NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (3-3) vs. NEW YORK JETS (3-3)

After playing four of their first six games on the road, the New England Patriots will return to the confines of Gillette Stadium and try to get an edge in the AFC East with a key division game against the New York Jets. All four AFC East teams enter this week's games with 3-3 records. It is the first time since realignment in 2002 that all of the teams in one division are tied for first place in Week 6 of the season or later.

PATRIOTS THROWBACK GAME

The Patriots will wear throwback uniforms that replicate the ones worn by the 1985 team this week. The Patriots wore throwback uniforms last season in the home game against the Jets, a 30-21 New England victory on Oct. 9, 2011. The Patriots will wear red jerseys with white pants and a white helmet featuring the 'Pat Patriot' logo with white facemasks. The Patriots are 8-3 in throwback uniforms.

NOTES: The Indianapolis Colts were members of the AFC East in 2001 and compiled a 3-5 divisional record that season. In 2002, the Patriots and Jets both finished with a 9-7 overall record and a 4-2 divisional record, but the Jets claimed the division title by virtue of having a better record against common opponents. In 2008, the Patriots and Dolphins both finished with an 11-5 overall record and a 4-2 divisional record, but Miami qualified for the playoffs due to a better conference record (8-4 to 7-5).

ROBERT KRAFT NEWS & NOTES

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. Now in his 19th season of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what many observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning



just 19 of 80 games (.238 pct.) and recording the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles (11), conference crowns (6) and Super Bowl championships (3) than any other NFL team. The Patriots have made six Super Bowl appearances since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other NFL franchise has earned more than four berths. In Kraft's first 18 seasons, the Patriots qualified for the playoffs 13 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons.

In the early 1990s, the Patriots seemed destined for relocation until Robert Kraft's purchase of the team rejuvenated local interest. In 1991, the season ticket base was just 17,635, barely enough to support the club. Now, the season tickets are capped and more than 50,000 fans are on a season ticket waiting list. The Patriots have sold out 197 consecutive home games, including playoff and preseason games (dating back to the 1994 season opener).

SERIES HISTORY

The Patriots and Jets will meet for the 107th time, including three postseason games, since the series between the AFC East

rivals began in 1960. The Patriots earned their 14th sweep in the series last season following a 30-21 win at Gillette Stadium on Oct. 9 and a 37-16 victory in the rematch at MetLife Stadium in a Sunday Night Football game on Nov. 13.



The Patriots sweep last season put them in front 53-52-1 in the all-time series.

The Patriots are 28-25-1 all-time in home games against the Jets, including 24-19 overall in Foxborough and 8-4 at Gillette Stadium.

The teams have played in the postseason three times, a 1985



Wild Card game, a 2006 Wild Card game and an AFC Divisional game in 2010. New England beat the Jets, 26-14, in 1985 at the Meadowlands on their way to Super Bowl XX. In 2006, the Patriots defeated the Jets, 37-16, at Gillette Stadium. The Jets defeated the Patriots, 28-21, in the 2010 playoff game.

New England is 24-14 against the

Jets since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994. New England's 53 victories over the Jets (including two playoff wins) are the second most over any single opponent, trailing only Buffalo with 63 all-time wins.

The New England Patriots won their 19th straight game at home behind a career-high 136 yards rushing by RB BenJarvus Green-Ellis that included two touchdown runs in a 30-21 win against the New York Jets.

Tom Brady was strong again, completing 24-of-33 passes for 321 yards with a touchdown as the Patriots scored 30 or more points for the 13th straight game. Wes Welker had his third straight 100-yard receiving game after finishing with five receptions for 124 yards.

New England never trailed after scoring the game's first 10 points and led 10-7 at halftime.

Trailing 27-14 in the fourth quarter, the Jets staged a comeback effort with an 85-yard touchdown drive to make it 27-21, but the Patriots answered on the next series with a 13-play, 69-yard drive that took 13:58 off the clock and ended with a field goal to secure the 30-21 victory.

With a 10-7 lead to open the second half, Brady connected with Welker on a 73-yard gain and three plays later Brady found WR Deion Branch on a 2-yard touchdown for a 17-7 lead. The Jets returned the ensuing kickoff 88 yards to set up a 9-yard touchdown pass from QB Mark Sanchez to WR Jeremy Kerley to cut the lead to 17-14.

Green-Ellis added his second touchdown run at the end of the third quarter to finish an 11-play, 77-yard drive and Gostkowski added a 24-yard field goal early in the fourth quarter for a 27-14 lead.

The Patriots defense forced the Jets' offense into seven three-and-outs in 12 possessions, including the first four drives of the game to take a 10-0 lead. The Jets did not get a first down until 10:27 remaining in the second quarter.

After the Jets executed a 13-play, 78-yard touchdown drive, the Patriots got the ball back with 3:17 to play in the first half and reached the Jets 11-yard line before a Brady pass intended for TE Aaron Hernandez was intercepted by CB Antonio Cromartie to end the drive as time expired in the first half. It was the first regular season red zone interception at home in Brady's career.

The Patriots defense held the Jets to just 14 first downs and only 166 yards passing.

In a showdown for first place in the AFC East, the Patriots took control of the division with a convincing 37-16 win over the New York Jets at MetLife Stadium in a Sunday Night Football game to improve to a 6-3 record. New England earned its 14th series sweep in the annual series following a 30-21 win in the first meeting.

Tom Brady threw for 329 yards and three touchdown passes, including two to TE Rob Gronkowski, to help the Patriots end a two-game losing streak and get back on track. Gronkowski finished the game with 8 receptions for 113 yards with the two scores. K Stephen Gostkowski drilled three field goals, including a 50-yard field goal in the first quarter.

After the Jets made it close at 23-16 early in the fourth quarter, Brady led the Patriots down the field on an 84-yard drive that ended in an 8-yard touchdown pass to WR Deion Branch for a 30-16 lead. Linebacker Rob Ninkovich sealed the victory when he picked off a QB Mark Sanchez pass on the next possession and returned it 12 yards for a touchdown to make it 37-16 midway through the fourth quarter. In addition to a two-interception game by Ninkovich, the Patriots defense was led by DE Andre Carter, who tied the Patriots' franchise record with a career-high 4.0 sacks.

The Jets opened the game with an impressive drive deep into New England territory before missing a 24-yard field goal. New England responded with two consecutive scoring drives that ended in field goals for a 6-0 first quarter lead. The Jets were able to get pressure on Brady for most of the second quarter and forced an intentional grounding call against Brady in the end zone for a safety with under five minutes to play in the first half. The Jets capitalized on the free kick and marched

65 yards on 7 plays before Sanchez scored on a 2-yard run for a 9-6 lead.

New England took the ensuing kickoff with 1:20 to play and moved to the New York 18-yard line where Brady connected with Gronkowski on a touchdown to recapture the lead at 13-9 before the end of the first half.

