#### NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (3-2) at SEATTLE SEAHAWKS (3-2)

Sunday, October 14, 2012 **★** CenturyLink Field (67,000) **★** 4:05 p.m. ET

The New England Patriots will be on the road for the fourth time in the first six weeks of the 2012 season when they travel west to face the Seattle Seahawks at CenturyLink Field on Sunday.

The game will feature the Patriots' top ranked offense against Seattle's top ranked defense.

Tom Brady will play at Seattle for the first time in his career. Brady has played an away game against every NFL team except San Francisco and Seattle. (Brady's only visit against Tampa Bay on the road in the regular season was played in London in 2009).

The Seattle game is the second meeting of four contests against the NFC West this year. The Patriots lost the home opener on Sept. 16, 20-18, to Arizona. New England will face St. Louis on Oct. 28 in London and will play San Francisco in a Sunday Night matchup on Dec. 16 at Gillette Stadium.

#### **BROADCAST INFORMATION**

**TELEVISION:** This week's game will be broadcast to a regional audience by **CBS** and can be seen in Boston on **WBZ-TV Channel 4. Ian Eagle** will handle play-by-play duties with **Dan Fouts** providing color. The game will be produced by **Bob Mansbach** and directed by **Suzanne Smith**.

**RADIO:** 98.5 FM, The Sports Hub, is the flagship station for the **Patriots Radio Network**. A complete listing of the network's 40 stations can be found in this press release. Play-by-play broadcaster **Gil Santos** is in his 36th season as the voice of the Patriots and will call the action. Former Patriots quarterback **Scott Zolak** will handle the color commentary, taking over duties for Gino Cappelletti. Cappelletti, a member of the original Boston Patriots in 1960 and the all-time leading scorer in the American Football League's history, retired from the broadcast team after 31 years as the team's iconic color analyst.

**NATIONAL RADIO:** This week's game will be broadcast to a national audience by **Sports USA. Larry Kahn** and **John Robinson** will call the game. **Troy West** will be the sideline reporter.

#### PATRIOTS WICKED GOOD IN OCTOBER

The Patriots are 33-6 in the month of October since the 2003 season and have won 24 out of their last 27 October games. The Patriots are 19-1 at home and 14-5 on the road during that time in October. The Patriots only home loss during that time was a 41-17 victory by the visiting San Diego Chargers on October 2, 2005.

## **ROBERT KRAFT NEWS & NOTES**

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. Now in his 19th season of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what many observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning



just 19 of 80 games (.238 pct.) and recording the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles (11), conference crowns (6) and Super Bowl championships (3) than any other NFL team. The Patriots have made six Super Bowl appearances since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other NFL franchise has earned more than four berths. In Kraft's first 18 seasons, the Patriots qualified for the playoffs 13 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons.

In the early 1990s, the Pathots seemed desched for relocation until Robert Kraft's purchase of the team rejuvenated local interest. In 1991, the season ticket base was just 17,635, barely enough to support the club. Now, the season tickets are capped and more than 50,000 fans are on a season ticket waiting list. The Patriots have sold out 197 consecutive home games, including playoff and preseason games (dating back to the 1994 season opener).

#### SERIES HISTORY

The New England Patriots and the Seattle Seahawks will meet

for the 16th time. This will be the second time the Patriots have played at Century Link Field following a 24-21 victory on Dec. 7, 2008.

The Patriots and Seahawks played 12 times in a 14-year span from 1980-93, but have played only twice since then (2004 and 2008).

The 2008 victory pushed the Patriots in front, 8-7, in the alltime series.



The Patriots have had the upper hand in road games against the Seahawks as they own a 4-2 record in games played in Seattle. The Patriots were 3-2 at the Kingdome (1976-1999)

New England won six of the first eight games in the series, which began in 1977.

The Patriots rallied from a 21-13 fourth-quarter deficit to defeat the Seattle Seahawks 24-21. Wes Welker had a seasonhigh 12 receptions for 134 yards, and Sammy Morris's touchdown run with 2:44 remaining gave the Patriots their first lead of the day and provided the winning margin. Seattle was driving for a potential game-tying field goal or go-ahead touchdown in the game's final minutes, but Brandon Meriweather sacked Seahawks quarterback Seneca Wallace and forced him to fumble near midfield on the first play after the 2-minute warning. Richard Seymour recovered the loose ball to preserve an exciting New England victory and keep pace in a tight AFC East race.

## CONNECTIONS

### **New England Ties**

- Seahawks Offensive Coordinator Darrel Bevell coached wide receivers at the University of Connecticut from 1998-99.
- Seahawks G John Moffitt is a native of Guilford, Conn. and attended Notre Dame High School in West Haven, Conn. Moffit was a member of the New England Top 20 team on Rivals.com and earned first-team All-State honors from the Hartford Courant.
- Seahawks T Breno Giacomini is a native of Malden, Mass. and was a three-year starter at Malden High School. Giacomini earned Greater Boston league all-star honors as a senior and played both defensive end and linebacker.
- Seahawks K Steven Hauschka is a native of Needham, Mass. and attended Middlebury College in Middlebury, VT. Hauschka played soccer and lacrosse at Middlebury before attending graduate school at North Carolina State where he kicked for the Wolfpack.

#### **Former Patriots**

- Seahawks Head Coach **Pete Carroll** served as the Patriots Head Coach from 1997-99. Carroll led the Patriots to an AFC East title in his first year as head coach and helped the team return to the playoffs the following season.
- Seahawks Quarterbacks Coach Carl Smith spent time in New England during Carroll's tenure as Patriots Head Coach and served as the Assistant Head Coach/Quarterbacks Coach in 1997 and the Tight Ends Coach from 1998-99. Under Smith's tutelage Patriots quarterback Drew Bledsoe was named to the AFC Pro Bowl team in 1997 and set careerhighs in touchdown passes (28) and passer rating (87.7).

#### Former Seahawks

- Patriots WR Deion Branch was traded from the Patriots to Seattle for a first-round draft selection on Sept. 11 following the first regular-season game of the 2006 season. Branch played for the Seahawks until 2010 when he was traded back to the Patriots on Oct. 12 in exchange for a fourthround draft pick.
- Patriots LB Niko Koutouvides was originally drafted by Seattle in the fourth round of the 2004 NFL Draft. Koutouvides produced 60 special teams tackles during his four seasons with the Seahawks (2004-07) and was part of the Seahawks's 2005 NFC Championship team.
- Patriots LB Tracy White played in 20 games with Seattle from 2003-04.

#### Former Teammates

- Patriots LB Tracy White and Seahawks P Jon Ryan were teammates in Green Bay from 2007-08. White also played one season (2008) in Green Bay with Seahawks QB Matt Flynn.
- White was defensive teammates with Seahawks DE Chris Clemons in Philadelphia during the 2009 season.
- Patriots CB Marquice Cole and Patriots RB Danny Woodhead were New York Jets teammates with Seahawks RB Leon Washington and Seahawks WR Braylon Edwards in 2009.
- Patriots TE Visanthe Shiancoe played on the offensive side of the ball in Minnesota with Seahawks WR Sidney Rice from 2007-10. Seahawks LB Heath Farwell also played with Shiancoe in Minnesota from 2007-10.
- Patriots DE Trevor Scott and Seahawks TE Zach Miller were teammates in Oakland from 2008-10. Seahawks G Paul McQuistan also played with Scott for the Raiders from 2008-09.

