THE MATCH-UP

Kansas City travels to New England to play its second Monday Night Football game of the season on Nov. 21. The Chiefs dropped a 17-10 decision to AFC West rival Denver (11/13) last week to fall to 4-5 on the season. The club trails Oakland by one game in the AFC West. New England won 37-16 at the N.Y. Jets (11/13) on Sunday Night Football.

This is the first meeting between the Chiefs and Patriots since an Opening Day matchup in 2008. In that game, New England QB Tom Brady suffered a season-ending knee injury as Matt Cassel came on to lead the club. New England pulled out a 17-10 win as Cassel finished the game with 152 passing yards. Kansas City had a chance to tie that contest, but could not convert a goal-to-go situation late in the fourth quarter.

The Chiefs posted a 3-1 record in the second quarter of the 2011 season, outscoring their opponents by a 82-75 margin. The club became the first team in the NFL to start the season 0-3 and then win its next four games since Pittsburgh accomplished the feat in 2000.

The Chiefs defense has intercepted 13 passes to tie for third in the NFL. The 13 interceptions were the most in Chiefs history after eight games since the club had 18 in 2003. CB Brandon Flowers is tied for third in the AFC and tied for fifth in the NFL by victimizing opposing quarterbacks four times, including taking one back for a touchdown. LB Derrick Johnson has 94 tackles and is on pace for 167 tackles in 2011, a mark that would rank as the highest single-season total in Chiefs history.

WR Dwayne Bowe leads the Chiefs offense with 41 receptions for 663 yards. He is tied for 10th in the AFC with four touchdown catches. RB Jackie Battle has a team-high 403 rushing yards and has averaged 73.2 rushing yards per game dating back to Oct. 9. He had a career-long 34-yard run vs. Denver (11/13) while averaging 4.8 yards per carry. CB Javier Arenas is third in the NFL with a 14.1-yard punt return average.

Kansas City returns home to host Pittsburgh on Sunday Night Football next week (11/27). It will be the Chiefs first appearance on Sunday Night Football since playing at San Diego (12/17/06). New England travels to play Philadelphia on Sunday, Nov. 27.

THE SERIES

Kansas City has a 16-12-3 (.565) all-time record against New England in the 52-year history of the series. The two clubs are both original members of the American Football League established by Chiefs founder Lamar Hunt. New England holds a 6-9-2 (.412) advantage in games played in the Northeast. Kansas City has played at Gillette Stadium on two different occasions, but lost both contests.

The Patriots have won six of the last seven contests at New England, including four consecutive games. Kansas City's most recent victory in New England was a 37-7 win vs. the Patriots (12/2/90).

Kansas City is 10-3-1 (.750) in home games against New England. The Chiefs are 2-1 in games played at the Cotton Bowl, 4-1 (.750) at Municipal Stadium and 4-1 (.800) at Arrowhead Stadium. Kansas City won 26-16 in the last matchup at Arrowhead Stadium (11/27/05).

Interestingly, the two old AFL rivals have never met in the postseason.

CHIEFS HEAD COACH - TODD HALEY



Todd Haley was named the 11th head coach of the Kansas City Chiefs on Feb. 6, 2009 and is in his third year leading the Chiefs. Haley is in his 17th season in the NFL in 2011 and his 15th season as an NFL coach after beginning his career as a scouting assistant with the N.Y. Jets in '95.

Haley led the Chiefs to a 10-6 record in 2010 after posting a 4-12 mark in 2009 for the best single-season turnaround in franchise history. Kansas City won the AFC West Championship as Haley was named the NFL Coach of the Year by the NFL Alumni Association and the AFC Coach of the Year by the Committee of 101.

Haley joined the Chiefs after a two-year stint as Arizona's offensive coordinator (2007-08), helping the Cardinals reach Super Bowl XLIII as the club won its first division title since '75. He has made playoff appearances with five different NFL teams. He served as passing game coordinator/WRs coach under Bill Parcells with Dallas (2004-06) after beginning his career under Parcells with the N.Y. Jets ('97-00). He also served as WRs coach with Chicago (2001-03). Born on Feb. 28, 1967, Haley grew up in Upper St. Clair, Pa. He is the son of long-time NFL personnel executive Dick Haley, who helped build the Steelers Super Bowl teams of the '70s. He was a '91 graduate of the University of North Florida.

