GAME SUMMARY

NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (12-4) vs. INDIANAPOLIS COLTS (11-5) Sunday, Jan. 18, 2015 • Gillette Stadium (68,756) • 6:40 p.m. ET

The New England Patriots advanced to their 11th AFC Championship Game, and fourth straight, after defeating the Baltimore Ravens, 35-31, in an AFC Divisional Playoff last Saturday at Gillette Stadium. Patriots QB Tom Brady will play in his ninth AFC Champi-onship Game in 13 full seasons as a starter.



The Patriots advance to the AFC Championship Game for the fourth straight season, joining Oakland (5 - 1973-77), Philadelphia (4 - 2001-04), Buffalo (4 - 1990-93) and Dallas (4 - 1970-73 and CHAMPIONSHIP) 1992-95) as the only teams to reach at least four straight conference championship games.

With the victory over Baltimore, Bill Belichick collected his 20th career playoff win, tying Tom Landry (20) for the most career postseason wins by a head coach. He advances to his ninth conference championship game, second only to the 10 by Tom Landry. The Patriots will meet Indianapolis in the AFC Championship Game for the third time. The Patriots beat the Colts, 24-14, in the 2003 AFC title game at Gillette Stadium and lost 38-34 in

the 2006 AFC title game in Indianapolis. Last year in a divisional playoff, New England defeated Indianapolis, 43-22, to move on to the conference championship game.

BROADCAST INFORMATION

TELEVISION: This week's game will be broadcast by CBS and can be seen locally on WBZ-TV Channel 4 in Boston. Jim Nantz will handle play-by-play duties with Phil Simms as the color an-alyst. Tracy Wolfson will work from the sidelines. The game will be produced by Lance Barrow and directed by Mike Arnold.

NATIONAL RADIO: This week's game will be broadcast to a national audience by Westwood One. Kevin Kugler and James Lofton will call the game with Tony Boselli providing sideline analysis

LOCAL RADIO: 98.5 FM, The Sports Hub, is the flagship station for the Patriots Radio Network. Play-by-play broadcaster Bob Socci will call the action along with former Patriots quarterback Scott Zolak, who will provide color analysis.

The Hall at Patriot Place presented by Raytheon is the crown jewel of Patriot Place and is the only sports and education experience of its kind. Through a dazzling array of interactive multimedia exhibits and artifacts never before viewable by the public, The Hall showcases the tradition of the New England Patriots, explores the history of football in New England and promotes math and science education for thousands of schoolchildren each year through its partnership with Raytheon. Several artifacts commemorating milestone moments from the 2014 season are currently showcased in a display on the third floor of The Hall at Patriot Place.

<u>ROB GRONKOWSKI</u>

Rob Gronkowski became the second-fastest player (tied with Randy Moss) in NFL history to reach 50 touchdown receptions in the team's 43-21 win vs. Denver (11/2). The previous week, Gronkowski caught three touchdown passes from Tom Brady to set a franchise record for most touchdown connections between a quarterback and receiver in the team's 51-23 win vs. Chicago (10/26). The jersey and gloves he wore for both games are on display at The Hall.



<u>STEPHEN GOSTKOWSKI</u>

Stephen Gostkowski became the Patriots all-time leader in points, passing Adam Vinatieri (1,158), with a 35-yard field goal in the Week 15 win vs. Miami (12/14). His game-worn jersey and the ball he kicked to become the Patriots all-time leading scorer are on display at The Hall.

TOM BRADY

Tom Brady became the sixth player in NFL history to reach 50,000 career passing yards after completing 23-of-35 passes for 292 yards and two touchdowns in the win vs. Cincinnati (10/5) on NBC's "Sunday Night Football." He was the fourth fastest to reach the mark, doing so in his 198th game. Brady's jersey from that game as well as the ball he threw to reach that milestone are on display at The Hall.



BILL BELICHICK

Bill Belichick earned his 200th regular season victory as a head coach after the Patriots' 30-7 win at Minnesota on Sept. 14, 2014. He became just the sixth NFL head coach to reach that mark, joining Don Shula (328), George Halas (318), Tom Landry (250), Curly Lambeau (226) and Marty Schottenheimer (200). Belichick's headset from that landmark win is on display at The Hall.

JONAS GRAY

Jonas Gray earned AFC Offensive Player of the Week honors for Week 11 after rushing for 201 yards and a team-record four rushing touchdowns in the team's 42-20 win at Indianapolis (11/16). Gray scored one touchdown in each quarter and is the only Patriots player to rush for 100 yards in each half of a game. His game-worn jersey and the ball from his record-breaking fourth touchdown, along with the *Sports Illustrated* cover commemorating his performance, are on display at The Hall.



CHRIS JONES

Chris Jones blocked a game-winning field goal attempt to preserve a Patriots' 27-25 win vs. N.Y. Jets in Week 7 (10/16) on "Thursday Night Football." The gloves that he wore in that game as well as the ball he blocked are on display at The Hall.







ROBERT KRAFT

ESTABLISHING A WINNING TRADITION

Kraft's winning percentage with the Patriots (.678) since taking over the team in 1994 is the highest among all owners/ownership groups with at least 200 wins (regular and postseason). He is just one of five owners with at least 200 wins and a winning percentage over .600.

KRAFT'S SIX CONFERENCE TITLES TIED FOR MOST OF ANY NFL OWNER IN SUPER BOWL ERA

The 2011 AFC Championship was the sixth conference championship for Robert Kraft as Patriots owner. Kraft was the first NFL owner to bring his team to six Super Bowls and his six conference championships are tied with Pat Bowlen for the most of any NFL owner in the Super Bowl Era (since 1966). Six NFL owners brought their teams to five Super Bowls, but Kraft was the first NFL owner to lead his team to six Super Bowl appearances.

