### **Cleveland Browns (2-5) vs. New England Patriots (6-1)**

**DATE:** Sunday, November 7, 2010 **SITE:** Cleveland Browns Stadium

#### THE GAME

The Browns (2-5) return from their bye week with three of their next four games at Cleveland Browns Stadium. Cleveland will host the New England Patriots (6-1) on Sunday, November 7 at 1:00 p.m. The game will be televised by CBS (WOIO-TV 19) and will air on the Browns' Flagship Station, WMMS Radio (100.7 FM), as well as a network of affiliates throughout Ohio.

This will be the Patriots' first trip to Cleveland Browns Stadium since December 5, 2004, when they defeated the Browns, 42-15. The Browns hold an 11-9 advantage in the all-time season series with a 6-4 mark at home.

Browns Head Coach **Eric Mangini** is 3-1 in his career coming off the bye week. Following the bye, Mangini's teams have a combined 20-15 (.572) record over the rest of the season.

Following their bye in Week 9 last season, the Browns improved in nearly every category both offensively and defensively, while committing just eight turnovers, which tied for the third-fewest in the league over that span. Cleveland scored an average of 11.1 more points per contest, 78.2 more total yards per game and 67.1 more rushing yards per game, offensively, while limiting opponents to 39.9 less total yards per game and 52.0 less rushing yards per contest.

Despite a 2-5 record this year, the Browns have made significant improvements on both sides of the ball compared to the first seven games of 2009. This season, the Browns have scored 46 more points and have totaled 466 more total yards than last year at this point. Defensively, Cleveland has surrendered 37 less points and 416 less total yards than a season ago.

To date, the Browns have faced the second-toughest schedule in the NFL as their opponents have combined for a 32-18 (.640) record. The slate doesn't get any easier as the Browns next two opponents sport a combined 11-3 (.786) record, including the Patriots, who own the best record in the NFL at 6-1.

The Browns continue a seven-game stretch where they face some of the best quarterbacks in the league. The combined record of those seven starting quarterbacks is 345-194 (.640), including

this week's quarterback Tom Brady who is 103-31 (.769) as a starter.

Last time out, the Browns improved to 2-5 with a 30-17 victory at New Orleans. The win marked the third consecutive year in which the Browns have knocked off the Super Bowl champion from the previous season.

The Browns recorded a season-high four interceptions, their most since a five interception game against Baltimore in 2001. Linebacker **David Bowens** registered two of the four interceptions, returning both for touchdowns en route to earning AFC Defensive Player of the Week honors. He became just the second Browns player to return two interceptions for touchdowns in a single-game and just the third NFL linebacker to return two interceptions for touchdowns in a single-game since 1970.

Offensively, running back **Peyton Hillis** totaled a game-high 69 rushing yards, including a four-yard touchdown scamper. Hillis' five rushing scores this season are tied for seventh in the league, while his six total touchdowns are tied for ninth in the NFL. He accounted for six rushing first downs against the Saints to increase his season total to 38, the ninth-most in the league. He also completed a 13-yard pass to rookie quarterback **Colt McCoy**, which helped set up a 48-yard field goal.

Special teams played a crucial role in the victory over the Saints. During the game's first punt return, following a three and out by the Saints, wide receiver **Joshua Cribbs** lateraled the ball across the field to defensive back **Eric Wright** who returned it 62 yards to set up the first of three field goals by kicker **Phil Dawson**.

In the second quarter, the Browns went back to their bag of tricks as punter **Reggie Hodges** faked a punt and dashed 68 yards to the Saints nine yard line. The run was the longest in the NFL by a punter since the merger in 1970. Hodges also booted four punts for 168 yards, including two inside the 20 yard line. He had a net average of 42.3 and has recorded a net average of 40.8 or better in each of last five games. Hodges' 40.2 net average on the season is the seventh-best in the NFL. He leads the league with nine punts inside the 10 yard line and is tied for sixth with 14 punts inside the 20 yard line.