- Brady has 48 career 300 yard games in the regular season and needs one more to tie Warren Moon (49) for 7<sup>th</sup> place all time.

#### **STEPHEN GOSTKOWSKI**

- Stephen Gostkowski (7-of-10) needs one more 50-yard field goal to tie Adam Vinatieri (8-of-17) for most 50-yard field goals in Patriots history.
- Gostkowski has two 50-yarders so far in 2012 and can become the first Patriots player with three 50-yard field goals in a single season.

#### WES WELKER

- Wes Welker has three straight 100-yard games and can tie a team mark if he reaches 100-yards receiving at Seattle. Randy Moss has the Patriots record with four straight 100-yard games in 2007.
- Welker (15) needs one more 10-plus catch game to break a tie with Andre Johnson (15) of Houston and Reggie Wayne (15) of Indianapolis for the most 10-plus reception games among active players.
- Welker needs one reception to extend his streak to 83 straight regular-season games with at least one reception as a member of the Patriots to extend his franchise record. Welker has an overall streak of 99 straight regular-season games with at least one reception, including his time with the Miami Dolphins.
- Welker needs one more game with 10 catches and 100 yards to tie Jerry Rice (15) for the most such games in NFL history. Welker is tied with Andre Johnson (14) and Marvin Harrison (14) with 14 such games.

#### Stevan Ridley

• Stevan Ridley has rushed for 100 yards in two consecutive games and can become the first Patriots player to rush for 100 yards in three straight games since Curtis Martin closed out the 1995 season with five straight 100-yard games.

a career-high of 151 yards by RB Stevan Ridley to help lead New England to a 31-21 victory over the Denver Broncos.

It was the 13th meeting between Brady and Peyton Manning in a showdown of two of the NFL's top quarterbacks. Brady improved to a 9-4 record when facing Manning.

Brady completed 23 of 31 passes for 223 yards with one touchdown and a 1-yard touchdown run. Manning completed 31 of 44 passes for 345 yards with three touchdowns, but he lost a fumble on a sack by DL Rob Ninkovich in the third quarter that was recovered by DL Vince Wilfork at the Denver 14-yard line to set up an 8-yard touchdown run by Ridley for a 31-7 Patriots lead with under five minutes to play in the third quarter.

The Patriots set a franchise record with 35 first downs, their third straight game with 30 more first downs. It also marked the first time since 1978 that the Patriots had back-to-back games with at least 200 yards rushing.

After taking a 17-7 halftime lead and then taking a 31-7 third quarter lead, Manning and the Broncos attempted to make a comeback. The Broncos responded to the Ridley touchdown with a 10-play, 90-yard drive that was highlighted by two key third down passes from Manning to keep the drive alive before he connected with WR Eric Decker on a 2-yard touchdown pass to make it 31-14.

In the fourth quarter, the Patriots elected to go for a first down on a fourth-and-five situation from the Denver 37-yard line. Brady fumbled on a sack, allowing the Broncos to recover at the New England 43. That helped set up a drive that ended with a 5-yard touchdown pass to WR Brandon Stokley to make it 31-21. Ridley lost a fumble that was recovered at the Denver 32yard line with just over five minutes to play, but Ninkovich forced his second fumble on a hit to RB Willis McGahee at the Denver 14-yard line and the Patriots were able to run out the clock to secure the victory.

Denver wasted a scoring opportunity on their first drive. Manning connected on a 43-yard pass to WR Demaryius Thomas but DB Sterling Moore stripped and recovered the ball to end the scoring threat.

WR Wes Welker caught 13 passes for 104 yards and scored the Patriots' first points on an 8-yard touchdown in the first quarter. Denver tied the game early in the second quarter but the Patriots added 10 points before halftime to secure a 17-7 lead. RB Shane Vereen scored on a 1-yard touchdown on a 14-play, 80-yard drive and then K Stephen Gostkowski added a 23-yard field goal at the end of the quarter. The field goal drive was aided by two big third down plays. Facing a third-and-14, Brady hit RB Danny Woodhead on a short pass that went for a 25-yard gain. Then on a third-and-one, RB Brandon Bolden ran for 24 vards.

The Patriots defense forced three fumbles, including two inside New England territory to end scoring threats.

### PATRIOTS SET TEAM RECORD WITH 35 FIRST DOWNS

The Patriots gained a total of 35 first downs against Denver, marking the highest total in franchise history. New England had 18 first downs rushing, 16 first downs passing, and one first down by penalty. The previous team record for most first downs in a game was 34, achieved against the Washington Redskins on Oct. 28, 2007. New England's 35 first downs are the eighthhighest single-game total in NFL history.

#### PATRIOTS HAVE FIRST BACK-TO-BACK 200-YARD RUSHING GAMES SINCE 1978

The Patriots have had more than 200 rushing yards in back-toback games for the first time since 1978. Against Denver, New England finished the game with a total of 251 rushing yards on 54 carries. The previous week at Buffalo, New England had a total of 247 rushing yards. The last time New England had 200plus rushing yards in consecutive games was when it followed a 213-yard performance on Dec. 3, 1978 at Dallas with a 249-yard effort against Buffalo on Dec. 10, 1978.

#### PATRIOTS 251 YARDS ON THE GROUND ARE THE MOST FOR THE TEAM SINCE 2008

The Patriots had 54 rushes for 251 yards, recording the franchise's highest single-game rushing total since having 277 rushing yards in a 49-26 win at Oakland on Dec. 14, 2008.

### RIDLEY SETS CAREER-HIGH WITH 151 RUSHING YARDS

Stevan Ridley had a career-high 151 rushing yards on 28 carries (5.4 avg.) and added a touchdown. Ridley's 151 rushing yards were the highest single-game rushing yardage total by a Patriots player since Dec. 23, 2007, when Laurence Maroney had 156 yards on 14 carries (11.1 avg) in a 28-7 Patriots win over Miami. Ridley's previous best was the 125 yards he had in the 2012 season opener at Tennessee (9/9).

## RIDLEY HAS BACK-TO-BACK 100-YARD GAMES

Stevan Ridley had his third 100-yard rushing game of the 2012 season and his first back-to-back 100-yard game after gaining 106 in last week's game at Buffalo. Ridley's performances mark the first time the Patriots have had back-to-back 100-yard rushing games since Laurence Maroney accomplished the feat in 2007.

#### TWO OF THE BEST, PART I

The matchup between starting quarterbacks Tom Brady and Peyton Manning was only the second time in NFL history that two starting quarterbacks with 125+ career regular-season wins each meet in a game. The previous matchup featured Dan Marino (147) of the Miami Dolphins versus John Elway (148) of the Denver Broncos on December 21, 1998. Following today's game, Peyton Manning has 143 career victories and Tom Brady has 127 career wins.

#### TWO OF THE BEST, PART II

The game marked the first time in NFL history that two quarterbacks entered a game with more than 300 career touchdown passes. The veteran quarterbacks rank third (Manning, 410) and fifth (Brady, 308) respectively for most touchdown passes in NFL history.

