The New England Patriots improved to 3-0 for the first time since 2007 and for the eighth time in team history after a 23-3 victory last Sunday against the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. This week, the Patriots will face their second consecutive NFC South opponent when they travel to Atlanta to play the Falcons in the Georgia Dome in a primetime Sunday Night Football game. The game is the second of five scheduled national television games for the Patriots. In addition to the Falcons game, the Patriots played the New York Jets on Thursday Night Football on Sept. 12 and will play at Carolina on Monday Night Football on Nov. 18, vs. Denver on Sunday night on Nov. 24 and at Baltimore on Sunday Night Football on Dec. 22.

The Patriots have allowed a total of 34 points through three games this season, but the defense has allowed only 27 points this season (seven opponent points came on a fumble return). The 34 total points allowed by the Patriots are the fewest for the team through three games since 1979, when New England started the season by allowing 33 points in the first three games (losing 16-13 to Pittsburgh in overtime, beating the New York Jets 56-3, and winning 20-14 at Cincinnati).

# **ROBERT KRAFT NEWS & NOTES**

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. Now in his 20th season of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what many observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning



just 19 of 80 games (.238 pct.) and recording the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles (12), conference crowns (6) and Super Bowl championships (3) than any other NFL team. The Patriots have made six Super Bowl appearances since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other NFL franchise has earned more than four berths. In Kraft's 19 seasons, the Patriots qualified for the playoffs 14 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons.

In the early 1990s, the Patriots seemed destined for relocation until Robert Kraft's purchase of the team rejuvenated local interest. In 1991, the season ticket base was just 17,635, barely enough to support the club. Now, the season tickets are capped and more than 50,000 fans are on a season ticket waiting list. The Patriots have sold out 209 consecutive home games, including playoff and preseason games (dating back to the 1994 season opener).

# PATRIOTS VS. FALCONS

SERIES HISTORY



The New England Patriots and the Atlanta Falcons will clash this week for the  $13^{\text{th}}$  time in the regular season and for the first time since 2009 when the Patriots beat the Falcons, 26-10, on Sept. 27 at Gillette Stadium. That victory tied the all-time series at 6-6.

The 2009 victory also marked the Falcons' first trip to Gillette Stadium.

The Patriots have won the last three times the teams have played in the regular season with wins in 2001 and 2005 at the Georgia Dome in addition to the 2009 victory.

Prior to those three wins, the Patriots had suffered four straight losses to the Falcons, dating back to 1989.

The two teams spent a week working with each other at the Falcons facility prior to a 2010 preseason game.

QB Tom Brady's first start against an NFC team was on Nov. 4, 2001 against the Falcons at the Georgia Dome. Brady completed 21-of-31 passes for 250 and three touchdowns in a 24-10 win.

CONSECUTIVE AWAY GAMES UNDER BILL BELICHICK The Patriots will play consecutive games on the road for the 25<sup>th</sup> time under Bill Belichick when they travel to Atlanta this weekend to play the Falcons and Cincinnati the following weekend to play the Bengals. Since 2000, Belichick's Patriots have compiled a 33-17 record for a .660 winning percentage when playing more than one consecutive game on the road. The Patriots have played two away games in a row 22 times since 2000, earning a 29-15 record in those contests. They have also played three away games in a row twice since 2000, with a 4-2 record in those games. Under Belichick's tenure, the Patriots have won back-to-back games on the road 10 times and have lost consecutive road games just twice. The Patriots were 3-1 in their two pairs of consecutive away games in 2012, splitting a late September road trip with a loss in Baltimore and a win in Buffalo before earning back-to-back road wins against the New York Jets on Nov. 22 and the Miami Dolphins on Dec. 2.

The New England Patriots offense hit from every angle and the New England defense held the high-powered Atlanta Falcons to just 10 points in a 26-10 victory in a steady rain in Foxborough. Quarterback Tom Brady threw for 277 yards, WR Randy Moss caught 10 passes for 116 yards and RB Fred Taylor gained 105 yards rushing. New England had 28 first downs, gained 445 yards in total offense and possessed the ball for 39:49.

Stephen Gostkowski connected on four field goals, including three on drives inside the red zone. Taylor scored on an 8-yard run in the second quarter and Brady became the  $27^{\text{th}}$  player to pass for 200 touchdowns on a 36-yard score to TE Chris Baker in the fourth quarter.

After playing a competitive game for the first half, New England took control and dominated the rest of the way. Atlanta scored on two of its first three drives of the game, but possessed the ball for just over six minutes in the second half and gained only 78 yards of total offense against a stingy Patriots defense. New England held RB Michael Turner to 56 yards, TE Tony Gonzalez to only one catch and QB Matt Ryan to just 17 completions and no touchdowns.

The Patriots took the lead in the second quarter after taking advantage of a shanked 29-yard punt that allowed a drive to begin at midfield. Taylor gained 41 yards, including a 19-yard run and an 8-yard touchdown run to cap a New England scoring drive that put them in front, 10-3. Atlanta tied the game at 10-10 on the next series by converting a fourth-and-3 from the 34-yard line on their way to a 2-yard touchdown run by Turner. After stopping the Patriots on the next set of downs, Atlanta drove to the New England 31yard line before S Brandon McGowan forced a fumble on a hard hit to Turner that was recovered by S James Sanders. New England responded by executing a 12-play, 58-yard drive that ended in a 33-yard field goal for a 13-10 halftime advantage. After adding a field goal for a 16-10 lead with their opening drive of the second half, head coach Bill Belichick called two fourth-down plays on a series that ended in another field goal early in the fourth quarter. Faced with a fourth-and-1 from their own 24-yard line, RB Sammy

Morris converted with a 2-yard run up the middle. Later on the same drive the Patriots were faced with a fourth-and-3 from the Atlanta 37-yard line. Brady completed a deep pass to Moss for a 21-yard gain to keep the drive alive. The conversions allowed New England to stretch a drive that went 16 plays, 70 yards and chewed up seven minutes off the play clock.

Hamilton also had two coaching stints in New England as an assistant defensive line coach from 1985-1989 and Defensive Line Coach from 1997-1999. He graduated from Suffolk University in Boston, Mass. in 1977.
- Falcons CB Asante Samuel was selected by New England in the fourth round of the 2003 NFL Draft and spent five

#### TOM BRADY

- Tom Brady needs one touchdown pass against the Falcons to extend his streak to 52 straight games with at least one touchdown pass. It is the second longest streak of all time, behind Drew Brees (54).
- Brady (139) needs one more win to become the fifth NFL starting quarterback to lead his team to at least 140 regular season victories and join Brett Favre (186), Peyton Manning (157), John Elway (148) and Dan Marino (147).
- Brady tied Drew Brees with his ninth NFL game with four touchdowns, 300 yards and no interceptions against St. Louis (10/28/12) and needs one more such game to be alone in first place.
- Brady has the fifth most 300-yard games in NFL history with 53, behind Peyton Manning (75), Drew Brees (70), Dan Marino (63) and Brett Favre (62).
- Brady (339) needs three touchdowns against the Falcons to move into a tie with Fran Tarkenton (342) for fourth place all-time.
- Brady needs one more touchdown to become the fifth
   NFL player with at least 340 career touchdown passes.

