Cleveland Browns (4-8) at New England Patriots (9-3)

NOTABLE STORYLINES

- The Browns travel to New England to face the Patriots. The Browns own a 12-9 advantage in the regular-season series, including a 34-14 victory on Nov. 7, 2010, the last time the teams squared off.
- WR **Josh Gordon** broke his own Browns record with 261 receiving yards on 10 receptions (26.1 avg.) with two touchdowns vs. Jacksonville. He set the previous record the week before after totaling 237 yards vs. Pittsburgh. Gordon is the only player in NFL history to top 200 receiving yards in back-to-back games. He has totaled 498 receiving yards in the last two games and 623 in the last three. Both figures are NFL records, according to Elias Sports Bureau.
- Gordon has a team-leading 1,249 receiving yards, the secondmost by a Brown in a season, and needs 41 yards to pass WR **Braylon Edwards** (1,289 in 2007) for the team record. Gordon is averaging 124.9 receiving yards per game, the most in the NFL. His 1,249 receiving yards are second in the league, despite playing in just 10 games. Gordon's average of 19.5 yards per catch this season leads the NFL, and his average of 18.0 per grab since his rookie 2012 campaign is also first.
- According to STATS LLC, DBs **Joe Haden** and **Buster Skrine** are tied for the league lead with 17 passed defensed (Browns film has credited Skrine with 22 and Haden with 18). Haden leads the team with four interceptions, all of which have come in the past four games.
- The Browns rank fourth in the league in total defense (306.8 yards), after finishing 23rd last season. Cleveland is fifth in the league in passing defense (207.8 yards), after finishing 25th last year. The Browns are fifth in rush defense (98.9) this season after allowing 118.7 yards per game a year ago, finishing 19th in the NFL. The Browns are the only team in the league to rank in the top five in rush defense, pass defense and total defense. The Browns are also the only team to have not allowed a 100-yard rusher or a 300-yard passer in a game this season.
- Offensive linemen **Joe Thomas** (108), **Alex Mack** (76), **Mitchell Schwartz** (28) and **John Greco** (22) have started the past 22 games together for the Browns. The four have not missed an offensive snap this season.

Coaching capsules:

Cleveland -- Rob Chudzinski: 4-8, first season as head coach. Chudzinski was named the 14th full-time head coach in Browns history on Jan. 10, 2013. He came to the team after spending the past two seasons (2011-12) as the offensive coordinator for the Carolina Panthers. Overall, Chudzinski's résumé includes 19 years of experience, including nine seasons in the NFL. Chudzinski rejoined the Browns organization, where he spent the 2004 season as tight ends coach and 2007-08 as offensive coordinator. In 2007, Chudzinski guided Cleveland's offense to 402 points and 5,621 vards, the highest totals for the team since the club returned in 1999, and third-best in franchise history.

New England -- Bill Belichick: 214-112, 19th season as head coach (14th season with New England).

Belichick, whose first NFL head coaching job was with Cleveland from 1991-95, owns 214 career wins, the fifth-most in NFL history, and is the only head coach to win three Super Bowl championships in a four-year span. Belichick, the eighth full-time head coach in Browns history, posted a 36-44 (.450) record in Cleveland and led the team to an 11-5 mark in 1994, reaching the AFC Divisional playoffs. From 2003-12, he guided the Patriots to more wins (126) over a 10-year span than any other head coach in league annals. The three-time Associated Press Coach of the Year (2003, 2007 and 2010) is the longest-tenured coach among active NFL head coaches and is the only head coach in NFL history to win at least 13 regular-season games in five seasons.

ON DECK

The Browns close out the home portion of the 2013 schedule when they host the Bears on Dec. 15. The Browns are 9-5 all-time against the Bears, including a 7-1 mark at home. Chicago hasn't won in Cleveland since a 27-21 victory at Municipal Stadium on Nov. 3, 1980.



NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

- Patriots coach **Bill Belichick** compiled a 36-44 (.450) record as head coach of the Browns from 1991-95. He led the Browns to the playoffs in 1994.
- Patriots linebackers coach **Thomas "Pepper" Johnson** played LB for the Browns from 1993-95. He amassed 5.5 quarterback sacks and two interceptions during his time in Cleveland. Johnson also played college football at Ohio State.
- New England offensive coordinator **Josh McDaniels** grew up in Barberton, Ohio, and played football at Canton McKinley High School before playing at John Carroll University.
- New England special teams coach **Scott O'Brien** held the same position with the Browns from 1991-95, when the team led the NFL in special-teams scores (eight) and special-teams scores allowed (zero).
- Patriots RB **Brandon Bolden's** grandfather, **Frank Pitts**, played wide receiver for the Browns from 1971-73.
- Patriots RB **James Develin** (Dublin), DB **Nate Ebner** (Dublin), and OL **Josh Kline** (Mason) are Ohio natives.
- Ebner (Ohio State), Kline (Kent State University), WR **Kenbrell Thompkins** (Cincinnati) and WR **Julian Edelman** (Kent State) went to college in Ohio.
- New England OL **Braxston Cave** was signed by the Browns as an undrafted free agent, and spent training camp with the team in 2013.
- Browns defensive line coach **Joe Cullen** played nose guard for the University of Massachusetts (1986-89), and later coached with the team (1990-91).
- DL **Desmond Bryant** went to college at Harvard University in Cambridge, Mass.
- Patriots cornerback coach **Josh Boyer** is a native of Heath, Ohio, and graduated from Muskingum College. He has served as a graduate assistant at the University of Dayton (2001) and Kent State (2002-03).

