the win column when they face the Miami Dolphins on Sunday at Gillette Stadium. The Patriots have won six straight games against Miami after series sweeps in

2010, 2011 and 2012. A win this Sunday will give the Patriots their longest winning streak in the regular season against Miami with seven straight wins. The Patriots current streak of six straight victories matches the six straight wins from 1986 through 1988 after the Patriots swept the series in those years.

# **ROBERT KRAFT NEWS & NOTES**

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. Now in his 20th season of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what many observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning



just 19 of 80 games (.238 pct.) and recording the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles (12), conference crowns (6) and Super Bowl championships (3) than any other NFL team. The Patriots have made six Super Bowl appearances since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other NFL franchise has earned more than four berths. In Kraft's 19 seasons, the Patriots qualified for the playoffs 14 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons

In the early 1990s, the Patriots seemed destined for relocation until Robert Kraft's purchase of the team rejuvenated local interest. In 1991, the season ticket base was just 17,635, barely enough to support the club. Now, the season tickets are capped and more than 50,000 fans are on a season ticket waiting list. The Patriots have sold out 210 consecutive home games, including playoff and preseason games (dating back to the 1994 season opener).

Of this group, only four quarterbacks have started a regular season or post-season game for the club, and only two (Tom Brady and Drew Bledsoe) have started on Opening Day, the fewest of any AFC East team in both categories. The only other NFL team to have started fewer quarterbacks over the last 20 years is the Green Bay Packers, with three total starters (Brett Favre, Aaron Rodgers, and Matt Flynn) and two Opening Day starters (Brett Favre and Aaron Rodgers).

# PATRIOTS VS. MIAMI

## SERIES HISTORY



The New England Patriots and Miami Dolphins will square off for the  $96^{th}$  time, including three playoff games, in their  $48^{th}$  year as division foes and for the first of two meetings of the 2013 season. The Patriots will travel to face the Dolphins in Miami on Dec. 15.

The Dolphins and Patriots began playing twice a year during the regular season in 1967.

The Patriots swept the series in the last three seasons (2010-2012). The Patriots also swept the annual series for three straight seasons from 1986 through 1988.

The Patriots have won eight of the last 10 games against Miami.

The Patriots have had the upper hand at home against Miami, as they hold a 29-17 record in games played in New England in the regular-season, including a 9-2 record at Gillette Stadium. But the Patriots are only 15-33 all-time in Miami.

The two have played three times in the postseason with New England holding a 2-1 advantage.

The Patriots are 17-9 against the Dolphins over that span and are 19-9 against the New York Jets and 24-3 against the Buffalo Bills in that time. The Patriots were 3-1 against Indianapolis from 2000 through 2001 when they were in the AFC East.
- The Patriots have not been swept in their season series with a divisional opponent since 2000, when they lost both games to Miami and also to the New York Jets.
- Tom Brady owns a 16-6 record when playing against Miami but he is 10-1 against Miami in home games, including wins in the last five games. The only loss was on Jan. 1, 2006 in the final game of the 2005 season when the Patriots had already locked up the AFC East Title and Brady played in the first quarter before being relieved by backup Matt Cassel.

## PASSING PERFORMANCES

Tom Brady is scheduled to start at quarterback against Miami for the 23<sup>rd</sup> time and has compiled a 16-6 record in his previous 22 starts against the Dolphins. Brady is 57-12 in his career as a starter in the regular-season against AFC East opponents, with six of the 12 losses coming to the Dolphins. One of those losses was in the final game of the 2005 season when Brady was pulled after the first quarter.

The New England Patriots beat the Miami Dolphins, 23-16, at Sun Life Stadium for their sixth consecutive victory and earned the AFC East title for the fourth straight year. The Patriots were assured of their 12<sup>th</sup> winning season in a row.

With the Patriots holding a 20-13 lead midway through the fourth quarter, QB Tom Brady started a drive at his own 20-yard line and led a 16-play drive that took more than seven minutes off the clock. After taking a knee on a third down play, K Stephen Gostkowski kicked his third field goal of the game to pad the lead. Miami scored a field goal on the ensuing drive but the Patriots recovered an onsides kick attempt with 31 seconds to play and ran out the clock for the victory.

During the game-winning drive, RB Stevan Ridley gained 46 yards on 10 carries to help drain the clock. In the process, Ridley eclipsed 1,000 yards for the first time in his career.

Miami mistakes proved pivotal in the win. A botched punt, a roughing the punter penalty and a fumble by Miami resulted in 17 New England points. Another penalty on Miami negated a Dolphins touchdown. Miami also had an interception returned for a touchdown that was negated due to a penalty in the first quarter.

The Patriots finished with a season-low of 321 total yards and Brady went 24 of 40 for 238 yards with one touchdown. Brady also threw his first interception in 202 pass attempts and for only the fourth time in 2012.

WR Wes Welker tied Jerry Rice with his 17<sup>th</sup> game with 10 receptions after finishing with 12 receptions for 103 yards.

After stopping Miami on the first series, Dolphins P Brandon Fields dropped a low snap and was tackled by Matthew Slater at the Miami 12-yard line. The Patriots scored five plays later on a 2-yard run by Ridley.

Early in the second quarter, Miami S Jimmy Wilson was called for a roughing the punter penalty to give the Patriots a first down and jump started a 75-yard drive that ended with a 7-yard touchdown pass from Brady to Welker for a 14-3 lead.

DE Trevor Scott, who led the defensive unit with two sacks, forced a fumble on a 7-yard sack of Miami QB Ryan Tannehill on the Dolphins next drive, and DL Vince Wilfork recovered the ball at the Miami 25-yard line. That turnover led to a 43-yard field goal by Gostkowski for a 17-3 lead. Tannehill avenged that mistake with 12-play, 80-yard drive that ended with his 2-yard touchdown run to make it 17-10 at the half.