#### JULIAN EDELMAN

- Julian Edelman has the highest punt return average in NFL history at 13.0 (83-1076) and is one of seven NFL players with a punt return average of 12.0 or above.
- Edelman needs one more punt return for a touchdown to set the team mark with his fourth punt returned for a touchdown. He is tied with Irving Fryar and Troy Brown with three returns for a touchdown.

#### STEPHEN GOSTKOWSKI

 Stephen Gostkowski is tied with Adam Vinatieri for the team lead with eight career 50-yard field goals and needs one more to break the tie and become the team's all-time leader.

#### **ROB NINKOVICH**

 Rob Ninkovich has the most fumble recoveries of any NFL player over the last four years (2010-13) with 10 and can add on to that total with a fumble recovery against the Falcons.

#### AQIB TALIB

 Aqib Talib needs an interception against Atlanta to register an interception in his third straight game after recording two fourth quarter interceptions vs. NY Jets (9/12) and a second quarter interception vs. Tampa Bay (9/22).

#### LEON WASHINGTON

 Leon Washington needs one more kick returned for a touchdown to set the NFL record. He is tied with Josh Cribbs with eight career returns for a touchdown.

#### TEAM

- The Patriots have forced a turnover in 30 straight games dating back to 2011. The last time the Patriots did not register at least one turnover was on Oct. 9, 2011 vs. the New York Jets.
- A win over Atlanta will give the Patriots its first 4-0 start since 2007 and its seventh time starting the season at 4-0.
- The Patriots will attempt to extend their streak to four straight games without allowing an opponent score in the fourth quarter.
- The Patriots have allowed just 34 points in the first three games and need to hold Atlanta under six points to set the team mark for fewest points allowed in the first four games of the season. The 1997 team allowed just 40 points in the first four games.

The New England Patriots improved to a 3-0 start for the eighth time in team history and for the first time since 2007 with a 23-3 victory over the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

The Patriots defense held the Buccaneers to just three points despite driving into New England territory six times. The Buccaneers missed a 38-yard field goal on the first drive of the game and were stopped on fourth-down attempts four times inside Patriots territory.

After falling behind, 3-0, in the first quarter, the Patriots scored 23 unanswered points, including a 17-point second quarter.

Tom Brady, who finished 25-of-36 for 225 yards, threw two touchdown passes to rookie WR Kenbrell Thompkins in the second quarter for a 14-3 lead. Brady culminated an 11play, 66-yard drive when he connected with Thompkins for a 16-yard touchdown pass. That drive was kept alive when Brady converted a fourth-and-2 situation with a 6-yard pass to WR Aaron Dobson. Brady's second touchdown pass to Thompkins was a 5-yard scoring pass that finished a 10play, 62-yard drive.

Aqib Talib intercepted Buccaneers QB Josh Freeman with 16 seconds to play in the first half to give the Patriots a first down at the Tampa Bay 43-yard line with 11 seconds to play. Brady completed a short pass to RB Brandon Bolden and then scrambled up the middle for 5 yards to help get in position for a 53-yard field goal by K Stephen Gostkowski for a 17-3 lead.

Gostkowski added a 46-yard field goal in the third quarter and a 33-yard field goal in the fourth quarter for a 23-3 final.

The Patriots ground game produced 156 yards on 33 attempts for a 4.7-yard average. RB LeGarrette Blount led the team with 65 yards, while RB Brandon Bolden finished with 51 yards on three carries, including a career-long 46-yard run in the third quarter. Bolden accounted for 100 yards from scrimmage with 51 yards rushing and 49 yards receiving.

#### PATRIOTS OFF TO A 3-0 START FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 2007

The Patriots are 3-0 for the eighth time in team history and for the first time since 2007. New England is now 3-0 for the fourth time under Head Coach Bill Belichick. The Patriots also started 3-0 in 1964, 1974, 1997, 1999, 2002, 2004 and 2007. In the NFL since 1990, 75.4 percent of teams (86 of 114) that started 3-0 have made the playoffs.

#### PATRIOTS DEFENSE STARTS 2013 SEASON STRONG; TEAM ALLOWS FEWEST POINTS THROUGH THREE GAMES SINCE 1979

The Patriots have allowed a total of 34 points through three games this season. The Patriots defense has allowed only 27 points this season (seven opponent points came on a fumble return). The 34 total points allowed by the Patriots are the fewest for the team through three games since 1979, when New England started the season by allowing 33 points in the first three games (losing 16-13 to Pittsburgh in overtime, beating the New York Jets 56-3, and then winning 20-14 at Cincinnati). The 34 points allowed are the second fewest in team history in the first three games, trailing only the 1979 team.

#### PATRIOTS DEFENSE ALLOWS THREE POINTS IN SOLID DEFENSIVE EFFORT

The New England defense allowed only three Tampa Bay points, marking the third consecutive home game the Patriots defense has allowed 10 points or less and the first time since 1997 that the Patriots defense has allowed three points or less in a September game. New England closed out the 2012 regular season with a 28-0 shutout of Miami at Gillette Stadium and opened its 2012 home slate with a 13-10 win over the New York Jets on Sept. 12. The last time New England allowed three points or fewer in a September game was in a 31-3 win over Chicago at Foxboro Stadium on Sept. 21, 1997. The last time the Patriots defense held an opponent to less than 10 points in a September game was on Sept. 23, 2007, in a 38-7 win over Buffalo in Foxborough.

#### PATRIOTS GROUND GAME TOTALS 156 RUSHING YARDS

The Patriots gained 156 rushing yards on 33 carries (4.7 avg.) against Tampa Bay, marking the second time in three games this season that New England has eclipsed the 150 rushing plateau. The Patriots had 158 rushing yards in the season opener at Buffalo. Against Tampa Bay, the Patriots racked up their rushing total against a Buccaneers defense that allowed the fewest rushing yards in the NFL in 2012 (82.5 yards per game).

#### PATRIOTS FORCE A TURNOVER FOR THE 30<sup>TH</sup> STRAIGHT GAME

The Patriots have now forced a turnover in 30 straight games dating back to 2011, and including all 16 regular season games of 2012 and now the first three games of 2013 after CB Aqib Talib intercepted QB Josh Freeman in the second quarter. The NFL record for most consecutive games with a turnover since the merger in 1970 is 71 by Philadelphia from 1985-1990. The last time the Patriots did not register at least one turnover was on Oct. 9, 2011 vs. the New York Jets.