WHAT TO LOOK FOR THIS WEEK

TE Jordan Cameron

- Needs nine catches to pass Kellen Winslow (71 in 2006) for the second-most receptions by a Brown in the first 13 games of a season. Needs 12 receptions to pass Ozzie Newsome (74 in 1984) for the most. Cameron currently has 63 receptions through the team's first 12 games.
- Needs one receiving touchdown to take sole possession of the second-most by a Browns tight end. Cameron currently has six. Ozzie Newsome had six in 1981 and 1983, and nine in 1979.

WR Josh Gordon

- Could become the only Browns player to record four straight 100-yard receiving games.
- Needs 41 receiving yards to pass Braylon Edwards (1,289 in 2007) for the franchise's single-season record. Gordon currently has 1,249 yards, second-most in team history.
- Needs 124 receiving yards to pass Calvin Johnson (746 in 2013) for the most by an NFL player in a four-game span. Gordon currently has 623 in his past three games.
- Needs eight catches to pass Kellen Winslow (71 in 2006) for the second-most receptions by a Brown in the first 13 games of a season. Needs 11 receptions to pass Ozzie Newsome (74 in 1984) for the most. Gordon currently has 64 receptions through the team's first 12 games.
- Could join Charley Hennigan (Houston Oilers, 1961) as the only players in NFL-AFL history to record three 200-plus yard receiving games in a season.
- Could become the first Browns player to record back-to-back games with two-or-more receiving touchdowns since Braylon Edwards in 2007.

OL Alex Mack

• Has started all 76 career games and has not missed an offensive snap since joining the Browns as the 21st overall selection of the 2009 draft, 4,744 straight plays.

LB Barkevious Mingo

• Needs 1.5 sacks to tie LB Chip Banks (5.5 in 1982) for the fourth-most sacks by a Browns rookie. Needs 2.0 to tie DT Michael Dean Perry (6.0 in in 1988) for the third-most. Mingo currently has 4.0 sacks. Sacks became an official NFL stat in 1982.

RB Chris Ogbonnava

• Needs one receiving touchdown to become the first Browns running back with three in season since Terry Kirby in 1999.

OL Joe Thomas

• Has started all 108 career games and has not missed an offensive snap since joining the Browns as the third overall selection of the 2007 draft. His consecutive snaps streak of 6,669 is the longest active stretch in the league.

DB T.J. Ward

• Needs an interception to surpass his single-season career high of two set in 2010.

The Browns used a powerful running game to control the clock and earn a 34-14 win over the New England Patriots. After the Browns kicked a field goal on their opening drive, the ensuing kickoff was muffed and recovered by DB Ray Ventrone at the New England 19-yard line. Two plays later, the Browns extended their lead to 10-0 after RB Peyton Hillis punched in a touchdown run from 2-yards. The Patriots cut into the lead midway through the second quarter after QB Tom Brady found TE Aaron Hernandez for a 2-yard score. The Browns responded on their next possession by driving 60 yards, ending it with a trick play where WR Chansi Stuckey took a handoff from WR Joshua Cribbs 11-yards for a touchdown. The score stayed 17-7 at halftime after Cleveland was able to force a crucial fumble deep in their own territory when DB Abram Elam stripped Patriots TE Rob Gronkowski of the ball on the Browns 2-yard line. Cleveland made the only score of the third quarter after QB Colt McCoy scurried 16 yards for a touchdown, the first rushing score of his career, to cap off a 10 play, 72-yard drive, extending Cleveland's advantage 24-10. After Dawson tacked on another field goal, New England responded with another Brady-to-Hernandez connection, this time from 1-yard, to make the score 27-14. The Browns were able to put the game out of reach with a six-play 60 yard drive, all hand offs to Hillis which ended when he scampered into the end zone from 35 yards out for his second touchdown of the afternoon. Hillis finished with a career-high 184 yards.

#12 6-3 225 2nd season WR Josh Gordon Leading the team with 64 receptions, 1,249 yards and seven TDs in 10 games... Became the first player in NFL history to record back-to-back games with 200-plus receiving yards... Acquired by Cleveland with a second-round selection in the 2012 NFL Supplemental Draft.

LT Joe Thomas #73 6-6 312 7th season Six-time Pro Bowler who has started at left tackle in all 108 career contests... Has not missed an offensive snap since being selected as the No. 3 overall pick in the 2007 draft... His six Pro Bowl selections trail only Jim Brown (9) and Lou Groza (9) for the most by a Browns player.

#77 **6-4** Started the past 22 games at LG... Traded to Cleveland prior to the start of the 2011 season... Originally drafted by St. Louis in the third round of the 2008 draft.

C Alex Mack #55 6-4 311 5th season Started all 76 career games and has not missed an offensive snap... Pro Bowl selection in 2010... Joined the Browns as the 21st overall selection in the 2009 draft.

#66 6-3 315 3rd season Started the past eight games after missing the first four with an ankle injury... A third-round draft choice in 2010.

RT Mitchell Schwartz #72 6-5 Started all 28 career games and has not missed an offensive snap... Second-round draft choice (37th overall).

TE Jordan Cameron #84 6-5 245 3rd season Among the NFL TE leaders in receptions (63), yards (704) and TDs (6)... Tied a team record with three TD catches at Minnesota (9/22)... Drafted by Cleveland in the fourth round of the 2011 draft... Converted college basketball player who played on USC's football and basketball teams.

