PATRIOTS ADVANCE TO EIGHTH SUPER BOWL; SEVENTH OF KRAFT ERA

Robert Kraft is the first owner in NFL history to have his team in seven Super Bowls. The seven Super Bowl appearances since Kraft purchased the team in 1994 are the most in the league over that span. Pittsburgh is second with four. New England has advanced to its eighth Super Bowl overall, a total that is tied with Dallas and Pittsburgh for the most Super Bowl berths in league history.

GAME SUMMARY

NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (12-4) vs. SEATTLE SEAHAWKS (12-4)

Sunday, Feb 1, 2015 • University of Phoenix Stadium (70.500) • 6:30 p.m. ET

The New England Patriots advanced to the Super Bowl for the eighth time in franchise history, tying Dallas and Pittsburgh for the most Super Bowl berths. The Patriots reached their seventh Super Bowl under the ownership of Robert Kraft, setting a new NFL record for most conference championships as an owner.

Head coach Bill Belichick won his sixth conference title as a head coach, tying Miami's Don Shula for the most by any coach in NFL history. Tom Brady won his sixth conference championship, passing John Elway (5) for the most conference titles by a starting quarterback.

The Patriots will seek their fourth Super Bowl title when they face off against the defending Super Bowl Champion Seattle Seahawks in Super Bowl XLIX.

Super Bowl XLIX will feature the top two seeded teams for the fifth time since the current playoff format was instituted in 1990 and for the 11th time since playoff seeding was introduced in 1975. It is the second consecutive season that the top two seeds will meet in the Super Bowl and the second time in NFL history that the Super Bowl will feature the top two seeds in back to back seasons. The top two seeds from each conference also met in Super Bowls XXVIII and XIX.

BROADCAST INFORMATION

<u>TELEVISION:</u> Super Bowl XLIX will be broadcast by **NBC** and can be seen locally on **WHDH-TV**Channel 7 in Boston. Al Michaels will handle play-by-play duties with **Cris Collinsworth** as the color analyst. **Michael Tafoya** will work from the sidelines. The game will be produced by **Fred Gaudelli** and directed by **Drew Esocoff**.

NATIONAL RADIO: This week's game will be broadcast to a national audience by Westwood One. Kevin Harlan and Boomer Esiason will call the game with James Lofton providing sideline analysis for the NFC and Mark Malone providing sideline analysis on the AFC team.

LOCAL RADIO: 98.5 FM, The Sports Hub, is the flagship station for the Patriots Radio Network. Play-by-play broadcaster Bob Socci will call the action along with former Patriots quarterback Scott Zolak, who will provide color analysis.

PATRIOTS IN THE SUPER BOWL

The New England Patriots earned a record-tying eighth Super Bowl berth with a 45-7 with over the Indianapolis Colts in the AFC Championship Game. The Patriots are 3-4 in seven Super Bowl appearances.

The Hall at Patriot Place presented by Raytheon is the crown jewel of Patriot Place and is the only sports and education experience of its kind. Through a dazzling array of interactive multimedia exhibits and artifacts never before viewable by the public, The Hall showcases the tradition of the New England Patriots, explores the history of football in New England and promotes math and science education for thousands of school-children each year through its partnership with Raytheon. Several artifacts commemorating milestone moments from the 2014 season are currently showcased in a display on the third floor of The Hall at Patriot Place.

ROB GRONKOWSKI

Rob Gronkowski became the second-fastest player (tied with Randy Moss) in NFL history to reach 50 touchdown receptions in the team's 43-21 win vs. Denver [11/2]. The previous week, Gronkowski caught three touchdown passes from Tom Brady to set a franchise record for most touchdown connections between a quarterback and receiver in the team's 51-23 win vs. Chicago [10/26]. The jersey and gloves he wore for both games are on display at The Hall.



STEPHEN GOSTKOWSKI

Stephen Gostkowski became the Patriots all-time leader in points, passing Adam Vinatieri (1,158), with a 35-yard field goal in the Week 15 win vs. Miami (12/14). His game-worn jersey and the ball he kicked to become the Patriots all-time leading scorer are on display at The Hall.

TOM BRADY

Tom Brady became the sixth player in NFL history to reach 50,000 career passing yards after completing 23-of-35 passes for 292 yards and two touchdowns in the win vs. Cincinnati (10/5) on NBC's "Sunday Night Football." He was the fourth fastest to reach the mark, doing so in his 198th game. Brady's jersey from that game as well as the ball he threw to reach that milestone are on display at The Hall.



BILL BELICHICK

Bill Belichick earned his 200th regular season victory as a head coach after the Patriots' 30-7 win at Minnesota on Sept. 14, 2014. He became just the sixth NFL head coach to reach that mark, joining Don Shula (328), George Halas (318), Tom Landry (250), Curly Lambeau (226) and Marty Schottenheimer (200). Belichick's headset from that landmark win is on display at The Hall.