#### PATRIOTS STOP TAMPA BAY ON FOURTH DOWN FOUR TIMES

The New England defense stopped Tampa Bay on fourth down four times in Patriots territory today, holding the Buccaneers to 0-for-4 on fourth downs. The Patriots stopped two Tampa Bay fourth-down conversion attempts in New England territory in the first half as the New England defense allowed only three first-half points. New England added two more fourth-down stops in the fourth quarter. The first-half fourth-down stops occurred at the Patriots' 34yard line and 38-yard line. The fourth-quarter fourth-down stops happened at the Patriots' 34-yard line and 17-yard line.

#### BRANDON BOLDEN MAKES 2013 DEBUT AND MAKES FIRST CAREER START, TOTALS 100 YARDS FROM SCRIMMAGE

RB Brandon Bolden made his 2013 season debut after missing the first two games of the year and made his first NFL start against Tampa Bay. Bolden led the team with exactly 100 yards from scrimmage (51 rushing, 49 receiving). Bolden's 100 yards from scrimmage were the second-highest such total of his career, trailing only his 148 yards from scrimmage at Buffalo on Sept. 20, 2012 (137 rushing, 11 receiving).

#### BOLDEN HAS CAREER LONG RUN IN THE THIRD QUARTER

RB Brandon Bolden had a career-long 46-yard run in the third quarter. His previous best was a 27-yard run at Buffalo on Sept. 30, 2012. It was the longest run by a Patriots player since Nov. 18, 2012 when WR Julian Edelman had a 47-yard run. It is the longest run by a Patriots running back since Sammy Morris had a 55-yard run on Dec. 27, 2009 vs. Jacksonville.

#### BOLDEN HAS CAREER-BEST RECEIVING PERFORMANCE

Brandon Bolden set career highs with five receptions and 49 receiving yards. Coming into the game, Bolden had two career receptions for 11 yards.

#### KENBRELL THOMPKINS SCORES FIRST NFL TOUCHDOWNS

Rookie WR Kenbrell Thompkins scored his first two NFL touchdowns against Tampa Bay. Thompkins tallied his first career score on a 16-yard pass from QB Tom Brady in the second quarter. He added his second touchdown on a 5-yard reception from Brady with 47 seconds to play in the first half.

#### BELICHICK ONE WIN AWAY FROM TYING CHUCK NOLL FOR FIFTH PLACE ALL-TIME

Bill Belichick won his 208th career game, bringing him within one win of Chuck Noll for fifth place on the NFL's all-time wins list.

#### STEPHEN GOSTKOWSKI TIES CAREER HIGH

K Stephen Gostkowski tied a career-high with a 53-yard field goal at the end of the first half. He also had a 53-yard field goal vs. Arizona on Sept. 16, 2012 and at Denver on Oct. 11, 2009. Gostkowski was a perfect 3-for-3 on field goals against Tampa Bay.

#### GOSTKOWSKI TIES PATRIOTS RECORD WITH HIS EIGHTH FIELD GOAL OF 50 OR MORE YARDS

Stephen Gostkowski's 53-yard field goal at the end of the first half was his eighth 50-yard field goal. He is now tied with Adam Vinatieri for the most field goals in team history of 50 or more yards with eight.

# AQIB TALIB HAS THIRD INTERCEPTION OF 2013

Aqib Talib intercepted a Josh Freeman pass at the Tampa Bay 43-yard line with 16 seconds left in the first half to set up a quick Patriots field goal that gave New England a 17-3 halftime lead. Talib's interception was his third in as many quarters, having had a pair of fourth-quarter interceptions against the Jets last week.

#### EDELMAN SURPASSES 2012 RECEIVING TOALS

Julian Edelman has 27 receptions through three games in 2013, already surpassing his 2012 season total (21). Edelman's career high for receptions is 37 catches, achieved as a rookie in 2009.

#### BRADY EXTENDS HIS STREAK TO 51 GAMES WITH AT LEAST ONE TOUCHDOWN

Tom Brady extended his streak to 51 straight games with at least one touchdown in the second quarter with his 16-yard touchdown pass to WR Kenbrell Thompkins. It is the second longest touchdown streak in NFL history, behind Drew Brees (54) and the longest active streak. Brady and Brees are the only NFL players with streaks of 50 or more consecutive games with at least one touchdown.

#### **DEFENSE QUICK HITS**

- **Devin McCourty** reached in to break up a Josh Freeman pass intended for Mike Williams in the end zone in the first quarter.
- **Alfonzo Dennard** broke up a Josh Freeman pass intended for Kevin Ogletree on third down in the fourth quarter, setting up a fourth down that the Buccaneers did not convert. On Tampa Bay's next drive, Dennard broke up a Freeman pass intended for Eric Page on second down, setting up a thirdand-nine that the Buccaneers did not convert.
- **Rob Ninkovich** and **Chandler Jones** combined to sack Josh Freeman for a 2-yard loss in the first quarter, while Jones and **Tommy Kelly** combined to sack Freeman for a 7-yard loss in the third quarter. The sacks raised Jones's team-leading total to three sacks and raised Kelly's total to 1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> sacks, while Ninkovich registered in the sack column for the first time in 2013.
- Jerod Mayo sacked Josh Freeman for a 1-yard loss on first down on the final play of the first quarter.
- **Dont'a Hightower** provided tight coverage on Doug Martin, forcing an incompletion on a secondquarter sideline pass attempt deep in Patriots territory.
- **Tommy Kelly** brought pressure on Josh Freeman on third down in the second quarter, forcing a Tampa Bay incompletion and a fourth down that the Buccaneers did not convert.
- **Brandon Spikes** and **Alfonzo Dennard** teamed up to stop Doug Martin for no gain on fourth-and-1 in the second quarter, as the Patriots stopped a Tampa Bay fourth-down conversion attempt for the second time in the first half.

#### BILL BELICHICK

- Bill Belichick (208) is in sole possession of sixth place all time in career wins and needs one more win to tie Chuck Noll, who is in fifth place with 209 career wins.
- Belichick (18) needs one more postseason victory to tie Don Shula (19) for second place in postseason wins. Tom Landry (20) is in first place.
- Belichick has five conference titles and needs one more to match Don Shula, who led his teams to six Super Bowls.
- Belichick has led the Patriots to 12 consecutive winning records (2001-12). He is tied with Curly Lambeau (12 1921-32) for third all-time. The NFL record is 20 by Tom Landry (1966-85) followed by 14 by Curly Lambeau (1934-47).

#### TOM BRADY

- Tom Brady has 53 career 300-yard games, including eight in 2012, and ranks fifth all-time for most 300-yard games.
- Brady (34) reached 30 touchdown passes in 2012 for the third straight season and became just the fifth player in NFL history with at least 30 touchdown passes in four seasons overall.
- Brady (4,827) reached 4,000 passing yards in 2012. He is just the fifth player in NFL history to reach 4,000 yards in five or more seasons: Peyton Manning (12), Drew Brees (7), Dan Marino (6) and Brett Favre (6).
- Brady has thrown at least one touchdown pass in 51 straight games, the NFL's longest active streak. Brady's 51 straight games with at least one touchdown pass is second all-time, behind Drew Brees (54).
- Brady is the only quarterback in NFL history to have thrown for at least one touchdown pass in each game for three consecutive seasons after throwing at least one touchdown in all 16 games in 2012. He has thrown for at least one touchdown in the first three games of 2013.
- Brady had 401 completions in 2012 for the second straight season and joined Drew Brees (5), Peyton Manning (2) and Matthew Stafford (2) as the only NFL quarterbacks with at least two 400 completion seasons.