WR Davone Bess #15 5-10 195 6th season 40 receptions for 343 yards and two TDs... Registered at least 50 receptions in all five of his previous NFL seasons... Joined the Browns in a draft-day trade with Miami this season.

OB Jason Campbell 9th Season Missed last week with a concussion... Became the first Browns quarterback to register a 100-plus rating in his first two starts with the team during the Super Bowl era (1966-2013)... Owns a 32-43 career record as a starter... Spent five years with Washington, three with Oakland and last season with Chicago.

The Browns are fifth in rush defense (98.9) this season after allowing 118.7 yards per game a year ago, finishing 19th in the NFL. The Browns are the only team in the league to rank in the top five in rush defense, pass defense and total defense. The Browns are the only team to have not allowed a 100-yard rusher or a 300-yard passer in a game this season. Cleveland and Tennessee are the only teams to have not allowed a 300-yard passer and the Browns are one of five teams (Denver, N.Y. Jets, Detroit and San Francisco) to have not allowed a 100-yard rusher.

STADIUM RENOVATIONS ON TAP

On Nov. 13, the Browns announced that they have initiated and developed a two-year FirstEnergy Stadium renovation project, proposed for completion during the next two offseasons. On Nov. 25, Cleveland City Council approved financing for the project, including a \$120 million investment up front from the Browns.

"We have consistently communicated that two of our primary areas of focus are winning as many games as possible and creating the best fan experience in the NFL," said Browns Owner Jimmy Haslam. "We have engaged our fans, asked for their thoughts, and responded to their ideas and concerns. This modernization plan is a result of our desire to invest in creating the best environment for them and our players."

During the first year of the renovation, the Browns will install two new video boards nearly triple the size of the boards currently in each end zone, moving them closer to the fans. Throughout the stadium, the plan also calls for LED video boards, which would feature stats, scores and information, and installation of an entirely new audio system, delivering crisper, clearer audio everywhere in the facility.

In 2014, the project will also increase the lower bowl's seating capacity while improving sightlines. Many Browns fans would be closer to the field and observe dramatically better views of the game, fostering a more intimate environment while enhancing the team's home-field advantage.

Easing in-stadium access for fans is another priority in the plan's initial stage. Two new escalators will be installed in both the north and south end zones to ensure the most fluid, convenient movement in and between stadium levels. At the end of the project, there will be 12 escalators providing access to stadium levels.

"The Browns are proud and excited to reward their fans, their team, and Northeast Ohio with this two-year modernization proposal," conveyed Browns CEO Joe Banner. "The Browns and the City of Cleveland have created a very positive working relationship on the design concepts of FirstEnergy Stadium, and we will continue to work together to establish a productive agreement."

In 2015, the Browns are hoping to improve general-admission concession areas, boasting revamped and unique locally based offerings. Additionally, the second phase will modernize premium areas, including upgrading club seats and suites, while adding more top-level entertainment areas, and creating new hospitality and fan-engagement opportunities.

Also during the project's second phase, new dramatic graphics honoring the Browns' illustrious history and current players will be fashioned throughout the stadium and its concourses to improve the facility's aesthetics. Plus, there will be a continued emphasis on offering the most up-to-date technology, with a heightened fo-

cus on providing reliable connectivity on all fan devices, and creative ways to use those devices in the stadium.

The Browns completed the process of reviewing the proposal with Mayor Jackson, City Council, the Design Review Advisory Committee and the City Planning Commission in November.

After analyzing fan feedback, the Browns enhanced multiple elements of the gameday experience at FirstEnergy Stadium prior to the 2013 season, focusing on stadium ingress, in-stadium cellphone service, in-stadium team stores, and guest expectations, as well as incorporating new features and traditions before and throughout home contests.

The Browns also completed a \$5 million, four-month renovation project to vastly improve the team's Berea training facility and administrative complex this past offseason. Revamping 37,000 square feet of the 90,000-square-foot building, the team incorporated first-class upgrades and a modernized layout to heighten teamwork, both within and across departments, to best foster productivity with an interactive, innovative mindset through its commitment to acquiring and retaining top talent on and off the field.





TEAM ADDS TOP COORDINATORS

Head Coach **Rob Chudzinski** hired **Norv Turner** as offensive coordinator and **Ray Horton** as defensive coordinator and retained **Chris Tabor** as special teams coordinator.

Turner, who also works with the club's quarterbacks, most recently spent six seasons (2007-12) as the head coach of the San Diego Chargers. Under Turner's tutelage, quarterback Philip Rivers became just the fifth player in league history to pass for more than 4,500 yards in consecutive seasons (2010-11). In total, Turner has spent 15 seasons as an NFL head coach and won 114 regular-season games. He served as head coach of the Washington Redskins (1994-2000) and Oakland Raiders (2004-05), in addition to stints as offensive coordinator in San Francisco (2006), Miami (2002-03), San Diego (2001) and Dallas (1991-93). Turner's offensive system has produced the NFL's leading rusher five times with three players in Emmitt Smith (1991-93), Ricky Williams (2002) and LaDainian Tomlinson (2007).

Horton's résumé includes 19 years of experience coaching in the NFL, following a 10-year playing career as a defensive back. He spent the past two seasons (2011-12) with the Arizona Cardinals as defensive coordinator. In 2012, Horton guided a defensive unit that ranked in the top-five in the NFL in several categories, including interceptions, takeaways, first downs allowed, third-down efficiency and passing yards. Prior to his time in Arizona, Horton spent seven seasons (2004-10) as the defensive backs/assistant defensive backs coach with the Pittsburgh Steelers. Horton was pivotal in the development of Steelers safety Troy Polamalu, as he was selected to six consecutive Pro Bowls (2005-10), named first team All-Pro three times (2005, 2008, 2010) and was voted as the 2010 AP Defensive Player of the Year. Horton began his coaching career with Washington (1994-96) and has made stops as a defensive backs coach with Cincinnati (1997-2001) and Detroit (2002-03).