JONAS GRAY

Jonas Gray earned AFC Offensive Player of the Week honors for Week 11 after rushing for 201 yards and a team-record four rushing touchdowns in the team's 42-20 win at Indianapolis (11/16). Gray scored one touchdown in each quarter and is the only Patriots player to rush for 100 yards in each half of a game. His game-worn jersey and the ball from his record-breaking fourth touchdown, along with the Sports Illustrated cover commemorating his performance, are on display at The Hall.





PATRIOTS IN THE PLAYOFFS

PATRIOTS CLINCH PLAYOFF SPOT FOR 16th TIME IN KRAFT'S 21 YEARS OF OWNERSHIP

New England has now qualified for the playoffs 22 times in its 55-year history. The Patriots have earned 16 of those playoff berths in the 21 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994. New England has won 17 division crowns overall (16 AFC East crowns) and has qualified as a Wild Card team on four occasions (1998, 1994, 1985 and 1976). The Patriots also qualified for the playoffs in 1982 as part of a 16-team tournament following a players' strike.



ANNUAL ACHIEVEMENTS

The Patriots have won more than half of their games for the 14th straight year with a 12-4 record in 2014. They are the first team to win more than half of their games in 14 straight seasons since free agency began in 1993.

HERE'S WHAT TO WATCH FOR IN SUPER BOWL XLIX

TEAM

★ A victory in Super Bowl XLIX will be the Patriots fourth Super Bowl Championship, and they will join Pittsburgh (6), Dallas (5), San Francisco (5), Green Bay (4) and the New York Giants (4) as the only teams with at least four Super Bowl wins.

ROBERT KRAFT

★ Super Bowl XLIX will be the seventh Super Bowl under the ownership of Robert Kraft, setting an NFL record for most Super Bowl appearances as an owner. Pat Bowlen of Denver is second with six Super Bowl appearances. The Patriots seven conference titles since Kraft purchased the team in 1994 is three more than the next-closest team over that span (Pittsburgh, 4).

BILL BELICHICK

- ★ Bill Belichick is one of just four head coaches to win three Super Bowl Championships along with Chuck Noll [4], Joe Gibbs (3) and Bill Walsh (3). He will attempt to join Noll with four Super Bowl titles with a win in Super Bowl XLIX.
- ★ Super Bowl XLIX will be Bill Belichick's ninth Super Bowl overall during his coaching career (six as a head coach and three as an assistant) to match Dan Reeves (four as a head coach, two as a player and three as an assistant) for the most Super Bowls of any other coach or player.

LEGARRETTE BLOUNT

★ LeGarrette Blount is the Patriots all-time leader with seven postseason rushing touchdowns. His seven overall postseason touchdowns are tied with David Givens for the most in team postseason history.

TOM BRADY

- * Super Bowl XLIX will be the sixth Super Bowl for Tom Brady. He will match DT Mike Lodish for most Super Bowl appearances by a player. Lodish played in four with Buffalo and two with Denver.
- ★ Brady needs to start in one more Super Bowl to set the NFL record with six starting assignments. He is currently tied with Matt Light, Cornelius Bennett, John Elway and Charles Haley with five starts in the Super Bowl.
- ★ Super Bowl XLIX will be Brady's 29th postseason game, which will tie for Second all-time with Jerry Rice, behind Adam Vinatieri's 30 postseason games.
- ★ Brady is already the all-time leader in Super Bowl passing yards (1,277), and is tied with Terry Bradshaw with nine Super Bowl touchdown passes, behind only Joe Montana (11).
- ★ Brady is tied with Brett Favre with 15 multi-touchdown games in the postseason and needs one more for the most such games in postseason history.
- * Brady (49) has the most touchdown passes in NFL postseason history and the most passing yards in postseason history (7,017).

STEPHEN GOSTKOWSKI

- ★ Stephen Gostkowski enters Super Bowl XLIX eighth in NFL history with 113 postseason points, and needs three points to move past George Blanda (115) into seventh place.
- ★ Gostkowski became the 11th player to reach 20 postseason field goals in the AFC Championship Game and enters Super Bowl XLIX tied for ninth all-time with 20 postseason field goals.
- ★ Gostkowski [113] needs five points to surpass Adam Vinatieri [117] as the team's all-time leader in postseason points.

GOSTKOWSKI PILING ON

SERIES HISTORY





The New England Patriots and the Seattle Seahawks will meet for the 17th time. The teams' last meeting was on Oct. 14, 2012, at CenturyLink Field with the Seahawks claiming a 24-23 victory to end a two-game New England winning streak.

The Patriots and Seahawks played 12 times in a 14-year span from 1980-93, but have played only three times since then (2004, 2008 and 2012).

The 2008 victory pushed the Patriots in front, 8-7, in the all-time series. Seattle evened the series at 8-8 with their victory in 2012.

The Patriots have had the upper hand in road games against the Seahawks as they own a 4-3 record in games played in Seattle. The Patriots were 3-2 at the Kingdome (1976-1993) and are 1-1 at CenturyLink Field (formerly Qwest Field).

New England won six of the first eight games in the series, which began in 1977.