#### **ROB GRONKOWSKI**

- Rob Gronkowski (10 touchdowns in 2010 and 18 in 2011) became the first tight end in NFL history with three straight 10plus touchdown seasons after reaching 11 for the season in 2012. Gronkowski and Antonio Gates (13 in 2004 and 10 in 2005) are the only tight ends to have back-to-back 10-plus touchdown seasons.
- Gronkowski joins Randy Moss (2007, 2008 and 2009) and Corey Dillon (2004, 2005, 2006) as the only Patriots with three straight 10-plus touchdown seasons and three 10-plus seasons overall.
- Gronkowski has 38 receiving touchdowns and 39 touchdowns overall (38 receiving and 1 rushing) since 2010. The 38 receiving touchdowns are the most in the NFL in that time span, and the 39 overall touchdowns are third, behind Arian Foster (48) and Adrian Peterson (42).
- Gronkowski has 38 touchdowns in just 43 games. He can become the fastest to 40 touchdowns. Antonio Gates currently holds the record after reaching 40 touchdowns in 71 games.

#### JEROD MAYO

• Jerod Mayo has registered 100 or more tackles in five straight seasons and needs one more 100-tackle season to tie Fred Marion (6) for the all-time lead in team history.

#### **ROB NINKOVICH**

Brady set a franchise record with 517 passing yards in the 2011 season-opener at Miami (9/12/11). The previous high was 426 yards by Drew Bledsoe vs. Minnesota on Nov. 13, 1994. Brady's previous best was 410 passing yards vs. Kansas City on Sept. 22, 2002. Brady is one of 14 NFL quarterbacks to throw for 500 yards or more. His 517 yards are the seventh highest in NFL history.

#### BRADY HAD 423 YARDS AS A FOLLOW-UP TO HIS 517 YARD PERFORMANCE IN MIAMI IN 2011

In the 2011 season opener in Miami (9/12/11), Brady threw for 517 yards. In Week 2 against San Diego (9/18/11), Brady became the first 500-yard passer to follow up his 500-yard performance by throwing for 400 or more yards. Before Brady's performance against the Chargers, only Drew Brees (2006) had followed-up a 500-yard game with 300 or more passing yards.

#### BRADY TIED NFL RECORD WITH THREE STRAIGHT GAMES WITH 30 COMPLETIONS IN 2011

Brady tied an NFL record with three straight games with 30 completions after completing 32 at Miami (9/12/11), 31 vs. San Diego (9/18/11) and 30 at Buffalo (9/25). He shares the record with Drew Brees (2011), Steve Young (1995), Rich Gannon (2002), Kurt Warner (2008) and Peyton Manning (2010). The most 30 completion games Brady has had in a season is five in 2007.

#### BRADY'S 65 PASS ATTEMPTS AGAINST SF ARE A CAREER-HIGH

Tom Brady's 65 passing attempts vs. San Francisco (12/16/12) are a career high, topping his 58 pass attempts at Seattle on Oct. 14, 2012. Brady's 65 attempts are the most in franchise history in a non-overtime game and are the second most in team history in any game, trailing only Drew Bledsoe's 70 attempts in an overtime win vs. Minnesota on Nov. 13, 1994. Brady's 65 pass attempts are the seventh most in NFL history and the most since Brian Griese had 67 for Tampa Bay at Chicago on Sept. 21, 2008 in overtime. It is the most in a non-overtime NFL game since Dec. 24, 2000 when the Jets Vinny Testaverde attempted 69 passes at Baltimore.

#### BOLDEN HAS FIRST 100-YARD DAY AND FINISHES WITH AN 8.6-YARD AVERAGE

Rookie RB Brandon Bolden finished with 16 carries for 137 yards and an 8.6-yard average at Buffalo (9/30/12) with runs of 20 and 27 yards. His 8.6-yard average is tied for the third highest ever in a single game for the Patriots among running backs with at least 15 rushing attempts. He earned the FedEx Ground Player of the Week for his performance.

#### DAN CONNOLLY HAS THE LONGEST KICKOFF RETURN EVER BY AN OFFENSIVE LINEMAN

Dan Connolly was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week after he returned a kickoff 71 yards to the 4-yard line in the second quarter of the Patriots win vs. Green Bay on Dec. 19, 2010. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, it is the longest kickoff return by an offensive lineman in NFL history. The run by Connolly topped the 48-yard touchdown return by Atlanta's Mal Snider in 1969. Previously, the longest kickoff return for a Patriots offensive lineman was a 27-yard return by G Stephen Neal on Nov. 30, 2008 vs. Pittsburgh. Connolly's previous best was a 16-yard return vs. Miami on Nov. 8, 2009.

#### JULIAN EDELMAN SETS FRANCHISE RECORD WITH A 94-YARD PUNT RETURN FOR A TOUCHDOWN

WR Julian Edelman set a franchise record with a 94-yard punt return for a touchdown in the second quarter vs. Miami (01/02/11). The previous longest punt return was an 89-yard touchdown return by Mike Haynes vs. Buffalo on Nov. 7, 1976. Edelman returned his second career punt for a touchdown vs. Kansas City on Nov. 21, 2011 with a 72-yard return. He was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance against Kansas City. He scored his third punt return for a touchdown with a 68-yarder vs. Indianapolis (11/18/12) to tie a franchise record.

Edelman is one of just seven NFL players to have a punt return average of 12.0 or more.

#### EDELMAN IS FIRST PATRIOTS PLAYER WITH TWO PUNT RETURNS OF 40 YARDS IN THE SAME GAME

Edelman had a 68-yard punt that he returned for a touchdown and a 49-yard return vs. Indianapolis (11/18/12). He is the first player in team history with two punt returns of 40 or more yards in the same game. Troy Brown came close in 2000 when he had returns of 39 and 66 against Tampa Bay.

#### EDELMAN'S 47-YARD RUN IS THE LONGEST RUN BY A PATS WIDE RECEIVER

Edelman had a 47-yard run in the fourth quarter vs. Indianapolis (11/18/12). It was the longest run from scrimmage for the Patriots in 2012, topping Steven Ridley's 41-yard run against St. Louis in London on Oct. 28. It is the longest run ever by a Patriots receiver, topping Troy Brown's 35-yard run vs. Tampa Bay on Sept. 3, 2000. It was the longest run by a Patriots player since Sammy Morris had a 55-yard run on Dec. 27, 2009 vs. Jacksonville.

