Head coach Chip Kelly will man the Philadelphia sideline for the first time.

Chip Kelly

Head Coach



Following a successful four-year stint manning the sidelines at the University of Oregon, Chip Kelly was named head coach of the Philadelphia Eagles on January 16, 2013. Kelly joined the NFL coaching fraternity after 23 years of working in the college ranks.

His remarkable four-year tenure with the Ducks produced a 46-7 (.868) overall record and transformed that university into one of the nation's premiere football destinations.

Amidst Kelly's meteoric rise, he became the first coach in Oregon's history to guide the program to three undisputed conference championships from 2009-12. Additionally, the Ducks made an appearance in a BCS Bowl game in each of Kelly's four seasons as head coach. In just Kelly's second season, Oregon earned a trip to the BCS National Championship game in 2010.

Not only did Kelly implement an offense with a fast pace, but his schemes also resulted in racking up big plays. During Kelly's tenure, the Ducks led the FBS in big plays, including 25-yard passing plays (220) and 25-yard rushes (110). In his four seasons at Oregon, the Ducks scored a whopping 44.7 points per game.

His 2012 Ducks squad finished 12-1 and ranked fourth in total offense accumulating nearly 7,000 yards while scoring an average of 49.6 points per game. They rushed for 315.2 yards per game while ranking fifth, averaging 537.4 total yards. Their offense ran 1,077 plays in just 13 games, which would have ranked 7th in the NFL's 16-game schedule.

Known as a football junkie, Kelly has a matter-of-fact leadership style in addition to his mastery of the spread offense. Following Oregon's run at a potential national title in 2010, Kelly's leadership was recognized with a multitude of Coach of the Year awards from outlets such as Associated Press, Sporting News, The Walter Camp Football Foundation, and other postseason titles including the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year, AFCA Coach of the Year, and Pac-10 Coach of the Year.

Prior to taking over as Oregon's head coach, Kelly spent two seasons as the team's offensive coordinator. In his first season leading the team's offense, the Ducks were forced into playing four different starting quarterbacks during the final four games of 2007. Kelly's plug-and-play style was cemented when the team had an impressive 56-21 Sun Bowl victory over South Florida.

Before joining Oregon's program, Kelly served as New Hampshire's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach from 1999-2006. His offenses at his alma mater averaged better than 400 yards of total offense in seven of his eight seasons and more than 30 points per game in his final four years. As a result, three Wildcat players received first-team All-America acclaim each of his last two seasons in the Granite State. In 2006, junior QB Ricky Santos earned the Walter Payton Award as the most outstanding players in FCS.

Ironically, Kelly got his first taste of coaching in the college ranks on the defensive side of the ball with Columbia in 1990. And in 1993, he was named the defensive coordinator at Johns Hopkins.

A product of the University of New Hampshire, Kelly earned a bachelor's degree in physical education. He played quarterback and defensive back for legendary coach Bill Bowes at UNH from 1981-84.

The third of four boys, Kelly attended Manchester (NH) Central High School and starred in football and track. Kelly, whose first love was hockey, played in the Manchester Regional Youth Hockey Association, and also made time for the local CYO basketball team.

Charles Kelly was born in Dover, NH, on November 25, 1963 and is the son of Paul and Jean Kelly. Paul is a retired trial lawyer.

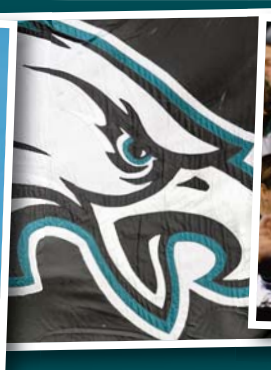

- Helped guide two linebackers to ACC defensive player of the year honors: Mark Herzlich and Luke Kuechly, the latter of whom garnered the Bronco Nagurski Trophy as the nation's top defensive player
- Also coached on the collegiate level at Pittsburgh, Massachusetts, Pennsylvania and his alma mater, Holy Cross
- A four-year starter at defensive back at Holy Cross, was inducted into their Hall of Fame in 1996