The Seattle Seahawks scored 14 points in the final 7:21 to overtake the New England Patriots, 24:23, at CenturyLink Field. Seattle rookie QB Russell Wilson found WR Sidney Rice behind the New England secondary for a game-winning 46-yard touchdown with 1:18 remaining in the game. Earlier in the quarter, Wilson hit WR Braylon Edwards on fourth down for a 10-yard touchdown to get the Seahawks within 23-17.

New England had a final chance to get ahead. Starting at their own 20-yard line with 1:14 left, QB Tom Brady missed on a deep pass to WR Brandon Lloyd on first down, was sacked on second down, threw an incomplete pass to TE Aaron Hernandez on third down and his fourth-down completion to WR Wes Welker was short of the first down marker, allowing Seattle to run out the final 51 seconds to secure the win.

The Patriots squandered two scoring opportunities in the game. The Patriots had a 17-10 lead late in the first half and Seattle was forced to punt from their own 38-yard line with 48 seconds to play. Seattle P Jon Ryan fumbled the snap and was tackled by DE Trevor Scott and LB Bobby Carpenter, allowing the Patriots to take over at the Seattle 24-yard line with 40 seconds left in the first half. The Patriots moved to the three-yard line with six seconds to play when Brady attempted a pass to the end zone that fell incomplete with one second to play. However, Brady was called for intentional grounding, a penalty that requires a 10-second run off, ending the half and the Patriots scoring opportunity. Early in the fourth quarter, Brady threw his second interception of the game when he was picked off by Seattle S Earl Thomas in the end zone to end a 15-play, 60-yard drive.

The Patriots drove into Seattle territory a total of eight times with six drives inside the 20-yard line, but scored just one touchdown and were forced to settle for three field goals.

The matchup turned into a showcase for Wilson, who finished 16-of-27 for 293 yards and three touchdowns. Seattle gained 158 yards in the first quarter, then just 70 in the second and third quarter before 140 yards and a 14-point rally in the fourth quarter. Wilson had passes of 50 and 51 yards to set up touchdowns in addition to a 46-yard touchdown pass.

The Seattle defense gave up 475 yards after not allowing any of its first five opponents of the season to top 300. Brady was 36-of-58 for 395 yards with one touchdown and two second half interceptions. Welker had his fourth straight 100-yard game, finishing with 10 receptions for 138 yards and one touchdown.

Seattle scored a field goal on its first possession, but New England answered on its ensuing drive when Brady connected with Welker for a 46-yard touchdown. Seattle answered that score when Wilson found WR Doug Baldwin for a 50-yard gain before finishing the drive with a 24-yard touchdown to Baldwin for a 10-7 first quarter lead.

New England scored 16 unanswered points to take a 23-10 lead into the fourth quarter. Brady culminated a 15-play, 80-yard drive with a one-yard touchdown pass to Hernandez in the second quarter for a 14-10 lead. K Stephen Gostkowski drilled a 25-yard field goal in the second quarter, a 35-yarder in the third quarter and another 35-yarder in the fourth quarter.

Rookie DE Chandler Jones had two sacks, including a forced fumble on his first sack, to help set up a field goal. LB Jerod Mayo forced a fumble in the fourth quarter that set up a field goal.

- ★ Patriots CB Brandon Browner played for the Seahawks from 2011-13, winning a Super Bowl ring in his final season with the club. He also earned his first Pro Bowl in 2011 after starting all 16 games and registering 54 tackles, 23 passes defensed, six interceptions and two touchdowns.
- ★ Patriots DL Alan Branch played for the Seahawks from 2011-12, starting 31 games and recording 63 total tackles, four sacks, four passes defensed and one fumble recovery.

News Notes

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. Now in his 21st season of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.238 pct.) and logging the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft



announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles [14], conference crowns (7) and Super Bowl championships (3) than any other NFL team. Super Bowl XLIX will be the seventh Super Bowl appearances since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other team has earned more than four berths. In Kraft's 21 seasons, the Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 16 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons. Pre-Kraft Kraft Fra

Kraft's success as an owner has brought the Patriots a great increase in national recognition. Prior to Kraft's ownership, the Patriots had been featured on the cover of just four issues of *Sports Illustrated* (1966, 1977, 1981 and 1986). Since 1994, New England has graced the cover a total of 29 times, including 17 that feature Tom Brady alone.

The Patriots finished the 2014 season with 52 touchdowns, marking the eighth time in franchise history that New England has scored at least 50 touchdowns in a season. New England totaled 468 points in 2014, a total that ranks fifth in team history and fourth in the league this year.

Since 2000, New England is 40-1 in the regular season when a Patriot eclipses 100 yards rushing after Jonas Gray had his first career 100-yard rushing performance, gaining 201 yards at In-

dianapolis (11/16/14). The only loss during the Bill Belichick era came at Miami on Dec. 20, 2004, when Corey Dillon rushed for 121 yards on 26 carries and the Patriots lost to the Dolphins, 29-28. Since then, New England is 27-0 with a 100-yard rusher.

SCORING FLURRY

The Patriots scored three touchdowns in a 57-second span during the final two minutes of the first half against Chicago on Oct. 26 to turn a 17-7 lead into a 38-7 cushion. It was the fastest three-touchdown flurry in the NFL since the Patriots had three touchdowns in 52 seconds against the New York Jets on Nov. 22, 2012. The Patriots are one of three teams to score three touchdowns in under a minute since the 1970 merger, and are the only team to have achieved the feat twice.

