WEEK 16: PATRIOTS (10-4) VS. RAVENS (8-6)

DEC. 22, 2013 • 4:25 P.M. ET • M&T BANK STADIUM (71,008)



JUST THE FACTS

- Fighting to make the playoffs for the sixth-consecutive season and the seventh time in the last eight years, the Baltimore Ravens host the New England Patriots this Sunday, Dec. 22. Game time at M&T Bank Stadium is 4:25 p.m. ET. The Ravens, winners of four in a row and five of the last six, are 8-6. The Patriots, winners of three consecutive before last Sunday's 24-20 loss at Miami, lead the AFC East with a 10-4 record.
- The 2012 Super Bowl XLVII Champion Ravens are the NFL's only team to earn the playoffs in each of the last five seasons – all under head coach **John Harbaugh**. (Baltimore has won at least one playoff game in each of the last five years when it also appeared in three AFC Championships.) Currently, the Ravens trail the 9-5 Bengals by one game in the AFC North.
- This is the seventh game between the Ravens and Patriots since 2009, including the last two AFC Championships – both played in Foxboro. Baltimore won, 28-13, on 1/20/13, while New England took the 2011 title, 23-20, on 1/22/12. The teams have split the previous six games they've played.
- K Justin Tucker** kicked a 61-yard field goal with 38 seconds left in the game to give the Ravens an 18-16 victory at Detroit last Monday. Tucker's kick was the longest in team history and one of six he made on the night, which set another franchise mark. Baltimore turned over Detroit three times in the contest, all interceptions off Lions QB Matthew Stafford. **DE DeAngelo Tyson**, **ILB Daryl Smith** and **S Matt Elam** grabbed the INTs, while the Ravens did not commit a turnover.
- The Ravens will conclude the regular season in Cincinnati on Dec. 29. Baltimore beat the Bengals, 20-17, in overtime on Nov. 10.

HARBS SAYS

"Playing in so many close games probably makes you tougher. It probably makes you more resilient when you know you can handle those situations, or maybe, what you learned in those games. It puts a lot of callouses on your psyche and your character. When you have callouses on your character, that's probably a good thing in the end. I'd say we're a confident team right now. We still have a lot ahead of us. We're still improving. We've had some lapses, and we look forward to when we're at our best for 60 minutes. That's always the goal."

CB Asa Jackson (hamstring) left the Lions game and did not return. **S Brynden Trawick** (ankle) missed the Detroit contest because of injury. Starting **G Kelechi Osemele** (back), **WR Brandon Stokley** (head), **OLB D.J. Bryant** (knee), **OLB Adrian Hamilton** (wrist) and **WR Aaron Mellette** (knee) are on Injured Reserve. **DE Kapron Lewis-Moore** (knee) is on the Non-Football Injury list.

The Ravens have won four-consecutive games and five of their last six, producing the NFL's best record since Week 10 (tied with Arizona and Carolina). Baltimore's four-game winning streak ties San Francisco for the NFL's top active streak entering Week 16.

SPOTLIGHT: JOE FLACCO

Why do you think the Ravens are usually in the playoff hunt? "Because we've done it the last handful of years consistently, I think we have a lot of confidence, whereas a lot of teams would give up or count themselves out after stumbling or facing adversity. It's amazing how many times we pull through things you didn't necessarily think you could. We have a lot of guys who have confidence, and we just keep fighting until the end."

How do the Ravens keep that consistent winning atmosphere with rookies and veterans coming in and out each year? "The veterans who come in are usually good players and hungry to win. Year to year, there's enough guys who are here – probably three draft classes – to keep that culture going. Because we've won the last five or six years, there's going to be somebody on the team that has come in and been used to winning football games. Guys who are in college now, when they think of us, they think of a team that's been winning. When they come in, they say, 'Oh, they're a good football team.' That's their first thought."

What was your "welcome to the NFL" moment? "We were in New England for my first preseason game. I hadn't played the whole game, and John [Harbaugh] put me in with two minutes left inside our own 5-yard line. I got sacked, I fumbled, and they got the ball and scored a TD. They were down by 1 and went for 2 to win, but they didn't get it. Thank goodness, because John was so ticked at me on the sideline. It stinks when you get in, and your first or second play you fumble, and they recover it. It was his first game as a head coach, so even though it was preseason, I'm sure he wanted to win. He would have been mad if they won, and it was on me. That was a little bit of a scary moment."

