# GAME NOTES



## HEADLINES

The Jets rank second in the NFL for fewest rushing yards allowed per game (75.7) and have the second lowest percentage (5.9%) of opposing rushing attempts go for 10+ yards. **No starting running back has averaged better than 3.1 yards per carry against the Jets.**

With four sacks of the PIT offense, the Jets are tied for fourth with 20 sacks this season. Equally as proficient at stopping the run, the Jets have registered 26 tackles for loss, the second most in the league this season. Their combined total of 46 sacks and stuffs combined is the most in the NFL.

**K Nick Folk** opened the season by garnering AFC Special Teams Player of the Week honors and has not slowed down. This season, he has connected on all 13 attempts, and kicked game-winning field goals in the season-opening win vs. TB (9/8) and at ATL (10/7).

## COACH OF THE WEEK

Coach Jay Price of Manasquan High School has been named this week's recipient of the New York Jets High School Coach of the Week Award. For his efforts, he will receive \$1,000 to benefit the school's football program, and he will be presented with a certificate from the Jets.

The award, in its 18th year, is given to a coach in the tristate area who serves the best interests of the game through the teaching of sound football fundamentals, the motivation of young players to achieve, and the promotion of youth football by way of dedication to their community, their school and their student-athletes.

Coach Price is in his third season at the helm of the Warriors. He's led the team to two straight state playoff appearances during the 2011 and 2012 seasons. Coach Price served sixteen years as an assistant coach on the staff on Manasquan before taking the reigns as the head coach. During this time, the warriors won seven state titles in 1998-2002, 2007-2208. Price is an alumnus of Manasquan High School where he played fullback and linebacker under legendary coach Vic Kubu.

Price went on to play football at Trenton State College for four years and was named captain during his senior season. He graduated college with a degree in history and is a history teach at Manasquan High School. In addition to his coaching and teaching duties, he is also a lieutenant with the Manasquan Hook and Ladder Company No.1.

## Rex Ryan

Head Coach

Fifth season with the Jets

- Now in his fifth season at the Jets helm, Ryan's Jets have tallied a 41-35 record including postseason play during his tenure.
- His team has fielded a top 10 defense in each of his first four seasons as Jets head coach and has never fielded a defense that finished worse than eighth in the league in his time as a head coach or defensive coordinator. Ryan has twice fielded the league's number one defense and finishing with a top five unit five times.
- His first year, the Jets turned a 5-6 record into a 9-7 playoff berth, earning two postseason victories before finishing one-step shy of the Super Bowl. The following season, the Jets finished 11-5, again advancing to the AFC Championship Game before their season ended.

### Ryan's Ranks

Since being named Defensive Coordinator with the Baltimore Ravens in 2005, Rex Ryan's defenses have always ranked near the top of the league. Combining the Baltimore Ravens defense from 2005-08 to the New York Jets Defense from 2009-12, Ryan has ranked in the top five in the following categories: Total Defense, Rushing Defense, Passing Defense, Scoring Defense, Rushing Average Allowed, Passing Yards per Attempt Allowed, Completion Percentage Allowed, Takeaways, Third-Down Percentage Allowed and Total First Downs Allowed.

- Ben Kotwica was named special teams coordinator on January 8, 2013 following the retirement of legendary special teams coach Mike Westhoff. Prior to earning this promotion, Kotwica served as the teams assistant special teams coach from 2009-2012.
- In his previous role, Kotwica worked closely with former special teams coordinator Mike Westhoff. Since 2007, when Kotwica joined the team, the Jets special teams units have returned nine kickoffs for touchdowns (the most touchdowns scored on special teams in the NFL during that time span).

## Marty Mornhinweg

Offensive Coordinator  
First season with the Jets

- Named the offensive coordinator on January 24, 2013, after spending 10 seasons with the Philadelphia Eagles where he served as senior assistant (2003) and assistant head coach/offensive coordinator (2004-12).
- He established a reputation for being one of the top football minds in the NFL. Mornhinweg has put together record-setting performances for two different franchises (San Francisco and Philadelphia) in the role of offensive coordinator.
- During Mornhinweg's time as coordinator with the Eagles, the offense set single-season franchise records in completions (367 in 2012), total net yards (6,386 in 2011), completion percentage (62.0 in 2010), total points (439 in 2010) average per rush (5.4 in 2010), third down percentage (42.4 in 2007), net passing yards (4,119 in 2006), passer rating (96.7 in 2006), fewest interceptions (nine in 2006) and tied for the fewest turnovers (22 in 2004).

