The San Diego Chargers will make their longest road trip of the season this weekend, traveling to Foxborough, Mass. to face the New England Patriots on Sunday, Sept. 18 at Gillette Stadium. CBS Sports will show the game to a National TV audience with **Jim Nantz** and **Phil Simms** describing the action from the broadcast booth. Kickoff from Foxborough is set for 1:15 p.m. PDT (4:15 p.m. EDT).



The Chargers opened their 2011 in San Diego on Sunday and overcame a three-point deficit in the fourth quarter to defeat Minnesota, 24-17. The Patriots, meanwhile, will have a short week to prepare for the Chargers after defeating the Miami Dolphins, 38-24, in a Monday night game in Miami.

The Chargers are hopeful of reversing their past history of road openers in New England. The previous two both resulted in big losses, a 38-14 defeat in 2007 and a 41-7 loss in 1997. The Chargers are 5-5 in their last 10 road openers and 22-29 all-time.



Series History

Two of the original members of the American Football League (AFL), the Chargers history with the Patriots dates to 1960. There have been 38 meetings all-time, including three in the postseason. The Chargers won their only championship in 1963, defeating the then-Boston Patriots, 51-10, in the AFL Championship Game. More recently, the teams met in the Divisional Playoffs in San Diego in 2006 and the AFC Championship Game in New England in 2007, with the Patriots winning both contests. All-time, the Patriots lead the series 21-15 and there have been two ties. San Diego has won three of the last seven, including a 41-17 win in Foxborough in 2005.



Familiar Faces

Chargers General Manager **A.J. Smith**, a native of Warwick, R.I., was a part-time scout for the Patriots from 1978-1980. Quarterbacks coach **John Ramsdell** is a native of Springfield, Mass., and played at Springfield College. Defensive end **Jacques Cesaire** is from Gardner, Mass., and linebacker **Stephen Cooper** is from Wareham, Mass. Defensive tackle **Antonio Garay** was an All-America wrestler at Boston College and joined the football team after the Eagles disbanded their wrestling program.

Patriots wide receiver **Wes Welker** began his NFL career with the Chargers in 2004, making the team as an undrafted free agent. He played in one game before signing with New England. Other Patriots with ties to Southern California include safety **Patrick Chung** (Rancho Cucamonga), wide receiver **Matthew Slater** (Anaheim and UCLA), center **Ryan Wendell** (Diamond Bar) and running back **Shane Vereen** (Valencia).



Milestones

Quarterback **Philip Rivers** comes into Sunday's game at New England just four yards shy of 20,000 for his career. Rivers is looking to become the 93rd quarterback in NFL history to eclipse 20,000 yards.

Tight end **Antonio Gates** comes into Sunday's game with 537 career catches, third-most in team history. Gates needs just four catches to tie **Kellen Winslow** (541) for second. Gates would also move past Winslow for fifth place on the NFL's all-time receptions list for tight ends. The Chargers' all-time receptions leader is **Charlie Joiner**, the team's wide receivers coach, who racked up 586 catches during his Hall of Fame career in San Diego.

Game Balls

Following the Chargers season opening win vs. Minnesota, several game balls were handed out in the locker room.

Norv Turner received one from the team for notching his 100th-career regular-season win.

Punter **Mike Scifres** received one from Turner for a game effort against the Vikings. After kicker **Nate Kaeding** was injured on the game's opening kickoff, Scifres handled all placements for the rest of the game. He made all three point-after tries and his 40-yard field goal at 10:05 of the fourth quarter tied the game at 17-17. It was his first field goal in a live game since 2000 when he was a sophomore at Western Illinois.

And linebacker **Takeo Spikes** earned one from Turner after leading the team with 13 tackles in his first game as a Charger, keying a relentless defensive effort that held Vikings' running back **Adrian Peterson** to less than 100 yards on the ground.

The Head Coaches

Norv Turner, whose teams have won three of the last four AFC Western Division Championships, has led one of the most successful eras in Chargers history.

