THE COACHES

MIKE TOMLIN was named the 16th head coach in Pittsburgh Steelers history on Jan. 22, 2007. Hired at the age of 34, Tomlin became only the third head coach hired by the Steelers since 1969.

Tomlin became the youngest head coach in NFL history to both coach in and win a Super Bowl when he led the Steelers to a 27-23 victory over the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII. By winning the Super Bowl in only his second season as a head coach, he also became the fastest to win a Super Bowl title in Steelers' history.

In Tomlin's first six years as head coach, he has guided the Steelers' defense to the NFL's top ranking in total defense four times. He has also sent a total of 38 selections to the league's annual Pro Bowl, including two following the 2012 season. Tomlin has reached the playoffs four times in his first six seasons, including two trips to the Super Bowl (winning Super Bowl XLIII).

Tomlin is one of only seven coaches in league history to win a Super Bowl within his first two seasons as an NFL head coach. Tomlin is the only head coach in Steelers history to lead the team to two Super Bowls in his first four seasons at the helm, including an appearance against the Green Bay Packers in Super Bowl XLV. He is one of only two Steelers' head coaches to win three division titles in his first four seasons.

Tomlin was appointed by Commissioner Roger Goodell to the NFL's Competition Committee in March, 2013.

In 2012, he led the Steelers to a 27-10 victory over the New York Jets in the home opener, becoming the first coach in team history to win his first six home openers. The Steelers finished the season with the top-ranked overall defense (275.8 ypg) and finished first in passing defense (185.2 ypg).

In 2011, Tomlin led the Steelers to a 12-4 record, marking the second straight season the team posted 12 wins, which marked only the second time in team history it has been achieved.

The Steelers finished second in total defense under Tomlin's guidance in 2010, allowing only 276.8 yards per game. Pittsburgh led the NFL and set a team record in rushing defense, yielding only 62.8 yards per game (1,004 yards), the third-best total in NFL history dating back to 1970. The Steelers also established an NFL record in 2010 by not allowing an opponent to rush for more than 75 yards in any of their first eight games during the regular season.

In all, the Steelers defense led the NFL in 2010 in rushing yards allowed, points allowed (232), touchdowns (22), quarterback sacks (48), rushing average (3.0), yards per play (4.5) and yards allowed on first down (4.08).

Tomlin was a three-year starter at wide receiver at William and Mary (1990-94) and finished his career with 101 receptions for 2,054 yards and 20 TD catches. A first-team All-Yankee Conference selection in 1994, he established a school record with a 20.2 yards-per-catch average.

BILL BELICHICK is in his 39th season as an NFL coach and his 14th as the head coach of the New England Patriots. He is the only head coach in NFL history to win three Super Bowls in a four-year span. He entered the 2013 season ranked sixth in NFL history with 205 total victories, including the postseason.

To go with three Super Bowl victories as a head coach, he has also delivered five conference titles, 10 division crowns and 17 playoff victories for New England. In 2007 he became the first head coach to guide his team to a 16-0 regular season.

Only one coach has won more Super Bowls than Belichick (Pittsburgh's Chuck Noll, 4).

For the 19th straight season, Bill Hillgrove serves as the "Voice of the Steelers" and handles play-by-play duties for the broadcast. Joining Hillgrove for his 15th season as an expert analyst is Tunch Ilkin, the former Steelers All-Pro offensive tackle. Joining the team for his 11th season is former Steeler offensive lineman Craig Wolfley, who provides sideline analysis.

Pittsburgh Team Notes:

- The Steelers are 9-12 against Oakland during the regular season, including 4-7 on the road against the Raiders.
- Pittsburgh fell to 116-60 during the month of October, dating back to 1970.
- The Steelers forced a season-high three turnovers (two interceptions, one fumble).
- Pittsburgh's defense held the Raiders to 5-14 (36%) on third down.
- The Steelers had 20 first downs compared to 13 for Oakland.
- Pittsburgh possessed the ball for 17:28 in the second half compared to 12:32 for the Raiders.
- The Steelers registered 241 passing yards compared to 82 for the Raiders
- The Pittsburgh defense held QB Terrelle Pryor to 88 yards passing and a rating of 25.7 while forcing two interceptions.
- The Steelers only committed three penalties for 12 yards.
- **QB Landry Jones, WR Markus Wheaton, CB Curtis Brown, TE Richard Gordon, LB Kion Wilson, LB Chris Carter and DT Hebron Fangupo** were inactive for the Steelers.

K Shaun Suisham

This matchup is Pittsburgh's first trip to New England since the 2008 regular season...the Steelers are looking for their third win in the last four regular-season showdowns with the Patriots...Pittsburgh is looking for consecutive wins over New England for the first time since the Steelers won six straight games from 1989-97...New England has won six of the nine games (regular season and postseason) that have taken place since 2001...of the 22 regular-season games between these two teams, this is only the seventh one to take place in New England...the Steelers are attempting to win consecutive regular season games on the road in the series for the first time since they won three-straight in New England in 1974, 1979 and 1997...Pittsburgh owns a 1-2 record in New England since Gillette Stadium opened in 2002...all but one of the last eight regular-season games have been decided by at least eight points.

- Patriots special teams coach **Scott O'Brien** coached at the University of Pittsburgh from 1987-1990.