RICK MINTER Inside Linebackers

1st year in Philadelphia



- Served as Cincinnati's head coach from 1994-2003 and had several future head coaches on his staff: John Harbaugh, Mike Tomlin, Rex Ryan, and Florida State's Jimbo Fisher
- As the Bearcats head coach, ended their 40-year bowl drought and recruited current Eagles Trent Cole and Brent Celek
- Served as defensive coordinator at Kentucky (2011-12), Marshall (2008-09), Notre Dame (1992-93, 2005-07), South Carolina (2004) and Ball State (1985-91)
- Worked with Eagles D-line coach Jerry Azzinaro at Marshall

JUSTIN PELLE Assistant Tight Ends

1st year in Philadelphia



- Played tight end for 10 seasons in NFL with San Diego, Miami, Atlanta and San Francisco. Caught 123 passes and 12 TDs in 151 games
- Drafted in 4th round in 2002 by Chargers from Oregon, where he finished with 70 career catches and 14 scores
- Was a four-time All-Pac 10 Academic Team selection

DUCE STALEY Running Backs

3rd year in Philadelphia



- Worked first two seasons in Philadelphia as an assistant special teams coach, while helping with the running backs
- Gained 5,785 yards during his 10-year NFL career with Philadelphia (1997-2003) and Pittsburgh (2004-06)
- A 3rd round draft pick of Eagles in 1997, ranks 4th on team's all-time rushing list. Is one of two Eagles to top the 200-yard rushing mark in a game (Steve Van Buren)
- Earned a Super Bowl championship ring with the Steelers in 2005
- His Eagle teammates voted him offensive MVP three times (1998, '99, and 2002)

JEFF STOUTLAND Offensive Line

1st year in Philadelphia



- Coached one of the most dominant offensive lines in the nation at Alabama from 2011-12, including Chance Warmack (first round pick in 2013), D.J. Fluker (1st round) and Barrett Jones (4th round)
- Helped Crimson Tide to a National Championship victory over Notre Dame in 2012
- Also coached successful offensive lines at Miami, FL (2007-10), Michigan State (2000-06), Syracuse (1999) and Cornell (1993-96)
- Began coaching career at his alma mater, Southern Connecticut State, in 1984.

PRESS TAYLOR Offensive Quality Control

1st year in Philadelphia



- Joined Eagles in 2013 after two seasons as a graduate assistant/QBs coach at Tulsa
- Brother, Zac, is the quarterbacks coach of the Miami Dolphins
- Spent two seasons as a reserve QB at Marshall after transferring from Butler Community College, where he led school to two Junior College championships (2007-08)

TED WILLIAMS Tight Ends

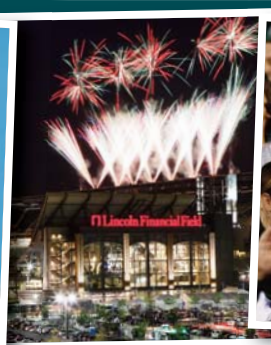
19th year in Philadelphia

- Under his tutelage, McCoy developed into an All-Pro player in 2011 with 1,309 rushing yards and team-record 20 total touchdowns (17 on the ground)

Taking over a football franchise in 1994 that made the playoffs just 14 times in a 62-year span (23%), the Eagles have been a perennial contender under Jeffrey Lurie, earning playoff berths in 11 of his 18 years as owner (61%). Off the field, his stewardship of Screen Pass Pictures has garnered two Academy Awards since 2010. And, under his guidance the Eagles have become leaders with their charitable and environmental efforts in the community.

Along the way, Lurie has earned the respect of NFL's top hierarchy as he serves on the NFL's Finance Committee, Broadcast Committee, Stadium Committee, International Committee, and the Super Bowl Advisory Committee.