The Patriots turned two Jets turnovers into points in the third quarter to extend their lead to 23-9. LB Niko Koutouvides recovered a muffed punt at the New York 13-yard line midway in the third quarter to help set up a 27-yard field goal by Gostkowski. Then on the next possession, Ninkovich intercepted Sanchez at the New England 25-yard line. The New England offense took over and drove to the New York 5-yard line where Brady connected with Gronkowski on his second touchdown.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR THIS WEEK VS. NY JETS

TOM BRADY

- With one touchdown pass against the Jets, Tom Brady will extend his streak to 39 straight games with at least one touchdown pass and continue his third longest streak all time, behind Drew Brees (48-current) and Johnny Unitas (47).
- Brady has 49 career 300 yard games in the regular season and needs one more to break a tie with Warren Moon (49) for 7th place all time.
- Brady has two rushing touchdowns in 2012 and needs one more to tie his single-season career high of three set in 2011.

STEPHEN GOSTKOWSKI

- Stephen Gostkowski (7-of-10) needs one more 50-yard field goal to tie Adam Vinatieri (8-of-17) for most 50-yard field goals in Patriots history.
- Gostkowski has two 50-yarders so far in 2012 and can become the first Patriots player with three 50-yard field goals in a single season.

WES WELKER

- Wes Welker has four straight 100-yard games and needs one against the Jets to set a team mark. He is tied with Randy Moss (2007) with four straight 100-yard games.
- Welker (16) needs one more 10-plus catch game to break a second place tie with Marvin Harrison (15) and tie Jerry Rice (17) for the most 10-catch games in NFL history.
- Welker has caught 10-plus catches in two straight games to tie his personal best. He had two back-to-back 10-plus catch games in 2009. If he has a 10-plus catch game against the Jets he will be the first with three straight 10plus catch games since Andre Johnson of Houston in 2008. The NFL record for most consecutive 10-catch games is three by Johnson, Brett Perriman (1995) and Reggie Wayne (2007-08).
- Welker needs one reception to extend his streak to 84 straight regular-season games with at least one reception as a member of the Patriots to extend his franchise record. Welker has an overall streak of 100 straight regular-season games with at least one reception, including his time with the Miami Dolphins.
- **TEAM**
- The Patriots have gained at least 350 total yards in 15 consecutive games and need to accomplish the feat against the Jets to tie the 1999-2000 St. Louis Rams for the longest streak in NFL history.
- The Patriots ran 89 offensive plays vs. Denver (10/7) and 85 offensive plays at Seattle (10/14). If they have 80 or plays against the Jets they will be the first team to do so in three straight games since the 1983 Dallas Cowboys.

The Seattle Seahawks scored 14 points in the final 7:31 to overtake the New England Patriots, 24-23, at CenturyLink Field. Seattle rookie QB Russell Wilson found WR Sidney Rice behind the New England secondary for a 46-yard touchdown with 1:18 remaining in the game. Earlier in the quarter Wilson hit WR Braylon Edwards on fourth down for a 10-yard touchdown to get the Seahawks within 23-17.

New England had a final chance to get ahead. Starting at their own 20-yard line with 1:14 left, QB Tom Brady missed on a deep pass to WR Brandon Lloyd on first down, was sacked on second down, threw an incomplete pass to TE Aaron Hernandez on third down and his fourth-down completion to WR Wes Welker was short of the first down marker, allowing Seattle to run out the final 51 seconds to secure the win.

The Patriots squandered two scoring opportunities in the game. The Patriots had a 17-10 lead late in the first half and Seattle was forced to punt from their own 38-yard line with 48 seconds to play. Seattle P Jon Ryan fumbled the snap and was tackled by DE Trevor Scott and LB Bobby Carpenter, allowing the Patriots to take over at the Seattle 24-yard line with 40 seconds left in the first half. The Patriots moved to the 3-yard line with 6 seconds to play when Brady attempted a pass to the end zone that fell incomplete with one second to play. However, Brady was called for intentional grounding, a penalty that requires a 10-second run off, ending the half and the Patriots scoring opportunity. Early in the fourth quarter, Brady threw his second interception of the game when he was picked off by Seattle CB S Earl Thomas in the end zone to end a 15-play, 60-yard drive.

The Patriots drove into Seattle territory a total of eight times with six drives inside the 20-yard line, but scored just one touchdown and were forced to settle for three field goals.

The matchup between the Patriots' No. 1 ranked offense and Seattle's No. 1 ranked defense turned into a showcase for Wilson, who finished 16-of-27 for 293 yards and three touchdowns. Seattle gained 158 yards in the first quarter, then just 70 in the second and third quarter before 140 yards and a 14-point rally in the fourth quarter. Wilson had passes of 50 and 51 yards to set up touchdowns in addition to a 46-yard touchdown pass.

The Seattle defense gave up 475 yards after not allowing any of its first five opponents to top 300. Brady was 36-of-58 for 395 yards with one touchdown and two second half interceptions. Welker had his fourth straight 100-yard game, finishing with 10 receptions for 138 yards and one touchdown.

Seattle scored a field goal on its first possession, but New England answered on its ensuing drive when Brady connected with Welker for a 46-yard touchdown. Seattle answered that score when Wilson found WR Doug Baldwin for a 50-yard gain before finishing the drive with a 24-yard touchdown to Baldwin for a 10-7 first guarter lead.

New England scored 16 unanswered points to take a 23-10 lead into the fourth quarter. Brady culminated a 15-play, 80-yard drive with a 1-yard touchdown pass to Hernandez in the second quarter for a 14-10 lead. K Stephen Gostkowski drilled a 25-yard field goal in the second quarter, a 35-yarder in the third quarter and another 35-yarder in the fourth quarter.

Rookie DE Chandler Jones had two sacks, including a forced fumble on his first sack, to help set up a field goal. LB Jerod Mayo forced a fumble in the fourth quarter that set up a field goal.

WELKER HAS 16TH CAREER 10-PLUS CATCH GAME

With 10 receptions against Seattle, Wes Welker had his 16th career game with 10 or more catches, the most among active NFL players. Welker's 16 career 10-plus catch games are tied with Marvin Harrison (16) for second all-time, behind Jerry Rice (17).

WELKER TIES JERRY RICE FOR THE MOST 10-CATCH, 100-YARD GAMES IN NFL HISTORY

Wes Welker tied Jerry Rice with his 15th NFL game with 10 receptions and 100-yards receiving for the most in NFL history. Welker entered the Seattle game tied with Andre Johnson (14) and Marvin Harrison (14) for second place. Welker finished with 10 receptions for 138 yards.

WELKER HAS FOURTH STRAIGHT 100-YARD GAME TO TIE TEAM RECORD

Welker had his fourth straight 100-yard game to tie the team mark after finishing with 138 against Seattle. Randy Moss opened his Patriots career with four straight 100-yard games in 2007. The NFL record for most consecutive games with 100 yards or more receiving is seven by Charley Hennighan (Houston) in 1961 and Michael Irvin (Dallas) in 1995.

WELKER HAS FOUR 100-YARD GAMES IN 2012

Welker now has four 100-yard games in 2012. Welker had a personal best with eight 100-yard games in 2011. Moss (2007) and Stanley Morgan (1986) have the New England record with nine 100-yard games in a single season.

WELKER'S 46-YARD TOUCHDOWN IS THE SECOND LONGEST TOUCHDOWN CATCH OF HIS CAREER

Welker's 46-yard touchdown pass from Tom Brady in the first quarter is the second longest touchdown reception of his career to the 99-yard touchdown reception he had at Miami on Sept. 12, 2011.

