The Philadelphia Eagles travel to Foxborough, Mass., to face off against the New England Patriots in a primetime preseason matchup on Monday, August 20 at 8:00 pm. Last week, the Eagles defeated the Steelers 24-23 at Lincoln Financial Field to open the preseason. In their previous game, the Patriots beat the New Orleans Saints 7-6. The Eagles and Patriots regular season series is knotted at 6-6, but New England has a 9-6 advantage in exhibition games. The two teams met last season and the Pats came away with a 38-20 victory on November 27.

### BROADCAST INFO/MULTIMEDIA COVERAGE

This week's preseason game will be broadcast nationally on **ESPN**. **Mike Tirico** will call play-by-play, joined by former NFL head coach and Eagles offensive coordinator **Jon Gruden**. **Lisa Salters** will report from the sidelines.

**WIP** (94.1 FM and 610 AM) will simulcast the radio play-by-play with **Merrill Reese**, the voice of the Eagles since 1977, and former All-Pro receiver **Mike Quick**. **Howard Eskin** will report from the sidelines.

For the first time, Eagles games will be broadcast in Spanish on **WTTM** (1680 AM) in Philadelphia and **WGPA** (1100 AM) in Allentown with **Rickie Ricardo** (play-by-play) and **Felix DeJesus** (color) on the call.

## BULLET POINTS ON BELICHICK

- Patriots head coach **Bill Belichick** currently ranks ninth all-time with 192 total victories as a head coach. His winning percentage of .649 ranks third in NFL history among coaches with 150 or more wins, trailing only George Halas (.682) and Don Shula (.666)
- Through 12 seasons, Belichick has delivered three Super Bowl championships, five conference titles, nine division crowns and 16 playoff victories, while posting an overall record of 155-59
- Since the beginning of the 2003 season, Belichick's squads are 27-3 (.880) in regular season games following a loss, dropping back-to-back regular-season contests just three times over that span
- In 2011, Belichick guided the Patriots to a 13-3 record, his fifth AFC Conference Championship and Super Bowl appearance, and the team's ninth division title in 12 years
- Under Belichick's guidance, the Patriots finished the 2011 season with 6,848 total net yards, setting a new franchise record for most total net yards in a season. That total is fourth all-time in NFL history
- According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Belichick is the only man in NFL history to serve 20 or more seasons as an assistant coach (20) and at least 15 seasons (18) as a head coach. He previously served as Cleveland's head man from 1991-95
- **NFL assistant coaching experience:** NY Jets (asst. head coach/secondary, 1997-99), New England (same title, 1996), NY Giants (defensive coordinator/secondary 1989-1990, D.C. 1985-88, linebackers 1983-84, special teams/LBs 1981-82, STs 1979-80), Denver (asst. STs/asst. to DC 1978), Detroit (asst. STs/TEs/WRs 1977, asst. STs 1976), and Baltimore Colts (special assistant, 1975)

## LAST PRESEASON MEETING

Patriots 27 - Eagles 25  
8/13/09 - Lincoln Financial Field

- New England brought a 21-6 lead into halftime, thanks to a 75-yard punt return touchdown by **Julian Edelman** (10:59 left in the first half) and two TD passes from **Tom Brady** to tight end **Chris Baker**
- After a **Steve Gostkowski** to give the Pats a 24-6 edge, RB **Eldra Buckley** scored twice via a four-yard rush (4:11 left in the third) as well as a one-yard reception from QB **A.J. Feeley** (44 seconds left in the third quarter)
- K **David Akers** went 4-6 on field goals, hitting on tries from 38, 43, 36, and 34 yards, respectively. He missed two field goal attempts from 44 and 43 yards
- RB **LeSean McCoy** led all rushers with 10 carries for 55 yards, as part of a team rushing effort that totaled 27 carries for 116 yards
- Feeley went 18-of-24 passing with one TD and no INTs for a rating of 115.1
- DE **Jason Babin** recorded the team's only sack, and CB **Sheldon Brown** recorded an INT
- The Birds outgained New England 420-257 in total yards, including 304-162 in passing yards, but converted on only 2-5 attempts from the red zone

## LAST REGULAR SEASON MEETING

- The Eagles took an early 7-0 lead on a two-yard TD run by RB **LeSean McCoy** with 12:43 left in the first quarter, capping off a five-play, 84-yard drive
- The Patriots countered with two TDs from **BenJarvus Green-Ellis** of four yards and one yard, respectively, to give New England a 14-10 lead
- QB **Tom Brady** connected with WR Wes Welker on a 41-yard TD pass and gave the Pats a 21-10 edge with 7:09 left in the first half
- Coming out of halftime with a 24-13 advantage, Brady again found Welker for a score, this time on a nine-yard TD strike to increase New England's lead to 31-13
- Patriots TE **Rod Gronkowski** reeled in a 24-yard TD throw from Brady to make the score 38-13 with 8:35 remaining in the game
- With 32 seconds left, WR **Jason Avant** caught a one-yard pass from QB **Vince Young** (starting in place of an injured **Michael Vick** - ribs) to make the score 38-20
- Avant led all receivers with eight catches for 110 yards and one TD
- Young completed 26-of-48 passes (54.2%) for 400 yards, 1 TD, 1 Int
- The Eagles outgained the Patriots 466-457, including 393-353 in the passing game
- DT **Mike Patterson** collected the lone sack for the Eagles

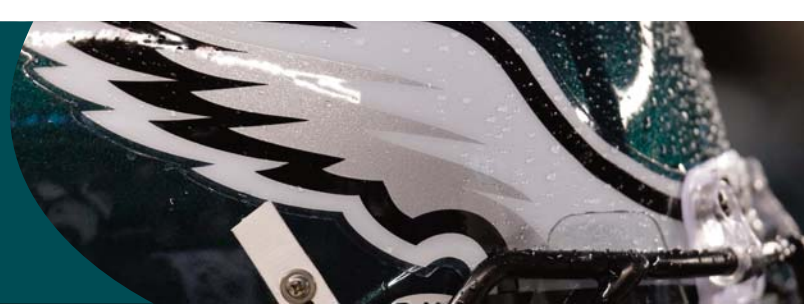

# REID ALL ABOUT IT



## ANDY REID

Head Coach/Executive VP of Football Operations

13th year in Philadelphia

Overall Record: 136-90-1 (.601)



One of the longest-tenured and most successful coaches in professional sports, Andy Reid utilizes a passionate, yet workmanlike approach as the head coach of the Philadelphia Eagles. A former offensive lineman at BYU, Reid still lives and works with those humble principles he learned during his time in the trenches.

His vision, dedication, and organizational skills have been impeccable during his time in Philadelphia. For those reasons, he was promoted to head coach/executive VP of football operations in 2001.

Reid appreciates his time working for this city's beloved football team, "I love Philadelphia. The fans, there is nothing like them. I was on the other side of that when I was at Green Bay coming in as an opponent. I always said, 'boy you'd love to play for that crew there.' The fans here are unbelievable. They're fair. If we stink they let us know we stink, if we're doing okay they let us know we're doing okay, but they're always there. My hat is off to them and that support is phenomenal, absolutely phenomenal."

The results of Reid's labor have been very tangible and quite remarkable since taking over a 3-13 club on January 11, 1999. With 135 wins during his Eagles tenure (including playoffs), Reid is in 24th place on the league's all-time list. Along the way, he has earned NFL coach of the year honors three times, and compiled the best win total, winning percentage, and playoff victory total (10) in team history. He has captured six division titles and five trips to the NFC Championship game.

