JACKSONVILLE JAGUARS (0-0) AT NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (0-0)

Thursday, August 11 ■ Gillette Stadium (68,756) ■ 7:30 p.m. ET

The Jacksonville Jaguars will open the 2011 preseason on Thursday, August 11 as they travel to New England. Kickoff is set for 7:30 p.m. ET.

The Jaguars have a 39-26 record in the preseason in their 16 seasons including 20-12 in the last eight years under head coach Jack Del Rio. They have posted a .500 record or better in seven of eight preseasons under Del Rio.

The Jaguars are coming off an 8-8 season but were not eliminated from the playoffs until the final weekend of the 2010 regular season. The club had a share of first place in the AFC South for five of the last six weeks but lost three straight games to conclude the season.

Third-year general manager Gene Smith and his staff have overhauled the club's roster with 80 of the 90 players currently in training camp acquired in the last three seasons. Smith's first two drafts netted 15 players and all 15 remain with the club, and the group has made 157 combined starts. QB Blaine Gabbert (Missouri), the 10th overall pick, headlines the club's 2011 draft class which also features G/C Will Rackley (Lehigh), WR/RS Cecil Shorts III (Mount Union), S Chris Prosinski (Wyoming) and CB Rod Issac (Middle Tennessee State).

Of the Jaguars' 90 roster players, 35 are new to the team. The Jaguars have 45 players who weren't on the club's roster during last year's training camp. The club signed 24 undrafted rookies and six unrestricted free agents last week. Due to the NFL's new collective bargaining agreement 11 players (six unrestricted free agents, five exclusive rights free agents) were not able to practice until Thursday, August 4.

"We'll get the work done that we're going to need to," Jaguars head coach Jack Del Rio said. "It requires more due diligence on the part of the players, more responsibility on the part of the players and the assistant coaches in terms of teaching and learning and being responsive in maximizing the time we have in meetings and in these hats practices. We are just not going to get the typical number of live reps in full pads that you would be able to get in a camp pre-2011."

One of the main areas of focus has been on the defensive side of the ball. The club was active in free agency and signed three projected starters in LBs Paul Posluszny and Clint Session along with S Dawan Landry. CB Drew Coleman was also added and is expected to assume the role of nickel back. Of the 11 starters on defense, only CB Rashean Mathis and LB Daryl Smith have been with the club more than three seasons. Three players selected in Smith's first three drafts could start alongside veteran DE Aaron Kampman in DT Tyson Alualu (1st round, 2010), DT Terrance Knighton (3rd round, 2009) and DE Austen Lane (5th round, 2010).

Offensively, 10 of the 11 projected starters were with the team a year ago. The Jaguars signed sixth-year pro G/C Jason Spitz in free agency and he is competing for the starting LG job. The offense is led by two-time Pro Bowl selection Maurice Jones-Drew, QB David Garrard and TE Mercedes Lewis. Garrard, a Pro Bowler in 2009, set a franchise single-season record with 26 touchdown passes in 2010. Lewis, who re-signed with the club last week, became the Jaguars' first Pro Bowl tight end in 2010.

TELEVISION: The game will be broadcast by WTEV CBS47 (Ch. 6 cable) in Jacksonville as well as in Orlando (WRBW), Gainesville (WMYG), Tallahassee (WTVL), and Savannah, Ga. (WSAV), Panama City (WJHG) and Dothan, Ala. (WTVY). NFL Network broadcaster Paul Burmeister will handle play-by-play duties for the fifth straight year with former Jaguars Pro Bowl tackle Tony Boselli providing analysis. Brent Martineau will serve as field reporter.

RADIO: Thursday's game will be broadcast on the Jaguars Radio Network which extends to 10 affiliates in Florida and Georgia. The Jaguars' flagship stations are WOKV AM & FM (690, 106.5). Brian Sexton (play-by-play) and former Jaguars defensive end Jeff Lageman (analyst) are in their ninth season together calling all Jaguars games. Sexton has called every Jaguars game in franchise history.

2011 SCHEDULE STORYLINES

- Open the regular season at home (Sept. 11 vs. Tennessee) for the second consecutive season and 10th time in franchise history.
- Features three nationally televised games including two Monday night games at EverBank Field against Baltimore (Oct. 24) and San Diego (Dec. 5). The Jaguars visit Atlanta (Dec. 15) for a Thursday night game televised by NFL Network. It marks only the third time in franchise history (1998, 2006) the club will host two Monday Night games. The three nationally televised games are tied for the third-most in team history (1999, 2000).
- Features six playoff teams from a year ago and seven games against playoff teams - the Colts twice, as well as the Ravens, Saints, Steelers, Falcons and Jets. The Jaguars will play 11 games against teams that finished .500 or better in 2010.
- Four of the club's six division games come in the second half of the season. The only two division games in the first half of the season are on Kickoff Weekend against Tennessee and on the road at Houston (Oct. 30).
- Face Super Bowl runner-up Pittsburgh (Oct. 16), the 12th time in franchise history the club will play a participant from the previous Super Bowl.
- Play six straight games outside the division following the season-opener against Tennessee.
- Two of the first three games (at NYJ, at Car.) and two of the last three games (at Atl., at Tenn.) will be played on the road.
- Will face all four NFC West teams for the third time in franchise history. The Jaguars will host New Orleans (Oct. 2) and Tampa Bay (Dec. 11) and own a combined 4-0 mark at home against those teams. The Jaguars will travel to Atlanta (Dec. 15) and Carolina (Sept. 25).
- Will not play a game on the west coast and only have two games outside the Eastern time zone (at Houston, at Tennessee).
- Will conclude the regular season at home (Ind., Jan. 1) for the first time since 2005 and only the sixth time overall.