PATRIOTS TOP RANKED OFFENSE CONNECTS AGAINST SEATTLE'S TOP RANKED DEFENSE

Seattle entered the game with the NFL's top ranked defense and was surrendering a league-low 258.6 yards per game, ranked second in points allowed (14.0) and fifth with 192.0 yards passing. The Patriots gained 475 yards in total offense, scored 23 points and gained 388 yards passing.

AARON HERNANDEZ MAKES HIS RETURN

TE Aaron Hernandez returned to action after missing three games with an ankle injury that occurred in the 2012 home opener vs. Arizona on Sept. 16. He finished the game with 6 receptions for 30 yards, including a 1-yard touchdown catch in the second quarter.

JERMAINE CUNNINGHAM MAKES HIS FIRST START OF THE YEAR

Jermaine Cunningham made his first start of the season when he lined up at end and Rob Ninkovich moved to linebacker due to the injury to rookie LB Dont'a Hightower.

CONSECUTIVE GAMES WITH AT LEAST ONE TOUCHDOWN PASS CONTINUES FOR BRADY

Tom Brady has now thrown at least one touchdown pass in 38 straight regular season games following a 46-yard touchdown pass to WR Wes Welker in the first quarter. It is the third longest streak, behind Drew Brees at 48 (current) and Johnny Unitas (47) (1956-60).

BRADY TIES WARREN MOON WITH 49TH 300-YARD GAME

Brady had his 49th career 300-yard game after finishing with 395 yards at Seattle to tie hall of famer Warren Moon for the seventh most 300-yard games in NFL history. The 395 yards are the fifth best in Brady's career.

CHANDLER JONES HAD FIRST TWO-SACK GAME

First round pick Chandler Jones had his first NFL two-sack game to increase his team-lead to five sacks on the year. He forced a fumble that was recovered by LB Rob Ninkovich on a 3-yard sack in the second quarter and had a 5-yard sack in the third quarter.



GIL SANTOS – THE VOICE OF THE PATRIOTS

For most Patriots fans, there has been but one "Voice of the New England Patriots" and it belongs to Gil Santos. Now in his 36 season, Santos has articulated the sights, sounds and all the play-by-play action for 733 games to millions of Patriots fans. Santos is tied with the Philadelphia Eagles' veteran play-by-play announcer, Merrill



Reese, as the two most tenured radio broadcasters in the NFL. Santos began calling games for the Boston Patriots at Fenway Park in 1966. He was the voice of the Patriots for the next 14 seasons (1966-79). He returned to the booth in 1991 and has broadcast every Patriots game since then.

PATRIOTS NAME 2012 TEAM CAPTAINS

The Patriots team captains are the same six who served as captains in 2011. The Patriots' 2012 captains were elected by their teammates. Quarterback Tom Brady and G Logan Mankins are the offensive captains. Nose tackle Vince Wilfork, LB Jerod Mayo and CB Devin McCourty are the defensive captains. Wide receiver Matthew Slater is the special teams captain. Brady has been chosen as a captain for the 11th straight season. Wilfork is a captain for the fifth straight season, while Mayo, is in his fourth season serving as a captain. Mankins, McCourty and Slater are captains for a second time.

TOM BRADY AND WELKER SCORE ON A 99-YARD PASS

Tom Brady connected with Wes Welker on a 99-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter of the 2011 season-opener at Miami (9/12/11). The 99-yard play tied the NFL record for the longest offensive play, which has been accomplished 14 times.

The Patriots have 2,672 net yards through the first six games in 2012 and are on pace to finish with 7,125 yard and become just the third NFL team to finish with over 7,000 total yards. Last season, the Patriots finished the 2011 season with 6,848 total net yards, setting a new franchise record for most total net yards in a season. That total is fourth all-time in NFL history.

2012 WHAT TO LOOK FOR

BILL BELICHICK

- Bill Belichick (195) needs seven more wins to move past Dan Reeves (201) into seventh place all-time.
- Belichick (17) needs one more postseason victory to move out of a tie with Joe Gibbs into sole possession of third place alltime in postseason wins. Tom Landry (20) is in first place followed by Don Shula (19).

TOM BRADY

- Tom Brady has 49 career 300-yard games. He needs one more 300-yard game to break a tie with Hall of Famer Warren Moon for sole possession of seventh place with 50 300-yard games.
- If Brady reaches 30 or more touchdowns passes in 2012 he will become just the fifth player in NFL history with at least 30 or more touchdown passes in four seasons.
- Brady needs one more postseason victory to set the NFL record for most career postseason wins by a starting guarterback. He enters 2012 tied with Joe Montana with 16 career postseason wins.
- Brady (21) needs one more AFC Offensive Player of the Week honor to break a tie with Peyton Manning (21) for the most player of the week honors in NFL history.
- If Brady reaches 4,000 passing yards in 2011, he will be just the fifth player in NFL history to reach 4,000 yards in five or more seasons: Peyton Manning (11), Dan Marino (6), Drew Brees (6) and Brett Favre (6).
- Brady has thrown at least one touchdown pass in 38 straight games. Brady's 38 straight games with at least one touchdown pass are third all-time, Drew Brees (48-current) and Johnny Unitas (47).
- Brady had at least one touchdown pass in all 16 games in each of the last two seasons and has thrown for at least one in each of the first six games of 2012. Brady and Brees are the first two quarterbacks to throw for at least one touchdown pass in all 16 games for two straight seasons.

ROB GRONKOWSKI

- Rob Gronkowski (10 touchdowns in 2010 and 18 in 2011) can become the first tight end in NFL history with three straight 10plus touchdown seasons. Gronkowski and Antonio Gates (13 in 2004 and 10 in 2005) are the only tight ends to have back-toback 10-plus touchdown seasons. Gronkowski has three touchdowns in the first six games of 2012.
- If Gronkowski has another 10-touchdown season in 2012, he will join Randy Moss (2007, 2008 and 2009) and Corey Dillon (2004, 2005, 2006) as the only Patriots with three straight 10plus touchdown seasons and three 10-plus seasons overall.
- Gronkowski has 30 receiving touchdowns and 31 touchdowns overall (30 receiving and 1 rushing) since 2010. The NFL record for most receiving touchdown in a player's first three NFL seasons is 43 by Randy Moss and the NFL record for most touchdowns overall by a player in his first three NFL seasons is 47 by Barry Sanders (4 receiving and 43 rushing).

CHANDLER JONES

• Chandler Jones has three forced fumbles in 2012. The Patriots record for most forced fumbles in a season is five by Mike Vrabel in 2007.

WES WELKER

- If Wes Welker reaches 100 receptions in 2012, he will become the first player in NFL history with five 100-catch seasons.
- Welker now has 16 10-plus catch seasons and needs two more 10-plus catch games to become the NFL's all-time leader. Jerry Rice is in first place with 17 10-reception games, followed by Marvin Harrison (16) and Welker (16).
- Welker (15) needs one more game with 10 receptions and 100 receiving yards to break a tie with Jerry Rice (15) for the most in NFL history.
- •Welker has caught 10 or more passes in two straight games and needs to catch 10 or more against the Jets for three straight to tie an NFL record set by Andre Johnson (2008), Brett Perriman (1995) and Reggie Wayne (2007-08).