The Eagles have a greater overall winning percentage and appeared in more playoff games (22) and won more (11) than any other ownership group in team history.

In 2013, Lurie hired renowned University of Oregon head coach Chip Kelly to be the 21st head coach in franchise history. Coach Kelly replaced Andy Reid, the all-time winningest coach in franchise history who Lurie hired in 1999. Later that year, Screen Pass Pictures earned its second Academy Award for *Inocente*, in the category of Best Documentary Short. Their first came in 2010 for *Inside Job* which earned the Academy Award for Best Documentary Feature.

One of Lurie's charitable endeavors was the creation of Eagles Youth Partnership (EYP), the team's non-profit, charitable wing. Since its inception in 1995, EYP has developed into one of the most innovative and dynamic non-profit organizations in Philadelphia, winning awards internationally for its sports philanthropy.

Eagles Youth Partnership won the coveted 2011 Sport Team of the Year award by Beyond Sport, a global organization that promotes, develops and funds the use of sport to create positive social change across the world for its campaigns Tackling Breast Cancer, and Go Green.

The *Philadelphia Business Journal* honored the Eagles as one of Philadelphia's top charitable corporations in 2010. "That giving attitude made them a winner in every category of the Corporate Philanthropy Awards."

The Go Green program serves to better the environment by creating and sustaining programs that improve the quality of life in the Philadelphia region, green the environment and reduce the team's impact on the planet. Lurie and Christina Weiss Lurie received the 2008 Ongoing Commitment Award from the Environmental Media Association for their efforts.

Lurie is a director of the NLM Family Foundation, which devotes much of its resources to autism research and education. NLM co-funded a short documentary film entitled *Autism Is A World* that received a nomination for a 2005 Academy Award.

More recently, the Lurie Family Foundation was established with an emphasis on health issues, especially in the areas of autism and cancer research. The Foundation also supports documentaries addressing global issues through Screen Pass Pictures.

Don Smolenski, a longtime leader in the Eagles front office and a veteran sports executive, was named the club's president in June, 2012. His promotion capped a steady rise through the executive ranks of the Eagles organization.

As President, Smolenski directs the club's business and strategic efforts, including sales, marketing, communications and operations. He is known for his collaborative, easygoing style, financial acumen and long-term view and for playing a key role in significant projects from the construction of Lincoln Financial Field to the club's internationally recognized environmental and philanthropic programs.

During his first year as President, Smolenski has infused energy throughout the organization with his engaging leadership style. He embarked on a two-year, \$125 million revitalization plan to Lincoln Financial Field and aided Eagles chairman Jeffrey Lurie and general manager Howie Roseman on the team's search for a new head coach - a process that landed Oregon head coach Chip Kelly. He also spearheaded a plan that relocated the team's training camp to Philadelphia for the first time since 1943.

The stadium revitalization plan, like others, was a direct result of his numerous conversations with Eagles fans, an initiative that fuels Smolenski's drive as one of the key stewards of the franchise.

Smolenski is also a driving force in the team's environmental initiatives. Through its Go Green! program, the Eagles have emerged as a leader in environmental stewardship. The team has become a green leader in the sports industry through its conservation efforts, recycling programs, and use of renewable energy. In fact, his efforts have made Lincoln Financial Field one of the greenest sports stadium in the world with the installation of solar panels and wind turbines in 2012.

STADIUM REVITALIZATION ON TAP



In June, the Eagles announced that Lincoln Financial Field, the team's home since 2003, will be revitalized over the next two years. Upon completion prior to the start of the 2014 regular season, the stadium will have upgraded amenities for all fans including two new HD video boards, imagery to honor the franchise's greatest players and moments, Wi-Fi installation, and seating bowl modifications that include additional seats and two connecting bridges. Gensler Architecture and Turner Construction will lead the \$125 million project.

"We have had discussions with season ticket holders over the past couple of seasons to find out what was important to them. We listened and developed a plan of action. The revitalization is a direct result of those conversations," said Smolenski. "Our main goal when we began this project was to dramatically enhance the gameday experience for our fans. They deserve an exciting and fun experience and we are committed to that."