## THE COACHES

### CLEVELAND BROWNS - ERIC MANGINI



Eric Mangini was named the 12th full-time head coach in the history of the Cleveland Browns franchise on January 8, 2009. For Mangini, it marked a return to his NFL roots, having kicked off his tenure in the league as a ball boy and an intern in the Browns' public relations department in 1994. His tireless work ethic was just as evident in that first year as it is today, a quality that led then-head coach Bill Belichick to add Mangini to

the team's coaching staff in 1995. In his 15 years of NFL coaching experience, Mangini has been a part of six teams that qualified for the playoffs, including five that captured division crowns and three that came away with the Lombardi Trophy as Super Bowl champions. During his first year at the helm in Cleveland, Mangini displayed a sense of resiliency that rubbed off on his team and led to the Browns winning their final four games of the year. Prior to being hired by the Browns, Mangini was the head coach of the New York Jets (2006-08). In 2006, Mangini took over a team that had gone 4-12 the previous year and guided them to a record of 10-6 and a Wild Card playoff berth. The Jets started with a 5-5 mark before compiling victories in five of their last six contests, including their final three. Prior to joining the Jets, Mangini spent six seasons with the New England Patriots (2000-05). His first five seasons were spent as defensive backs coach (2000-04) before being promoted to defensive coordinator in 2005. Mangini's first coaching opportunity came in 1995 as an assistant on the Browns' staff. Ted Marchibroda retained Mangini when the team moved to Baltimore in 1996 and became the Ravens. Mangini was an assistant coach with the Jets under head coach Bill Parcells from 1997-99.

### NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS - BILL BELICHICK



Bill Belichick is in his 11th season as the head coach of the New England Patriots and is the only head coach in NFL history to win three Super Bowl championships in a four-year span. During his tenure in New England, Belichick has delivered three Super Bowl championships, four conference titles, seven division crowns and 15 playoff victories. In 2007 he became the first coach to guide his team to a 16-0 regular season record.

Now in his 36th season in the NFL, he has more years of NFL experience than any of the other 31 head coaches. He won two Super Bowls as the defensive coordinator of the New York Giants in 1986 and again in 1990 before winning three as the head coach of Patriots. Only George Seifert has won more multiple Super Bowls as a head coach and as an assistant coach. Belichick began his coaching career with the Baltimore Colts in 1975 before coaching with the Detroit Lions, Denver Broncos and New York Giants. Belichick got his first NFL head coaching experience as the Browns head coach (1991-95). Following his time in Cleveland, he coached with the Patriots for one season (1996) and the New York Jets (1997-99), before returning to New England as the Patriots' head coach in 2000.

## ABOUT THE PATRIOTS

The Patriots improved to 6-1 on the season following a 28-18 victory over the Minnesota Vikings last weekend. After a 28-14 Week 2 loss to the Jets, New England has won its last five games. Quarterback Tom Brady is 147 of 225 passing for 1,602 yards with 12 touchdowns and



four interceptions. Running back BenJarvus Green-Ellis leads the club with 371 rushing yards and six rushing touchdowns, while wide receiver Wes Welker has totaled 40 receptions for 319 yards.

### ON DECK

The Browns host the New York Jets on Sunday, November 14, at 1:00 p.m. The Browns hold a 12-7 advantage in the all-time series, including an 8-5 mark at home. The Browns have claimed four of the past five contests against the Jets, including a 24-18 victory at the Meadowlands the last time the two clubs met.

The Cleveland Browns dug themselves an early hole that proved to be too deep to dig out of, falling to the New England Patriots 34-17. After the Browns defense held the Patriots to a field goal with a solid goal line stand on the game's first possession, the Browns offense came up short on their first drive of the afternoon after a tipped ball in the end zone was intercepted by Patriots linebacker Junior Seau. The Browns next drive ended in a similar fashion as a second deflected pass led to another interception and the Patriots first touchdown on the afternoon, giving them a 10-0 lead. The Browns found themselves trailing 20-0 at halftime after a 25-yard field goal by Patriots kicker Stephen Gostkowski and another New England touchdown off of an interception, the Browns' third in the first half. Facing a large halftime deficit, the Browns put up a fight in the second half, outscoring the Patriots 17-14. A 42-yard field goal by Browns kicker Phil Dawson made it 20-3 and was the only scoring in the third quarter. Browns quarterback Derek Anderson connected with wide receiver Tim Carter on a 21-yard touchdown pass early in the fourth quarter, closing the gap to 20-10. The Patriots answered with a 25-yard touchdown pass by quarterback Tom Brady to tight end Benjamin Watson, increasing their lead to 27-10. After each team exchanged punts on their next drives, the Browns forced the Patriots to punt again and ended up with good field position. Starting at the Patriots 35-yard line, Anderson would find running back Jason Wright for a 21-yard gain before hitting tight end Kellen Winslow on a 14-yard touchdown pass to make it 27-17. That would be as close as the Browns would get, as the Patriots would force the Browns into their fourth turnover of the afternoon, a fumble that they would return for a touchdown and a 34-17 lead, ending the scoring for the afternoon.