It also is the alma mater of actor Leonardo DiCaprio, will.i.am of the Black Eyed Peas, and Judge Lance Ito, who oversaw the O.J. Simpson trial. Each year, Marshall's lineman of the year on their football team receives the "Andy Reid Trophy".

## BIG RED'S BULLET POINTS:

- Has the highest win total of any coach in club history
- Became the 37th coach in NFL history to reach the 100-win plateau, the 22nd coach to win 100 games with one franchise and the 17th coach to reach 100 victories in first stint as a head coach
- Is just the fourth head coach to lead a team to 100-plus wins in a decade, joining Bill Belichick, Tom Landry and Don Shula
- His 10 playoff wins are most in team history and tied for 11th in league history
- Reached the 50-win milestone faster than any coach in team history (81 games). Dick Vermeil did so in 88 games
- In his 20-year NFL coaching career, his teams have made the playoffs 15 times (19-14 record). He has coached in the Super Bowl three times and in the NFC Championship game eight times
- Earned NFL coach of the year honors in 2000, 2002 and 2010
- Is a member of the NFL's Coaches Subcommittee chaired by John Madden
- Joined NFL coaches Marvin Lewis, John Fox and Brad Childress on a USO tour of Germany and Afghanistan in July 2010. "I wish everyone could experience this," said Reid, whose father served in the Navy during World War II

## GETTING TO THE TOURNEY

Reid's tenure in Philadelphia has been one of the best in NFL history, and the numbers show that he puts his teams in position to contend year in and year out

- Reid has led his team to the playoffs in nine out of his 13 seasons (69%) while at the helm of the Eagles, the fourth-best percentage all-time out of coaches with five or more playoff berths

## WINNING CONSISTENTLY

With 11 out of his 13 seasons with Philadelphia ending with a .500-or-better winning percentage (84.6%), Reid has shown his ability to keep his team competitive regardless of the circumstances during the season

- Having been at-or-above .500 84.6% of the time, only seven coaches in the history of the NFL with as many seasons have had a better percentage: George Allen (12-12, 100%), Vince Lombardi (10-10, 100%), John Madden (10-10, 100%), Don Shula (31-33, 93.9%), Tony Dungy (12-13, 92.3%), Paul Brown (11-12, 91.6%), and Curly Lambeau (26-29, 89.7%)
- Of the nine head coaches who have lasted 13-or-more seasons at their first head coaching job, only Curly Lambeau has had a higher percentage of non-losing seasons (89.7%) than Reid

## BOUNCING BACK

Reid's Philadelphia squads have been known for both prospering in good times and turning negatives into positives in regards to winning and losing.

- The Eagles have posted a 66-37 record (.641) the week after wins. Their ability to capitalize on a win the week before has allowed the Eagles to string together 19 winning streaks of three or more games during Reid's tenure
- Philadelphia is also strong coming off of a loss. Reid has effectively rallied his troops to a 42-22-1 (.654) mark when losing the week before

## MARTY MORNHINWEG

Asst. Head Coach/Off Coord.

10th year in Philadelphia



Known as one of the top offensive minds in the league, Mornhinweg has put together record-setting performances for two different franchises (San Francisco and Philadelphia) in the role of offensive coordinator. In 2011, the Eagles offense set franchise records in total net yards (6,386)

- In 2010, the Eagles set a franchise record in points for the 3rd consecutive year and earned NFL assistant coach of the year honors from *Pro Football Weekly*
- Five QBs have earned Pro Bowl status working under him: Michael Vick, Donovan McNabb, Steve Young, Jeff Garcia and Brett Favre
- Served as head coach of the Detroit Lions from 2001-02
- In 1996, tutored Packers quarterbacks as Favre captured MVP honors in leading his team to a Super Bowl 31 championship
- Also coached with Andy Reid at Green Bay, Texas-El Paso and Missouri
- Was elected to the Grizzly Sports Hall of Fame at the University of Montana and the Oak Grove HS Hall of Fame
- Earned Northern California HS player of the year honors at Oak Grove, where Mike Holmgren served as an assistant coach

## JUAN CASTILLO

Defensive Coordinator

18th year in Philadelphia



After a 13-year stint as the club's offensive line coach, Castillo was named defensive coordinator in 2011. As the O-line coach, often confided with the late Jim Johnson and his defensive staff, exchanging ideas about blitzes, protections and coverages.

- In first year as coordinator in 2011, Castillo's unit led the league with 50 sacks, ranked 8th in yards permitted (324.9) and 10th in points allowed (20.5).
- 4 linemen earned their 1st Pro Bowl berth under him: Tra Thomas, Jermaine Mayberry, Jon Runyan, Shawn Andrews
- Also displayed a penchant for developing undrafted players into NFL starters, including Jamaal Jackson, Nick Cole, Hank Fraley, Artis Hicks and Bubba Miller
- Fluent in Spanish and proud to be one of a few NFL coaches of Hispanic descent

- Former linebacker with Texas A&I and the USFL's San Antonio Gunslingers
- His son, Gregory, is a cornerback at Iowa
- On July 4, 2009, hometown of Port Isabel, TX, celebrated "Juan Castillo Day" in which the mayor gave him the key to city

## BOBBY APRIL

Special Teams Coordinator

3rd year in Philadelphia



One of the most highly-regarded special teams coaches in the NFL, April spent six seasons with Buffalo (2004-09) and guided their special teams to the #1 ranking in the NFL 3 times, according to the intricate system compiled annually by esteemed *Dallas Morning News* columnist Rick Gosselin.

- Integrated a rookie kicker and punter in 2011. K Alex Henery set a team and NFL rookie record with a 88.9 FG %
- Was twice named special teams coach of the year by his peers in 2004 and 2008
- Helped the Steelers earn a trip to the Super Bowl in 1995 as their special teams coordinator
- Son, Bobby April, III, was named Eagles defensive quality control coach in 2011

## BOBBY APRIL, III

Defensive Quality Control

1st year in Philadelphia



- The son of the Eagles special teams coordinator, he previously coached at Nicholls State and Portland State
- Was believed to be the youngest coordinator in college football while at Portland State (25 years old)

## TODD BOWLES

Secondary

1st year in Philadelphia



- Served as an assistant head coach/secondary coach for Miami from 2008-11 and was their interim head coach for the final 3 games of 2011 (2-1 record)
- Also worked with Dallas (2005-07), Cleveland (2001-04) and NY Jets (2000). Coached 3 Pro Bowlers in Dallas: Roy Williams, Ken Hamlin, Terence Newman
- Played 8 seasons as a DB in the NFL with Washington and San Francisco and was a member of the Redskins Super Bowl XXII championship team

- Worked under legendary coach Eddie Robinson at Grambling State (1998-99)
- A native of Elizabeth, NJ, played collegiately at Temple

## MIKE CALDWELL

Linebackers

5th year in Philadelphia



- Enjoyed an 11-year NFL career as a linebacker with Cleveland, Baltimore, Arizona, Philadelphia (1998-2001), Chicago, and Carolina
- Voted by his teammates as the Eagles special teams MVP in 1998
- Served as an intern coach during the Eagles 2007 training camp, working with the team's linebackers
- Niece, Nikki, is the head women's basketball coach at LSU