#### EDELMAN GOES FROM STANDOUT QB TO WR

Edelman began his college football career with a year at the College of San Mateo (Calif.) before transferring to Kent State where as a senior he completed 56% of his passes (153 of 275 passes for 1,820 yards) with 13 touchdowns. He was also the leading rusher, gaining 1,551 yards on 215 attempts (an average of 7.5 yards per carry) and scoring 13 touchdowns. His offensive numbers broke Kent State's single-season record for total offense set by Joshua Cribbs in 2003. Said head coach Bill Belichick on the versatility of Edelman: "He played the guarterback position in college at Kent State and all the positions really that he's played in the NFL - covering kicks, returning kicks, slot receiver, outside receiver, slot defender - he didn't do any of those things in college. I think that really speaks to his versatility and how much he's grown as a player and how many things he's learned how to do that he really didn't have much experience with in college. I'd say that's pretty unusual, especially to be as competent in them as he is."

#### GRONKOWSKI SETS NFL RECORD FOR RECEIVING YARDS BY A TIGHT END

Rob Gronkowski finished the 2011 season with 1,327 receiving yards, surpassing San Diego's Kellen Winslow's 1980 record of 1,290 receiving yards for most receiving yards in a season by a tight end. New Orleans' Jimmy Graham also broke Winslow's old record, but finished with 1,310 receiving yards, 17 shy of Gronkowski's new record.

#### GRONKOWSKI SETS NFL MARK FOR TOUCHDOWNS BY A TIGHT END IN A SEASON

Gronkowski set an NFL record for most touchdowns by a tight end with 18 overall touchdowns (17 receiving and 1 rushing). Gronkowski passed the old mark of 13 receiving touchdowns by Vernon Davis (SF in 2009) and Antonio Gates (SD in 2004). In addition to his 17 touchdown receptions, Gronkowski scored on a lateral in the third quarter vs. Indianapolis (12/4/11), credited as his first career rushing play.

#### **GRONKOWSKI SECOND PATRIOTS TIGHT END TO REACH 1,000 YARDS**

Gronkowski became the second tight end in New England Patriots history to go over 1,000 receiving yards in 2011. He broke TE Ben Coates (1,174 yards in 1994) franchise record en route to his NFL tight end receiving record of 1,327 yards.

#### **GRONKOWSKI BECOMES FIRST PATRIOTS TIGHT** END TO RECORD A RUSHING TOUCHDOWN

Gronkowski scored a 2-yard touchdown on a lateral from Tom Brady in the third quarter vs. Indianapolis (12/4/11), becoming the first tight end in Patriots history to score a rushing touchdown. Gronkowski is the first NFL tight end to score a rushing touchdown since Tennessee's Bo Scaife had a 31-yard scoring run against Baltimore on Nov. 12, 2006. He is the first tight end since the 1970 merger to have two receiving touchdowns and a rushing touchdown in the same game.

#### LED AFC IN SCORING IN 2011; FIRST TIME THAT A TE HAS LED A CONFERENCE IN SCORING

Gronkowski led the AFC in scoring among non-kickers with 108 points in 2011 and finished second in the NFL to Philadelphia's LeSean McCoy, who had 120 points. It is the first time in NFL history that a tight end has led his conference in scoring and the first time a tight end has led the NFL in touchdown receptions (17).

#### **GRONKOWSKI HAS THREE STRAIGHT 10-TD** SEASONS

Gronkowski has three straight 10 touchdown seasons (10 in 2010, 18 in 2011 and 11 in 2012). Gronkowski joins Randy Moss (2007, 2008 and 2009) and Corey Dillon (2004, 2005, 2006) as the only Patriots with three straight 10-plus touchdown seasons and three 10-plus touchdown seasons overall.

#### **RIDLEY REACHES 12 TDS IN 2012**

Stevan Ridley scored 12 rushing TDs in 2012. It is the 13<sup>th</sup> time in Patriots history that a running back has finished a season with 10 or more touchdowns rushing. Ridley (12) and TE Rob Gronkowski (11) both had 10-plus touchdowns on the year. It is the third straight season and fifth time in team history that the Patriots have had two players finish with 10 or more touchdowns in a season. #### **STEVAN RIDLEY HAD FOUR 100-YARD RUSHING DAYS IN 2012**

Stevan Ridley had his first career 100-yard day in the 2012 season opener at Tennessee (9/9) with 125 yards rushing on 21 carries for a 6.0-yard average. He finished with 106 yards rushing on 22 carries for a 4.8-yard average at Buffalo (9/30), a career-high 151 rushing yards vs. Denver (10/7) and then gained 127 yards on 15 carries for an 8.5-yard average at St. Louis (10/28).

#### **RIDLEY GOES LONG**

In the season opener at Tennessee (9/9/12), Ridley had five runs of 15 or more yards (17, 17, 16, 15, 15). No Patriots running back in at least the past 25 years has done that in a single game, according to the Elias Sports Bureau. Tennessee's Chris Johnson was the last NFL player to have five runs of 15 or more yards in a game (Nov. 27, 2011 vs. Tampa Bay).

### **T NATE SOLDER**

#### **2011 FIRST ROUND PICK NATE SOLDER**

It only took a day for Nate Solder to decide to change from his lifelong position of tight end to tackle after playing his freshman year at Colorado as a tight end. "My coaches came to me and said, 'You'd be an all right tight end, but you'd be an even better tackle,"" he told the Boston Globe. "I've always wanted to be great, so that's why I moved to tackle." He added over 30 pounds after his redshirt freshman season and was named the team's starting left tackle. He played in 2,540 of 2,542 offensive plays over the next three seasons at Colorado and became an immediate contributor on the Patriots offensive line at right tackle as a rookie before moving to left tackle.

#### SLATER EMERGED AS A TWO-TIME CAPTAIN AND **TWO-TIME PRO BOWLER ON SPECIAL TEAMS**

Bill Belichick recently acknowledged Matthew Slater's role as a gunner on special teams: "Matt is one of the best in the league," Belichick said. "Any time the punt return team has to double somebody, that makes it one less guy they can use somewhere else in the return. He almost always draws two guys out there unless they're in an eight-man rush. Most of the time, there's two guys out there — fourth-and-short, where they're trying to protect the box - but he draws a lot of double teams, and deservedly so. He does an outstanding job of covering punts.

#### WILL SVITEK TAKES A HIKE TO REMEMBER

Will Svitek was born in Prague, Czechoslovakia. When he was 2, his parents took him and his three brothers out of the communist country. They left in secret with no money and only the clothes on their backs. Saying they were on a day hike, they walked 14 hours through the mountains and ended up in Austria. The family spent eight months in a refugee camp until being legalized to come to the United States. "My parents were hard-working immigrants who came here to achieve the American Dream and help their sons reach their full potential," said Svitek. "I think they instilled it in me to do everything well. I am a competitive person on the field and in the classroom and I don't think you can just turn that switch off."

