Sunday, December 2, 2012 ★ Sun Life Stadium (75,192) ★ 1:00 p.m. ET The New England Patriots improved to 8-3 with a win over the Jets last Thursday and will be aiming for their ninth win this week when they travel to face the Miami Dolphins. If the Patriots win, they will earn their 12th straight winning season. Only San Francisco (1983-98) and Dallas (1970-85) with 16 straight winning seasons, have had longer stretches than 11. New England enters this week tied with Oakland (1970-80) for the third longest streak in NFL history. While New England is 57-15 against the AFC East since 2001, almost half of those losses have been to Miami. The Patriots are 15-7 against the Dolphins during that time. Overall, the Patriots are 14-33 (.298) all-time in Miami.

The Patriots have finished undefeated in December seven times since 2001: (2001 - 4-0), (2003 - 4-0), (2005 - 4-0), (2007 - 5-0), (2008 - 4-0), (2010 - 4-0) and (2011 - 4-0).

BELICHICK IN DECEMBER

Bill Belichick is 43-7 (.860) in December with THE Patriots, the best record in December among head coaches with one team in NFL history (min. 25 games). George Seifert (San Francisco) is second (27-6, .818).

ANNUAL ACHIEVEMENTS

The Patriots won more than half of their games for the 11th straight year with a 13-3 record in 2011. They are the first team to win more than half of their games in 11 straight seasons since free agency began in 1993. The Patriots are the fourth team to win more than half of their games in 11 straight seasons since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, joining the 49ers (16 straight from 1983-1998), the Cowboys (16 straight from 1970-85) and the Raiders (11 straight from 1970-80).

ROBERT KRAFT NEWS & NOTES

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. Now in his 19th season of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what many observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning



just 19 of 80 games (.238 pct.) and recording the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles (11), conference crowns (6) and Super Bowl championships (3) than any other NFL team. The Patriots have made six Super Bowl appearances since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other NFL franchise has earned more than four berths. In Kraft's first 18 seasons, the Patriots qualified for the playoffs 13 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons

The Patriots have sold out 200 consecutive home games, including playoff and preseason games (dating back to the 1994 season opener).

SERIES HISTORY

The New England Patriots and Miami Dolphins will square off for the 94th time, including three playoff games, in their 47th year as division foes. The Dolphins and Patriots began playing twice a year during the regular season in 1967.



The Patriots have won eight of the last 10 games against Miami, including a sweep in the two meetings in 2011. The

Patriots beat Miami in the 2011 season-opener, 38-24, on Monday Night Football and then beat the Dolphins, 27-24 in the rematch at Gillette Stadium.



The Patriots swept the series in 2010 and again in 2011 for their seventh and eighth series sweeps, respectively.

The Patriots have had the upper hand at home against Miami, as they hold a 28-17 record in games played in New England in the regular-season, including an 8-2

record at Gillette Stadium. But, the Patriots are only 14-33 alltime in Miami.

The two have played three times in the postseason with New England holding a 2-1 advantage.

PATRIOTS-DOLPHINS QUICK HITS

- Since Bill Belichick became Patriots head coach in 2000, New England is 15-9 (.625) against the Miami Dolphins.
- Since 2000, the Patriots are 59-21 (.738) against AFC East opponents. The Patriots are 15-9 against the Dolphins over that span and are 18-8 against the New York Jets and 23-3 against the Buffalo Bills in that time.
- The Patriots have not been swept in their season series with a divisional opponent since 2000, when they lost both games to Miami and also to the New York Jets.
- In nine career games against the Dolphins, Wes Welker has caught 75 passes for 981 yards and four touchdowns, averaging 8.3 catches and 109 receiving yards per game against his former club. Those averages are the best against any team Welker has faced more than once in his career. He also has five 100-yard games against Miami with a 138-yard game at Miami (10/21/07), a 120-yard game at Miami (11/23/08), a 10-catch, 167-yard game in 2009 at Miami (12/06/09), eight receptions for 160 yards, including a 99-yard touchdown at Miami (9/12) in the 2011 season-opener and 12 receptions for 138 yards vs. Miami (12/24/11). Welker has three 100-yard games each against Buffalo and the New York Jets.

PASSING PERFORMANCES

Tom Brady is scheduled to start at quarterback against Miami for the 21st time and has compiled a 14-6 record in his previous 20 starts against the Dolphins. Brady is 53-12 in his career as a starter in the regular-season against AFC East opponents, with six of the 12 losses coming to the Dolphins. One of those losses was in the final game of the 2005 season when Brady was pulled after the first quarter.

Tom Brady threw for a team-record 517 yards and four touchdowns, including a 99-yard touchdown pass to WR Wes Welker, and the New England Patriots started with a victory for the eighth consecutive season with a 38-24 victory over the Miami Dolphins at Sun Life Stadium on Monday Night Football. The Patriots totaled a franchise-best 622 total yards. Miami QB

Chad Henne had a solid effort with 416 yards passing but was overshadowed by Brady. The 906 net yards passing by both teams was an NFL record for a single game. Brady became the 11th quarterback in NFL history to throw for 500 or more yards and his yardage total of 517 is fifth in NFL history. He finished with 32 completions on 48 attempts for 517 yards with four touchdowns. Holding a 31-17 lead with 5:44 to play after the Patriots defense held Miami on a fourth down play from the 1yard line, Brady lined up from shotgun and threw from the end zone to Welker, who slipped behind the Miami coverage and caught the ball in stride on his way to become the 12th NFL player to score on a 99-yard play. Brady also threw a 10-yard touchdown pass to TE Rob Gronkowski, a 2-yarder to Welker and a 1-yarder to TE Aaron Hernandez. Welker (160) and Hernandez (103) both had 100-yard games. Both teams scored on their first offensive drives for a 7-7 first quarter. Brady engineered a 7-play, 65-yard drive that was culminated with a 10-yard touchdown pass to Gronkowski on the second play of the second guarter for a 14-7 New England lead, which they took into halftime. The Patriots took the second half kickoff and Brady had his only blunder of the night when he was intercepted for the first time in 358 pass attempts. A 39-yard return gave Miami a first down at the 1-yard line where Miami scored on a 10-yard touchdown pass from Henne to WR Brian Hartline to tie the game at 14. Brady and the Patriots shook off the error and scored on their next three possessions. Brady engineered a 10-play, 73-yard drive on the ensuing series that ended with a 2-yard touchdown pass to Welker for a 21-14 lead. Following a Miami field goal on the next possession, Brady finished an 8-play, 78-yard drive with a 1-yard touchdown pass to Hernandez for a 28-17 lead heading into the fourth guarter. In the fourth guarter, a 20-yard field goal by K Stephen Gostkowski was followed by the 99-yard touchdown pass from Brady to Welker for a 38-17 lead. The Dolphins added a touchdown late for a 38-24 final. The Patriots first score was set up when Brady connected with WR Matthew Slater on a 46yard pass to the Miami 24-yard line to help set up a 1-yard touchdown run by RB BenJarvus Green-Ellis.

The New England Patriots rallied from a 17-0 first half deficit to beat the Miami Dolphins 27-24 and clinch a first round by in the playoffs.

Tom Brady, who finished with his 44th 300-yard game with 304 yards on 27 completions, was just 7-of-19 for 87 yards in the first half. Brady was playing in front of an offensive line that was without left tackle Matt Light, who was unable to play due to an ankle injury. Logan Mankins moved from left guard to left tackle to take his place but was forced out of the game in the second series due to a knee injury. The Patriots punted on their first six offensive possessions.

Brady completed 20-of-27 passes for 217 yards in the second half and led the Patriots on five straight scoring drives, including three in the third quarter to tie the game at 17. The Patriots took the second half kickoff and moved to the Miami 26-yard line to set up a 45-yard field goal by K Stephen Gostkowski. On the first play of the third quarter, Brady connected with TE Rob Gronkowsmki for a 22-yard gain.

Miami QB Matt Moore fumbled a snap on the next series and NT Vince Wilfork recovered at the Miami 38-yard line. Brady moved the Patriots to the 1-yard line before connecting with WR Deion Branch on a touchdown to close the Miami lead to

17-10. A 1-yard sneak by Brady tied the game at 17 heading into the fourth quarter.