## CAREER VS. NEW ENGLAND

Below are notable individual players' career numbers against New England:

In his lone career regular season game against New England, quarterback **Jake Delhomme** completed 11 of 26 passes for 154 yards with zero touchdowns and one interception in a win as a member of the Carolina Panthers. During Super Bowl XXXVIII against New England, Delhomme completed 16 of 33 passes for 323 yards with three touchdowns and a 113.6 rating. He completed an 85-yard touchdown pass to Muhsin Muhammad, which is the longest pass completion in Super Bowl history. His three touchdown passes are tied for the sixth-most in a single Super Bowl.

Tight end **Robert Royal** has hauled in eight receptions for 86 yards in seven career games against New England.

Wide receiver **Chansi Stuckey** has totaled nine receptions for 83 yards with one touchdown in three career games against the Patriots.

Linebacker **David Bowens** has registered 4.5 sacks and one forced fumble in 15 career games against New England.

Linebacker **Matt Roth** has forced two fumbles in nine career games against the Patriots. He recorded 1.5 sacks on December 10, 2006, as a member of the Miami Dolphins.

Linebacker **Eric Barton** has forced one fumble and recovered one fumble in nine career contests against New England.

Kicker **Phil Dawson** is 9 of 10 on field goal attempts and 6 of 6 on PATs in six career games against the Patriots.

## INCREASED TE PRODUCTION

In 2009, Browns tight ends Greg Estandia, Michael Gaines, Evan Moore and Robert Royal combined for 32 receptions for 396 yards and two touchdowns. In just seven games, the Browns tight ends have already surpassed that production in 2010. Tight end **Benjamin Watson** leads the team in receptions (30) and receiving yards (336), while tight end **Evan Moore** leads the club with a 22.4 yards per reception average.

**(On the win against New Orleans)-** “I’m just really proud of the guys. What I said to them in the locker room is, ‘You see what’s possible when we play complementary football. When we play together, we win. When we do that, I think anything is possible. We got some big plays from our special teams group. Whether it was the throw back from Josh (Cribbs) to Eric Wright or the keep by Reggie Hodges, I thought that Brad (Seely) did an excellent job with that, not just designing it, but talking about it during the course of the game, as to when he wanted to call it and when we thought we had the looks.”

**(On if the win against New Orleans was the best that his team has played in two years)-** “We’ve faced a lot of challenges. We’ve got a young, rookie quarterback. We have a lot of guys playing that are young. We’ve had some injuries and other different things that we’ve faced. They have a potent offense, many different looks on defense. I think that it was, arguably, our most complete game.”

**(On Scott Fujita against the Saints)-** “I gave him a game ball. I know about that transition going from a team that you’ve invested so much in and helped build something very special like they have in New Orleans and then transitioning to a new team. The thing that I admire about Scott is he’s a great leader and a great person, but he relishes the opportunity to go somewhere else and to build that next program. He did outstanding.”

**(On how the quarterback situation will evolve in the next week)** - “The thing I was most happy with in terms of Colt’s (McCoy) play was he improved in some areas and there were some areas that were, it’s a work in progress, but he was consistent and he was poised again. I thought he made some really good decisions in terms not taking a sack and throwing the ball out of bounds. Those things are things that I think are positives. With the decision as we get Seneca (Wallace) back, and Jake (Delhomme) back, which we may have a chance for one or both against New England, then I’ll just sit down and think about it. I’ll talk to Brian (Daboll), I’ll talk to Mike (Holmgren), I’ll definitely get his input. He’s been through these decisions quite a few times. It’s got to get to the point where it really is a decision as opposed to where we’re at now, where we just got a couple games under our belts.”

**(On what kind of carry over the win against New Orleans could have going forward into the rest of the season)** - “I think it obviously reinforces what we can do when we do things in a consistent fashion, when we play what I like to call ‘Browns football’, when it’s complementary, when we don’t turn the ball over when we have a low amount of penalties. I felt that throughout the course of the season the guys have been consistent, they work hard. They may be frustrated, but they’re not discouraged. To be able to get a win like that at a place that’s as difficult to play at as that is, I think it just reinforces that. If we do things the right way and we execute the plan each week, it doesn’t matter who we’re playing or externally what the perception is of how the game is going to go, we can control the outcome.”