Pro Connections

- Steelers running backs coach **Kirby Wilson** coached for the Patriots from 1997-99.
- Steelers **P Zoltan Mesko** was drafted by New England in the fifth round (150th overall) of the 2010 NFL Draft. He appeared in 48 regular-season games and six postseason games in three years with the Patriots.
- Steelers Head Coach **Mike Tomlin** was the Minnesota Vikings defensive coordinator in 2006 when Patriots wide receivers coach **Chad O'Shea** was the Vikings offensive assistant/wide receivers coach.
- Steelers assistant head coach/defensive line coach **John Mitchell** and wide receivers coach **Richard Mann** were on the Cleveland Browns coaching staff when Patriots Head Coach **Bill Belichick** was the Browns head coach. Also on that Cleveland staff was Patriots special teams coach **Scott O'Brien**. In 1993, Mitchell's and Mann's final season with Cleveland, Patriots linebackers coach **Pepper Johnson** was in his first season as a linebacker for the Browns.
- Steelers offensive coordinator **Todd Haley** was working with the New York Jets as an offensive assistant/wide receivers coach when Patriots linebackers coach **Pepper Johnson** was playing linebacker for the Jets in 1997-98.
- Steelers wide receivers coach **Richard Mann** and Patriots special teams coach **Scott O'Brien** were both on the Baltimore Ravens coaching staff in 1997 and 1998.

- Steelers special teams coordinator **Danny Smith** held the same position with the Washington Redskins when Patriots **DE Andre Carter** was a member of the Redskins from 2006-09
- Steelers **WR Jerricho Cotchery** played for the New York Jets from 2004-10. - Looking to throw for 400+ yards for the fifth time in his career and the second time this season (406 yards vs. CHI, 9/22/13).
- Is looking to match his franchise best by throwing for at least 375 yards in three games during the same regular season (2009).
- Is one passing touchdowns shy of becoming the second Steelers player to throw for at least 200 touchdowns (Terry Bradshaw, 212).

WR Antonio Brown

TEAM NOTES

Two Of the Best: The Pittsburgh Steelers and New England Patriots are two of the most prominent franchises in the NFL. The Steelers have appeared in eight Super Bowls (winning a league best six), while New England has been to seven Super Bowls and won three. Combined they have represented the AFC in eight Super Bowls since 2001 and won five of those.

Dating back to the AFL-NFL merger of 1970 the Steelers have been to the playoffs 26 times while the Patriots have been there 19 times. The two teams account for two of the top three regular-season records since the start of free agency in 1993.

Both of the team's current head coaches, **Mike Tomlin** and Bill Belichick, also rank among the best in the league. Tomlin has led the Steelers to a record of 65-38, which ties for the fourth-best record in the NFL since 2007. Belichick has guided the Patriots to a record of 157-59, which marks the best regular season record in the NFL since 2000.

A Good 10-Plus Years: Pittsburgh is one of five teams to win at least 100 regular-season games since the start of the 2003 season. They are also second in Super Bowl appearances over that time span and tied for the lead with two Super Bowl victories.

All About Defense: The Pittsburgh Steelers are one of three teams to allow less than 200 net passing yards per game this season (181.0).

- Five of seven opponents have been held to 21 points or less including each of the last three.
- Rank second in the NFL by only allowing 17.9 completions/game.
- Rank second in the league in gross passing yards a game (188.0).
- Four of the seven quarterbacks Pittsburgh has faced have completed less than 56% of their passes.
- Five passing touchdowns are the fewest allowed in the NFL.
- Pittsburgh has allowed the fifth fewest (tied) pass plays of 25+ yards (9).
- Have allowed the second fewest passing first downs (61).
- Have recorded four interceptions in the last three games while giving up only one passing touchdown.
- The Steelers have held five of seven opponents to less than 290 total net yards and under 210 net passing yards.
- The Steelers have only yielded 14 runs of 10+ yards, which is tied for the third fewest in the NFL.
- Pittsburgh has yielded 13 points on the offenses' first possession this season.
- The Steelers have not allowed over 280 net passing yards in a single game.
- Pittsburgh defense has given up the fewest YAC (yards after catch) in the league (577).

Defense Feels At Home: Pittsburgh's defense only gave up 16 points in Week 1 versus Tennessee and in a Week 7 win over Baltimore. The Titans game was the ninth consecutive home opener where the Steelers gave up 17 points or less.

The Steelers yielded 40 points in Week 3 against Chicago in part due to five turnovers, including two the Bears brought back for touchdowns. Pittsburgh's 17.4 points per game allowed at home are the fourth-fewest in the NFL and first in the AFC since the start of 2012.

Since **Dick LeBeau** has been defensive coordinator (2004-present), the Steelers have allowed an average of 15.7 points per game at Heinz Field, which is the second-lowest in the NFL over that time span for points given up at home during the regular season (Baltimore, 15.4).

Dating back to 2010, Coach LeBeau's defenses have been consistently stingy at home. In 2010 the Steelers allowed only 13.8 points per game, followed by 10.0 in 2011 and 14.9 in 2012. Holding away teams to under 15.0 points per game in each of the last three seasons tied 1992-94 (11.4, 12.1 and 13.0) for the second-longest streak of only giving up an average of less than 15.0 points per home game. The longest such streak in team history was eight years, 1972-79 (10.3, 13.8, 9.4, 13.3, 9.9, 14.9, 13.4 and 10.5).

Heinz Field Advantage: The Steelers own the best home record in the NFL with a 240-94-1 record (.718) since 1970. Pittsburgh is 71-27-1 (.722) at home since Heinz Field opened in 2001, which is the fourth best winning percentage in the NFL during that time span. Only six opponents have registered multiple regular-

season victories at Heinz Field. Below are the top five home records since 2001:

If You Build It, They Will Come: Pittsburgh opened the 2013 season with crowds of over 61,000 in the first three home games. Pittsburgh has sold out every home game, dating back to Nov. 5, 1972 versus Cincinnati, a span of 320 regular season games.