Named NFL Coach of the Year by USA Today in 2009, Turner's accomplishments in the last four seasons are among the best in franchise history. His 41 wins over the four-year stretch are second only to the team's 42 from 1978-81, and he and Don Coryell are tied for the most AFC West titles in a four-year period (three). Turner's winning percentage in the regular season (.641) is the franchise's best, as is his combined mark (.629), including playoffs, and he's tied with Coryell and Bobby Ross for the most playoff wins in team history (three). Turner has saved some of his best coaching for late in the season as evidenced by his 28-7 regular-season record after Nov. 1, including 17-2 in December and January.

In 2010, Turner's Chargers led the NFL in total offense and total defense. San Diego finished the season strong, winning seven of its last nine. The Chargers led the NFL in 2010 in total offense (395.6 ypg), average yards per play (6.1) and yards per pass play (8.7). They scored the second-most points in the NFL (441) and averaged 27.6 points per game, becoming the NFL's first team ever to average more than 25.0 points a game for seven consecutive seasons, including four-straight under Turner.

Turner faced one of the more challenging seasons of his NFL coaching career in 2010 as the Chargers' roster endured constant change throughout the season. Seventy-four different players appeared in at least one game for the Bolts, equaling Arizona's NFL record (2005) for the most players in a nonstrike season. In total, the Chargers made 109 roster moves between final cuts (Sept. 4) and the end of the regular season.

Despite the constant roster shuffling, the Chargers offense rarely wavered. At the end of the year, the Chargers were one of only two NFL teams to feature a quarterback with at least 30 touchdown passes, a running back with at least 10 rushing touchdowns and a receiver or tight end with at least 10 touchdown catches. It's a feat that had been achieved only one other time in franchise history (1981).

The Chargers' running game also showed significant progress in 2010. After falling to 31st among the league's 32 teams in 2009, the Chargers ranked 15th in 2010 and showing balance, they were the NFL's only team to register more than 4,500 yards through the air and 1,800 on the ground.

A look back at 2010

The San Diego Chargers finished the 2010 season with a 9-7 record. It was the team's sixth winning season in the last seven years. The Chargers finished second in the AFC West, a game behind Kansas City, and posted a mark of 3-3 within the division. After a 2-5 start to the season, the Chargers finished strong by winning seven of the last nine.

The Chargers led the NFL in total offense (395.6 ypg) and total defense (271.6) in 2010. They became just the eighth team, and fifth since the merger (1970), to lead the NFL in both categories. The Chargers also led the NFL offensively in yards per play (6.1) and yards per pass play (8.7), and defensively in passing yards per game (177.8), yards per pass play (6.4) and first downs allowed per game (15.4). The 2010 season marked the first time since 1985 that the Chargers led the NFL in total offense and the first time since 1998 that it led the league in total defense.

The Chargers scored the second-most points in the NFL (441), averaging 27.6 points per game, to become the NFL's first team ever to average more than 25.0 points a game for seven consecutive seasons. Defensively, the Chargers allowed the 10th-fewest points in the NFL (322) and owned the league's fifth-highest point disparity (+119).

The Chargers' roster endured constant change throughout the season as 74 different players appeared in at least one game for the Bolts in 2010, equaling Arizona's NFL record (2005) for the most players in a non-strike season. In total, the Chargers made 109 roster moves between final cuts (Sept. 4) and the end of the regular season.

Some of the highlights included quarterback **Philip Rivers**, who led the NFL with a career-high 4,710 yards and was second in the league with a quarterback rating of 101.8. **Jerome Clary**, the team's Ed Block Courage Award winner, didn't miss a single snap all season on tight tackle. Center **Nick Hardwick** was back to his old self anchoring the offensive line after missing 13 games in 2009 with an ankle injury. Outside linebacker **Shaun Phillips**, who hasn't missed a start since 2007, led the team with 11 sacks, 16 tackles for loss and 19 quarterback pressures, and tied for the team lead with 15 quarterback hits. Free safety **Eric Weddle** led the secondary with 93 tackles. Defensive end **Jacques Cesaire** was second on the defensive line with 47 tackles and 11 quarterback pressures. Cornerback **Antoine Cason** led the team with four interceptions and 11 passes defensed. Defensive tackle **Antonio Garay** set career-highs and led the defensive line in tackles (59), sacks (5.5), tackles for loss (10) and quarterback hits (15).

