adversity has made a lasting impact on fellow Mississippi native Stevan Ridley, who grew up 30 miles west of Meadville in Natchez, Miss., and got to know Collins through a family friend. "What I've known about him, he really has been a strong person," Ridley told the *Herald.* "Anybody that's gone through the things that he's gone through and can still find a way to be successful on the football field, you have to be mentally tough. That's what he's kind of done as a teammate here. He's come in here and accepted his role and did a pretty good job as a rookie."

COLLINS RECORDS FIRST INT

LB Jamie Collins intercepted a Kyle Orton pass in the win at Buffalo (10/12), marking his first regular-season interception. He had his second of the year at the Jets on Dec. 21. His first career pick came last year in the AFC Divisional Playoff vs. Indianapolis (1/11/14).

COLLINS' FIRST TWO-SACK GAME

LB Jamie Collins registered his first NFL two-sack game with a 9-yard sack in the first quarter and a 9-yard sack in the second quarter against San Diego (12/7). It was the fourth time in 2014 that a Patriots player had a multiple sack game. LB Dont'a Hightower had two sacks at Minnesota (9/14), DE Chandler Jones had two sacks at Minnesota (9/14) and DL Rob Ninkovich had three sacks at Buffalo (10/12).

TEAM LEADER

Collins had a standout second season in 2014. He led the team in total tackles (109), forced fumbles (4) and fumble recoveries (2), and tied for the team lead in interceptions (2).



WEARING BRUSCHI'S JERSEY #54

As a first round draft pick, Dont'a Hightower is used to high expectations. Hightower went to training camp with jersey #45 but was switched to jersey #54 prior to the start of his rookie year in 2012. Former LB Tedy Bruschi wore #54 for 13 seasons.

Hightower understands the importance of the number and hopes to live up to its legacy. "I definitely feel honored to be able to wear this number," Hightower said. "I've read that Tedy didn't want it to be retired and he hoped another linebacker would come in and be able to wear this number and be able to play as well. I feel honored. Tedy was a great player, and he means a lot to this organization. I'm definitely proud to be able to wear this number."

HIGHTOWER HAS A CAREER FIRST

LB Dont'a Hightower registered his first career two-sack game at Minnesota [09/14/14].

HIGHTOWER SETS CAREER HIGH

LB Dont'a Hightower registered a 9-yard sack of Green Bay QB Aaron Rodgers in the second quarter to set a career high with $4\frac{1}{2}$ sacks in 2014. He now has 6.0 sacks for the year. His previous best was four sacks as a rookie in 2012.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Chandler Jones was named AFC Defensive Player of the Week for his performance in the Patriots' 30-7 victory at Minnesota on Sept. 14, 2014. It was the first time in Jones' career that he has received an AFC Player of the Week honor. He was named AFC Defensive Player of the Month for November last season and NFL Defensive Rookie of the Month in September 2012.

Jones blocked a 48-yard field goal attempt and returned it 58 yards for a touchdown to give New England a 24-7 halftime lead at Minnesota (9/14). He also finished the game with eight total tackles and his fifth career two-sack game.

The last time the Patriots earned an AFC Defensive Player of the Week honor was Week 10 of the 2011 season when Andre Carter tied a team record with four sacks at N.Y. Jets (11/13/11).

JONES ACHIEVES TRIFECTA

DL Chandler Jones blocked a second-quarter Minnesota 48-yard field goal attempt, recovered the loose ball and returned it 58 yards for a touchdown. It was the fifth blocked field goal returned for a touchdown in Patriots history and the first returned for a touchdown since S Patrick Chung blocked a field goal attempt that was returned 35 yards for a touchdown by DB Kyle Arrington at Miami on Oct. 4, 2010. It is the second field goal block by Jones. He blocked a 39-yard attempt vs. Miami on Oct. 27, 2013. It was Jones' second career touchdown. He recovered an errant shotgun snap squibbed into the end zone at Baltimore on Dec. 22, 2013.