## DAVID CULLEY

Sr. Offensive Asst./Receivers

14th year in Philadelphia



- Under his direction, DeSean Jackson became the first player in NFL history to earn a Pro Bowl berth as both a receiver and a return man in 2009. Jackson garnered his 2nd Pro Bowl in 2010
- In addition, Jeremy Maclin caught more passes (189) in his first three seasons as an Eagle than any other player besides TE Keith Jackson (194)
- Coached in six conference championship games as an NFL assistant
- As QBs coach at Southwestern Louisiana, tutored former Eagle Brian Mitchell as he became the first player in NCAA history to pass for over 5,000 yards and rush for over 3,000 yards in a career
- Was recruited by Bill Parcells as a quarterback at Vanderbilt

## TOM MELVIN

Tight Ends

14th year in Philadelphia



- Played a key role in the development of Brent Celek, who has caught 223 passes and 19 TDs in his five-year career
- Was an o-lineman at San Francisco State and his position coach was Andy Reid
- His cousin, Bob Melvin, a former MLB catcher, is the manager of Oakland A's

## HOWARD MUDD

Offensive Line

2nd year in Philadelphia



- One of the most revered O-line coaches in NFL history, Mudd joined the Eagles in 2011 after a one-year retirement
- Mudd's revamped line in 2011 (4 new starters) helped Eagles post team-record 6,386 total net yards and an All-Pro campaign for RB LeSean McCoy
- In 12-year stint in Indy (1998-2009), helped Colts earn Super Bowl crown in 2006 and post the most regular season wins in a decade (115) in NFL history, including 7 consecutive 12-win campaigns
- His troops helped protect 4-time league MVP Peyton Manning and paved the way for two rushing titles by Edgerrin James
- Was a three-time Pro Bowl starting guard (1966-68) and was named to the NFL's All-Decade team of the 1960's. Played for the 49ers (1964-69) and Chicago (1969-71)

## MATT NAGY

Offensive Quality Control

2nd year in Philadelphia



- A native of Lancaster, PA, set over 20 records as a QB at the University of Delaware, including career yards and TDs
- Played six seasons in the Arena Football League from 2002-08

## DOUG PEDERSON

Quarterbacks

4th year in Philadelphia



- Promoted to his current post in 2011 after spending first two seasons as offensive quality control coach
- In first year as QBs coach in 2011, the Eagles set franchise record in yards (6,386) while Michael Vick posted career highs in passing yards (3,303), attempts (423) and completions (253)
- Compiled 40-11 record as head coach and asst. athletic director of Calvary Baptist Academy in Shreveport, LA (2005-08)
- During his NFL career, backed up Dan Marino, Brett Favre and Donovan McNabb
- A 12-year NFL veteran, signed as a rookie free agent with the Dolphins in 1991 and played with Miami, Green Bay, Philadelphia (1999), and Cleveland

## DUCE STALEY

Special Teams Quality Control

2nd year in Philadelphia



- Gained 5,785 yards during his 10-year NFL career with Philadelphia (1997-2003) and Pittsburgh (2004-06)
- A 3rd round draft pick of Eagles in 1997, ranks 4th on team's all-time rushing list. Is one of two Eagles to top the 200-yard rushing mark in a game (Steve Van Buren)
- Earned a Super Bowl championship ring with the Steelers in 2005
- His Eagle teammates voted him offensive MVP three times (1998, '99, and 2002)

## JIM WASHBURN

Defensive Line

2nd year in Philadelphia



- Regarded by many observers as the best D-line coach in the league, joined Eagles in 2011 after 12-year tenure in Tennessee
- In his first year in Philly, the Eagles led the NFL with 50 sacks, 46 of which came from the defensive line. DE Jason Babin notched a career-high 18 and earned his second trip to the Pro Bowl
- During his time with the Titans, they ranked 7th in the NFL in sacks and 5th in rushing yards allowed, while helping them earn six playoff berths, three division titles and one AFC championship
- Tutored five D-linemen to 11 Pro Bowls: Babin, Kyle Vanden Bosch, Kevin Carter, Albert Haynesworth, Jevon Kearse
- His son, Brady, was a D-lineman at Clemson and his other son, Jeremiah, was an O-lineman at Arkansas and is an assistant O-line coach with the Detroit Lions

## TED WILLIAMS

Running Backs

18th year in Philadelphia



- Under his tutelage, LeSean McCoy developed into an All-Pro player in 2011 with 1,309 rushing yards and team-record 20 total touchdowns (17 on the ground)
- In addition, McCoy ranked 4th in the NFL with 1,672 total yards from scrimmage in 2010 and broke the Eagles rookie rushing record with 637 yards in 2009
- Tutored a 1,000-yard rusher eight times during his tenure in Philadelphia (three by Staley, two by Brian Westbrook and McCoy and one by Ricky Watters)

- In 2009, Leonard Weaver became 2nd Eagle FB ever to earn Pro Bowl honors

3rd year in Philadelphia

- A 9th round draft choice of the San Diego Chargers in 1986, Zordich played in 185 games for the New York Jets, Phoenix Cardinals and the Eagles (1994-98) and recorded 810 tackles, 20 interceptions, five sacks and four touchdowns
- Earned All-America honors at Penn State, where he was part of their 1982 National Championship squad
- His son, Michael, is a fullback at Penn State, and his son, Alex is a quarterback at the University of Buffalo

## BARRY RUBIN

Head Strength & Conditioning

5th year in Philadelphia



- Spent his first 2 seasons in Philadelphia as a strength and conditioning assistant
- Previously served as the head strength and conditioning coach of the Green Bay Packers from 1999-2005
- In 2003, was inducted into the USA Strength and Conditioning Coaches Hall of Fame for his contributions to the field

## RICK BURKHOLDER

Head Athletic Trainer

14th year in Philadelphia



- Joined Eagles in 1999 after six seasons as assistant athletic trainer with the Steelers
- Burkholder and his staff were voted by their NFL peers as the Athletic Training Staff of the Year in 2010
- A Carlisle, PA, native, was influenced by his father, Richard, a long-time athletic trainer at Carlisle HS, and his mother, Nancy, a registered nurse

## JEFFREY LURIE Chairman/Chief Executive Officer

16th year in Philadelphia  
Overall Record: 166-126-2 (.568)



Driven by a tireless pursuit of a Super Bowl championship for the city of Philadelphia, Jeffrey Lurie has shaped the Eagles into one of the most successful organizations in professional sports on and off the field. Along the way he has fueled energy, optimism, and pride throughout the entire organization, and has provided first-class working facilities along with a family atmosphere.

Taking over a franchise that made the playoffs just 14 times in a 62-year span (23%), the Eagles have been a perennial Super Bowl contender under Lurie, earning playoff berths in 11 of his 17 years as owner (65%). In fact, only three teams have made more playoff appearances than the Eagles since 1995, Lurie's first full season as owner. The Eagles have a greater overall winning percentage and appeared in more playoff games (22) and won more (11) than any other ownership group in team history.

Along the way, the Eagles have captured six NFC East division crowns in a span of 11 years. From 2000-09, the Eagles won an NFC-best 103 regular season games and 10 playoff contests, while capturing five division titles (trailing only New England's 6). As such the Eagles became just the 13th team to top the century mark in wins over the course of one decade.