CB Devin McCourty registered his first interception of the 2011 season to end Miami's first drive in the fourth quarter. The Patriots responded with a 10-play, 74-yard drive that ended with a 42-yard field goal by Gostkowski to put the Patriots in the lead at 20-17. After stopping Miami on three straight plays, the Patriots engineered an 11-play, 59-yard drive that ended with Brady's second 1-yard touchdown run of the day for a 27-17 lead.

The Dolphins made it close on Moore's 15-yard scoring pass to WR Davone Bess with 1:48 to play. They had three timeouts left, but their hopes faded when Brady hit WR Wes Welker for a 6-yard gain and a first down and the Patriots ran out the clock to secure the win. Welker had 12 catches for 138 yards to surpass Randy Moss (1,493) for the most receiving yards in a single season with 1,518.

Miami took a 3-0 first quarter lead after scoring on their opening possession. Miami scored on its first two possessions in the second quarter to take a 17-0 halftime lead.

Gronkowski set the team franchise record for most yards by a tight end with 1,219 and Brady set a single-season best with 4,897 passing yards.

• Bill Belichick (200) needs one more win to tie Dan Reeves for seventh place all-time.

TOM BRADY

- With one touchdown pass against the Dolphins, Tom Brady will extend his streak to 44 straight games with at least one touchdown pass and continue his third longest streak all time, behind Drew Brees (54-current) and Johnny Unitas (47).
- Brady has 52 career 300-yard games in the regular season and needs one more to break a fifth place tie with Kurt Warner. Drew Brees and Brett Favre are tied for third with 62 300-yard games.
- Brady tied Drew Brees with his ninth NFL game with four touchdowns, 300 yards and no interceptions against St. Louis and needs one more such game to be alone in first place.
- Brady has 35 games with three touchdowns and no interceptions and needs one more such game to tie Brett Favre (36) for second place, behind Peyton Manning (37).
- Brady (3,671) needs 16 completions to move past Fran Tarkenton (3,686) into 9th place on the NFL's all-time completion list. Vinny Testaverde is in 8th place with 3,787 completions.

STEPHEN GOSTKOWSKI

- Stephen Gostkowski (7-of-10) needs one more 50-yard field goal to tie Adam Vinatieri (8-of-17) for most 50-yard field goals in Patriots history.
- Gostkowski has two 50-yarders so far in 2012 and can become the first Patriots player with three 50-yard field goals in a single season.

JEROD MAYO

 With 10 tackles, Jerod Mayo will have his sixth straight 10plus tackle game and his 10th 10-plus tackle game of the season. He had a career-best with 10 double digit tackle games in 2010.

ROB NINKOVICH

- Rob Ninkovich has a team-leading five forced fumbles. If he has one more forced fumble he will break a tie with Mike Vrabel (five in 2007) for the most forced fumbles for a Patriots player within the last 20 years.
- Ninkovich has 6.0 sacks in 2012 and needs one more to set a career best. He had 6.5 sacks in 2011.

STEVAN RIDLEY

 Stevan Ridley (939) needs 61 yards rushing to reach 1,000 yards and give New England its 15th 1,000-yard rushing season. He will be the 12th Patriots player to reach 1,000 yards and first since BenJarvus Green-Ellis in 2010.

WES WELKER

- Wes Welker (16) needs one more 10-plus catch game to break a second place tie with Marvin Harrison (16) and Andre Johnson (16) and tie Jerry Rice (17) for the most 10-catch games in NFL history.
- Welker needs one reception to extend his streak to 89 straight regular-season games with at least one reception as a member of the Patriots to extend his franchise record. Welker has an overall streak of 105 straight regular-season games with at least one reception, including his time with the Miami Dolphins.
- Welker (961) needs 39 receiving yards for his 5th career 1,000 yard season

<u>TEAM</u>

- The Patriots are 19-0 in the second half of the season since 2010. In both 2010 and 2011, the Patriots were 8-0 in the second half of the season. Their last loss in the second half was in the 2009 season-finale at Houston, a 34-27 loss, on Jan. 3, 2010.

The New England Patriots are guaranteed to finish with a record of .500 or better for the $12^{\rm th}$ consecutive year after a 49-19 win over the New York Jets in a Thanksgiving Night game at MetLife Stadium. The victory was Bill Belichick's 200th career win.

It appeared the game would be a competitive defensive battle after a scoreless first quarter, but the Patriots scored 35 points in the second quarter with four touchdowns in just over six minutes, including three in a 52-second span, to help build a 35-3 halftime lead. The Patriots scored on two Tom Brady passes, including an 83-yard pass and then scored on two fumbles that were returned for touchdowns.

Brady finished 18 of 28 for 323 yards with three touchdowns and no interceptions and also ran for a score. He reached 3,000 yards passing for the 10^{th} time in his career and passed Dan Fouts for 10^{th} place on the NFL's all-time passing list.

The Jets squandered two drives that ended inside New England territory with an interception and a fumble on two of their first three offensive drives.

Safety Steve Gregory had a big night with an interception, a forced fumble and two fumble recoveries, including one he returned for a touchdown.

He ended a scoring threat from the Jets in the first quarter when he intercepted a QB Mark Sanchez pass at the New England 15-yard line. Brady then led the Patriots on a 15-play, 84-yard drive that ended with a 3-yard touchdown pass to WR Wes Welker. The Jets next series ended when LB Brandon Spikes forced RB Shonn Green to fumble, allowing Gregory to recover at the New England 17-yard line. On the next play, Brady threw a swing pass to RB Shane Vereen, who zipped down the left sideline for an 83-yard touchdown to make it 14-0.

The Patriots were back in the end zone moments later when Sanchez fumbled on a second down play as when he hit one of his own players. Gregory picked up the ball and ran it 32 yards for a score to put the Patriots up, 21-0. Devin McCourty forced a fumble on the ensuing kickoff and WR Julian Edelman caught the ball in stride and ran 22 yards for another touchdown and a 28-0 lead.

After stopping the Jets on the next series, Brady connected with Edelman on a 56-yard touchdown pass for a 35-0 lead, with 3:17 left in the half. Jets K Nick Folk got the Jets on the board with a 32-yard field goal with two seconds to play in the half.

RB Stevan Ridley was called for a chop block in the end zone midway through the third quarter, resulting in a safety and a 35-5 Patriots lead. The Jets received the free kick and went on a 4-play, 71-yard drive that ended in a touchdown to cut the lead to 35-12 heading into the fourth quarter.

The Patriots scored on their first two fourth quarter drives for a 49-12 lead. Brady scored on a 1-yard run to finish an 87-yard drive. Rookie CB Alfonzo Dennard forced a fumble that was recovered by LB Rob Ninkovich on the next series, allowing the Patriots to take over at the Jets 37-yard line. Brady threw a 28yard pass to Welker to help set up a 9-yard touchdown run by Ridley to finish the Patriots scoring.

PATRIOTS TO FINISH .500 OR BETTER FOR 12TH STRAIGHT SEASON

With their eighth win of the 2012 season, the Patriots are guaranteed to finish the season with a record of .500 or better for the 12th consecutive year. At the conclusion of the 2012 season, the Patriots will be the only NFL team to finish with a record of .500 or better in each of the last 12 years (2001-2012). Each of the other 31 NFL teams had at least one losing season between 2001 and 2011.

BELICHICK BECOMES 8TH NFL COACH WITH 200 WINS

Bill Belichick became the eighth NFL coach with 200 career victories. He needs one more win to move into seventh place. Dan Reeves is in seventh place with 201 career wins.

THE PATRIOTS EARN THEIR 15TH SERIES SWEEP OVER THE JETS

The Patriots earned their 15th series sweep over the Jets and swept the annual series for the second straight season. The Patriots beat the Jets 29-26 in overtime on Oct. 21 at Gillette Stadium in the first meeting of 2012.

THE PATRIOTS HAVE THE MOST POINTS IN BACK-TO-BACK GAMES IN FRANCHISE HISTORY

With 59 points vs. Indianapolis and 49 points against the Jets, the Patriots have scored 108 points in a two week stretch for the highest two-week point total in team history. The Patriots previous best was 101 points when they scored 49 points and 52 points in back-to-back weeks in 2007. It is the third most in a two-game span in a single season in NFL History. The 1950 Rams hold the record with 135 points, followed by the 1948 Chicago Cardinals with 112 points.