WR Jason Hill - Played in 40 games with three starts for San Francisco and Jacksonville. Played in six games for Jaguars in 2010. Former third-round pick of 49ers in 2007.

LT Eugene Monroe - 2009 first round pick has made 28 career starts.

LG Jason Spitz - Signed as unrestricted free agent from Green Bay. Played in 65 games with 45 starts (18 at RG, 8 at C, 19 at LG).

C Brad Meester - Holds franchise record with 161 career starts.

RG Uche Nwaneri - Has started 45 of 57 games (16 at LG, 29 at RG) since joining club as a fifth-round pick in 2007.

RT Eben Britton - 2009 second-round pick has made 22 career starts.

TE Mercedes Lewis - 2010 Pro Bowl selection tied single-season record for receiving touchdowns with 10.

WR Mike Thomas - Led team in 2010 with 66 receptions for 820 yards and four touchdowns.

QB David Garrard - In his fifth season as the starter owns 39-37 career mark as a starter.

RB Maurice Jones-Drew - Two-time Pro Bowl selection (2009, 2010) has 63 career touchdowns (54 rushing, 7 receiving, 2 returns).

FB Greg Jones - Eighth-year pro has played in 87 games with 54 starts.

DEFENSE

DE Austen Lane - 2010 fifth-round pick started nine games as a rookie, the youngest (11/9/87) defensive end in the NFL to start eight or more games.

DT Tyson Alualu - 2010 first-round pick started all 16 games as a rookie and had 3.5 sacks and seven tackles for loss.

DT Terrance Knighton - Started all 32 games in first two seasons.

DE Aaron Kampman - Two-time Pro Bowl selection has played in 120 games with 112 starts and recorded 58 sacks.

LB Daryl Smith - Holds franchise record with 918 career tackles.

LB Paul Posluszny - Added in free agency. Started 44 career games with Buffalo and registered 405 tackles including three straight seasons of 100-plus tackles.

LB Clint Session - Acquired as unrestricted free agent from Indianapolis. Has played in 48 games with 35 starts.

CB Rashean Mathis - Owns franchise record with 29 career INTs.

CB Derek Cox - Had eight interceptions in first two seasons.

SS Courtney Greene - Third-year pro started 11 games in 2010 and finished with 77 tackles.

FS Dawan Landry - Joined club as a free agent after five seasons with Baltimore. Started 64 of 66 games at both safety spots.

- Jaguars offensive coordinator **Dirk Koetter** served in the same capacity at Boston College from 1994-95.
- Jaguars defensive line coach **Joe Cullen** played nose guard at the University of Massachusetts from 1986-89, earning All-Yankee Conference honors three times. He later began his coaching career overseeing the defensive line at his alma mater from 1990-91.
- Jaguars defensive backs **Cory Undlin** spent the 2004 season as an assistant with the Patriots working with the defensive backs.
- Jaguars director, player personnel **Terry McDonough** is a native of Boston and is the son of the late Will McDonough, the long-time sports reporter and columnist for The Boston Globe.
- Jaguars DL **Jeremy Mincey** was a sixth-round pick of the Patriots in the 2006 draft.
- Jaguars CB **Terrence Wheatley** was drafted by the Patriots in the second round of the 2008 draft and played in 11 games for the club from 2008-10.
- Jaguars rookie LB **Scott Lutus** attended Brookfield High School (Conn.) and was a four-year starter at Connecticut.
- Patriots OL **Dan Connolly** was originally signed as an undrafted rookie by the Jaguars in 2005 and spent two seasons with the club.
- The Patriots have nine players with ties to Florida: CB **Darius Butler** (Ft. HEAD COACH JACK DEL RIO

DEL RIO LEADS JAGUARS

Jack Del Rio is in his ninth season as the Jaguars' head coach, his 15th season as an NFL coach and 26th year in the league. Del Rio is one of only four current NFL head coaches who have been with his current team more than eight seasons, joining Bill Belichick, Andy Reid and Marvin Lewis. Del Rio was named to the post on January 17, 2003, becoming the second head coach in Jaguars history.

Del Rio ranks seventh among active coaches with a regular season record of 65-63. In 2007, the Jaguars posted an 11-5 regular season record to earn the second playoff berth in three years, in addition to the franchise's first playoff win since the 1999 season.

Del Rio spent 11 years as an NFL linebacker and had a standout college career at the University of Southern California. He previously coached in New Orleans (1997-98), Baltimore (1999-2001), and Carolina (2002). He was the Panthers' defensive coordinator, and in his only season with the club the defense improved from last in the NFL to second, the biggest one-season defensive improvement in NFL history. Del Rio was the linebackers coach for three seasons in Baltimore, where the Ravens' defense also ranked second each season. He helped the team win Super Bowl XXXV over the New York Giants and coached the Ravens' talented linebackers, overseeing the development of Peter Boulware, Jamie Sharper and Ray Lewis, the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year in 2000 and the MVP of Super Bowl XXXV. Prior to coaching, Del Rio played 11 seasons in the NFL, with New Orleans (1985-86), Kansas City (1987-88), Dallas (1989-1991) and Minnesota (1992-95), playing in the Pro Bowl following the 1994 season.