### 💎 <u>T SEBASTIAN VOLLMER</u>

#### SEBASTIAN VOLLMER MAKES HIS MARK

A native of Kaarst, Germany, Vollmer did not begin playing football until the age of 14 when he started playing for the Dusseldorf club team. Vollmer helped lead his German prep school team to two national football championships. His early football success landed him an appearance in the 2004 Global Junior Championships in San Diego, which led him to a scholarship at Houston. He spoke very little English when he signed with Houston, but he became fluent in the language as he developed from a 250-pound tight end into a 315-pound lineman who started his final 25 games at tackle for the Cougars. He was not invited to the NFL combine, but Vollmer's collegiate career created interest from the Patriots, who drafted him in the second round of the 2009 draft. Nicknamed "Seabass" during his playing days at Houston, it is a nickname that has carried over to the NFL.

### 🔫 <u>C RYAN WENDELL</u>

#### RYAN WENDELL LEADS THE NFL IN PLAY SNAPS IN 2012

Ryan Wendell played a league-high 1,249 snaps in 2012 and it helped earn him a spot on the USA Today All-Joe team in 2012. Said Wendell: "I think first it says a lot about the organization, our training staff and our strength training coaches, that they do everything they can all season and all off-season and during the spring to keep us healthy throughout the whole season. I think it says more about them then it does about me individually."





### CB KYLE ARRINGTON

#### WHAT IS IN A NUMBER

When Arrington was first making the transition from Hofstra to the NFL in 2008, he was assigned jersey No. 42. At that point in his career, he was cut by both the Eagles and Buccaneers.

When Arrington first arrived in New England as a practice squad player in 2009, he initially donned No. 27. But when No. 24 became available, a result of Jonathan Wilhite leaving in free agency after the 2010 season, Arrington pounced on it.

The reason is that it reflects how he's flipped his NFL fortunes -- from a No. 42 struggling to hang on to a No. 24 who has carved out a role on a winning team.

Arrington moved from 24 to 25 in an agreement with Adrian Wilson this past season to accommodate the veteran's desire to keep the same jersey he has worn during his 12-year NFL career.

#### STEVE GREGORY STEVE GREGORY WAS ABOUT TO ENTER THE POLICE ACADEMY WHEN SAN DIEGO CALLED

Steve Gregory's father and stepmother are New York City police officers and both were on duty during the events of September 11, 2001. Following his college career at Syracuse, Gregory took the test to enter the police academy. He found out he passed the test on the same day that the San Diego Chargers called him to offer him a rookie free agent contract.

#### GREGORY SETS CAREER HIGH WITH HIS THIRD INTERCEPTION OF THE SEASON IN 2012

Steve Gregory set a single-season career-high when he intercepted Miami QB Ryan Tannehill in the first quarter for his third on the season in the season-finale on Dec. 30, 2012. The pick helped set up a 9-yard touchdown pass from Tom Brady to Wes Welker. Gregory's previous single-season high was two interceptions in 2010 when he played for San Diego.

#### LB DONT'A HIGHTOWER DONT'A HIGHTOWER WEARS TEDY BRUSCHI'S JERSEY #54

As a first round draft pick, Dont'a Hightower is used to high expectations. Hightower went to training camp with jersey #45 but was switched to jersey #54 prior to the start of the regular season. Former LB Tedy Bruschi wore #54 for 13 seasons. Hightower understands the importance of the number and hopes to live up to its legacy. "I definitely feel honored to be able to wear this number," Hightower said. "I've read that Tedy didn't want it to be retired and he hoped another linebacker would come in and be able to wear this number and be able to play as well. I feel honored. Tedy was a great player, and he means a lot to this organization. I'm definitely proud to be able to wear this number."

### DE CHANDLER JONES

#### 2012 FIRST ROUND PICK CHANDLER JONES FOLLOWS IN BROTHERS' FOOTSTEPS

Chandler Jones has two brothers, Arthur, a fifth-round NFL Draft selection by the Baltimore Ravens in 2010, who was a Syracuse defensive tackle, and Jon "Bones" Jones, a UFC fighter and the reigning Lightweight Champion.

#### CHANDLER'S PERK OF BEING IN THE NFL

Chandler Jones was excited to get the Madden football game and play himself: "I've always put myself in Madden manually, but now that I can actually buy the game and see myself already installed in the game, it's great."

#### JONES HAS SECOND TWO-SACK GAME

DE Chandler Jones tied his career high with his second two sack game of his career in the win vs. the New York Jets on Sept. 12, 2013. He had his first two-sack game at Seattle on Oct. 14, 2012. #### MAYO IS A YOUNG LEADER

Jerod Mayo learned knowledge and discipline are the keys to success while spending afternoons with his three brothers under the supervision of their grandfather, Walter Johnson, a retired Air Force veteran of 30 years. While Mayo's mother worked two jobs, Johnson taught the boys discipline, responsibility and the value of life. Those lessons helped Mayo develop a work ethic and demeanor that has earned him the nickname of "Old Soul" from his teammates. His leadership skills and talent helped him become only the second Patriot to be named AFC Rookie of the Year, earning that title in 2008 to join Michael Haynes (1976).

#### MAYO ON WHY THE PATRIOTS HAVE SUCCESS

Mayo, who served as a defensive co-captain for New England last season, says the team's continued success is a result of the entire organization working towards one common goal.

"If you want to be a good football team, you'll never be stuck in rush-hour traffic," says Mayo. "You are the first one here and the last one to leave. I think guys really buy into that, guys that come from other teams, I think they follow the lead of the bulk of this team."

### DB DEVIN MCCOURTY

#### **DOUBLE TROUBLE: CB DEVIN MCCOURTY**

After being selected by the Patriots in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft, DB Devin McCourty became part of a select group in league history. McCourty's identical twin brother, Jason, is a cornerback with Tennessee, selected in the sixth round of the 2009 NFL Draft. The two are the 12<sup>th</sup> set of twins to play in the NFL. Devin redshirted for the 2005 season and therefore was a year behind his brother in eligibility. McCourty is the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 1998-2000. His twin brother, Wasswa, played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox. The McCourty twins are one of three active sets of twins playing in the NFL.

It is the fourth time in 2012 that the Patriots have intercepted a pass in the end zone. Rookie Tavon Wilson had an interception in the end zone at Tennessee on Sept. 9 in the second quarter.

### DE ROB NINKOVICH

#### NINKOVICH LEADS NFL OVER LAST FOUR SEASONS WITH 10 FUMBLE RECOVERIES

Ninkovich has more opponent fumble recoveries (10) over the last four seasons (2010-2013) than any other NFL player. Chicago's Brian Urlacher and Vince Wilfrok are second during that time with seven opponent fumble recoveries.



#### NINKOVICH: WHERE DID HE COME FROM?

Rob Ninkovich's journey to the Patriots was not easy. He entered the league as a fifth-round pick by the Saints in 2006 and was waived four times by New Orleans and Miami before landing in New England on Aug. 2, 2009. He spent the 2009 offseason trying to make the New Orleans team as a long snapper. Before coming to the Patriots, he had appeared in just eight games over three seasons. He doubled that total in his first year in New England, appearing in 15 games in 2009 and his role on the team has grown since, earning a starting role at linebacker in 2010 and 2011 before moving to a starting role on the defensive line in 2011.