#### WES WELKER SETS A PERSONAL MARK FOR MOST FIRST HALF RECEPTIONS

Wes Welker had nine catches in the first half, setting a new personal best for most receptions in a first half. Welker's personal best for most receptions in any half was 10 in the second half against Miami on Dec. 24, 2011. Prior to Denver, Welker's previous best for most first half receptions was eight receptions on Nov. 22, 2009 vs. N.Y. Jets and on Dec. 27, 2009 vs. Jacksonville. Terry Glenn set the franchise record with 11 first half receptions at Cleveland (10/3/99).

## WELKER HAS 15<sup>TH</sup> CAREER 10-PLUS CATCH GAME

With 13 receptions against Denver, Wes Welker had his 15th career game with 10 or more catches and is now tied with Andre Johnson (15) and Reggie Wayne (15) for the most among active NFL players. Welker's 15 career 10-plus catch games are tied with Johnson and Wayne for third all-time in NFL history, behind Jerry Rice (17), and Marvin Harrison (16). Welker has had 13 or more receptions in a game a total of five times.



## LAST GAME: PATRIOTS VS. BRONCOS

#### WELKER HAS THREE STRAIGHT WEEKS WITH 100 YARDS RECEIVING

Welker had 104 receiving yards against Denver, marking his third straight game with more than 100 receiving yards, tying a career long streak. Welker also had streaks of three straight games with 100 yards or more in 2008 and in 2011. The NFL record for most consecutive games with 100 yards or more receiving is seven by Charley Hennighan (Houston) in 1961 and Michael Irvin (Dallas) in 1995. The Patriots record for most consecutive 100-yard games is four by Randy Moss, who accomplished the feat in 2007.

#### PATRIOTS ARE THE FIRST TEAM WITH THREE STRAIGHT GAMES WITH 30 OR MORE FIRST DOWNS SINCE THE 1970 MERGER

The Patriots are the first team since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to have recorded 30 or more first downs in three straight games. The Patriots set a franchise record with 35 first downs, marking the team's third straight game with 30 or more first downs. New England also broke the 30 first down mark with 33 at Baltimore (9/23) and 33 at Buffalo (9/30).

#### MAYO GOES OVER 10 TACKLES

Jerod Mayo had a team-high 18 tackles against Denver. Mayo has had 10 or more tackles in four of the first five games in 2012.

### **DB ALFONZO DENNARD SEES FIRST NFL ACTION**

Seventh round draft pick DB Alfonzo Dennard saw action in his first NFL game. Dennard defensed a pass on a key third down play in the second quarter that forced Denver into a punting situation.

### **ROOKIE TAVON WILSON GETS FIRST NFL START**

Second round pick S Tavon Wilson made his first NFL start when he lined up at safety in place of Steve Gregory, who was out with an injury.

### MOORE TURNOVERS

Patriots defensive back Sterling Moore ended Denver's first offensive possession when he ran down Broncos wide receiver Demaryius Thomas and punched the ball loose, recording a forced fumble and then a fumble recovery to give New England possession. The play marked the first forced fumble and the first fumble recovery of Moore's career and was the third forced turnover of his career, joining his two interceptions in the 2011 regular-season finale against Buffalo.

#### NINKOVICH CAUSES A PAIR OF TURNOVERS; SECOND STRAIGHT WEEK A PLAYER FORCED TWO FUMBLES

Rob Ninkovich strip-sacked Peyton Manning on first down from the Broncos' 20-yard line in the third quarter and Vince Wilfork recovered the ball at the Broncos' 14-yard line to give the Patriots possession and set up a six-play, 14-yard drive that ended in an 8-yard touchdown run by Steven Ridley and a 31-7 Patriots lead. He forced his second fumble on a hit to RB Willis McGahee at the Denver 14-yard line and the Patriots were able to run out the clock to secure the victory. It is the second straight week that has happened. LB Brandon Spikes forced two fumbles at Buffalo (9/30).

#### PATRIOTS TWO-GAME TOTAL OF 498 RUSHING YARDS IS THE MOST FOR TEAM SINCE 1978

The Patriots totaled 251 rushing yards against Denver, and combined with their 247-yard performance last week against Buffalo have totaled 498 rushing yards over a two-week span. It's the best two-game aggregate rushing total for the team since gaining 519 total rushing yards in a two-game stretch from Oct. 29, 1978 (240 yards vs. N.Y. Jets) to Nov. 5, 1978 (279 yards vs. Buffalo).

#### PATRIOTS HAVE SEVEN RUSHING TOUCHDOWNS. IN LAST TWO GAMES; MOST IN A TWO-GAME SPAN IN MORE THAN 30 YEARS

The Patriots have scored seven rushing touchdowns in the last two weeks, scoring three times on the ground against the Broncos to follow up on a four-score performance on the ground last week in Buffalo. It's the first time since 1978 that the Patriots have had as many as seven rushing touchdowns in a two-game span. New England had eight rushing scores in a twogame span in 1978 when it scored four times on the ground on both Oct. 22, 1978 vs. Miami and on Oct. 29, 1978 vs. the New York Jets.

#### **RIDLEY STARTS STRONG**

Stevan Ridley has a total of 490 rushing yards through five games this season, recording the highest total for a Patriots running back through the season's first five games since Corey Dillon had 522 yards through the first five games of the 2004 season. In 2004, Dillon went on to record a team-record 1,635 rushing yards.

#### BRADY MOVES PAST BRETT FAVRE (36) WITH 37 STRAIGHT GAMES WITH A TOUCHDOWN

Tom Brady has now thrown at least one touchdown pass in 37 straight regular season games following a 4-yard touchdown pass to WR Wes Welker in the first quarter to move past Brett Favre (36) for the third longest streak in NFL history, behind Drew Brees at 48 (current) and Johnny Unitas (47) (1956-60). Brady's current streak started when he threw a touchdown pass in all 16 games in 2010 and 2011 and now the first five games of 2012. The old team record was 19 games, also set by Brady.

RB SHANE VEREEN SCORES SECOND NFL

## TOUCHDOWN

RB Shane Vereen scored his second NFL touchdown on a 1-yard run in the second quarter. He had a 4-yard touchdown run on Monday Night Football vs. Kansas City last season (11/21/11).

### PATRIOTS GO OVER 30 POINTS

The New England Patriots scored 31 points in the win vs. Denver for their fourth game in 2012 with 30 or more points after scoring 34 points at Tennessee, 30 points at Baltimore and 52 at Buffalo. The Patriots scored 30 points 12 times in 2011 to tie the NFL record for most 30-point games in a single season. The 2007 Patriots and the 1999 St. Louis Rams also had 12 30 point games. The NFL record for most consecutive 30-point games in a single season is eight by the 2007 and 2010 Patriots and the 2000 St. Louis Rams.

PATRIOTS HAVE BACK-TO-BACK GAMES WITH TWO 20-YARD RUNS FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 1995

Against Denver, RB Brandon Bolden had a 24-yard run and Stevan Ridley had a 20-yard run. The previous week at Buffalo, Bolden had a 27-yard run and a 20-yard run. It is the first time the Patriots have had back-to-back games with two 20 yard runs since 1995.

### **DEFENSIVE PLAYER QUICK HITS**

- Jerod Mayo had his first sack of the season in the first quarter, dropping Peyton Manning for a 7-yard loss on thirdand-five, forcing a Broncos punt on the next play.
- Brandon Spikes tackled Willis McGahee for a 4-yard loss in the first quarter.
- Vince Wilfork and Jermaine Cunningham teamed up to stop Willis McGahee for a loss of a yard on first-and-goal from the Patriots' 1-yard line in the third quarter.
- Chandler Jones batted down a Peyton Manning pass at the line of scrimmage in the second quarter.
- Rookie Alfonzo Dennard, making his NFL debut, broke up a Peyton Manning pass intended for Brandon Stokely on thirdand-five at the Patriots' 39-yard line in the second quarter, snuffing out a potential Denver scoring drive and forcing a Broncos punt on the next play.