### LURIE'S LANDMARKS:

- He and Christina Weiss Lurie served as executive producers of the 2010 documentary film *Inside Job* which earned the Academy Award for Best Documentary
- The Eagles, based on the work of EYP, Tackling Breast Cancer, and *Go Green!* initiatives, earned the coveted 2011 Sport Team of the Year award by Beyond Sport, a global organization that promotes, develops and funds the use of sport to create positive social change across the world. They were a finalist for that award in 2010
- Under his direction, the Eagles *Go Green!* program was a groundbreaking initiative to better the environment by creating and sustaining programs that improve the quality of life in the Philadelphia region, green the environment and reduce the team's impact on the planet
- Lurie is a director of the NLM Family Foundation, which devotes much of their resources to autism research and education. NLM co-funded a short documentary film entitled *Autism Is A World* that received nomination for a 2005 Academy Award
- The Lurie Family Foundation was also established by Jeffrey and Christina Weiss Lurie with an emphasis on health issues, especially in the areas of autism and cancer research
- Serves as chairman of the Los Angeles Stadium Working Group Committee, in addition to sitting on the NFL's Finance Committee, Broadcast Committee, International Committee, and the Super Bowl Advisory Committee
- Was named NFL owner of the year by *The Sporting News* in 1995 and by *Pro Football Insider* in 2000

The youngest, but one of the most aggressive general managers in the league, Roseman is in his 13th season in Philadelphia and his 3rd as the Eagles GM. His tenacity, creativity and ability to develop and nurture positive relationships in every part of his job has played a significant role in Roseman's ascent within the Eagles organization.

The Brooklyn, NY, native relentlessly pursued jobs in the front office of an NFL team and finally got his foot in the door with the Eagles in 2000 as salary cap/staff counsel, and eventually worked his way up to his dream job. Roseman was elevated to director of football administration in 2003 and to vice president of football administration in 2006.

### SCOUTING UP ROSEMAN:

- His drafts from 2010-11 produced 126 overall starts, the 6th highest total in the entire league during that span
- His aggressive nature has fueled a whopping 30 trades since 2010. In addition, the Eagles have drafted a league-high 33 players over that time frame. All but five of those players are on the team's 2012 training camp roster
- Since Roseman became the team's vice president of player personnel in 2009, the Eagles have added several key players to their arsenal, including Pro Bowlers Jason Peters, Michael Vick, LeSean McCoy, and Jason Babin. Several other prominent starters - DeMeco Ryans, Nnamdi Asomugha and Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie and Evan Mathis - have been acquired under his guidance
- In the 2012 offseason, the Eagles made it a priority to retain the services of many of their own players and he aggressively negotiated and inked long-term deals for DeSean Jackson, McCoy, Trent Cole, Todd Herremans, Mathis and Cullen Jenkins. He also engineered a blockbuster trade for Ryans, a two-time All-Pro linebacker, and signed free agent T Demetress Bell just days after learning of the Achilles injury suffered by the All-Pro Peters
- Also active in the community, he donates tickets to the Federation Allied Jewish Appeal as well as to soldiers from the McGuire and Dover Air Force bases. For his continued efforts with the military, he was named Honorary Commander for the Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst. He also delivers toys several times per year to patients at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia

Despite a slow start and early injury concerns, the Philadelphia Eagles displayed the team's depth in a 24-23 comeback victory over the Pittsburgh Steelers.

The Steelers opened up the game with a 10-minute drive, but the Eagles defense was able to hold them to a **Shaun Suisham** 46-yard field goal, giving Pittsburgh a 3-0 edge. On Pittsburgh's next possession, the defense locked down to prevent the Steelers from moving the ball, which included a sack and forced fumble from DE **Phillip Hunt** on QB **Ben Roethlisberger**.



JOHNSON

The Steelers added to their lead in the second quarter with a Leftwich touchdown pass to WR **Emmanuel Sanders** and a second field goal by Suisham, and brought a 13-0 lead into halftime.

With 8:01 left in the third quarter, QB **Nick Foles** put the Eagles on the scoreboard with a 70-yard touchdown pass to WR **Damaris Johnson**. Foles followed up his first score with another on the Eagles next drive, hitting WR **Mardy Gilyard** deep down the left sideline for a 44-yard touchdown pass.

Pittsburgh reclaimed the lead with 2:57 left in the third quarter via a 57-yard catch and run by Pittsburgh RB **Chris Rainey**.

QB **Trent Edwards** took control under center for the Eagles in the fourth quarter, and hit WR **Jamel Hamler** on a 16-yard TD pass with 5:26 remaining in the game. The lead was short-lived, however, as K **Daniel Hrapmann** gave the Steelers a 23-21 edge on a 43-yard field goal.

Edwards responded by bringing the Eagles two-minute offense marching 45 yards down the field in 11 plays, setting up a 51-yard field goal K **Alex Henery**. The second-year kicker put it straight through the uprights with 12 seconds left in the game, icing the game and giving the Birds their first win of the preseason, 24-23.

- K **Alex Henery** on hitting the game-winner: "Yeah, it was a good hit and I'm glad it went in. It's good to get some practice before the regular season. I was happy with how I hit it. It really makes it a little bit harder from that distance. I had the wind at my back and trusted what I had been working on all week, so I'm glad it went in."
- Head coach **Andy Reid** on how the younger players performed: "I was proud of the way the 3's and the 4's finished the game. I saw a lot of good things from the young kids. I thought they really did some nice things, played hard and physical, and they really played emotional football in the second half. We can build on that."
- Reid on what he will be looking for in his evaluation of LB **De-Meco Ryans**: "I want to see him continue to play fast every day and get a little bit better at it. He's handling the mental part fine, and he seems to be picking things up. He's been doing a good job in practice and he's able to adjust. You saw a few different motions that they threw at him. He had no problems, and was able to make the adjustments."
- The Birds defense tallied seven sacks against Pittsburgh, a total they surpassed only once last season. They were led by DE **Phillip Hunt**, who had two QB takedowns
- WR **Damaris Johnson** has shown why he was one of the most highly-touted Eagles rookie free agent signings so far this preseason. Johnson caught a team-high four passes for 85 yards (21.3 yards/catch) with a 70-yard touchdown while fielding three punts for 18 yards and a kickoff return. "I see a kid who goes out and works extremely hard," said QB **Michael Vick** of Johnson. "He's very bright. He puts himself in the right positions and he does everything the coaches ask him to do and that's all you can ask for out of a young player. I'm pleased to see him playing as well as he is and it was great to see him get into the end zone."
- QB **Nick Foles** showed his ability to make big plays in his first snaps as a pro, as he threw two long-distance touchdown strikes to Damaris Johnson (70 yards) and wideout **Mardy Gilyard** (44 yards). "It was exciting. It was my first time getting to be in an NFL stadium. To be out here, in Philadelphia, in front of the fans, was a special moment. It was fun to go out there and play football again."

- The Eagles selected three defenders in the first two rounds of the draft, swinging a first round trade with Seattle to nab DT **Fletcher Cox** while selecting LB **Mychal Kendricks** and DE **Vinny Curry** in the second round
- CB **Brandon Boykin**, Philadelphia's fourth-round draft choice and Georgia's all-time leading return man (110 KO returns, 2,663 yards, all-time SEC leading four career kick return TDs) is vying for a role in both the return game and the secondary
- Sixth round selection WR **Marvin McNutt** and undrafted rookie WR **Damaris Johnson** are in line for increased playing time after injuries hit the wide receiving corps. Johnson is the NCAA's all-time leader in all-purpose yardage

### NEW FACES FOR 2012

While the 2012 Philadelphia Eagles roster does not look drastically different from the team that won four straight games to close out 2011, the squad did add several key offseason acquisitions in their quest to bring a Super Bowl title to the city of Philadelphia.