NFL HEAD COACHES WITH PLAYING FATHERS

Kansas City Head Coach Todd Haley and New England Head Coach Bill Belichick both had fathers who played in the NFL. Only five NFL head coaches hold the distinction of having fathers who contributed to the NFL as a player. Haley's father, Dick Haley, was a halfback with Washington ('59-60), Minnesota ('61) and Pittsburgh ('61-64) before working in player personnel with the Steelers. In the meantime, Belichick's father, Steve, was a fullback with Detroit ('41). He coached 33 years at the Naval Academy.

PATRIOTS HEAD COACH - BILL BELICHICK



Bill Belichick is in his 37th season as a coach in the National Football League. He was named the 12th head coach in Patriots history on Jan. 27, 2000 and has led the club to a 132-53 (.714) regular season record. New England has advanced to four Super Bowls, claiming wins in Super Bowls XXXVVI, XXXVIII and XXXIX. Overall, the Patriots have won four conference titles, eight division championships and 14 playoff games under the direction of Belichick.

Prior to joining the Patriots, Belichick served as the assistant head coach/secondary for three seasons with the N.Y. Jets ('97-99). In his first stint with New England, he was the assistant head coach/secondary ('96). Belichick spent five years as the head coach of the Cleveland Browns ('91-95).

The Nashville, Tenn. native was a 12-year assistant coach with the N.Y. Giants ('79-90) where he served in a variety of roles. He began his tenure as a special teams coach before rising to defensive coordinator his last six years ('85-90). During his tenure, the Giants won a pair of Super Bowl Championships.

Belichick spent one season with Denver ('78) after two campaigns with Detroit ('76-77). He began his coaching career with the Baltimore Colts ('75).

He was a letterwinner in football, lacrosse and squash at Wesleyan University where he was inducted in the school's Athletics Hall of Fame in 2008.

WINNING THE SECOND HALF

The second half of games has been key to the Chiefs success in 2011. During its four-game winning streak, Kansas City came out of the halftime break having made the proper adjustments. In its last six contests, the team has out-scored its opponents by a 61-51 mark in the second half of games. Scoring is not the only improvement the club has made. Here is a look at some other improvements.

FIRST QUARTER VS. SECOND QUARTER

Kansas City's special teams units have been vital in controlling the field position game for the club. Led by CB Javier Arenas, the Chiefs rank fourth in the NFL with a 13.7-yard punt return average. The Chiefs cornerback currently paces the AFC and is third in the NFL with a 14.1-yard punt return average. Only Chicago WR Devin Hester (20.1) and Arizona CB Patrick Peterson (17.6) have a higher average. Both of those players have returned multiple punts for touchdowns. New England is holding its opponents to a 5.9-yard return average on punts to rank second in the NFL behind only Chicago (3.5). The Patriots have only allowed 94 return yards and have forced eight fair catches.

The Chiefs kickoff coverage unit has been equally effective for the club. Kansas City has only allowed opponents to average 18.0-yards per kickoff return on the season. That average is the best mark in the NFL. Opponents have an average starting position of the 21.4-yard line after kickoffs to rank 13th in the NFL. New England has a 20.8-yard kickoff return average in 2011, standing 30th in the NFL. Only Buffalo (19.7) and Indianapolis (18.0) have a lower average.

2011 KANSAS CITY CHIEFS

Kansas City is 4-5 on the season and is in second place in the AFC West, one game behind Oakland. QB Matt Cassel has completed 160 of 269 passes (59.5%) for 1,713 yards with 10 TDs and nine INTs, good for a 76.6 passer rating. He is 10th in the AFC with a 59.5 comp. pct. RB Jackie Battle has 87 carries for a team-high 403 yards while RB Dexter McCluster has 291 rushing yards. RB Thomas Jones has added 204 yards. WR Dwayne Bowe has 41 receptions for a team-high 663 yards (16.2 avg.) with four TDs. WR Steve Breaston has 33 catches for 483 yards with a pair of scores. Jonathan Baldwin, Keary Colbert, Terrance Copper and Jerheme Urban also work at the wide receiver position. TE Anthony Becht, TE Leonard Pope and TE Jake O'Connell are the club's tight ends. C Casey Wiegmann, G Ryan Lilja, G Jon Asamoah, T Branden Albert and T Barry Richardson form the Chiefs starting offensive line.