## Dennis Thurman

Defensive Coordinator  
Fifth season with the Jets

- Elevated to defensive coordinator on January 24, 2013, after spending four seasons as the club's defensive backs coach. This season, the Jets defense ranks second in total defense (241.0 yards/gm), tied for third in scoring defense (15.0) and fifth in third-down defense (29.4%).
- Under the tutelage of Thurman, Jets defensive backs have held their opponents to an NFL-low 71.0 passer rating, 52.6 completion percentage, and 186.3 passing yards since 2009.
- A two-time All-American safety at USC who was part of teams that won four bowl games and the 1974 National Championship. Recorded 13 interceptions, returning two for scores.

### Passer Beware

As the Jets defensive backs coach from 2009-12, Thurman led one of the league's premier secondaries, consistently making life difficult for opposing quarterbacks.

## Mike Devlin

Offensive Line Coach  
Eighth season with the Jets

- In his eighth season with the Jets and his first overseeing the offensive line after spending the past four seasons as tight ends/assistant offensive line coach.
- Was selected in the fifth-round of the 1993 NFL Draft by the Buffalo Bills. During his career in the NFL, he appeared in 101 regular season games and played in Super Bowl XXVIII with the Bills.
- Founded the Devlin Football Camp which donates funds each year to various causes. Also created a scholarship in honor of his father which is granted to football players at Bloomsburg University.

## Karl Dunbar

Defensive Line Coach  
Second season with the Jets

- In his first season with the Jets, Dunbar guided the development of second-year DL Muhammad Wilkerson and rookie LB Quinton Coples. Wilkerson led all Jets defensive linemen with 90 tackles and totaled five sacks and two FF. Coples' 5.5 sacks in 2012 led the team and were the most by a Jets rookie since Shaun Ellis, who recorded 8.5 in 2000.
- Dunbar coached the defensive line for the Minnesota Vikings from 2006-2011, where the Vikings defense allowed the fewest rushing yards in the NFL and recorded the sixth most sacks during that six-season span.
- As the Vikings defensive line coach, Dunbar instructed several Pro Bowl players. DT Kevin Williams was selected to the Pro Bowl five times, DE Jared Allen was selected four times and DT Pat Williams was selected three times.
- Dunbar was selected in the eighth round of the 1990 NFL Draft by the Pittsburgh Steelers and played defensive line for the Steelers, New Orleans Saints and Arizona Cardinals during his career (1990-1995).

## Steve Hagen

Tight Ends Coach  
First season with the Jets

- Entering his first season with the Jets after spending the previous four seasons as the Cleveland Browns tight ends coach.
- Served as the offensive coordinator at UNLV and helped the team break 20 school offensive records during his two-year tenure.
- Earned NAIA All-America honors as a senior wide receiver at Cal-Lutheran University.

## Ron Heller

Assistant Offensive Line Coach  
First season with the Jets

- Comes to the Jets following a one-year stint in the UFL coaching the offensive line for the Omaha Nighthawks. Spent 2010-11 as the assistant offensive line coach for the Jacksonville Jaguars.
- Played 12 seasons in the NFL after being picked in the fourth round by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Played a total of 179 games and made 173 starts for the Buccaneers, Eagles and Dolphins. Was named Philadelphia's 1989 offensive MVP for protecting QB Randall Cunningham's blindside.
- Won the 1983 National Championship at Penn State where he was a two-year starter.