Bill Belichick is in his 37th season as an NFL coach and is the only head coach in NFL history to win three Super Bowl championships in a four-year span. He currently ranks 10th all time with 178 total victories as a head coach. His winning percentage ranks third in NFL history among coaches with 150 or more wins, trailing only George Halas and Don Shula. Belichick won more regular-season games (121) and more games overall (135) during a ten-year stretch (2001-2010) than any other head coach in NFL history.

He was hired by Patriots Chairman and CEO Robert Kraft on Jan. 27, 2000 and is in his 12th season as the team's head coach. Through 11 seasons, Belichick has delivered three Super Bowl championships, four conference titles, eight division crowns and 14 playoff victories, while posting an overall record of 140-55 (not including Miami game). Belichick directed the Patriots to victories in Super Bowls XXXVI (2001), XXXVIII (2003) and XXXIX (2004), and in 2007 he became the only NFL head coach to guide his team to a 16-0 regular season. From 2003 to 2004, Belichick directed the Patriots to an overall winning streak of 21 consecutive games, including the postseason, unprecedented in NFL annals.

Despite an NFL system designed to ensure parity, Belichick's program has produced a remarkable run of sustained on-field success. From 2001-10, the Patriots won 75.6 percent of their regular-season games (121-39), recording the highest winning percentage of any major American professional sports team over that span. Over a 100-game stretch from 2003-08, Belichick directed the team to an 82-18 record – the best record in any 100-game span in NFL history. Belichick has led the Patriots to a winning record in each of the last 10 seasons, making the Patriots the only NFL franchise to accomplish that feat from 2001-10. For five straight seasons from 2003-07, Belichick's teams won the AFC East title and advanced in the playoffs, with the Patriots' five straight years of playoff advancement tying the second longest streak in NFL history. The only other NFL coach to have 10 consecutive winning seasons with one team since the 1970 merger was Tom Landry, who led the Dallas Cowboys to 16 consecutive winning seasons (1970-85).

Belichick was born in 1952 in Nashville, Tenn. and raised in Annapolis, Md. His father, Steve, played fullback for the Detroit Lions in 1941 and coached for 33 years at the Naval Academy. Bill was a standout prep athlete at Annapolis High, where he has since been inducted into the school's Hall of Fame.

They said it

Antonio Gates on Norv Turner — "There's a lot of coaches in this league that think it's about them. It's about their records, it's about what they need to accomplish, how many wins they need to get to increase their resume, etc., etc. One thing I feel I've figured out about Norv is (to him) it's just about enjoying what he does, going out and winning and having you be the best that you can be."

Philip Rivers on Norv Turner — "Guys that have been around long enough to know, they know he cares about them. He knows football, he loves football and he's going to do everything he can to help you play your best football. They know what his passion is for. They know he's not a guy who's going to go, 'I told them.' He truly wants it -- not so he can get the credit, obviously. He doesn't care about getting any of the credit. But the guys who have been around him appreciate the way he goes about it -- the way he pops in the training room, the way he pops in the weight room, the way he's around the meeting room. You see him. He's not a head coach that just hits the walk-thru, that you just see on the field, just going to call the plays. He truly knows guys."

Defensive line coach Don Johnson on defensive lineman Vaughn Martin — "Something that big moving that fast? Vaughn's like a Ford truck with Porsche quickness."

Antonio Gates on Bob Sanders — "He's unpredictable and he covers ground so fast. I told him it's nice to have him on my side." (After Gates caught a pass in practice and turned). "I was blinded by this dreadlocks explosion."

Special teams coach Rich Bisaccia — "I'd like to believe [special teams can make a difference]. We're kind of the glue that combines it all together. We don't have three downs. We have one down to make a play, and if we don't handle our job on that one play, it could be a deterrent to the entire game, or it can be a momentum-changer to the entire game."