What's the best throw you've ever made? "If you just think about last year, it's tough to rule out the throw to Jacoby [Jones] to put the game into overtime in Denver. I threw one to Dennis [Pitta] in the Super Bowl. I rolled out left, and as I was getting hit, I flung one out to the sideline. I really like that one for whatever reason."

What's your favorite part of the touch football games you played as a kid? "One of my favorite things to do in the school yard was play 'Ed Reed.' I'd sit back there, play safety, act like I wasn't really covering anybody, but at the last second, make up the ground and make a pick. That was the most fun thing to do. Every now and then, I'd come home and tell my dad about some sweet catch I made throughout the day. I would try to be like Randy Moss or bait somebody into a pick like Ed."

NOTE OF THE WEEK

The Ravens have played an NFL-high nine games that have been decided by 3 points or less this season, with Baltimore compiling a 5-4 record in those contests. New England has played the second-most such games (seven), producing an impressive 6-1 mark.

#TUCKERTIME

- In the Ravens' last four wins, **K Justin Tucker** has accounted for 50 of Baltimore's 88 points.

- Tucker's 35 FGs made this season tie (Matt Stover, 2000) for the most in Ravens single-season history. His 35 makes and 37 attempts are also league highs entering Week 16.

- Tucker (130) needs just 6 points to set a Ravens' single-season record, breaking Matt Stover's mark of 135 from 2000.

- Tucker's 130 points this season tie (Steven Hauschka) for second in the NFL (Stephen Gostkowski is first with 133).

- Against Detroit, Tucker was 6-for-6, posting a franchise-record 61-yard game-winner. It marked the sixth overall game-winner of his career (5 regular season, 1 playoffs). The 6 FGs set a single-game team record and are the most in an NFL game this season.

- Tucker has made 33-consecutive FGs, ranking as the NFL's longest current streak and fourth-longest in league history.

- Against the Lions, Tucker became the first NFL kicker ever to connect from the 20-, 30-, 40-, 50- and 60-yard range in a game.

- Tucker is now 23-of-24 during his career when the Ravens are losing a game. He's 16-of-17 when Baltimore is down by 7 points or less.

- Tucker is 12-of-13 in the last 2 minutes of a game during his career, and he's 22-of-23 in the fourth quarter.

QUOTH THE RAVENS

BALTIMORE FOOTBALL



“We don’t panic. We don’t let the situation get too big. I wish it wasn’t like that, that we wouldn’t have to continue to play these types of [close] games. But we’ve played a lot of them. We’re used to having to make plays in crunch time when you’re down a couple of points or up by a couple of points. We’ve played in a lot of big-time games and in a lot of big-time atmospheres. Everybody knows how to handle them pretty well.”

- QB Joe Flacco on the Ravens in crunch time

Head coach John Harbaugh on overcoming adversity and battling back in improbable fashion:

“The thing I love about our football team is that we are a team of faith. We believe. We trust. Because of that, we’ll fight. We will run the race right down to the end. That’s something that our football team does. I’m very proud of them for that.”

ESPN.com’s Jamison Hensley on the Ravens:

“A month ago, I was convinced the Baltimore Ravens weren’t going to make the playoffs. Now, after another can’t-believe-it-until-you-see-it moment [at Detroit], I wouldn’t be shocked if the Ravens marched to another Super Bowl. I’m not saying the Ravens are the NFL’s best team. Heck, I can’t say they’re a consistent team. But, when the game is on the line, there is no team I trust more in the NFL right now than the defending Super Bowl champions. Just think about it: The Ravens control their fate in the playoffs and the AFC North because of the right leg of Justin Tucker and their one-legged quarterback. Obviously hurt by a hit to his left knee earlier in the fourth quarter, Joe Flacco completed a 27-yard pass on third-and-15 off his back foot to get the Ravens in range for a winning field goal. Tucker then booted a franchise-record 61-yarder with 38 seconds to lift the Ravens to another improbable victory.”

Ravens secondary coach Teryl Austin on CB Jimmy Smith’s play in 2013, boosted by a standout game in Super Bowl XLVII:

“You can’t do it on a bigger stage. And for him to play the way he did in the Super Bowl, I think it was a great springboard coming into the offseason, because I think he realized, ‘I can be really good, but I’ve got to really work at it.’ ... Now that he has confidence and is doing everything right, he is starting to look for the ball and make plays on the ball. That’s huge because quarterbacks in this league, if they know you aren’t going to make an interception or get your hands on the ball, they’ll just throw at you all day.”