Del Rio was a starter at linebacker for Southern California (1981-84), where he earned All-America honors, was a runner-up for the Lombardi Award and co-MVP of the 1985 Rose Bowl. Del Rio has learned from some of the best coaches in all of football. He was recruited to USC and played for John Robinson, and in the NFL he played under Bum Phillips, Jim Mora, Jimmy Johnson and Dennis Green. As an assistant coach, he has worked for Hall of Famer Mike Ditka, Super Bowl participant John Fox and Super Bowl winner Brian Billick. Among other notable coaches Del Rio has worked with are Dom Capers, Tony Dungy, Dave Wannstedt, Monte Kiffin, Mike Tice, Tom Moore, Norv Turner, Mike Smith and Butch Davis. Drafted by baseball's Toronto Blue Jays, Del Rio batted .340 while playing catcher on USC's baseball team in 1983 and 1984 with future stars Randy Johnson and Mark McGwire. He was a third-round choice by the New Orleans Saints in 1985 and was named to the NFL's All-Rookie team.

SIGNING FRENZY

The NFL and NFLPA agreed on a new 10-year collective bargaining agreement on Monday, July 25. What followed was a signing frenzy as rosters were expanded to 90 players. The Jaguars made 51 transactions in a five-day period (July 27-31). Here's the timeline:

July 27 - Jaguars report to training camp. Teams allowed to sign their own drafted rookies and any undrafted rookies. The Jaguars signed 26 undrafted rookies.

July 28 - First practice is held at Florida Blue Health & Wellness Practice Fields. All five draft picks are signed.

July 29 - The Jaguars signed five players to exclusive right contracts but they were unable to practice. In addition, the club signed three unrestricted free agents (Clint Session, Paul Posluszny, Jason Spitz).

July 30 - The Jaguars signed two unrestricted free agents (Drew Coleman, Dawan Landry).

July 31 - The Jaguars signed unrestricted free agent punter Matt Turk

August 4 - The CBA is ratified by the NFLPA and 11 players (six unrestricted free agents, five exclusive rights free agents) took the field for practice for the first time.

CLOSER LOOK AT THE ROSTER

SMITH BUILDS ROSTER THROUGH DRAFT

Gene Smith is in his third season as the Jaguars general manager and senior vice president, player personnel. Smith is one of 12 staff members who joined the franchise in 1994.

Smith's first two drafts (2009-10) netted 15 players and all 15 remain with the club, and the group has made 157 combined starts. In 2011, the Jaguars moved up in the first round to select QB Blaine Gabbert with the 10th overall pick.

Smith's first draft class in 2009 was led by two offensive tackles in Eugene Monroe (1st round) and Eben Britton (2nd round). In 2010, two defensive tackles were selected with the first two picks in Tyson Alualu (1st round) and D'Anthony Smith (3rd round).

2011 DRAFT CLASS

QB Blaine Gabbert (Round 1, 10th overall, Missouri)

■ Only second quarterback drafted by the Jaguars in the first round in franchise history and fifth overall. Was one of four quarterbacks selected in the first 12 picks, the third overall behind Cam Newton and Jake Locker. Was a two-year starter and finished career with 6,822 passing yards and posted an 18-8 record as a starter. Had three career 400-yard passing games.

G/C Will Rackley (Round 3, 76th overall, Lehigh)

■ Four-year starter with 35 starts at left tackle and 10 at right guard. Three-time All-Patriot League selection who finished with 300 knock-downs and 35 touchdown-resulting blocks. Was highest-drafted Lehigh player since 1974 and first player to be drafted since 1995.

WR/RS Cecil Shorts III (Round 4, 114th overall, Mount Union)

■ Three-time Division III All-America selection finished career with 78 total touchdowns (63 receiving, 12 rushing, 3 returns). Set school and conference records with 259 receptions for 4,705 yards. Highest drafted player in school history and first player drafted by the Jaguars from a Division III school. Also competed on the track team as a sprinter.

S Chris Prosinski (Round 4, 121st overall, Wyoming)

■ Three-year starter ranked fourth in school history with 373 tackles. Was two-time All-Mountain West Conference selection. Started final 37 games at free safety. Played in Texas vs. the Nation All-Star Game.

CB Rod Issac (Round 5, 147th overall, Middle Tennessee State)

■ Known as a physical corner with good size and instincts. Played in 46 games with 37 starts and earned first-team All-Sun Belt honors as a senior. Had five career interceptions and returned two fumbles for touchdowns. Native of Miami and played at Miami-Dade High School.

2010 DRAFT CLASS

DT Tyson Alualu (Round 1, 10th overall, California)

■ Was the only rookie to start all 16 games. Ranked tied for third on the club with 3.5 sacks and fourth with 20 quarterback hits along with 77 tackles. His six tackles for loss tied for the third-most on the team.

DT D'Anthony Smith (Round 3, 74th overall, Louisiana Tech)

■ Injured his Achilles early in 2010 training camp and was placed on injured reserve. Impressed the staff during the OTAs with his aggressive nature and ability to get to the quarterback. He was a two-time first-team All-Western Athletic Conference selection.