PATRIOTS HAVE 190 POINTS IN LAST FOUR GAMES

The Patriots have scored 190 points in the last four games (49, 52, 37 and 45). Prior to this week's game, that total is more than four teams have scored this year.

PATRIOTS IMPROVE TO 3-2 ON THANKSGIVING The game against the Jets was the Patriots' fifth Thanksgiving game and first Thanksgiving night game. The Patriots improved to a 3-2 Thanksgiving record with the victory.

BELICHICK IMPROVES TO 5-3 ON THANKSGIVING, INCLUDING 3-1 AS PATRIOTS COACH

Patriots head coach Bill Belichick has coached eight times on Thanksgiving: twice as an assistant coach with the Detroit Lions (1976-77), once with the Denver Broncos (1978), once with the N.Y. Giants (1982), and four as the head coach of the New England Patriots (2000, 2002, 2010 and 2012). He has a 5-3 record in those games.

BRADY MOVES PAST DAN FOUTS INTO 10TH PLACE ON THE NFL PASSING LIST

Brady (43,278) moved past Dan Fouts (43,040) into 10th place on the NFL's all-time passing list. He entered the game needing 86 yards to pass Fouts and did so on an 83-yard touchdown pass to RB Shane Vereen. Drew Brees is in ninth place with 43,808 passing yards.

BRADY REACHES 3,000 YARDS PASSING FOR 10TH TIME

Brady (3,299) went over 3,000 passing yards on the season for the 10th time in his career. Brady entered the game needing 24 yards to reach 3,000 yards, which he did on a 28-yard pass to TE Aaron Hernandez in the first quarter. He is one of six NFL players with at least 10 3,000-yard seasons.

BRADY CONNECTS WITH RB SHANE VEREEN ON AN 83-YARD TOUCHDOWN PASS

Brady connected with RB Shane Vereen on an 83-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter. It is the third-longest pass in Brady's career, trailing a 99-yard touchdown pass to Wes Welker at Miami (9/12/11) and a 91-yard touchdown pass to WR David Patten at Indianapolis (10/21/01). Brady now has five touchdown passes of 80 or more yards in his career. It was Vereen's first touchdown reception of his career.



LAST GAME: PATRIOTS AT JETS

BRADY CONNECTS WITH EDELMAN ON A 56-YARD TD FOR SEVENTH GAME WITH TWO 50-YARD PASSES IN THE SAME GAME

Brady connected with WR Julian Edelman for a 56-yard touchdown pass and an 83-yard touchdown pass to Shane Vereen in the second quarter. It is the seventh time in Brady's career (including the postseason) that he has had at least two 50-yard pass plays in the same game. His career best was when he had a 58-yard touchdown, a 58-yard pass and an 81-yard touchdown at Miami on Dec. 6, 2009.

EDELMAN HAS A CAREER-LONG 56-YARD RECEPTION

Edelman's 56-yard touchdown in the second quarter is the longest of his career. His previous best was a 40-yard reception on January 2, 2011.

EDELMAN HAS SECOND STRAIGHT GAME WITH TWO TOUCHDOWNS

Edelman scored on a 22-yard fumble return and a 56-yard reception. It is the second straight game where he has had two touchdowns. He scored on a 68-yard punt return and a 2-yard pass vs. Indianapolis (11/18). He now has three games with two touchdowns. His first was in a 2009 postseason game vs. Baltimore (1/10/10) when he caught two touchdown receptions.

PATRIOTS TIE A TEAM MARK WITH 35 POINTS; BECOME FIRST WITH TWO 30-POINT QUARTERS

The Patriots tied a franchise record for the most points in a quarter with 35 points in the second quarter against the Jets. The Patriots also scored 35 points in the second quarter in a 59-0 win vs. Tennessee on Oct. 18, 2009. The 35 points are tied for the fourth highest amount of points scored in a single quarter. The Patriots are the only team to score 35 points in a quarter since 1983, and they have now done it two times. It is the second time in 2012 that the Patriots have scored 30 or more points in a quarter. The Patriots scored 31 points in the fourth quarter in a 52-28 win at Buffalo on Sept. 30, 2012 and are now the first team in NFL history with two 30-points quarters.

PATRIOTS RETURN TWO FUMBLES FOR A TOUCHDOWN IN THE SAME GAME

Steve Gregory scored on a 32-yard fumble return and Julian Edelman scored on a 22-yard fumble return on the ensuing kickoff. It is the first time in team history that the Patriots have scored on two fumbles returned in the same game.

STEVE GREGORY RECORDS AN INTERCEPTION, RECOVERS A FUMBLE AND SCORES ON A FUMBLE RETURN

Steve Gregory intercepted his second pass of the season when he picked off a QB Mark Sanchez pass in the first quarter. His two interceptions match his season-high. He also had two interceptions in 2010. Gregory also recovered two fumbles, beginning with a Shonn Green fumble in the second quarter followed by a Sanchez fumble which he returned 32 yards for a touchdown. He was also credited with a forced fumble in the third quarter that was recovered by the Jets.

MCCOURTY FORCES A FUMBLE AND EDELMAN RETURNS THE FUMBLE FOR A TD

Devin McCourty forced a fumble on a second quarter kickoff that was returned 22 yards for a touchdown by Julian Edelman.

MARCUS CANNON MAKES FIRST CAREER START

Marcus Cannon made his first NFL start when he lined up at right tackle in place of Sebastian Vollmer, who was inactive for the game.

JEROD MAYO SETS A CAREER BEST WITH HIS FIFTH STRAIGHT 10-PLUS TACKLE GAME

Jerod Mayo had his fifth straight 10-plus tackle game for a new career high after finishing with 15 against the Jets. He had two four-game stretches with 10 or more tackles in 2010. It was also his ninth 10-tackle game of the 2012 season. He had a careerbest with ten 10-tackle games in 2010. After 11 games, Mayo has a team-leading 143 tackles, putting him on pace for 208.

BRADY TIES CAREER-HIGH WITH HIS THIRD RUSHING TOUCHDOWN OF THE SEASON

Brady scored on a 1-yard run for his third rushing touchdown of the season to match a career-high. He had three rushing touchdowns in 2011.

BRADY HAS HIS 52ND 300-YARD GAME TO MOVE INTO A TIE FOR FIFTH WITH KURT WARNER

Tom Brady had his 52nd career 300-yard game after finishing with 323 yards against the Jets to move past Dan Fouts into a tie for fifth place all-time with Kurt Warner for the most 300-yard games in NFL history.

ROB GRONKOWSKI

- Rob Gronkowski (10 touchdowns in 2010 and 18 in 2011) became the first tight end in NFL history with three straight 10plus touchdown seasons after reaching 10 for the season in the win vs. Indianapolis (11/18). Gronkowski and Antonio Gates (13 in 2004 and 10 in 2005) are the only tight ends to have back-to-back 10-plus touchdown seasons.
- Gronkowski joins Randy Moss (2007, 2008 and 2009) and Corey Dillon (2004, 2005, 2006) as the only Patriots with three straight 10-plus touchdown seasons and three 10-plus seasons overall.
- Gronkowski has 37 receiving touchdowns and 38 touchdowns overall (37 receiving and 1 rushing) since 2010. The NFL record for most receiving touchdowns in a player's first three NFL seasons is 43 by Randy Moss and the NFL record for most touchdowns overall by a player in his first three NFL seasons is 47 by Barry Sanders (4 receiving and 43 rushing). Moss (43) and Jerry Rice (40) have the most receiving touchdowns in the their first three NFL seasons.

• Chandler Jones is tied with Ninkovich with 6.0 sacks. The Patriots rookie record for most sacks in a season is 10.5 by Garin Veris in 1985. The NFL rookie record is 14.5 by Jevon Kearse with Tennessee in 1999.

WES WELKER

- Wes Welker now has 16 10-plus catch games and needs two more 10-plus catch games to become the NFL's all-time leader. Jerry Rice is in first place with 17 10-reception games, followed by Marvin Harrison (16), Welker (16) and Andre Johnson.

It is the second time in NFL history that feat has been accomplished. PATRIOTS TIED A TEAM RECORD WITH FOUR **RUSHING TOUCHDOWNS AT BUFFALO**

The Patriots tied a team record with four rushing touchdowns in the win at Buffalo (9/30). It is the seventh time and the first time since Oct. 16, 1983 vs. San Diego that the Patriots scored on four rushing touchdowns in a game.