#### NINKOVICH SCORED AS A TE IN COLLEGE

Ninkovich played some at tight end in college at Purdue and caught two touchdown passes with a 2-yard touchdown pass from Dallas QB Kyle Orton and a 1-yard touchdown pass from New York Giants QB Curtis Painter.



#### NINKOVICH AND SPIKES: BACK-TO-BACK WEEKS WITH TWO FORCED FUMBLES EACH

LB Brandon Spikes forced two fumbles at Buffalo (9/30/12) and Ninkovich forced two fumbles vs. Denver (10/7/12) to become one of eight Patriots players to record at least two forced fumbles in a single game.

#### SPIKES IS A THROWBACK

Spikes, who patterns his style of play after Hall of Fame linebacker Dick Butkus, shared his feelings on modeling his game after oldschool linebackers. Spikes' passion and energy are apparent when he plays the game. Said former Patriots safety Rodney



Harrison in a recent interview with the *Boston Herald*. "You can see how much he loves it, how he enjoys being physical. He's an intimidator. He's got that fight in him. He's going to hit you and you're going to feel it."

#### **SPIKES WENT OVER 100 TACKLES**

Spikes had 10 or more tackles in six games and finished with a career-high 128 tackles in 2012. With Jerod Mayo at 184 tackles and Spikes at 128, it is the fifth time in the Bill Belichick era that two players have finished with 100 or more tackles.

### DL VINCE WILFORK

#### VINCE WILFORK REGISTERS FIRST CAREER INTERCEPTIONS IN 2011

Vince Wilfork recorded his first career interception when he

picked off QB Philip Rivers in the second quarter vs. San Diego (9/18). He had his second interception at Oakland (10/2) to join Anthony Pleasant (2001) as the only other Patriots defensive lineman to ever record two interceptions in the same season. Wilfork is one of four Patriots defensive lineman to ever record two interceptions overall, joining Pleasant, Richard Seymour and Henry Thomas.



#### WILFORK'S FIRST FORCED FUMBLE CAME AGAINST TEAMMATE LEON WASHINGTON

Wilfork's first career forced fumble came against 2013 free agent acquisition Leon Washington in a September 20, 2009 contest against the New York Jets. In the first quarter of a 16-9 Patriots loss, Wilfork stripped the Jets' Washington on his own 17-yard line to set up a Patriots field goal. Wilfork forced one fumble in 2011 and two in 2012 to bring his total to four over the course of his nine-year career.

#### VINCE WILFORK: REASONS FOR PATRIOTS SUCCESS

Patriots Pro Bowl DL Vince Wilfork, who has served as a defensive captain for the Patriots for five straight seasons, says the team's continued success is a result of the entire organization working towards one common goal: "The Patriots are all about team, family and smart football players. They try to get good people here from coaches to guys who work in the front office to guys who put on this uniform. I think everybody has to have one goal in mind, and that's to be together. When you get an organization together that is seeking one goal, you can be pretty successful."

# **PATRIOTS IN THE PLAYOFFS**

#### PATRIOTS HAVE CLINCHED PLAYOFF SPOTS IN 14 **OF KRAFT'S 19 YEARS OF OWNERSHIP**

New England has qualified for the playoffs 20 times in its 53-year history. The Patriots have earned 14 of those playoff berths in the 19 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994. New England has won 12 AFC East crowns under Kraft's leadership. New England has won 15 division crowns overall (14 AFC East Crowns) and has qualified as a



Wild Card team on four occasions (1998, 1994, 1985 and 1976). The Patriots also qualified for the playoffs in 1982 as part of a 16-team tournament following a players' strike

#### **ANNUAL ACHIEVEMENTS**

The Patriots have won more than half of their games for 12 straight years after finishing with a 12-4 record in 2012. They are the first team to win more than half of their games in 12 straight seasons since NFL free agency began in 1993.

The Patriots are the fourth team to win more than half of their games in 12 straight seasons since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, joining the 49ers (16 straight from 1983-1998), the Cowboys (16 straight from 1970-85) and the Raiders (11 straight from 1970-80).

The Patriots have now won nine or more games in 16 of the 19 seasons Robert Kraft has owned the team.

#### WR Danny Amendola (FA-STL, '13)

Amendola shined in his Patriots debut against Buffalo, catching 10 passes for 104 yards in the team's Week 1 win. It was Amendola's third career 100-yard game and fourth career game with 10 or more receptions ... Seven of Amendola's 10 receptions came on third down and resulted in a Patriots first down, including a 6-yard reception on a third-and-4 from the NE 31 to keep the game-winning drive alive ... Amendola has missed the last two games due to injury.

This is Amendola's second regular season game vs. the Falcons

#### LT Nate Solder (D1, '11)

Started in all 16 regular season games in 2012 at left tackle ... Also appeared in 16 games in 2011, making 13 starts – 11 at right tackle and two as a tackleeligible tight end ... Started both postseason games at left tackle in 2012. *This is Solder's first regular season game vs. the Falcons* 

#### LG Logan Mankins (D2, '05)

An eight-year mainstay at guard and five-time Pro Bowler who has started all 116 regular-season games and all 15 postseason games in which he has appeared since joining the Patriots in 2005.

#### OL Ryan Wendell (FA-'08)

Led all NFL players in playing time in 2012 by starting all 16 games at center and playing 1,379 snaps ... Was a key reserve on the offensive line and saw starting assignments at center and both guard positions before earning the starting center position in 2011 ... Made his NFL debut on special teams in the Patriots' season opener vs. Buffalo in 2009.

#### OL Dan Connolly (FA-'07)

Started in 14 regular season games in 2012 at right guard and also appeared at fullback in short yardage situations ... Took over as starting center after seasonending leg injury to Dan Koppen in the 2011 opener ... Started at right guard for both postseason games in 2012.

#### RT Sebastian Vollmer (D2d, '09)

Started in 15 regular season games at right tackle in 2012, rebounding strong from an injury ravaged 2011 in which he was inactive for 10 regular season and two playoff games ... Also started both playoff contests in 2012.

#### WR Julian Edelman (D7a, '09)

Edelman is tied with Atlanta's Julio Jones for the NFL lead in receptions with 27 catches through three games ... Set a career high with 13 receptions in a Week 2 win over the Jets ... Caught two touchdown passes in a regular season game for the first time in his career in a Week 1 win at Buffalo ... Has 27 receptions for 201 yards through three games, both team highs.