DE Larry Hart (Round 5, 143rd overall, Central Arkansas)

■ Played a pass-rushing role in the defensive line rotation in 14 games. Recorded one sack, 12 quarterback pressures and 13 tackles.

DE Austen Lane (Round 5, 153rd overall, Murray State)

■ Started nine of 11 games and totaled 33 tackles, 13 quarterback hits and two tackles for loss.

RB/KR Deji Karim (Round 6, 180th overall, Southern Illinois)

■ Played in 11 games as the primary kickoff returner and also saw action at running back. Recorded a 25.0-yard kickoff return average on 50 returns with a long of 65 yards. Carried the ball 35 times for 160 yards.

RS Scotty McGee (Round 6, 203rd overall, James Madison)

■ Gave the Jaguars a glimpse of what they can expect in 2011 during last year's preseason. Missed the first two regular season games with a shoulder injury before he was placed on injured reserve on Sept. 21. Played in all four preseason games and finished with a 29.3-yard average on 10 kickoff returns and a 9.9-yard average on 11 punt returns.

SCOUTING THE PLAYER, NOT THE SCHOOL

The 2011 draft was another indication that Jaguars general manager Gene Smith is not trying to win a popularity contest among the experts. Four of the Jaguars' five picks were from non-BCS schools and 14 of the 20 players selected by the club the last three years fall in the same category.

The Jaguars have 28 players on their current roster from non Division I-A schools including four starters in CB **Derek Cox** (William & Mary), DE **Austen Lane** (Murray State), CB **Rashean Mathis** (Bethune-Cookman), C **Brad Meester** (Northern Iowa) along with key special teams contributors in LS **Jeremy Cain** (Massachusetts) and FB **Montell Owens** (Maine).

"I told our scouts this, you hear about sleepers. I feel like the only sleeper is the scout that's sleeping in and not doing his job well enough," Smith said. "He should know his area. He should know his region better than anyone else in our organization, and so from my perspective in this day and age with the video we have, with the ability to get information, if you have a work ethic you should know all the players in your particular part of the country that you're responsible for."

CLOSER LOOK AT THE ROSTER

2009 DRAFT CLASS

The Jaguars selected nine players in the 2009 NFL Draft including seven players on Sunday in the final five rounds. All nine players remain with the club. Seven offensive players and two defensive players were selected.

OT Eugene Monroe (Round 1, 8th overall, Virginia)

■ Started at left tackle in 28 games. One of six offensive linemen taken in the first round and third overall (behind Jason Smith and Andre Smith).

OT Eben Britton (Round 2, 39th overall, Arizona)

■ Was of only three rookies to start 15 or more games in 2009 after he was the seventh offensive lineman taken in draft. He started the first seven games in 2010 before suffering a season-ending shoulder injury on October 24 at Kansas City.

DT Terrance Knighton (Round 3, 72nd overall, Temple)

■ Has started all 32 games to open his career and has emerged as the leader of the defensive front. Posted career-high numbers in 2010 with four sacks, 23 quarterback hits, six tackles for loss and 84 tackles.

CB Derek Cox (Round 3, 73rd overall, William & Mary)

■ Jaguars selected Cox with the second of back-to-back third round picks and traded up with New England to have the opportunity. Made 27 starts in his first two seasons and led the team in interceptions in both seasons. Had four interceptions in back-to-back seasons.

WR Mike Thomas (Round 4, 107th overall, Arizona)

■ Has started 15 of 30 games and plays a vital role in the passing game. A year after setting a franchise record for a rookie with 48 receptions, he led the Jaguars with 66 receptions for 820 yards in 2010. Has a 9.9-yard career punt return average including a 78-yard return for a touchdown against Indianapolis.

WR Jarett Dillard (Round 5, 144th overall, Rice)

■ Was placed on injured reserve prior to the 2010 season-opener, the second consecutive year his season ended due to injury. Finished with six receptions for 106 yards as a rookie but missed the final seven games with a broken ankle.

TE Zach Miller (Round 6, 180th overall, Nebraska-Omaha)

■ Former college quarterback has played in 29 games with five starts and totaled 41 receptions for 428 yards and three touchdowns.

RB Rashad Jennings (Round 7, 250th overall, Liberty)

■ Played in 28 games with three starts and has emerged as the perfect complement to Maurice Jones-Drew in the running game. Finished with a career-high 84 carries for 459 yards with four touchdowns in 2010 including two 100-yard rushing games.

WR Tiquan Underwood (Round 7, 253rd overall, Rutgers)

■ Has played in 13 games for the Jaguars after playing four seasons at Rutgers. He has eight career receptions for 111 yards and a 23.4 average on 23.0 average on 26 kickoff returns.

OFFSEASON ACQUISITIONS

The Jaguars added several veterans in the first week of free agency with the signing of six unrestricted free agents: four on defense, one on offense and punter Matt Turk.

CB Drew Coleman (UFA, New York Jets)

■ Sixth-year cornerback played in 67 games with nine starts for the Jets the past five seasons. Career totals include six sacks, six forced fumbles, two INTs and 18 passes defended. Has played in seven postseason games with two starts including the AFC Championship game the last two seasons. Made career-high four starts in 2010 and had a career-high five forced fumbles.

S Dawan Landry (UFA, Baltimore)

■ Sixth-year pro spent the past five seasons with the Ravens and has ability to play both free and strong safety. Started 64 of 66 games and has made seven starts in the postseason. Has started all 16 games in three of five seasons. Career totals include 387 tackles, five sacks, nine INTs and 34 passes defended. Produced career-high 11 tackles in 2010 in 16 starts at SS.