PATRIOTS HAVE FIVE DEFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS IN 2012

Steve Gregory's 32-yard touchdown on a fumble return and Julian Edelman's 22-yard fumble return at the Jets (11/22) gave the Patriots five defensive touchdowns in 2012. In addition to Gregory and Edelman's scores, LB Dont'a Hightower returned a fumble at Tennessee (9/9), and Alfonzo Dennard and Aqib Talib returned interceptions for touchdowns vs. Indianapolis (11/18). It is the most for the Patriots since scoring five defensive touchdowns in 2010. The Patriots team record for most defensive touchdowns in a season is six by the 2007 team (3 interception returns) and 3 fumble returns). The Patriots also had five defensive touchdowns in 2003 (5 interception returns), 2001 (5 interception returns), 1992 (3 interceptions and 2 fumble returns).

2012 PATRIOTS HAVE SEVEN NON-OFFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS IN 2012

The Patriots have seven non-offensive touchdowns in 2012. The 2010 Patriots and 1961 Patriots teams own the team record with nine non-offensive touchdowns. The NFL record for most non-offensive touchdowns is 13 by Seattle in 1998.

2012 PATRIOTS LEAD THE NFL WITH A TURNOVER DIFFERENTIAL OF +24

The 2012 Patriots are first in the NFL with a +24 turnover differential, forcing 32 turnovers while allowing just 8 turnovers. The Patriots set a franchise record with a +28 turnover differential in 2010, forcing 38 turnovers while allowing just 10 turnovers. The Patriots turnover differential of +28 in 2010 is tied with the 2011 San Francisco 49ers for the second-best turnover differential since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, trailing only the +43 posted by the 1983 Washington Redskins.

2012 PATRIOTS DEFENSE FORCES TURNOVERS

The 2012 Patriots' defense is second in the NFL to Chicago (33) with 32 forced turnovers (14 interceptions and 18 forced fumbles). The Patriots are on pace to finish with 47 turnovers, which would be tied with the 1985 and 1964 teams behind the team record of 50 turnovers in 1976. The most forced turnovers under Bill Belichick's reign with the Patriots are 41 by the 2003 team. The Patriots are on pace to finish with 26 forced fumbles, which would be second in team history to the 27 by the 1976 team.

PATRIOTS HAVE FEWEST INTERCEPTIONS IN 2012

The Patriots have thrown just three interceptions in 2012. In 2010, the Patriots tied the NFL mark for fewest interceptions in a single season.

PRO BOWL BALLOTTING

NFL Pro Bowl balloting has begun and runs through Dec. 17. Fans may vote for their favorite NFL players to represent the AFC and NFC in the 2013 Pro Bowl on Sunday, Jan. 27 at 7 p.m. from Aloha Stadium in Honolulu, Hawaii. Fans may vote online at nfl.com/probowl or on Web-enabled mobile phones by going to NFL.com.



The AFC and NFC All-Star squads are determined by the consensus votes of fans, players and coaches. Each group's vote counts one-third towards determining each conference's 43-man roster. NFL players and coaches will cast their votes on Dec. 20-21. The Pro Bowl teams will be announced at 7:00 p.m. ET on Wednesday, Dec. 26 in a Pro Bowl Selection Show on NFL Network. Quarterbacks, Tom Brady, Aaron Rodgers and Drew Brees were the top three vote-getters last year and WR Wes Welker and Calvin Johnson rounded out the top five.



PRO BOWL – PATRIOTS PLAYER RANKINGS

QB Tom Brady (345,036) ranks second in the NFL in fan voting, behind Peyton Manning (376,981). The New England Patriots have 13 players in the top five in Pro Bowl votes in their respective positions, including three that are leading the fan vote at their positions. TE Rob Gronkowski, G Logan Mankins and LB Jerod Mayo have the most fan votes at their positions.

PATRIOTS SCORE ON THE GROUND

The Patriots had a pair of rushing touchdowns at the Jets (11/22) and have now scored 18 times on the ground this season. New England is on pace to total 26 rushing touchdowns this year, which would be the second-highest such total in team history. The last time the Patriots had 25 or more rushing touchdowns in a season was 1978, when they scored a franchise-record 30 times on the ground. The NFL record for most rushing touchdowns in a season is 36, by Green Bay in 1962.

PATRIOTS SUSTAIN DRIVES; JUST 11 THREE-AND-OUTS IN 123 SERIES

In 123 offensive series in 2012, the Patriots have had just 11 drives with a three-and-out, the best in the NFL. The Patriots three-and-out percentage is 8.9. Indianapolis is next in the NFL with a 14.8 average. Since 2000, the fewest three-and-outs were by St. Louis in 2001 with 18. The Patriots lowest total since 2000 was 26 in 2007.

PATRIOTS HAVE TWO PLAYERS WITH 100 TACKLE SEASONS

Jerod Mayo has 143 total tackles and Brandon Spikes has 109 total tackles. It is the fifth time in the Bill Belichick era that two players have recorded 100 tackles but the first time since 2006 when LB Tedy Bruschi (124), DL Ty Warren (117) and LB Mike Vrabel (101) each went over 100 tackles.

PATRIOTS SCORE 21 POINTS IN 52 SECONDS **AGAINST THE JETS**

With 10 minutes remaining in the second quarter at the Jets on Nov. 22, 2012, the Patriots were in front, 7-0, but the Jets were in New England territory with a chance to tie the game. Shonn Greene lost a fumble on a fourth-and-one and the Jets proceeded to allow 21 points within a 52-second span. Steve Gregory recovered the Greene fumble. On the next play, Tom Brady completed a screen pass to Shane Vereen that he took 83 yards for a touchdown. On the second play of the Jets next series, Mark Sanchez fumbled and Gregory scooped up the ball and returned the fumble 32 yards for a touchdown. On the ensuing kickoff, Devin McCourty forced a fumble that was fielded in stride by Julian Edelman, who returned it 22 yards for a touchdown.

The Patriots are one of three teams to ever score three touchdowns in under a minute since the 1970 merger. PATRIOTS ARE MOST FREQUENT SUPER BOWL TEAM OVER LAST 30 YEARS

The Patriots won their seventh conference championship since the 1985 season, and have won more conference titles than any other team over the last 30 years (since 1982). Additionally, the Patriots' six conference titles over the last 25 years are two more than the next closest teams, and New England's six conference championships in the last 20 years are also more than any other team. New England also has more conference titles over the last 15 years (5) and over the last 10 years (4) than any other team. The Patriots' two conference titles in the last five years are tied with Pittsburgh and the New York Giants for the most over that span.

He has won more regular season games (123) and more games overall (136) during a 10year stretch (2002-2011) than any other coach in NFL History. In the 2007 season, Belichick led the Patriots to the fourth undefeated and untied regular season and the first since the NFL established a 16-game schedule in 1978.

BELICHICK LEADS TEAM TO 11TH STRAIGHT WINNING RECORD

Bill Belichick has led the Patriots to a winning record for 11 consecutive seasons (2001-2011). The only other NFL coach to have at least 10 consecutive winning seasons with one team since the 1970 merger was Tom Landry, who led the Dallas Cowboys to 16 consecutive winning seasons (1970-1985).

BALICHICK IS GOOD IN DECEMBER Bill Belichick is 43-7 (.860) in December with New England, the best record in December among head coaches with one team in NFL history (min. 25 games). George Seifert is second (27-6, .818).

BELICHICK NAMED COACH OF THE YEAR 3 TIMES The Associated Press named Bill Belichick the NFL's Coach of the Year for 2010. It was the third time that Belichick earned the honor. He was also named Coach of the Year following the 2003 and 2007 seasons. Belichick joins Don Shula (4-time winner) and Chuck Knox as the only three-time winners.

BELICHICK FIRST WITH 14 WINS IN FOUR SEASONS

Bill Belichick guided the Patriots to an NFL-best 14-2 record in 2010. Belichick is the first head coach ever to win at least 14 regular-season games in four separate seasons. Only four other coaches — San Francisco's George Seifert (3), Washington's Joe Gibbs (2), Chicago's Mike Ditka (2) and Miami's Don Shula (2) — have more than one 14-win season.