HOWIE ROSEMAN

General Manager

14th year in Philadelphia



Howie Roseman is in his 14th season in Philadelphia and his 4th as the Eagles general manager after being promoted to his current post on January 29, 2010. Roseman spent the previous two seasons as the team's vice president of player personnel.

Known as one of the most aggressive general managers in the league, Roseman has earned a reputation for seeking any edge he can find to field the best team.

Roseman oversees the college and pro scouting departments, the team's medical, equipment, video and player development staffs, while serving as the steward of the salary cap.

He played a vital role assisting Eagles chairman Jeffrey Lurie in the team's search for a new head in 2013, which ultimately brought renowned Oregon coach Chip Kelly east to Philadelphia.

"He's one of the brightest young guys in the league," said Eagles chairman Jeffrey Lurie. "I'm very excited about what he brings to the table. He has assembled an excellent team around him. He's meticulous in his evaluations. He has great relationships with players, coaches and agents around the league."

Over the last couple of years, Roseman has configured what many observers have coined a strong scouting staff with a blend of experienced scouts and a young core of talent.

"You have to give him a lot of credit for that, because there are a lot of young guys who wouldn't do that," former NFL GM and current Eagles senior football advisor Tom Donahoe said. "They'd feel threatened by it. They would feel a little bit intimidated by it. But Howie's only interested in getting the best group of scouts that he can. He values our opinion. We don't always agree, but that's part of scouting."

QUARTERBACKS

Michael Vick is the most experienced quarterback in the Eagles arsenal as the former first overall draft pick in 2001 continues the 2nd phase of his NFL career in Philadelphia. The four-time Pro Bowl selection engineered the highest scoring offense in franchise history in 2010 (439 points) and a team record 6,386 total net yards in 2011. Vick is the Eagles all-time leader in QB rating (87.8) and completion percentage (60.1%)

2nd-year pro **Nick Foles** is a tall (6-6), strong-armed quarterback who was chosen with a 3rd round draft pick in 2011. He earned the Eagles starting quarterback job during the latter part of his rookie campaign and set Eagles rookie passing records in yards, attempts and completions in six starts. He finished his career at Arizona as the all-time leader in yards, TDs, attempts and completions.

The all-time leading passer in Pac 12 and USC history, **Matt Barkley** was chosen in the 4th round by the Eagles in 2013. A four-year starter with the Trojans, Barkley was also a four-year starter in high school at powerhouse Mater Dei High School.

Dennis Dixon, a practice squad player with the Super Bowl champion Ravens a year ago, was signed this past offseason. Dixon and Eagles head coach Chip Kelly worked together for one season at Oregon (2007) when Dixon earned several Heisman Trophy votes. He was a 5th round draft pick of the Steelers in 2008 and has started 3 games in the NFL (all with Pittsburgh).

Rounding out the quarterback group is first-year pro **G.J. Kinne**, who was signed by the NY Jets as a rookie free agent in 2012. The Univ. of Tulsa product also played in the UFL and Arena League.

RUNNING BACKS

One of the most dynamic backs in the game, **LeSean McCoy** rushed his way into the Eagles record book during a breakout season in 2011. His 20 total touchdowns and league-leading 17 rushing scores shattered franchise records set by Hall of Famer Steve Van Buren in 1945. The Harrisburg, PA, native garnered first team All-Pro and FedEx Ground Player of the Year honors as well as his first Pro Bowl berth. Nicknamed "Shady," he was the Eagles second round pick in 2009 out of Pittsburgh.

Bryce Brown had a promising rookie season in which he broke the team's single-game rookie rushing record with 178 yards in his first start. He took a circuitous route to the NFL after being tabbed as the nation's top recruit coming out of high school in Wichita in 2008. He played only 13 games in college with Tennessee and Kansas State.