DE Glenn Dorsey, DL Kelly Gregg and DE Tyson Jackson man the trenches for the defense. LB Derrick Johnson has tallied a team-high 94 tackles while LB Jovan Belcher has 70 stops. LB Tamba Hali has produced 6.0 QB takedowns, tying for fourth in the AFC. LB Justin Houston and LB Andy Studebaker man the other outside linebacker position. CB Brandon Flowers has a team-high four interceptions to tie for fifth in the NFL. He returned one for a TD at Oakland (10/23). CB Brandon Carr has two INTs. CB Javier Arenas works as the club's nickel back. S Kendrick Lewis, who opens at free safety, returned an INT for a TD at Oakland (10/23). S Jon McGraw, S Sabby Piscitelli and S/CB Donald Washington see action at the other safety spot. McGraw has two INTs in 2011.

P Dustin Colquitt handles the punting duties for the seventh-consecutive season, ranking first in club history in gross average (44.40), net average (38.91) and punts inside the 20 (192). K Ryan Succop had a game-winning 30-yard FG vs. San Diego (10/31). LS Thomas Gafford is the long snapper. Arenas is third in the NFL with a 15.1-yard punt return avg. McCluster has 16 kickoff returns.

2011 NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS

Head Coach Bill Belichick is in his 37th season as an NFL coach and his 12th as the head coach in New England. The Patriots are currently 6-3 and leading the AFC East after a 37-16 victory at the N.Y. Jets (11/13). All-Pro QB Tom Brady has completed 238 of 360 passes for 3,032 yards and 23 TDs with 10 INTs for a 102.0 rating. Brady ranks second in the NFL in completions, yards, TD passes and QB rating. RB BenJarvus Green-Ellis leads the rushing attack with 116 carries for 460 yards (4.0 avg.) with five TDs. RB Stevan Ridley has added 194 rushing yards on 36 carries (5.4 avg.) with a TD. RB Danny Woodhead has rushed 44 times for 186 yards (4.2 avg.). WR Wes Welker leads the NFL with 72 receptions and 1,006 yards with six TDs. He is averaging 111.8 receiving yards per game. WR Deion Branch has caught 37 passes for 484 yards (13.1 avg.) and four TDs. TE Rob Gronkowski has added 52 catches for 709 yards and eight TDs, the second-highest total in the NFL. TE Aaron Hernandez has 37 receptions for 374 yards (10.1 avg.) with five TDs.

CB Devin McCourty leads the New England defense in tackles. S Patrick Chung and LB Brandon Spikes are very active. DE Andre Carter is tied for fourth in the NFL with 9.0 sacks (-65.0 yards), including 4.5 sacks (-33.5 yards) at the N.Y. Jets (11/13). DE Mark Anderson has added 5.0 sacks (-32.5 yards). CB Kyle Arrington is tied for the NFL-lead with five INTs. DT Vince Wilfork has two INTs and LB Rob Ninkovich has picked off two passes, including one for a TD at the N.Y. Jets (11/13).

K Stephen Gostkowski has converted 16 of 19 (84.2 pct.) field goal attempts with a long of 50 yards. He has made all 29 PATs for a total of 77 points. P Zoltan Mesko has punted 31 times for 1,405 yards and has placed 11 inside the 20-yard line to go along with two touchbacks. WR Julian Edelman has returned 15 punts for 138 yards (9.2 avg.). Edelman, Woodhead and Ridley all have at least seven kickoff returns.

GROUND GAME

Kansas City is averaging 124.4 rushing yards per game in 2011. That mark ranks fifth in the AFC and 10th in the NFL so far this season. On the road, the club is averaging 141.3 rushing ypg in 2011, standing fourth in the AFC and fifth in the NFL. In its last two road games, Kansas City has tallied 166.5 rushing ypg. The Chiefs recorded 194 rushing yards at Indianapolis (10/9) and 139 yards at Oakland (10/23). The Chiefs have produced 135 or more rushing yards in three of its first four road games. Kansas City had a season-high 39 rushing attempts for 139 yards (3.6 avg.) with two touchdowns in its last road game at Oakland (10/23).