PATRIOTS DEFENSE HOLDS TENNESSEE TO JUST **20 YARDS RUSHING IN 2012 OPENER**

The Patriots defense held the Titans to just 20 yards rushing on 16 attempts for a 1.3-yard average in the 2012 season opener. The 20 yards rushing allowed are the fifth-lowest total in Patriots history and the lowest total since holding Buffalo to 14 yards rushing on Dec. 11, 2005 in Buffalo.

Rookie RB Brandon Bolden (137) and RB Stevan Ridley (106) both rushed for over 100 yards at Buffalo on Sept. 30. It is the first time the Patriots had two 100-yard rushers in the same game since Nov. 23, 1980 at Baltimore Colts when Don Calhoun (106) and Vagas Ferguson (100) each had 100 yards rushing

2012 PATRIOTS HAVE FIRST BACK-TO-BACK 200 YARD RUSHING GAMES SINCE 1978

The Patriots had more than 200 rushing yards in back-to-back games for the first time since 1978. Vs. Denver (10/7), New England finished the game with a total of 251 rushing yards on 54 carries. The previous week at Buffalo (9/30), New England had a total of 247 rushing yards. The last time New England had 200-plus rushing yards in consecutive games was when it followed a 213-yard performance on Dec. 3, 1978 at Dallas with a 249-yard effort against Buffalo on Dec. 10, 1978. It is the 69th time in franchise history that they have rushed for 200 yards in a game. It is the most rushing yards in a game since gaining 277 at Oakland on Dec. 14, 2008.

SECOND TIME IN NFL HISTORY A TEAM HAS TWO 100-YARD RUSHERS, TWO 100-YARD RECEIVERS AND A 300-YARD PASSER

The Patriots had two 100-yard rushers (Brandon Bolden 137 and Stevan Ridley (106), two 100-yard receivers (Wes Welker 129 and Rob Gronkowski 104) and a 300-yard passer (Tom Brady 340) in the win at Buffalo (9/30) for the first time in team history. It is the second time in NFL history that feat has been accomplished. Green Bay was the first team to do so on Dec. 28. 2008 in a win vs. Detroit when Ryan Grant (106) and DeShawn Wynn (106) rushed for over 100 yards, Donald Driver (111) and Greg Jennings (101) went over 100 yards receiving and Aaron Rodgers (308) passed for over 300 yards.

PATRIOTS TIED A TEAM RECORD WITH FOUR **RUSHING TOUCHDOWNS AT BUFFALO**

The Patriots tied a team record with four rushing touchdowns in the win at Buffalo (9/30). It is the seventh time and the first time since Oct. 16, 1983 vs. San Diego that the Patriots scored on four rushing touchdowns in a game.

PATRIOTS OFFENSE GAINS 580 YARDS AT **BUFFALO**

The Patriots chalked up 580 yards in total offense at Buffalo (9/30), the fourth most in team history. It is the 14th time in team history that the Patriots have recorded at least 500 total yards on offense. It is the ninth time under Bill Belichick that the Patriots have accomplished the feat.

PATRIOTS SET TEAM RECORD WITH 35 FIRST DOWNS IN THE WIN VS. DENVER

The Patriots gained a total of 35 first downs vs. Denver (10/7), marking the highest total in franchise history. New England had 18 first downs rushing, 16 first downs passing, and one first down by penalty. The previous team record for most first downs in a game was 34, achieved against the Washington on Oct. 28, 2007.

PATRIOTS ARE FIRST TEAM SINCE THE NFL MERGER TO REGISTER THREE STRAIGHT GAMES WITH 30 OR MORE FIST DOWNS

The Patriots are the first team since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to have recorded 30 or more first downs in three straight games with 33 at Baltimore (9/23), 33 at Buffalo (9/30) and a team-record of 35 vs. Denver (10/7).

PATRIOTS SCORE 45 SECOND HALF POINTS TO TIE A TEAM RECORD FOR MOST POINTS IN A HALF

The Patriots scored 45 points in the second half, including 31 points in the fourth quarter at Buffalo (9/3). It is tied for the highest total in a half in franchise history. The Patriots scored 45 first half points vs. Tennessee on Oct. 18, 2009 in a 59-0 win. 

Bill Belichick is the only head coach in NFL history to win three Super Bowl titles in a four-year span. He has won more regular season games (123) and more games overall (136) during a 10-year stretch (2002-2011) than any other coach in NFL History. In the 2007 season, Belichick led the Patriots to the fourth undefeated and untied regular season and the first since the NFL established a 16-game schedule in 1978.

Bill Belichick is 43-7 (.860) in December with New England, the best record in December among head coaches with one team in NFL history (min. 25 games). George Seifert is second (27-6, .818).

BELICHICK NAMED COACH OF THE YEAR 3 TIMES

The Associated Press named Bill Belichick the NFL's Coach of the Year for 2010. It was the third time that Belichick earned the honor. He was also named Coach of the Year following the 2003 and 2007 seasons. Belichick joins Don Shula (4-time winner) and Chuck Knox as the only three-time winners.

BELICHICK FIRST WITH 14 WINS IN FOUR SEASONS

Bill Belichick guided the Patriots to an NFL-best 14-2 record in 2010. Belichick is the first head coach ever to win at least 14 regular-season games in four separate seasons. Only four other coaches — San Francisco's George Seifert (3), Washington's Joe Gibbs (2), Chicago's Mike Ditka (2) and Miami's Don Shula (2) — have more than one 14-win season.

BRADY REACHES 30 TDS FOR THIRD TIME

Tom Brady (39) reached 30 touchdown passes in 2011. Brady now has three 30-touchdown seasons after throwing for an NFLleading 36 in 2010 and an NFL-record 50 in 2007. He is one of just 13 NFL players since the 1970 merger to have at least two 30 touchdown seasons. The only other Patriots quarterback to have a 30-touchdown season was Vito Parilli in 1964 when he led the AFL with 31.

BRADY SETS FRANCHISE RECORD WITH 517 PASSING YARDS

Brady set a franchise record with 517 passing yards in the 2011 season-opener at Miami (9/12). The previous high was 426 yards by Drew Bledsoe vs. Minnesota on Nov. 13, 1994. Brady's previous best was 410 passing yards vs. Kansas City on Sept. 22, 2002. Brady is one of 13 NFL quarterbacks to throw for 500 yards or more. His 517 yards are the sixth highest in NFL history.

BRADY SETS NFL RECORD WITH AT LEAST TWO TOUCHDOWNS AND NO INTERCEPTIONS

Tom Brady set an NFL record by throwing at least two touchdowns without an interception in each of the final nine games of the 2010 season. Brady passed Don Meredith's previous record of six straight games with two or more touchdowns and no interceptions (1965-66).

BRADY REACHEAD 3,000 YARDS IN 2011 IN JUST NINE GAMES

Brady entered the Jets game on Nov. 13, 2011 with 2,703 yards and added 329 to set the NFL record for most yards through a team's first nine games with 3,032 yards. Brady joins Drew Brees (2011) as the only players to reach 3,000 yards passing in the first nine games of a season.