MULTIPLE SACKS FOR JONES

Jones finished with his fifth career two-sack game at Minnesota (09/14/14). He had three two-sack games in 2013.



THIRD TEAM'S A CHARM

Chris Jones had an early introduction to failure in the NFL. Taken behind 37 other defensive linemen in the 2013 NFL Draft, the defensive tackle was cut by two teams over a span of just 11 days. After selecting him in the sixth round with the 198th overall pick, the Houston Texans cut Jones on Aug. 31. Jones signed with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers on Sept. 1, but lasted only 10 days, as the Buccaneers released him on Sept., 10. Rather than be deterred by these early disappointments, however, Jones maintained a positive outlook when he signed with the Patriots on Sept. 11, and it has paid off in a big way. Thrust into a starting role after key injuries to the defensive line, Jones finished his rookie season with six sacks.

Jones' sudden success may have come as a surprise to some, but not to Dave Clawson, Jones' college coach at Bowling Green. Jones was part of Clawson's first recruiting class and blossomed into an All-American and two-two time captain for the Falcons. "It's hard to talk about Chris without getting a little bit emotional," Clawson told the *The Boston Herald*, "because he was that special of a player and person in our program."

JONES SAVES THE DAY; EARNS AFC HONORS

Chris Jones blocked a 58-yard field goal attempt by the Jets on the final play of the game to preserve New England's 27-25 win. It was the first blocked field goal for the Patriots since Chandler Jones blocked a 48-yard try by Minnesota's Blair Walsh earlier this season. He was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance in the victory.







DOUBLE TROUBLE: DB DEVIN McCOURTY

After being selected by the Patriots in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft, DB Devin McCourty became part of a select group in league history. McCourty's identical twin brother, Jason, is a cornerback with Tennessee, selected in the sixth round of the 2009 NFL Draft. The two are the 12th set of twins to play in the NFL. Devin redshirted for the 2005 season and therefore was a year behind his brother in eligibility. McCourty is the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 1998-2000. His twin brother, Wasswa, played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox. The McCourty twins are one of two active sets of twins playing in the NFL.

McCOURTY GOES LONG

Devin McCourty had a 104-yard kickoff return for a touchdown vs. N.Y. Jets (10/21/12), the second longest kickoff return in team history. Ellis Hobbs has the longest in team history with a 108-yard return for a touchdown at N.Y. Jets on Sept. 9, 2007. He was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance.

IN GOOD COMPANY

Devin McCourty earned Associated Press All-Pro Second Team honors at safety in 2013. He also earned Second Team All-Pro Honors as a rookie in 2010 when he played cornerback. McCourty joins Pro Football Hall of Famers Rod Woodson and Ronnie Lott as the only NFL players to earn All-Pro honors at both safety and cornerback.

McCOURTY REGISTERS CAREER LONG

DB Devin McCourty returned a first quarter interception 60 yards to the Minnesota (09/14/14) 1-yard line to set up a Patriots touchdown. It is the longest interception return of his career. He had a 50-yard return as a rookie in 2010 at Detroit (11/25) on Thanksgiving Day.



A NOSE FOR THE FOOTBALL

Ninkovich has more opponent fumble recoveries (13) over the last five seasons (2010-2014) than any other NFL player. J.J. Watt is second during that time with 11 opponent fumble recoveries.



CAREER DAY IN BUFFALO

Ninkovich finished with a three-sack game for the first time in his career in the win at Buffalo (10/12), to add to two two-sack performances vs. Miami (1/2/11) and at Carolina (11/18/13).

WHERE DID HE COME FROM?

Rob Ninkovich's journey to the Patriots was not easy. He entered the league as a fifth-round pick by the Saints in 2006 and was waived four times by New Orleans and Miami before landing in New England on Aug. 2, 2009. He spent the 2009 offseason trying to make the New Orleans team as a long snapper. Before coming to the Patriots, he had appeared in just eight games over three seasons. He doubled that total in his first year in New England, appearing in 15 games in 2009 and his role on the team has grown since, earning a starting role at linebacker in 2010 and 2011 before moving to a starting role on the defensive line in 2011.