QB Joe Flacco on rookie free agent WR Marlon Brown:

“I don’t know how we get a guy like that. He wasn’t even drafted, and he could be a great player. Stand next to him; he’s a big man. It’s not too big for him, even from the beginning. He can catch and run and, he’s strong enough to just run over people. He’s going to help us over these last [few] games.”

OLB Terrell Suggs on the Ravens’ mentality:

“We are pretty much battle-tested against anything a team can throw against us. We just keep trucking along. This team is very tough and very mentally strong.”

John Eisenberg, *BaltimoreRavens.com* columnist, on WR/RS Jacoby Jones’ impact the past several weeks:

“Before [Justin] Tucker performed his heroics [at Detroit], Jacoby Jones performed his yet again. After the Lions took a one-point lead with two minutes, 21 seconds to play, Jones returned the ensuing kickoff 36 yards, giving the Ravens hope that they could get into Tucker’s range. Then, after two incompletions on which Ravens quarterback Joe Flacco threw off his back foot, seemingly favoring a knee that took a hit late in the game, Flacco fired a rope over the middle of the field that Jones reeled in for a 27-yard gain. Do the math. Between the kickoff return and long reception, Jones moved the ball 63 yards to set up Tucker’s kick. Add those plays to his growing collection of game-changers, the kickoff returns against Pittsburgh and Minnesota, the long catch against the Jets ... His impact is huge every week.”

The *Baltimore Sun*’s Peter Schmuck on Ravens QB Joe Flacco:

“The thing you have to love the most is the way he shrugs [adversity] all off, which is just more proof that he’s a solid guy who – despite his New Jersey roots – personifies Baltimore football in much the same way Johnny Unitas did.”

ESPN.com’s Kevin Seifert on K Justin Tucker:

“It helps that Tucker is a delightfully even-keeled personality who felt compelled, first and foremost, to joke Monday night about his impact on fantasy football playoffs. He doesn’t appear to be a person easily affected by pressure.”

Assistant general manager Eric DeCosta on how unique Ravens NT Haloti Ngata is:

“It’s hard to find players like Haloti; they’re ‘planet players.’ There’s only a few of those guys on the planet who have size and can move like that. ... He came here [in 2006] as we were moving into the third era of Baltimore Ravens defense. In my mind, Haloti goes down in Baltimore with some of the greatest defensive linemen we’ve ever had, and we’ve had a number of standout defensive linemen. He’s right up there with all of them.”

LAST MONDAY AT DETROIT

Baltimore Ravens 18, Detroit Lions 16

K Justin Tucker's team-record 61-yard field goal with 38 seconds left in the game gave the Ravens a hard-fought 18-16 victory over the host Lions at Ford Field last Monday night. Tucker's game-winner was his sixth FG of the game, accounting for all of Baltimore's points. (The 6 FGs are also a team record.) The game didn't start well for the Ravens, as the Lions opened with an 8-play, 78-yard drive that ended with a RB Reggie Bush 14-yard touchdown run for a 7-0 Detroit lead. It then became Tucker time, starting with 3 second-quarter FGs (29, 24, 32 yards) for a 9-7 Ravens' halftime lead. Tucker and Detroit K David Akers then exchanged FGs – Tucker from 49 yards and Akers from 40 – in the third quarter to give the Ravens a 12-10 advantage. The Baltimore kicker blasted a 53-yarder to make the score 15-10 midway through the final period. But, the Lions roared back to take a 16-15 lead with 2:21 left in the game. The score came on a QB Matthew Stafford 14-yard TD strike to TE Joseph Fauria. However, the attempt for the 2-point conversion failed. A key play in the Ravens' field-goal-winning drive was a **QB Joe Flacco-to-WR Jacoby Jones** 27-yard completion on a third-and 15. That put the ball on Detroit's 45-yard line. The line of scrimmage for the winning FG was the 43. The Ravens intercepted Stafford three times (**DE DeAngelo Tyson**, **ILB Daryl Smith** and **S Matt Elam**), while not turning the ball over. Flacco completed 20 of 38 for 222 yards, including 6 to Jones for 80 yards and 4 each to **WR Torrey Smith** (69 yards) and **WR Marlon Brown** (31). WR Calvin Johnson caught 6 for 98 for the Lions; Bush added 86 rushing yards on 17 carries. The victory was the Ravens' fourth in a row and fifth in the last six games.