GROUND CONTROL

The Patriots rushed for 200 yards in a game two times in 2014 with 220 yards in the win vs. Cincinnati on Oct. 5 and 246 yards in the win at Indianapolis on Nov. 16. The Patriots are 65-7 all-time when rushing for 200 yards or more and are 12-0 under Bill Belihcick when rushing for 200 yards or more.

SEASON-HIGH OUTPUT

The Patriots scored a season-high 51 points vs. Chicago on Oct. 26, 2014. It is the seventh time the Patriots have scored at least 50 points in the last eight seasons (2007-14). In that span, no other team has more than three games with 50 points

HALF-CENTURY CLUB

The Patriots scored 51 points against the Bears (10/26), marking the 13th time in franchise history that they have broken the 50-point barrier. New England has topped 50 points eight times since 2007. The Patriots' franchise record for most points in a game is 59, achieved twice - on Nov. 18, 2012 against Indianapolis (59-24) and on Oct. 16, 2009 vs. Tennessee (59-0).

PILING UP THE RECEIVING YARDS

Rob Gronkowski and Brandon LaFell each broke the 100-yard receiving mark in the win vs. Chicago (10/26). It was the only time this season that the Patriots had two 100-yard receivers and the 34th time in team history that the feat has occurred. The last time the Patriots had two 100-yard receivers in a game was on Dec. 15, 2013, at Miami, when Julian Edelman (139) and Danny Amendola [131] each broke the 100-yard mark.

PATS TAME LIONS TOP-RANKED DEFENSE

The Patriots scored 34 points against a Lions [11/23] defense which entered the game allowing an NFL-low 15.6 points per game. Prior to the Patriots-Lions game, the highest point total allowed by the Lions was 24 points to the Carolina Panthers on Sept. 14. Entering the game, Detroit also allowed an NFL-low 290.3 yards per game, and New England totaled 439 yards in the victory.

THIRD QUARTER SCORING RECORD

The Patriots scored 24 points in the third quarter vs. Miami [12/14/14], marking the highest scoring total in team history in the third quarter. The previous high was a 22-point third quarter vs. the Dallas Texans on Nov. 18, 1960.

★ Stephen Gostkowski led the NFL with 156 points. It was the third straight season that he has led the NFL in scoring (2012, 2013 and 2014). He also led the NFL in scoring in 2008. He joins Don Hutson (5) and Gino Cappelletti (5) as the only NFL players to lead the NFL in scoring in at least four seasons.

**Gostkowski made 94.6 percent of his field goals in 2014 (35-of-37), setting

a new team record for field goal percentage in a single season. The previous best was 93.9 by Adam Vinatieri (31-of-33) in 2004.

Five members of the New England Patriots have been selected to the 2014 NFL Pro Bowl. QB Tom Brady, K Stephen Gostkowski, TE Rob Gronkowski, CB Darrelle Revis and WR Matthew Slater (special teams) have been selected to represent the New England Patriots in the 2015 NFL Pro Bowl on Jan. 25, 2015 at University of Phoenix Stadium in Glendale, Ariz., site of Super Bowl XLIX.

Brady was named to the Pro Bowl for the 10th time, the most Pro Bowl selections in team history. He was tied with Patriots and Pro Football Hall of Famer John Hannah with nine selections. It is Brady's sixth consecutive selection to the all-star game. He was voted to the Pro Bowl after each of the following seasons: 2001, 2004, 2005, 2007, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012,



2013 and now, 2014. Brady finished the season with 4,109 yards and 33 touchdown passes. He joined Drew Brees (9) and Peyton Manning (14) as the only NFL players to have at least seven seasons with 4,000 passing yards. Brady also guided the Patriots to their 12th division title of his career, the most by a quarter-back in NFL history.

Gostkowski was named to the Pro Bowl for the third time in his career and for the second straight season. He finished the season with an NFL-leading 156 points. He also led the NFL in points in 2008, 2012 and 2013, becoming just the third player to lead the NFL in points in at least four seasons. Gostkowski became the Patriots' all-time leading scorer vs. Miami (12/14) and currently has 1,179 career points. He was 35-of-37 on field goals in 2014 for a 94.6 field goal percentage, the highest field goal percentage in team history for a season.

Gronkowski was named to the Prow Bowl for the third time after being selected to the Pro Bowl in 2011 and 2012. He led all NFL tight ends in 2014 with 1,124 yards on 82 receptions with 12 touchdowns. He became the first tight end in NFL history with four seasons of 10 or more touchdowns. He is the second tight end in NFL history to have two 1,000-yard and 10-plus touchdowns in a single season.

Revis was named to his sixth career Pro Bowl and his sixth Pro Bowl in the last seven seasons. He was previously voted to the Pro Bowl following the 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2013 seasons. Revis leads the NFL with 123 passes defensed since he entered the NFL in 2007. He played a key role in a Patriots defense that is ranked 13th overall and eighth in the NFL by allowing just 19.6 points per game.