After a scoreless third quarter, Gostkowski gave the Patriots a 20-10 lead after a 32-yard field goal. Miami responded with a 33-yard field goal to cut the New England lead to 20-13 with 8:28 left to play in the game.

Quarterback Tom Brady threw for two touchdown passes, RB Stevan Ridley added two rushing touchdowns and the defense forced two turnovers and seven sacks to give the New England Patriots a first round bye in the postseason with a 28-0 victory over the visiting Miami Dolphins in the regular season finale.

The Patriots finished 12-4 and finished undefeated in the division for the second time after earning a series sweep of Miami. New England built a 21-0 halftime lead on a 9-yard touchdown pass from Brady to WR Wes Welker. The Patriots first score was set up when S Steve Gregory picked off QB Ryan Tannehill and returned it 13 yards to the Miami 28-yard line. After a 19-yard pass to TE Rib Gronkowski, Brady connected with Welker on the 9-yard scoring pass for a 7-0 lead.

Brady moved into second place in NFL history with a touchdown pass in 48 consecutive games, breaking a tie with Hall of Famer Johnny Unitas. Brady also became the first player to throw at least one scoring pass in all 16 games for three straight seasons.

Ridley scored on runs of 1 and 2 yards to cap drives of 13 and 14 plays. After a scoreless third quarter, Brady finished a six-play, 47-yard drive with a 23-yard touchdown pass to Gronkowski for a 28-0 lead.

Rookie DL Justin Francis dropped Miami QB Ryan Tannehill for a 4-yard loss in the first quarter, a 1-yard loss in the third quarter and a 3-yard loss in the fourth quarter for his first three NFL sacks. Francis' three sacks in a game are tied for the seventh most all time in franchise history with 30 others. The last three-plus sack game was Andre Carter, who had four at the Jets on Nov. 13, 2011.

Miami had one serious scoring threat, driving to the New England 3-yard line in the third quarter before Tannehill fumbled while trying to hand the ball to a running back. LB Dont'a Hightower recovered the ball at the 1-yard line.

- Patriots DL Rob Ninkovich was claimed by the Dolphins on Sept. 7, 2007 and spent two seasons in Miami as a reserve defensive end before signing with the New Orleans Saints on December 3, 2008.

## **Former NFL Teammates**

- Patriots T Will Svitek was teammates with Dolphins T Tyson Clabo and CB Brent Grimes for three seasons (2009-12) on the Atlanta Falcons. Svitek and Clabo were positional teammates and started 10 games together at left and right tackle during Atlanta's 10-6 playoff season in 2011.
- Dolphins WR Daniel Gibson teamed up in the St. Louis Rams passing game with Patriots WR Danny Amendola for four seasons (2009-12) and TE Michael Hoomanawanui for two seasons (2010-11).
- Amendola was also teammates with Dolphins G Richie Incognito in St. Louis for the first 13 games of the 2009 season before Incognito was traded to the Bills on Dec. 15.

## WHAT TO LOOK FOR THIS WEEK AGAINST THE DOLPHINS

## TOM BRADY

- Tom Brady (342) needs one touchdown against the Dolphins to move out of a tie with Fran Tarkenton (342) and move into sole possession of fourth place on the NFL's all-time touchdown list. Dan Marino is in third place with 420 touchdowns.
- Brady (3,956) needs 33 completions to move past Warren Moon (3,988) into fifth place all-time on the NFL completions list.

## JULIAN EDELMAN

 Julian Edelman needs one more punt return for a touchdown to set the team mark with his fourth punt returned for a touchdown. He is tied with Irving Fryar and Troy Brown with three returns for a touchdown.

## **STEPHEN GOSTKOWSKI**

- Stephen Gostkowski has eight field goals of 40 or more yards in 2013. He needs four more field goals of 40 or more yards to set the Patriots record for most 40-yard field goals in a single season. Adam Vinatieri had 11 field goals of 40 or more yards in 2004 and 1998 and Gostkowski had 11 such field goals in 2012.
- Gostkowski needs one field goal to extend his streak to 14 consecutive field goals. The team record is 23 by Adam Vinatieri in 2004.

## **ROB GRONKOWSKI**

- Rob Gronkowski has 38 touchdown receptions from Tom Brady and needs one touchdown reception from Brady to tie Randy Moss at 39 for the most touchdown receptions from Brady.
- Gronkowski has 38 touchdown receptions in 44 career games. He has an opportunity to become the fastest to 40 touchdown receptions. Antonio Gates from San Diego has the current record, reaching 40 touchdown receptions in 71 games.

## **ROB NINKOVICH**

• Rob Ninkovich has the most fumble recoveries of any NFL player over the last four years (2010-13) with 10 and can add to that total with a fumble recovery against the Dolphins.

## **KENBRELL THOMPKINS**

- Kenbrell Thompkins has 23 receptions for 334 yards and four touchdowns on the season. The most touchdowns in a rookie season by a free agent wide receiver in the common draft era (since 1967) is seven by Bobby Johnson in 1984 with the New York Giants. Thompkins needs three more touchdowns to match that total.
- Thompkins needs two more touchdown receptions to match the Patriots team record for a rookie wide receiver of six by Terry Glenn in 1996.

## TEAM

- The Patriots have forced a turnover in 34 straight games dating back to 2011, the longest active streak in the NFL. The last time the Patriots did not register at least one takeaway was on Oct. 9, 2011 vs. the NY Jets.
- A win this Sunday will give the Patriots their longest winning streak in the regular season against Miami with seven straight wins.
- The Patriots are one win away from tying Oakland for the most regular season wins among the original eight AFL teams. The Patriots have 431 wins and Oakland has 432 wins.

The New York Jets beat the visiting New England Patriots 30-27, in overtime to end the Patriots 12-game winning streak against AFC East opponents.