LAST GAME VS. NEW ENGLAND: RAVENS 28, PATRIOTS 13

Ravens 28, Patriots 13 • Jan. 20, 2013 • Foxboro, MA

The Baltimore Ravens earned a trip to their second Super Bowl in franchise history, defeating the No. 2 seed Patriots, 28-13, in the AFC Championship. The Ravens' defense shut out the NFL's No. 1-ranked and highest-scoring offense in the second half, and **QB Joe Flacco**, who has 8 TDs and zero INTs in the playoffs, threw three TDs in leading Baltimore to victory. The Ravens held New England to a **K Stephen Gostkowski** 31-yard field goal on four first-quarter possessions. Then, Flacco led the team on a 13-play, 90-yard scoring drive to open the second quarter, capped by a **RB Ray Rice** 2-yard TD run. New England struck back with a **QB Tom Brady**-to-WR Wes Welker 1-yard TD, making the score 10-7. After another Gostkowski field goal (25 yards), the Patriots took a 13-7 lead at halftime. Early in the third period, Flacco hit **TE Dennis Pitta** with a 5-yard TD pass, giving Baltimore a 14-13 lead. Flacco was 6 for 9 for 64 yards on the 72-yard scoring drive. The Ravens' defense was stout, forcing the Patriots to punt on both third-quarter possessions, while the offense continued to put points on the board, including Flacco's second TD, a three-yard pass to a leaping WR Anquan Boldin in the back of the end zone early in the fourth quarter. After the Ravens forced a **RB Stevan Ridley** fumble, Flacco hit Boldin again on an 11-yard toss, giving the Ravens a 28-13 lead and the final margin. Baltimore's defense sealed the game with 2 INTs on New England's final two possessions. The Ravens held Brady to a 62.3 QB rating, his fourth-worst in 24 career postseason games. The Brady-led Pats had been 67-0 at home when leading at halftime.

PATRIOTS SNAPSHOT

Overview: New England lost at Miami last week, 24-20, dropping to 10-4 this season, but maintains control of the AFC East lead. The Patriots are 3-4 on the road and have dropped four of their last five away from home. Including playoffs, three of the last four matchups between the Ravens and Patriots have been decided by 3 points or less. Following this week's game in Baltimore, New England closes its regular season by hosting Buffalo in Week 17.

Bill Belichick: Belichick is in his 14th season as head coach of the Patriots, compiling a 161-60 regular season record. During his tenure with New England, the Patriots have earned 10 playoff berths and 10 AFC East division crowns, with Belichick becoming the only head coach in NFL history to win three Super Bowl championships in a four-year span. He currently ranks first among active head coaches with 215 overall wins and is sixth on the all-time list. A 39-year NFL coaching veteran, Belichick has previously served as head coach of the Cleveland Browns (1991-95). He also won two other Super Bowls as an assistant coach with the New York Giants.

Offense: New England's offense ranks eighth (390.7 ypg), boasting the NFL's sixth-best passing attack (272.4 ypg) and the 12th-ranked run game (118.3 ypg). The Patriots' 26.4 points per contest are the league's seventh most. With just 58 penalties this season, New England has committed the league's fewest infractions. **QB Tom Brady** has completed 352 of 578 passes for 4,049 yards, 23 TDs and 10 INTs, marking his third-straight 4,000-yard season. **WR Julian Edelman** has a team-high 89 receptions for 914 yards and 6 TDs, while **RB Stevan Ridley** leads the ground attack with 151 carries for 645 yards and 7 scores.

Defense: The Patriots are 24th in overall defense (372.7 ypg), including 18th against the pass (240.2 ypg) and 31st in run stop (132.5 ypg). The defensive unit has forced 25 turnovers (14 INTs and 11 FRs), led by **CB Aqib Talib's** 4 INTs. The pass rush has yielded 40 sacks, including a team-high 11.5 takedowns by second-year **DE Chandler Jones**. **LB Dont'a Hightower** has a team-leading 85 tackles (50 solo).