Slater earned his fourth consecutive Pro Bowl selection. A productive member of the Patriots special teams units since joining the squad as a fifth-round draft pick out of UCLA in 2008, Slater has become a leader after being voted special teams captain each of the last four years. He has now led the Patriots in special teams tackles for four of the last five seasons, including a team-high 14 in 2014.



The Associated Press named Bill Belichick the NFL's Coach of the Year in 2010, the third time that Belichick earned the honor. He was also named Coach of the Year following the 2003 and 2007 seasons, joining Don Shula [4-time winner] and Chuck Knox as the only three-time winners.

BELICHICK ADDED TO HIS RECORD IN 2014

Bill Belichick has coached the Patriots to 12 straight seasons with 10 or more wins after reaching his 10th win of the 2014 season at San Diego (12/7/14), adding to his NFL record streak. In 2011, Belichick became the first coach in NFL history with nine straight seasons with at least 10 victories. George Seifert has the second most consecutive 10-win seasons with eight from 1989-1996 for San Francisco.

DIVISION TITLES RECORD

Bill Belichick guided the Patriots to the AFC East title in 2014. His 12 division titles are the most by a head coach since the 1970 merger. Don Shula is second with 11 division titles since the merger.

FIRST WITH 14 WINS IN 4 SEASONS

Bill Belichick guided the Patriots to an NFL-best 14-2 record in 2010, becoming the first head coach ever to win at least 14 regular-season games in four separate seasons. Only four other coaches — San Francisco's George Seifert [3], Washington's Joe Gibbs [2], Chicago's Mike Ditka [2] and Miami's Don Shula [2] — have more than one 14-win season.



Since the win vs. Denver on Nov. 2, no NFL team can claim a winning record against Tom Brady. Conversely, Peyton Manning has a losing record against five teams and Brett Favre had a losing record against seven teams in his career. Brady has a career .500 record against five teams and a winning regular-season record against 26 teams.

He is undefeated against eight teams – Atlanta (4-0), Chicago (4-0), Dallas (3-0), Detroit (4-0), Jacksonville (4-0), Minnesota (4-0), Philadelphia (3-0) and Tampa Bay (3-0). Brady is most successful against Buffalo, with a 23-3 career record and the non-divisional team he has beaten the most is Indianapolis (9-3).

IVY LEAGUE JOURNEY

An ly League defensive lineman standout at Brown, James Develin graduated in 2010 with a degree in chemical engineering and began lining up interviews with companies he felt might be best suited for the technical skills. However, Develin wanted to give football one last shot, and play in the NFL.

"Football is something that is not around your entire life," Develin told *The Boston Globe.* "I knew if I didn't give it my best shot to play football as a career, that I'd always regret it." Develin made the most of his opportunity by switching positions to fullback. Following stints in the Arena Football League and the now defunct United Football League, Develin caught on with the Cincinnati Bengals practice squad and eventually worked his way to the Patriots 53-man roster full-time in 2013.








RECORD RETURNER

Edelman began his college football career with a year at the College of San Mateo [Calif.] before transferring to Kent State where as a senior he completed 56 percent of his passes [153 of 275 passes for 1,820 yards] with 13 touchdowns. He was also the leading rusher, gaining 1,551 yards on 215 attempts (an average of 7.5 yards per carry) and scoring 13 touchdowns. His offensive numbers broke Kent State's single-season record for total offense set by Joshua Cribbs in 2003. Said head coach Bill Belichick on the versatility of Edelman: "He played the quarterback position in college at Kent State and all the positions really that he's played in the NFL – covering kicks, returning kicks, slot receiver, outside receiver, slot defender – he didn't do any of those things in college. I think that really speaks to his versatility and how much he's grown as a player and how many things he's learned how to do that he really didn't have much experience with in college. I'd say that's pretty unusual, especially to be as competent in them as he is."

EDELMAN TAKES HIS FATHER'S ADVICE

If there is one thing Julian Edelman has never lacked, it's athletic ability. A dual-threat quarterback at Kent State and former baseball standout in high school, Edelman once wowed Toronto Blue Jays players with his impressive footwork while fielding ground balls in an appearance at batting practice in 2011.

This natural ability may have been overlooked by NFL scouts, who let him fall to the Patriots in the seventh round of the 2009 NFL Draft. Edelman remains focused on the lessons his father, Frank Edelman, taught him at a young age. "I'm still constantly trying to learn," Edelman told *The Boston Herald.* "My dad always put it in my head, when you're green, you're growing, when you're ripe, you're lost. When you're done learning, you're done."







He had two touchdowns with Carolina vs. the New York Giants on Sept. 22, 2013. He added his third two-touchdown game at Green Bay on Nov. 30.

CAREER DAY FOR LAFELL

Brandon LaFell had 11 receptions for 124 yards vs. Chicago (10/26/14), setting career highs in each category. LaFell's 11 topped his previous career high of seven receptions last season for Carolina when they played New England on Nov. 18, 2013. His 124 yards topped his previous career high of 119 yards, set at Kansas City on Sept. 29, 2014.