CRAZY EIGHTS

Ninkovich raised his 2014 total to a team-high of 8.0 sacks in 2014. Ninkovich has had at least 8.0 sacks in three consecutive seasons (8.0 in 2012, 8.0 in 2013 and 8.0 in 2014), becoming the first Patriots player to have at least 8.0 sacks in three consecutive seasons since Pro Football Hall of Famer Andre Tippett achieved the feat from 1985-87 (1985, 16 1/2, 1986, 9 1/2 and 1987, 12 1/2).

NINKOVICH SCORED AS A TE IN COLLEGE

Ninkovich played some at tight end in college at Purdue and caught two touchdown passes with a 2-yard touchdown pass from Buffalo QB Kyle Orton and a 1-yard touchdown pass from former New York Giants and Indianapolis QB Curtis Painter.





HOMETOWN PATRIOTS CONNECTION

Darrelle Revis and former Patriots CB Ty Law are close friends, having both grown up in Aliquippa, Pa. Revis considers Law a close family friend. He sees Law as somewhat of an adviser.

"Ty has been a mentor through my whole life. He's a very close friend to my family. I talk to Ty all the time – about life and football. I'm just happy he's on my side and I can bounce questions off of him and ask him certain things because he has a lot of experience. Ty's always there in my corner to help me whether it's football or life. I thank Ty for that."

CLASSMATES REUNITE IN NEW ENGLAND

Defensive backs Logan Ryan and Duron Harmon are used to working together. Ryan and Harmon began their college football careers together as members of the same recruiting class at Rutgers University and developed a close friendship during their four years in Piscataway, N.J. As fate would have it, Ryan and Harmon would begin their NFL journeys together as well when the Patriots selected the two defensive backs just eight picks apart in the third round of the 2013 NFL Draft.

Reunited once again, the former Scarlet Knights are excited and eager to make their mark, just as they did at Rutgers. "We talked before the draft and said how good it would be to play on the same team again, and for it to happen again, it's exciting and it's a blessing," Harmon told *The Boston Globe.* "It's great [we're contributing], because at the end of the day you want to play, and to contribute to a team like this, it's fun."

RYAN'S FIRST PICK FOR SIX

Ryan returned his first NFL interception 79 yards for a touchdown N.Y. Jets on Oct. 20, 2013. RYAN RETURNS... TO SCHOOL

When Logan Ryan decided to leave Rutgers and enter the NFL Draft after his redshirt junior season in 2012, he made a promise to his parents that after his rookie year, he would return to school and earn his degree.

Ryan kept his promise and graduated in the spring of 2014 with a degree in labor relations and a minor in psychology.

"I committed to Rutgers, not only as a football player, but as a student, so I was going to make sure I finished that end too," Ryan told NJ.com.

"It's a big accomplishment in my life. I held my word to my parents and stuck with it and I'm fortunate. It took a lot of work, but I was able to go back and finish and walk in graduation."



FIRST NFL SACK RESULTS IN TURNOVER

Ryan forced a fumble on his first NFL sack vs. Miami (10/27/13), a week after returning his first career interception for a touchdown. Ryan strip-sacked Ryan Tannehill, forcing a fumble recovered by Rob Ninkovich that led in to a touchdown. The play marked the second time in as many weeks that a Ryan turnover led to Patriots points.

SEALED WITH A PICK

Vince Wilfork notched his third career interception (second vs. Oakland on Sept. 21) when he snared a pass that had been deflected in the final minute of the game. The play came with the Raiders having gained a first-and-goal and with Oakland trailing by seven points. Wilfork's last interception was also against Oakland, coming in a 31-19 New England victory in Oakland on Oct. 2, 2011.

THIRD TIME'S A CHARM

Vince Wilfork became the franchise's all-time leader in interceptions by a defensive lineman following his INT vs. Oakland. Wilfork became the first Patriots defensive lineman to have three interceptions.