LB Paul Posluszny (UFA, Buffalo)

■ Enters his fifth NFL season after being selected in the second round of the 2007 draft by the Bills. Led Bills in tackles the last two seasons including a career-high 140 in 2010. Has started 44 games and produced 405 tackles including three straight seasons of 100-plus tackles.

LB Clint Session (UFA, Indianapolis)

■ Physical, explosive LB who can play weakside or strongside. Spent the last four seasons with the Colts where he played in 48 games with 35 starts. Has played in five postseason games with four starts. Career totals include 264 tackles, four INTs and five forced fumbles. Was limited to five games in 2010 with an elbow injury. Native of Pompano Beach Florida.

G/C Jason Spitz (UFA, Green Bay)

■ Versatile offensive lineman has the ability to play both guard and center. Spent the last five seasons with the Packers, playing in 65 games with 45 starts (18 at RG, 8 at C, 19 at LG). Played in six postseason games with two starts. Teammate of Jaguars DE Aaron Kampman in Green Bay from 2006-09. Native of Jacksonville played at The Bolles School.

P Matt Turk (UFA, Houston)

■ Veteran punter is in his 16th season in the NFL. A three-time Pro Bowl selection (1996-98), he has played in 235 games including all 16 games in 13 different seasons. Spent the past four seasons with the Texans. Has averaged 42.4 yards (37.4 net) on 1,100 career punts and only had three blocked punts in his career.

FREE AGENTS PLAYED ROLE IN 2010

The Jaguars added two unrestricted free agents in the 2010 offseason and both played key roles with the club in their first season. DE **Aaron Kampman** had his first season cut short by a knee injury but his impact was felt on and off the field as a leader. The two-time Pro Bowl selection started the first eight games and tied for second on the team with four sacks and led the team with 30 QB pressures despite missing the second half of the season.

WR **Kassim Osgood** came to Jacksonville via San Diego as one of the league's best special teams performers and he didn't disappoint. The ninth-year pro played in all 16 games and was voted the first alternate special teamer for the Pro Bowl.

Here is a position-by-position breakdown of the 2011 Jaguars:

QUARTERBACKS (3)

■ **David Garrard**, a fourth-round draft pick in 2002, returns for his fifth season as the starter. Garrard owns a 39-37 career record as a starter with 89 touchdown passes and an 85.8 passer rating. In 2010, Garrard set the franchise single-season record with 23 touchdown passes and a 64.5 completion percentage. He finished the season with a 90.8 passer rating and ranked second in the NFL with a 108.3 fourth quarter rating. He became the first QB in franchise history to throw for three or more TDs in four different games in a season.

■ The Jaguars moved up in the draft to select former Missouri quarterback **Blaine Gabbert** with the 10th overall pick. Gabbert is only the second quarterback drafted by the Jaguars in the first round, and fifth quarterback overall. He started 26 of 31 games in three seasons and completed 568 of 933 passes for 6,822 yards with 40 touchdowns and 18 interceptions.

■ Eighth-year veteran **Luke McCown** is in his third season with the Jaguars after he was acquired via trade from Tampa Bay prior to the 2009 season-opener. McCown, a fourth-round pick of Cleveland in 2004, has played in 16 career games with seven starts. He suffered a season-ending knee injury in week two of the 2010 season at San Diego. His career totals include 154 of 260 passing for 1,739 yards with nine touchdowns and 10 interceptions for a 74.8 rating.

RUNNING BACKS (8)

■ Two-time Pro Bowl selection **Maurice Jones-Drew** leads the backfield. Jones-Drew, a second-round pick in 2006, ranks third in franchise history with 63 career touchdowns (54 rushing, 7 receiving, 2 kickoff returns) in 77 games. He set a career-high in 2010 with seven 100-yard rushing games including a streak of six straight, the longest streak in the NFL. Since taking over as the lead running back in 2009, he ranks second in the NFL in rushing yards (2,715) and third in overall touchdowns (23).

■ 2009 seventh-round pick **Rashad Jennings** enters his third season and has emerged as a threat in the rushing and passing game. He posted career-best numbers in 2010 with 459 rushing yards and four touchdowns, including two 100-yard rushing games. The Jaguars added **Deji Karim** in the fifth round of the 2010 draft and he saw action at running back and as kickoff returner as a rookie. He finished second in franchise history with 50 returns for 1,248 yards along with 35 rushes for 160 yards. Undrafted rookies **Richard Murphy** (LSU) and **DuJuan Harris** (Troy) are competing for a roster spot.

■ Fullback **Greg Jones** enters his eighth season and is regarded as one of the NFL's best at his position. Jones has served as a lead blocker for two running backs (Fred Taylor, Maurice Jones-Drew) that have made three Pro Bowl appearances. He has career totals of 263 rushes for 896 yards and nine touchdowns. **Montell Owens** also sees action at fullback and excels on special teams. Owens, the franchise leader for career special teams tackles with 95, was voted to his first Pro Bowl in 2010 after being named an alternate in 2009. Second-year pro **Brock Bolen** has played in seven career games and he competes for a roster spot at fullback.

WIDE RECEIVERS (11)

■ Perhaps the most competitive position at training camp is the battle for roster spots at receiver. **Johnny Cox** is in his first season as the club's wide receivers coach and his third year on the staff.