LAFELL REWRITES PERSONAL RECORD BOOK

Brandon LaFell set career high season marks in receptions, yards and touchdowns in 2014. He finished the 2014 season with 74 receptions for 953 yards and seven touchdowns. LaFell's previous high in receptions was 49 in 2013, his previous best in yards was 677 in 2012 and his previous best in touchdowns was five in 2013.

SLATER'S EMERGENCE WAS SPECIAL

Bill Belichick acknowledged Matthew Slater's role as a gunner on special teams: "Matt is one of the best in the league," Belichick said. "Any time the punt return team has to double somebody, that makes it one less guy they can use somewhere else in the return. He almost always draws two guys out there unless they're in an eight-man rush. Most of the time, there's two guys out there — fourth-and-short, where they're trying to protect the box — but he draws a lot of double teams, and deservedly so. He does an outstanding job of covering punts."





ELECTED TEAM LEADER

Patriots wide receiver Matthew Slater has been named to four straight Pro Bowls (2011-14) for his special teams work, but perhaps more revealing of his value to New England is the fact that he has been elected a captain by his teammates for the fourth straight season in 2014.

The special teams ace was willing to share his advice on being a great captain with high school football players in a story published by *The Boston Globe*. "I think first and foremost, you have to be able to put others before yourself. Being a captain and leadership is about serving, and to me, that means a great deal of sacrifice – putting aside personal agendas for the greater common goal. Leadership is equated with sacrifice. I think you have to be willing to do whatever it takes for the unit to succeed. I think you need to lead by example. A lot of times, it's about what you do, not what you say."

SLATER ON BILL BELICHICK

"Guys have really bought into what we're trying to do here and believing in the goals that we've set to accomplish. We try not to acknowledge all the noise and hype surrounding ballgames. We prepare ourselves to have success by the way we work day-in and day-out on the field and in the meeting room, but it definitely starts with our leadership on this team."



FIRST NFL TD

WR Brian Tyms scored his first NFL touchdown on a 43-yard reception from Tom Brady in the win at Buffalo (10/12). He entered the game with two career receptions for 12 yards in seven games. In total for 2014, Tyms had all five recpetions for 82 yards, all coming against the Bills.



2011 FIRST ROUND PICK NATE SOLDER


It only took a day for Nate Solder to decide to change from his lifelong position of tight end to tackle after playing his freshman year at Colorado as a tight end. "My coaches came to me and said, 'You'd be an all right tight end, but you'd be an even better tackle," he told the *Boston Globe*. "I've always wanted to be great, so that's why I moved to tackle."

He added over 30 pounds after his redshirt freshman season and was named the team's starting left tackle. He played in 2,540 of 2,542 offensive plays over the next three seasons at Colorado and became an immediate contributor on the Patriots offensive line at right tackle as a rookie before moving to left tackle.



VEREEN SETS TWO RECORDS IN ONE GAME

Shane Vereen had 12 receptions for 153 yards vs. Cleveland on Dec. 8, 2013, setting a single-game franchise record for most receptions and most receiving yards by a running back.

RYAN WENDELL LEADS THE NFL IN PLAY SNAPS IN 2012

Ryan Wendell played a league-high 1,249 snaps in 2012 and it helped earn him a spot on the *USA Today* All-Joe team. Said Wendell: "I think first it says a lot about the organization, our training staff and our strength training coaches, that they do everything they can all season and all off-season and during the spring to keep us healthy throughout the whole season. I think it says more about them than it does about me individually."



WHAT'S IN A NUMBER?

When Arrington was first making the transition from Hofstra to the NFL in 2008, he was assigned jersey No. 42. At that point in his career, he was cut by both the Eagles and Buccaneers. When Arrington first arrived in New England as a practice squad player in 2009, he initially donned No. 27. But when No. 24 became available, a result of Jonathan Wilhite leaving in free agency after the 2010 season, Arrington pounced on it.

The reason is that it reflects how he's flipped his NFL fortunes – from a No. 42 struggling to hang on to a No. 24 who has carved out a role on a winning team. Arrington moved from 24 to 25 in an agreement with Adrian Wilson in 2013 to accommodate the veteran's desire to keep the same jersey he had worn during his 12-year NFL career.

ARRINGTON SCORES AGAIN

DB Kyle Arrington has two touchdowns in 2014. He returned a Cincinnatifumble (10/5/14) forced by Brandon Bolden on a third-quarter kickoff 9 yards for a touchdown and returned a blocked field goal 62 yards for a touchdown vs. Miami (12/14). He has four career touchdowns. He returned a blocked field goal 35 yards for a touchdown at Miami (10/4/10) and returned his first career interception 36 yards for a touchdown vs. Green Bay (12/19/10).



JAMIE COLLINS' JOURNEY

The road to the NFL has been anything but easy for linebacker and 2013 second-round draft pick Jamie Collins. The youngest of five siblings growing up in Meadville, Miss., Collins lost both of his parents when he was six years old and was raised by one of his sisters, who was in her mid 20s.