Felix Jones was added to the mix in the 2013 offseason. A multi-purpose threat, Jones is the only NFL player since 2008 to record a 60+ yard TD run, a 70+ yard TD catch and a 90+ yard kickoff return for a TD. He spent his first five NFL seasons in Dallas after being selected in the first round by the Cowboys in 2008 from Arkansas.

2nd-year back **Chris Polk** played in seven games as a rookie after being signed as a rookie free agent from Washington, where he finished as the Huskies 2nd all-time leading rusher (4,049 yds.)

Rookie free agent **Matthew Tucker** (TCU) rushed for 2,602 yards and 33 TDs in college.

WIDE RECEIVERS

DeSean Jackson is one of the NFL's most dangerous weapons. The team's 2nd round draft pick in 2008, Jackson earned Pro Bowl berths in 2009 and 2010. In fact, he became the first player in league history to earn a Pro Bowl berth at two positions in 2009. A native of Los Angeles, Jackson became the first player in NFL history to accumulate 3,500 receiving yards and 1,000 punt returns yards in his first four seasons.

One of the most sure-handed receivers in the league, **Jason Avant** posted a career-high 53 receptions in 2012. In fact, the 8th-year pro from Michigan increased his reception total during each of his first seven campaigns. Avant, who overcame a rough childhood in Chicago, IL, is one of the most respected players in the confines of the Eagles locker room.

A 5th round draft choice in 2010, **Riley Cooper** provides size to the wide receivers ranks while proving to be an accomplished performer on special teams.

Speedy **Damaris Johnson** was signed as a rookie free agent from Tulsa in 2012. He finished his three-year career as the NCAA's all-time leader in all-purpose yardage (7,796)

Arrelious Benn was acquired in a trade with Tampa Bay in 2013 offseason. He spent his first three NFL seasons with the Buccaneers (2nd round pick in 2010) after a stellar career at Illinois

Greg Salas was claimed off waivers from New England in 2012. He was a 4th round pick of St. Louis in 2011 and was one of the most accomplished receivers in WAC history, while playing at Hawaii.

Nick Miller has suited up with both Oakland and St. Louis in his three-year NFL career, playing both receiver and returner. He was signed by the Raiders as a rookie free from Southern Utah in 2009.

Rookie free agent **Russell Shepard** was a multi-purpose threat at LSU, playing quarterback, running back, and wide receiver.

Ifeanyi Momah, a 6-7 target, signed with the Eagles in 2013 after missing all but one game over the last two seasons. He suffered an ACL injury in Boston College's opener in 2011 after catching 8 passes for 171 yards.

Will Murphy was signed as a rookie free agent from Oregon in 2013. He made the Ducks squad as a walk on. **Dave Ball** was added early in camp. He had a stellar college career at New Hampshire

Injured Reseve: A 1st round pick in 2009, **Jeremy Maclin** became the 8th receiver in NFL history to have at least 55 catches and 750 yards in each of his first four NFL seasons. The Missouri product holds the team record for most receptions (258) during the first four years of a career. Maclin had a team-leading 69 catches, 857 yards and 7 TDs in 2012. He suffered a torn ACL in practice on July 27.

TIGHT ENDS

Recognized for his ability both as a receiver and as a blocker, **Brent Celek** is in his 7th NFL season after joining the Eagles as a 5th round pick in 2007. Among TEs, only Pete Retzlaff has caught more passes in team history. He posted 57 catches for 684 yards in 2012.

Position-By-Position Breakdown



James Casey signed with the Eagles during the 2013 offseason after spending his first four NFL campaigns in Houston. A fifth round draft choice of the Texans in 2009, Casey has proven to be an accomplished receiver and blocker.

The Eagles 2nd round draft choice in 2013, **Zach Ertz** was one of the nation's most productive tight ends as a senior at Stanford, catching 69 passes for 898 yards in 2012. He was tutored in high school by former 49ers All-Pro tight end Brent Jones.