Tabor, who joined the Browns in 2011, has 20 years of coaching experience between the high school, collegiate and professional levels. In 2012, he helped guide kicker **Phil Dawson** and kick returner **Joshua Cribbs** to Pro Bowl selections. In addition, **Johnson Bademosi** led all rookies and finished tied for third in the NFL with 18 special-teams tackles en route to being named the PFW/PFWA All-Rookie special teams player. As a team Cleveland ranks second in the NFL in punt return average (13.0) and tied for second in the league in total return yards (3,432) since Tabor's arrival in 2011. Prior to joining the Browns, Tabor spent three seasons (2008-10) as assistant special teams coach with Chicago. While with the Bears, Tabor helped shape some of the NFL's top return specialists in Danieal Manning, Johnny Knox and Devin Hester.

NEW BUSINESS LEADERSHIP

There aren't just new faces on the sidelines for the Browns this season, there are also plenty of new faces on the business side of the organization. Owner **Jimmy Haslam** and CEO **Joe Banner's** first hire on the business side was **Alec Scheiner**, brought in as team President. Scheiner, who spent the previous eight years with the Dallas Cowboys, oversees all business functions of the club including revenue generation, stadium operations, finance, legal, information technology, and fan engagement. Scheiner also helps lead football analytics for the club and has various other involvement with team operations.

The team also added **Brent Stehlik** as executive vice president/chief revenue officer. Prior to joining the Browns, Stehlik, a native of Lakewood, Ohio, was senior vice president of business operations for the San Diego Padres from 2010-12. In 2013, he was named a recipient of the *Sports Business Journal's* "Forty Under 40" Award.

The club also added **Kevin Griffin** as vice president of fan experience and marketing. Griffin joined the club after working with the Seattle Seahawks and Seattle Sounders FC (MLS) since 2004.

In addition, **Sashi Brown** was named the club's executive vice president, general counsel. He comes to the club after spending the previous eight seasons (2005-12) with the Jacksonville Jaguars.

FACILITY GETS A FACELIFT

The Cleveland Browns training and administrative complex is located in Berea, Ohio, and during the 2013 offseason, the facility's second floor underwent a \$5 million, 37,000 square-foot renovation. The new space boosts an open floor plan and was designed to create a vibrant, energetic and collaborative space for the club's football and business operations. The new space also houses a state-of-the-art media studio for radio and television production.

BROWNS OVERSEAS

Browns players have participated in the NFL-USO All-Star Tour in recent years, illustrating a team and personal commitment to extend military appreciation. **D'Qwell Jackson** (March, 2013), **Alex Mack** (2012) and **Joe Thomas** (2010) each participated in week-long visits to U.S. troops at military bases throughout the Middle East. In addition, former Brown **Eric Metcalf** (1989-94) participated in the USO Alumni Tour in July 2013. The NFL and USO have organized overseas morale-building visits for more than 45 years.

Following his trip overseas, Thomas supported a national USO campaign to raise additional funds in support of our troops, lending his name to the nationwide effort. In addition, Thomas, who was an NFL Finalist for the 2013 NFL Walter Payton Man of the Year award, founded the "Thomas' Troops" season-ticket program, which hosts men and women who serve our country every home game. These special guests from the USO of Northern Ohio are provided tickets, apparel and food.



GORDON SETS NFL RECORDS

WR **Josh Gordon** is the only player in NFL history to top 200 receiving yards in back-to-back games. He has totaled 498 receiving yards in the last two games and 623 in the last three. Both figures are NFL records, according to Elias Sports Bureau. Gordon is also one of eight players to record two 200-plus receiving-yard games in the same season.

THE D'QWELL DIFFERENCE

He has responded to the challenge by virtually shutting down the opposition each game. Haden has matched up against a Pro Bowl receiver six times - who have combined for nine Pro Bowl appearances - and has limited them to a combined total of 17 receptions, 147 yards and zero touchdowns. In total, the opposing team's top receivers have combined for 48 receptions for 528 yards and three touchdowns. Haden has limited them to an average of 4.0 receptions, 44.0 yards and 0.25 touchdowns. Against the rest of the NFL this season, those receivers are averaging 5.3 receptions, 78.8 yards and 0.46 touchdowns.

BROWNS HONOR McCORMACK

The Browns are honoring the late **Mike McCormack**, who passed away Nov. 15 at the age of 83, by wearing a helmet decal with his initials for the remainder of the season. McCormack played offensive tackle for the Browns from 1954-62 and was enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1984.

McCormack helped the Browns to three NFL championship games, including capturing the title in 1954 and 1955. He helped pave the way for the Browns to lead the league in rushing yards in 1958 and 1959.

As a rookie, he played for the New York Yanks in 1951 and was traded to the Browns while serving a two-year stint (1952-53) in the U.S. Army. During his time with the Browns, McCormack blocked for Pro Football Hall of Famers Otto Graham, Jim Brown and Bobby Mitchell.

McCormack was selected to six Pro Bowls (one with the Yanks and five with the Browns) and was an inaugural member of the Cleveland Browns Ring of Honor.