- Fresh off of a stint as interim head coach of the Miami Dolphins, **Todd Bowles** was brought in to mentor the Birds secondary. The Temple University product is entering his 13th season as an NFL coach
- Two-time Pro Bowler MLB **DeMeco Ryans** was acquired via trade from the Houston Texans in March of this past offseason. A team captain with Houston, Ryans impressive resume includes 637 career tackles, 8.5 sacks, an AP All-Pro selection in 2007, and trips to Honolulu in '07 and 2009
- The Eagles signed unrestricted free agent T **Demetress Bell** in April, an athletic left tackle who brings 30 career starts to the Birds o-line unit
- Veteran safety **Oshiomogho Atogwe** was signed just before training camp to provide depth in the secondary
- Fresh off rehabbing a foot injury, ninth-year P **Mat McBriar** was added on 7/25/12 to compete with **Chas Henry** for punting duties

- Henery made 24-for-27 (88.9%) field goal attempts in 2011, the best single-season percentage in Eagles history and most successful percentage all-time for a rookie kicker, besting the previous mark of 86.2% held by Kris Brown (1999) and Ryan Succop (2009)
- The 88.9% success rate was also third in the conference and fifth in the league last season
- Henery's 118 points set a new season-high for an Eagles rookie kicker. The old record was 116 (Paul McFadden in 1984)

## ON THE OFFENSIVE

The 2012 edition of the Philadelphia Eagles hope to continue the success they had on offense last season under offensive coordinator Marty Mornhinweg.

- The Birds set a new all-time high last year in total net yards with 6,386, topping the previous record of 6,230 set in 2010
- Each of the franchise's top five yardage outputs have come under Mornhinweg's guidance over the past six seasons (2006-11)
- Last year's Eagles finished third in the conference and fourth in the league averaging 399.1 yards per game of total offense
- With a team-record 356 first downs, the Eagles finished second in the NFC and fourth in the league last season: 134 came via the rush (tops in the league), 197 via the pass, and 25 due to penalties
- Since Mornhinweg took over as offensive coordinator in 2004, Philly is third in the NFC and fourth in the NFL with 363.4 yards per game

## RECORD BREAKING RUSH ATTACK

Led by **LeSean McCoy's** best season in Philadelphia, the revamped Eagles rushing attack will look to build off the unit's 2011 campaign.

- McCoy finished last season with new career-highs in attempts (273) and yards (1,309), the fifth-most among Eagles running backs all-time in a season and fourth among NFL backs in 2011
- His 20 TDs and 17 rushing scores led the NFL and also broke a team record set by RB Steve Van Buren in 1945
- McCoy's 120 points led the league among non-kickers and were the seventh-highest total in franchise history. The last non-kicker to lead the Eagles in scoring was Calvin Williams in 1993
- The third-year pro also finished fifth in the NFL with 1,624 scrimmage yards
- Since McCoy joined the team in 2009, the Eagles are second the NFC and sixth in the NFL, compiling 6,237 rushing yards

## TRUSTED TARGETS

Philadelphia's wide receiving corps has developed into one of the most talented and varied skill position groups in the NFL, and look to continue to grow after a stellar 2011.

- The Eagles finished 2011 with four receivers who tallied 50+ receptions: WR **Jeremy Maclin** (63), TE **Brent Celek** (62), WR **DeSean Jackson** (58), and WR **Jason Avant** (52). Jackson (961), Maclin (859) and Celek (811) became the first trio in team history to rack up 800+ yards in one season

### ACTION JACKSON

- For the fourth consecutive season, WR DeSean Jackson led the team in receiving yards (961) and yards per catch (16.6) in 2011. His 229 career receptions for 4,085 yards are the highest in team annals through a receiver's first four seasons.

### J-MAC ATTACK

- Now healthy, WR Jeremy Maclin is poised for a big season after he led the team with 63 catches while also collecting 859 yards during an adversity filled 2011 season

### CEL-BLOCK #87

- TE Brent Celek, who did not miss a game despite battling injuries in 2011, further solidified his reputation as one of the best tight ends in the league. His 500 yards after the catch were the best among NFC TEs, and 8.1 average yards after catch was the best total in the league

### CAREER HIGHS FOR AVANT

- In his seventh season in Philly, WR Jason Avant is coming off a season where he established new career-bests in catches (52), yards (679), and yards per catch (13.1). The former Michigan standout remains one of the Eagles most sure-handed receivers and one of the biggest locker room leaders

## SECOND YEAR SURGE

Under second-year defensive coordinator **Juan Castillo**, the Eagles will look to build off of their solid finish to 2011 defensively.

- After allowing 344.8 total yards per game the first 12 weeks of the 2011 season, the Eagles 'D' allowed just 265.0 yards per game in their last four contests, including 103.5 yards per game via the rush and 161.5 against the pass
- The Eagles allowed only 11.5 points per game over their last four contests, which is second in the league only to Pittsburgh's 7.8
- Over the first 8 games of the season, the Eagles allowed 8 rushing plays of 20-plus yards. After that, they surrendered just two (one in last four games)
- Over their final 11 contests (7-4 record), the Eagles held opponents to just 17.8 points per game while forcing 19 takeaways

- Acquired from Arizona last season, CB **Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie** will take over as a starter for the departed Asante Samuel. Rodgers-Cromartie has picked off 13 INTs in his career, four of which he took back for TDs
- With Rodgers-Cromartie moving out of the nickel corner role, **Joselio Hanson** has been seeing most of the first-team reps. **Brandon Boykin** and **Curtis Marsh** have also been splitting time at the position
- The Eagles added veteran safety **Oshiomogho (O.J.) Atogwe**, who will provide depth to the secondary. The eighth year player has compiled 25 career INTs, three of which came in 2011 with the Redskins

- Philadelphia had 13 different players tally at least one sack in 2011



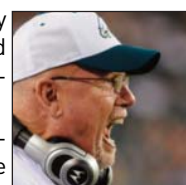

## HISTORICALLY SACKING

The Eagles have proven over the years that they have a knack for getting to the quarterback, and will look to continue to do so in 2012 after a stellar 2011

- Since 1982 when sacks became an official statistic, the Eagles have recorded the most in the league with 1,359
- Since 1999, both the Philadelphia and Washburn's defenses have had one common goal: get to the QB. The Eagles have compiled an NFC-best 560 sacks in that time
- During that same span, Washburn's squads have had 525.0 sacks, including 474 compiled by Tennessee's defense from 1999-2010 while he was the Titans defensive line coach

# DEFENSIVE NOTES & TRENDS



## DYNAMIC DUO

Defensive ends **Jason Babin** and **Trent Cole** combined to be one of the most dominant pass-rushing forces in Philadelphia Eagles history. The pair of pass rushers accumulated 29 sacks in 2011, which is tied for second-most in Eagles annals behind Reggie White and Clyde Simmons combined for 33 in 1992.