Vincent Jackson on Quentin Jammer being one of the NFL's top cover cornerbacks — "He's always in great position and the fact that his interception numbers are not high, it means nothing to me. I don't think it means anything to any receiver in this league. If a guy is in your hip pocket and you're not catching the ball, it's tough whether it's intercepted or not."

Team Captains

Prior to the season opener, the Chargers voted on team captains for the 2011 season. The players selected **Philip Rivers** and **Nick Hardwick** as offensive captains, **Takeo Spikes** and **Eric Weddle** as defensive captains, and **Jacob Hester** as special teams captain. This is the sixth-consecutive year Rivers has served as a captain and the second year in a row for Hardwick. Spikes, Weddle and Hester are all first-time captains.

Week 1 vs. Minnesota

The Chargers opened the season with a 24-17 win over the Vikings, overcoming a fourth-quarter deficit and scoring 17 unanswered points in the win. **Philip Rivers** passed for two touchdowns, including the game-winner to **Mike Tolbert** at 5:01 of the fourth quarter. San Diego's defense dominated the Vikings, holding them to just 187 yards of total offense and just 26 in the second half. After the Vikings' second touchdown of the game at 9:44 of the second quarter, they didn't manage to cross the 50-yard line into Chargers territory for the rest of the game. The Chargers finished the game with 31 first downs to the Vikings' 10, and possessed the ball for 37:17 to Minnesota's 22:43.

Norv Turner earned his 100th career regular-season win against the Vikings.
Mike Scifres took over for an injured **Nate Kaeding** and scored his first-career NFL points, including a game-tying 40-yard field goal with 10:05 remaining in the fourth quarter...it tied the game at 17-17...Scifres' last made field goal in a live game (college or pro) was a 56-yard game-winner as time expired to give Western Illinois a 44-41 win over Northern Iowa in 2000 for a conference title...Scifres was also good on all three point-after attempts...Scifres also handled kickoffs and had two touchdowns...Kaeding suffered season-ending torn ligaments in his left knee on the game's opening kickoff.
Antoine Cason had a game-high two passes defended...both came on third down plays to force Minnesota punts...the last gave the ball to the Chargers for the go-ahead touchdown drive.
Philip Rivers' 335 yards were his most ever in a season opener...it was his 21st career 300-yard game and the 13th time in his career that he led the Chargers back for a win when trailing in the fourth quarter.
Mike Tolbert scored a career-high three touchdowns, including a career-high two receiving touchdowns...Tolbert scored the game-winner for the Chargers on his second touchdown reception, a 19-yarder with 5:01 remaining in the fourth quarter...he became the third player in team history to have two touchdown catches and a rushing touchdown in the same game...his nine catches were a career high.
Antonio Gates caught eight passes to move into third place on the team's all-time receptions list with 537...he passed **LaDainian Tomlinson** (530) for third place.
Shaun Phillips made a great play on Minnesota's first offensive play of the game, tipping a Donovan McNabb pass in the air and intercepting it at the Vikings' six...it was his fifth-career interception and led to a Chargers touchdown three plays later to tie the game at 7-7.
Ryan Mathews had a career-high 73 yards receiving, including a career-long 37-yard catch.
Antwan Barnes made two big plays in the second half...on the last play of the third quarter, his pressure on third-down helped force an incomplete pass and a punt...on the ensuing drive, Scifres kicked a 40-yard field goal to tie the game at 17-17...then late in the fourth quarter, Barnes' 10-yard sack on third-down capped off a three-and-out and the Chargers offense ran out the clock on the ensuing possession to close out the win.
Takeo Spikes, in his first game with the Chargers, led the team with 13 tackles.
Corey Liuget had a team-high two tackles for loss in his first-career NFL game.

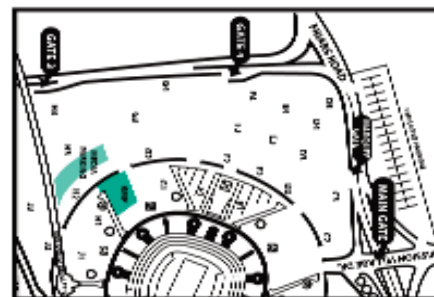