## **GIL SANTOS – THE VOICE OF THE PATRIOTS**

For most Patriots fans, there has been but one "Voice of the New England Patriots" and it belongs to Gil Santos. Now in his 36 season, Santos has articulated the sights, sounds and all the play-by-play action for 732 games to millions of Patriots fans. Santos is tied with the Philadelphia Eagles' veteran play-by-play announcer, Merrill



Reese, as the two most tenured radio broadcasters in the NFL. Santos began calling games for the Boston Patriots at Fenway Park in 1966. He was the voice of the Patriots for the next 14 seasons (1966-79). He returned to the booth in 1991 and has broadcast every Patriots game since then.

#### PATRIOTS NAME 2012 TEAM CAPTAINS

The Patriots team captains are the same six who served as captains in 2011. The Patriots' 2012 captains were elected by their teammates. Quarterback Tom Brady and G Logan Mankins are the offensive captains. Nose tackle Vince Wilfork, LB Jerod Mayo and CB Devin McCourty are the defensive captains. Wide receiver Matthew Slater is the special teams captain. Brady has been chosen as a captain for the 11<sup>th</sup> straight season. Wilfork is a captain for the fifth straight season, while Mayo, is in his fourth season serving as a captain. Mankins, McCourty and Slater are captains for a second time.

#### TOM BRADY AND WELKER SCORE ON A 99-YARD PASS

Tom Brady connected with Wes Welker on a 99-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter of the 2011 season-opener at Miami (9/12/11). The 99-yard play tied the NFL record for the longest offensive play, which has been accomplished 14 times.

### 2012 PATRIOTS LEAD THE NFL WITH 165 POINTS

The Patriots are first in the NFL with 165 points in 2012 and are on pace for 528 points. It would be the third straight season scoring 500 or more points for the Patriots. If the Patriots keep their current scoring pace and finish with 528 points, it would be second in team history to the 589 points scored in 2007. The Patriots became the third team to ever have at least five straight 400-point seasons. ### 2012 WHAT TO LOOK FOR

### **BILL BELICHICK**

- Bill Belichick (195) needs seven more wins to move past Dan Reeves (201) into seventh place all-time.
- Belichick (17) needs one more postseason victory to move out of a tie with Joe Gibbs into sole possession of third place alltime in postseason wins. Tom Landry (20) is in first place followed by Don Shula (19).

#### TOM BRADY

- Tom Brady has 48 career 300-yard games. He is in eighth place all-time and needs one more 300-yard game to tie Hall of Famer Warren Moon for seventh place with 49 300-yard games.
- If Brady reaches 30 or more touchdowns passes in 2012 he will become just the fifth player in NFL history with at least 30 or more touchdown passes in four seasons.
- Brady needs one more postseason victory to set the NFL record for most career postseason wins by a starting quarterback. He enters 2012 tied with Joe Montana with 16 career postseason wins.
- Brady (21) needs one more AFC Offensive Player of the Week honor to break a tie with Peyton Manning (21) for the most player of the week honors in NFL history.
- If Brady reaches 4,000 passing yards in 2011, he will be just the fifth player in NFL history to reach 4,000 yards in five or more seasons: Peyton Manning (11), Dan Marino (6), Drew Brees (6) and Brett Favre (6).
- Brady has thrown at least one touchdown pass in 37 straight games. Brady's 37 straight games with at least one touchdown pass are third all-time, Drew Brees (48-current) and Johnny Unitas (47).
- Brady had at least one touchdown pass in all 16 games in each of the last two seasons and has thrown for at least one in each of the first five games of 2012. Brady and Brees are the first two guarterbacks to throw for at least one touchdown pass in all 16 games for two straight seasons.

#### **ROB GRONKOWSKI**

- Rob Gronkowski (10 touchdowns in 2010 and 18 in 2011) can become the first tight end in NFL history with three straight 10plus touchdown seasons. Gronkowski and Antonio Gates (13 in 2004 and 10 in 2005) are the only tight ends to have back-toback 10-plus touchdown seasons. Gronkowski has three touchdowns in the first five games of 2012.
- If Gronkowski has another 10-touchdown season in 2012, he will join Randy Moss (2007, 2008 and 2009) and Corey Dillon (2004, 2005, 2006) as the only Patriots with three straight 10plus touchdown seasons and three 10-plus seasons overall.
- Gronkowski has 30 receiving touchdowns and 31 touchdowns overall (30 receiving and 1 rushing) since 2010. The NFL record for most receiving touchdown in a player's first three NFL seasons is 43 by Randy Moss and the NFL record for most touchdowns overall by a player in his first three NFL seasons is 47 by Barry Sanders (4 receiving and 43 rushing).

#### WES WELKER

- If Wes Welker reaches 100 receptions in 2012, he will become the first player in NFL history with five 100-catch seasons.
- •Welker now has 15 10-plus catch seasons and needs three more 10-plus catch games to become the NFL's all-time leader. Jerry Rice is in first place with 17 10-reception games, followed by Marvin Harrison (16), Welker (15), Andre Johnson (15) and Reggie Wayne (15).

The Patriots defense held the Titans to just 20 yards rushing on 16 attempts for a 1.3-yard average in the 2012 season opener. The 20 yards rushing allowed are the fifth-lowest total in Patriots history and the lowest total since holding Buffalo to 14 yards rushing on Dec. 11, 2005 in Buffalo.

Rookie RB Brandon Bolden (137) and RB Stevan Ridley (106) both rushed for over 100 yards at Buffalo on Sept. 30. It is the first time the Patriots had two 100-yard rushers in the same game since Nov. 23, 1980 at Baltimore Colts when Don Calhoun (106) and Vagas Ferguson (100) each had 100 yards rushing

#### 2012 PATRIOTS HAVE FIRST BACK-TO-BACK 200 YARD RUSHING GAMES SINCE 1978

The Patriots have had more than 200 rushing yards in back-toback games for the first time since 1978. Vs. Denver (10/7), New England finished the game with a total of 251 rushing yards on 54 carries. The previous week at Buffalo (9/30), New England had a total of 247 rushing yards. The last time New England had 200-plus rushing yards in consecutive games was when it followed a 213-yard performance on Dec. 3, 1978 at Dallas with a 249-yard effort against Buffalo on Dec. 10, 1978. It is the 69th time in franchise history that they have rushed for 200 yards in a game. It is the most rushing yards in a game since gaining 277 at Oakland on Dec. 14, 2008.

#### SECOND TIME IN NFL HISTORY A TEAM HAS TWO 100-YARD RUSHERS, TWO 100-YARD RECEIVERS AND A 300-YARD PASSER

The Patriots had two 100-yard rushers (Brandon Bolden 137 and Stevan Ridley (106), two 100-yard receivers (Wes Welker 129 and Rob Gronkowski 104) and a 300-yard passer (Tom Brady 340) in the win at Buffalo (9/30) for the first time in team history. It is the second time in NFL history that feat has been accomplished. Green Bay was the first team to do so on Dec. 28. 2008 in a win vs. Detroit when Ryan Grant (106) and DeShawn Wynn (106) rushed for over 100 yards, Donald Driver (111) and Greg Jennings (101) went over 100 yards receiving and Aaron Rodgers (308) passed for over 300 yards.

