HEADLINES

In Sunday's season opening win, six rookies, **CB Dee Milliner**, **DT Sheldon Richardson**, **QB Geno Smith**, **G Brian Winters**, **FB Tommy Bohannon** and **WR Ryan Spadola**, all saw action. **The last time the Jets had six rookies play in a season opener was 2006** when **D'Brickashaw Ferguson**, **Nick Mangold**, **Eric Smith**, **Leon Washington**, **Brad Smith** and **Drew Coleman** all took the field.

In his first game action in almost a year, **new TE Kellen Winslow led the team with seven receptions for 79 yards**. Winslow, was just one of the offseason acquisitions to make their presence felt in the debut. **S Dawan Landry's** second-quarter interception led to a Jets touch-down drive and **LB Antawn Barnes** recorded his first sack as a Jet as part of a pass rush that registered three sacks total.

QB Geno Smith became the first rookie drafted in the second round or later to pass for 250+ yards and win on Kickoff Weekend since the 1970 AFL/NFL merger. Smith also became the first Jets QB to lead the team in both passing yards (256) and rushing yards (47) since Ray Lucas accomplished the feat at NYG (12/05/99).

Continuing his strong opening day performances with the Jets, **K Nick Folk went three-for-three on FG attempts, including the game-winning 48-yard kick with seven seconds remaining, his second game winner in the last three opening days**. Since joining the team in 2010, Folk has gone 10-for-10 on FGs, 10-for-10 on XPs and has three kicks of 40+ yards.

The Jets defense had a strong opening day performance, **limiting Pro Bowl RB Doug Martin to 2.6 yards per carry and holding QB Josh Freeman under 50% passing**, including a five-for-17 effort in the second half.

In Thursday games, the Jets defense has fared well under Coach Ryan, holding opponents to 265.3 yards per game (ranked fourth since 2009), 153.8 yards per game passing (ranked third) and a 35.2% third-down conversion percentage (ranked ninth).

Named special teams coordinator on January 8, 2013 following the retirement of legendary Special Teams coach Mike Westhoff. Prior to earning this promotion, Kotwica served as the team's assistant special teams coach from 2009-12. In his previous role, Kotwica worked with Westhoff. Since 2007, when Kotwica began learning under Westhoff, the Jets special teams units have returned eight kickoffs for touchdowns (the most touchdowns scored on special teams in the NFL during that time span). Kotwica, a graduate of West Point, spent seven years in the Army before leaving as a decorated officer.

Marty Mornhinweg

Offensive Coordinator

First season with the Jets

Named the offensive coordinator on January 24, 2013, after spending 10 seasons with the Philadelphia Eagles where he served as senior assistant (2003) and assistant head coach/offensive coordinator (2004-12).

He established a reputation for being one of the top football minds in the NFL. Mornhinweg has put together record-setting performances for two different franchises (San Francisco and Philadelphia) in the role of offensive coordinator.

During Mornhinweg's time as coordinator with the Eagles, the offense set single-season franchise records in completions (367 in 2012), total net yards (6,386 in 2011), completion percentage (62.0 in 2010), total points (439 in 2010) average per rush (5.4 in 2010), third down percentage (42.4 in 2007), net passing yards (4,119 in 2006), passer rating (96.7 in 2006), fewest interceptions (9 in 2006) and tied for the fewest turnovers (22 in 2004).

Devlin founded the Devlin Football Camp which donates funds each year to various causes. He also created a scholarship in honor of his father which is granted to football players at Bloomsburg University. Coach Devlin was selected in the fifth-round of the 1993 NFL Draft by the Buffalo Bills. During his career in the NFL, he appeared in 101 regular season games and played in Super Bowl XXVIII with the Bills.

Karl Dunbar

Defensive Line Coach

Second season with the Jets

In his first season with the Jets, Dunbar guided the development of second-year DL Muhammad Wilkerson and rookie LB Quinton Coples. Wilkerson led all Jets defensive linemen with 90 tackles and totaled five sacks and two FF. Coples' 5.5 sacks in 2012 led the team and were the most by a Jets rookie since Shaun Ellis, who recorded 8.5 in 2000.

Dunbar coached the defensive line for the Minnesota Vikings from 2006-2011, where the Vikings defense allowed the fewest rushing yards in the NFL and recorded the sixth most sacks during that six-season span.

As the Vikings defensive line coach, Dunbar instructed several Pro Bowl players. DT Kevin Williams was selected to the Pro Bowl five times, DE Jared Allen was selected four times and DT Pat Williams was selected three times.

Dunbar was selected in the eighth round of the 1990 NFL Draft by the Pittsburgh Steelers and played defensive line for the Steelers, New Orleans Saints and Arizona Cardinals during his career (1990-1995).

First season with the Jets

Entering his first season with the Jets after spending the previous four seasons as the Cleveland Browns tight ends coach. Served as the offensive coordinator at UNLV and helped the team break 20 school offensive records during his two-year tenure. Earned NAIA All-America honors as a senior wide receiver at Cal-Lutheran University.