The New England defense is fifth in the AFC and ninth in the NFL by limiting its opponents to 103.1 rushing ypg. The Patriots are even better at home by holding their opponents to 95.8 yards on the ground, ranking 12th in the NFL. In its three wins at home, the Patriots have not allowed a team to top the 100-yard plateau. New England allowed 111 rushing yards on 29 carries vs. the N.Y. Giants (11/6) in a 24-20 loss, its first regular season home loss in 20 games.

Meanwhile, the Patriots offense is only producing 105.9 rushing ypg to rank 19th in the NFL. In its first four home contests, New England has averaged 113.3 ypg, including topping the 100-yard barrier the last three games at Gillette Stadium. Kansas City is 26th in the NFL by allowing 134.0 rushing yards per game. The Chiefs defense has held their opponents to 109.8 ypg on the ground to tie for 11th in the AFC.

CHIEFS ON MONDAY NIGHT FOOTBALL

Kansas City plays its second Monday Night Football game of the season when the club travels to New England this week for a matchup with the Patriots. It marks the first time the Chiefs have made two appearances on Monday Night Football since the 2004 season. In that campaign, Kansas City won 27-24 at Baltimore (10/4/04) before falling 27-19 vs. New England (11/22/04). Kansas City is 0-2 all-time against the Patriots on Monday Night Football. The Chiefs posted a 23-20 victory in overtime vs. San Diego (10/31) in its first Monday Night Football game of the season. K Ryan Succop hit a 30-yard game-winning field goal after the defense held the San Diego offense on the first possession of the extra period.

The second-ever regular season telecast of ABC's Monday Night Football featured the defending Super Bowl Champion Kansas City Chiefs at Baltimore (9/8/70). The Chiefs posted a 44-24 win as QB Len Dawson threw four touchdown passes. Kansas City forced seven turnovers, including three by S Johnny Robinson and two by CB Emmitt Thomas, the Chiefs current defensive backs coach.

CHIEFS COACHES ON MONDAY NIGHT FOOTBALL

Head Coach Todd Haley became the third head coach in Chiefs history to win in his initial Monday Night Football contest with the club when the Chiefs defeated San Diego (9/13/10). Only Haley, Hank Stram and Dick Vermeil have won their first two Monday Night Football games with Kansas City. Stram is the only head coach in club history to win his first three games on Monday Night Football. During his 15-year tenure as an NFL coach with the N.Y. Jets, Chicago, Dallas, Arizona and Kansas City, Haley's teams have compiled a 12-9 record on Monday Night Football. The Patriots are 13-5 on MNF under Bill Belichick, including winning nine of their last 10 contests. New England is 5-1 at home on Monday Night Football since 2000.

MOVING THE BALL THROUGH THE AIR

New England is allowing 308.9 passing yards per game to rank 32nd in the NFL. Teams have attempted 363 passes against the Patriots defense, the fourth-highest total in the NFL this season. Only Chicago (390), New Orleans (381) and San Francisco (363) have had more attempted on them. The seven clubs that have allowed the most pass attempts are all either first or second in their divisions. The Patriots have allowed six of their nine opponents to each produce 300 or more net passing yards. New England allowed a season-high 390 net passing yards vs. Miami (9/12/11).

Kansas City is averaging 182.2 passing yards per game to rank 28th in the NFL. The club's 59.8 completion percentage stands 17th in the NFL. QB Matt Cassel has attempted 73 consecutive passes without an interception dating back to a game vs. San Diego (10/31). It marks the second time this season Cassel has not thrown an INT in two consecutive games.

The Chiefs defense is allowing 230.3 net passing yards per game through their first nine games. That mark ranks 16th in the NFL. Kansas City held Denver to eight passing attempts in its last contest, the lowest single-game mark in team history. The Broncos two completions in that game tied for the second-lowest single-game total in club annals.