#### PATRIOTS TIED A TEAM RECORD WITH FOUR **RUSHING TOUCHDOWNS AT BUFFALO**

The Patriots tied a team record with four rushing touchdowns in the win at Buffalo (9/30). It is the seventh time and the first time since Oct. 16, 1983 vs. San Diego that the Patriots scored on four rushing touchdowns in a game.

## PATRIOTS OFFENSE GAINS 580 YARDS AT BUFFALO

The Patriots chalked up 580 yards in total offense at Buffalo (9/30), the fourth most in team history. It is the 14<sup>th</sup> time in team history that the Patriots have recorded at least 500 total yards on offense. It is the ninth time under Bill Belichick that the Patriots have accomplished the feat.



Tom Brady was named AFC Offensive Player of the Week by the National Football League for his performance in the Patriots' 52-28 victory over the Buffalo Bills (9/30). It is the 21st time in his career that Brady has received the AFC Offensive Player of the Week honor to tie Denver's Peyton Manning for the most Player of the Week awards earned by a player since the accolade was instituted in 1984. Brady, who earned three Player of the Week Awards in 2011, completed 22 of 36 passes for 340 yards against the Bills, including three touchdown passes. Brady also scored on a 4-yard touchdown run. After falling behind, 21-7, midway through the third quarter, Brady led the Patriots to six straight second half touchdowns and 45 total second half points, including a 31-point fourth quarter to earn the 52-28 victory.

#### **BRADY HAD 423 YARDS AS A FOLLOW-UP TO HIS 517 YARD PERFORMANCE IN MIAMI IN 2011**

In the 2011 season opener in Miami (9/12), Brady threw for 517 yards, becoming one of 11 passers in NFL history to break the 500-yard mark. In Week 2 against San Diego (9/18), Brady became the first of those 11 500-yard passers to follow up his 500-yard performance by throwing for 400 or more yards. Before Brady's performance against the Chargers, only Drew Brees (2006) had followed-up a 500-yard game with 300 or more passing yards.

## BRADY HAS 8<sup>TH</sup> GAME WITH 300 YDS AND 4 TDS

Deion Branch was awarded the Pete Rozelle Trophy as the Most Valuable Player of Super Bowl XXXIX. His 11 receptions in the game tied the Super Bowl record, also achieved by Jerry Rice, Dan Ross and Wes Welker. On the day of Super Bowl XXXIX, Deion called a dozen of his former football coaches to thank them for the support that they gave him throughout his high school, junior college and college careers. Hours after talking to his coaches, he tied the Super Bowl record with 11 receptions and was named MVP of the game. Branch has turned in his biggest performances on the greatest stage in sports, leading all receivers in Super Bowls XXXVIII and XXXIX. He recorded a combined 24 receptions in three games and owns two of the top seven receiving performances in Super Bowl history. His career reception total in the Super Bowl ranks third all-time, trailing only Jerry Rice (33) and Andre Reed (27).

#### DAN CONNOLLY HAS THE LONGEST KICKOFF RETURN EVER BY AN OFFENSIVE LINEMAN

Dan Connolly was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week after he returned a kickoff 71 yards to the 4-yard line in the second quarter of the Patriots win vs. Green Bay on Dec. 19, 2010. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, it is the longest kickoff return by an offensive lineman in NFL history. The run by Connolly topped the 48-yard touchdown return by Atlanta's Mal Snider in 1969. WR Julian Edelman set a franchise record with a 94-yard punt return for a touchdown in the second quarter vs. Miami (01/02/11). The Patriots' previous longest punt return was an 89-yard touchdown return by Mike Haynes vs. Buffalo on Nov. 7, 1976. Edelman returned his second career punt for a touchdown vs. Kansas City on Nov. 21, 2011 with a 72-yard



return. He is the fourth Patriots player with two or more punt returns for a touchdown. He was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance against Kansas City.

Edelman began his college football career with a year at the College of San Mateo (Calif.) before transferring to Kent State where as a senior he completed 56% of his passes (153 of 275 passes for 1,820 yards) with 13 touchdowns. He was also the leading rusher, gaining 1,551 yards on 215 attempts (an average of 7.5 yards per carry) and scoring 13 touchdowns. Gronkowski became the second tight end in New England Patriots history to go over 1,000 receiving yards in 2011. He moved past TE Ben Coates (1,174 yards in 1994) to set the franchise record for most receiving yards by a Patriots tight end with 1,327 yards. He is the seventh tight end in NFL history to reach 1,200 yards.

#### **GRONKOWSKI BECOMES FIRST PATRIOTS TIGHT** END TO RECORD A RUSHING TOUCHDOWN

Gronkowski scored a 2-yard touchdown on a lateral from Tom Brady in the third quarter vs. Indianapolis (12/4/11), becoming the first tight end in Patriots history to score a rushing touchdown. Gronkowski is the first NFL tight end to score a rushing touchdown since Tennessee's Bo Scaife had a 31-yard scoring run against Baltimore on Nov. 12, 2006. He is the first tight end since the 1970 merger to have two receiving touchdowns and a rushing touchdown in the same game.

#### LEADS AFC IN SCORING; FIRST TIME THAT A **TIGHT END HAS LED A CONFERENCE IN SCORING**

Gronkowski led the AFC in scoring among non-kickers with 108 points in 2011 and finished second in the NFL to Philadelphia's LeSean McCoy, who had 120 points. It is the first time in NFL history that a tight end has led his conference in scoring and the first time a tight end has led the NFL in touchdown receptions (17)

### **BACK-TO-BACK 10 TOUCHDOWN SEASONS**

Gronkowski scored 10 touchdowns in 2010 and then scored 18 touchdowns in 2011. With back-to-back 10 touchdown seasons (10 in 2010 and 18 in 2011), Gronkowski is the second Patriots player to have back-to-back seasons with 10 or more touchdown reception seasons. #### TIGHT ENDS COMBINE FOR 24 TDS IN 2011

#### AARON HERNANDEZ LEARNS FROM HIS BROTHER

The relationship between Aaron Hernandez and his older brother D.J. has taken on many roles over the years: sibling, teammate, role model and surrogate father. They played high school football together – D.J. the star senior quarterback and Aaron, the athletic, but not quite ready, freshman. When their father passed away when Aaron



was 17, he relied on his brother even more. "I just followed my brother's footsteps," he told the Providence Journal. "I just tried to follow his work ethic because he did everything the right way. He was always successful." D.J., now a graduate assistant at the University of Miami, has tried to instill hard work and perseverance in his younger brother. It's paying off, as Aaron continues to thrive in the Patriots offense.

#### AARON HERNANDEZ ON HOW BEING A PATRIOT HAS CHANGED HIM

"This is a place that not only did it change my future from them paying me, but it just changed me as a person," he said. "You can't come here and act reckless and do your own stuff, and [I] was one of the persons that when I came here, I might've acted the way I wanted to act, but you get changed by Bill Belichick's way. You get changed by the Patriots' way. Now that I'm a Patriot, I have to start living like one, and making the right decisions for them."