★ With a victory, the Patriots will advance to their eighth Super Bowl, matching Dallas and Pittsburgh for the most Super Bowl appearances.

ROBERT KRAFT

★ With a win in the AFC Championship Game, Robert Kraft will earn his seventh conference title, which will be the most for an owner in NFL history.

* Robert Kraft is currently tied with Eddie DeBartolo, Jr. with 22 postseason wins , which is the fourth-most wins by an ownership group. He needs one more win to take sole possession of third place, behind 33 by the Rooney family, 31 by Green Bay and 24 by the Mara family.

SERIES HISTORY



The New England Patriots and Indianapolis Colts will meet in the AFC Championship Game for the third time and in the postseason for the fifth time, including the second straight year in the playoffs.

Last season, the Patriots beat Indianapolis, 43-22, on Jan. 11, 2014, in the AFC Divisional Playoffs at Gillette Stadium.

The Patriots own a 3-1 record overall against Indianapolis in the postseason, including a 3-0 record in playoff games played in New England.

The clubs have clashed in the playoffs following the 2003, 2004, 2006 and 2013 seasons. The Patriots beat the Colts in the 2003 AFC Championship Game, 24-14, at Gillette Stadium (1/18/04), won 20-3 at Gillette Stadium in a 2004 AFC Divisional game (1/16/05), lost in the 2006 AFC Championship Game, 38-34, at Indianapolis (1/21/07), and then won in the AFC Divisional meeting last year.

The Patriots traveled to Indianapolis on Nov. 16 of this season in a Sunday night game that ended in a 42-20 New England victory.

The two teams share a long-time rivalry, as the Patriots and the Baltimore/ Indianapolis Colts played twice each year from 1970 to 2001 as members of the AFC East, with the exception of the 1982 strike season.

Since realignment in 2002 with the Colts moving to the AFC South, the two teams played in the regular season in every season for 10 straight seasons from 2003 through 2012 with New England winning six of the 10 games. While they did not play in the 2013 regular season, breaking a streak of 10 regular-season meetings, they did face each other in the postseason with the Patriots claiming a 43-22 win at Gillette Stadium on Jan. 11, 2014.

Overall, this week's game will be the 79th meeting between the two teams. The Patriots lead the series with a 46-28 record in the regular season and a 3-1 record in the postseason.

New England holds an overall record of 28-12 when playing at home against the Colts, including a 7-2 record at Gillette Stadium.

The New England Patriots relied on their running game to beat the Indianapolis Colts, 42-20, in a Sunday Night Football game from Lucas Oil Stadium. The Patriots sixth-straight win improved their record to 8-2 and guaranteed a mark of at least .500 for the 14th straight season. During that time frame, every other NFL team has at least one losing season.

The Patriots relied on their running game to beat the Colts, gaining 244 yards behind a career-high of 199 yards by RB Jonas Gray and a team record four rushing touchdowns. To further emphasize the role the Patriots offensive line played, the Colts failed to register a sack in the game.

QB Tom Brady helped the Patriots score on all four of their second-half drives with two second half touchdowns. The Patriots had a fifth drive at the end of the game with backup QB Jimmy Garoppolo in to run the final 4:17 off the clock and secure the victory.

The Patriots defense held the Colts to just 19 yards rushing on 17 carries for a 1.1-yard average. The Patriots offense had 33 first downs and 501 total yards.

After stopping the Colts on three straight plays to start the game, the Patriots drove 89 yards in 11 plays before Gray scored his first NFL touchdown on a 4-yard run. Gray scored a 2-yard run in the second quarter to cap an 11-play, 68-yard drive for a 14-3 lead. That drive was set up after CB Darrelle Revis deflected a QB Andrew Luck pass that was intercepted by DB Devin McCourty.

Indianapolis closed the gap to 14-10 before the half when Colts DB Mike Adams intercepted a Brady pass at the New England 33-yard line. Three plays later, Luck hit WR Hakeem Hicks for a 10-yard touchdown.

Brady, who finished 19-of-30 for 257 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions, opened the second half with an 8-play, 80-yard drive that ended when Brady connected with TE Tim Wright on a 2-yard touchdown for a 21-10 lead.

Gray scored on a 2-yard run in the third quarter and a 1-yard run in the fourth quarter to make it 35-20. Brady put the finishing touches on the rout with a 26-yard touchdown pass to TE Rob Gronkowski.

The Patriots have averaged 40.5 points per game during their six-game winning streak.

The New England Patriots advanced to their third straight AFC Championship Game with a 43-22 victory over the Indianapolis Colts.

The Patriots ground game gained 234 yards and rushed for six touchdowns. RB LeGarrette Blount led the way, scoring a team-record four rushing touchdowns and tying a team mark for most rushing yards in a playoff game with 166 yards rushing. Blount scored on two 2-yard runs in the first quarter, a 2-yard run in the second quarter and a 73-yard run in the fourth quarter.

The Colts trailed, 21-12 at halftime, then cut the deficit to 29-22 on a 35yard touchdown pass with 5:01 left in the third quarter. The Patriots dominated the rest of the way.

The Patriots scored on their first offensive play, after CB Alfonzo Dennard picked off a Colts QB Andrew Luck pass on the game's third play from scrimmage and returned it to the 2-yard line to set up Blount's touchdown run. He scored again on the Patriots second possession for a 14-0 lead.

Indianapolis answered with a touchdown drive to make it 14-7 at the end of the first quarter. New England opened the second quarter with a 14-play, 75yard drive that ended with Blount's third touchdown on a 2-yard run for a 21-7 lead. Indianapolis added a field goal on the next series and then a safety when a bad snap sailed over the head of punter Ryan Allen. The Colts got the ball back on the free kick but Luck threw his second interception when LB Dont'a Hightower picked him off.