## Sanjay Lal

Wide Receivers Coach  
Second season with the Jets

- In his first season with the Jets, Lal oversaw the improvement of second-year WR Jeremy Kerley who established career highs and led the team in receptions, receiving yards and yards per catch. Lal coached WR Santonio Holmes, who was on pace to catch 80 passes (for 1,296 yards) before suffering a season-ending injury in Week Four.
- Lal coached the Oakland Raiders from 2007-2011 (Wide Receivers 2009-11, Assistant Wide Receivers 2007-08) and helped the 2011 Raiders wide receivers unit rank sixth in the NFL with an average of 15.0 yards per catch.
- In 2009, he developed rookies Darrius Heyward-Bey and Louis Murphy who became the first rookie tandem to start at wide receiver in the NFL since 2000.

## David Lee

Quarterbacks  
First season with the Jets

- Enters his ninth season in the NFL and first as the Jets quarterbacks coach.
- Was the quarterbacks coach for the Miami Dolphins from 2008-10 and played a vital role in reintroducing and transforming the Wildcat offense at the pro level. The Wildcat formation accounted for more than 1,000 plays and produced 15 or more touchdowns. Lee also helped former Jets QB Chad Pennington who was voted the NFL Comeback Player of the Year and a runner-up for NFL Player of the Year in 2008.
- As the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach for Arkansas in 2007, Lee presided over an offense that ranked 12th in points per game (38.8) and 18th in yards per game (457.4) – setting school records in both categories. Arkansas threw 24 touchdown passes and only 10 interceptions.



## Tim McDonald

Defensive Backs Coach  
First season with the Jets

- Joins the NFL coaching ranks for the first time with the Jets. Previously served as the Fresno State secondary coach where he coached Redskins 2013 second-round draft pick safety Phillip Thomas who became the first Bulldogs player to earn All-American honors after leading the nation with eight interceptions. The Bulldogs' other safety, Derron Smith, was tied for fifth in the nation with six interceptions.
- Enjoyed a 13-year NFL career with the St. Louis/Phoenix Cardinals and San Francisco 49ers as a strong safety. Career highlights and honors include six Pro Bowl selections, helping the 49ers earn a Super Bowl XXIX victory and being named as one of six safeties to the Walter Camp All-Century Team.
- Eldest son Timothy Jr. (T.J.) started for three seasons at USC before being selected in the third round by the St. Louis Rams in the 2013 NFL Draft. Younger son Tevin is a safety for Eastern Washington University.

## Brian Smith

Assistant Defensive Backs Coach  
Seventh season with the Jets

- Enters his first season as the Jets assistant defensive backs coach and seventh season with the team. Jets defensive backs have held their opponents to an NFL-low 71.0 passer rating, 52.6 completion percentage and 11,921 yards since the start of his tenure as a defensive coach in New York in 2009.
- Three-year starter at UMass as a strong safety and corner-back, who totaled 306 tackles (214 solo), 23 passes defensed and eight interceptions, earning All-Atlantic 10, All-New England and All-ECAC honors as a senior.

## Brian VanGorder

Linebackers  
First season with the Jets

- Joined the Jets after serving as the defensive coordinator at Auburn in 2012. Prior to his time at Auburn, he spent the previous four seasons as the defensive coordinator for the Atlanta Falcons (2008-11) after initially joining the organization as its linebackers coach in 2007.
- During his stint with the Falcons, the team posted four consecutive winning seasons (2008-11) for the first time in franchise history, including playoff appearances in 2008, 2010 and 2011.
- Under the leadership of VanGorder as defensive coordinator (2008-11), Atlanta ranked fourth in the NFL with a +22 turnover margin throughout that time span.

## Jeff Weeks

Defensive Assistant – Defensive Line/Linebackers  
Fourth season with the Jets

- Re-joined the Jets for the 2013 season, after working with the team from 2009-11.
- In 2009, as the Jets advanced to the AFC Championship Game, Weeks focused on the defensive line during the second half of the season, helping the Jets limit teams to 82.0 yards rushing a game (fifth-best in the NFL) after allowing 111.6 rushing yards a game in the season's first seven contests.