Jets K Nick Folk was wide left on a 56-yard attempt in overtime, but his kick was negated when Patriots DL Chris Jones was called for an unsportsmanlike conduct penalty for pushing a teammate forward to try to block the kick. It was the first time that the new penalty has been called in 2013. The penalty gave the Jets another chance, and Folk booted a 42-yard field goal with 5:07 left for the 30-27 victory.

The Patriots built a 21-10 halftime lead but had a rough third quarter that saw the Jets score 17 points to take a 27-21 lead. The Patriots offense had minus-five yards in four offensive series in the third quarter.

On the first play of the second half, the Jets stripped Brady of the ball on a sack. The Patriots did recover the ball but on the next play S Antonio Allen picked off a Brady pass and returned it 23 yards for a touchdown. Later in the quarter, Jets QB Geno Smith converted two big third down plays before running it in for an 8-yard touchdown to give the Jets their first lead with a 24-21 advantage. A 21-yard punt return by WR Josh Cribbs helped set up a field goal at the end of the quarter that extended the Jets lead to 27-21.

The Patriots took the ensuing kick and turned the drive into a 39-yard field goal to close the gap to 27-24 early in the fourth quarter. Late in the fourth quarter, TE Rob Gronkowski almost made a one-handed catch with a clear lane to the end zone. Instead the Patriots settled for a game-tying field goal with 16 seconds left to send the game into overtime. Gronkowski, who returned to action after missing the first six games, finished with a team-leading 8 receptions for 114 yards. It was his 10<sup>th</sup> 100-yard game.

The Patriots won the coin toss in overtime, and Brady opened the overtime period with a 16-yard pass to Gronkowski, but the Jets stopped the Patriots on the next three plays and forced New England to punt. The Jets took over at their own 20-yard line after a 62-yard punt by P Ryan Allen went through the end zone. Jets RB Chris Ivory, who finished with 104 yards rushing, helped get the Jets into New England territory for the game-winning field goal.

The Jets opened the game with a 12-play, 80-yard drive that was culminated when Smith connected with WR Jeremy Kerley on a 12-yard touchdown pass. The Patriots responded on the next set of downs when RB Brandon Bolden finished a 10-play, 80-yard drive with a 1-yard touchdown run.

New England took a 14-7 lead when rookie CB Logan Ryan picked off a Smith pass and returned it 79 yards for a touchdown. It was Ryan's first NFL interception.

Smith was able to rebound on the ensuing drive by engineering a drive that ended in a field goal to cut the Patriots lead to 14-10. A 17-yard touchdown run by RB Stevan Ridley late in the fourth quarter gave New England a 21-10 lead at the end of the first half.

Smith finished the game 17-of-33 for 233 yards with one touchdown and one interception, while Brady was held without a touchdown for the second time in three games. Brady was 22-of-46 for 228 yards with no touchdowns and one interception.

The Patriots were 1-of-12 on third downs with the Patriots failing to convert a single third-down attempt until the fourth quarter.

## RIDLEY QUALIFIES FOR THE ALL-TIME LEAD IN RUSHING AVERAGE

Stevan Ridley has 455 rushing attempts for 2,024 yards for a 4.45 yard average and now qualifies for the all-time team lead in rushing average. He entered the game needing six more rushing attempts to meet the team qualification of 450 rushing attempts to qualify for the team lead in rushing average. Ridley finished with 11 carries for 50 yards against the Jets.

## **GRONKOWSKI RETURNS TO ACTION**

Rob Gronkowski returned to action after missing the first six games of the season. He was in the starting lineup and his first reception was a 12-yarder from Tom Brady in the first quarter. Gronkowski led the team with 8 receptions for 114 yards.

## GRONKOWSKI SETS PATRIOTS TEAM MARK FOR A TE WITH 10<sup>TH</sup> 100-YARD GAME

Gronkowski registered his 10<sup>th</sup> career 100-yard game after finishing with 8 receptions for 114 yards. He entered the game tied with Ben Coates with 9 100-yard games.

## 2013 THIRD-ROUND PICK CB LOGAN RYAN RETURNS A PICK FOR A TOUCHDOWN

CB Logan Ryan returned his first NFL interception 79 yards for a touchdown in the first quarter. It was the first interception returned for a touchdown by the Patriots since CB Aqib Talib (59 yards) and CB Alfonzo Dennard (87 yards) returned picks for touchdowns vs. Indianapolis (11-18-12).

The last Patriots player to return their first career interception for a touchdown was Kyle Arrington in 2010 against the Green Bay Packers, when he took back a Matt Flynn pass 36 yards for a touchdown. The last rookie Patriots player to return their first career interception for a touchdown was James Sanders in 2005.

## CHANDLER JONES SETS SINGLE-SEASON HIGH WITH 6.5 SACKS

DE Chandler Jones had two sacks to increase his 2013 total to 6.5. As a rookie in 2012, Jones finished with 6.0 sacks. Jones now has two 2-sack games in 2013. He had two sacks in in the first Jets game on Sept. 12. Jones now has three career 2-sack games. He had one as a rookie in 2012.

## JONES IS FIRST PATRIOTS PLACEY TO START HIS CAREER WITH TWO 6-PLUS SACK SEASON SINCE CHRIS SLADE

DE Chandler Jones has 6.5 sacks in 2013 and had 6.0 sacks as a rookie in 2012. He is the first Patriots player with 6-plus sacks in each of his first two NFL seasons since Chris Slade in 1993 (9.0) and 1994 (9.5).

## GOSTKOWSKI EXTENDS FIELD GOAL STREAK TO 13

Stephen Gostkowski extended his streak to 13 straight field goals with his 39-yard field goal in the third quarter and a 44-yarder in the fourth quarter. The active streak spans five games, beginning with a 53-yard field goal at Gillette against the Buccaneers. It is the longest streak of Gostkowski's career.

## PATRIOTS END STREAK AT 12 STRAIGHT DIVISION WINS

The Patriots ended a streak of 12 straight wins over AFC East opponents.