The Steelers averaged 61,141 fans in eight home games during the 2012 season. It was the 11th time in 12 seasons at Heinz Field that Pittsburgh averaged over 61,000 fans per game.

In the 2010 AFC Championship victory over the N.Y. Jets, the Steelers broke the single-game record. The attendance of 66,662 surpassed the old mark of 65,597 set October 25, 2009, during a game versus the Minnesota Vikings.

The previous regular-season record was 65,392, which was set on November 16, 2009 versus Cincinnati. It helped Pittsburgh set the team home attendance record in 2009 by averaging 63,458 (507,882 total).

INDIVIDUAL OFFENSIVE NOTES

Playing The Pats Well: QB **Ben Roethlisberger** has had a fair amount of success against the Patriots, especially in recent years. He is 3-3 against New England during the regular season, including leading the Steelers to victory in two of the last three games and in his last visit to Gillette Stadium (2008).

In six games against New England Roethlisberger has recorded a passer rating of 95.3 while throwing for 1,530 yards, 12 touchdowns and just three interceptions. In each of the last two games, he has registered over 360 yards and a passer rating of at least 97.0 in each.

Dating back to 2004, Roethlisberger is the only quarterback in the NFL to throw for over 360 yards against New England twice during the regular season. His passer rating of 95.3 against the Patriots during the regular season ranks fifth among NFL quarterbacks dating back to 2000, when Bill Belichick was named head coach.

He has registered 25 300+ yard passing games in his career during the regular season, including throwing for 406 yards against Chicago in Week 3 and 383 yards versus Minnesota in Week 4. It was the first time in his career he has thrown for at least 375 yards in back-to-back games. Roethlisberger has registered the third-most games with at least 375 passing yards this season (2).

The 406 yards in Week 3 were the fourth-most passing yards of his career and the sixth-most in franchise history. It was the eighth time a quarterback has thrown for at least 400 yards against the Bears and only the second time dating back to 2001 (Brian Griese, 407 yards, 9/21/08).

LOOKING AHEAD...

The Steelers return home to take on the Buffalo Bills on Sunday, Nov. 10. Kickoff is set for 1 p.m. ET and will be televised on CBS (locally KDKA-TV, channel 2).

Controlling The North: QB Ben Roethlisberger is 36-11 (.766) as a starter against AFC North opponents during his career. He is 12-4 since 2010 against divisional foes during the regular season, including 3-2 since the start of the 2012 season. Roethlisberger has finished with an above .500 record against division opponents during the regular season in seven of his first nine years, including winning at least five games four times.

Roethlisberger had won 12 straight games against divisional foes as the starter prior to a Week 3 setback at Cincinnati in 2009, which was the longest streak in the NFL since Peyton Manning won 12 straight from 2004-06.

In his 47 career games versus division opponents, Roethlisberger has posted a perfect passer rating once (11/5/07 vs. Baltimore) and has recorded a passer rating of over 100.0 a total of 18 times, including a rating of 107.2 in a Week 7 victory over Baltimore this season.

Home Cooking: QB Ben Roethlisberger owns a 50-17 (.746) mark in the regular season in his career at Heinz Field, including winning his first eight starts as a rookie in 2004. Roethlisberger is 12-5 at home since the start of the 2011 regular season. Dating back to 2011, Roethlisberger is one of six active quarterbacks to have a passer rating of at least 100.0 at home during the regular season (100.0).

In his regular-season career at Heinz Field, Roethlisberger has completed 63.2 percent of his passes for 15,892 yards with 104 touchdowns and 52 interceptions for a passer rating of 95.0. He has thrown for more than 300 yards 12 times and has 31 multi-touchdown games at home (24-7 record in such games), including throwing for 406 yards in Week 2 versus Chicago. He is one of seven active quarterbacks to throw at least 100 touchdowns at home during the regular season.

Roethlisberger has twice posted a perfect passer rating at home, including most recently in Week 9 of 2007 against Baltimore. He also had a perfect passer rating (158.3) against Tennessee in the 2005 season opener and has posted at least a 125.0 passer rating eight times.

The Steelers have scored at least 20 points in 52 of the 67 games at home with Roethlisberger as the starter.

Finding The End Zone: QB Ben Roethlisberger has recorded at least one touchdown pass in each of the last 21 games in which he has played, including the postseason (2011 Wildcard / 2012, Games 1-9 and 13-16 / 2013, Games 1-7). It passed his career best streak of 15 games with at least one touchdown pass (2006, Games 12-16 / 2007, Games 1-10).

The 2012 season was the first time in his career that he recorded at least one passing touchdown in each game he played during the regular season (13).

Roethlisberger totaled at least three touchdown passes in 24 games during his career, including four times in 2012 (4 at Oak / 3 vs. Was / 3 vs. SD / 3 vs. Cle), marking the second most times he has thrown for at least three touchdowns in a game in one season (5 in 2007 and 2009).

In 2012, Roethlisberger threw 26 touchdowns, tying for the second most touchdowns he has thrown in his career and the third most in franchise history.

Facing The NFC: With a career record of 89-43 as a starter, **QB Ben Roethlisberger** has posted gaudy numbers no matter the opposition.

Throughout his career, Roethlisberger has feasted on competition from the NFC.

- 24-10 in 34 career regular-season games against NFC opponents. Roethlisberger won his first seven starts against NFC teams.
- Completed 610-of-975 passes (62.6 pct.) for 8,016 yards with 48 touchdowns, 25 interceptions and a passer rating of 94.2.
- In two games against NFC teams this season Roethlisberger has thrown for 789 yards while completing 67.4 percent of his passes.
- His 8.58 yards per attempt is the seventh highest against NFC teams this season.
- Roethlisberger is tied for the sixth most passes of 25+ yards against NFC teams this year (9).