After a Colts field goal made it 21-15 early in the third quarter, a 3-yard touchdown run by RB Stevan Ridley gave the Patriots a 29-15 lead. Luck, who finished 20-for-41 for 331 yards, responded with a touchdown drive to close the gap to 29-22 heading into the final quarter.

Blount scored on a 73-yard run early in the fourth quarter for a 36-22 lead. LB Jamie Collins then picked off a Luck pass deep inside Indianapolis territory to help set up a Ridley touchdown run for a 43-22 lead midway through the fourth quarter.

★ Colts QB Matt Hasselbeck was an honorable mention All-America select tion by USA Today as a senior at Xaverian Brothers HS in Westwood, Mass. after completing 90-of-120 passes for 1,490 yards and seven touchdowns. He also earned three letters in basketball and two in baseball. Hasselbeck played collegiately at Boston College, where he played in 37 games with 21 starts, finishing fifth on the Eagles' career passing list with 4,548 yards. His father, Don, played tight end for the Patriots from 1977-83, while his younger brothers, Tim and Nathaniel, also played college football at Boston College. In 1992, Hasselbeck served as a ball boy for the Patriots.

★ Colts **CB Darius Butler** attended the University of Connecticut from 2004-08, where he started all 45 games he appeared in, tallying 180 tackles, three forced fumbles, 10 interceptions, 26 passes defensed and two touchdowns

Colts OL Anthony Castonzo attended Boston College, where he set a school record with 54 career starts. He was a team captain as a senior in 2010, giving up only one sack and collecting first-team All-ACC and third-team All-America honors.




Over the last 20 years, the Patriots have posted a 38-9 record in games where the kickoff temperature is 34 degrees or colder and are 11-2 in postseason cold-weather games. When snow is in the forecast, the Patriots are virtually unbeatable. New England has never lost a snow game in Foxborough in the history of its franchise, posting an 11-O record in those games and outscoring their opponents by a margin of 257-77. The club has won 12 consecutive snow games under Head Coach Bill Belichick, including three straight postseason games, and has yet to lose a game in the snow on the road or at home since Belichick became head coach in 2000.

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. Now in his 21st season of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games [.238 pct.] and logging the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994,

Kraft announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles (14), conference crowns (6) and Super Bowl championships (3) than any other NFL team. The Patriots have made six Super Bowl appearances since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other team has earned more than four berths. In Kraft's 21 seasons, the Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 16 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons.

In 1991, the season ticket base was just 17,635, barely enough to support the club. Now, the season tickets are capped and more than 50,000 fans are on a season ticket waiting list. The Patriots have sold out 227 consecutive home games, including playoff and preseason games (dating back to the 1994 season opener).

MILESTONE WIN FOR KRAFT

The victory over the New York Jets (12/21/14) was the 250th win under Robert Kraft. His 250 wins in his first 368 total games tied Chicago's George Halas for the fastest an owner has reached 250 victories.



Kraft's success as an owner has brought the Patriots a great increase in national recognition. Prior to Kraft's ownership, the Patriots had been featured on the cover of just four issues of Sports Illustrated [1966, 1977, 1981 and 1986). Since 1994, New England has graced the cover a total of 29 times, including 17 that feature Tom Brady alone.







RECORD HOME STREAK ENDS

New England's loss to Buffalo ended a streak of 35 straight wins at home against AFC opponents. The 35 straight home wins against a conference foe is the longest in NFL history (following the 1970 merger). The Miami Dolphins are second in NFL history with 21 straight home conference wins (1971-1974). Prior the loss to Buffalo, the Patriots last loss at home against an AFC opponent was a 33-10 loss vs. Pittsburgh on Nov. 30, 2008.

Since the beginning of 2003, the Patriots are 37-4 (.902) in regular-season games following a loss, including 10 straight wins following a defeat since 2012. The Patriots have dropped back-to-back regular season games just four times since 2003 (2006, 2009, 2011 and 2012). As a starter in his career, Tom Brady is 38-8 in games following a loss.

GROUND CONTROL

The Patriots rushed for 200 yards in a game two times in 2014 with 220 yards in the win vs. Cincinnati on Oct. 5 and 246 yards in the win at Indianapolis on Nov. 16. The Patriots are 65-7 all-time when rushing for 200 yards or more and are 12-0 under Bill Belihcick when rushing for 200 yards or more.

SEASON-HIGH OUTPUT

The Patriots scored a season-high 51 points vs. Chicago on Oct. 26, 2014. It is the seventh time the Patriots have scored at least 50 points in the last eight seasons (2007-14). In that span, no other team has more than three games with 50 points.

THE NUMBERS 2

Stephen Gostkowski executed a successful onside kick in a victory vs. Cleveland (12/8/13) for only the second time in team history. The first came when Jim Lee Hunt recovered a Gino Cappelletti kick at the end of the first half in a 26-10 win vs. the NY Jets (9/27/64).

Jonas Gray is the third player in NFL history to have at least 37 carries, 200 yards rushing and four rushing touchdowns in a single game, joining Mike Anderson of Denver in 2000 and Corey Dillon of Cincinnati in 1997. Gray gained 201 yards rushing on 37 carries with four touchdowns in the win at Indianapolis on Nov. 16.

The Patriots scored three touchdowns in a 57-second span vs. Chicago on Oct. 26. The Patriots are one of three teams to score three touchdowns in under a minute since the 1970 merger, and are the only team to have achieved the feat twice.

The Patriots scored 31 points in the second quarter of the 51-23 win vs. Chicago (10/26/14), marking the fourth time in team history that the team has scored 30 or more points in a quarter.

The Patriots became the first team in NFL history in 2014 to earn five straight first round byes. Dallas and San Francisco earned four straight byes from 1992 through 1995.