### BABIN THE BEAST

- Babin put up his finest season as a pro in 2011, and was tied for third in the league with 18 sacks at the season's end. It also marked the third-highest single season total in franchise history behind Clyde Simmons (19.0) and Reggie White (21.0)
- Babin collected five multi-sack outings in 2011 to bring his career total to 11. He had three sacks vs. NY Jets (12/18), Miami (12/11) and San Francisco (10/2), and two sacks against Seattle (12/1), Dallas (10/30), and St. Louis (9/11)
- After racking up 12.5 sacks in 2010, Babin has 30.5 sacks since the beginning of last season, which is third behind DeMarcus Ware (35) and Jared Allen (33)

### SACK COLE-LITION

- Cole collected 11 sacks in 2011 despite missing two games with a calf injury, eight of which came after he returned. He tallied a season-high 3.0 sacks in the Eagles win over Miami (12/11)
- A seventh year pro out of Cincinnati, Cole is third all-time in Eagles history and third among NFC defenders with 68.0 career quarterback takedowns

## TACKLING ADVERSITY

The Eagles are locked and loaded at defensive tackle in 2012 despite missing **Mike Patterson** (out indefinitely recovering from brain surgery), one of the Eagles most constant contributors since his arrival as a first-round selection in 2004.



LANDRI

- A sixth-year pro, **Cullen Jenkins** impressed in his first season in Philadelphia, registering 5.5 sacks
- DT **Derek Landri** led the team with eight tackles for loss in 2011 after re-joining the team in October
- With their first round selection in 2012, the Eagles moved up three slots to the 12th overall pick to draft DT **Fletcher Cox** from Mississippi State. Cox was recognized with first team All-SEC honors after posting five sacks and 56 tackles his senior year

## MANNING THE MIDDLE

In one of the biggest moves of the 2012 offseason, the Eagles acquired MLB **DeMeco Ryans** in a trade with the Houston Texans.

- A two-time Pro Bowler (2009, 2007), Ryans was tabbed as a first team All-Pro performer by AP and garnered Defensive Rookie of the Year honors in 2006
- The Bessemer, Alabama, native left Houston as the Texans all-time leader with 637 tackles, and led the club or tied for the team lead in tackles 30 times
- Named the Texans 2011 Ed Block Courage Award winner for not missing a game that season after being placed on injured reserve in 2010 with a torn Achilles tendon

## REVAMPED LINEBACKING CORPS

The Eagles hope to solidify the linebacker position in 2012 thanks to experienced veterans and an influx of new talent.



ROLLE

- With their first draft pick in the second round, the Eagles selected **Mychal Kendricks** from California. Kendricks, penciled in as the starter at SAM linebacker, earned several All-America selections as a senior in 2011, and was named the Pac-12's Defensive Player of the Year, playing in all 13 games with 11 starts, leading the team in tackles with a career-high 106, while adding two interceptions and three sacks
- In his second season in Philadelphia, **Brian Rolle** posted an impressive rookie season. In addition to 63 tackles and a sack, the Birds sixth-round selection stripped RB Matt Forte and scooped up the loose ball and returned it 22 yards for his first career touchdown vs. Chi. (11/7)
- Jamar Chaney** led the 2011 squad with in tackles (104), ranked 2nd in pass breakups (10), and tied for 2nd in interceptions (3). Chaney also proved his versatility with starts at both SAM and MLB over his three-year stint with Philadelphia since being drafted in the seventh-round of 2010

## QUARTERBACKS

A multi-dimensional threat from the quarterback position, **Michael Vick** made the most of his first full offseason in Philadelphia in 2012 and, as a whole, is enjoying the second phase of his NFL career. In 2011, Vick helped engineer a franchise-record 6,386 yards of offense, while setting career marks in attempts (423), completions (253), and yards (3,303). Vick is the NFL's all-time rushing leader among quarterbacks and became just the 2nd player in NFL history to surpass the 3,000-yard passing mark and the 500-yard rushing mark in consecutive seasons. Vick was selected with the first overall pick in 2001 draft by Atlanta, signed with Philadelphia in 2009 and inked a six-year contract extension with the Eagles in 2011.



Behind Vick is 3rd-year signal caller **Mike Kafka**, a fourth round draft choice in 2010 from Northwestern. A talented and cerebral player, he served as the Eagles 3rd QB for most of his first two NFL campaigns and connected on 68.8% of his passes last year in his first NFL action.

Rookie 3rd round pick **Nick Foles** finished his career at Arizona as the school's all-time leading passer in terms of yards (10,011), TDs (67), attempts (1,369) and completions (933) en route to earning three consecutive All-Pac 10 honorable mention honors (2009-11).

**Trent Edwards** signed as a free agent during the 2012 offseason. A former third round selection of the Bills in 2007, Edwards has completed 60.5% of his career passes with Buffalo and Jacksonville from 2007-10.

## RUNNING BACKS

One of the most dynamic backs in the game, **LeSean McCoy** rushed his way into the Eagles record book during a breakout season in 2011. His 20 total touchdowns and league-leading 17 rushing scores shattered franchise records set by Hall of Famer Steve Van Buren in 1945. The Harrisburg, PA, native gained 1,309 rushing yards (5th in Eagles history) and garnered first team All-Pro and FedEx Ground Player of the Year honors as well as his first Pro Bowl berth. The Eagles second round pick in 2009 out of Pittsburgh, McCoy, nicknamed "Shady," has also proved his worth as a receiver out of the backfield. McCoy signed a five-year contract extension during the 2012 offseason that will keep him in Philadelphia through 2017.



**Dion Lewis**, a speedy and shifty 5th round draft pick from Pittsburgh in 2011, spent his rookie season as both a reserve running back and kick returner.

Depth at running back is also provided by rookies **Bryce Brown** (D7-12) and **Chris Polk**, a rookie free agent from Washington.

**Brown** took a circuitous route to the NFL after being tabbed as the nation's number one recruit coming out of high school in Wichita, KS in 2008. He only played 13 games at the collegiate level with Tennessee and Kansas State. **Polk** finished as the Huskies 2nd all-time leading rusher with 4,049 yards.

Fullback **Stanley Havili** (D7b-11 from USC) spent his rookie season of 2011 on the Eagles practice squad. He is the leading candidate to take over the fullback spot in 2012.

Challenging Havili is rookie free agent **Emil Igwenagu** (UMass).

## WIDE RECEIVERS

Armed with a unique combination of speed, skill, and a relentless, competitive desire, **DeSean Jackson** is one of the NFL's most dangerous weapons. The team's 2nd round draft pick in 2008, Jackson earned Pro Bowl berths in 2009 and 2010. In fact, he became the first player in league history to earn a Pro Bowl berth at two positions in 2009. A native of Los Angeles, CA, Jackson became the first player in NFL history to accumulate 3,500 receiving yards and 1,000 punt returns yards in his first four seasons. He was rewarded for his effort with a five-year contract extension in 2012 that will keep him in an Eagles uniform through 2016.



A 1st round pick in 2009, **Jeremy Maclin** proved his toughness in 2011 by posting a team-high 63 catches for 859 yards despite spending an offseason ruling out cancer as an ailment that zapped a good deal of his strength and stamina. The Missouri product caught a team-leading 189 passes over his first three NFL campaigns. Only one other Eagle has ever caught more in their first three seasons (TE Keith Jackson)



One of the most sure-handed receivers in the league, **Jason Avant** set new career benchmarks with 52 catches and 679 yards in 2011. In fact, the 7th-year pro from Michigan increased his reception total during each of his first six campaigns. Avant, who overcame a rough childhood in Chicago, IL, is one of the most respected players in the confines of the Eagles locker room.

A 5th round draft choice in 2010, **Riley Cooper** provides size to the wide receivers ranks while proving to be an accomplished performer on special teams.

A former 2nd lieutenant in the Air Force, **Chad Hall** is a reserve wide receiver and return man for the Eagles over the last two seasons.

Originally a 4th round selection of St. Louis in 2010, **Mardy Gilyard** played in 11 career games for the Rams, all in 2010.