Clay Harbor grabbed a career-high 25 passes in 2012, his third year in Philadelphia after being drafted in 4th round from Missouri State.

Signed as a rookie free agent in 2012, **Emil Igwenagu** spent the last three weeks of his rookie season on the active roster.

Derek Carrier spent his rookie season on the Eagles practice squad after signing as a rookie free agent with Oakland in 2012.

Will Shaw was signed as a rookie free agent from Youngstown St.

OFFENSIVE LINE

In 2000, he was a redshirt defensive lineman in college, laboring on Arkansas' scout team. In 2004, he was a rookie free agent tight end just looking for playing time in Buffalo. Now, **Jason Peters** is a five-time Pro Bowl offensive tackle who is regarded by many experts as the best left tackle in the game. Acquired in a trade from Buffalo in 2009, Peters missed the 2012 season after rupturing his Achilles tendon during the offseason.

Now in his 3rd season in Philadelphia, **Evan Mathis** has flourished in his new home. In fact, the former 3rd round draft choice of Carolina was tabbed by Pro Football Focus and CBS Sports.com as an All-Pro selection in 2012. He previously played with Carolina, Miami and Cincinnati.

A mainstay on the Eagles offensive line since 2005 is **Todd Herremans**, a former 5th round draft pick from Saginaw Valley State. He served primarily as the Eagles left guard from 2006-10, but primarily played right tackle from 2011-12. Herremans, who earned All-Joe honors from the USA Today in 2008 and 2011, also has two career touchdown receptions.

Center **Jason Kelce**, who started all 16 games for the Eagles as a rookie, had his sophomore season cut short in week 2 with an ACL and MCL injury in his right knee. He was a 6th round draft choice from Cincinnati and quickly earned a starting role with his athleticism and intelligence. His brother, Travis, was a 3rd round pick of the Chiefs in 2013 as a tight end.

A physically gifted athlete who played collegiately as a quarterback, tight end and defensive lineman before transitioning to offensive line, **Lane Johnson** was the 4th overall pick by the Eagles in 2013 from Oklahoma.

A first round pick in 2011, **Danny Watkins** started 12 games as a rookie and was named to the PFW/PFWA All-Rookie team. A native of Kelowna, BC, Canada, Watkins began playing football at the age of 22 and blocked for Redskins QB Robert Griffin III at Baylor.

Dennis Kelly, a towering 5th round draft pick from Purdue in 2012, provided depth at both tackle and guard as a rookie.

Dallas Reynolds started the majority of the 2012 season at center for the Eagles after Kelce went down with an injury during week two. He spent the majority of his first three seasons on the Eagles practice squad.

Nate Menkin, claimed off waivers from Houston in 2012, has persevered during his rise from Division III Mary Hardin-Baylor. **Julian Vandervelde** was a 5th round draft choice of the Eagles in 2011 and has spent time on their active roster and practice squad. **Matt Tennant**, a 5th-round pick of New Orleans in 2010, and **Matt Kopa**, signed from New England's practice squad in 2012 also return.

Allen Barbre has played with Green Bay, Seattle and Miami during his first six seasons. He was a 4th round pick of the Packers in 2007

Ed Wang, the first ever Chinese American drafted into the NFL (by Buffalo in 2010), played in six games with the Bills as a rookie.

Matt Tobin (Iowa) and **Michael Bamiro** (Stony Brook) were signed as rookie free agents in 2013.

Nic Purcell, a former Rugby player in New Zealand, signed with the Eagles in 2013 after participating in their rookie camp on a tryout basis. He first started playing football in 2011 at Golden West CC.

DEFENSIVE LINE

Fletcher Cox made an immediate impact as a rookie in 2012 after being selected with the 12th overall pick. He earned a spot on the PFWA's All-Rookie team after notching 5.5 sacks, 5th most by an NFL DT and 5th most by a rookie

Long-time 49ers lineman **Isaac Sopoaga**, a proven and dependable performer in the trenches was added in the 2013 offseason. He was selected by the 49ers in the 4th round in 2004 from Hawaii and missed just three games from 2005-2012.