The Patriots blocked five total kicks in $\overline{2014}$ with four field goals and one punt and returned two of the blocked field goals for touchdowns. 5

The Patriots finished with a 12-4 record in 2014. It is the ninth time in team history that the team won 12 or more wins and the fifth straight season that the team has had 12 or more wins.



Brady was named to the Pro Bowl for the 10th time, the most Pro Bowl selections in team history. He was tied with Patriots and Pro Football Hall of Famer John Hannah with nine selections. It is Brady's sixth consecutive selection to the all-star game. He was voted to the Pro Bowl after each of the following seasons: 2001, 2004, 2005, 2007, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012,

2013 and now, 2014. Brady finished the season with 4,109 yards and 33 touchdown passes. He joined Drew Brees (9) and Peyton Manning (14) as the only NFL players to have at least seven seasons with 4,000 passing yards. Brady also guided the Patriots to their 12th division title of his career, the most by a quarter-back in NFL history.

Gostkowski was named to the Pro Bowl for the third time in his career and for the second straight season. He finished the season with an NFL-leading 156 points. He also led the NFL in points in 2008, 2012 and 2013, becoming just the third player to lead the NFL in points in at least four seasons. Gostkowski became the Patriots' all-time leading scorer vs. Miami (12/14) and currently has 1,179 career points. He was 35-of-37 on field goals in 2014 for a 94.6 field goal percentage, the highest field goal percentage in team history for a season.

Gronkowski was named to the Prow Bowl for the third time after being selected to the Pro Bowl in 2011 and 2012. He led all NFL tight ends in 2014 with 1,124 yards on 82 receptions with 12 touchdowns. He became the first tight end in NFL history with four seasons of 10 or more touchdowns. He is the second tight end in NFL history to have two 1,000-yard and 10-plus touchdowns in a single season.

Revis was named to his sixth career Pro Bowl and his sixth Pro Bowl in the last seven seasons. He was previously voted to the Pro Bowl following the 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2013 seasons. Revis leads the NFL with 123 passes defensed since he entered the NFL in 2007. He played a key role in a Patriots defense that is ranked 13th overall and eighth in the NFL by allowing just 19.6 points per game.

Slater earned his fourth consecutive Pro Bowl selection. A productive member of the Patriots special teams units since joining the squad as a fifth-round draft pick out of UCLA in 2008, Slater has become a leader after being voted special teams captain each of the last four years. He has now led the Patriots in special teams tackles for four of the last five seasons, including a team-high 14 in 2014.



In the 2007 season, Belichick led the Patriots to the fourth undefeated and untied regular season in NFL history and the first since the NFL established a 16-game schedule in 1978. His 40 consecutive years as an NFL coach are second in NFL history to 42 by Pittsburgh defensive coordinator Dick LeBeau.

Bill Belichick has recorded 231 career wins, which is fourth all-time in NFL history. Belichick owns a career winning percentage of .662, which is third all-time, behind George Halas (.682) and Don Shula (.667).

3X COACH OF THE YEAR

The Associated Press named Bill Belichick the NFL's Coach of the Year in 2010, the third time that Belichick earned the honor. He was also named Coach of the Year following the 2003 and 2007 seasons, joining Don Shula (4-time winner) and Chuck Knox as the only three-time winners.

BELICHICK ADDED TO HIS RECORD IN 2014

Bill Belichick has coached the Patriots to 12 straight seasons with 10 or more wins after reaching his 10th win of the 2014 season at San Diego (12/7/14), adding to his NFL record streak. In 2011, Belichick became the first coach in NFL history with nine straight seasons with at least 10 victories. George Seifert has the second most consecutive 10-win seasons with eight from 1989-1996 for San Francisco.

DIVISION TITLES RECORD

Bill Belichick guided the Patriots to the AFC East title in 2014. His 12 division titles are the most by a head coach since the 1970 merger. Don Shula is second with 11 division titles since the merger.

FIRST WITH 14 WINS IN 4 SEASONS

Bill Belichick guided the Patriots to an NFL-best 14-2 record in 2010, becoming the first head coach ever to win at least 14 regular-season games in four separate seasons. Only four other coaches — San Francisco's George Seifert (3), Washington's Joe Gibbs (2), Chicago's Mike Ditka (2) and Miami's Don Shula (2) — have more than one 14-win season.



IVY LEAGUE JOURNEY

An lvy League defensive lineman standout at Brown, James Develin graduated in 2010 with a degree in chemical engineering and began lining up interviews with companies he felt might be best suited for the technical skills. However, Develin wanted to give football one last shot, and play in the NFL.

"Football is something that is not around your entire life," Develin told *The Boston Globe.* "I knew if I didn't give it my best shot to play football as a career, that I'd always regret it." Develin made the most of his opportunity by switching positions to fullback. Following stints in the Arena Football League and the now defunct United Football League, Develin caught on with the Cincinnati Bengals practice squad and eventually worked his way to the Patriots 53-man roster full-time in 2013.

His offensive numbers broke Kent State's single-season record for total offense set by Joshua Cribbs in 2003. Said head coach Bill Belichick on the versatility of Edelman: "He played the quarterback position in college at Kent State and all the positions really that he's played in the NFL - covering kicks, returning kicks, slot receiver, outside receiver, slot defender - he didn't do any of those things in college. I think that really speaks to his versatility and how much he's grown as a player and how many things he's learned how to do that he really didn't have much experience with in college. I'd say that's pretty unusual, especially to be as competent in them as he is."

EDELMAN TAKES HIS FATHER'S ADVICE

If there is one thing Julian Edelman has never lacked, it's athletic ability. A dual-threat quarterback at Kent State and former baseball standout in high school, Edelman once wowed Toronto Blue Jays players with his impressive footwork while fielding ground balls in an appearance at batting practice in 2011.