■ Fifth-year pro **Jason Hill** will start at wideout after playing in six of the final seven games for the Jaguars a year ago. Hill, a third-round pick of San Francisco in 2007, was claimed off waivers on Nov. 17. He has played in 40 career games with 51 receptions for 661 yards and five touchdowns. **Mike Thomas** was one of three wideouts drafted by the Jaguars in 2009 and he emerged as the team's leading receiver in 2010. Thomas, a fourth-round pick, finished with 66 receptions for 820 yards and four touchdowns and led the team with a 10.5-yard average on 34 punt returns. He is one of only three

players in team history to record 66 or more receptions in a season, joining Jimmy Smith and Keenan McCardell.

■ **Jarett Dillard** (5th round) and **Tiquan Underwood** (7th round) were also drafted by the club in 2009. Dillard has been slowed by injuries his first two seasons, missing the final seven games of his rookie campaign with a broken ankle and the 2010 season. He has six career receptions for 106 yards. Underwood has appeared in 13 games in two seasons and also sees action as a kickoff returner.

■ Ninth-year pro **Kassim Osgood** returns for his second season with the Jaguars. Osgood, 6-5, 220, is known as one of the NFL's best special teams performers and has been voted the AFC's special teams player for the Pro Bowl twice in the last four seasons. He also sees action at receiver and has 39 career receptions for 707 yards and five touchdowns.

■ The Jaguars selected former Division III (Mount Union) standout **Cecil Shorts** in the fourth round of this year's draft. Shorts, who also sees action at punt returner, has impressed the staff with his hands and quickness early in training camp. He was a three-time All-America selection and finished his career with 78 touchdowns (63 receiving, 12 rushing, 3 returns).

■ Second-year pro **John Matthews** is in camp after spending time on the practice squad and active roster in 2010. Undrafted rookies **Armon Binns** (Cincinnati), **Jamar Newsome** (Central Florida), **Greg Ellingson** (Florida International) and **Dontrelle Inman** (Virginia) are competing for a roster spot.

TIGHT ENDS (5)

■ Former first-round pick **Mercedes Lewis** re-signed with the club last week and looks to build on his Pro Bowl season from a year ago. Lewis earned his first Pro Bowl honors after a career-best 58 receptions for 700 yards and 10 touchdowns. The 10 touchdowns tied a single-season franchise record and the receptions and yards were the second-best ever by a Jaguars tight end. The former 2006 first-round pick has 181 career receptions for 2,224 yards and 17 touchdowns.

■ The Jaguars look for 2009 sixth-round pick **Zach Miller** to make major strides in his third season after making the transition from college quarterback to tight end. Miller has played in 29 games with five starts and totaled 41 receptions for 428 yards and three touchdowns. He has receptions of 62 and 52 yards in two seasons.

■ Second-year pro **Zach Potter** returns after playing in 13 games the last two seasons. The former collegiate defensive end was originally signed as a rookie free agent by the New York Jets before spending the majority of his rookie season on the Jaguars practice squad. Rookie free agents **Tommy Gallarda** (Boise State) and **Kyle Miller** (Mount Union) compete for a roster spot.

OFFENSIVE LINE (15)

■ The Jaguars expect to have only one new starter along the offensive line while the unit is a mixture of veterans and youth. The club selected tackles **Eugene Monroe** (1st round) and **Eben Britton** (2nd round) in the 2009 draft. Monroe has started 28 games at left tackle while Britton has made 22 starts on the right side.

■ Center **Brad Meester** returns for his 12th NFL season and holds the franchise record with 161 career starts. Only Jimmy Smith (171) has played more games as a Jaguar than Meester (161). Second-year pro **John Estes** and first-year pro **Bradley Vierling** are competing for a roster spot at center.

■ Fifth-year pro **Uche Nwaneri** is expected to start at RG. Nwaneri can play both guard and center and has started 45 of 47 games (16 at LG, 29 at RG) since joining the club as a fifth-round pick in 2007. Veteran **Jason Spitz** and 2010 third-round pick **Will Rackley** are competing for the starting job at left guard. Spitz, a Jacksonville native, has spent the past five seasons with Green Bay where he played in 65 games with 45 starts (18 at RG, 8 at C, 19 at LG). Rackley, 6-3, 309, was a four-year starter at Lehigh and has ability to play both guard and tackle. He started 45 of 46 games and ended his career with 40 straight starts with 35 at left tackle and 10 at right guard.

■ Sixth-year pro **Guy Whimper** has played in 36 games in five seasons and

made his first career start in 2010 for the Jaguars. Whimper was originally a fourth-round pick of the New York Giants in 2006 where he spent four seasons. **Kevin Haslam** saw action in five games as a rookie and can play both guard and tackle. First-year pro **Daniel Baldridge** will compete for a roster spot along with undrafted rookies **Cameron Bradfield** (Grand Valley State), **Wade Grayson** (Arkansas), **Brandon Harper** (Duke) and **Troy White** (West Virginia Tech).