TURNOVER DIFFERENTIAL

Dating back to 2009, Kansas City is 10-8 when producing a positive turnover differential. The Chiefs are 5-5 away from Arrowhead Stadium over that same timeframe when positive in the turnover column. In 2011, Kansas City is 2-1 overall with a positive turnover margin and 1-1 on the road. In the last three meetings between the two clubs in New England, the Patriots are +3 in the turnover column. The Chiefs have committed seven giveaways while only taking the ball away four times.

New England is 5-7 when negative in the turnover column dating back to 2009. The club is 2-2 in 2011 when negative. In contests with a positive turnover margin, the Patriots are 22-2 dating back to 2009, including 3-1 this season. Since Gillette Stadium opened in 2002, the Patriots are 45-1 when positive in the turnover column. The club has won 43 consecutive home games with a positive turnover margin dating back to a game vs. Minnesota (11/24/02). The Patriots only setback with a positive turnover margin at Gillette Stadium was a 24-16 loss vs. Denver (10/27/02). New England finished the day +2 in the turnover column.

PROTECTING THE FOOTBALL

Kansas City has not turned the ball over in two straight contests, the second time the club has accomplished that feat this season. The Chiefs are 2-2 in those games. Kansas City is one of four teams in the NFL to not commit a turnover in at least four contests in 2011, joining Cincinnati (4), Houston (5) and New England (4). Under Head Coach Todd Haley, the Chiefs are 7-7 when not committing a turnover. The Kansas City quarterbacks have only thrown nine interceptions on the year, tying for the 14th-fewest in the NFL. The Chiefs have forced their opponents to turn the ball over 15 times. Those 15 takeaways are tied for the 12th most in the NFL this season. Kansas City has had a takeaway in six of its nine contests in 2011.

The Chiefs have been opportunistic against opposing quarterbacks this year. The club has 13 interceptions, tying for fourth in the NFL. Only Green Bay (17), Buffalo (15) and Houston (14) have more so far. Kansas City had a league-high six interceptions at Oakland (10/23). New England is tied for eighth in the NFL by picking off opposing QBs 12 times so far in 2011. The Patriots have thrown 10 interceptions, tying for the ninth most in the league. QB Tom Brady has thrown an interception in five of the nine contests this season. A year ago, he did not throw an interception in an NFL-record 11 consecutive starts. CB Brandon Flowers is tied for third in the AFC and fifth in the NFL with four interceptions. New England CB Kyle Arrington is tied for the NFL lead with five interceptions.

The Chiefs are 18th in the NFL with a -1 turnover differential (15 takes/16 gives). Over its last six games, Kansas City is +5 in the turnover column (11 takes/6 gives). New England has a +3 turnover differential (17 takes/14 gives), tying for 10th in the NFL.

It was a game where both starting quarterbacks suffered game-ending injuries, the defenses seemed in more control of the outcome than the offenses and where New England was able to score one more touchdown than the Chiefs. Ultimately, that was the difference as the Patriots grabbed a 17-10 victory at Gillette Stadium.

In the first quarter, the Chiefs defense was very active, forcing a pair of New England fumbles. The Patriots won the opening coin toss and QB Tom Brady drove them five plays before the Chiefs defense stopped them on a third down and New England was forced to punt. CB Brandon Flowers ran into P Chris Hanson and the five-yard penalty gave the Patriots a first down.

But three plays later, WR Wes Welker caught a pass and the ball was punched out by CB Patrick Surtain, recovered by S Jarrad Page and the Chiefs had possession at their own 40-yard line. On their next offensive series, the Patriots were moving the ball when Brady completed a pass to WR Randy Moss. The ball came loose and was recovered by CB Brandon Carr. New England suffered an even bigger loss as Brady was hit on the left knee by blitzing S Bernard Pollard.

When the Patriots offense came back on the field, they were directed by fourth-year QB Matt Cassel. Two runs by RB Sammy Morris produced a one-yard loss as the Chiefs had the Patriots backed up, but then on third down from their own one-yard line, Cassel hit Moss for a 51-yard gain to get New England out of a field position hole as the first quarter ended.