SPECIAL FORCES



Assistant head coach/special teams coordinator **Jerry Rosburg**, a 35-year coaching veteran, has guided a strong special teams group since arriving in Baltimore in 2008. In 2012, the Ravens' special teams units excelled. Led by Pro Bowl **RS Jacoby Jones**, Baltimore ranked first in the NFL in kickoff

return average (27.3), also setting a team record. Jones, who became the first player ever to record dual KORs of at least 105 yards in a career, tied for a league-leading 3 kick return TDs (2 KORs & 1 PR) and averaged an NFL-best 30.7 yards per kickoff return. Jones also tied an NFL record for longest KOR in Super Bowl history with his 108-yard KOR-TD in Super Bowl XLVII.

Rosburg's kickers were special in 2012, too: **P Sam Koch** set Ravens single-season punting records with a 47.1 gross average and a 40.8 net average, shattering career bests. **K Justin Tucker** made 30 of 33 FGAs (90.9%), producing the second-best success rate in Ravens single-season history and also the second-best mark by a rookie kicker in NFL history.

Prior to Baltimore, Rosburg built a successful NFL special teams resume both with the Browns (2001-06) and Falcons (2007). Under his leadership, Cleveland's special teams units were consistently ranked among the NFL's best. Over a five-year span (2002-06), the Browns' special teams were ranked as the top NFL unit in Rick Gosselin's annual comprehensive special teams report.

SPECIAL TEAMS STANDOUTS

In 2012, senior NFL writer Rick Gosselin of *The Dallas Morning News* ranked the Ravens' special teams unit No. 2 in the league in his annual comprehensive ratings system that's based on 22 categories, assigning points according to each standing — 1 for best, 32 for worst. The Vikings finished first in Gosselin's special teams rankings, followed by the Ravens and the Bengals.

A STRONG RETURN

Dating back to the 2008 season when **Jerry Rosburg** became the Ravens' special teams coordinator, Baltimore has produced the NFL's No. 1 kickoff return average (24.9).

COORDINATORS NOTES

CALDWELL'S ATTACK



Jim Caldwell, a 36-year coaching veteran, joined the Ravens as the team's QBs coach in February 2012 and was elevated to offensive coordinator on Dec. 10, replacing Cam Cameron. Caldwell arrived in Baltimore after coaching 10 seasons with the Indianapolis Colts, including three (2009-11) as head coach. In his first year at the helm, he led the Colts to the AFC Championship and a berth in Super Bowl XLIV. Caldwell, who earned a Super Bowl ring (2006) with Indy, spent six seasons tutoring one of the NFL's all-time greats in QB Peyton Manning. During the course of Caldwell's time in Indianapolis, the Colts achieved much success, tying an NFL record with nine-straight playoff appearances and winning six AFC South division titles.

CALDWELL FIRES UP "O"

Under **Jim Caldwell**, who was elevated to offensive coordinator prior to the Ravens' Dec. 16, 2012 game vs. Denver, Baltimore averaged 400.6 yards of offense per contest (146.4 rushing & 254.1 passing) and 27.3 points per game to close out last season.

The Flacco-to-Brown score finished a five-play, 80-yard drive that eclipsed all but 4 of the game's final 45 seconds. The Ravens' rally also included a 77-yard kickoff return for a touchdown by WR/RS Jacoby Jones.

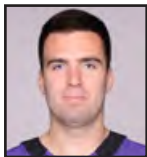

SMITH IS SCINTILLATING

WR Torrey Smith has excelled this season. With 6 receptions for 121 yards in Week 5 at Miami, Smith became the first Raven since Qadry Ismail in 1999 to post back-to-back 100-yard receiving games. (Ismail had three straight that year.)

- In Week 15 at Detroit, Smith (36) moved past Derrick Mason (35) to produce a franchise record in receptions of 25-or-more yards.
- With 3 more catches of 25-plus yards, Smith (12 in 2013) will break the single-season team record set by WR Michael Jackson (14) in 1996.
- With 170 receiving yards, Smith (1,032) will set a single-season franchise record, surpassing Jackson (1,201) from 1996.
- Smith, who owns a 17.5-yard receiving average this season, pulled in a 54-yard bomb in Week 13 vs. Pit., marking his seventh catch of 40-or-more yards in 2013.

Rookie WR Marlon Brown on Smith's leadership: "If you're having a tough day of practice, everyone is hurting and tired, usually I just look over at Torrey, and I just see how he responds. He responds with a good attitude, so I'm going to get out there and respond with a good attitude. If something is going wrong, or if I need help with something, I go to Torrey before I go to anybody. He's our leader."