Roethlisberger's statistics against the NFC are equally impressive in games at Heinz Field. In 16 career games against NFC opponents at home, Roethlisberger has a 15-2 mark while completing 288-of-476 passes (60.5 pct.) for 3,974 yards with 23 touchdowns and 10 interceptions for a passer rating of 94.6.

Starting In Style: In his career, **QB Ben Roethlisberger** owns an 89-44 (.669) record as a starting quarterback in the regular season. That mark is the fourth-best record in the NFL among all active quarterbacks (min. 50 starts).

Roethlisberger registered his 80th career win in his 113th career start, becoming the fourth quarterback who began their career in the Super Bowl era to reach 80 wins in 113 or fewer starts: Tom Brady (104), Roger Staubach (105) and Ken Stabler (112).

His 63-27 record after his first 90 starts in the NFL ranks third (tied) in league history for the best record in such starts. Only Brady (97-23) and Stabler (66-23-1) had better records in their first 90 starts in the NFL. Roethlisberger's record is tied with Jim McMahon.

Miller Time: TE Heath Miller has been a consistent performer for the Steelers throughout his career. After suffering a knee injury in Week 16 of 2012, Miller returned to the field for the first time in Week 3 versus Chicago and registered three receptions for 35 yards. He registered six receptions in both Games 4-5, marking the second time in his career that he has recorded at least six receptions in back-to-back games (10/11/12 - 10/21/12). Miller has recorded four receptions of at least 20 yards in the last five games (22, 22, 28, 31).

Despite only playing in 15 games last season, Miller was named Steelers MVP and selected to his second career Pro Bowl. Miller's 71 receptions led the team and ranked second in the AFC among tight ends.

In 2012, Miller set career highs with 816 receiving yards and eight touchdown receptions. Miller's 816 receiving yards led all AFC tight ends and his eight touchdowns were second-most in the AFC amongst tight ends.

Miller Climbs The Ranks: TE Heath Miller has 40 career receiving touchdowns, passing Elbie Nickel (37) for the most by a Pittsburgh tight end and ranking fifth in team history. The Steelers are 27-9 when Miller finds the end zone.

Miller (428) passed Nickel (329) for the franchise lead in receptions by a tight end in 2011. Against Minnesota in Week 4 he passed Buddy Dial (4,723) for the sixth-most receiving yards in franchise history (4,905). He trails Nickel (5,131) for the fifth most in franchise history and the most for a Steelers' tight end.

Miller has registered at least one reception in 132-of-140 career games played, including the postseason. Miller has recorded at least one reception in every game he has played in, regular and postseason, dating back to 11/3/08 vs. Washington, a streak of 79 games.

Since 2008, Miller has surpassed 40 receptions each season, including a career-best 76-reception performance in 2009. During the first eight years of his career, Miller averaged over 10 yards per catch each season and currently is averaging 12.1 yards per catch this season.

Brown Steps Up: WR Antonio Brown is a fourth-year player that continues to get better. He leads the NFL in receptions (56) and is tied for ninth in receiving yards (630). In six games this season Brown has led the Steelers in receptions, receiving yards or both in each game. Below are some highlights from the first six games:

- Has 56 receptions this season, marking the most receptions by a Steelers' player in the team's first seven games of a season (dating back to 1960). It also ties for the fifth most receptions in a team's first seven games in the NFL (dating back to 1960).
- In games 3-5 he has registered 30 receptions (370 yards, two TDs) to tie Hines Ward (Gms. 8-10, 2002, 30 rec., 386 yds. 4 TDs) for the most receptions over a three-game span in franchise history.
- In Week 1 all five of Brown's receptions went for first downs.
- He led the Steelers with six receptions for 57 yards in Week 2.
- In Week 3, Brown recorded a career-best 196 yards on nine receptions with a career-high two touchdowns. It was the fourth 100+ yard receiving game of his career.

- Against Minnesota in Week 4 he registered a career-best 12 receptions for 88 yards. His 12 receptions were the most by a Steelers' player since Hines Ward recorded 13 receptions on 11/30/03 against Cincinnati.
- In Week 3, on third-and-14, Brown recorded a 45-yard reception to the Chicago 15-yard line, setting up a field goal by the Steelers. It was the fifth reception of 40 or more yards during the regular season in his career.

- In Week 5, Brown recorded a game-high nine receptions for 86 yards.
- At Oakland in Week 8, he led the way with nine receptions for 82 yards, marking the fourth time in the last five games that he registered at least nine receptions.

Sanders Steps In: Following the 2012 season the Steelers managed to hold onto **WR Emmanuel Sanders**, who was one of the only restricted free agents in the NFL to receive an offer sheet this past off-season (New England).

The former third-round pick began his ascension from the third option into the starting line-up in Week 1 by tying a career-high

with a team-best seven receptions for 57 yards. He followed it up in Week 2 by recording a team-best 78 yards receiving on five receptions, including a career-long reception of 43 yards that set up the Steelers at the Cincinnati one-yard line. Sanders provided one of the highlights of the Week 4 game against Minnesota, a 36-yard reception to the Vikings 21-yard line on a drive that resulted in a touchdown. In Week 6 he registered the longest reception of his career, a 55-yard touchdown. At Oakland in Week 8 he matched his career high with seven receptions for a game-best 88 yards while also running in a two-point conversion to cut the Raiders lead to three late in the fourth quarter.