Vinny Curry, a 2nd round pick of the Eagles in 2012, finished his career at Marshall with 26 sacks, 49 TFL and 10 forced fumbles.

2nd-year pro **Cedric Thornton** saw action in all 16 games in 2012 after spending the majority of his rookie season on the Eagles practice squad. He was signed by the Eagles as a rookie free agent.

Antonio Dixon has overcome remarkable odds and obstacles during his youth just to make it to the NFL and has carved out a four-year career, mostly in Philadelphia.

Coming from a tremendous football lineage, **Clifton Geathers**, a 6-8, 340-lb. lineman was acquired in a trade with the Colts in 2013.

Bennie Logan, a third round draft pick in 2013, anchored one of the nation's top defensive fronts at LSU.

Joe Kruger (Utah) and **David King** (Oklahoma) were selected in the 7th round in 2013, while the Eagles added a trio of rookie free agents: **Isaac Remington** (Oregon), **Damion Square** (Alabama), and **Daryell Walker** (Hampton).

LINEBACKERS

A 5th round draft selection from Cincinnati in 2005, two-time Pro Bowl selection **Trent Cole** is a proven commodity at rushing the passer and stopping the run. Now in his 9th season in Philadelphia, Cole has the third most sacks in Eagles history, trailing only Reggie White and Clyde Simmons.

Position-By-Position Breakdown



The Eagles signed free agent **Connor Barwin** from Houston during the 2013 offseason. Barwin, who was also a basketball player at the University of Cincinnati, notched 11.5 sacks for the Texans in 2011. He was a 2nd round pick of Houston in 2009.

A two-time All-Pro and Pro Bowl middle linebacker, **DeMeco Ryans** was acquired by the Eagles in 2012 in a trade with Houston. A 2nd round pick of the Texans in 2006, Ryans was the Texans all-time leader with 637 tackles. He led the Eagles with 148 tackles in 2012, including 16 behind the line of scrimmage.

The Eagles added speedy LB **Mychal Kendricks** in the 2nd round in the 2012 draft from California. He posted 88 tackles during his rookie campaign. He appeared in all 51 games during his four-year career at Cal and was named the Pac-12's Defensive Player of the Year following his senior season.

Brandon Graham, a first round draft selection in 2010 out of Michigan, battled back from a torn ACL suffered late in his rookie campaign to return to the field in a limited role in the latter half of the 2011 season and had 5.5 sacks in 2012.

The team's leading tackler in 2011, **Jamar Chaney** has seen action at all three linebacker positions during his career while being a productive member of the special teams.

Signed in 2011 fresh off a successful stint in the CFL, **Phillip Hunt** has provided depth over the last two years. Prior to his arrival in Philadelphia, Hunt notched 19 sacks from 2009-10 for the Winnipeg Blue Bombers, including a league-leading 16 sacks in 2010.

Casey Matthews was a 4th round draft pick from Oregon in 2011. He is the 6th member of his family to play in the NFL.

Emmanuel Acho, brother of Cardinals LB Sam Acho, was acquired in a trade with Cleveland in 2013. The University of Texas product missed his entire rookie season with a knee injury.

Everette Brown, a 2nd round pick of the Panthers in 2009, and **Chris McCoy**, a 7th round pick of Miami in 2010, were added in 2013.

Jake Knott, a rookie free agent from Iowa State, earned first team All-Big 12 honors in 2012. **Travis Long** (Washington State) was added as a rookie free agent early in camp.

Injured Reserve: Jason Phillips, a special teams standout with the Panthers in 2012, was acquired as a free agent in 2013. Phillips was originally a 5th round draft pick of the Ravens in 2009. He suffered torn ACL in his knee during practice on July 29.

DEFENSIVE BACKS

Bradley Fletcher was a third round draft choice of the Rams in 2009 and spent his first four NFL seasons in St. Louis. He led the Rams with 4 interceptions in 2010.