This natural ability may have been overlooked by NFL scouts, who let him fall to the Patriots in the seventh round of the 2009 NFL Draft. Edelman remains focused on the lessons his father, Frank Edelman, taught him at a young age. "I'm still constantly trying to learn," Edelman told *The Boston Herald.* "My dad always put it in my head, when you're green, you're growing, when you're ripe, you're lost. When you're done learning, you're done."

EDELMAN ECLIPSES 1,000-YARDS

EDELMAN GOES LONG

WR Julian Edelman set a career-high with a 69-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter at San Diego (12/7/14). His previous best was a 56-yard touchdown at the New York Jets on Nov. 22, 2012. Edelman's 69-yard touchdown was the longest of the season for the Patriots. Tom Brady threw a 56-yard touchdown pass to WR Brandon LaFell at Buffalo on Oct. 12.

EDELMAN GOES OVER 100

Edelman finished with eight receptions for a career-high 141 yards at San Diego (12/7) for his fifth career 100-yard game and his first of the 2014 season .



GAROPPOLO FIRSTS

Jimmy Garoppolo saw his first game action at Kansas City (9/29/14) and engineered a 7-play, 81-yard drive that included a 37-yard pass to WR Brandon LaFell before he culminated the drive with a 13-yard touchdown pass to TE Rob Gronkowski.



GRAY MATTERS

RB Jonas Gray set a team record with four rushing touchdowns at Indianapolis (11/16), his first touchdowns of his career, in his second NFL start. LeGarrette Blount set a Patriots postseason record with four rushing touchdowns vs. Indianapolis in the 2013 AFC Divisional Playoff game.

GRAY IN THE (END) ZONE

RB Jonas Gray capped an 11-play, 89-yard drive with his first NFL touchdown on a 4-yard run on the Patriots first offensive drive of the game at Indianapolis (11/16). He scored his second touchdown on a 2-yard run in the second quarter. He scored his third touchdown on a 2-yard run in the third quarter and added his fourth touchdown on a 1-yard run in the fourth quarter.

100 YARDS IN EACH HALF

Jonas Gray became the first Patriots player to ever have at least 100 yards rushing in each half at Indianapolis (11/21). He gained 100 yards in the first half and 101 yards in the second half. The Patriots have had two other players with 200 yard games - Tony Collins 212 (128 first half, 84 second half) on Sept. 18, 1983 vs. NY Jets and Jim Nance 208 (159 first half, 49 second half) on Oct. 30, 1966 vs. Oakland.

GRAY MAKES HISTORY

Jonas Gray is the first NFL player to score his first four career rushing touchdowns in one game since Herb Henderson of the Evansville Crimson Giants in 1921.

MOVING THE CHAINS

Jonas Gray had 15 rushing first downs at Indianapolis (11/21) to tie an NFL single-game record. Corey Dillon in 1997 with Cincinnati and Edgerrin James in 2000 with Indianapolis also had 15 rushing first downs in a game. Gray set the Patriots team mark, besting 10 rushing first downs by Curtis Martin (two times) and Stevan Ridley (two times).

RECEIVING YARDS RECORD

Rob Gronkowski finished the 2011 season with 1,327 receiving yards, surpassing San Diego's Kellen Winslow's 1980 record of 1,290 receiving yards for most receiving yards in a season by a tight end. He is the ninth NFL tight end and the first Patriots tight end with two 1,000-yard seasons.



FIRST TIGHT END TO SCORE A RUSH TD

Gronkowski scored a 2-yard touchdown on a lateral from Tom Brady in the third quarter vs. Indianapolis (12/4/11), becoming the first tight end in Patriots history to score a rushing touchdown. Gronkowski is the first NFL tight end to score a rushing touchdown since Tennessee's Bo Scaife had a 31-yard scoring run against Baltimore on Nov. 12, 2006. He is the first tight end since the 1970 merger to have two receiving touchdowns and a rushing touchdown in the same game.

Gronkowski recorded his 50th career touchdown reception in his 59th career game - 33 games (or two full seasons) earlier than the next fastest tight end. Antonio Gates reached 50 touchdown receptions in 92 games. Additionally, Gronkowski is the fifth player in NFL history to have 50 or more touchdown catches in his first five seasons, joining Jerry Rice, Randy Moss, Lance Alworth and Andre Rison.

LAFELL FINDS THE END ZONE

WR Brandon LaFell scored his first touchdown with the Patriots on a 44yard touchdown pass from Tom Brady in the third quarter at Kansas City [9/29/14].

HITTING THE CENTURY MARK

LaFell finished the game against Kansas City (9/29) with six receptions for 119 yards for his first 100-yard day as a Patriot and the third 100-yard day of his career. He had his fourth career 100-yard day vs. Chicago (10/26), setting a career-high with 11 receptions for 124 yards.

TWICE AS NICE

WR Brandon LaFell scored two touchdowns on an 18-yard pass and a 56yard pass in the fourth quarter at Buffalo on Oct. 12, 2014. It was his second two-touchdown game of his career. He had two touchdowns with Carolina vs. the New York Giants on Sept. 22, 2013. He added his third two-touchdown game at Green Bay on Nov. 30.

CAREER DAY FOR LAFELL

Brandon LaFell had 11 receptions for 124 yards vs. Chicago (10/26/14), setting career highs in each category. LaFell's 11 topped his previous career high of seven receptions last season for Carolina when they played New England on Nov. 18, 2013. His 124 yards topped his previous career high of 119 yards, set at Kansas City on Sept. 29, 2014.