#### TE Rob Gronkowski (D2a, '10)

Gronkowski caught two touchdown passes against Indianapolis in Week 11 of 2012 to push his season total to 10 touchdowns. He is the first tight end in NFL history to have three straight 10-plus touchdown seasons (10 touchdowns in 2010, 18 in 2011, 10 in 2012). Gronkowski and Antonio Gates (13 in 2004 and 10 in 2005) are the only tight ends to have back-to-back 10-plus touchdown seasons... Gronkowski joins Randy Moss (2007, 2008 and 2009) and Corey Dillon (2004, 2005, 2006) as the only Patriots with three straight 10-plus touchdown seasons and three 10-plus seasons overall ... Gronkowski's 53 receptions are the

most by an AFC TE in 2012 and the third most in the NFL behind Dallas TE Jason Witten (73) and Atlanta TE Tony Gonzalez (64) ... Gronkowski's 10 receiving touchdowns led the team in 2012.

#### QB Tom Brady (D6, '00)

Brady led the Patriots on a 12-play, 49-yard drive late in the fourth quarter to set up Stephen Gostkowski's game-winning field goal against Buffalo in the Patriots 2013 opener. It is the 27<sup>th</sup> time in his career that Brady has led a comeback with his team trailing in the fourth quarter, good for second all-time among active NFL quarterbacks behind Broncos QB Peyton Manning (38) ... Brady threw a touchdown pass against the Buccaneers last week to extend his streak of at least one touchdown pass to 51 games, the second-longest active streak behind Drew Brees (54) ... Brady threw for 288 yards against Buffalo to become the 9<sup>th</sup> player in NFL history with at least 45,000 career passing yards ... Brady is a perfect 3-0 against the Falcons in his NFL career. In his last game vs. Atlanta, Brady completed 25 passes for 277 yards and a 36-yard touchdown to TE Chris Baker in the fourth quarter to lead the Patriots to a 26-10 win.

#### RB Stevan Ridley (D3a, '11)

Ridley finished third in the AFC with 1,263 yards rushing in 2012, good for fourth most in franchise history. Ridley is the  $12^{th}$  Patriots player to reach 1,000 yards rushing and just the fifth Patriots player to reach 1,200 yards ... Ridley also scored 12 rushing TDs, good for  $2^{nd}$  in the AFC behind Texans RB Arian Foster (12) ... It is the  $13^{th}$  time that a Patriots running back has finished a season with 10 or more rushing yards ... Ridley (12) and TE Rob Gronkowski (11) both had 10-plus touchdowns on the year. It is the third straight season and fifth time in team history that the Patriots have had two players finish with 10 or more touchdowns in a season ... Ridley had four 100-yard rushing days in 2012, including one at Buffalo (9/30) where he finished with 106 yards and two touchdowns.

Wilfork also recorded three sacks on the season. His first of the season came on a strip-sack of Bills quarterback Ryan Fitzpatrick in the first quarter of the team's Week 10 win over Buffalo ... Wilfork has played in 138 games with 128 starts over nine seasons with the Patriots (2004-12) ... The Patriots own a 108-31 (.777) record in Wilfork's 139 career regular-season games.

### DT Tommy Kelly (FA-'13)

Kelly took down the quarterback for the second straight week on Sunday when he combined with Chandler Jones to drop Josh Freeman for a loss of seven yards in the third quarter ... Kelly notched his first sack as a Patriot when he dropped Geno Smith for a three-yard loss in last week's win over the Jets ... Kelly was a mainstay at defensive tackle for the past nine seasons with the Oakland Raiders. He had started every regular season game for the club dating back to 2008.

This is Kelly's fourth regular-season game vs. the Falcons

### DL Rob Ninkovich (FA-'09)

Ninkovich combined with Chandler Jones to sack Josh Freeman for a two-yard loss in the first quarter of last Sunday's win over Tampa Bay. Ninkovich recorded eight sacks in 2012, a career-high ... Recovered a fumble forced by Kyle Arrington in the second quarter of the Patriots' Week 1 win over Buffalo, giving him the most fumble recoveries of any NFL player over the last four years (2010-13) with ten. Vince Wilfork is second with seven opponent fumble recoveries during that time.

### LB Jerod Mayo (D1, '08)

Mayo notched nine tackles against the Buccaneers on Sunday to give him a team-high 34 tackles through three games ... Mayo and Dont'a Hightower led the Patriots with 10 tackles each in a Week 2 win over the Jets ... Mayo recorded a team-high 15 tackles, including 12 solo tackles, against the Bills in Week 1 ... Mayo led the Patriots with 184 tackes in 2012 and has now recorded 100 or more tackles in five straight years. He is the first player in Patriots history to register 100 tackles in his first five NFL seasons ... Mayo matched a career best by recording at least 10 tackles in 10 games last season, including a season-high 20 tackles in a win over the Jets on 10/28.

### LB Brandon Spikes (D2c,'10)

Spikes led the team with 10 tackles, including seven solo tackles, in Sunday's win over the Buccaneers ... Spikes finished with a career-high 128 tackles in 2012 and was the only other Patriot besides Jerod Mayo to record 100 or more tackles... Spikes had 10 or more tackles in six games in 2012 ... He also finished with five forced fumbles, tied for third in the AFC with teammate Rob Ninkovich ... Spikes also recorded one sack and six passes defensed.

### LB Dont'a Hightower (D1b,'12)

Hightower tied Jerod Mayo for the team lead in tackles with 10 and led the team in solo tackles with seven a Week 2 win over the Jets ... Hightower scored a touchdown in his first NFL game when he recovered a fumble caused by a Chandler Jones strip sack on the 6-yard line and ran in for the score in the Patriots season-opening win at Tennessee (9/9) ... Started in 13 games his rookie season and finished with 75 total tackles, four sacks, three passes defensed and two fumble recoveries.

### CB Agib Talib (Tr-`12)



Talib picked off Josh Freeman late in the first half on Sunday to give him an NFL-high three interceptions through three games this season ... Talib recorded two interceptions in a Week 2 win over the Jets. It was the third time in his career that he had recorded multiple interceptions, the last time coming in 2010 when he had two picks against the Arizona

Cardinals as a member of the Buccaneers ... Talib played in six games for the Patriots after being traded midway through the season from the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. He recorded a 59-yard interception return for a touchdown during his first game with New England in a Week 11 win over Indianapolis.

Dennard recorded his first interception of 2013 in a Week 2 win over the Jets when he picked off a Geno Smith pass late in the fourth quarter ... Recorded 35 tackles and three interceptions in his rookie campaign, including an 87-yard interception return for a touchdown in a Week 11 win over Indianapolis.

# THE TEAM OF THE DECADE

hen Robert Kraft purchased the New England Patriots in 1994, few would have thought that 17 years later the franchise would be the undisputed team of the decade in the first decade of the new millennium. Kraft brought a winning vision to the organization and dedicated his resources to building a consistent winner. On Jan. 27, 2000, Kraft hired Bill Belichick to coach the team, and three months later the team drafted then-unheralded quarterback Tom Brady, putting the final pieces in place for the Patriots to become the most successful NFL team of the 2000s. Below is a look at the accomplishments of the Patriots during the first decade of the new millennium that earned the Patriots the "Team of the Decade" moniker.