Following his playing career, he served as a coach and executive in the NFL. He was the head coach for the Philadelphia Eagles (1973-75), Baltimore Colts (1980-81) and Seattle Seahawks (1982) before serving as Seahawks president and general manager until 1988. McCormack also served as the Carolina Panthers' first president and was the first inductee into the Panthers Hall of Honor.





NO ORDINARY JOE

Browns spread holiday goodwill, celebrate Browns 'ceREAL' School Food Drive top school

The Browns and Browns players celebrated with Menlo Park Academy, the top-performing school in the inaugural Browns "ce-REAL" Food Drive, benefitting Cleveland Foodbank, during an exclusive tour of FirstEnergy Stadium. Browns players thanked students for their goodwill and shared the value of giving back leading into the Thanksgiving holiday. In its first year, the Browns 'ceREAL" Food Drive engaged schools in the six counties served by the Cleveland Foodbank in a two-week competition (Nov. 3-15) to collect cereal and monetary donations that benefitted hungry Northeast Ohio families. Part of the Browns PLAY 60 program, the food drive focused on cereal donations and allowed students to make a "real" difference in the community while emphasizing the importance of eating a healthy breakfast each day. In addition to the Browns 'ceREAL' Food Drive, the Browns and Browns players hosted the annual Browns Gameday Food Drive at FirstEnergy Stadium prior to Cleveland's 24-18 victory against the Baltimore Ravens (Nov. 3). The two initiatives helped provide nearly 37,000 meals through the Cleveland Foodbank. Browns players also joined the team's efforts to purchase turkeys for families in need for Thanksgiving. This year, the club has purchased more than 1,000 turkeys for Cleveland families. Additional player initiatives also occurred during Thanksgiving week.





HEAD COACH ROB CHUDZINSKI



Rob Chudzinski was named the 14th full-time head coach in Browns history on Jan. 10, 2013. Chudzinski comes to the team after spending the past two seasons (2011-12) as the offensive coordinator for the Carolina Panthers. Overall, Chudzinski's résumé includes 19 years of experience, including nine seasons in the NFL. Chudzinski re-joins the Browns organization, where he spent the 2004 season as tight ends coach and 2007-08 as offensive coordinator.

With the Panthers, the team went from two wins in the year before Chudzinski's arrival to winning six in 2011 and seven in 2012, including victories in the final four games of 2012. In 2011, the team set club records for total yards (6,237) and first downs (345), one year after experiencing franchise lows in both categories. Carolina also scored 48 touchdowns after recording 17 the year prior to Chudzinski's arrival. The Panthers also moved from last in total vardage to seventh, marking the biggest improvement in the league since the St. Louis Rams went from 27th in 1998 to first in 1999. In 2011, Chudzinski tutored Cam Newton, who became the first rookie in NFL history to throw for 4,000 yards, while setting an NFL record for rushing touchdowns by a quarterback with 14 en route to being named the 2011 Associated Press Offensive Rookie of the Year. The Panthers also became the first team in league history with three 700-vard rushers in DeAngelo Williams (836), Jonathan Stewart (761) and Newton (706). Wide receiver Steve Smith eclipsed 1,000 yards receiving both seasons under Chudzinski.

Chudzinski had two stints with the San Diego Chargers, where he served as the assistant head coach/tight ends coach from 2009-10 and tight ends coach from 2005-06. As assistant head coach under current Browns offensive coordinator Norv Turner, Chudzinski was intricately involved in team operations and many gameday elements, in addition to his coaching duties. Over this two-year period, San Diego posted a composite regular season record of 22-10, including one AFC West title. During Chudzinski's initial stint with the Chargers, he worked under former Browns Head Coach Marty Schottenheimer. As tight ends coach, Chudzinski tutored Antonio Gates, who was voted to the Pro Bowl in each of Chudzinski's four seasons with the team. Gates recorded 1,157 receiving yards in 2009 and 1,101 in 2005, marking the only times he has eclipsed the 1,000-yard plateau in his career. In four seasons working with Chudzinski, Gates averaged 72.3 receptions, 991.0 yards and 9.3 touchdowns per season, compared to an average of 58.8 receptions, 726.1 yards and 7.7 touchdowns in six seasons without Chudzinski.

In 2007, Chudzinski guided the Browns' offense as they scored 402 points and amassed 5,621 yards of total offense, as both figures ranked as third-best in franchise history. In 2007, the Browns ranked eighth in the NFL in total offense after finishing 31st in 2006. In addition, they racked up

42 offensive touchdowns in 2007 and tied for seventh in the league in this category, after finishing 30th with 22 the year before. Wide receiver Braylon Edwards set franchise records with 1,289 receiving yards and 16 touchdowns, tight end Kellen Winslow set a career-high with 1,109 receiving yards and running back Jamal Lewis finished fifth in the NFL with 1,304 rushing yards. The Browns won 10 games that year, which are the most victories by the team since 1994 (11).

Chudzinski began his pro coaching career in 2004 as the Browns' tight ends coach, where he worked with first-round draft choice, Kellen Winslow. During that season, Chudzinski was elevated to offensive coordinator for the final five games following Butch Davis' resignation as head coach.

From 1994-2003, Chudzinski coached at his alma mater, the University of Miami (Fla.). He spent two seasons (1994-95) as a graduate assistant, five (1996-2000) as tight ends coach and three (2001-03) as offensive coordinator. During his three seasons as offensive coordinator, the Hurricanes compiled a record of 35-3 and played in a BCS Bowl game each year, including two National Championship appearances. He helped shape future NFL Pro Bowlers Bubba Franks, Frank Gore, Andre Johnson, Willis McGahee, Bryant McKinnie, Clinton Portis, Jeremy Shockey and Kellen Winslow.