LAFELL REWRITES PERSONAL RECORD BOOK

Brandon LaFell set career high season marks in receptions, yards and touchdowns in 2014. He finished the 2014 season with 74 receptions for 953 yards and seven touchdowns. LaFell's previous high in receptions was 49 in 2013, his previous best in yards was 677 in 2012 and his previous best in touchdowns was five in 2013.

SLATER'S EMERGENCE WAS SPECIAL

Bill Belichick acknowledged Matthew Slater's role as a gunner on special teams: "Matt is one of the best in the league," Belichick said. "Any time the punt return team has to double somebody, that makes it one less guy they can use somewhere else in the return. He almost always draws two guys out there unless they're in an eight-man rush. Most of the time, there's two guys out there — fourth-and-short, where they're trying to protect the box — but he draws a lot of double teams, and deservedly so. He does an outstanding job of covering punts."



ELECTED TEAM LEADER

Patriots wide receiver Matthew Slater has been named to four straight Pro Bowls (2011-14) for his special teams work, but perhaps more revealing of his value to New England is the fact that he has been elected a captain by his teammates for the fourth straight season in 2014.

The special teams ace was willing to share his advice on being a great captain with high school football players in a story published by *The Boston Globe*. "I think first and foremost, you have to be able to put others before yourself. Being a captain and leadership is about serving, and to me, that means a great deal of sacrifice – putting aside personal agendas for the greater common goal. Leadership is equated with sacrifice. I think you have to be willing to do whatever it takes for the unit to succeed. I think you need to lead by example. A lot of times, it's about what you do, not what you say."

SLATER ON BILL BELICHICK

"Guys have really bought into what we're trying to do here and believing in the goals that we've set to accomplish. We try not to acknowledge all the noise and hype surrounding ballgames. We prepare ourselves to have success by the way we work day-in and day-out on the field and in the meeting room, but it definitely starts with our leadership on this team."



FIRST NFL TD

WR Brian Tyms scored his first NFL touchdown on a 43-yard reception from Tom Brady in the win at Buffalo (10/12). He entered the game with two career receptions for 12 yards in seven games. In total for 2014, Tyms had all five recpetions for 82 yards, all coming against the Bills.



2011 FIRST ROUND PICK NATE SOLDER

It only took a day for Nate Solder to decide to change from his lifelong position of tight end to tackle after playing his freshman year at Colorado as a tight end. "My coaches came to me and said, 'You'd be an all right tight end, but you'd be an even better tackle," he told the *Boston Globe.* "I've always wanted to be great, so that's why I moved to tackle."

He added over 30 pounds after his redshirt freshman season and was named the team's starting left tackle. He played in 2,540 of 2,542 offensive plays over the next three seasons at Colorado and became an immediate contributor on the Patriots offensive line at right tackle as a rookie before moving to left tackle.



VEREEN SETS TWO RECORDS IN ONE GAME

Shane Vereen had 12 receptions for 153 yards vs. Cleveland on Dec. 8, 2013, setting a single-game franchise record for most receptions and most receiving yards by a running back.

RYAN WENDELL LEADS THE NFL IN PLAY SNAPS IN 2012

Ryan Wendell played a league-high 1,249 snaps in 2012 and it helped earn him a spot on the *USA Today* All-Joe team. Said Wendell: "I think first it says a lot about the organization, our training staff and our strength training coaches, that they do everything they can all season and all off-season and during the spring to keep us healthy throughout the whole season. I think it says more about them than it does about me individually."



WHAT'S IN A NUMBER?

When Arrington was first making the transition from Hofstra to the NFL in 2008, he was assigned jersey No. 42. At that point in his career, he was cut by both the Eagles and Buccaneers. When Arrington first arrived in New England as a practice squad player in 2009, he initially donned No. 27. But when No. 24 became available, a result of Jonathan Wilhite leaving in free agency after the 2010 season, Arrington pounced on it.

The reason is that it reflects how he's flipped his NFL fortunes – from a No. 42 struggling to hang on to a No. 24 who has carved out a role on a winning team. Arrington moved from 24 to 25 in an agreement with Adrian Wilson in 2013 to accommodate the veteran's desire to keep the same jersey he had worn during his 12-year NFL career.

ARRINGTON SCORES AGAIN

DB Kyle Arrington has two touchdowns in 2014. He returned a Cincinnati fumble (10/5/14) forced by Brandon Bolden on a third-quarter kickoff 9 yards for a touchdown and returned a blocked field goal 62 yards for a touchdown vs. Miami (12/14). He has four career touchdowns. He returned a blocked field goal 35 yards for a touchdown at Miami (10/4/10) and returned his first career interception 36 yards for a touchdown vs. Green Bay (12/19/10).



JAMIE COLLINS' JOURNEY

The road to the NFL has been anything but easy for linebacker and 2013 second-round draft pick Jamie Collins. The youngest of five siblings growing up in Meadville, Miss., Collins lost both of his parents when he was six years old and was raised by one of his sisters, who was in her mid 20s.

Collins turned to football as an outlet to help him through the tough times. "It means a lot. It's my living," Collins told *The Boston Herald.* "It kept me on track." Collins' resiliency in dealing with adversity has made a lasting impact on fellow Mississippi native Stevan Ridley, who grew up 30 miles west of Meadville in Natchez, Miss., and got to know Collins through a family friend. "What I've known about him, he really has been a strong person," Ridley told the *Herald.* "Anybody that's gone through the things that he's gone through and can still find a way to be successful on the football field, you have to be mentally tough. That's what he's kind of done as a teammate here. He's come in here and accepted his role and did a pretty good job as a rookie."

COLLINS RECORDS FIRST INT

LB Jamie Collins intercepted a Kyle Orton pass in the win at Buffalo (10/12), marking his first regular-season interception. He had his second of the year at the Jets on Dec. 21. His first career pick came last year in the AFC Divisional Playoff vs. Indianapolis (1/11/14).