## ROOKIE CHRIS JONES HAS FIRST 2-SACK GAME

Rookie DL Chris Jones registered his first NFL two-sack game. It was his second game with multiple sacks. He was credited with 1.5 sacks at Cincinnati.

## BILL BELICHICK

- Bill Belichick (210) moved past Hall of Famer Chuck Noll (209) into fifth place all-time on the NFL wins list with the Patriots 30-27 win against New Orleans. Curly Lambeau is in fourth place with 229 career wins.
- Belichick (18) needs one more postseason victory to tie Don Shula (19) for second place in postseason wins. Tom Landry (20) is in first place.
- Belichick has five conference titles and needs one more to match Don Shula, who led his teams to six Super Bowls.
- Belichick has led the Patriots to 12 consecutive winning records (2001-12). He is tied with Curly Lambeau (12 1921-32) for third all-time. The NFL record is 20 by Tom Landry (1966-85) followed by 14 by Curly Lambeau (1934-47).

## TOM BRADY

- Tom Brady has 54 career 300-yard games and ranks fifth alltime for most 300-yard games and third among active players.
- Brady (34) reached 30 touchdown passes in 2012 for the third straight season and became just the fifth player in NFL history with at least 30 touchdown passes in four seasons overall.
- Brady (4,827) reached 4,000 passing yards in 2012. He is just the fifth player in NFL history to reach 4,000 yards in five or more seasons: Peyton Manning (12), Drew Brees (7), Dan Marino (6) and Brett Favre (6).
- Brady is the only quarterback in NFL history to have thrown for at least one touchdown pass in each game for three consecutive seasons (2010-12).
- •Brady had 401 completions in 2012 for the second straight season and joined Drew Brees (5), Peyton Manning (2) and Matthew Stafford (2) as the only NFL quarterbacks with at least two 400 completion seasons.

## **ROB GRONKOWSKI**

- Rob Gronkowski (10 touchdowns in 2010 and 18 in 2011) became the first tight end in NFL history with three straight 10plus touchdown seasons after reaching 11 for the season in 2012. Gronkowski and Antonio Gates (13 in 2004 and 10 in 2005) are the only tight ends to have back-to-back 10-plus touchdown seasons.
- Gronkowski joins Randy Moss (2007, 2008 and 2009) and Corey Dillon (2004, 2005, 2006) as the only Patriots with three straight 10-plus touchdown seasons and three 10-plus seasons overall.
- Gronkowski has 38 receiving touchdowns and 39 touchdowns overall (38 receiving and 1 rushing) since 2010. The 38 receiving touchdowns are the second most in the NFL in that time span, behind Calvin Johnson (39), and the 39 overall touchdowns are third, behind Arian Foster (49) and Adrian Peterson (45).
- Gronkowski has 38 touchdowns in just 44 games. He can become the fastest to 40 touchdowns. Antonio Gates currently holds the record after reaching 40 touchdowns in 71 games.

## ROB NINKOVICH

• Rob Ninkovich has 10 fumble recoveries over the last four seasons (2010-13), the most of any player in the NFL over that time. Vince Wilfork is second with seven.

## STEVAN RIDLEY

- Stevan Ridley rushed for 1,263 yards in 2012 and will be looking to become the third Patriots player with back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons, joining Jim Nance (1966-67) and Curtis Martin (1995-97).
- Ridley scored 12 touchdowns in 2012 and will look to become the fourth running back in team history with back-to-back 10plus touchdowns in a season, joining Corey Dillon (2004, 2005, 2006), BenJarvus Green-Ellis (2010, 2011) and Curtis Martin (1995, 1996).

Brady has been chosen as a captain for the 12<sup>th</sup> straight season. Wilfork is a captain for the sixth straight season, while Mayo is in his fifth season serving as a captain. ## BELICHICK IS GOOD IN DECEMBER

Bolden's grandfather, Frank Pitts, played 10 years in the NFL (1965-74) as a receiver for Kansas City, Cleveland and Oakland. He was with Kansas City for two Super Bowls, losing Super Bowl I and winning Super Bowl IV. Said Bolden about his grandfather, "I remember being 6 years old, him popping in a highlight film of Super Bowl I and IV. I've seen that tape at least 500 times."

## DAN CONNOLLY HAS THE LONGEST KICKOFF RETURN EVER BY AN OFFENSIVE LINEMAN

Dan Connolly was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week after he returned a kickoff 71 yards to the 4-yard line in the second quarter of the Patriots win vs. Green Bay on Dec. 19, 2010. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, it is the longest kickoff return by an offensive lineman in NFL history. The run by Connolly topped the 48-yard touchdown return by Atlanta's Mal Snider in 1969. Previously, the longest kickoff return for a Patriots offensive lineman was a 27-yard return by G Stephen Neal on Nov. 30, 2008 vs. Pittsburgh. Connolly's previous best was a 16-yard return vs. Miami on Nov. 8, 2009.

## EDELMAN IS FIRST PATRIOTS PLAYER WITH TWO PUNT RETURNS OF 40 YARDS IN THE SAME GAME

Edelman had a 68-yard punt that he returned for a touchdown and a 49-yard return vs. Indianapolis (11/18/12). He is the first player in team history with two punt returns of 40 or more yards in the same game. Troy Brown came close in 2000 when he had returns of 39 and 66 against Tampa Bay.

## EDELMAN'S 47-YARD RUN IS THE LONGEST RUN BY A PATS WIDE RECEIVER

Edelman had a 47-yard run in the fourth quarter vs. Indianapolis (11/18/12). It was the longest run from scrimmage for the Patriots in 2012, topping Steven Ridley's 41-yard run against St. Louis in London on Oct. 28. It is the longest run ever by a Patriots receiver, topping Troy Brown's 35-yard run vs. Tampa Bay on Sept. 3, 2000. It was the longest run by a Patriots player since Sammy Morris had a 55-yard run on Dec. 27, 2009 vs. Jacksonville.