BRADY HAD 423 YARDS AS A FOLLOW-UP TO HIS 517 YARD PERFORMANCE IN MIAMI IN 2011

In the 2011 season opener in Miami (9/12), Brady threw for 517 yards, becoming one of 11 passers in NFL history to break the 500-yard mark. In Week 2 against San Diego (9/18), Brady became the first of those 11 500-yard passers to follow up his 500-yard performance by throwing for 400 or more yards. Before Brady's performance against the Chargers, only Drew Brees (2006) had followed-up a 500-yard game with 300 or more passing yards.

BRADY HAS 8TH GAME WITH 300 YDS AND 4 TDS

Tom Brady had his 8th game with 300 yards or more (326) and 4 TDs (and no interceptions) in a win against the Jets (12/6/10) last season. Drew Brees leads the NFL with nine such games in his career.

BRADY HAD 14 GAMES IN 2011 WITH 2 OR MORE TOUCHDOWNS

Rookie RB Brandon Bolden finished with 16 carries for 137 yards and an 8.6-yard average at Buffalo (9/30) with runs of 20 and 27 yards. His 8.6-yard average is tied for the third highest ever in a single game for the Patriots among running backs with at least 15 rushing attempts. He earned the FedEx Ground Player of the Week for his performance.

He was with Kansas City for two Super Bowls, losing Super Bowl I and winning Super Bowl IV. Said Bolden about his grandfather, "I remember being 6 years old, him popping in a highlight film of Super Bowl I and IV. I've seen that tape at least 500 times."

DEION BRANCH – SUPER BOWL XXXIX MVP

Deion Branch was awarded the Pete Rozelle Trophy as the Most Valuable Player of Super Bowl XXXIX. His 11 receptions in the game tied the Super Bowl record, also achieved by Jerry Rice, Dan Ross and Wes Welker. On the day of Super Bowl XXXIX, Deion called a dozen of his former football coaches to thank them for the support that they gave him throughout his high school, junior college and college careers. Hours after talking to his coaches, he tied the Super Bowl record with 11 receptions and was named MVP of the game. Branch has turned in his biggest performances on the greatest stage in sports, leading all receivers in Super Bowls XXXVIII and XXXIX. He recorded a combined 24 receptions in three games and owns two of the top seven receiving performances in Super Bowl history. His career reception total in the Super Bowl ranks third all-time, trailing only Jerry Rice (33) and Andre Reed (27).

DAN CONNOLLY HAS THE LONGEST KICKOFF RETURN EVER BY AN OFFENSIVE LINEMAN

Dan Connolly was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week after he returned a kickoff 71 yards to the 4-yard line in the second quarter of the Patriots win vs. Green Bay on Dec. 19, 2010. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, it is the longest kickoff return by an offensive lineman in NFL history. The run by Connolly topped the 48-yard touchdown return by Atlanta's Mal Snider in 1969. Previously, the longest kickoff return for a Patriots offensive lineman was a 27-yard return by G Stephen Neal on Nov. 30, 2008 vs. Pittsburgh. Connolly's previous best was a 16-yard return vs. <u>Miami on Nov. 8, 2009</u>.

JULIAN EDELMAN SETS FRANCHISE RECORD WITH A 94-YARD PUNT RETURN FOR A TOUCHDOWN

WR Julian Edelman set a franchise record with a 94-yard punt return for a touchdown in the second quarter vs. Miami (01/02/11). The Patriots' previous longest punt return was an 89-yard touchdown return by Mike Haynes vs. Buffalo on Nov. 7, 1976. Edelman returned his second career punt for a touchdown vs. Kansas City on Nov. 21, 2011 with a 72-yard



return. He is the fourth Patriots player with two or more punt returns for a touchdown. He was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance against Kansas City.

Edelman began his college football career with a year at the College of San Mateo (Calif.) before transferring to Kent State where as a senior he completed 56% of his passes (153 of 275 passes for 1,820 yards) with 13 touchdowns. He was also the leading rusher, gaining 1,551 yards on 215 attempts (an average of 7.5 yards per carry) and scoring 13 touchdowns. His offensive numbers broke Kent State's single-season record for total offense set by Joshua Cribbs in 2003.

EDELMAN GOES ON DEFENSE

Late in the fourth quarter of the Patriots' 37-16 win at the Jets (11/13) last season, Edelman was pressed into service on defense and registered his first NFL tackle when he laid a hard hit on RB LaDainian Tomlinson. He continued to see action on defense throughout the season and finished the year with 14 total tackles.

GRONKOWSKI SETS NFL RECORD FOR RECEIVING YARDS BY A TIGHT END

Rob Gronkowski finished the 2011 season with 1,327 receiving yards, surpassing San Diego's Kellen Winslow's 1980 record of 1,290 receiving yards for most receiving yards in a season by a tight end. New Orleans' Jimmy Graham also broke Winslow's old record, but finished with 1,310 receiving yards, 17 shy of Gronkowski's new record.

Gronkowski set an NFL record for most touchdowns by a tight end with 18 over all touchdowns (17 receiving and 1 rushing). Gronkowski passed the old mark of 13 receiving touchdowns by Vernon Davis (SF in 2009) and Antonio Gates (SD in 2004). Gronkowski became the second tight end in New England Patriots history to go over 1,000 receiving yards in 2011. He moved past TE Ben Coates (1,174 yards in 1994) to set the franchise record for most receiving yards by a Patriots tight end with 1,327 yards. He is the seventh tight end in NFL history to reach 1,200 yards.

GRONKOWSKI BECOMES FIRST PATRIOTS TIGHT END TO RECORD A RUSHING TOUCHDOWN

Gronkowski scored a 2-yard touchdown on a lateral from Tom Brady in the third quarter vs. Indianapolis (12/4/11), becoming the first tight end in Patriots history to score a rushing touchdown. Gronkowski is the first NFL tight end to score a rushing touchdown since Tennessee's Bo Scaife had a 31-yard scoring run against Baltimore on Nov. 12, 2006. He is the first tight end since the 1970 merger to have two receiving touchdowns and a rushing touchdown in the same game.

LEADS AFC IN SCORING; FIRST TIME THAT A TIGHT END HAS LED A CONFERENCE IN SCORING

Gronkowski led the AFC in scoring among non-kickers with 108 points in 2011 and finished second in the NFL to Philadelphia's LeSean McCoy, who had 120 points. It is the first time in NFL history that a tight end has led his conference in scoring and the first time a tight end has led the NFL in touchdown receptions (17).

BACK-TO-BACK 10 TOUCHDOWN SEASONS

Gronkowski scored 10 touchdowns in 2010 and then scored 18 touchdowns in 2011. With back-to-back 10 touchdown seasons (10 in 2010 and 18 in 2011), Gronkowski is the second Patriots player to have back-to-back seasons with 10 or more touchdown reception seasons. AARON HERNANDEZ LEARNS FROM HIS BROTHER

The relationship between Aaron Hernandez and his older brother D.J. has taken on many roles over the years: sibling, teammate, role model and surrogate father. They played high school football together – D.J. the star senior quarterback and Aaron, the athletic, but not quite ready, freshman. When their father passed away when Aaron



was 17, he relied on his brother even more. "I just followed my brother's footsteps," he told the Providence Journal. "I just tried to follow his work ethic because he did everything the right way. He was always successful." D.J., now a graduate assistant at the University of Miami, has tried to instill hard work and perseverance in his younger brother. It's paying off, as Aaron continues to thrive in the Patriots offense.