RECORDING SUCCESS

Tom Brady has quarterbacked the Patriots to victories in 132 of his 170 career regularseason starts, compiling a .776 winning percentage and giving him the best record of any quarterback in the Super Bowl era (since 1966). Brady reached 125 career wins in the fewest starts among quarterbacks in NFL history.

It is the longest run ever by a Patriots receiver, topping Troy Brown's 35-yard run vs. Tampa Bay on Sept. 3, 2000. It is the longest run by a Patriots player since Sammy Morris had a 55-yard run on Dec. 27, 2009 vs. Jacksonville.



EDELMAN GOES FROM STANDOUT QB TO WR

Edelman began his college football career with a year at the College of San Mateo (Calif.) before transferring to Kent State where as a senior he completed 56% of his passes (153 of 275 passes for 1,820 yards) with 13 touchdowns. He was also the leading rusher, gaining 1,551 yards on 215 attempts (an average of 7.5 yards per carry) and scoring 13 touchdowns. His offensive numbers broke Kent State's single-season record for total offense set by Joshua Cribbs in 2003.

EDELMAN GOES ON DEFENSE

Late in the fourth quarter of the Patriots' 37-16 win at the Jets (11/13) last season, Edelman was pressed into service on defense and registered his first NFL tackle when he laid a hard hit on RB LaDainian Tomlinson. He continued to see action on defense throughout the season and finished the year with 14 total tackles.

GRONKOWSKI SETS NFL RECORD FOR RECEIVING YARDS BY A TIGHT END

Rob Gronkowski finished the 2011 season with 1,327 receiving yards, surpassing San Diego's Kellen Winslow's 1980 record of 1,290 receiving yards for most receiving yards in a season by a tight end. New Orleans' Jimmy Graham also broke Winslow's old record, but finished with 1,310 receiving yards, 17 shy of Gronkowski's new record.

GRONKOWSKI SECOND PATRIOTS TIGHT END TO REACH 1,000 YARDS

GRONKOWSKI BECOMES FIRST PATRIOTS TIGHT END TO RECORD A RUSHING TOUCHDOWN

Gronkowski scored a 2-yard touchdown on a lateral from Tom Brady in the third quarter vs. Indianapolis (12/4/11), becoming the first tight end in Patriots history to score a rushing touchdown. Gronkowski is the first NFL tight end to score a rushing touchdown since Tennessee's Bo Scaife had a 31-yard scoring run against Baltimore on Nov. 12, 2006. He is the first tight end since the 1970 merger to have two receiving touchdowns and a rushing touchdown in the same game.

LED AFC IN SCORING IN 2011; FIRST TIME THAT A TE HAS LED A CONFERENCE IN SCORING

Gronkowski led the AFC in scoring among non-kickers with 108 points in 2011 and finished second in the NFL to Philadelphia's LeSean McCoy, who had 120 points. AARON HERNANDEZ LEARNS FROM HIS BROTHER

The relationship between Aaron Hernandez and his older brother D.J. has taken on many roles over the years: sibling, teammate, role model and surrogate father. They played high school football together – D.J. the star senior quarterback and Aaron, the athletic, but not quite ready, freshman. When their father passed away when Aaron



was 17, he relied on his brother even more. "I just followed my brother's footsteps," he told the *Providence Journal*. "I just tried to follow his work ethic because he did everything the right way. He was always successful." D.J., now a graduate assistant at the University of Miami, has tried to instill hard work and perseverance in his younger brother. It's paying off, as Aaron continues to thrive in the Patriots offense.

AARON HERNANDEZ ON HOW BEING A PATRIOT HAS CHANGED HIM

"This is a place that not only did it change my future from them paying me, but it just changed me as a person," he said. "You can't come here and act reckless and do your own stuff, and [I] was one of the persons that when I came here, I might've acted the way I wanted to act, but you get changed by Bill Belichick's way. You get changed by the Patriots' way. Now that I'm a Patriot, I have to start living like one, and making the right decisions for them."

MANKINS GOT A UNIQUE RIDE TO THE AFC CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

Logan Mankins' car wouldn't start when he was leaving the team hotel to head to last season's AFC Championship Game. He went back into the hotel lobby with plans to call a car service for help, but he ran into fans dressed in Patriots apparel and asked if they were going to the game and if they could give him a ride. The fans planned on parking at their usual spot across from the stadium but Mankins was able to return the favor of a ride for premium parking right next to the stadium.

STEVAN RIDLEY HAS FOUR 100-YARD RUSHING DAYS IN 2012

Stevan Ridley had his first career 100-yard day in the 2012 season opener at Tennessee (9/9) with 125 yards rushing on 21 carries for a 6.0-yard average. He finished with 106 yards rushing on 22 carries for a 4.8-yard average at Buffalo (9/30), a career-high 151 rushing yards vs. Denver (10/7) and then gained 127 yards on 15 carries for an 8.5-yard average at St. Louis (10/28).

RIDLEY GOES LONG

In the season opener at Tennessee (9/9/12), Ridley had five runs of 15 or more yards (17, 17, 16, 15, 15). No Patriots running back in at least the past 25 years has done that in a single game, according to the Elias Sports Bureau. It is the first time under Bill Belichick that a Patriots running back had five runs of 15 or more yards rushing in the same game. Ridley was the first under Belichick to have four runs of 15 or more yards in the same game when he had runs of 33, 25, 20, and 18 at Oakland on Oct. 2, 2011. Tennessee's Chris Johnson was the last NFL player to have five runs of 15 or more yards in a game (Nov. 27, 11 vs. Tampa Bay).

RIDLEY STARTS STRONG

Stevan Ridley has a total of 939 rushing yards through 11 games this season. Ridley is on pace to total 1,366 rushing yards, which would give him the 15^{th} 1,000-yard rushing season in Patriots history and make him the 12^{th} Patriots' player to reach 1,000 yards rushing. That number would be the fourth best total in Patriots history and he would become the fourth Patriots player to reach 1,300 yards.

2011 DIRSTROUND PICK NATE SOLDER It only took a day for Nate Solder to decide to change from his lifelong position of tight end to tackle after playing his freshman year at Colorado as a tight end. "My coaches came to me and said, "You'd be an all right tight end, but you'd be an even better tackle," he told the *Boston Globe*. "I've always wanted to be great, so that's why I moved to tackle." He added over 30 pounds after his redshirt freshman season and was named the team's starting left tackle. He played in 2,540 of 2,542 offensive plays over the next three seasons at Colorado and became an immediate contributor on the Patriots offensive line at right tackle as a rookie before moving to left tackle.

MATTHEW SLATER: LIKE FATHER LIKE SON

Matthew Slater is one of seven sons of Hall of Fame members to be drafted in NFL history.

DONALD THOMAS: FROM NO HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL TO THE NFL

Donald Thomas found football while playing basketball. A former high school baseball and basketball player who had never played football at any level, Thomas often played pickup basketball at the student gymnasium and one day found himself playing with several members of the UConn football team who convinced him to try out for the team. After meeting with coaches, Thomas walked on to the team as a defensive lineman for the scout team in 2003. He red-shirted a year before contributing on special teams. In 2007, he got his chance to play offensive guard, earning All-Big East honors before being selected in the sixth round of the 2008 draft by the Miami Dolphins.

SEBASTIAN VOLLMER MAKES HIS MARK

A native of Kaarst, Germany, Vollmer did not begin playing football until the age of 14 when he started playing for the Dusseldorf club team. Vollmer helped lead his German prep school team to two national football championships. His early football success landed him an appearance in the 2004 Global Junior Championships in San Diego, which led him to a scholarship at Houston. He spoke almost no English when he signed with Houston, but he became fluent in the language as he developed from a 250-pound tight end into a 315-pound lineman who started his final 25 games at tackle for the Cougars. Vollmer's collegiate career created interest from the NFL where the Patriots drafted him in the second round of the 2009 draft. Nicknamed "Seabass" during his playing days at Houston, a nickname that has carried over to the NFL.

WOODHEAD GOES FROM DIVISION II TO THE NFL

Danny Woodhead was a standout at Division II Chadron State in Nebraska. He averaged 178.9 yards per game and totaled 101 rushing touchdowns during his collegiate career. Woodhead's outstanding junior and senior seasons earned him two Harlon Hill Trophies, the Division II equivalent to the Heisman Trophy. He is one of just three players to ever win two or more Harlon Hill



Trophies, joining Texas A&M University-Kingsville running back Johnny Bailey, who won it three times (1987-89) before playing six seasons in the NFL for the Bears, Cardinals, and Rams. Valdosta State University's Dusty Bonner was the only other player to win the Harlon Hill Trophy multiple times (2000 and 2001).