**(On if it is good to have different types of running backs to have a change of pace)-** “I think Peyton (Hillis) can do a lot of different things. He’s been effective on outside runs, he’s been effective on inside runs. To me, it’s not necessarily the pace as much as it is our ability to consistently gain positive yards in the running game, and to use that not only to move the chains, but to wear down the defense, to set a tone, to be able to set up the passing game, in a lot of ways too to force guys down the box to deal with the running game. You like

it when they tackle your running back and they’re going backwards and they’re absorbing blows and that wears on you after a while defensively. Every time you go to tackle that guy you’ve got to make a decision, that decision gets harder later in the game, colder, things like that.”

**(On if we can expect the second half of the season to be a lot more successful)** - “I think our expectations internally are that we are going to be successful every week. I think there were a lot of games that could have easily gone the other way. That’s how it should be, we should all have that approach that each week and we are going to win the game. If your expectation is anything different, then you’re not approaching it the right way. To me, the difference is you can have that expectation, but it’s got to be backed up by work ethic, consistency, executing the game plan, not turning the ball over. It demonstrates what’s possible, but consistency is what you need to make it probable.”

**(On if Scott Fujita has given him what he was looking for when the team signed him)-** “Yes, he’s been outstanding. He is outstanding as a player, very good at the mechanics of it, recognizing the offense, getting the defenses checked, that part. He is really athletic. There are certain tools that are available in different coverages, he uses a lot of them and those have generated some sacks for us. The strip sack against Atlanta, that was really him and Robaire working together that created that opportunity. Those things I liked because he’s taking the defense and is able to push it further, which is great. He’s really good in the (meeting) room, he understands the things that need to be done consistently to win at a high level. His experience in New Orleans, I think that helps. I’m really happy he’s here.”

**(On T.J. Ward)-** “The thing that I really like about T.J. Ward is even if he is unsure about where he is going, he’s going there fast and when he gets there someone is going to get hit. Sometimes you are going to be wrong, but if you are wrong and you’re doing it as quickly as you can and someone gets hit at the end of the play those types of mistakes sometimes actually have a way of working out. It’s when you’re unsure and you sort of get stuck in mud that you have bigger issues. He’s confident. He backs that up with the way that he works. He’s bright and he likes to hit people which I appreciate.”

**(On why he likes the 3-4 defense)-** “There is the first and second down component where I think the main reason I like it is because it is balanced and you have flexibility with which rushes you bring and how you want to cover. Then to take those outside linebackers and be able to bring them into sub downs, I think that adds flexibility because you can switch roles easier. This time I’m rushing, you’re covering, and they’re all guys that are used to covering and rushing as opposed to trying to drop defensive linemen or switch with them it gets a little harder.”

**(On making improvements week to week)-** “One of the things that I talked to the players a lot about, win or lose, you come in and you look at the tape and you draw value from the experience. You draw value from whatever happened and it only has value if you can take that information and apply it to the next time that you play and you stay consistent with the approach. Often times in a post-game analysis, if you win you can gloss over some things that have to be fixed. If you lose, you can harp on some things overly so. It was a good chance for me to go through that process again.”

### **LB David Bowens**

**(On if this team has a run in them like they did at the end of last season)-** “Absolutely. We go in there every week thinking we can win the game. We prepare to win, things just haven’t ended up like that, but we prepare to win every week. We think that if we can take care of ourselves and the intangible things that help us win the game, then we can.”

### **K Phil Dawson**

**(On being a teammate and leader)-** “I have a great amount of respect for my teammates. When it is all said and done, a lot of these field goals people aren’t going to remember, but they will remember how you conducted yourself. That’s always been very important to me. I’ve got a name on the back of my jersey that my dad and grand-dad passed on to me. It is very important that I take that name and pass it on to my kids. So to have the guys, not so much the football aspect, but just to talk about the character, that’s the part that means the most.”

### **WR Mohamed Massaquoi**

**(On what he can improve on going forward into the rest of the season)-** “Looking at this point in the season, I definitely wish that my production would be a little bit better. But I’m going to go back and look at some of the things that I can do to better myself to try to have a bigger second half and try to learn from the little things that didn’t go so right in the first half. Just try to get on the same page with everybody and make sure I can do some things differently to be as productive as possible in the second part of the season.”

### **QB Colt McCoy**

**(On if he wants to finish the season as the starter)-** “You know what, that’s not up to me. I prepare every day like I’m the starter, I have since day one. I want to be the best that I can be for each and every guy in this locker room because our number one goal, no matter who is playing, is to win. That’s what we are here for, that’s what we want to do for Cleveland, for this organization, for everybody. We want to win. If that’s me out there playing, then I’m going to give it 100 percent.”