### **2011 FIRST ROUND PICK NATE SOLDER**

It only took a day for Nate Solder to decide to change from his lifelong position of tight end to tackle after playing his freshman year at Colorado as a tight end. "My coaches came to me and said, 'You'd be an all right tight end, but you'd be an even better tackle," he told the Boston Globe. "I've always wanted to be great, so that's why I moved to tackle." He added over 30 pounds after his redshirt freshman season and was named the team's starting left tackle. He played in 2,540 of 2,542 offensive plays over the next three seasons at Colorado and became an immediate contributor on the Patriots offensive line at right tackle as a rookie before moving to left tackle

#### **DONALD THOMAS: FROM NO HIGH SCHOOL** FOOTBALL TO THE NFL


Donald Thomas found football while playing basketball. A former high school baseball and basketball player who had never played football at any level, Thomas often played pickup basketball at the student gymnasium and one day found himself playing with several members of the UConn football team who convinced him to try out for the team. After meeting with coaches, Thomas walked on to the team as a defensive lineman for the scout team in 2003. He red-shirted a year before contributing on special teams. In 2007, he got his chance to play offensive guard, earning All-Big East honors before being selected in the sixth round of the 2008 draft by the Miami Dolphins.

#### SEBASTIAN VOLLMER MAKES HIS MARK

A native of Kaarst, Germany, Vollmer did not begin playing football until the age of 14 when he started playing for the Dusseldorf club team. Vollmer helped lead his German prep school team to two national football championships. His early football success landed him an appearance in the 2004 Global Junior Championships in San Diego, which led him to a scholarship at Houston. He spoke almost no English when he signed with Houston, but he became fluent in the language as he developed from a 250-pound tight end into a 315-pound lineman who started his final 25 games at tackle for the Cougars, Vollmer's collegiate career created interest from the NFL where the Patriots drafted him in the second round of the 2009 draft. Nicknamed "Seabass" during his playing days at Houston, a nickname that has carried over to the NFL

### WOODHEAD GOES FROM DIVISION II TO THE NFL

Danny Woodhead was a standout at Division II Chadron State in Nebraska. He averaged 178.9 yards per game and totaled 101 rushing touchdowns during his collegiate career. Woodhead's outstanding junior and senior seasons earned him two Harlon Hill Trophies, the Division II equivalent to the Heisman Trophy. He is one of just three players to ever win two or more Harlon Hill



Trophies, joining Texas A&M University-Kingsville running back Johnny Bailey, who won it three times (1987-89) before playing six seasons in the NFL for the Bears, Cardinals, and Rams. Valdosta State University's Dusty Bonner was the only other player to win the Harlon Hill Trophy multiple times (2000 and 2001).

#### DANNY WOODHEAD SET TEAM MARK FOR **RUSHING AVERAGE IN 2010**

Danny Woodhead finished the 2010 season with 97 rushes for 547 yards, with his average of 5.64 yards per carry setting a new team record (minimum 90 rushing attempts). Woodhead topped Don Calhoun's previous team mark of 5.59 yards per carry in 1976 (129 attempts for 721 yards).

PATRICK CHUNG'S JOURNEY TO THE NFL Long before S Patrick Chung picked up flag football as a teen, his mother, Jamaican recording artist Sophia George, had preached about being a tough man in a song. Her hit single, "Girlie Girlie" - a traditional reggae song which pokes fun at a boy who was not man enough - topped the charts in 1985. Chung is aware that among his talents he was born with, such as speed and agility,



singing is not one of them. Chung possesses a great sense of pride in his unique heritage - his mother is Jamaican and his father is half Jamaican and half Chinese, was born in Jamaica and moved to California at age 12 where he started to play football as a freshman in high school. Chung went on to star at Oregon, where he holds the distinction of starting more games than any other defensive player in school history with 51 starts. He originally entered the draft as a junior, but ultimately decided to return for his senior season. Pinned to the back of his locker is a reminder of the support he has gotten - a Jamaican flag that represents his family's heritage.

#### STEVE GREGORY WAS ABOUT TO ENTER THE POLICE ACADEMY UNTIL SAN DIEGO CALLED

Steve Gregory's father and stepmother are New York City police officers and both were on duty during the events of September 11, 2001. Following his college career at Syracuse, Gregory took the test to enter the police academy. He found out he passed the test on the same day that the San Diego Chargers called him to offer him a free agent contract

#### DONT'A HIGHTOWER WEARS TEDY BRUSCHI'S JERSEY #54

As a first round draft pick, Dont'a Hightower is used to high expectations. Hightower went to training camp with jersey #45 but was switched to jersey #54 prior to the start of the regular season. Former LB Tedy Bruschi wore #54 for 13 seasons. Hightower understands the importance of the number and hopes to live up to its legacy. "I definitely feel honored to be able to wear this number," Hightower said. "I've read that Tedy didn't want it to be retired and he hoped another linebacker would come in and be able to wear this number and be able to play as well. I feel honored. Tedy was a great player, and he means a lot to this organization. I'm definitely proud to be able to wear this number."



#### 2012 FIRST ROUND PICK CHANDLER JONES FOLLOWS IN BROTEHRS' FOOTSTEPS

Chandler Jones has two brothers, including Arthur, a fifth-round NFL Draft selection by the Baltimore Ravens in 2010, who was a Syracuse defensive tackle, and John "Bones" Jones, a UFC fighter and the reigning Light Weight Champion.

#### CHANDLER'S PERK OF BEING IN THE NFL

Chandler Jones was excited to get the Madden football game and play himself: "I've always put myself in Madden manually, but now that I can actually buy the game and see myself already installed in the game, it's great."

#### FIRST ROUND PICKS MAKE IMPACT IN 2012 OPENER

Chandler Jones forced a fumble on a 1-yard sack of Tennessee QB Jake Locker in the first quarter and Dont'a Hightower recovered the ball and ran 6-yards for a touchdown in the season opener at Tennessee (9/9/12). It is the first fumble returned for a touchdown for the Patriots since Gary Guyton returned a fumble 35 yards for a touchdown at Chicago on Dec. 12, 2010. It is the first defensive touchdown for the Patriots since Sterling Moore returned an interception 21 yards for a score vs. Buffalo on Jan. 1, 2012. Jones caused an opponent turnover for the second time this season vs. Arizona (9/16). Against Arizona, Jones forced Kevin Kolb to fumble on a sack in the second quarter and Tavon Wilson recovered the ball to give the Patriots possession. Jones picked up his third sack in four games in Buffalo when he dropped Ryan Fitzpatrick for a 5-yard loss in the first quarter.

#### JONES NAMED AFC ROOKIE OF THE MONTH FOR SEPTEMBER

Jones was named the AFC Rookie of the Month for September. Jones registered three sacks in his first four games with two forced fumbles, the most sacks of any NFL rookie. His first NFL sack at Tennessee resulted in a forced fumble that was returned for a touchdown. Jones finished the month with 19 tackles, three sacks and two forced fumbles He joins Jerod Mayo (October of 2008) as the only Patriots to be named NFL Defensive Rookie of the Month.

#### STILL RECEIVING THE LOVE

Kyle Love continues to receive motivation from his father, retired Army colonel Anthony Love. Every game day, his father sends him a text message with words of encouragement to get him excited. His dad has been motivating him since middle school and the message has always remained the same: "Give the coaches a reason to keep you."