Rookie 6th round draft pick **Marvin McNutt** finished his career at Iowa with 170 receptions for 2,861 yards and 28 touchdowns after converting from quarterback as a sophomore.

**Jamel Hamler**, a rookie free agent signee of Denver in 2011, spent his rookie season on the Eagles practice squad.

Rounding out the position group are **Tiger Jones**, who starred with the Philadelphia Soul of the Arena League, and rookie free agents **Elvis Akpla** (Montana State), **Brian Hernandez** (Utah), **McKay Jacobson** (BYU), and **Damaris Johnson** (Tulsa). Johnson finished his three-year career at Tulsa as the NCAA's all-time leader in all-purpose yardage (7,796)

## TIGHT ENDS

Recognized for his ability both as a receiver and as a blocker, **Brent Celek** is in his 6th NFL season after joining the team as a 5th round pick in 2007. Celek hauled in 223 passes during his career, 6th most ever by an Eagles tight end.

Reserve tight ends are 2010 4th rounder **Clay Harbor**, 1st-year pro **Brett Brackett**, a native of Lawrence, NJ, and rookie free agent **Chase Ford** (Miami, FL).

## OFFENSIVE LINE

2nd-year center **Jason Kelce** anchors a young and talented line tutored by renowned offensive line coach **Howard Mudd**. Kelce started all 16 games for the Eagles a year ago after being drafted in the 6th round from Cincinnati. He earned all-rookie team honors and earned high praise from his head coach along the way. "This kid could be Howard's son," said Andy Reid. "Not only do they look and act alike, their playing styles are the same. He's a phenomenal athlete, plus he's a smart kid."

Manning the right tackle spot for the 2nd year is eight-year vet **Todd Herremans**. The team's 5th round draft pick in 2005, he served primarily as the Eagles left guard from 2006-10. Herremans, who earned All-Joe honors from the USA Today in 2008 and 2011, also has two career touchdown receptions. He inked a contract extension in 2012 that will keep him in Philly through 2016.

Now in his 2nd season in Philadelphia, **Evan Mathis** flourished in his first year in Mudd's system in 2011 and started 15 games. In fact, the former 3rd round draft choice of Carolina was tabbed as the 18th best player in the NFL by Pro Football Focus. He previously played with Carolina, Miami and Cincinnati.

A first round pick in 2011, **Danny Watkins** started 12 games at right guard last season. Watkins combined with Kelce to become the first Eagles rookie duo to start 10-or-more games in the same season. A native of Kelowna, British Columbia, Canada, he was named to the PFW/PFWA All-Rookie team.

**Demetress Bell** was signed during the 2012 offseason to offset the Achilles injury suffered by Pro Bowl LT **Jason Peters**. Bell, who served as an understudy to Peters in Buffalo, started 30 games for the Bills at left tackle from 2009-11. He was originally recruited to Northwestern State in basketball before making the change to football. He was drafted in the 7th round by Buffalo in 2008.

**King Dunlap** has experience at both tackle and guard for the Eagles since being drafted in the 7th round in 2008.

**Mike Gibson** has lined up at center and guard during his three-year NFL career in Seattle (2009-11). He was originally drafted by Philadelphia in 2008 in the 6th round.

A fifth round draft pick from Iowa in 2011, **Julian Vandervelde** adds depth at guard and center, as does **Dallas Reynolds**, who spent the majority of the last three seasons on the Eagles practice squad.

Other linemen with NFL experience on the roster include center **Steve Vallos**, tackle **Thomas Welch**, and tackle **D.J. Jones**.

Three rookies are competing for roster spots: T **Dennis Kelly** (5th round pick from Purdue), G **Brandon Washington** (6th rounder from Miami, FL), and rookie free agent G **Alfred McCullough**. (Georgia).

**PUP list:** In 2000, he was a redshirt defensive lineman in college, laboring on Arkansas' scout team. In 2004, he was a rookie free agent tight end just looking for playing time in Buffalo. Now, he is a five-time Pro Bowl offensive tackle who is building his resume for a spot in the Pro Football Hall of Fame. In between is the remarkable story of **Jason Peters**, who is regarded by many experts as the best left tackle in the game, and who has anchored the Eagles offensive line since being acquired in a trade from Buffalo in 2009. Peters, who is signed through 2014, will be slowed at the start of the 2012 season after rupturing his Achilles tendon during the offseason.

## DEFENSIVE LINE

A fifth round draft selection from Cincinnati in 2005, two-time Pro Bowl selection **Trent Cole** is a proven commodity at rushing the passer and stopping the run. Now in his 8th season in Philadelphia, Cole has the third most sacks in Eagles history, trailing only Reggie White and Clyde Simmons. Cole was rewarded with a four-year contract extension in 2012 that will keep him in Philadelphia through 2017.



COLE

Cole's running mate at defensive end is **Jason Babin**, a two-time Pro Bowl selection himself. Since the start of the 2010 season, Babin ranks third in the NFL with 30.5 sacks after registering a career-high 18 sacks in 2011. He is one of just three players, along with DeMarcus Ware and Tamba Hali, to log 12+ sacks in each of the last two seasons. A former first round draft choice of Houston in 2004, Babin spent the 2009 season in Philadelphia before returning to the Eagles in 2011.



BABIN

A daunting and versatile presence, DT **Cullen Jenkins** provides a strong pass rush inside. A Super Bowl champion with the Packers in 2010, Jenkins entered the season with 34.5 career sacks, including 5.5 in his first season with Philadelphia in 2011.

DT **Mike Patterson**, a first round pick in 2005 from USC, is one of the toughest and most dependable players on the squad. Patterson missed just two games over his eight-year career, including just one game in 2011 after being diagnosed with a rare brain condition called arteriovenous malformation (AVM) that caused him to have a seizure during a training camp practice in August.

DE **Darryl Tapp** provides valuable depth at the defensive end position and is in his third season in Philadelphia after being acquired from a trade with Seattle in 2010.. A seven-year vet, Tapp has accumulated 23.5 sacks and nine forced fumbles in his career.

DE **Brandon Graham**, a first round draft selection in 2010 out of Michigan, battled back from a torn ACL suffered late in his rookie campaign to return to the field in a limited role in the latter half of the 2011 season.

DT **Derek Landri** is a high-motor presence in the middle of the defense. He led the Eagles with eight tackles for loss last year, despite playing in only 12 games. He previously played for Jacksonville (2007-09) and Carolina (2009-10) and started all 16 games for the Panthers in 2010 (three sacks).



# POSITION-BY-POSITION BREAKDOWN



DT **Antonio Dixon** missed the majority of the 2011 campaign after being placed on Injured Reserve on 10/4 with a torn triceps. Originally a rookie free agent signing of the Washington Redskins in 2009, Dixon was claimed off waivers by the Eagles prior to the 2009 season opener and transitioned from reliable contributor to a starter on the defensive line in 2010.

Signed in 2011 fresh off a successful stint in the CFL, DE **Phillip Hunt** provided quality depth on the defensive line in his first season with the team. Prior to his arrival in Philadelphia, Hunt notched 19 sacks from 2009-10 for the Winnipeg Blue Bombers, including a league-leading 16 sacks in 2010.

The Eagles also added a pair of high draft picks to the mix in 2012 in DT **Fletcher Cox** (12th overall pick) and DE **Vinny Curry** (2nd round). They moved up three spots in the draft to select **Cox**, who was named first-team All-SEC as a junior after collecting 56 tackles and five sacks in his final season at Mississippi State. **Curry** finished his four-year career at Marshall with 26 sacks, 49 tackles for a loss and 10 forced fumbles.