**(On the difference between learning on the sidelines and actually playing in the game)-** “There’s nothing like learning in the game. It’s so much faster, plays happen, you’re in and out, you’re checking, you’ve got audibles and you can’t take anything back. Those plays happen. I wish we could have a few back and I feel like we would’ve stayed on the field a lot longer, but that’s when you learn. The hardest thing in football for me is to come back and watch the film and critique yourself and coach yourself because

that’s where you truly learn and you truly get better, but it’s really hard to do. The last two weeks, that’s what I’ve been doing. What can I do to help this team? It’s a learning process and those first two games were against very good opponents and I just have got to go out to practice and continue to work, continue to get better, continue to work on timing with the receivers and the sky is the limit. I feel really good.”

**(On what he has learned in the first weeks of the season)-** “I’ve learned so much since I stepped in this locker room. It’s like I said earlier, this wasn’t the scenario that the coaches here wanted. We’ve got tremendous quarterbacks, Jake and Seneca are outstanding. I’ve learned so much from them, I’ve been in the locker room with them, I’ve been in the meetings with them, I’ve been in the meetings with my coach and I’ve taken the same notes they have all year long. I’ve prepared like I’m the starter every week and that’s not going to change this week.”

**(On if he has a better understanding of what he likes to do in this offense)-** “Coach (Brian) Daboll and the offensive coaches did a great job of getting our team prepared with me going out on the field. I feel like so far in the last couple of days, we’ve done some really good preparation and we’ve got a really good game plan. Like I said, we have got to go out there and execute this week. I feel comfortable with what we are doing again and be ready to go out there and play. You’ve got to give credit to my teammates for stepping up and making plays when I was in there and Coach Daboll for calling some good plays. We have just got to continue to improve.”

### **OL Joe Thomas**

**(On if being able to run the ball well will help them succeed)-** “I think so. I think for us, on offense, we want to be able to run the ball. I think if we can successfully kind of grind the ball through four quarters, give our defense a chance to rest and open up some things in the passing game, I think we are going to have more successes than failures.”

**(On what he is looking forward to seeing the rest of the season following the bye week)-** “I’m looking forward to seeing the same type of improvement that we had last year, this year. The first half of the season last year wasn’t very good, and in the second half, we made a significant improvement on offense and all of the different phases. It led us to winning some good games at the end, so hopefully we will get that same type of improvement and we’ll be even better this year than we were last year.”

The Tampa Bay Buccaneers forced three turnovers and overcame an 11-point deficit to defeat the Cleveland Browns in the 2010 season opener. Bucs quarterback Josh Freeman threw for two scores en route to the comeback win. The Browns struck first late in the opening quarter when quarterback Jake Delhomme hit wide receiver Mohamed Massaquoi on a 41-yard touchdown pass. Tampa was able to get on the board in the final minute of the quarter with a 49-yard field goal by kicker Connor Barth that was set up by a 33-yard scramble by Freeman. The Browns used a big 39-yard rush by running back Jerome Harrison to get deep in Tampa territory and then extended their lead with a 10-yard touchdown run by running back Peyton Hillis late in the second quarter. Both teams traded interceptions in the last two minutes of the half, with the second being accompanied by a 64-yard return by Bucs cornerback Ronde Barber that set up a three-yard touchdown pass by Freeman to wide receiver Mike Williams on the very next play. In the fourth, the Bucs were able to take the lead on a 33-yard pass from Freeman to wide receiver Micheal Spurlock on a drive that began in Cleveland territory. Delhomme threw for 227 yards in his Browns debut and the Bucs got their first opening day win since 2005.

# RAVENS 24 BROWNS 17

M&T Bank Stadium, Baltimore, Maryland

Ravens quarterback Joe Flacco connected with wide receiver Anquan Boldin for three scores en route to a 24-17 victory against the Cleveland Browns in AFC North play. The Browns struck first with a 38-yard field goal by kicker Phil Dawson on their first offensive possession. Baltimore responded with an 85-yard after Flacco hit Boldin from eight yards out. The touchdown catch made Boldin the fastest ever to reach 600 career receptions. The Ravens repeated the formula in the second quarter when Flacco and Boldin hooked up for another touchdown from 12 yards out on a 10 play, 93-yard drive. The Browns were able to answer back before the half with an 11 play, 83-yard drive that was capped off with a one-yard run by running back Peyton Hillis. The touchdown was the first scored on the Ravens' defense in 2010. After a scoreless third quarter, the Browns took the lead on the first play in the fourth on a one-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Seneca Wallace to tight end Benjamin Watson that completed a six play, 86-yard drive. Baltimore regained the lead for good on the third touchdown pass from Flacco to Boldin midway through the fourth and stretched the lead when kicker Billy Cundiff hit a field goal from 49 yards out. Hillis finished with 144 yards rushing, becoming the first Browns running back ever to rush for over 100 against the Ravens. Hillis' total was also the most rushing yards Baltimore has given up since 2005.