DANNY WOODHEAD SET TEAM MARK FOR RUSHING AVERAGE IN 2010

Danny Woodhead finished the 2010 season with 97 rushes for 547 yards, with his average of 5.64 yards per carry setting a new team record (minimum 90 rushing attempts). Woodhead topped Don Calhoun's previous team mark of 5.59 yards per carry in 1976 (129 attempts for 721 yards).

PATRICK CHUNG'S JOURNEY TO THE NFL

Long before S Patrick Chung picked up flag football as a teen, his mother, Jamaican recording artist Sophia George, had preached about being a tough man in a song. Her hit single, "Girlie Girlie" – a traditional reggae song which pokes fun at a boy who was not man enough – topped the charts in 1985. Chung is aware that among his talents he was born with, such as speed and agility,



singing is not one of them. Chung possesses a great sense of pride in his unique heritage – his mother is Jamaican and his father is half Jamaican and half Chinese, was born in Jamaica and moved to California at age 12 where he started to play football as a freshman in high school. Chung went on to star at Oregon, where he holds the distinction of starting more games than any other defensive player in school history with 51 starts. He originally entered the draft as a junior, but ultimately decided to return for his senior season. Pinned to the back of his locker is a reminder of the support he has gotten - a Jamaican flag that represents his family's heritage.

STEVE GREGORY WAS ABOUT TO ENTER THE POLICE ACADEMY UNTIL SAN DIEGO CALLED

Steve Gregory's father and stepmother are New York City police officers and both were on duty during the events of September 11, 2001. Following his college career at Syracuse, Gregory took the test to enter the police academy. He found out he passed the test on the same day that the San Diego Chargers called him to offer him a free agent contract.

DONT'A HIGHTOWER WEARS TEDY BRUSCHI'S JERSEY #54

As a first round draft pick, Dont'a Hightower is used to high expectations. Hightower went to training camp with jersey #45 but was switched to jersey #54 prior to the start of the regular season. Former LB Tedy Bruschi wore #54 for 13 seasons. Hightower understands the importance of the number and hopes to live up to its legacy. "I definitely feel honored to be able to wear this number," Hightower said. "I've read that Tedy didn't want it to be retired and he hoped another linebacker would come in and be able to wear this number and be able to play as well. I feel honored. Tedy was a great player, and he means a lot to this organization. I'm definitely proud to be able to wear this number."

2012 FIRST ROUND PICK CHANDLER JONES FOLLOWS IN BROTHERS' FOOTSTEPS

Chandler Jones has two brothers, including Arthur, a fifth-round NFL Draft selection by the Baltimore Ravens in 2010, who was a Syracuse defensive tackle, and Jon "Bones" Jones, a UFC fighter and the reigning Light Weight Champion.

CHANDLER'S PERK OF BEING IN THE NFL

Chandler Jones was excited to get the Madden football game and play himself: "I've always put myself in Madden manually, but now that I can actually buy the game and see myself already installed in the game, it's great."

FIRST ROUND PICKS MAKE IMPACT IN 2012 OPENER

Chandler Jones forced a fumble on a 1-yard sack of Tennessee QB Jake Locker in the first quarter and Dont'a Hightower recovered the ball and ran 6-yards for a touchdown in the season opener at Tennessee (9/9/12). It was the first fumble returned for a touchdown for the Patriots since Gary Guyton returned a fumble 35 yards for a touchdown at Chicago on Dec. 12, 2010. It is the first defensive touchdown for the Patriots since Sterling Moore returned an interception 21 yards for a score vs. Buffalo on Jan. 1, 2012.



JONES HAS FIRST TWO-SACK GAME

Chandler Jones had his first NFL two-sack game at Seattle (10/14). He forced a fumble that was recovered by LB Rob Ninkovich on a 3-yard sack in the second quarter and had a 5-yard sack in the third quarter.

JONES HAS FORCED THREE FUMBLES ON SACKS

Jones now has three forced fumbles in 2012. Jones forced a fumble on a sack at Tennessee (9/9), vs. Arizona (9/16) and at Seattle (10/14).

JONES TIED FOR TEAM LEAD WITH 6.0 SACKS

Jones is tied for the team lead with 6.0 sacks. The Patriots rookie record for most sacks in a season is 10.5 by Garin Veris in 1985. The NFL rookie record is 14.5 by Jevon Kearse with Tennessee in 1999.

JONES NAMED AFC ROOKIE OF THE MONTH FOR SEPTEMBER

Jones was named the AFC Rookie of the Month for September. Jones registered three sacks in his first four games with two forced fumbles, the most sacks of any NFL rookie. His first NFL sack at Tennessee resulted in a forced fumble that was returned for a touchdown. Jones finished the month with 19 tackles, three sacks and two forced fumbles He joins Jerod Mayo (October of 2008) as the only Patriots to be named NFL Defensive Rookie of the Month.

STILL RECEIVING THE LOVE

Kyle Love continues to receive motivation from his father, retired Army colonel Anthony Love. Every game day, his father sends him a text message with words of encouragement to get him excited. His dad has been motivating him since middle school and the message has always remained the same: "Give the coaches a reason to keep you."

KYLE LOVE 'MINI-V' FOLLOWS WILFORK

Kyle Love has been looking up to Vince Wilfork since his days at Mississippi State, when his teammates dubbed him "Mini-V" for his resemblance to the Patriots defensive tackle. The nickname led Love to closely monitor Wilfork as he finished his playing days with the Bulldogs. Little did he know that he would get the chance to watch Wilfork from an even closer perspective – lined up next to him on the Patriots defensive line. "I stay close to that guy always. Watch me out here, I'm right beside him, no matter what," Love told the *Boston Globe*. Now that they're on the same team, Wilfork has become an even bigger influence, like a big brother, according to Love.

MAYO OVER 100 TACKLES FOR THE FIFTH STRAIGHT YEAR

LB Jerod Mayo has 143 total tackles through the first 11 games of the 2012 season and has now registered 100 or more tackles in five straight years. He is the first player in New England history to register 100 tackles in his first five NFL seasons, and the fourth Patriots' player with at least five straight 100-tackle seasons.

After 11 games in 2012, Mayo leads the team with 143 tackles and is on pace to finish the season with 208 total tackles and become the third New England player to reach 200 tackles in a single season. Mayo has registered at least 10 tackles in nine out of the first 11 games, including a season-high of 20 vs. the New York Jets (10/28/12). He had a career-best with ten games in 2010 with 10 or more tackles. In the other two games of 2012, Mayo had nine tackles.

Jerod Mayo learned knowledge and discipline are the keys to success while spending afternoons with his three brothers under the supervision of their grandfather, Walter Johnson, a retired Air Force veteran of 30 years. While Mayo's mother worked two jobs, Johnson taught the boys discipline, responsibility and the value of life. Those lessons helped Mayo develop a work ethic and demeanor that has earned him the nickname of "Old Soul" from his teammates. His leadership skills and talent helped him become only the second Patriot to be named AFC Rookie of the Year, earning that title in 2008 to join Michael Haynes (1976)

DOUBLE TROUBLE: CB DEVIN MCCOURTY

After being selected by the Patriots in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft, CB Devin McCourty became part of a select group in league history. McCourty's identical twin brother, Jason, is a cornerback with Tennessee, selected in the sixth round of the 2009 NFL Draft. The two are the 12th set of twins to play in the NFL. Devin redshirted for the 2005 season and therefore was a year behind his brother in eligibility. McCourty is the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 1998-2000. His twin brother, Wasswa, played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox. The McCourty twins are one of three active sets of twins playing in the NFL.

Devin McCourty had his second career two-interception game in the win at Buffalo on Sept. 30, 2012. He had his first interception of the 2012 season when he picked off a Ryan Fitzpatrick pass at the Buffalo 42-yard line in the first quarter. He picked off his second pass in the fourth quarter. It is McCourty's second career two-interception game. He had his first two-interception game at Detroit on Nov. 25, 2010. The Patriots are 9-0 when McCourty has at least one interception in a game

MCCOURTY HAS A 104-YARD KICKOFF RETURN FOR A TOUCHDOWN; SECOND LONGEST IN TEAM HISTORY

Devin McCourty had a 104-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the first quarter vs. the Jets (10/21), the second longest kickoff return in team history. Ellis Hobbs has the longest in team history with a 108-yard return for a touchdown at the New York Jets on Sept. 9, 2007. He was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance.