In 2001, the 'Canes went 12-0 and defeated Nebraska to win the national championship. In 2002, Miami's offense set school records for points (527), total yards (6,074) and rushing touchdowns (33), one year after establishing school records in those same categories. In 2002, they averaged 40.5 points per game, 284.2 passing yards per game and 183.0 rushing yards per contest. The Hurricanes went 12-1 in 2002, with their only defeat coming in overtime against Ohio State in the National Championship game. In 2003, Miami finished with an 11-2 record, including a 16-14 victory over Florida State in the Orange Bowl.

At Miami, Chudzinski tutored Kellen Winslow, who won the John Mackey Award in 2003 as the nation's top collegiate tight end, while he also helped to develop two other All-America tight ends in Bubba Franks (1999) and Jeremy Shockey (2001). All three players went on to be first-round NFL draft picks.

Chudzinski played tight end at Miami from 1986-90 and was a three-year starter and a member of two national championship teams (1987 and 1989). He graduated with a B.A. in business administration in 1990 and went on to earn his MBA in 1996. He is just the second University of Miami product to become an NFL head coach, joining Jim Dooley, who coached the Chicago Bears from 1968-71.

Chudzinski attended St. John's High School in Toledo, Ohio, where he grew up an avid Browns fan. He and his wife, Sheila, have two sons, Kaelan and Rian, and one daughter, Margaret.

The Browns held a 7-6 halftime advantage against the Dolphins, but Miami responded with two second-half touchdowns and one field goal to claim a 23-10 victory in the season opener at FirstEnergy Stadium. Defensively, Cleveland limited Miami to 20 rushing yards (23 attempts, 0.9 average) - tied for the second-fewest allowed in a game in franchise history - tallied four sacks and intercepted one pass that led to a first-half touchdown. The Browns did not surrender a first down on seven of the Dolphins' 13 drives (53.8 percent), and allowed only one first down on two additional series. Starting at right end in his Browns debut, DL Desmond Bryant tied a career highs with 2.0 sacks. The Browns offense registered more net yards (291-275) and first downs (20-18) than the Dolphins, led by TE Jordan Cameron, who posted career highs for catches (9) and receiving yards (108) and scored his second career touchdown. Cameron for catches (9) and receiving yards (108) and scored his second career touchdown. Cameron became the only Browns tight end to amass 100 receiving yards in a Browns season opener and the first Brown to accomplish the feat since 2005 (WR Frisman Jackson, 128, vs. Cin., 9/11). After a three-and-out on the Dolphins' first possession, Miami rookie K Caleb Sturgis converted a 45-yard and 49-yard field goal to establish a 6-0 lead with 13:37 to play in the second quarter. With 4:23 to play in the first half, Browns LB D'Qwell Jackson deflected a Dolphins QB Ryan Tannehill pass that DB Tashaun Gipson intercepted at the Cleveland 15-yard line and returned 29 yards. It marked Gipson's second career interception and his longest-career interception return. Browns QB Brandon Weeden responded with an 11-play, 56-yard drive, completing four of six passes for 25 yards, including a 7-yard TD pass to Cameron that gave Cleveland a 7-6 halftime edge. Weeden attempted a career-high 53 passes with 26 completions for 289 yards, one touchdown and three interceptions in the game. In the second half. Tanfor 289 yards, one touchdown and three interceptions in the game. In the second half, Tannehill completed a 34-yard touchdown pass to WR Brian Hartline to make it 13-7 with 6:46 to play in the third quarter. Tannehill completed 24 of 38 passes for 272 yards with one TD and one INT, while Hartline caught nine passes for a game-best 114 yards with one TD. Browns K Billy Cundiff answered with his first field goal (39 yards) of the season, but the Dolphins extended their lead to two scores, 20-10, on a 1-yard touchdown run by RB Daniel Thomas with 6:48 remaining. Sturgis capped the game's scoring with a 36-yard field goal with 1:34 to play in the game.