AARON HERNANDEZ ON HOW BEING A PATRIOT HAS CHANGED HIM

"This is a place that not only did it change my future from them paying me, but it just changed me as a person," he said. "You can't come here and act reckless and do your own stuff, and [I] was one of the persons that when I came here, I might've acted the way I wanted to act, but you get changed by Bill Belichick's way. You get changed by the Patriots' way. Now that I'm a Patriot, I have to start living like one, and making the right decisions for them."

Lloyd has 28 receptions of 25 or more yards since 2010, the fifth best during that time frame, behind DeSean Jackson (32), Mike Wallace (31), Calvin Johnson (30) and Larry Fitzgerald (29). Lloyd has two receptions of 25 or more yards with New England, a 27-yard receptions at Tennessee (9/9) and a 25-yard touchdown catch at Buffalo (9/30).

MANKINS GOT A UNIQUE RIDE TO THE AFC CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

Logan Mankins' car wouldn't start when he was leaving the team hotel to head to last season's AFC Championship Game. He went back into the hotel lobby with plans to call a car service for help, but he ran into fans dressed in Patriots apparel and asked if they were going to the game and if they could give him a ride. The fans planned on parking at their usual spot across from the stadium but Mankins was able to return the favor of a ride for premium parking right next to the stadium.

STEVAN RIDLEY HAS THREE 100-YARD RUSHING DAYS IN 2012

Stevan Ridley had his first career 100-yard day in the 2012 season opener at Tennessee (9/9) with 125 yards rushing on 21 carries for a 6.0-yard average. He finished with 106 yards rushing on 22 carries for a 4.8-yard average at Buffalo (9/30) and then had a career-high 151 rushing yards vs. Denver (10/7).

RIDLEY GOES LONG

In the season opener at Tennessee (9/9/12), Ridley had five runs of 15 or more yards (17, 17, 16, 15, 15). No Patriots running back in at least the past 25 years has done that in a single game, according to the Elias Sports Bureau. It is the first time under Bill Belichick that a Patriots running back had five runs of 15 or more yards rushing in the same game. Ridley was the first under Belichick to have four runs of 15 or more yards in the same game when he had runs of 33, 25, 20, and 18 at Oakland on Oct. 2, 2011. Tennessee's Chris Johnson was the last NFL player to have five runs of 15 or more yards in a game (Nov. 27, 11 vs. Tampa Bay).

"My coaches came to me and said, 'You'd be an all right tight end, but you'd be an even better tackle," he told the Boston Globe. "I've always wanted to be great, so that's why I moved to tackle." He added over 30 pounds after his redshirt freshman season and was named the team's starting left tackle. He played in 2,540 of 2,542 offensive plays over the next three seasons at Colorado and became an immediate contributor on the Patriots offensive line at right tackle as a rookie before moving to left tackle

DONALD THOMAS: FROM NO HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL TO THE NFL


Donald Thomas found football while playing basketball. A former high school baseball and basketball player who had never played football at any level, Thomas often played pickup basketball at the student gymnasium and one day found himself playing with several members of the UConn football team who convinced him to try out for the team. After meeting with coaches, Thomas walked on to the team as a defensive lineman for the scout team in 2003. He red-shirted a year before contributing on special teams. In 2007, he got his chance to play offensive guard, earning All-Big East honors before being selected in the sixth round of the 2008 draft by the Miami Dolphins.

SEBASTIAN VOLLMER MAKES HIS MARK

A native of Kaarst, Germany, Vollmer did not begin playing football until the age of 14 when he started playing for the Dusseldorf club team. Vollmer helped lead his German prep school team to two national football championships. His early football success landed him an appearance in the 2004 Global Junior Championships in San Diego, which led him to a scholarship at Houston. He spoke almost no English when he signed with Houston, but he became fluent in the language as he developed from a 250-pound tight end into a 315-pound lineman who started his final 25 games at tackle for the Cougars, Vollmer's collegiate career created interest from the NFL where the Patriots drafted him in the second round of the 2009 draft. Nicknamed "Seabass" during his playing days at Houston, a nickname that has carried over to the NFL

WOODHEAD GOES FROM DIVISION II TO THE NFL

Danny Woodhead was a standout at Division II Chadron State in Nebraska. He averaged 178.9 yards per game and totaled 101 rushing touchdowns during his collegiate career. Woodhead's outstanding junior and senior seasons earned him two Harlon Hill Trophies, the Division II equivalent to the Heisman Trophy. He is one of just three players to ever win two or more Harlon Hill



Trophies, joining Texas A&M University-Kingsville running back Johnny Bailey, who won it three times (1987-89) before playing six seasons in the NFL for the Bears, Cardinals, and Rams. Valdosta State University's Dusty Bonner was the only other player to win the Harlon Hill Trophy multiple times (2000 and 2001).

DANNY WOODHEAD SET TEAM MARK FOR **RUSHING AVERAGE IN 2010**

Danny Woodhead finished the 2010 season with 97 rushes for 547 yards, with his average of 5.64 yards per carry setting a new team record (minimum 90 rushing attempts). Woodhead topped Don Calhoun's previous team mark of 5.59 yards per carry in 1976 (129 attempts for 721 yards).

PATRICK CHUNG'S JOURNEY TO THE NFL Long before S Patrick Chung picked up flag football as a teen, his mother, Jamaican recording artist Sophia George, had preached about being a tough man in a song. Her hit single, "Girlie Girlie" - a traditional reggae song which pokes fun at a boy who was not man enough - topped the charts in 1985. Chung is aware that among his talents he was born with, such as speed and agility,



singing is not one of them. Chung possesses a great sense of pride in his unique heritage - his mother is Jamaican and his father is half Jamaican and half Chinese, was born in Jamaica and moved to California at age 12 where he started to play football as a freshman in high school. Chung went on to star at Oregon, where he holds the distinction of starting more games than any other defensive player in school history with 51 starts. He originally entered the draft as a junior, but ultimately decided to return for his senior season. Pinned to the back of his locker is a reminder of the support he has gotten - a Jamaican flag that represents his family's heritage.

STEVE GREGORY WAS ABOUT TO ENTER THE POLICE ACADEMY UNTIL SAN DIEGO CALLED

Steve Gregory's father and stepmother are New York City police officers and both were on duty during the events of September 11, 2001. Following his college career at Syracuse, Gregory took the test to enter the police academy. He found out he passed the test on the same day that the San Diego Chargers called him to offer him a free agent contract.