Sanders also has contributed on special teams. In Week 7 against Baltimore he returned a kickoff 44 yards to the Pittsburgh 37-yard line, setting up a drive that resulted in a game-winning field goal.

This season Sanders looks to improve on career highs he set last season in games played (16), starts (7), receptions (44), receiving yards (626), receiving average (14.2) and receiving long (37). Even though Sanders was not one of the two primary starters in his first three seasons he was still very consistent, recording at least one reception in 15-of-16 games last season. He has also recorded 172 yards on 13 receptions in four postseason contests.

Calm and Cool Catchery: The veteran leader of the Steelers wide receivers is **WR Jerricho Cotchery**. He has eclipsed 400 receptions and 5,000 yards in his 10-year NFL career. Besides providing leadership, he also contributes on the field. Below are some highlights from the first four games of the season:

- Tied for the team lead with two receiving touchdowns this season.
- Third on the team with 22 receptions for 328 yards.
- Recorded a team-high 103 yards on five receptions with one touchdown versus Minnesota in Week 4. It was the ninth 100+ yard receiving game of his career during the regular season and the first since 9/27/09 (8 rec. for 108 yards and one touchdown vs. Ten).
- Ranks third in the AFC in first down percentage (81.8).

INDIVIDUAL DEFENSIVE NOTES

Timmons Time: On a defense that has struggled to stay healthy over the last couple of seasons, **LB Lawrence Timmons** has been a player the Steelers can count on being in the lineup each week. Timmons, who has missed only two games his entire career, started his team-leading 44th consecutive regular-season game last Sunday against Oakland. Since the start of the 2010 season, Timmons has started (54) and played in (55) the most games out of any Steelers' linebackers, while also leading the group in tackles over that time. Timmons currently holds the team lead with 78 tackles this season.

Timmons not only plays in almost every game, he also makes an impact.

- He recorded at least 10 tackles against Tennessee (11, six solo), Chicago (10, seven solo), the New York Jets (10, six solo), Baltimore (20, 17 solo) and Oakland (12, 5 solo). Timmons has registered double digit tackles in 22 games during his career, including nine times since the start of the 2012 season.
- His tackles (20) and solo tackles (17) in a victory over Baltimore in Week 7 were both career highs.
- In Week 2 he tied for the team lead with seven solo tackles.
- Against the Vikings in Week 4 he tied for second on the team with seven tackles.
- In Week 8, forced a fumble that was recovered by **DE Brett Keisel**, at the Oakland 11-yard line early in the fourth quarter. It was the 10th forced fumble of his career. The ensuing drive resulted in a touchdown to cut the lead to 21-10.

In 2012, Timmons became the first player since Joey Porter in 2002 to lead the team or tie for the team lead in tackles, sacks and interceptions.

Bringing The Wood: LB LaMarr Woodley has made it a habit of coming out of the gate quick to start the season. He has registered one sack in four of the six openers he has played in, including in Week 1 this season.

He recorded a team-high five sacks this season, all coming in the first six games, which tied for the second most sacks he has recorded in the first six games of a season in his career (5.0 in 2011 / 7.5 in 2008).

It was the third time in his career where he has registered at least five sacks in the team's first six games (5.0, 2011 / 7.5, 2008). Dating back to 1982, Woodley joined James Harrison (8.5, 2008 / 6.0, 2009 / 5.0, 2010) and Joey Porter (6.0, 2002 / 5.0, 2000 and 2001) as the only Steelers to record at least five sacks in the team's first six games of a season three times.

Woodley registered one sack in four consecutive games this season, tying for the second-longest streak of his career.

Elite Company: LB LaMarr Woodley registered five sacks this season to pass Greg Lloyd (53.5) for the fifth most sacks by a Steelers' player since sacks became an official statistic in 1982 (57.0).

Gotta Be Da Beard: DE Brett Keisel started the 2013 season just as he ended the 2012 season, by getting pressure on the quarterback.

- Second on the team with 16 quarterback pressures this season.
- Leads the Steelers' defensive line with 29 tackles this season (21 solo).
- Tied for the team lead with two quarterback pressures in both Weeks 1 and 4.
- In Week 2, he recorded a team-high five quarterback pressures.
- Against the Bears in Week 3, Keisel sacked QB Jay Cutler for a loss of two yards.
- Led the defensive line with four solo tackles in a victory over the New York Jets.
- Recorded seven tackles, one sack and registered the sixth fumble recovery of his career in Week 8 at Oakland, which set the offense up at the Raiders 11-yard line in the fourth quarter.

In 2012, he led the team with a career-high 40 quarterback pressures, 21 more than **LB Lawrence Timmons** who finished second on the team with 19. It was the most quarterback pressures by a Pittsburgh defender since **LB James Harrison** recorded 44 in 2008.

Not Backing Down: CB Ike Taylor is consistently matched up with the other team's top receiving threat, routinely minimizing their impact. Before missing the last four weeks of the 2012 season due to injury, Taylor had played in 135 consecutive games.

Taylor returned to the field for the season opener and nothing has changed:

- Versus Tennessee in Week 1 he helped limit the Titans to 117 net passing yards.
- In Week 2 at Cincinnati he was primarily matched up on WR A.J. Green and while Green was thrown to 14 times, he only recorded six receptions for 41 yards. Green has faced the Steelers four times with Taylor in the line-up and was held to one reception twice (11/13/11 and 10/21/12) and six receptions twice (12/4/11, 9/16/13) while being targeted a total of 33 times.
- Against Chicago in Week 3 Taylor and secondary held QB Jay Cutler to 159 passing yards and his primary target, WR Brandon Marshall, to 52 yards on five receptions.
- Finished tied for second on the team in Week 4 with seven tackles.
- Part of a secondary that held Jets QB Geno Smith to a passer rating of 48.8 and Raiders QB Terrelle Pryor to a rating of 25.7 and 88 passing yards.
- In a Week 7 victory over Baltimore, held WR Torrey Smith to three receptions on six targets.