NINKOVICH: WHERE DID HE COME FROM?

Rob Ninkovich's journey to the Patriots was not easy. He entered the league as a fifthround pick by the Saints in 2006 and was waived four times by New Orleans and Miami before landing in New England on Aug. 2, 2009. He spent the 2009 offseason trying to make the New Orleans team as a long snapper. Before coming to the Patriots, he had appeared in just eight games over



three years. He doubled that total in his first year in New England, appearing in 15 games in 2009 and his role on the team has grown since, earning a starting role at linebacker in 2010 and 2011 before moving to a starting role on the defensive line in 2011.

NINKOVICH SCORED AS A TE IN COLLEGE

Ninkovich played some at tight end in college at Purdue and caught two touchdown passes with a 2-yard touchdown pass from Dallas QB Kyle Orton and a 1-yard touchdown pass from former Indianapolis QB Curtis Painter.

NINKOVICH HELPS DEFENSE WALK OFF WITH A WIN VS. THE JETS

Ninkovich and Jermaine Cunningham combined on a 15-yard sack of Mark Sanchez in overtime vs. the Jets (10/21), and Ninkovich forced and recovered a Sanchez fumble on the play, giving the Patriots possession and ending the game with a 29-26 overtime win for New England. any Patriots player within the last 20 years.

NINKOVICH AND SPIKES: BACK-TO-BACK WEEKS WITH TWO FORCED FUMBLES EACH

Spikes, who patterns his style of play after Hall of Fame linebacker Dick Butkus, shared his feelings on modeling his game after old school linebackers. "My thing is, when I'm done with this game, I want the older guys when they watch to say, 'He's playing the position the right way.' It's just a point of respect from me to them." Spikes passion and energy is apparent when he plays the



game. Said former Patriots safety Rodney Harrison in a recent interview with the *Boston Herald*: "You can see how much he loves it, how he enjoys being physical. "He's an intimidator. He's got that fight in him. He's going to hit you and you're going to feel it."

SPIKES ON PACE FOR HIGH TACKLE TOTAL

Spikes finished with 16 tackles at the Jets (11/22) and now has had 10 or more tackles in six of the 11 games so far for a total of 109 tackles. He is on pace to finish the season with 159 tackles. With Jerod Mayo at 143 tackles and Spikes at 109, it is the fifth time in the Bill Belichick era that two players have finished with 100 or more tackles.

VINCE WILFORK REGISTERS FIRST CAREER INTERCEPTIONS IN 2011

Vince Wilfork recorded his first career interception when he picked off QB Philip Rivers in the second quarter vs. San Diego (9/18). He had his second interception at Oakland (10/2) to join Anthony Pleasant (2001) as the only other Patriots defensive lineman to ever record two interceptions in the same season. Wilfork is one of four Patriots defensive lineman to ever record two



interceptions overall, joining Pleasant, Richard Seymour and Henry Thomas.

WILFORK WEARS HIS HEART ON HIS NECK

Wilfork wears No. 75 over his shoulder pads. Underneath hangs a gold chain locket for those who were number one in his heart: his parents. In 2002, parents David and Barbara Wilfork both passed away within five months of each other, leaving the then University of Miami star without his greatest support system. Wilfork, who lost his father to diabetes, has raised hundreds of thousands of dollars for diabetes-related causes. His annual draft day fundraiser, a bowling event he has held for eight years, is one of the longest running fundraising events held by a pro athlete in New England. For his charity work, Wilfork was awarded the 2010 New England Patriots Ron Burton Community Service Award. While he will always cherish his National Championship and Super Bowl rings, his constant reminder lies closest to his heart, a picture of his late parents at their high school prom. "I carry them with me wherever I go," Wilfork said of his parents' keepsake. "My parents pushed me to be the best I could be. The things I do and my wife does, we do out of the kindness of our heart, and we do it for the community. I never look for anything in return. My teammates are my second family. My kids, my wife, the New England Patriots - that's all I have."

VINCE WILFORK: REASONS FOR PATRIOTS SUCCESS

Patriots Pro Bowl DL Vince Wilfork, who has served as a defensive captain for the Patriots for five straight seasons, says the team's continued success is a result of the entire organization working towards one common goal: "The Patriots are all about team, family and smart football players. They try to get good people here from coaches to guys who work in the front office to guys who put on this uniform. I think everybody has to have one goal in mind, and that's to be together. When you get an organization together that is seeking one goal, you can be pretty successful."

GOSTKOWSKI ON HIGH POINT TOTAL IN 2012

Stephen Gostkowski is second in the NFL in 2012 with 111 total points, behind the 117 by Lawrence Tynes of the New York Giants. He is on paced to finish with 161 points. The Patriots record for most points in a season is 155 by Gino Cappelletti in 1964. Gostkowski's personal best was 148 points in 2008.

GOSTKOWSKI IS FIRST PATRIOTS PLAYER TO KICK TWO 50-YARD FIELD GOALS IN THE SAME GAME

Gostkowski drilled a 51-yard field goal in the third quarter and a 53-yarder in the fourth quarter vs. Arizona on Sept. 16, 2012. The 53-yarder ties a career-long mark. ZOLTAN MESKO: COMING TO AMERICA

P Zoltan Mesko was born in Timisoara, Romania on the Romania-Hungary border. On many occasions in 1989, during the communist revolutions, his family was forced to take cover to avoid gun shots from the armies. Even after the fall of the Berlin Wall, his family lived in poverty. His family left Romania when his father won a United States Permanent Resident Card (green card) in the Diversity Immigrant Visa Lottery in 1997 when Mesko was 11. "I survived a war," he noted. "I was coming from a really low point growing up, with communism and a very adverse economic situation. Coming over here, I'm very grateful for where I am. It happens by luck that I am here," he said. "When my dad applied for the green card lottery, there were 20 million applicants and 55,000 winners. That's a percentage in itself that tells you I am lucky to be here."

MESKO DISCOVERS FOOTBALL

An avid soccer player from his days in Romania, Mesko had a strong leg. It was only when he came to America that he discovered his leg could take him places. In eighth grade, Mesko was playing kickball in the gym when he kicked the ball so high that he broke a light fixture. He was given a choice: pay for the light fixture or play football. The choice was an easy one—Mesko



decided to play football. His leg would land him numerous Division I scholarships and admission offers from Ivy League schools. From those, Mesko chose to play football at Michigan.

GIL SANTOS – THE VOICE OF THE PATRIOTS

For most Patriots fans, there has been but one "Voice of the New England Patriots" and it belongs to Gil Santos. Now in his 36th season, Santos has articulated the sights, sounds and all the play-by-play action for 738 games to millions of Patriots fans. Santos is tied with the Philadelphia Eagles' veteran play-by-play announcer, Merrill



Reese, as the two most tenured radio broadcasters in the NFL. Santos began calling games for the Boston Patriots at Fenway Park in 1966. He was the voice of the Patriots for the next 14 seasons (1966-79). He returned to the booth in 1991 and has broadcast every Patriots game since then.

TOM BRADY AND WELKER SCORE ON A 99-YARD PASS

Tom Brady connected with Wes Welker on a 99-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter of the 2011 season-opener at Miami (9/12/11). The 99-yard play tied the NFL record for the longest offensive play, which has been accomplished 14 times.

New England went 8-0 in their final eight games of 2010 and 2011 and have jumped out to a 3-0 record in the second half of 2012. Started two postseason games at right tackle and started Super Bowl XLVI as a tackle eligible tight end.

This is Solder's third game vs. the Dolphins

LG Logan Mankins (D2, '05)

An eight-year mainstay at guard and four-time Pro Bowler who has started all 110 regular-season games and all 13 postseason games in which he has appeared since joining the Patriots in 2005.

This is Mankins' 14th game vs. the Dolphins

OL Dan Connolly (FA-'07)

Has started every game in which he has appeared this season at right guard ... Took over as starting center after season-ending leg injury to Dan Koppen in the 2011 opener ... Played in 13 games with 11 starts last year ... Started at center for all three postseason games, including Super Bowl XLVI against the N.Y. Giants (2/5).