The Browns established a 6-0 halftime lead, becoming only the second NFL team in the past 28 seasons to shut out the defending Super Bowl champion in the first half of its home-opener, but surrendered two unanswered touchdowns in a 14-6 loss at Baltimore. Rookie LB Barkevious Mingo made his NFL debut and recorded a sack on his first career play. Baltimore drove 57 yards to open the game, but Ravens K Justin Tucker missed a 50-yard field-goal attempt. QB Brandon Weeden responded with a five-play, 57-yard drive, resulting in K Billy Cundiff's 21-yard field goal that gave the Browns a 3-0 lead with 8:40 to play in the first quarter. TE Jordan Cameron caught a career-long 53-yard pass from Weeden on the first play of the series. Weeden completed 21 of 33 passes (63.6 percent) for 227 yards for an 83.8 passer rating. The two teams exchanged punts for the rest of the first half until Tucker pushed his second fieldgoal attempt wide right, ending a six-play, 39-yard Ravens drive. Taking possession with: 31 to play in the half, Weeden completed three consecutive passes for 33 yards, placing Cundiff in range for a 51-yard field goal to give the Browns a 6-0 lead with: 02 left on the clock. Baltimore drove 80 yards on 12 plays during its first second-half possession, capitalizing on RB Bernard Pierce's 5-yard touchdown run to set the score at 7-6 with 5:13 to go in the second quarter. LB Craig Robertson notched his first career forced fumble (Ravens RB Ray Rice) in the third grapter, which LB D'Couell leaken respected at the Deltimore 45; however, the in the third quarter, which LB D'Qwell Jackson recovered at the Baltimore 45; however, the Browns turned the ball over on downs. QB Brian Hoyer placed a pass in the back-left corner of the end zone to TE Jordan Cameron with 0:51 left, providing Cleveland a 31-27 victory over the Vikings at Mall of America Field. It marked Browns Head Coach Rob Chudzinski's first career win as an NFL head coach. Hoyer registered career bests with 30 completions, 54 pass attempts (55.6 percent), 321 passing yards and three TDs in his Browns debut and second career start. Cameron tied a Browns single-game record with three touchdown receptions, including one from P Spencer Lanning (11 yards) on a second-quarter fake field goal. Vikings RB Adrian Peterson scored on a 2-yard run to cap an 80-yard scoring drive on the game's opening possession, but the Browns responded with a six-play, 68-yard series, capped by a 47-yard TD reception by WR Josh Gordon, his first of the season, to tie the game. Gordon recorded career-highs and game-bests with 10 receptions for 146 yards. The Browns defense limited Peterson to 88 yards on 25 carries (3.5 avg.), with his longest rush gaining only nine yards in the first quarter. Hoyer directed a 77-yard touchdown drive on his next opportunity, finding Cameron for his first TD of the game on a 19-yard pass. Following a second Vikings touchdown, Browns rookie DB Josh Aubrey rushed for 34 yards on a fake punt to set up K Billy Cundiff's 38-yard field goal. Two plays later, LB Craig Robertson tipped a pass that DB T.J. Ward intercepted to start the ensuing Browns drive in Vikings territory (38-yard line). Cleveland capitalized as Lanning found Cameron for a touchdown on a fake field goal, giving the Browns a 24-14 lead with 3:39 remaining in the half. The Browns produced two 90-yard touchdown drives (12 plays, 95 yards; 12 plays, 91 yards) and limited the Bengals to 266 offensive yards in a 17-6 win. QB Brian Hoyer won his second start as many games, making him the first Browns QB to win his first two starts with the club since Mark Rypien in 1994. TE Jordan Cameron posted a career-high 10 receptions for 91 yards with one TD, becoming the first Browns tight end with at least five touchdowns in a season since Kellen Winslow (2007). Defensively, the Browns contained the Bengals to 203 net passing yards and 64 rushing yards, the fourth consecutive game the unit did not allow an individual running back to reach 100 rushing yards, and held Cincinnati to a 29-percent thirddown conversion rate (4-14). The team finished +2 in turnover margin as the offense did not surrender the football, while DB Chris Owens forced and recovered a fumble and DB Buster Skrine notched his second career interception. Cleveland's second possession comprised 12 plays and 95 yards as Hoyer was perfect on five pass attempts for 56 yards, including a 2-yard TD pass to Cameron that gave the Browns a lead they would not relinquish. Cincinnati and Cleveland converted field goals in the second and third quarters. In the fourth quarter, Cleveland put together a 91-yard touchdown drive that spanned 6:37 to give the team the 17-6 advantage with 4:54 in the game. Hoyer, who was perfect on five attempts for 56 yards, capitalized on the series with a 1-yard TD to RB Chris Ogbonnaya, his first career receiving TD. On the drive, RB Willis McGahee carried six times for 33 yards (5.5 avg.), including two 9-yard carries that placed the Browns on the 1-yard line. On Cincinnati's final three possessions, the defense permitted only two first downs and intercepted Bengals QB Andy Dalton as LB D'Qwell Jackson deflected a pass that was snared by Skrine.

Erasing a 10-0 first-quarter deficit, the Browns scored one rushing, passing, special-teams (punt return) and defensive (interception return) touchdown to earn a 37-24 victory against the Buffalo Bills in Thursday night action. QB Brandon Weeden, who replaced starting QB Brian Hoyer after a season-ending knee injury (torn ACL) sustained on the seventh offensive play, completed 13 of 24 passes (54.2 percent) for 197 yards with one touchdown and zero interceptions for a 95.3 rating. Defensively, Cleveland held Buffalo to 188 net passing yards, did not allow a 100-yard rusher for the fifth consecutive game and registered its first interception-return touchdown of the season (DB T.J. Ward, 44 yards). On special teams, WR-PR Travis Benjamin set a franchise record with 179 punt-return yards, bolstered by a 79-yard touchdown return. The Bills jumped to a 10-0 lead as RB Fred Jackson scored on a 1-yard run and K Dan Carpenter converted a 52-yard field-goal attempt with 5:51 remaining in the first quarter. The Browns grabbed a 17-10 lead with 17 unanswered points on three consecutive opportunities in the second quarter. Benjamin created a short field after nearly scoring on a 57-yard punt return, setting up Billy Cundiff's 30-yard field goal. On the next possession, Weeden directed a 14-play 71-yard scoring drive, finalized with McGahee's first touchdown as a Brown. After Cleveland forced a three-and-out on the Bills ensuing drive, Benjamin returned a punt 79 yards up the left sideline, breaking multiple tackles to give the Browns a seven-point lead, 17-10, with 2:20 remaining in the first half. Buffalo posted touchdowns on its first two second-half drives after Jackson and Bills RB C.J. Spiller rushed for 54-yard and 1-yard touchdowns, respectively, to earn a 24-17 edge with 6:32 to play in the third quarter. On the following possession, Weeden connected with WR Greg Little for a 47-yard completion, and Gordon for a 37-yard touchdown. Cundiff booted a pair of field goals, his secon