## John Idzik

General Manager  
First season with the Jets

- Named General Manager by Woody Johnson on January 18, 2013, after he spent six seasons with the Seattle Seahawks as the Vice President of Football Administration.
- Raised in a football family, his father, also John, served as a longtime NFL assistant coach with the New York Jets, Baltimore Colts, Miami Dolphins and Philadelphia Eagles.
- Became one of the NFL's few father-son Super Bowl champions in 2003 when the younger Idzik's Buccaneers won Super Bowl XXXVII, after his father was the offensive backfield coach of the Super Bowl V champion Baltimore Colts.

For the season, Bohanon has rushed nine times for 29 yards and has six receptions for 44 yards.

**CAREER vs. NEW ENGLAND:** This is Tommy's second-career game against the Patriots.

## 87

### TE JEFF CUMBERLAND

Fourth-year TE **Cumberland**, who started 12 games in 2012, looks to expand his role after establishing career highs in receptions (29), yards (359) and touchdowns (3).

Cumberland had a career night on Monday Night Football at Atlanta, posting personal bests in receiving yards (79) and longest reception (47). He also scored his second touchdown in consecutive weeks on a 20-yard reception from QB Geno Smith, which gave him a touchdown catch in all three Monday Night Football games he has played in.

On the season, he has 11 receptions for 198 yards and two touchdowns.

**CAREER vs. NEW ENGLAND:** This is Jeff's second-career game against the Patriots. He did not record any stats in the first meeting against them this season.

### WR STEPHEN HILL

**Hill** leads the team in catches and receiving yards with 18 receptions for 300 yards. The second-year receiver is averaging 16.7 yards per catch. Earlier this season Hill recorded his first 100-yard receiving game against Buffalo, reeling in three receptions for 108 yards, including a personal-best 51-yard touchdown catch.

**CAREER vs. NEW ENGLAND:** This is Stephen's fourth-career game against the Patriots. Earlier this season Hill tied and set his previous career-long receptions, hauling in a 33- and 37-yard catch. In three games, Hill has logged 10 receptions for 157 yards, averaging 15.7 yards per catch.

### RB CHRIS IVORY

**Ivory**, a draft-day acquisition, displayed his downhill running in Week Two against New England. He registered a game-high 52 rushing yards on 12 carries (4.3 avg.), including a long of 11 yards. Before leaving the game with a hamstring injury, Ivory made his first start as a Jet in the win against the Bills.

On a fourth-quarter touchdown drive to give the Jets a 27-14 lead in Week Five in Atlanta, Ivory carried the ball twice for 20 yards, including his season-long rush of 19 yards. Ivory earned the start in the victory and would finish the game with 27 yards on four rushes (7.0 avg.)

**CAREER vs. NEW ENGLAND:** This is Chris' second-career game against the Patriots. In Week Two, Ivory rushed 12 times for 52 yards.

### WR SANTONIO HOLMES

Following a summer rehabbing, **Holmes** returned after suffering a season-ending Lisfranc injury in Week Four in 2012. Before his injury last season, Holmes was on pace to set a career-high of 80 catches, while recording his second 1,000-yard receiving season. It also marked the first time in his career he failed to play in at least 12 games.

In Week Three vs. BUF (9/22), Holmes had a career outing as he posted a single-game high 154 yards. Holmes also set a new personal best, recording his longest receiving touchdown on a 69-yard catch. The reception broke a fourth-quarter tie and gave New York the final points in a 27-20 win. Holmes currently leads the team in receiving yards with 243.

Holmes has also been a clutch target throughout his career when the game is on the line. Since entering the league in 2007, Holmes leads the NFL in overtime receiving yards (161) and yards after catch (92) and is tied for first with six receptions and one touchdown. His 92 overtime yards after the catch are 40 yards more than the next closest player.

#### Holmes in Overtime as a Jet:

**(09/23/12 at MIA)** Sanchez connected with Holmes for a 38-yard gain that led to Folk's 33-yard field goal, clinching the Jets 23-20 victory.

**(11/14/10 at CLV)** Holmes hauled in a 37-yard touchdown pass from Sanchez with 24 seconds left in overtime to defeat the Browns, 26-20.

**(11/07/10 at DET)** Holmes had a 52-yard catch-and-run from Sanchez to set up a Folk game-winning 30-yard field goal.

**CAREER vs. NEW ENGLAND:** This is Santonio's seventh-career game against the Patriots. In six games, the Jets wide receiver has registered 23 receptions for 317 yards and two touchdowns.