DONT'A HIGHTOWER WEARS TEDY BRUSCHI'S JERSEY #54

As a first round draft pick, Dont'a Hightower is used to high expectations. Hightower went to training camp with jersey #45 but was switched to jersey #54 prior to the start of the regular season. Former LB Tedy Bruschi wore #54 for 13 seasons. Hightower understands the importance of the number and hopes to live up to its legacy. "I definitely feel honored to be able to wear this number," Hightower said. "I've read that Tedy didn't want it to be retired and he hoped another linebacker would come in and be able to wear this number and be able to play as well. I feel honored. Tedy was a great player, and he means a lot to this organization. I'm definitely proud to be able to wear this number."



2012 FIRST ROUND PICK CHANDLER JONES FOLLOWS IN BROTEHRS' FOOTSTEPS

Chandler Jones has two brothers, including Arthur, a fifth-round NFL Draft selection by the Baltimore Ravens in 2010, who was a Syracuse defensive tackle, and John "Bones" Jones, a UFC fighter and the reigning Light Weight Champion.

Chandler Jones was excited to get the Madden football game and play himself: "I've always put myself in Madden manually, but now that I can actually buy the game and see myself already installed in the game, it's great."

FIRST ROUND PICKS MAKE IMPACT IN 2012 OPENER

Chandler Jones forced a fumble on a 1-yard sack of Tennessee QB Jake Locker in the first quarter and Dont'a Hightower recovered the ball and ran 6-yards for a touchdown in the season opener at Tennessee (9/9/12). It is the first fumble returned for a touchdown for the Patriots since Gary Guyton returned a fumble 35 yards for a touchdown at Chicago on Dec. 12, 2010. It is the first defensive touchdown for the Patriots since Sterling Moore returned an interception 21 yards for a score vs. Buffalo on Jan. 1, 2012.

JONES HAS FIRST TWO-SACK GAME

Chandler Jones had his first NFL two-sack game at Seattle (10/14) to increase his team-lead to five sacks on the year. He forced a fumble that was recovered by LB Rob Ninkovich on a 3-yard sack in the second quarter and had a 5-yard sack in the third quarter.

JONES HAS FORCED THREE FUMBLES ON SACKS

Jones now has three forced fumbles in 2012. The Patriots record for most forced fumbles in a season is five by Mike Vrabel in 2007. Jones forced a fumble on a sack at Tennessee (9/9), vs. Arizona (9/16) and at Seattle (10/14).

JONES NAMED AFC ROOKIE OF THE MONTH FOR SEPTEMBER

Jones was named the AFC Rookie of the Month for September. Jones registered three sacks in his first four games with two forced fumbles, the most sacks of any NFL rookie. His first NFL sack at Tennessee resulted in a forced fumble that was returned for a touchdown. Jones finished the month with 19 tackles, three sacks and two forced fumbles He joins Jerod Mayo (October of 2008) as the only Patriots to be named NFL Defensive Rookie of the Month.

STILL RECEIVING THE LOVE

Kyle Love continues to receive motivation from his father, retired Army colonel Anthony Love. Every game day, his father sends him a text message with words of encouragement to get him excited. His dad has been motivating him since middle school and the message has always remained the same: "Give the coaches a reason to keep you."

KYLE LOVE 'MINI-V' FOLLOWS WILFORK

Kyle Love has been looking up to Vince Wilfork since his days at Mississippi State, when his teammates dubbed him "Mini-V" for his resemblance to the Patriots defensive tackle. The nickname led Love to closely monitor Wilfork as he finished his playing days with the Bulldogs. Little did he know that he would get the chance to watch Wilfork from an even closer perspective – lined up next to him on the Patriots defensive line. "I stay close to that guy always. Watch me out here, I'm right beside him, no matter what," Love told the *Boston Globe*. Now that they're on the same team, Wilfork has become an even bigger influence, like a big brother, according to Love.

STERLING MOORE; MORE TURNOVERS

Patriots defensive back Sterling Moore ended Denver's (10/7) first offensive possession when he ran down Broncos wide receiver Demaryius Thomas and punched the ball loose, recording a forced fumble and then a fumble recovery to give New England possession. The play marked the first forced fumble and the first fumble recovery of Moore's career and was the third forced turnover of his career, joining his two interceptions in the 2011 regular-season finale against Buffalo, one of which was returned 21 yards for a touchdown.

MAYO OVER 100 TACKLES FOR THE FOURTH STRAIGHT YEAR

LB Jerod Mayo finished the 2011 season with 103 tackles, registering 100 tackles for the fourth straight year. He is the first player in New England history to register 100 tackles in his first four NFL seasons. He is the fifth Patriots player to register at least four consecutive 100 tackle seasons. Mayo has had 10 or more tackles in four of the first six games in 2012 and is on pace for his fifth straight season of 100 or more tackles.

MAYO ON PACE FOR 200 TACKLES IN 2012

Jerod Mayo learned knowledge and discipline are the keys to success while spending afternoons with his three brothers under the supervision of their grandfather, Walter Johnson, a retired Air Force veteran of 30 years. While Mayo's mother worked two jobs, Johnson taught the boys discipline, responsibility and the value of life. Those lessons helped Mayo develop a work ethic and demeanor that has earned him the nickname of "Old Soul" from his teammates. His leadership skills and talent helped him become only the second Patriot to be named AFC Rookie of the Year, earning that title in 2008 to join Michael Haynes (1976)

DOUBLE TROUBLE: CB DEVIN MCCOURTY

After being selected by the Patriots in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft, CB Devin McCourty became part of a select group in league history. McCourty's identical twin brother, Jason, is a cornerback with Tennessee, selected in the sixth round of the 2009 NFL Draft. The two are the 12th set of twins to play in the NFL. Devin redshirted for the 2005 season and therefore was a year behind his brother in eligibility. McCourty is the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 1998-2000. His twin brother, Wasswa, played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox. MCCOURTY REGISTERS SECOND CAREER TWO-INTERCEPTION GAME AT BUFFALO

Devin McCourty had his second career two-interception game in the win at Buffalo on Sept. 30, 2012. He had his first interception of the 2012 season when he picked off a Ryan Fitzpatrick pass at the Buffalo 42-yard line in the first quarter. He picked off his second pass in the fourth quarter. It is McCourty's second career two-interception game. He had his first two-interception game at Detroit on Nov. 25, 2010. The Patriots are 9-0 when McCourty has at least one interception in a game.

ROB NINKOVICH: WHERE DID HE COME FROM?

Rob Ninkovich's journey to the Patriots was not easy. He entered the league as a fifthround pick by the Saints in 2006 and was waived four times by New Orleans and Miami before landing in New England on Aug. 2, 2009. He spent the 2009 offseason trying to make the New Orleans team as a long snapper. Before coming to the Patriots, he had appeared in just eight games over



three years. He doubled that total in his first year in New England, appearing in 15 games in 2009 and his role on the team has grown since, earning a starting role at linebacker in 2010 and 2011 before moving to a starting role on the defensive line in 2011.

NINKOVICH SCORED AS A TE IN COLLEGE

Ninkovich played some at tight end in college at Purdue and caught two touchdown passes with a 2-yard touchdown pass from Dallas QB Kyle Orton and a 1-yard touchdown pass from former Indianapolis QB Curtis Painter.

NINKOVICH SACKS

Since the beginning of the 2010 season, Ninkovich leads the team with a total of 13.0 sacks over that span.