TORREY'S COURAGEOUS NIGHT

WR Torrey Smith played in the 2012 Week 3 Sunday night victory over New England after his brother, 19-year-old Tevin Jones, passed away in a motorcycle accident that morning. Smith posted 6 catches for 127 yards and 2 TDs in the come-from-behind win, producing the third 100-yard game of his young career. Additionally, he eclipsed the 1,000-yard receiving milestone for his career.

SMITH BIG IN '12 PLAYOFFS

In the 2012 thrilling, double-overtime Divisional Playoff win at Denver (38-35 on 1/12/13), **WR Torrey Smith** caught 59-yard and 32-yard TD passes, helping mark the first game in NFL playoff history that a QB (**Joe Flacco**) threw 2 TDs of 59-plus yards (the other being to **WR Jacoby Jones** on a 70-yarder). In the 2012 postseason, Smith recorded a 21.2 yards-per-catch average, reeling in 11 passes for 233 yards.

LONG BALL LOVE

WR Torrey Smith ranks first in Ravens franchise history in yards-per-catch average, posting a 17.3 mark over the three seasons in which he's caught 158 passes for 2,728 yards and 19 TDs. Dating back to his rookie campaign (2011), his 17.3 average ties for third in the NFL.

SMITH COULD SET RECORD

WR Torrey Smith's 1,032 receiving yards (on 59 catches) rank 16th in the NFL entering Week 16. Impressively, Smith is on pace to finish with 1,179 yards in 2013, but is threatening the franchise record set by Michael Jackson (1,201 on 76 catches) in 1996.

IMPRESSIVE SINCE DAY ONE

In 2011's Week 11 game vs. Cincinnati, **WR Torrey Smith** set a Ravens' single-season and single-game record for receiving yards by a rookie, totaling a career-high 165 yards on 6 catches (27.5 avg.). In 2011, the first-year Smith had 50 catches for 841 yards and a Ravens' rookie-record 7 TDs.

Smith Quick Hits:

- During the 2011 campaign, Smith ranked 13th in the NFL with a stout 16.8 yards-per-catch average.
- Smith's 26-yard TD catch with 8 seconds remaining in Week 9 at Pit. capped a 92-yard drive and sealed the Ravens' 23-20 win.
- Impressively, 5 of his 7 TD receptions in 2011 covered at least 25 yards (74, 41, 38, 36, 26, 18 and 8 yards), and he averaged a sensational 34.4 yards-per-TD catch.
- Never before has a Ravens' wideout registered dual 150-yard receiving games in a season (165 vs. Cin. and 152 at STL). Smith also posted the Top 2 receiving yards outputs by a rookie in the NFL in 2011.
- In 2011's Week 11, Smith joined Ken Burrow (2 in 1971) and Randy Moss (3 in 1998) as the only rookies in NFL history to have multiple games with at least 150 receiving yards and a TD catch.

THE DOMINANT DT

JONES ELECTRIFIES

WR/RS Jacoby Jones ranked first in the NFL with a 30.7 KOR average and posted three combined kick return TDs (2 KOR and 1 PR) in 2012. Not only is Jones the first Raven to ever tally 3 total kick return TDs in a season, but he's just one of six NFL players since 2008 to score a PR, KOR and receiving TD in a single campaign.

JUST FOR KICKS



K Justin Tucker's 35 FGs made this season tie (Matt Stover, 2000) for the most in Ravens single-season history. His 35 makes and 37 attempts are also league highs entering Week 16. A few quick hits:

- Tucker (130) needs just 6 points to set a Ravens' single-season record, breaking Matt Stover's mark of 135 from 2000. Tucker's 130 points in 2013 tie (Steven Hauschka) for second in the NFL (Stephen Gostkowski is first with 133).

- At Detroit (12/16), Tucker was 6-for-6, posting a franchise-record 61-yard game-winner. It marked the sixth overall game-winner of his career (5 regular season, 1 playoffs). The 6 FGs set a single-game team record and are the most in an NFL game this season.

- Tucker has made 33-consecutive FGs, ranking as the NFL's longest current streak and fourth-longest in league history.

- Against the Lions, Tucker became the first NFL kicker ever to connect from the 20-, 30-, 40-, 50- and 60-yard range in a game.

- Tucker is now 23-of-24 during his career when the Ravens are losing a game. He's 16-of-17 when Baltimore is down by 7 points or less.

- Tucker is 12-of-13 in the last 2 minutes of a game during his career, and he's 22-of-23 in the fourth quarter.