## KYLE LOVE 'MINI-V' FOLLOWS WILFORK

Kyle Love has been looking up to Vince Wilfork since his days at Mississippi State, when his teammates dubbed him "Mini-V" for his resemblance to the Patriots defensive tackle. The nickname led Love to closely monitor Wilfork as he finished his playing days with the Bulldogs. Little did he know that he would get the chance to watch Wilfork from an even closer perspective – lined up next to him on the Patriots defensive line. "I stay close to that guy always. Watch me out here, I'm right beside him, no matter what," Love told the *Boston Globe*. Now that they're on the same team, Wilfork has become an even bigger influence, like a big brother, according to Love.

#### STERLING MOORE; MORE TURNOVERS

Patriots defensive back Sterling Moore ended Denver's (10/7) first offensive possession when he ran down Broncos wide receiver Demaryius Thomas and punched the ball loose, recording a forced fumble and then a fumble recovery to give New England possession. The play marked the first forced fumble and the first fumble recovery of Moore's career and was the third forced turnover of his career, joining his two interceptions in the 2011 regular-season finale against Buffalo, one of which was returned 21 yards for a touchdown.

#### MAYO OVER 100 TACKLES FOR THE FOURTH STRAIGHT YEAR

LB Jerod Mayo finished the 2011 season with 103 tackles, registering 100 tackles for the fourth straight year. He is the first player in New England history to register 100 tackles in his first four NFL seasons. He is the fifth Patriots player to register at least four consecutive 100 tackle seasons. Mayo has had 10 or more tackles in four of the first five games in 2012 and is on pace for his fifth straight season of 100 or more tackles.

Jerod Mayo learned knowledge and discipline are the keys to success while spending afternoons with his three brothers under the supervision of their grandfather, Walter Johnson, a retired Air Force veteran of 30 years. While Mayo's mother worked two jobs, Johnson taught the boys discipline, responsibility and the value of life. Those lessons helped Mayo develop a work ethic and demeanor that has earned him the nickname of "Old Soul" from his teammates. His leadership skills and talent helped him become only the second Patriot to be named AFC Rookie of the Year, earning that title in 2008 to join Michael Haynes (1976)

#### DOUBLE TROUBLE: CB DEVIN MCCOURTY

After being selected by the Patriots in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft, CB Devin McCourty became part of a select group in league history. McCourty's identical twin brother, Jason, is a cornerback with Tennessee, selected in the sixth round of the 2009 NFL Draft. The two are the 12<sup>th</sup> set of twins to play in the NFL. Devin redshirted for the 2005 season and therefore was a year behind his brother in eligibility. McCourty is the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 1998-2000. His twin brother, Wasswa, played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox. The McCourty twins are one of three active sets of twins playing in the NFL.

#### MCCOURTY REGISTERS SECOND CAREER TWO-INTERCEPTION GAME AT BUFFALO

Devin McCourty had his second career two-interception game in the win at Buffalo on Sept. 30, 2012. He had his first interception of the 2012 season when he picked off a Ryan Fitzpatrick pass at the Buffalo 42-yard line in the first quarter. He picked off his second pass in the fourth quarter. It is McCourty's second career two-interception game. He had his first two-interception game at Detroit on Nov. 25, 2010. The Patriots are 9-0 when McCourty has at least one interception in a game.



### **ROB NINKOVICH: WHERE DID HE COME FROM?**

Rob Ninkovich's journey to the Patriots was not easy. He entered the league as a fifthround pick by the Saints in 2006 and was waived four times by New Orleans and Miami before landing in New England on Aug. 2, 2009. He spent the 2009 offseason trying to make the New Orleans team as a long snapper. Before coming to the Patriots, he had appeared in just eight games over



three years. He doubled that total in his first year in New England, appearing in 15 games in 2009 and his role on the team has grown since, earning a starting role at linebacker in 2010 and 2011 before moving to a starting role on the defensive line in 2011.

#### NINKOVICH SCORED AS A TE IN COLLEGE

Ninkovich played some at tight end in college at Purdue and caught two touchdown passes with a 2-yard touchdown pass from Dallas QB Kyle Orton and a 1-yard touchdown pass from former Indianapolis QB Curtis Painter.

#### NINKOVICH SACKS

Since the beginning of the 2010 season, Ninkovich leads the team with a total of 13.0 sacks over that span



## **SPIKES IS A THROWBACK**

Spikes, who patterns his style of play after Hall of Fame linebacker Dick Butkus, shared his feelings on modeling his game after old school linebackers. "My thing is, when I'm done with this game, I want the older guys when they watch to say, 'He's playing the position the right way.' It's just a point of respect from me to them." Spikes passion and energy is apparent when he plays the game. Said former Patriots safety Rodney Harrison in a recent interview with the Boston Herald: "You can see how much he loves it, how he enjoys being physical. "He's an intimidator. He's got that fight in him. He's going to hit you and you're going to feel it."

#### VINCE WILFORK REGISTERS FIRST CAREER **INTERCEPTIONS IN 2011**

Vince Wilfork recorded his first career interception when he picked off QB Philip Rivers in the second quarter vs. San Diego (9/18). He had his second interception at Oakland (10/2) to join Anthony Pleasant (2001) as the only other Patriots defensive lineman to ever record two interceptions in the same season. Wilfork is one of four Patriots defensive lineman to ever record two



interceptions overall, joining Pleasant, Richard Seymour and Henry Thomas.

#### WILFORK SCORES FIRST NFL TOUCHDOWN IN 2011

Wilfork recovered a fumble in the end zone at Washington (12/11/11) for his first touchdown. DE Andre Carter sacked QB Rex Grossman in the end zone and forced a fumble and Wilfork recovered the ball for the Patriots first points in their 34-27 victory

## WILFORK WEARS HIS HEART ON HIS NECK

Wilfork wears No. 75 over his shoulder pads. Underneath hangs a gold chain locket for those who were number one in his heart: his parents. In 2002, parents David and Barbara Wilfork both passed away within five months of each other, leaving the then University of Miami star without his greatest support system. Wilfork, who lost his father to diabetes, has raised hundreds of thousands of dollars for diabetes-related causes. His annual draft day fundraiser, a bowling event he has held for eight years, is one of the longest running fundraising events held by a pro athlete in New England. For his charity work, Wilfork was awarded the 2010 New England Patriots Ron Burton Community Service Award. While he will always cherish his National Championship and Super Bowl rings, his constant reminder lies closest to his heart, a picture of his late parents at their high school prom. "I carry them with me wherever I go," Wilfork said of his parents' keepsake. "My parents pushed me to be the best I could be. The things I do and my wife does, we do out of the kindness of our heart, and we do it for the community. I never look for anything in return. My teammates are my second family. My kids, my wife, the New England Patriots - that's all I have."

### VINCE WILFORK: REASONS FOR PATRIOTS SUCCESS

Patriots Pro Bowl DL Vince Wilfork, who has served as a defensive captain for the Patriots for five straight seasons, says the team's continued success is a result of the entire organization working towards one common goal: "The Patriots are all about team, family and smart football players. They try to get good people here from coaches to guys who work in the front office to guys who put on this uniform. I think everybody has to have one goal in mind, and that's to be together. When you get an organization together that is seeking one goal, you can be pretty successful."

#### EVEN STEPHEN

Since joining the Patriots as a fourth-round draft choice in 2006, Stephen Gostkowski has connected on 84.0 percent of his regularseason field goal attempts (152-for-181), achieving the best field goal percentage in Patriots history.