NINKOVICH AND SPIKES: BACK-TO-BACK WEEKS WITH TWO FORCED FUMBLES EACH

LB Brandon Spikes forced two fumbles at Buffalo (9/30) and Ninkovich forced two fumbles vs. Denver (10/7) to become one of eight Patriots players to record at least two forced fumbles in a single game.

SPIKES IS A THROWBACK

Spikes, who patterns his style of play after Hall of Fame linebacker Dick Butkus, shared his feelings on modeling his game after old school linebackers. "My thing is, when I'm done with this game, I want the older guys when they watch to say, 'He's playing the position the right way.' It's just a point of respect from me to them." Spikes passion and energy is apparent when he plays the game. Said former Patriots safety Rodney Harrison in a recent interview with the Boston Herald: "You can see how much he loves it, how he enjoys being physical. "He's an intimidator. He's got that fight in him. He's going to hit you and you're going to feel it."

VINCE WILFORK REGISTERS FIRST CAREER INTERCEPTIONS IN 2011

Vince Wilfork recorded his first career interception when he picked off QB Philip Rivers in the second quarter vs. San Diego (9/18). He had his second interception at Oakland (10/2) to join Anthony Pleasant (2001) as the only other Patriots defensive lineman to ever record two interceptions in the same season. Wilfork is one of four Patriots defensive lineman to ever record two



interceptions overall, joining Pleasant, Richard Seymour and Henry Thomas.

WILFORK SCORES FIRST NFL TOUCHDOWN IN 2011

Wilfork recovered a fumble in the end zone at Washington (12/11/11) for his first touchdown. DE Andre Carter sacked QB Rex Grossman in the end zone and forced a fumble and Wilfork recovered the ball for the Patriots first points in their 34-27 victory.

WILFORK WEARS HIS HEART ON HIS NECK

Wilfork wears No. 75 over his shoulder pads. Underneath hangs a gold chain locket for those who were number one in his heart: his parents. In 2002, parents David and Barbara Wilfork both passed away within five months of each other, leaving the then University of Miami star without his greatest support system. Wilfork, who lost his father to diabetes, has raised hundreds of thousands of dollars for diabetes-related causes. His annual draft day fundraiser, a bowling event he has held for eight years, is one of the longest running fundraising events held by a pro athlete in New England. For his charity work, Wilfork was awarded the 2010 New England Patriots Ron Burton Community Service Award. While he will always cherish his National Championship and Super Bowl rings, his constant reminder lies closest to his heart, a picture of his late parents at their high school prom. "I carry them with me wherever I go," Wilfork said of his parents' keepsake. "My parents pushed me to be the best I could be. The things I do and my wife does, we do out of the kindness of our heart, and we do it for the community. I never look for anything in return. My teammates are my second family. My kids, my wife, the New England Patriots – that's all I have.'

VINCE WILFORK: REASONS FOR PATRIOTS SUCCESS

Patriots Pro Bowl DL Vince Wilfork, who has served as a defensive captain for the Patriots for five straight seasons, says the team's continued success is a result of the entire organization working towards one common goal: "The Patriots are all about team, family and smart football players. They try to get good people here from coaches to guys who work in the front office to guys who put on this uniform. I think everybody has to have one goal in mind, and that's to be together. When you get an organization together that is seeking one goal, you can be pretty successful."

ZOLTAN MESKO: COMING TO AMERICA

P Zoltan Mesko was born in Timisoara, Romania on the Romania-Hungary border. On Many occasions in 1989, during the communist revolutions, his family was forced to take cover to avoid gun shots from the armies. Even after the fall of the Berlin Wall, his family lived in poverty. His family left Romania when his father won a United States Permanent Resident Card (green card) in the Diversity Immigrant Visa Lottery in 1997 when Mesko was 11. "I survived a war," he noted. "I was coming from a really low point growing up, with communism and a very adverse economic situation. Coming over here, I'm very grateful for where I am. It happens by luck that I am here," he said. "When my dad applied for the green card lottery, there were 20 million applicants and 55,000 winners. That's a percentage in itself that tells you I am lucky to be here."

MESKO DISCOVERS FOOTBALL

An avid soccer player from his days in Romania, Mesko had a strong leg. It was only when he came to America that he discovered his leg could take him places. In eighth grade, Mesko was playing kickball in the gym when he kicked the ball so high that he broke a light fixture. He was given a choice: pay for the light fixture or play football. The choice was an easy one—Mesko



decided to play football. His leg would land him numerous Division I scholarships and admission offers from Ivy League schools. From those, Mesko chose to play football at Michigan.

MESKO SETS FRANCHISE RECORD WITH A 46.5 AVERAGE IN 2011

Mesko led the AFC and finished third in the NFL in 2011 with a 41.5 net average. His 46.5 average overall in 2011 is the best in team history, topping the 45.8 average by Tom Tupa in 1997.

MESKO HAS SIXTH-BEST NET AVERAGE IN NFL HISTORY IN 2011

Mesko finished the 2011 season with a 41.5 net average, the sixth-best net average in NFL history. It marked just the 24^{th} time in NFL history that a player finished a season with a net average over 40 yard.

TE Rob Gronkowski (D2a, '10)

Gronkowski's 29 receptions are the most by an AFC TE in 2012 and the second most in the NFL behind Atlanta TE Tony Gonzalez (43) ... Gronkowski's three receiving touchdowns lead the team in 2012 ... Gronkowski set an NFL record for receiving yards by a tight end in a single season with 1,327 in 2011. Gronkowski also set the NFL all-time record for touchdowns by a tight end in a single season, finishing with 18 (17 receiving, 1 rushing) ... Reached 20 career touchdowns faster than any tight end in NFL history (26 games). Pro Football Hall of Fame TE Mike Ditka previously held the record, achieving the feat in 31 games.

TE Aaron Hernandez (D4,'10)

Hernandez returned to action in Week 6 after missing three games due to an ankle injury that he suffered in the 2012 home opener vs. Arizona on Sept. 16. Hernandez recorded 6 receptions for 30 yards and a touchdown in the team's loss at Seattle. Hernandez's 45 receptions in 2010 set a franchise record for most receptions by a rookie tight end, passing Greg Baty's previous rookie tight end record of 37 receptions in 1986.

Ninkovich also forced a McGahee fumble at the Patriots' 11-yard line with 3:48 left in the game and Jermaine Cunningham recovered the loose ball to give the Patriots possession and stop a driving Broncos offense that was looking to cut into a 10-point Denver deficit.



THE TEAM OF THE DECADE

hen Robert Kraft purchased the New England Patriots in 1994, few would have thought that 17 years later the franchise would be the undisputed team of the decade in the first decade of the new millennium. Kraft brought a winning vision to the organization and dedicated his resources to building a consistent winner. On Jan. 27, 2000, Kraft hired Bill Belichick to coach the team, and three months later the team drafted then-unheralded quarterback Tom Brady, putting the final pieces in place for the Patriots to become the most successful NFL team of the 2000s. Below is a look at the accomplishments of the Patriots during the first decade of the new millennium that earned the Patriots the "Team of the Decade" moniker.