Ron Heller

Assistant Offensive Line Coach

First season with the Jets

Comes to the Jets following a one-year stint in the UFL coaching the offensive line for the Omaha Nighthawks. Spent 2010-11 as the assistant

offensive line coach for the Jacksonville Jaguars.

Played 12 seasons in the NFL after being picked in the fourth round by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Played a total of 179 games and made 173 starts for the Buccaneers, Eagles and Dolphins. Was named Philadelphia's 1989 offensive MVP for protecting QB Randall Cunningham's blindside.

Won the 1983 National Championship at Penn State where he was a two-year starter.

Sanjay Lal

Wide Receivers Coach

Second season with the Jets

In his first season with the Jets, Lal oversaw the improvement of second-year WR Jeremy Kerley who established career highs and led the team in receptions, receiving yards and yards per catch. Lal coached WR Santonio Holmes, who was on pace to catch 80 passes (for 1,296 yards) before suffering a season-ending injury in Week Four.

Lal coached the Oakland Raiders from 2007-2011 (Wide Receivers 2009-11, Assistant Wide Receivers 2007-08) and helped the 2011 Raiders wide receivers unit rank sixth in the NFL with an average of 15.0 yards per catch.

In 2009, he developed rookies Darrius Heyward-Bey and Louis Murphy who became the first rookie tandem to start at wide receiver in the NFL since 2000.

Quarterbacks

First season with the Jets

Joined the Jets after spending the 2012 season with BUF. Worked on MIA staff from 2008-10 and played a vital role in making the Wildcat offense popular in the NFL.

Tim McDonald

Defensive Backs Coach

First season with the Jets

Joins the NFL coaching ranks for the first time with the Jets. Previously served as the Fresno State secondary coach where he coached Redskins 2013 second-round draft pick safety Phillip Thomas who became the first Bulldogs player to earn All-American honors after leading the nation with eight interceptions. The Bulldogs' other safety, Derron Smith, was tied for fifth in the nation with six interceptions.

Enjoyed a 13-year NFL career with the St. Louis/Phoenix Cardinals and San Francisco 49ers as a strong safety. Career highlights and honors include six Pro Bowl selections, helping the 49ers earn a Super Bowl XXIX victory and being named as one of six safeties to the Walter Camp All-Century Team.

Eldest son Timothy Jr. (T.J.) started for three seasons at USC before being selected in the third round by the St. Louis Rams in the 2013 NFL Draft. Younger son Tevin is a safety for Eastern Washington University.

Brian Smith

Assistant Defensive Backs Coach

Seventh season with the Jets

Enters his first season as the Jets assistant defensive backs coach and seventh season with the team. Jets defensive backs have held their opponents to an NFL-low 71.0 passer rating, 52.6 completion percentage and 11,921 yards since the start of his tenure as a defensive coach in New York in 2009. Three-year starter at UMass as a strong safety and cornerback, who totaled 306 tackles (214 solo), 23 passes defended and eight interceptions, earning All-Atlantic 10, All-New England and All-ECAC honors as a senior.

Linebackers

First season with the Jets

Joined the Jets after serving as the defensive coordinator at Auburn in 2012. Prior to his time at Auburn, he spent the previous four seasons as the defensive coordinator for the Atlanta Falcons (2008-11) after initially joining the organization as its linebackers coach in 2007.

During his stint with Falcons, the team posted four consecutive winning seasons (2008-11) for the first time in franchise history, including playoff appearances in 2008, 2010 and 2011.

Under the leadership of VanGorder as defensive coordinator (2008-11), Atlanta ranked fourth in the NFL with a +22 turnover margin throughout that time span.

Defensive Assistant – Defensive Line/Linebackers

Fourth season with the Jets

Re-joined the Jets for the 2013 season, after working with the team from 2009-11. He was originally added to the coaching staff as a defensive assistant in 2009, before being elevated to outside linebackers coach in 2010 and assistant defensive line coach in 2011.

The rookie was one of only five players in the NFL to register a 100-yard receiving game in the preseason, hauling in three receptions for 110 yards and a touchdown against the New York Giants.

KERLEY KEEPING MOVING

Entering his third NFL season, **WR Jeremy Kerley** looks to continue his versatility after a career-year as a wide out and punt returner. Last season, Kerley appeared in all 16 games and led the team with career highs in receptions (56), yards (827), yards per catch (14.8) and plays of 40-plus yards (6). He also caught two touchdown passes and returned a punt for a score while becoming the first Jets WR to lead the team in both receptions and receiving yards since Jericho Cotchery in 2009.

In Week One vs. BUF last season, Kerley became the first player in Jets history to score a receiving touchdown and a punt return touchdown in the same game.

Following the injury to **WR Santonio Holmes** in Week Four vs. SF, Kerley's production increased during the final 12 weeks of the 2012 campaign, as he led the team in receptions in six games and receiving yards in seven games.

WR Stephen Hill continued his strong play in season openers in 2013's Week One. In the 18-17 win against Tampa Bay, Hill set a new single-game career-high of six receptions. He also had 39 receiving yards.