Since Taylor became a regular starter (2005-present), the Steelers have led the league in pass defense, allowing only 190.7 net passing yards per game. Since 2005 Taylor has started 110 of the 131 regular season games he has played in. In those 131 games the defense only allowed seven players to record double-digit receptions in a single game. Also, in those 131 games, Pittsburgh's defense allowed only nine 300-yard passers, including only one in 2011 and none in the 12 games he played in in 2012 or the seven so far in 2013.

Tackling Machine: S Ryan Clark has teamed with perennial All-Pro Troy Polamalu to form one of the finest safety duos in the NFL. Since coming to the Steelers in 2006, Clark has started 100 of 101 regular-season games played, including at least 15 games in each season from 2009-12.

Clark started the 2013 season just where he left off in 2012, tackling everything.

- Second on the team with 55 tackles and 42 solo tackles this season.
- In the season opener versus Tennessee, Clark recorded career highs with 15 tackles and 13 solo tackles. His tackling helped limit the Titans to 2.7 yards per carry while he was part of a secondary that only gave up 117 net passing yards.
- He registered a team-high 11 tackles (seven solo) at Cincinnati in Week 2. It was only the second time in his career that he registered double digit tackles in back-to-back games (11, 11/7/04 at Det and 12, 11/21/04 vs. Cin).
- Finished tied for second on the team with seven tackles at NYJ while his six solo tackles tied for the team lead.
- Finished second on the team with 11 tackles (nine solo) at Oakland. It was the 18th time he registered at least 10 tackles in a game and the third this season.

INDIVIDUAL SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

Oh So Suisham: **K Shaun Suisham** started of the 2013 season by registering a safety on his first kickoff when Titans RB Darius Reynaud fielded the ball just outside the goal line and then took a knee in the end zone.

Suisham made all 15 field goals to start the season before missing his last two. Dating back to last season Suisham recorded a streak of 16 consecutive makes, tying for the longest streak of his career when you include the postseason (16, 1/1/12 – 10/11/12).

He has made six from beyond 40 yards this season. Including the postseason, he has made 19 straight field goals between 40-49 yards, which is a personal best. His last miss from the range was on 1/1/12 at Cleveland.

Suisham clinched a Week 7 victory for the Steelers over Baltimore with a 42-yard field goal as time expired. Suisham has eight career game-winning field goals, including six as a Steeler.

Suisham has a current streak of 98 consecutive PATs made as a Steeler. Since October 4, 2009, Suisham has made 119 straight PATs, which is the longest streak of his career.

All Around Ability: Steelers **WR Antonio Brown** doesn't just contribute as one of Pittsburgh's main offensive targets. He also makes plays on special teams. Brown has returned a punt and a kickoff for a touchdown in his career. Below are some highlights from what Brown has done as the team's punt returner this season:

- Recorded a 44-yard punt return to the Oakland 31-yard line in the fourth quarter of Week 8. It was the second longest punt return of his career. It was the 11th punt return of his career of 20 or more yards.
- Against Baltimore in Week 7, he returned a punt 18 yards to the Pittsburgh 40-yard line, setting up a drive that resulted in a Steelers' touchdown.
- In Week 2 at Cincinnati he returned a punt 40 yards to the Cincinnati 34-yard line, setting up an eventual field goal that gave the Steelers a 3-0 lead. Below are the five longest punt returns of his career:

PITTSBURGH – The Steelers lost their 2013 preseason opener to the New York Giants.

The Giants forced the Steelers to punt on their first possession of the game. After a penalty forced Pittsburgh to punt again, **Drew Butler's** second punt attempt was blocked by DE Damontre Moore, and the Giants took over at the Steelers' five-yard line. The Steelers defense though did not allow a single yard and forced the Giants to settle for a field goal and a 3-0 lead.

Pittsburgh responded on its ensuing drive by controlling the football for more than six minutes. On the drive, **RB LaRod Stephens-Howling** totaled 36 rushing yards and picked up two key first downs. **K Shaun Suisham** ended the drive with a 34-yard field goal to tie the game 3-3.

New York took a 10-3 lead on their next possession when QB Eli Manning found WR Victor Cruz for a 57-yard touchdown. Early in the second quarter, rookie **LB Jarvis Jones** recovered a fumble at the Giants 44-yard line. On the ensuing drive, the Steelers cut the lead 10-6 with another Suisham field goal, this time from 41 yards out. And as the clock expired at halftime, Brown connected on a 30-yard field goal to give the Giants a 13-6 lead going into the break.

Early in the third quarter, **QB Landry Jones** and **RB Baron Batch** collided, which resulted in a fumble. Jones recovered the football but was tackled in the end zone for a safety and the Giants took a 15-6 lead.

The Steelers defense came up big early in the fourth quarter when the Giants fumbled the football on their own 16-yard line. The ball was recovered in the end zone by **LB Adrian Robinson** to cut the Giants' lead 15-13. But Brown added a 47-yard field goal late in the fourth quarter to seal the win for the Giants.

On the Steelers second drive of the game, **QB Ben Roethlisberger** was picked off by LB Ryan Kerrigan, and he returned it 22 yards for a touchdown to give the Redskins a 7-0 lead. Early in the second quarter, the Steelers cut the lead to 7-3 on **K Shaun Suisham's** 28-yard field goal.