Collins turned to football as an outlet to help him through the tough times. "It means a lot. It's my living," Collins told *The Boston Herald.* "It kept me on track." Collins' resiliency in dealing with adversity has made a lasting impact on fellow Mississippi native Stevan Ridley, who grew up 30 miles west of Meadville in Natchez, Miss., and got to know Collins through a family friend. "What I've known about him, he really has been a strong person," Ridley told the *Herald*. "Anybody that's gone through the things that he's gone through and can still find a way to be successful on the football field, you have to be mentally tough. That's what he's kind of done as a teammate here. He's come in here and accepted his role and did a pretty good job as a rookie."

COLLINS RECORDS FIRST INT

LB Jamie Collins intercepted a Kyle Orton pass in the win at Buffalo [10/12], marking his first regular-season interception. He had his second of the year at the Jets on Dec. 21. His first career pick came last year in the AFC Divisional Playoff vs. Indianapolis [1/11/14].

COLLINS' FIRST TWO-SACK GAME

LB Jamie Collins registered his first NFL two-sack game with a 9-yard sack in the first quarter and a 9-yard sack in the second quarter against San Diego (12/7). It was the fourth time in 2014 that a Patriots player had a multiple sack game. LB Dont'a Hightower had two sacks at Minnesota (9/14), DE Chandler Jones had two sacks at Minnesota (9/14) and DL Rob Ninkovich had three sacks at Buffalo (10/12).

TEAM LEADER



Hightower understands the importance of the number and hopes to live up to its legacy. "I definitely feel honored to be able to wear this number," Hightower said. "I've read that Tedy didn't want it to be retired and he hoped another



linebacker would come in and be able to wear this number and be able to play as well. I feel honored. Tedy was a great player, and he means a lot to this organization. I'm definitely proud to be able to wear this number."

HIGHTOWER HAS A CAREER FIRST

LB Dont'a Hightower registered his first career two-sack game at Minnesota (09/14/14).

HIGHTOWER SETS CAREER HIGH

LB Dont'a Hightower registered a 9-yard sack of Green Bay QB Aaron Rodgers in the second quarter to set a career high with 4% sacks in 2014. He now has 6.0 sacks for the year. His previous best was four sacks as a rookie in 2012.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Chandler Jones was named AFC Defensive Player of the Week for his performance in the Patriots' 30-7 victory at Minnesota on Sept. 14, 2014. It was the first time in Jones' career that he has received an AFC Player of the Week honor. He was named AFC Defensive Player of the Month for November last season and NFL Defensive Rookie of the Month in September 2012.

Jones blocked a 48-yard field goal attempt and returned it 58 yards for a touchdown to give New England a 24-7 halftime lead at Minnesota (9/14). He also finished the game with eight total tackles and his fifth career two-sack game.

The last time the Patriots earned an AFC Defensive Player of the Week honor was Week 10 of the 2011 season when Andre Carter tied a team record with four sacks at N.Y. Jets (11/13/11).

JONES ACHIEVES TRIFECTA

DL Chandler Jones blocked a second-quarter Minnesota 48-yard field goal attempt, recovered the loose ball and returned it 58 yards for a touchdown. It was the fifth blocked field goal returned for a touchdown in Patriots history and the first returned for a touchdown since S Patrick Chung blocked a field goal attempt that was returned 35 yards for a touchdown by DB Kyle Arrington at Miami on Oct. 4, 2010. It is the second field goal block by Jones. He blocked a 39-yard attempt vs. Miami on Oct. 27, 2013. It was Jones' second career touchdown. He recovered an errant shotgun snap squibbed into the end zone at Baltimore on Dec. 22, 2013.

MULTIPLE SACKS FOR JONES

Jones finished with his fifth career two-sack game at Minnesota (09/14/14). He had three two-sack games in 2013.



THIRD TEAM'S A CHARM

Chris Jones had an early introduction to failure in the NFL. Taken behind 37 other defensive linemen in the 2013 NFL Draft, the defensive tackle was cut by two teams over a span of just 11 days. After selecting him in the sixth round with the 198th overall pick, the Houston Texans cut Jones on Aug. 31. Jones signed with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers on Sept. 1, but lasted only 10 days, as the Buccaneers released him on Sept., 10. Rather than be deterred by these early disappointments, however, Jones maintained a positive outlook when he signed with the Patriots on Sept. 11, and it has paid off in a big way. Thrust into a starting role after key injuries to the defensive line, Jones finished his rookie season with six sacks.

Jones' sudden success may have come as a surprise to some, but not to Dave Clawson, Jones' college coach at Bowling Green. Jones was part of Clawson's first recruiting class and blossomed into an All-American and two-two time captain for the Falcons. "It's hard to talk about Chris without getting a little bit emotional," Clawson told the *The Boston Herald*, "because he was that special of a player and person in our program."

JONES SAVES THE DAY; EARNS AFC HONORS

Chris Jones blocked a 58-yard field goal attempt by the Jets on the final play of the game to preserve New England's 27-25 win. It was the first blocked field goal for the Patriots since Chandler Jones blocked a 48-yard try by Minnesota's Blair Walsh earlier this season. He was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance in the victory.