In last season's opener, Hill exploded onto the scene in Week One. Sanchez completed 66.7 percent of his passes (28-of-42) for 366 yards, throwing for two touchdowns and two interceptions and compiling a 90.0 passer rating. In the Jets' first preseason game, Sanchez followed an early interception by completing nine-of-10 passes for 115 yards and a touchdown for an overall passer rating of 99.8. The fifth-year signal caller then led the Jets to a dominant 37-13 victory over the Jaguars in Week Two of the preseason, going 13-for-23 for 169 yards with one touchdown and an interception. Sanchez ended his 2013 preseason with an efficient five-for-six performance for 72 yards and a 116.7 passer rating in the MetLife Bowl against the Giants.

SECOND (ROUND) TO NONE

QB Geno Smith became the first rookie drafted in the second round or later to pass for 250+ yards and win on Kickoff Weekend since the 1970 AFL/NFL merger. Smith also became the first Jets QB to lead the team in both passing yards (256) and rushing yards (47) since Ray Lucas accomplished the feat at NYG (12/05/99). Down 14-5 in the second quarter, Smith, twice, brought the Jets back to take the lead becoming the first QB to overcome a deficit of at least nine points in his NFL debut since Ryan Fitzpatrick did it for the Rams at Houston on 11/27/05.

SUMMER OF VLAD

After a strong preseason, **OL Vladimir Ducasse** earned the start for the Jets in Week One at left guard. The former second-round pick joins G Willie Colon as the new starting members of the offensive line. Ducasse has seen his playing time steadily increase during his three-year career. He played on fewer than 10 percent of offensive plays during his first two seasons before playing on over 25 percent of offensive plays in 2012. He played in every offensive snap for the Jets in the 2013 season opener.



YOUTH IS SERVED

In Sunday's season opening win, six rookies, **CB Dee Milliner**, **DT Sheldon Richardson**, **QB Geno Smith**, **G Brian Winters**, **FB Tommy Bohanon** and **WR Ryan Spadola**, all saw action. The last time the Jets had six rookie play in a season opener was 2006 when **T D'Brickashaw Ferguson**, **C Nick Mangold**, Eric Smith, Leon Washington, Brad Smith and Drew Coleman all took the field.

FERGUSON & MANGOLD

LT D'Brickashaw Ferguson and **C Nick Mangold** entered the NFL together as 2006 New York Jets first-round selections and have gone on to play 118 out of 120 possible games together, including seven playoff contests. Ferguson has only missed one snap in his career while Mangold has missed only two career games. The duo has combined for seven Pro Bowl selections and became the only two players to enter the league together and start in their first 75 regular-season games on the same offensive line since 1970. As part of the same starting offensive line, the two stalwarts have blocked for 29 100-yard rushers and 11 300-yard passers.

In his first career start, **DL Damon Harrison** anchored the Jets defense in the win against Tampa Bay and set a career-high in tackles (6). He also had one tackle for loss and helped hold Pro Bowl RB Doug Martin to 2.7 yards per carry on 24 attempts.

"Snacks" was the only undrafted free agent to make the active roster in 2012 and is poised to make his presence felt in his sophomore season. Harrison finished the preseason with 11 tackles in three games, after a standout game against the New York Giants in which he recorded seven solo tackles, including two for losses. In his second season (2012), **DL Muhammad Wilkerson** produced the best season by a Jets defensive lineman since Head Coach Rex Ryan took the helm of the Jets in 2009. His tackles (90) and QB pressures (33) rank first among all linemen under Ryan. He stands second in forced fumbles (2) and third in sacks (5).

Wilkerson had an especially strong second half of the 2012 season beginning at Seattle (11/11) where he recorded the first fumble recovery of his career and raced 21-yards to score his first NFL touchdown. On the very next series, Wilkerson forced a fumble by RB Marshawn Lynch that was recovered by **LB Calvin Pace**. The following week at SL (11/18) he forced a fumble by QB Sam Bradford, which was scooped up by former LB Bart Scott and returned 38 yards. At TEN (12/17), Wilkerson blocked a 46-yard field goal attempt by Rob Bironas. During the course of the last eight games of the 2012 season, Wilkerson recorded 44 tackles, four sacks, a FF and a FR.

K Nick Folk registered his fifth game-winning field goal as a Jet vs. TB after hitting a 48-yarder that gave the Jets the lead with 0:02 on the clock. Folk registered 10 of the Jets 18 points against the Bucs, connecting on all three field goal attempts. The Jets kicker recorded a 43-yard field goal in the second quarter and a 30-yarder that gave the Jets a fourth quarter lead. After winning the punting competition in training camp, **P Robert Malone** returns for his second season with the Jets. Last season, he set the franchise mark for gross punting average (45.8) and recorded second best net punting average (38.5) in club history. In the season opening win, Malone registered an 84-yard punt, ranking as the second longest in Jets all-time history. He surpassed Chuck Ramsey's 79-yard punt at BAL (10/15/78) and is second only to Steve O'Neil's 98-yard punt at DEN (9/21/69). The last time an NFL player had a punt of 84 yards or longer in a game was Brian Moorman (84 yards) at GB on 12/22/02.