Midway through the second quarter, Kerrigan sacked and stripped **QB Bruce Gradkowski** and Washington recovered the football on Pittsburgh's 16-yard line. On the very next play, rookie **LB Jarvis Jones** stripped QB Rex Grossman and **CB Ike Taylor** recovered the fumble. On the Steelers ensuing drive, **RB Jonathan Dwyer** fumbled and the Redskins took over near midfield.

On Washington's next drive, Grossman found WR Leonard Hankerson for a 10-yard touchdown to extend the Redskins lead to 14-3. With one minute left in the half, Suisham connected on a 30-yard field goal to cut the lead to 14-6. But as the halftime whistle sounded, K Kai Forbath's 38-yard field goal gave Washington a 17-6 lead going into the half.

On Pittsburgh's first possession of the game, **QB Ben Roethlisberger** found **WR Antonio Brown** for a 49-yard completion. Later in the drive, **K Shaun Suisham** connected on a 28-yard field goal to give the Steelers a 3-0 lead.

Pittsburgh went up 10-0 on its next drive when Roethlisberger connected with **RB Jonathan Dwyer** for a 13-yard touchdown. Roethlisberger finished with a game-high 166 passing yards.

Midway through the second quarter, Suisham's 52-yard field goal attempt was blocked by Kansas City. On the Chiefs' ensuing drive, K Ryan Succop made a 19-yard field goal to cut the lead 10-3. And with 21 seconds left in the half, QB Alex Smith found WR Junior Hemingway for a five-yard touchdown to tie the game 10-10 at halftime.

Late in the third quarter, **QB Bruce Gradkowski** found rookie **WR Markus Wheaton** for a 34-yard touchdown to give the Steelers a 17-10 lead. But on the very next play, RB Knile Davis returned a kickoff 109 yards for a touchdown to tie the game.

Tennessee 16, Pittsburgh 9

PITTSBURGH – The Steelers lost their 2013 home opener to the Tennessee Titans, 16-9. It marked the Steelers first home-opening loss since the 2002 season.

On the opening kickoff, Titans RB Darius Reynaud fielded the ball just outside the goal line, and then took a knee into the end zone for a safety. It marked the first time that there was a safety on the opening kickoff since September 18, 1988 (New York Giants vs. Dallas Cowboys).

Midway through the second quarter, **QB Ben Roethlisberger's** pass to **WR Emmanuel Sanders** was picked off by CB Alterraun Verner. Tennessee then went 49 yards on 12 plays on a drive that took up almost seven minutes of clock time. RB Jackie Battle scored on a three-yard run to cap off the drive to give the Titans a 7-2 lead.

Late in the third quarter, K Rob Bironas connected on a 26-yard field goal to give the Titans a 10-2 lead. Bironas made a 44-yard field goal midway through the fourth quarter to extend Tennessee's lead, 13-2. And with less than four minutes remaining in the game, Bironas connected on a 27-yard field goal to give the Titans a 16-2 lead.

Late in the game, Roethlisberger led the team on a nine-play, 75-yard drive that was capped off with a four-yard touchdown pass to **WR Jericho Cotchery**. On the drive, Roethlisberger surpassed 30,000 passing yards to become just the 35th quarterback in NFL history to throw for at least 30,000 yards.

Despite the loss, the Steelers' defense held its opponent to less than 17 points for the ninth-consecutive home opener. Dating back to last season, this marked the seventh game in a row where the Steelers' defense did not allow a single touchdown in the first quarter of a game.

CINCINNATI – The Steelers lost their AFC North opener, 20-10, to the Cincinnati Bengals at Paul Brown Stadium.

Pittsburgh scored on their second drive of the game, thanks in large part to **WR Antonio Brown's** 40-yard punt return, which set the Steelers up in Bengals' territory. **K Shaun Suisham** connected on a 44-yard field goal to give Pittsburgh a 3-0 lead.

Midway through the first quarter, the Steelers marched into Bengals' territory. **QB Ben Roethlisberger** found **TE David Paulson** for a 34-yard completion but Paulson fumbled the football before he was down. Cincinnati then took over and QB Andy Dalton led the team on a five-play, 87-yard drive that was capped off by **RB Giovani Bernard's** seven-yard touchdown run.

Early in the second quarter, Cincinnati extended their lead, 10-3, on K Mike Nugent's 41-yard field goal. Later in the quarter, **WR Emmanuel Sanders** had a 43-yard reception that went to the Bengals' one-yard line. On the very next play, Roethlisberger found **WR Derek Moyer** for a one-yard score. It marked Moyer's first career reception. The teams went into halftime tied 10-10.

Early in the third quarter, Dalton connected with Bernard on a 27-yard touchdown to give the Bengals a 17-10 lead. Dalton finished with a game-high 280 passing yards. Early in the fourth quarter, Nugent connected on a 25-yard field goal to give Cincinnati the decisive 20-10 victory.

For the 16th straight game (including postseason), Roethlisberger has thrown at least one touchdown pass, which is a career-best.

PITTSBURGH – The Steelers could not overcome a 21-point first-half deficit and lost to the Chicago Bears, 40-23, at Heinz Field.