DOUBLE TROUBLE: DB DEVIN McCOURTY

After being selected by the Patriots in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft, DB Devin McCourty became part of a select group in league history. McCourty's identical twin brother, Jason, is a cornerback with Tennessee, selected in the sixth round of the 2009 NFL Draft. The two are the 12th set of twins to play in the NFL. Devin redshirted for the 2005 season and therefore was a year behind his brother in eligibility. McCourty is the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 1998-2000. His twin brother, Wasswa, played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox. The McCourty twins are one of two active sets of twins playing in the NFL.

McCOURTY GOES LONG

Devin McCourty had a 104-yard kickoff return for a touchdown vs. N.Y. Jets (10/21/12), the second longest kickoff return in team history. McCourty joins Pro Football Hall of Famers Rod Woodson and Ronnie Lott as the only NFL players to earn All-Pro honors at both safety and cornerback.

McCOURTY REGISTERS CAREER LONG

DB Devin McCourty returned a first quarter interception 60 yards to the Minnesota [09/14/14] 1-yard line to set up a Patriots touchdown. It is the longest interception return of his career. He had a 50-yard return as a rookie in 2010 at Detroit [11/25] on Thanksgiving Day.



A NOSE FOR THE FOOTBALL

Ninkovich has more opponent fumble recoveries (13) over the last five seasons (2010-2014) than any other NFL player. J.J. Watt is second during that time with 11 opponent fumble recoveries.



CAREER DAY IN BUFFALO

Ninkovich finished with a three-sack game for the first time in his career in the win at Buffalo (10/12), to add to two two-sack performances vs. Miami (1/2/11) and at Carolina (11/18/13).

WHERE DID HE COME FROM?

Rob Ninkovich's journey to the Patriots was not easy. He entered the league as a fifth-round pick by the Saints in 2006 and was waived four times by New Orleans and Miami before landing in New England on Aug. 2, 2009. He spent the 2009 offseason trying to make the New Orleans team as a long snapper. Before coming to the Patriots, he had appeared in just eight games over three seasons. He doubled that total in his first year in New England, appearing in 15 games in 2009 and his role on the team has grown since, earning a starting role at linebacker in 2010 and 2011 before moving to a starting role on the defensive line in 2011.

CRAZY EIGHTS

Ninkovich raised his 2014 total to a team-high of 8.0 sacks in 2014. Ninkovich has had at least 8.0 sacks in three consecutive seasons (8.0 in 2012, 8.0 in 2013 and 8.0 in 2014), becoming the first Patriots player to have at least 8.0 sacks in three consecutive seasons since Pro Football Hall of Famer Andre Tippett achieved the feat from 1985-87 (1985, 16 1/2, 1986, 9 1/2 and 1987, 12 1/2).

NINKOVICH SCORED AS A TE IN COLLEGE

Ninkovich played some at tight end in college at Purdue and caught two touchdown passes with a 2-yard touchdown pass from Buffalo QB Kyle Orton and a 1-yard touchdown pass from former New York Giants and Indianapolis QB Curtis Painter.





CLASSMATES REUNITE IN NEW ENGLAND

Defensive backs Logan Ryan and Duron Harmon are used to working together. Ryan and Harmon began their college football careers together as members of the same recruiting class at Rutgers University and developed a close friendship during their four years in Piscataway, N.J. As fate would have it, Ryan and Harmon would begin their NFL journeys together as well when the Patriots selected the two defensive backs just eight picks apart in the third round of the 2013 NFL Draft.

Reunited once again, the former Scarlet Knights are excited and eager to make their mark, just as they did at Rutgers. "We talked before the draft and said how good it would be to play on the same team again, and for it to happen again, it's exciting and it's a blessing," Harmon told *The Boston Globe.* "It's great [we're contributing], because at the end of the day you want to play, and to contribute to a team like this, it's fun."

Ryan kept his promise and graduated in the spring of 2014 with a degree in labor relations and a minor in psychology.

"I committed to Rutgers, not only as a football player, but as a student, so I was going to make sure I finished that end too," Ryan told NJ.com.

"It's a big accomplishment in my life. I held my word to my parents and stuck with it and I'm fortunate. It took a lot of work, but I was able to go back and finish and walk in graduation."

FIRST NFL SACK RESULTS IN TURNOVER


Ryan forced a fumble on his first NFL sack vs. Miami (10/27/13), a week after returning his first career interception for a touchdown. Ryan strip-sacked Ryan Tannehill, forcing a fumble recovered by Rob Ninkovich that led in to a touchdown. The play marked the second time in as many weeks that a Ryan turnover led to Patriots points.



REASONS FOR TEAM SUCCESS

"The Patriots are all about team, family and smart football players. They try to get good people here from coaches to guys who work in the front office to guys who put on this uniform. I think everybody has to have one goal in mind, and that's to be together. When you get an organization together that is seeking one goal, you can be pretty successful."



SEALED WITH A PICK

Vince Wilfork notched his third career interception (second vs. Oakland on Sept. 21) when he snared a pass that had been deflected in the final minute of the game. The play came with the Raiders having gained a first-and-goal and with Oakland trailing by seven points. 