## EDELMAN GOES FROM STANDOUT QB TO WR

Edelman began his college football career with a year at the College of San Mateo (Calif.) before transferring to Kent State where as a senior he completed 56% of his passes (153 of 275 passes for 1,820 yards) with 13 touchdowns. He was also the leading rusher, gaining 1,551 yards on 215 attempts (an average of 7.5 yards per carry) and scoring 13 touchdowns. His offensive numbers broke Kent State's single-season record for total offense set by Joshua Cribbs in 2003. Said head coach Bill Belichick on the versatility of Edelman: "He played the quarterback position in college at Kent State and all the positions really that he's played in the NFL - covering kicks, returning kicks, slot receiver, outside receiver, slot defender - he didn't do any of those things in college. I think that really speaks to his versatility and how much he's grown as a player and how many things he's learned how to do that he really didn't have much experience with in college. I'd say that's pretty unusual, especially to be as competent in them as he is."

## **GRONKOWSKI SECOND PATRIOTS TIGHT END TO REACH 1,000 YARDS**

Gronkowski became the second tight end in New England Patriots history to go over 1,000 receiving yards in 2011. He broke TE Ben Coates (1,174 yards in 1994) franchise record en route to his NFL tight end receiving record of 1,327 yards.

## **GRONKOWSKI BECOMES FIRST PATRIOTS TIGHT** END TO RECORD A RUSHING TOUCHDOWN

Gronkowski scored a 2-yard touchdown on a lateral from Tom Brady in the third quarter vs. Indianapolis (12/4/11), becoming the first tight end in Patriots history to score a rushing touchdown. Gronkowski is the first NFL tight end to score a rushing touchdown since Tennessee's Bo Scaife had a 31-yard scoring run against Baltimore on Nov. 12, 2006. ## **RIDLEY REACHES 12 TDS IN 2012**

Stevan Ridley scored 12 rushing TDs in 2012. It is the 13<sup>th</sup> time in Patriots history that a running back has finished a season with 10 or more touchdowns rushing. Ridley (12) and TE Rob Gronkowski (11) both had 10-plus touchdowns on the year. It is the third straight season and fifth time in team history that the Patriots have had two players finish with 10 or more touchdowns in a season. In 2011, RB BenJarvus Green-Ellis (11) and Rob Gronkowski (18) had 10 touchdown seasons. In 2010, Gronkowski (10) and Green-Ellis (13) had 10 touchdown seasons. In 1974, Mack Herron had 12 touchdowns (7 rushing, 5 receiving) and Sam Cunningham had 11 (9 rushing, 2 receiving). In 1976, Steve Grogan had 12 touchdowns (12 rushing) and Andy Johnson had 10 touchdowns (6 rushing, 4 receiving).

## STEVAN RIDLEY LED TEAM WITH 12 TOUCHDOWNS

Ridley finished tied for third in the NFL with 12 rushing touchdowns in 2012. The 12 rushing touchdowns are tied with Corey Dillon (2005 and 2004), Antowain Smith (2001) and Steve Grogan (1976) for fifth all-time in team history.

## STEVAN RIDLEY HAD FOUR 100-YARD RUSHING DAYS IN 2012

Stevan Ridley had his first career 100-yard day in the 2012 season opener at Tennessee (9/9) with 125 yards rushing on 21 carries for a 6.0-yard average. He finished with 106 yards rushing on 22 carries for a 4.8-yard average at Buffalo (9/30), a career-high 151 rushing yards vs. Denver (10/7) and then gained 127 yards on 15 carries for an 8.5-yard average at St. Louis (10/28).

## **RIDLEY GOES LONG**

In the season opener at Tennessee (9/9/12), Ridley had five runs of 15 or more yards (17, 17, 16, 15, 15). No Patriots running back in at least the past 25 years has done that in a single game, according to the Elias Sports Bureau. Tennessee's Chris Johnson was the last NFL player to have five runs of 15 or more yards in a game (Nov. 27, 2011 vs. Tampa Bay).



## 2011 FIRST ROUND PICK NATE SOLDER

It only took a day for Nate Solder to decide to change from his lifelong position of tight end to tackle after playing his freshman year at Colorado as a tight end. "My coaches came to me and said, 'You'd be an all right tight end, but you'd be an even better tackle," he told the *Boston Globe*. "I've always wanted to be great, so that's why I moved to tackle." He added over 30 pounds after his redshirt freshman season and was named the team's starting left tackle. He played in 2,540 of 2,542 offensive plays over the next three seasons at Colorado and became an immediate contributor on the Patriots offensive line at right tackle as a rookie before moving to left tackle.

## SLATER EMERGED AS A TWO-TIME CAPTAIN AND TWO-TIME PRO BOWLER ON SPECIAL TEAMS

Bill Belichick recently acknowledged Matthew Slater's role as a gunner on special teams: "Matt is one of the best in the league," Belichick said. "Any time the punt return team has to double somebody, that makes it one less guy they can use somewhere else in the return. He almost always draws two guys out there unless they're in an eight-man rush. Most of the time, there's two guys out there — fourth-and-short, where they're trying to protect the box — but he draws a lot of double teams, and deservedly so. He does an outstanding job of covering punts."



## 💎 WR KENBRELL THOMPKINS

## JUDGE KEEPS AUTOGRAPHED PICTURE OF KENBRELL THOMPKINS ON HIS DESK

Florida judge Dennis Murphy will never forget Kenbrell Thompkins. This is especially true now, as Murphy keeps an autographed picture of Thompkins on his desk from the rookie's playing days at El Camino Community College. The picture was a gift from Thompkins, who has Murphy to thank for granting him special probation conditions after a drug charge in 2007 that allowed Thompkins to leave his crime-riddled neighborhood in Miami, Fla. and attend El Camino. "I'm a firm believer in giving youth a chance to try and turn it around," Murphy told *The Boston Globe.* After being arrested seven times between the ages of 15 and 18, Thompkins excelled at El Camino and went on to play at the University of Cincinnati en route to fulfilling his NFL dream. Thompkins earned his degree from Cincinnati in criminal justice.