Chicago raced out to a 17-0 lead by the end of the first quarter. K Robbie Gould connected on a 47-yarder on the Bears' opening drive of the game. On the Steelers' first possession, **QB Ben Roethlisberger** was sacked and stripped by LB D.J. Williams and the Bears took over at the Steelers' 17-yard line. Four plays later, RB Matt Forte scored on a five-yard run to increase Chicago's lead, 10-0. After forcing Pittsburgh to punt, Forte had a 55-yard run to the Steelers' five-yard line. Pittsburgh cut the lead to 14 heading into the half after Roethlisberger found **WR Antonio Brown** for a 33-yard touchdown midway through the second quarter.

Gould connected on a 32-yard field goal early in the third quarter to increase the Bears' lead 27-10. The Steelers then scored 13 unanswered points. Suisham connected on a 36-yard field goal midway through the third quarter, and Brown recorded his second receiving touchdown on the night, a 21-yarder, to pull the team within a touchdown, 27-20.

Early in the fourth quarter, Suisham nailed a 44-yarder to cut the lead 27-23. But it would be the closest the Steelers would get. Cutler found WR Earl Bennett for a 17-yard touchdown to give the Bears a 34-23 lead. And with less than four minutes in the game, DE Julius Peppers caught a Roethlisberger fumble and returned it 42 yards for a score to give Chicago the decisive 40-23 victory.

EAST RUTHERFORD, N.J. – The Steelers beat the New York Jets, 19-6, at MetLife Stadium for the franchise's 600th win. The Steelers became just the fourth team in NFL history, and first AFC team to accomplish that milestone.

K Nick Folk gave the Jets a 3-0 lead late in the first quarter when he connected on a 25-yard field goal. Pittsburgh though would score on its next three possessions with help from **K Shaun Suisham**. Suisham nailed a 46-yarder, a 33-yarder and then a 48-yarder with less than a minute remaining in the half to give the Steelers a 9-3 lead. Folk responded with his 39-yarder with two seconds left in the second quarter. The Steelers went into halftime with a 9-6 lead.

On Pittsburgh's first drive of the second half, the team faced a third-and-one on at its 45-yard line. **QB Ben Roethlisberger's** play action fake froze the Jets' defense, and **WR Emmanuel Sanders** was wide open in the middle of the field. Sanders hauled in a 55-yard touchdown, his longest career reception, and the Steelers extended their lead to 16-6.

New York drove to the Steelers' 23-yard line on their ensuing possession, but **QB Geno Smith's** throw was intercepted by **S Ryan Clark**. It marked Clark's 14th career interception. Suisham connected on his fourth field goal of the game, this one from 32 yards out to give the Steelers the decisive 19-6 win. The Jets drove into Steelers' territory late in the game, but Smith was intercepted near the goal line by **LB Lawrence Timmons**.

The Steelers' defense recorded season highs in sacks (3) and takeaways (2). The defense also held the Jets to 3-of-11 (27%) on third-down conversions.

Pittsburgh scored first midway through the first quarter. **QB Ben Roethlisberger** led the team on a 10-play, 60-yard drive that was capped off by a three-yard shovel pass to **TE Heath Miller**. The touchdown was the 40th in Miller's career, as he became just the fifth player in team history to record at least 40 receiving touchdowns.

Baltimore's K Justin Tucker made a 46-yard field goal near the end of the first quarter to cut the lead, 7-3. Suisham connected on his first field goal of the game, a 34-yarder, early in the second quarter to increase Pittsburgh's lead, 10-3. Right before halftime, Tucker connected from 38 yards out, and the Steelers went into halftime with a 10-6 lead.

The only points in the third quarter came from Suisham, as he made a 28-yard field goal late in the period to increase the Steelers lead, 13-6. Both teams exchanged field goals, as Tucker made a 32-yarder early in the fourth quarter and then Suisham followed it up with a 38-yarder.

With Pittsburgh leading 16-9, the Ravens started at their own 27-yard line. QB Joe Flacco led the team on a 16-play, 73-yard drive that took up eight minutes of clock time. Flacco found TE Dallas Clark for a one-yard score to tie the game, 16-16.

But Roethlisberger had more than enough time to lead his team down the field. Roethlisberger led the group 39 yards to set up Suisham's game-winning kick. It marked the 28th time during the regular season that Roethlisberger led the team to victory when facing a fourth-quarter deficit or tie.

OAKLAND – The Steelers could not erase an 18-point first-half deficit and lost to the Oakland Raiders, 21-18, at the O.co Coliseum.

On the Raiders first play of the game, QB Terrelle Pryor faked a handoff to RB Darren McFadden, and then ran 93 yards for a touchdown to give Oakland an early 7-0 lead. **P Zoltan Mesko's** attempt was blocked midway through the first quarter, which set Oakland up at the Steelers' 26-yard line. Five plays later, McFadden scored on a seven-yard run to give the Raiders a 14-0 lead.

Late in the first quarter, **S Troy Polamalu** picked off Pryor and returned it to the Raiders' 48-yard line. **K Shaun Suisham** capped off the ensuing drive with a 47-yard field goal to cut the lead, 14-3. The Raiders scored their final points of the game after the two-minute warning when McFadden scored on a four-yard run to give the Raiders a 21-3 lead at halftime.

Neither team scored in the third quarter. Early in the fourth quarter, **DE Brett Keisel** recovered an Oakland fumble that was forced by **LB Lawrence Timmons**, and three plays later **QB Ben Roethlisberger** found **WR Emmanuel Sanders** for a nine-yard touchdown to cut the lead, 21-10.

With 1:27 left in the game, **RB Le'Veon Bell** scored on a two-yard run, and Sanders scored on a two-point conversion to cut the lead, 21-18. The Steelers attempted an onside kick but it was recovered by the Raiders.

Despite the loss, the Steelers defense forced a season-high three turnovers and held their opponents to a season-low 82 net passing yards.