Rounding out the defensive line group is a trio of first-year pros in DT **Cedric Thornton**, DT **Ollie Ogbu** and DE **Xavier Brown** and rookie free agents DE **Monte Taylor** (Cincinnati) and DT **Frank Trotter** (Memphis).

## LINEBACKERS

A two-time All-Pro and Pro Bowl middle linebacker, **DeMeco Ryans** was acquired by the Eagles in 2012 in a trade with Houston. A 2nd round pick of the Texans in 2006, Ryans was the Texans all-time leader with 637 tackles. A team captain as well, he rebounded from an Achilles injury that shortened his 2010 season to play in all 16 games in a newly implemented 3-4 defensive scheme in Houston.

The Eagles added speedy LB **Mychal Kendricks** in the 2nd round in the 2012 draft from California. He appeared in all 51 games during his four-year career at Cal and was named the Pac-12's Defensive Player of the Year following his senior season.

**Brian Rolle** opened eyes in his first season with the Eagles, earning a starting role at WILL linebacker early on in his rookie campaign. A 6th round draft pick from Ohio State, Rolle had 63 tackles, one sack and a forced fumble which he returned for a TD in 2011.

The team's leading tackler in 2011, **Jamar Chaney** was a full-time starter a year ago, working mostly at the MLB position. A 7th round draft choice from Mississippi St. in 2010, he notched three INTs in 2011, the most by an Eagles LB since William Thomas had 3 in 1996.

A six-year vet out of Division 1-AA James Madison, **Akeem Jordan** started seven of the final eight games of the year at the SAM linebacker last year, while also contributing on special teams.

Second-year pro **Casey Matthews** became the first Eagles rookie to start at linebacker on opening day since Alonzo Johnson in 1986. Matthews was a 4th round draft pick from Oregon in 2011.

**Keenan Clayton** has served a key role on special teams and added depth to the linebacking corps since joining the team as a 4th round pick in 2010.

Rounding out the position group is **Monte Simmons**, who spent the 2011 season on the 49ers practice squad, along with **Adrian Moten**, who spent last season with the Seahawks and Colts, and rookie free agent **Ryan Rau** (Portland State).

## DEFENSIVE BACKS

A three-time Pro Bowler and four-time All Pro selection, and widely regarded as one of the elite cornerbacks in the NFL, **Nnamdi Asomugha** is in his second season with the Eagles after signing a five-year contract on the first day of free agency in 2011. Originally a first round pick of the Raiders in 2003, Asomugha ranked 2nd on the team with 3 INTs in his inaugural season in Philadelphia.



After serving as the Eagles nickel cornerback for the majority of the 2011 season, **Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie** will transition into a starting role on the outside. Acquired by the Eagles via trade with the Arizona Cardinals in exchange for QB Kevin Kolb on July 28, 2011, Rodgers-Cromartie has tallied 16 interceptions over his four-year career, including four career interception returns for TDs.

Returning for his seventh season in Philadelphia, **Joselio Hanson** has played a valuable role as a nickel cornerback. A gritty veteran, Hanson was originally signed by San Francisco as a rookie free agent out of Texas Tech in 2003.

A 3rd round draft pick in 2011, **Curtis Marsh** spent most of his rookie season learning the Eagles scheme, while seeing action in the team's final seven contests. Marsh provides depth at the cornerback position and should compete for playing time.

**Trevard Lindley** played in 11 games with the Eagles in his rookie campaign and tallied 21 tackles and an interception. The Kentucky alum was drafted in the 4th round in 2010.

**Brandon Hughes** has been a key contributor on special teams since joining the team in 2010 off the Giants practice squad. A 5th round pick of the Chargers in 2009, Hughes spent his rookie campaign on Injured Reserve before landing on the Giants practice squad.

**Kevin Thomas**, a 3rd round pick of the Colts in 2010 from USC, was acquired in a trade from Indianapolis on August 2.

The secondary will also feature first-year cornerbacks **Brandon Boykin**, a fourth round selection out of Georgia, and rookie free agents **Cliff Harris** (Oregon) and **Wade Bonner** (Mississippi State).

Entering his third year with the Eagles, **Nate Allen** re-established himself as the starting free safety for the Eagles after being hampered by a knee injury that required season-ending surgery in 2010. A second round draft choice of the Birds, Allen has notched five interceptions over his first two seasons in an Eagles uniform.

A third-year safety from Ohio State, hard-hitting safety **Kurt Coleman** battled his way back from losing a starting job to lead the Eagles in interceptions (4) and ranked second in tackles (96) in 2011. He was drafted by Philadelphia in the 7th round in 2010.

Arriving in Philadelphia after spending the 2011 season with Washington, **Oshiomogho Atogwe** brings a veteran presence to the safety position. Originally a 3rd round pick of St. Louis in 2005, Atogwe has 24 interceptions since 2006, which ranks second among safeties (Ed Reed, 35) in that time frame.

Second-year safety **Jaiquawn Jarrett**, the team's 2010 2nd round selection appeared in every game of his rookie campaign.

Special teams MVP **Colt Anderson** will look to rebound in 2012 after tearing his ACL during the 2011 campaign. Plucked from Minnesota's practice squad by the Eagles in 2010, Anderson has become a staple on the special teams unit.

**Tom Nelson** was added to the Eagles roster in 2011 and appeared in the final four games of the year. A third-year safety out of Illinois State, Nelson appeared in 21 games with the Bengals from 2009-10.

## **SPECIAL TEAMS**

Second-year placekicker **Alex Henery** set a franchise record and rookie NFL mark with an 88.9% field goal percentage in his first season with the Eagles. Selected in the fourth round of the 2011 draft, Henery finished fifth in the league in field goal percentage and connected on his final 16 kicks of the year, marking the third-longest streak in team history.

Punter **Chas Henry** was signed as a rookie free agent in 2011 from Florida, where he earned the 2010 Ray Guy Award as the nation's top punter. A consensus first-team All-America selection, Henry averaged 42.9 yards on 66 kicks in 2011.

On July 25, 2012, the Eagles signed two-time Pro Bowler and All-Pro punter **Mat McBriar** to a one-year contract. McBriar, who spent the previous eight seasons as a member of the Dallas Cowboys, averages 45.3 yards per punt, which ranks fifth in NFL history. He will look to rebound from a foot injury that resulted in his placement on Injured Reserve last season.

**Jon Dorenbos** is one of the league's most reliable long snappers and, as a result, earned Pro Bowl honors in 2009. The UTEP alum is in his 10th NFL season and his seventh in Philadelphia.

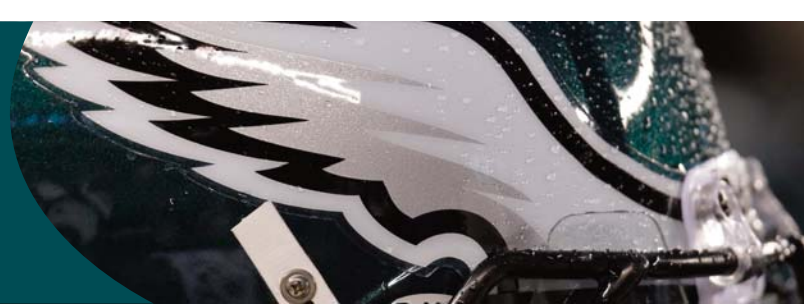