DEFENSIVE LINE (15)

- Defensive end **Aaron Kampman** returns to the lineup after having his first season with the Jaguars cut short by a knee injury. Kampman, a two-time Pro Bowler, suffered a torn ACL in his right knee in practice on Nov. 11 and missed the final eight games. He has played in 120 games with 112 starts and registered 58 career sacks including four in 2010.
- The starter opposite Kampman will be determined in the preseason. 2010 fifth-round pick **Austen Lane** saw extensive action as a rookie and has been impressive in training camp. The former Murray State standout started nine games and was the youngest defensive end in the NFL to start eight or more games in 2010. He finished with 33 tackles, 13 QB pressures and two tackles for loss. Fourth-year pro **Jeremy Mincey** started a career-high eight games a year ago and led the team with five sacks and ranked second with 25 QB pressures despite playing part of the season with a broken hand.
- Competition is stiff for a role in the defensive end rotation from a host of players. Second-year pro **Larry Hart** showed signs of rushing the passer in 2010 and had 1.5 sacks and 12 QB pressures. **Aaron Morgan** earned a roster spot as a rookie free agent in 2010 and appeared in seven games. Undrafted rookies **Steven Wesley** (North Alabama), **Marc Schiechl** (Colorado School of Mines) and **Odrick Ray** (Tulsa) compete for a roster spot at end.
- The tackle position is led by third-year pro **Terrance Knighton** who has started the first 32 games of his career. Knighton, nicknamed "Pot Roast," has 5.5 career sacks and 12 tackles for loss and totaled 23 QB pressures in each of his first two seasons. He produced a career-high 84 tackles in 2010 along with four sacks and six tackles for loss. The club selected tackles **Tyson Alualu** (1st round) and **D'Anthony Smith** (3rd round) in the 2010 draft. Alualu, the 10th overall pick, started all 16 games as a rookie, joining Knighton as the only defensive linemen in franchise history to accomplish the feat. He ranked second in the NFL among all rookie defensive tackles with 3.5 sacks including two in the first three games. Smith suffered an Achilles injury in training camp and missed the entire season. He has not missed a practice through the first week of training camp. He was a two-time first-team All-WAC selection at Louisiana Tech and totaled 23.5 tackles for loss and 12.5 sacks.
- Two veterans return to add depth at tackle in **Leger Douzable** and **C.J. Mosley**. Douzable, who is in his third season, has played in 27 career games including 15 games in 2010 for the Jaguars. He posted a career-high 27 tackles along with two tackles for loss. Mosley enters his seventh NFL season since he was selected in the sixth round by Minnesota in 2005. He has also spent time with the New York Jets and Cleveland and played in eight games for the Jaguars in 2010.
- Second-year pro **Nate Collins** is back after seeing his first NFL action in 2010. The only rookie tackle on the roster is undrafted rookie **Andrew Lewis** (Syracuse).

LINEBACKERS (10)

- The Jaguars will have two new starters at linebacker in 2011, both coming via free agency, to join eighth-year pro **Daryl Smith**. Smith, the franchise's all-time leading tackler with 918, will hold down one outside linebacker position. He has started 106 of 108 games and is the only player in franchise history with six straight seasons with 100-plus tackles. He led the team with 156 tackles in 2010 and tied for the team-lead with eight tackles for loss.
- Fifth-year pros **Paul Posluszny** (Buffalo) and **Clint Session** (Indianapolis) were signed as unrestricted free agents on July 29. Posluszny, who will man the middle, has started 44 games since he was a second-round pick of

the Bills in 2007. In four seasons, he compiled 405 tackles including three straight seasons of 100-plus tackles. Session spent the last four seasons with the Colts where he played in 48 games with 35 starts after being selected in the fourth round of the 2007 draft. He has 264 career tackles with four interceptions, five forced fumbles and 1.5 sacks. He started five games in 2010 on the weakside and was inactive for 11 games with an elbow injury.

- There are a host of players battling for roster spots including five players that spent time with the team in 2010. Third-year pro **Russell Allen** has played in all 32 games since making the roster as an undrafted rookie and has nine career starts. He sees extensive action on special teams where he has 26 career tackles. **Jacob Cutrera** (2nd year), **Kyle Bosworth** (2nd year), **Alvin Bowen** (2nd year) and **Slade Norris** (3rd year) all return. Cutrera was one of three undrafted rookies to make the opening day roster in 2010 and Bosworth spent his entire rookie season on injured reserve. Bowen and Norris spent time on the club's practice squad. Undrafted rookies **Scott Lutrus** and **Mike Lockley** compete for a roster spot.

DEFENSIVE BACKS (18)