The Browns fell to an early 14-point as QB Aaron Rodgers directed TD drives (four plays, 40 yards and 11 plays, 56 yards) on his first opportunities. Packers TE Jermichael Finley caught a 10-yard touchdown pass from Rodgers with 12:22 remaining in the first quarter, while rookie RB Eddie Lacy scored on a 1-yard run with 3:44 to play in the first period. The Browns scored on three consecutive possessions but could not surmount the Chiefs' early 13-point lead in a 23-17 loss at Arrowhead Stadium. Kansas City forced three three-and-outs and entered Cleveland territory on each of the team's first three possessions of the game, establishing a 13-0 advantage with 10:26 to play in the second quarter. Chiefs K Ryan Succop converted field goals (42, 35) on Kansas City's first two possessions, followed by QB Alex Smith's 12-yard TD pass to FB Anthony Sherman. The Browns responded with three consecutive scoring drives to bring the game within three points, 20-17. Following a missed field goal by Succop, QB Jason Campbell, who was making his debut start with the Browns, completed back-to-back passes to WR Greg Little (19 yards) and WR Josh Gordon (39-yard TD), the second occurring on a flea-flicker involving RB Willis McGahee to make it 13-7 with 2:44 remaining in the first half. The Chiefs answered with a touchdown on a 28-yard pass to WR Dexter McCluster, but Campbell directed a seven-play, 54-yard drive in the final two minutes, setting up Billy Cundiff's 44-yard field goal that cut the Chiefs advantage to 20-10 at the half. On the opening possession of the second half, Campbell completed 4-of-5 passes for 69 yards with a touchdown and rushed for nine yards on two scrambles during a nine-play, 80-yard drive, capped by his 17-yard pass to RB Fozzy Whittaker, his first career touchdown, that made it 20-17 with 9:58 to play in the third quarter. The defenses tightened to close the games the Browns and Chiefs gained a maximum of two first downs and one first down on each of their remaining drives, respectively. Cleveland's defense allowed only 19 net yards on Kansas City's first drive of the second half, with the following five drives netting 11 yards or fewer. The Browns scored in all four quarters and did not trail at any point of a 24-18 victory over the Baltimore Ravens, snapping an 11-game skid dating back to 2007. The Browns committed four turnovers that resulted in 17 points during a 27-11 loss against the Pittsburgh Steelers. Each team earned a field goal on its opening possession as Steelers K Shaun Suisham converted a 47-yarder and Browns K Billy Cundiff booted a 49-yarder, leaving the teams even, 3-3. The game remained level until Steelers QB Ben Roethlisberger found WR Antonio Brown for a 41-yard touchdown that provided a 10-3 lead with 2:33 to go in the first half. Pittsburgh forced a fumble on the ensuing possession to set up Suisham for a 32-yard field goal, giving the Steelers a 13-3 advantage at halftime. Midway through the third quarter, Browns QB Jason Campbell was sacked by Steelers CB William Gay, resulting in a fumble that S Will Allen returned to the 4-yard line. Campbell, who completed 14 of 22 passes for 124 yards, sustained a head injury on the play and did not return. One play later, Roethlisberger threw a 4-yard TD to WR Emmanuel Sanders to give Pittsburgh a 20-3 lead with 7:43 to play in the third quarter. The Steelers made it 27-3 late in the fourth quarter as Gay posted a 21-yard interception return touchdown. On the next possession, Browns QB Brandon Weeden completed four of six attempts for 78 yards with a 1-yard TD pass to Josh Gordon. Weeden, who passed for 209 yards in the game, connected with WR Davone Bess on the twopoint conversion, setting the score at 27-11. Gordon set a franchise record with 237 receiving yards and tied a club mark with 14 receptions. Gordon, who became the first Brown to record back-to-back 100-yard games since Braylon Edwards in 2006, registered his team-record fifth 100-yard effort of the season.

The Jaguars, aided by 13 points off of turnovers, scored the game-winning touchdown with 40 seconds to play for a 32-28 victory. After Cleveland forced a Jacksonville punt on the game's opening possession, QB Brandon Weeden completed a 42-yard pass to WR Josh Gordon on his first play under center, setting up RB Willis McGahee for a 1-yard touchdown run. Jacksonville evened the contest on its next possession as QB Chad Henne found TE Clay Harbor for an 18-yard touchdown. Weeden responded with an 11-play, 92-yard touchdown drive spanning 5:17, capped by a 21-yard pass to Gordon, to give the Browns a 14-7 lead with 12:03 to play in the first half. In the final minutes of second quarter, Jacksonville forced two interceptions and one fumble that led to Jaguars RB Maurice Jones-Drew's 8-yard TD pass to TE Marcedes Lewis and two K Josh Scobee field goals (44 yards, 36 yards) that provided Jacksonville a 20-14 advantage at the intermission. To open the second half, Cleveland regained the lead on Weeden's 4-yard touchdown pass to WR Greg Little, but in the fourth quarter, Jacksonville earned a safety following a high snap and kicked a field goal on the ensuing possession to grab a 25-21 with 4:14 to play. One play later, Weeden connected near the sideline with Gordon, who then raced 95 yards to give the Browns a 28-25 edge. Jacksonville drove 80 yards on nine plays during the next possession, notching the game-winning TD on Henne's 20-yard pass to WR Cecil Shorts. Gordon, who broke his own franchise record (237 vs. Pittsburgh) with 261 receiving yards with two touchdowns on 10 receptions (26.1 avg.), became the first player in NFL history to amass 200 receiving yards in back-to-back games.