## 💎 <u>OL WILL SVITEK</u>

## WILL SVITEK TAKES A HIKE TO REMEMBER

Will Svitek was born in Prague, Czechoslovakia. When he was 2, his parents took him and his three brothers out of the communist country. They left in secret with no money and only the clothes on their backs. Saying they were on a day hike, they walked 14 hours through the mountains and ended up in Austria. The family spent eight months in a refugee camp until being legalized to come to the United States. "My parents were hard-working immigrants who came here to achieve the American Dream and help their sons reach their full potential," said Svitek. "I think they instilled it in me to do everything well. I am a competitive person on the field and in the classroom and I don't think you can just turn that switch off."

## **T SEBASTIAN VOLLMER**

## SEBASTIAN VOLLMER MAKES HIS MARK

A native of Kaarst, Germany, Vollmer did not begin playing football until the age of 14 when he started playing for the Dusseldorf club team. Vollmer helped lead his German prep school team to two national football championships. His early football success landed him an appearance in the 2004 Global Junior Championships in San Diego, which led him to a scholarship at Houston. He spoke very little English when he signed with Houston, but he became fluent in the language as he developed from a 250-pound tight end into a 315-pound lineman who started his final 25 games at tackle for the Cougars. He was not invited to the NFL combine, but Vollmer's collegiate career created interest from the Patriots, who drafted him in the second round of the 2009 draft. Nicknamed "Seabass" during his playing days at Houston, it is a nickname that has carried over to the NFL.

## 💎 CRYAN WENDELL

## RYAN WENDELL LEADS THE NFL IN PLAY SNAPS IN 2012

Ryan Wendell played a league-high 1,249 snaps in 2012 and it helped earn him a spot on the USA Today All-Joe team in 2012. Said Wendell: "I think first it says a lot about the organization, our training staff and our strength training coaches, that they do everything they can all season and all off-season and during the spring to keep us healthy throughout the whole season. I think it says more about them then it does about me individually."





## 🔫 CB KYLE ARRINGTON

## WHAT IS IN A NUMBER

When Arrington was first making the transition from Hofstra to the NFL in 2008, he was assigned jersey No. 42. At that point in his career, he was cut by both the Eagles and Buccaneers.

When Arrington first arrived in New England as a practice squad player in 2009, he initially donned No. 27. But when No. 24 became available, a result of Jonathan Wilhite leaving in free agency after the 2010 season, Arrington pounced on it.

The reason is that it reflects how he's flipped his NFL fortunes -- from a No. 42 struggling to hang on to a No. 24 who has carved out a role on a winning team.

Arrington moved from 24 to 25 in an agreement with Adrian Wilson this past season to accommodate the veteran's desire to keep the same jersey he has worn during his 12-year NFL career.

## STEVE GREGORY STEVE GREGORY WAS ABOUT TO ENTER THE POLICE ACADEMY WHEN SAN DIEGO CALLED

Steve Gregory's father and stepmother are New York City police officers and both were on duty during the events of September 11, 2001. Following his college career at Syracuse, Gregory took the test to enter the police academy. He found out he passed the test on the same day that the San Diego Chargers called him to offer him a rookie free agent contract.

## GREGORY SETS CAREER HIGH WITH HIS THIRD INTERCEPTION OF THE SEASON IN 2012

Steve Gregory set a single-season career-high when he intercepted Miami QB Ryan Tannehill in the first quarter for his third on the season in the season-finale on Dec. 30, 2012. The pick helped set up a 9-yard touchdown pass from Tom Brady to Wes Welker. Gregory's previous single-season high was two interceptions in 2010 when he played for San Diego.

## LB DONT'A HIGHTOWER DONT'A HIGHTOWER WEARS TEDY BRUSCHI'S JERSEY #54

As a first round draft pick, Dont'a Hightower is used to high expectations. Hightower went to training camp with jersey #45 but was switched to jersey #54 prior to the start of the regular season. Former LB Tedy Bruschi wore #54 for 13 seasons. Hightower understands the importance of the number and hopes to live up to its legacy. "I definitely feel honored to be able to wear this number," Hightower said. "I've read that Tedy didn't want it to be retired and he hoped another linebacker would come in and be able to wear this number and be able to play as well. I feel honored. Tedy was a great player, and he means a lot to this organization. I'm definitely proud to be able to wear this number."

## 2012 FIRST ROUND PICK CHANDLER JONES FOLLOWS IN BROTHERS' FOOTSTEPS

Chandler Jones has two brothers, Arthur, a fifth-round NFL Draft selection by the Baltimore Ravens in 2010, who was a Syracuse defensive tackle, and Jon "Bones" Jones, a UFC fighter and the reigning Lightweight Champion.

## JONES IS PILING UP SACKS

DE Chandler Jones had his second two-sack game of the 2013 season with two-sack games against the Jets in both 2013 meetings. He now has 6.5 sacks for the year. The Patriots have had a player finish with 10 or more tackles in a season 14 times in team history.

After being selected by the Patriots in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft, DB Devin McCourty became part of a select group in league history. McCourty's identical twin brother, Jason, is a cornerback with Tennessee, selected in the sixth round of the 2009 NFL Draft. The two are the 12<sup>th</sup> set of twins to play in the NFL. Devin redshirted for the 2005 season and therefore was a year behind his brother in eligibility. McCourty is the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 1998-2000. His twin brother, Wasswa, played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox. The McCourty twins are one of three active sets of twins playing in the NFL.