COLLINS' FIRST TWO-SACK GAME

LB Jamie Collins registered his first NFL two-sack game with a 9-yard sack in the first quarter and a 9-yard sack in the second quarter against San Diego (12/7). It was the fourth time in 2014 that a Patriots player had a multiple sack game. LB Dont'a Hightower had two sacks at Minnesota (9/14), DE Chandler Jones had two sacks at Minnesota (9/14) and DL Rob Ninkovich had three sacks at Buffalo (10/12).

TEAM LEADER



As a first round draft pick, Dont'a Hightower is used to high expectations. Hightower went to training camp with jersey #45 but was switched to jersey #54 prior to the start of his rookie year in 2012. Former LB Tedy Bruschi wore #54 for 13 seasons.

Hightower understands the importance of the number and hopes to live up to its legacy. "I definitely feel honored to be able to wear this number," Hightower said. "I've read that Tedy didn't want it to be retired and he hoped another



linebacker would come in and be able to wear this number and be able to play as well. I feel honored. Tedy was a great player, and he means a lot to this organization. I'm definitely proud to be able to wear this number."

HIGHTOWER HAS A CAREER FIRST

LB Dont'a Hightower registered his first career two-sack game at Minnesota [09/14/14].

HIGHTOWER SETS CAREER HIGH

LB Dont'a Hightower registered a 9-yard sack of Green Bay QB Aaron Rodgers in the second quarter to set a career high with 4½ sacks in 2014. He now has 6.0 sacks for the year. His previous best was four sacks as a rookie in 2012.





FOLLOWING IN BROTHERS' FOOTSTEPS

Chandler Jones has two brothers, Arthur, a fifth-round NFL Draft selection by the Baltimore Ravens in 2010 (currently with the Indianapolis Colts), who was a Syracuse defensive tackle, and Jon "Bones" Jones, a UFC fighter and the reigning Lightweight Champion.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Chandler Jones was named AFC Defensive Player of the Week for his performance in the Patriots' 30-7 victory at Minnesota on Sept. 14, 2014. It was the first time in Jones' career that he has received an AFC Player of the Week honor. He was named AFC Defensive Player of the Month for November last season and NFL Defensive Rookie of the Month in September 2012.

Jones blocked a 48-yard field goal attempt and returned it 58 yards for a touchdown to give New England a 24-7 halftime lead at Minnesota (9/14). He also finished the game with eight total tackles and his fifth career two-sack game.

The last time the Patriots earned an AFC Defensive Player of the Week honor was Week 10 of the 2011 season when Andre Carter tied a team record with four sacks at N.Y. Jets (11/13/11).

JONES ACHIEVES TRIFECTA

DL Chandler Jones blocked a second-quarter Minnesota 48-yard field goal attempt, recovered the loose ball and returned it 58 yards for a touchdown. It was the fifth blocked field goal returned for a touchdown in Patriots history and the first returned for a touchdown since S Patrick Chung blocked a field goal attempt that was returned 35 yards for a touchdown by DB Kyle Arrington at Miami on Oct. 4, 2010. It is the second field goal block by Jones. He blocked a 39-yard attempt vs. Miami on Oct. 27, 2013. It was Jones' second career touchdown. He recovered an errant shotgun snap squibbed into the end zone at Baltimore on Dec. 22, 2013.

MULTIPLE SACKS FOR JONES

Jones finished with his fifth career two-sack game at Minnesota (09/14/14). He had three two-sack games in 2013.



THIRD TEAM'S A CHARM

Chris Jones had an early introduction to failure in the NFL. Taken behind 37 other defensive linemen in the 2013 NFL Draft, the defensive tackle was cut by two teams over a span of just 11 days. After selecting him in the sixth round with the 198th overall pick, the Houston Texans cut Jones on Aug. 31. Jones signed with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers on Sept. 1, but lasted only 10 days, as the Buccaneers released him on Sept., 10. Rather than be deterred by these early disappointments, however, Jones maintained a positive outlook when he signed with the Patriots on Sept. 11, and it has paid off in a big way. Thrust into a starting role after key injuries to the defensive line, Jones finished his rookie season with six sacks.

Jones' sudden success may have come as a surprise to some, but not to Dave Clawson, Jones' college coach at Bowling Green. Jones was part of Clawson's first recruiting class and blossomed into an All-American and two-two time captain for the Falcons. "It's hard to talk about Chris without getting a little bit emotional," Clawson told the *The Boston Herald*, "because he was that special of a player and person in our program."

JONES SAVES THE DAY; EARNS AFC HONORS

Chris Jones blocked a 58-yard field goal attempt by the Jets on the final play of the game to preserve New England's 27-25 win. It was the first blocked field goal for the Patriots since Chandler Jones blocked a 48-yard try by Minnesota's Blair Walsh earlier this season. He was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance in the victory.





DOUBLE TROUBLE: DB DEVIN McCOURTY

After being selected by the Patriots in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft, DB Devin McCourty became part of a select group in league history. McCourty's identical twin brother, Jason, is a cornerback with Tennessee, selected in the sixth round of the 2009 NFL Draft. The two are the 12th set of twins to play in the NFL. Devin redshirted for the 2005 season and therefore was a year behind his brother in eligibility. McCourty is the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 1998-2000. His twin brother, Wasswa, played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox. The McCourty twins are one of two active sets of twins playing in the NFL.

McCOURTY GOES LONG

Ellis Hobbs has the longest in team history with a 108-yard return for a touchdown at N.Y. Jets on Sept. 9, 2007. He was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance.

Devin McCourty earned Associated Press All-Pro Second Team honors at safety in 2013. He also earned Second Team All-Pro Honors as a rookie in 2010 when he played cornerback. McCourty joins Pro Football Hall of Famers Rod Woodson and Ronnie Lott as the only NFL players to earn All-Pro honors at both safety and cornerback.