#### GOSTKOWSKI IS FIRST PATRIOTS PLAYER TO KICK TWO 50-YARD FIELD GOALS IN THE SAME GAME

ZOLTAN MESKO: COMING TO AMERICA					

P Zoltan Mesko was born in Timisoara, Romania on the Romania-Hungary border. On Many occasions in 1989, during the communist revolutions, his family was forced to take cover to avoid gun shots from the armies. Even after the fall of the Berlin Wall, his family lived in poverty. His family left Romania when his father won a United States Permanent Resident Card (green card) in the Diversity Immigrant Visa Lottery in 1997 when Mesko was 11. "I survived a war," he noted. "I was coming from a really low point growing up, with communism and a very adverse economic situation. Coming over here, I'm very grateful for where I am. It happens by luck that I am here," he said. "When my dad applied for the green card lottery, there were 20 million applicants and 55,000 winners. That's a percentage in itself that tells you I am lucky to be here."

### MESKO DISCOVERS FOOTBALL

An avid soccer player from his days in Romania, Mesko had a strong leg. It was only when he came to America that he discovered his leg could take him places. In eighth grade, Mesko was playing kickball in the gym when he kicked the ball so high that he broke a light fixture. He was given a choice: pay for the light fixture or play football. The choice was an easy one—Mesko



decided to play football. His leg would land him numerous Division I scholarships and admission offers from Ivy League schools. From those, Mesko chose to play football at Michigan.

#### MESKO SETS FRANCHISE RECORD WITH A 46.5 AVERAGE IN 2011






#### WR Brandon Lloyd (UFA-STL, '12)

#### RB Stevan Ridley (D3a, '11)

Ridley had a career-high 151 rushing yards on 28 carries (5.4 avg.) and added a touchdown in the Patriots' Week 5 win vs. Denver. Ridley's 151 rushing yards were the highest single-game rushing yardage total by a Patriots player since Dec. 23, 2007, when Laurence Maroney had 156 yards on 14 carries (11.1 avg.) in a 28-7 Patriots win over Miami. Ridley's previous best was the 125 yards he had in the 2012 season opener at Tennessee (9/9)... Ridley has a total of 490 rushing yards through five games this season, recording the highest total for a Patriots running back through the season's first five games since Corey Dillon had 522 yards through the first five games of the 2004 season.

#### RB Danny Woodhead (FA-'10)

Woodhead is the only Patriot to record both a receiving touchdown and a rushing touchdown in 2012.

#### DE Chandler Jones (D1a, '12)

Jones currently leads the team with 3.0 sacks in 2012.

#### DT Vince Wilfork (D1, '04)

Wilfork has played in 127 games with 117 starts over eight-plus seasons with the Patriots (2004-12) ... The Patriots own a 98-29 (.772) record in Wilfork's 127 career regular-season games ... Wilfork recovered a Peyton Manning fumble in the third quarter of the team's Week 5 win vs. Denver and his three fumble recoveries in 2012 are tied for the most in the NFL with San Francisco's Carlos Rogers.

#### DT Kyle Love (FA-'10)

Has started on the Patriots' defensive line in every game of the 2012 season ... Finished the 2011 season with 4.0 sacks for 14 yards, 55 tackles and a fumble recovery ... Started all three postseason games and finished with nine tackles and a pass defensed ... Originally joined the team as a rookie free agent in 2010.

#### DL Rob Ninkovich (FA-'09)

Ninkovich strip-sacked Peyton Manning on first down from the Broncos' 20-yard line in the third quarter of last Sunday's win vs. Denver and Vince Wilfork recovered the ball at the Broncos' 14-yard line to give the Patriots possession and set up a six-play, 14-yard drive that ended in an 8-yard touchdown run by Steven Ridley and a 31-7 Patriots lead. Ninkovich also forced a McGahee fumble at the Patriots' 11-yard line with 3:48 left in the game and Jermaine Cunningham recovered the loose ball to give the Patriots possession and stop a driving Broncos offense that was looking to cut into a 10-point Denver deficit.

#### DL Brandon Deaderick (D7b,'10)

Started the 2011 season on the Reserve/PUP list before being activated on Oct.

29 ... After being activated, Deaderick started five of the 10 games in which he played, recording 20 tackles and 2.0 sacks on the season.

#### LB Jerod Mayo (D1, '08)

Mayo had a team-high 18 tackles against Denver in Week 5, and has a total of 64 tackles through five games in 2012. Mayo is on pace to tally 205 tackles this season, which would mark his fifth straight year with 100 or more tackles. If Mayo stays on track he would become just the third player in Patriots' history to record more than 200 tackles in a season. The other two Patriots who have accomplished this feat are LB Clayton Weishuhn (229 tackles in 1983) and LB Steve Nelson (207 tackles in 1984).

#### LB Brandon Spikes (D2c,'10)

Spike recorded 11 tackles in last week's win vs. Denver and has no registered double digit tackles in three games this season ... Has registered 10 or more tackles in three games in 2012.

#### LB Don'ta Hightower (D1b,'12)

Hightower recorded his first NFL sack when he dropped Bills QB Ryan Fitzpatrick for a sack in the first quarter of the Patriots' Week 4 win at Buffalo.

#### CB Devin McCourty (D1,'10)

McCourty recorded his first interception of 2012 when he picked off Bills QB Ryan Fitzpatrick in the first quarter of the team's Week 4 win at Buffalo. McCourty hauled in a second interception in the fourth quarter, marking the second time in his career that he has recorded two interceptions in a single game. He had his first two-interception game at Detroit on Nov. 25, 2010.

#### CB Kyle Arrington (FA-'09)

Started 14 of 16 games and tied Charles Woodson (Green Bay) and Eric Weddle (San Diego) for most interceptions in the league in 2011 with seven ... Notched multiple interceptions twice in 2011 – at Buffalo (9/25) and vs. Kansas City (11/21).



#### S Steve Gregory (UFA-SD, '12)

Gregory registered his first interception as a Patriot in the first quarter of Week 3's game at Baltimore. Gregory picked off Joe Flacco and returned the ball 36 yards to the Baltimore 6-yard line. The play helped set up a 2-yard touchdown run by rookie RB Brandon Bolden. Gregory's 36-yard interception return is second to the 41-yard return he had vs. San Francisco on Dec. 16, 2010 when he played with San Diego.

#### S Patrick Chung (D2a,'09)

Has started at safety in every game of 2012 season ... Missed eight games due to injury in 2011 ... Finished the season with 67 tackles, 1.0 sack, one interceptions and four passes defensed ... Started all three playoff games including Super Bowl XLVI and made 15 tackles and defensed one pass.

## THE TEAM OF THE DECADE

hen Robert Kraft purchased the New England Patriots in 1994, few would have thought that 17 years later the franchise would be the undisputed team of the decade in the first decade of the new millennium. Kraft brought a winning vision to the organization and dedicated his resources to building a consistent winner. On Jan. 27, 2000, Kraft hired Bill Belichick to coach the team, and three months later the team drafted then-unheralded quarterback Tom Brady, putting the final pieces in place for the Patriots to become the most successful NFL team of the 2000s. Below is a look at the accomplishments of the Patriots during the first decade of the new millennium that earned the Patriots the "Team of the Decade" moniker.