## 11

### WR JEREMY KERLEY

**Kerley** recorded his first touchdown of the season against Atlanta, after leading the team with five receptions for 68 yards. The Jets receiver is currently third on the team in both catches and receiving yards, posting 222 yards on 16 receptions.

Entering his third NFL season, Kerley looks to continue his versatility after a career-year as a wide out and punt returner. Last season, Kerley appeared in all 16 games and led the team with career highs in receptions (56), yards (827), yards per catch (14.8) and plays of 40-plus yards (6). He also caught two touchdown passes and returned a punt for a score while becoming the first Jets WR to lead the team in both receptions and receiving yards since Jerricho Cotchery in 2009.

Last season, Kerley became the first player in Jets history to score a receiving touchdown and a punt return touchdown in the same game when he accomplish the feat vs. BUF (09/09/12). Following the injury to **WR Santonio Holmes** in Week Four vs. SF, Kerley's production increased during the final 12 weeks of the 2012 campaign, as he led the team in receptions in six games and receiving yards in seven contests.

**CAREER vs. NEW ENGLAND:** This is Jeremy's fifth-career game against the Patriots. Last year against the Patriots, Jeremy set a career-high with 120 receiving yards. Kerley missed this season's earlier contest against the New England due to injury.



## 29

### RB BILAL POWELL

Third-year RB **Powell** enters Week Seven fourth in the AFC with 360 rushing yards. In Weeks Three and Four, Powell registered back-to-back games of 100 yards from scrimmage. Against Tennessee, Powell rushed 14 times for a game-high 66 rushing yards and caught three passes for 42 yards.

In Week Three, Powell was the workhorse back in the win against Buffalo and had a career day on the ground, setting single-game career-highs in rushing yards (149), carries (27) and longest rush (27). It was Powell's first 100-yard rushing game of his career.

**CAREER vs. NEW ENGLAND:** This is Bilal's third-career game against the Patriots. He has scored a rushing touchdown in both contests and totaled 88 yards on 25 carries and four receptions for 35 yards.

## 7

### QB GENO SMITH

**Smith** became the first rookie drafted in the second round or later to pass for 250+ yards and win on Kickoff Weekend since the 1970 AFL/NFL merger. Smith also became the first Jets QB to lead the team in both passing yards (256) and rushing yards (47) since Ray Lucas accomplished the feat at NYG (12/05/99). Down 14-5 in the second quarter, Smith, twice, brought the Jets back to take the lead becoming the first QB to overcome a deficit of at least nine points in his NFL debut since Ryan Fitzpatrick did it for the Rams at Houston on 11/27/05.

Directed the first Jets offense to register a 100-yard rusher (Powell 27-149), two 100-yard receivers (Hill 3-108-1 & Holmes 5-154-1) and a 300-yard passer when he completed 16-of-29 passes for 331 yards, 2 touchdowns and 2 interceptions vs. BUF (9/22), as he became the first Jets rookie quarterback to throw for 300 yards. Also established a career-long pass with a 69-yard touchdown throw to Holmes in the fourth quarter to give the Jets the final score in a 27-20 victory, marking the third-longest go-ahead touchdown in the fourth quarter in Jets history. Finished the BUF game with four passes of 40+ yards, the first time a Jets offense has registered four plays of 40+ yards in a game since 1991.

Became only the second rookie quarterback to win on the road on Monday Night Football after posting a 147.7 rating in the win at ATL (10/7). Trailing 28-27 with 1:54 to play, Smith led his league-leading third fourth-quarter go-ahead drive, leading the team 55 yards in eight plays to set up a **K Nick Folk** 43-yard field goal as time expired.

Smith is tied for the second-most passes of 25-plus yards (15) in the NFL.

**CAREER vs. PITTSBURGH:** This is Geno's second game against the Steelers.



### OFFENSIVE LINE

Week Three vs. BUF marked the first time in team history that the Jets had two 100-yard receivers, a 100-yard rusher and a 300-yard passer in the same game.