Cary Williams earned a Super Bowl championship with the Ravens in 2012. He started all 16 games and posted four INTs. He began his career with Tennessee in 2008 (7th round pick).

Patrick Chung, a native of Kingston, Jamaica, spent his first four NFL seasons in New England after being drafted by the Patriots in the 2nd round of the 2009 draft. He played collegiately at Oregon.

Now in his 4th year with the Eagles, 2010 second round pick **Nate Allen** notched a career high with 81 tackles in 2012.

No stranger to the Eagles or the NFC East, former Giant **Kenny Phillips** was signed by Philadelphia to add to the safety depth. When healthy, Phillips has been a valuable performer during his first five years in the NFL since being selected in the first round in 2008.

Brandon Boykin, a fourth round selection out of Georgia in 2012, provides ability as an inside cover man and as a returner.

Kurt Coleman is a savvy and hard-hitting defensive back. He was drafted by Philadelphia in the 7th round in 2010 and ranked 2nd on the team with 105 tackles in 2012.

Safety **David Sims**, originally signed by the Giants as a rookie free agent in 2011, spent time on the Browns practice squad in 2011 before being acquired in a trade with Cleveland in 2012.

Special teams MVP **Colt Anderson** rebounded in 2012 after tearing his ACL during the 2011 campaign. Plucked from Minnesota's practice squad in 2010, Anderson has become a staple on special teams.

A 3rd round draft pick in 2011, **Curtis Marsh** is a valuable contributor on special teams while providing depth at cornerback.

Brandon Hughes has been a contributor on special teams since joining the team in 2010 off the Giants practice squad. A 5th round pick of the Chargers in 2009, Hughes spent his rookie campaign on Injured Reserve before landing on the Giants practice squad.

5th-round pick **Earl Wolff** was a first team All-ACC selection following his senior season at NC State in 2012. His 51 games ranked first in Wolfpack history, while his 400 tackles ranked 4th.

Jordan Poyer was a 7th round pick in 2013 from Oregon State, where he earned first-team All Pac 12 honors as a senior.

CB **Trevard Lindley** was a 4th round pick of the Eagles in 2010 and was re-signed this past offseason. CB **Eddie Whitley** spent the last four weeks of the 2012 season on the Eagles practice squad after being signed by Dallas as a rookie free agent.

SPECIAL TEAMS

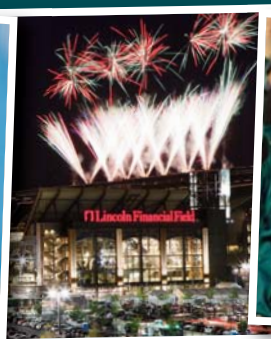
Alex Henery has connected on 51 of 58 field goal attempts in his career for an 87.9% mark. He set a franchise record and a rookie NFL mark with a 88.9% rate in 2011. He owns the longest consecutive field goal streak in team history with a streak of 22 in 2012.

Jon Dorenbos is one of the league's most reliable long snappers and, as a result, earned Pro Bowl honors in 2009. The UTEP alum is in his 11th NFL season and his eighth in Philadelphia.

10th-year pro **Donnie Jones** was signed after spending the 2012 campaign with Houston. He was also punted for Seattle (2004), Miami (2005-06), and St. Louis (2007-11). He is one of seven players in NFL history to post a 50.0+ gross average in a season.

Brad Wing, a former Australian rules player, was signed as a rookie free agent from LSU. He averaged 44.6 yards per punt and earned All-America honors in 2011.

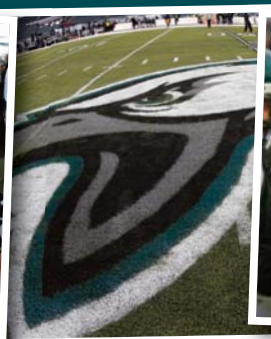