## MCCOURTY HAS A 104-YARD KICKOFF RETURN FOR A TOUCHDOWN; SECOND LONGEST IN TEAM HISTORY

Devin McCourty had a 104-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the first quarter vs. the Jets (10/21/12), the second longest kickoff return in team history. Ellis Hobbs has the longest in team history with a 108-yard return for a touchdown at the New York Jets on Sept. 9, 2007. McCourty was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance.

Ninkovich has more opponent fumble recoveries (10) over the last four seasons (2010-2013) than any other NFL player. Chicago's Brian Urlacher and Vince Wilfrok are second during that time with seven opponent fumble recoveries.



## **NINKOVICH: WHERE DID HE COME FROM?**

Rob Ninkovich's journey to the Patriots was not easy. He entered the league as a fifth-round pick by the Saints in 2006 and was waived four times by New Orleans and Miami before landing in New England on Aug. 2, 2009. He spent the 2009 offseason trying to make the New Orleans team as a long snapper. Before coming to the Patriots, he had appeared in just eight games over three seasons. He doubled that total in his first year in New England, appearing in 15 games in 2009 and his role on the team has grown since, earning a starting role at linebacker in 2010 and 2011 before moving to a starting role on the defensive line in 2011.

## NINKOVICH SCORED AS A TE IN COLLEGE

Ninkovich played some at tight end in college at Purdue and caught two touchdown passes with a 2-yard touchdown pass from Dallas QB Kyle Orton and a 1-yard touchdown pass from New York Giants QB Curtis Painter.

## DBS LOGAN RYAN AND DURON HARMON

## RUTGERS CLASSMATES LOGAN RYAN AND DURON HARMON REUNITE IN NEW ENGLAND

Rookie defensive backs Logan Ryan and Duron Harmon are used to learning a new system together. Four years ago, Ryan and Harmon began their college football careers together as members of the same recruiting class at Rutgers University and developed a close friendship during their four years in Piscataway, N.J. As fate would have it, Ryan and Harmon would begin their NFL journeys together as well when the Patriots selected the two defensive backs just eight picks apart in the third round of the 2013 NFL Draft. Reunited once again, the former Scarlet Knights are excited and eager to make their mark, just as they did four years ago at Rutgers. "We talked before the draft and said how good it would be to play on the same team again, and for it to happen again, it's exciting and it's a blessing," Harmon told the Boston Globe. ""It's great [we're contributing], because at the end of the day you want to play, and to contribute to a team like this, it's fun."

## RYAN RETURNS FIRST PICK FOR A TOUCHDOWN

Ryan returned his first NFL interception 79 yards for a touchdown in the first quarter at the New York Jets on Oct. 20, 2013. The last Patriots player to return their first career interception for a touchdown was Kyle Arrington in 2010 against the Green Bay Packers, when he took back a Matt Flynn pass 36 yards for a touchdown. ## SPIKES IS A THROWBACK

Spikes, who patterns his style of play after Hall of Fame linebacker Dick Butkus, shared his feelings on modeling his game after oldschool linebackers. "My thing is, when I'm done with this game, I want the older guys when they watch to say, 'He's playing the position the right way.' It's just a point of respect from me to them." Spikes' passion and energy are apparent when he plays the game. Said former Patriots safety Rodney



Harrison in a recent interview with the Boston Herald: "You can see how much he loves it, how he enjoys being physical. He's an intimidator. He's got that fight in him. He's going to hit you and you're going to feel it."

## SPIKES WENT OVER 100 TACKLES IN 2012; ON PACE TO FINISH WITH OVER 100 AGAIN IN 2013

Spikes had 10 or more tackles in six games and finished with a career-high 128 tackles in 2012. With Jerod Mayo at 184 tackles and Spikes at 128, it is the fifth time in the Bill Belichick era that two players have finished with 100 or more tackles. Mayo is on pace to finish with 176 tackles in 2013, and Spikes has 49 total tackles and is on pace to finish 131 total tackles.

## SPIKES SETS CAREER HIGH WITH 22 TACKLES

Spikes set a career-high with 22 total tackles at Cincinnati on Oct. 6, 2013. His previous best was 16 tackles at the New York Jets on Nov. 22, 2012. It is the highest tackle total for a Patriots player since Jerod Mayo had 23 total tackles vs. the New York Jets on Nov. 13, 2008.

Spikes has three games so far in 2013 with 10 or more tackles - 10 vs. Tampa Bay, 22 at Cincinnati and 17 at New York Jets.

## AQIB TALIB HAS A NOSE FOR THE BALL

Aqib Talib has been one of the most prolific cornerbacks in the NFL at intercepting opposing quarterbacks and returning those interceptions for touchdowns during his NFL career. # PATRIOTS IN THE PLAYOFFS

## KRAFT'S SIX CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS ARE THE MOST OF ANY NFL OWNER IN SUPER BOWL ERA

The 2011 AFC Championship was the sixth conference championship for Robert Kraft as Patriots owner. Kraft is the first NFL owner to bring his team to six Super Bowls and his six conference championships are the most of any NFL owner in the Super Bowl Era (since 1966). Seven NFL owners brought their teams to five Super Bowls, but Kraft is the first NFL owner to lead his team to six Super Bowl appearances.

## WR Danny Amendola (FA-STL, '13)

Amendola returned in Week 5 after a three-game absence to lead the team with four catches for 55 yards against the Bengals ... Amendola shined in his Patriots debut against Buffalo, catching 10 passes for 104 yards in the team's Week 1 win. It was Amendola's third career 100-yard game and fourth career game with 10 or more receptions ... Seven of Amendola's 10 receptions came on third down and resulted in a Patriots first down, including a 6-yard reception on a third-and-4 from the NE 31 to keep the game-winning drive alive.

This is Amendola's first regular season game vs. the Dolphins

## LT Nate Solder (D1, '11)

Started in all 16 regular season games in 2012 at left tackle ... Also appeared in 16 games in 2011, making 13 starts – 11 at right tackle and two as a tackleeligible tight end ... Started both postseason games at left tackle in 2012.