This is Connolly's sixth regular season game vs. the Dolphins

OL Marcus Cannon (D5a, '11)

Cannon made his first NFL start in Week 12 when he lined up at right tackle in place of an inactive Sebastian Vollmer ... Has seen time as a key reserve on the offensive line in 2012.

This is Cannon's second game vs. the Dolphins

RT Sebastian Vollmer (D2d, '09)

Has started all but one game in 2012 at right tackle and has rebounded strong

from an injury-plagued 2011 in which he was inactive for 10 regular season and two playoff games ... Despite being limited to six games in 2011, returned to start at right tackle in Super Bowl XLVI vs. the N.Y Giants (2/5).

> This is Vollmer's fourth game vs. the Dolphins

OL RYAN WENDELL (FA-'08)

Has started at center in every game of the 2012 season ... After spending his rookie season and most of the 2009 season on the practice squad, Ryan Wendell had been a key reserve on the offensive line, seeing starting assignments at center and both guard positions before earning the starting center position ... Also plays on special teams units.

This is Wendell's third game vs. the Dolphins

TE Rob Gronkowski (D2a, '10)

Gronkowski caught two touchdown passes against Indianapolis in Week 11 to push his season total to 10 touchdowns. He is the first tight end in NFL history to have three straight 10-plus touchdown seasons (10 touchdowns in 2010, 18 in 2011, 10 in 2012). Gronkowski and Antonio Gates (13 in 2004 and 10 in 2005) are the only tight ends to have back-to-back 10-plus touchdown seasons ... Gronkowski joins Randy Moss (2007, 2008 and 2009) and Corey Dillon (2004, 2005, 2006) as the only Patriots with three straight 10-plus touchdown seasons and three seasons with 10 or more scores overall.

TE Aaron Hernandez (D4,'10)

Hernandez returned from injury in Week 12 and tallied two receptions for 36 yards in the team's win over the Jets ... Hernandez's 45 receptions in 2010 set a franchise record for most receptions by a rookie tight end, passing Greg Baty's



previous rookie tight end record of 37 receptions in 1986.

WR Brandon Lloyd (UFA-STL, '12)

Lloyd had two touchdown receptions in the team's Week 8 win over the Rams. It was the first time he has had a two touchdown game with the Patriots and the fifth time in his career that he has scored at least two touchdowns in a game.

QB Tom Brady (D6, '00)

Brady (43,278) moved past Dan Fouts (43,040) into 10^{th} place on the NFL's alltime passing list during the team's Week 12 win over the Jets. Brady (3,299) also went over 3,000 passing yards on the season for the 10^{th} time in his career and is one of six NFL players with at least 10 3,000-yard seasons ... Brady has now thrown at least one touchdown pass in 43 straight regular season games following a 3-yard touchdown pass to WR Wes Welker in the second quarter of the team's Week 12 win over the Jets. It is the third longest streak, behind Drew Brees (54, current) and Johnny Unitas (47, 1956-60) ... Brady has now thrown 189 straight passes without an interception and has totaled just three interceptions through 11 games this season. The last time Brady threw an interception was more than a month ago – in the fourth quarter of the Patriots' game at Seattle on Oct. 14.

<u>RB Stevan Ridley (D3a, '11)</u>

Ridley scored his eighth touchdown of the season on a 9-yard run in the fourth quarter of the team's Week 12 win vs. the Jets and is on pace to finish with 12 touchdowns this season. Ridley's eight rushing touchdowns are tied for the third most in the NFL ... Ridley is on pace to total 1,368 rushing yards, which would give him the 15th 1,000-yard rushing season in Patriots history and make him the 12th Patriots' player to reach 1,000 yards rushing. Ridley is currently ranked third in the AFC and seventh in the NFL with 939 rushing yards ... Ridley's 63 first downs are the second most in the NFL.

RB Danny Woodhead (FA-'10)

Woodhead scored twice in the team's Week 10 win vs. Buffalo with a 15-yard rushing touchdown in the second quarter and an 18-yard reception in the third quarter. The performance was the first two-touchdown game of Woodhead's career.

Jones was named the NFL Defensive Rookie of the Month for September and his 6.0 sacks are tied with Rob Ninkovich for the team lead ... If Jones reaches 10 sacks for the year he will become the 15th player in Patriots history to record a 10-sack season ... Jones has also forced three fumbles on sacks in 2012.

DT Vince Wilfork (D1, '04)

Has started on the Patriots defensive line in every game of the 2012 season ... Wilfork has played in 133 games with 123 starts over eight-plus seasons with the Patriots (2004-12) ... The Patriots own a 103-30 (.774) record in Wilfork's 133 career regular-season games.

DT Kyle Love (FA-'10)

Has started on the Patriots defensive line in every game of the 2012 season ... Finished the 2011 season with 4.0 sacks for 14 yards, 55 tackles and a fumble recovery ... Started all three postseason games in 2011 and finished with nine tackles and a pass defensed ... Originally joined the team as a rookie free agent in 2010.

DL Rob Ninkovich (FA-'09)

Ninkovich's 6.0 sacks are tied for the most on the team with rookie DE Chandler Jones ... Ninkovich's has also registered three strip-sacks this season ... Ninkovich had a career-high with 6.5 sacks in 2011.

LB Jerod Mayo (D1, '08)

Mayo had his fifth straight 10plus tackle game for a new career high after finishing with 15 against the Jets in Week 12. It was his ninth 10-tackle game of the 2012 season ... After 11 games Mayo leads the team with 143 tackles and is on pace to finish the season with 208 total tackles and become the third New England player to reach 200 tackles in a single season.

LB Brandon Spikes (D2c,'10)

Spikes went over 100 tackles after finishing with 16 against the Jets in Week 12 and now has 109 for the year. Spikes is

on pace to finish the season with 159 tackles \ldots Spikes' five forced fumbles are tied for the most on the team with Rob Ninkovich.

LB Dont'a Hightower (D1b,'12)

Has made eight starts at LB during his rookie season \dots Hightower recorded his third NFL sack in Week 12 when he dropped Jets QB Mark Sanchez in the first quarter.

CB Agib Talib (TR-TB, '12)

Talib was acquired by the Patriots from Tampa Bay in a trade on Nov. 1, 2012 along with a 2013 seventh-round draft selection in exchange for a 2013 fourth round draft selection ... Intercepted Colts quarterback Andrew Luck in his first game with the Patriots and returned the ball 59 yards for a touchdown.

CB Alfonzo Dennard (D7a, '12)

Dennard has started four games in the secondary and has tallied three interceptions and a forced fumble ... Dennard returned an Andrew Luck interception 87 yards for a touchdown in the team's Week 11 win over the Colts.




S Steve Gregory (UFA-SD, '12)

Gregory intercepted his second pass of the season when he picked off QB Mark Sanchez in the first quarter of the team's Week 12 win over the New York Jets. His two interceptions this season match his career season-high mark. Gregory also scored his second NFL touchdown when he returned a Sanchez fumble 32 yards for a touchdown in the second quarter. Gregory also forced a fumble in the third quarter to cap off his career day.

S Devin McCourty (D1,'10)

McCourty started the first six games of the season at cornerback before moving over to safety in Week 7. McCourty has since started every game at safety and has tallied an interception and a forced fumble in his new role ... In the Patriots' Week 12 win over the Jets, McCourty forced a fumble on a kickoff return which was returned for a touchdown by Julian Edelman for a touchdown ... McCourty was named the AFC Special Teams Player of the Week following his 104-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the first quarter of the team's Week 7 win vs. the Jets. The return was the second longest in team history behind Ellis Hobbs' 108-yard return against the Jets on Sept. 9, 2007.

THE TEAM OF THE DECADE

When Robert Kraft purchased the New England Patriots in 1994, few would have thought that 17 years later the franchise would be the undisputed team of the decade in the first decade of the new millennium. Kraft brought a winning vision to the organization and dedicated his resources to building a consistent winner. On Jan. 27, 2000, Kraft hired Bill Belichick to coach the team, and three months later the team drafted then-unheralded quarterback Tom Brady, putting the final pieces in place for the Patriots to become the most successful NFL team of the 2000s. Below is a look at the accomplishments of the Patriots during the first decade of the new millennium that earned the Patriots the "Team of the Decade" moniker.