Later in that possession, on a third down-and-eight play at the Chiefs 10-yard line, Cassel found Moss at the back of the end zone as he caught his 125th career TD pass for a 7-0 lead. Late in the second quarter, the Chiefs got a drive going, as they converted a trio of third down plays. The big play in the possession was a 20-yard completion from QB Brodie Croyle to TE Tony Gonzalez. But the drive bogged down and K Nick Novak nailed a 40-yard FG for a 7-3 at halftime score.

Chiefs QB Brodie Croyle suffered a right shoulder injury on the first drive of the second half when he was sacked by LB Adalius Thomas and did not return to the game. The Patriots then took over at their own 20-yard line and marched 80 yards in 11 plays, using 6:14 of the third-quarter clock. A five-yard run by RB Sammy Morris gave New England a 14-3 lead.

The Chiefs offense came back on the field with QB Damon Huard under center and moved down the field in their best possession of the game, going 10 plays and 63 yards and finishing up with a Huard to WR Dwayne Bowe 13-yard TD pass to make the score 14-10.

A 37-yard FG by K Stephen Gostkowski capped a 10-play, 34-yard drive and gave the Patriots a seven-point lead with less than 2:30 to play. The Chiefs took over at their own 22-yard line and hit their biggest play of the game, as Huard connected with WR DevarD Darling for 68 yards. Darling was tackled on the New England five-yard line. The Chiefs had four plays to score, but three Huard passes fell incomplete and a Johnson run went for no gain as the Patriots narrowly escaped with a 17-10 victory.

Behind 244 rushing yards, the Denver Broncos defeated the Kansas City Chiefs 17-10 at Arrowhead Stadium. Six Denver ball carriers rushed a total of 55 times on the afternoon and averaged 4.4 yards per carry. QB Tim Tebow threw a touchdown and rushed for another for the Broncos.

After forcing a three-and-out on the game's first possession, Denver took an early 7-0 lead on a seven-yard touchdown run by Tebow to cap an eight-play, 57-yard drive in 4:11. RB Knowshon Moreno had a 24-yard run in which he hurdled a defender to set up the score.

K Matt Prater increased the lead to 10-0 with a 38-yard field goal with 7:46 remaining in the first half. The scoring drive covered 34 yards on eight plays in 4:32.

The 10-point lead would hold up through halftime. Denver had 169 rushing yards in the first half and did not complete a pass. Kansas City was only able to generate 72 total yards through the first two quarters.

Kansas City pulled within three on a one-yard touchdown pass from QB Matt Cassel to FB Le'Ron McClain with 8:10 left in the third quarter. The Chiefs drove 65 yards on eight plays in 3:29. For McClain, it was his first TD reception since 2008.

The big play on the drive was a 34-yard run by RB Jackie Battle, marking the longest rush of the season for the Chiefs. RB Dexter McCluster accounted for 28 yards with two receptions and one carry on the scoring march.

Tebow connected with WR Eric Decker on third-and-10 for a 56-yard touchdown with 6:44 left in the fourth quarter to increase the lead to 17-7. The drive covered 80 yards and eight plays in 5:21. The scoring strike was just the second completion of the day for Tebow.

On the following drive, the Broncos defense held on a fourth down play to force a turnover on downs with 4:56 left in regulation. After the Chiefs got a stop of their own, Denver again held Kansas City on downs deep in their own territory with 3:29 left in the game.

Prater missed a 41-yard field goal with 1:55 left in regulation to give KC the ball back.

QB Tyler Palko entered the game and led an eight-play, 55-yard drive in 1:48 that concluded on a 32-yard field goal by K Ryan Succop with seven seconds left in regulation to pull the Chiefs within seven. Palko completed five of six throws for 47 yards on the drive.

The Broncos recovered the ensuing onside kick and ran out the clock to finish the game.

RB Lance Ball finished with a game-high 96 rushing yards on 30 carries. Moreno gained 52 yards on four carries while Tebow added 43 yards on nine rushes.

Tebow completed just two of eight pass attempts for 69 yards.

Cassel finished 13 of 28 passing for 93 yards. Battle gained 61 yards on nine carries. McCluster finished with a game-best six receptions for 48 yards while WR Steve Breaston added four catches for 33 yards.