## LG Logan Mankins (D2, '05)

An eight-year mainstay at guard and five-time Pro Bowler who has started all 121 regular-season games and all 15 postseason games in which he has appeared since joining the Patriots in 2005.

## OL Ryan Wendell (FA-'08)

Led all NFL players in playing time in 2012 by starting all 16 games at center and playing 1,379 snaps ... Was a key reserve on the offensive line and saw starting assignments at center and both guard positions before earning the starting center position in 2011 ... Made his NFL debut on special teams in the Patriots' season opener vs. Buffalo in 2009.

## OL Dan Connolly (FA-'07)

Started in 14 regular season games in 2012 at right guard and also appeared at fullback in short yardage situations ... Took over as starting center after seasonending leg injury to Dan Koppen in the 2011 opener ... Started at right guard for both postseason games in 2012.

This is Connolly's ninth regular season game vs. the Dolphins

## RT Sebastian Vollmer (D2d, '09)

Started in 15 regular season games at right tackle in 2012, rebounding strong from an injury-ravaged 2011 in which he was inactive for 10 regular season and two playoff games ... Also started both playoff contests in 2012.

## WR Julian Edelman (D7a, '09)

Edelman had 102 all-purpose yards against the Jets on Sunday and compiled 58 punt return yards, including a season-long 38-yard return in the second quarter that set up a Patriots touchdown ... Had five catches for a career-high 118 yards in a Week 4 win over the Falcons ... Has already passed his career highs in receptions and yards with 46 catches for 455 yards on the



season and leads the team in both categories... Set a career high with 13 receptions in a Week 2 win over the Jets ... Caught two touchdown passes in a game for the first time in his career in a Week 1 win at Buffalo.

## TE Rob Gronkowski (D2a, '10)

Gronkowski returned to the field for the first time in 2013 against the Jets on Sunday and led the team with eight catches for 114 yards. It was his tenth career 100-yard game, passing Ben Coates (9) for the most 100-yard games by a tight end in team history ... Led the team with 11 touchdown receptions in 2012

and is the first tight end in NFL history to have three straight 10-plus touchdown seasons (10 touchdowns in 2010, 18 in 2011, 10 in 2012). Gronkowski and Antonio Gates (13 in 2004 and 10 in 2005) are the only tight ends to have back-to-back 10-plus touchdown seasons... Joined Randy Moss (2007, 2008 and 2009) and Corey Dillon (2004, 2005, 2006) as the only Patriots with three straight 10-plus touchdown seasons and three 10-plus seasons overall... Gronkowski's 53 receptions were the most by an AFC tight end in 2012 and the third most in the NFL behind Cowboys TE Jason Witten (73) and Falcons TE Tony Gonzalez (64).

## QB Tom Brady (D6, '00)

Brady led the offense on a last-minute drive for the second consecutive week on Sunday against the Jets, going 66 yards with 2:10 remaining to set up Stephen Gostowski's game-tying field goal to send the game to overtime ... Two weeks ago, Brady orchestrated an 8-play, 70-yard game-winning drive with 1:13 remaining and threw a 17-yard touchdown pass to Kenbrell Thompkins with five seconds remaining to give the Patriots a 30-27 win over the Saints ... It marked the 38<sup>th</sup> time that Brady has led his team to victory following a fourth-quarter lead or tie. He led the Patriots on a 12-play, 49-yard drive late in the fourth quarter against Buffalo in Week 1 to set up Gostkowski's game-winning field goal ... Brady is 4<sup>th</sup> on the all-time NFL touchdown passes list with 342 and 8<sup>th</sup> on the all-time passing list with 46,286 yards ... Had his streak of consecutive games with a touchdown pass snapped at 52 in Week 5 against the Bengals. His streak stands as the second-longest in NFL history behind Saints QB Drew Brees (54) ... Threw for 317 yards on 20-of-31 passing and two touchdowns in a Week 4 win over the Falcons. It was his 54<sup>th</sup> career 300-yard passing game, good for fifth alltime among NFL QBs ... Brady is 16-6 in 24 career games against the Dolphins and has won his last six games against Miami. He has a 102.4 quarterback rating in those six games with 11 touchdowns and just 2 interceptions.

Added 11 tackles and eight solo stops and leads all Patriots defensive linemen with 40 tackles through seven games ... Four of Jones' 6.5 sacks this season have come against Geno Smith, as Jones dropped the Jets QB twice in a Week 2 win at Gillette Stadium ... This is the third multi-sack effort of Jones' career ... Jones now has at least a share of a sack in three consecutive games, the longest streak of his career ... Has 6.5 sacks through seven games to lead the team and has already surpassed his rookie year total of six sacks.

## DT Tommy Kelly (FA-'13)

Jones sacked Geno Smith twice for a total of 12 yards lost in just his second NFL start on Sunday ... It is the second time in four NFL games that Jones has recorded multiple sacks. Jones dropped Bengals QB Andy Dalton for 1.5 sacks for 13 yards lost in Week 5 ... Jones has made an immediate impact in the absence of Vince Wilfork. He leads all NFL rookies with 3.5 sacks despite playing in just four of the team's seven games.

### DT Joe Vellano (UFA-'13)

Vellano recorded a career-high 9 tackles and 8 solo stops in his third career start against the Jets on Sunday ... ## THE TEAM OF THE DECADE

hen Robert Kraft purchased the New England Patriots in 1994, few would have thought that 17 years later the franchise would be the undisputed team of the decade in the first decade of the new millennium. Kraft brought a winning vision to the organization and dedicated his resources to building a consistent winner. On Jan. 27, 2000, Kraft hired Bill Belichick to coach the team, and three months later the team drafted then-unheralded quarterback Tom Brady, putting the final pieces in place for the Patriots to become the most successful NFL team of the 2000s. Below is a look at the accomplishments of the Patriots during the first decade of the new millennium that earned the Patriots the "Team of the Decade" moniker.