McCOURTY REGISTERS CAREER LONG

DB Devin McCourty returned a first quarter interception 60 yards to the Minnesota (09/14/14) 1-yard line to set up a Patriots touchdown. It is the longest interception return of his career. He had a 50-yard return as a rookie in 2010 at Detroit (11/25) on Thanksgiving Day.



A NOSE FOR THE FOOTBALL

Ninkovich has more opponent fumble recoveries (13) over the last five seasons (2010-2014) than any other NFL player. J.J. Watt is second during that time with 11 opponent fumble recoveries.



CAREER DAY IN BUFFALO

Ninkovich finished with a three-sack game for the first time in his career in the win at Buffalo (10/12), to add to two two-sack performances vs. Miami (1/2/11) and at Carolina (11/18/13).

WHERE DID HE COME FROM?

Rob Ninkovich's journey to the Patriots was not easy. He entered the league as a fifth-round pick by the Saints in 2006 and was waived four times by New Orleans and Miami before landing in New England on Aug. 2, 2009. He spent the 2009 offseason trying to make the New Orleans team as a long snapper. Before coming to the Patriots, he had appeared in just eight games over three seasons. He doubled that total in his first year in New England, appearing in 15 games in 2009 and his role on the team has grown since, earning a starting role at linebacker in 2010 and 2011 before moving to a starting role on the defensive line in 2011.

CRAZY EIGHTS

Ninkovich raised his 2014 total to a team-high of 8.0 sacks in 2014. Ninkovich has had at least 8.0 sacks in three consecutive seasons (8.0 in 2012, 8.0 in 2013 and 8.0 in 2014), becoming the first Patriots player to have at least 8.0 sacks in three consecutive seasons since Pro Football Hall of Famer Andre Tippett achieved the feat from 1985-87 (1985, 16 1/2, 1986, 9 1/2 and 1987, 12 1/2).

NINKOVICH SCORED AS A TE IN COLLEGE

Ninkovich played some at tight end in college at Purdue and caught two touchdown passes with a 2-yard touchdown pass from Buffalo QB Kyle Orton and a 1-yard touchdown pass from former New York Giants and Indianapolis QB Curtis Painter.





HOMETOWN PATRIOTS CONNECTION

Darrelle Revis and former Patriots CB Ty Law are close friends, having both grown up in Aliquippa, Pa. Revis considers Law a close family friend. He sees Law as somewhat of an adviser.

"Ty has been a mentor through my whole life. He's a very close friend to my family. I talk to Ty all the time – about life and football. I'm just happy he's on my side and I can bounce questions off of him and ask him certain things because he has a lot of experience. Ty's always there in my corner to help me whether it's football or life. I thank Ty for that."

CLASSMATES REUNITE IN NEW ENGLAND

Defensive backs Logan Ryan and Duron Harmon are used to working together. Ryan and Harmon began their college football careers together as members of the same recruiting class at Rutgers University and developed a close friendship during their four years in Piscataway, N.J. As fate would have it, Ryan and Harmon would begin their NFL journeys together as well when the Patriots selected the two defensive backs just eight picks apart in the third round of the 2013 NFL Draft.

Reunited once again, the former Scarlet Knights are excited and eager to make their mark, just as they did at Rutgers. "We talked before the draft and said how good it would be to play on the same team again, and for it to happen again, it's exciting and it's a blessing," Harmon told *The Boston Globe.* "It's great [we're contributing], because at the end of the day you want to play, and to contribute to a team like this, it's fun."



PATRIOTS DEFENSIVE

RYAN'S FIRST PICK FOR SIX

RYAN RETURNS... TO SCHOOL

When Logan Ryan decided to leave Rutgers and enter the NFL Draft after his redshirt junior season in 2012, he made a promise to his parents that after his rookie year, he would return to school and earn his degree.

Ryan kept his promise and graduated in the spring of 2014 with a degree in labor relations and a minor in psychology.

"I committed to Rutgers, not only as a football player, but as a student, so I was going to make sure I finished that end too," Ryan told NJ.com.

"It's a big accomplishment in my life. I held my word to my parents and stuck with it and I'm fortunate. It took a lot of work, but I was able to go back and finish and walk in graduation."

FIRST NFL SACK RESULTS IN TURNOVER

Ryan forced a fumble on his first NFL sack vs. Miami (10/27/13), a week after returning his first career interception for a touchdown. Ryan strip-sacked Ryan Tannehill, forcing a fumble recovered by Rob Ninkovich that led in to a touchdown. The play marked the second time in as many weeks that a Ryan turnover led to Patriots points.



REASONS FOR TEAM SUCCESS

Patriots Pro Bowl DL Vince Wilfork, who has served as a defensive captain for the Patriots for seven straight seasons, says the team's continued success is a result of the entire organization working towards one common goal:

"The Patriots are all about team, family and smart football players. They try to get good people here from coaches to guys who work in the front office to guys who put on this uniform. I think everybody has to have one goal in mind, and that's to be together. When you get an organization together that is seeking one goal, you can be pretty successful."



SEALED WITH A PICK

Vince Wilfork notched his third career interception (second vs. Oakland on Sept. 21) when he snared a pass that had been deflected in the final minute of the game. The play came with the Raiders having gained a first-and-goal and with Oakland trailing by seven points. Wilfork's last interception was also against Oakland, coming in a 31-19 New England victory in Oakland on Oct. 2, 2011.

THIRD TIME'S A CHARM

Vince Wilfork became the franchise's all-time leader in interceptions by a defensive lineman following his INT vs. Oakland. Wilfork became the first Patriots defensive lineman to have three interceptions.