- Cornerback **Rashean Mathis** returns for a ninth season to lead the secondary. Mathis, a Pro Bowl starter in 2006, holds the franchise record with 29 career interceptions. He started all 16 games in 2010 for the first time since 2006.
- Third-year pro **Derek Cox** is expected to start opposite Mathis. Cox has eight interceptions since being selected in the third round of the 2009 draft, the most by a Jaguar in his first two seasons. He has started 27 of 29 games and led the team in 2010 with four interceptions. The Jaguars added sixth-year cornerback **Drew Coleman** (N.Y. Jets) in free agency and he will assume the role of nickel back. Coleman played the last five seasons with the Jets where he played in 67 games with nine starts. In 2010, he established career-highs with 34 tackles, five forced fumbles and four sacks. His four sacks were the most in the NFL by a cornerback.
- Fifth-year pro **David Jones** competes at cornerback after starting five games for the club in 2010. He joined the Jaguars via a trade with Cincinnati prior to the 2010 season. Third-year CB **William Middleton** excels on special teams and saw extensive action in the nickel defense a year ago. Middleton, a fifth-round pick of the Falcons in 2009, has 27 special teams tackles in two seasons. The Jaguars acquired fourth-year pro **Terrence Wheatley** midway through the 2010 season. A former second-round pick of New England in 2008, Wheatley played in one game with the Jaguars before suffering a season-ending hamstring injury. The Jaguars selected **Rod Issac** in the fifth round of this year's draft and he is expected to see action in the nickel defense and on special teams. He played in 46 games with 37 starts at Middle Tennessee State. Other players in the mix at cornerback include undrafted rookies **Jalil Johnson** (Jackson State), **Kevin Rutland** (Missouri), **Cole Brodie** (South Dakota State) and **T.J. Heath** (Jacksonville State).
- The safety position was upgraded with the signing of sixth-year pro **Dawan Landry** (Baltimore) in free agency. Landry has the ability to play both free or strong safety. He spent the past five seasons with the Ravens where he started 64 of 66 games including all 16 games in three of five seasons. He registered a career-high 11 tackles in 2010.
- Competition in the preseason will determine the starter beside Landry. Third-year pro **Courtney Greene** made 11 starts at strong safety in 2010 and had 77 tackles. He has played in 23 games with 11 starts since joining the Jaguars in 2009 as a free agent. **Michael Hamlin** enters his third NFL season after being selected in the fifth round of the 2009 draft by Dallas. He was signed to the Jaguars practice squad on Oct. 15, 2010 and played in the final four games for the club. Third-year pro **Don Carey** saw his first career action in 2010 and started 10 games at free safety. He was inserted into the starting lineup in week seven at Kansas City.
- 2010 fourth-round pick **Chris Prosinski** leads a group of young pros looking to see time at safety. Prosinski was a three-year starter at free safety at Wyoming and was a two-time All-Mountain West Conference selection. Second-year pro **Terrell Whitehead** spent the entire 2010 season on injured

reserve. Also in the mix for a roster spot is undrafted rookie **Matt Estrada** (Northern Arizona).

SPECIALISTS (5)

- **Josh Scobee**, a fifth-round pick by the Jaguars in 2004, returns for his eighth season as the placekicker. Scobee holds the team-record with 106 touchbacks and has connected on 144 of 187 field goals (77.0 pct.). He has hit seven game-winning field goals including a franchise-best 59-yard game-winning field goal in 2010.
- The Jaguars will open the season with a new punter for the first time since 2007. The club added 16-year pro **Matt Turk** in free agency and he has played in 235 games including 64 games the last four seasons with Houston. At age 43, Turk is the oldest player currently in the NFL. The club signed second-year punter **Durant Brooks** last week. Brooks was originally a sixth-round draft pick of the Washington Redskins in 2008 and played in six games as a rookie for the Redskins.
- Fifth-year pro **Jeremy Cain** returns for his third season as long snapper with the Jaguars. Cain has played in 49 career games since entering the NFL in 2004.
- Second-year pro **Scotty McGee** excelled in the preseason as a rookie before suffering a season-ending shoulder injury in the final preseason game. He had six returns for touchdowns at James Madison including three of 99-plus yards. Mike Thomas and rookie Cecil Shorts can also handle punts. Second-year pro Deji Karim and McGee will compete for the kickoff returner job.

C Brad Meester and QB David Garrard are the only players on the Jaguars roster who joined the Jaguars prior to Jack Del Rio taking over the helm in 2003. Meester and Garrard were both drafted by former head coach Tom Coughlin.

2010 TIDBITS

- The Jaguars finished the regular season 8-8 as they lost three straight games to conclude the season. For the second straight season, the Jaguars were not eliminated from the playoffs until the final weekend of the regular season.
- The Jaguars had a share of first place in the AFC South for five of the last six weeks, the latest they had been in that position since 1999. The Jaguars finished 3-3 in the AFC South with a win against each team in the division.
- Following a 1-2 start, the Jaguars won seven of their next 10 games including a streak of three straight wins.
- RB Maurice Jones-Drew (starter), TE Mercedes Lewis and special teamer Montell Owens were named to the AFC Pro Bowl roster.
- The Jaguars concluded the season with 14 players on injured reserve including several starters. Pro Bowl RB Maurice Jones-Drew missed the final two games with a knee injury while QB David Garrard was placed on injured reserve with a finger injury the week of the regular season finale.
- The Jaguars started three different quarterbacks (Garrard, Todd Bouman, Trent Edwards) for only the third time (1997, 1998) in franchise history.
- DE Aaron Kampman produced four sacks in the first eight games before suffering a torn ACL in his knee during practice, forcing him to miss the final half of the season. 2009 second-round pick Eben Britton missed the final nine games after injuring his shoulder in week seven at Kansas City.
- The Jaguars surpassed the 30-point mark in five games, tied for the most in franchise history.
- The Jaguars picked up three wins with the final outcome in doubt until the final seconds. Josh Scobee connected on a franchise-record 59-yard field goal as time expired on Oct. 3 to give the Jaguars a 31-28 win over Indianapolis. It was the third-longest game-ending field goal in NFL history. David Garrard hooked up with Mike Thomas for a 50-yard touchdown as time expired on Nov. 14 for a win against Houston. Maurice Jones-Drew went 75 yards on a screen pass on Nov. 21 against Cleveland and then scored on a one-yard run with 1:16 remaining to give the Jaguars the win.