# BROWNS 23 BENGALS 20

Cleveland Browns Stadium, Cleveland, Ohio

The Cleveland Browns used a powerful running game and big plays on defense to capture their first win of the 2010 season with a 23-20 victory over the Cincinnati Bengals. After kicker Phil Dawson connected on the only score of the first quarter, a 30-yard field goal, tight end Even Moore snagged his first-career touchdown on a 24-yard pass from quarterback Seneca Wallace early in the second, which capped off an 87-yard drive. The Bengals got on the board on the next possession after kicker Mike Nugent hit from 24 yards out. Cincinnati quarterback Carson Palmer connected with wide receiver Terrell Owens for a 78-yard touchdown, the longest of Palmer's career, midway through the second to tie the game at 10-10. Dawson hit a 31-yard field goal to give Cleveland a 13-10 lead as time expired in the second quarter. The Browns scored on their first possession of the second half capped off by a one-yard run by running back Peyton Hillis. On the ensuing Bengals possession, linebacker Scott Fujita sacked Palmer and forced a fumble that was recovered by defensive lineman Kenyon Coleman and led to another Dawson field goal. Cincinnati added two more scores and threatened for a third but a sack by linebacker Matt Roth on third and 13 kept the Bengals out of field goal range. The Browns were able to hold the ball for the final 4:41 powered by the running game as Hillis ran the ball on six consecutive plays, including a 24-yard run to seal the victory. Peyton Hillis totaled 102 rushing yards on 27 carries with one touchdown, marking his second consecutive 100-yard performance and third of his career. Hillis became the first Browns player to record a rushing touchdown in four consecutive games since Greg Pruitt did it in five straight games in 1975.

The Atlanta Falcons rushed for 165 yards and forced three turnovers to secure a 20-10 road victory against the Cleveland Browns. After a scoreless opening quarter, Atlanta got on the board first with a 24-yard Matt Bryant field goal early in the second. Cleveland responded with a touchdown on the ensuing possession when quarterback Seneca Wallace connected with running back Peyton Hillis for a 19-yard pass, giving Hillis a touchdown in each of the first five games of the season. After another Bryant field goal made it 7-6 before the end of the half, Wallace was sacked by defensive end John Abraham and was injured, forcing Jake Delhomme to see his first action since an injury in the season opener four weeks earlier. The Browns forced a turnover on the Falcons' first possession of the second half when linebacker Scott Fujita sacked quarterback Matt Ryan and forced a fumble that was recovered by defensive end Kenyon Coleman, which led to a 19-yard field goal by kicker Phil Dawson to extend the lead to 10-6. The Falcons quickly struck back when Ryan hooked up with wide receiver Roddy White for a 45-yard touchdown pass on the Falcons' next possession to take a 13-10 lead. Atlanta extended its lead to 20-10 late in the fourth when defensive end Kroy Biermann tipped a Delhomme pass to himself for a diving interception which he returned 31 yards for a touchdown, the first of his career. Atlanta running back Michael Turner ran for 140 yards in the game, snapping a streak of six straight games where Cleveland had not allowed a 100-yard rusher. With his third quarter field goal, Dawson tied Hall of Famer Lou Groza for the Browns' franchise record for field goals made at 234.

Steelers quarterback Ben Roethlisberger threw for three touchdowns en route to a 28-10 victory against the Cleveland Browns in AFC North play. With Pittsburgh in the red zone early in the first quarter, Browns rookie defensive back Joe Haden made his first career interception and returned it 62 yards to the Steelers 25-yard line. The interception led to Phil Dawson connecting on a 39-yard field goal, giving him in sole possession of first place on the franchise's career field goals made list with 235, passing Hall of Famer Lou Groza. Pittsburgh was able to take the lead early in the second quarter when wide receiver Mike Wallace caught a 29-yard touchdown strike from Roethlisberger. A battle for field position lasted the remainder of the first half and mostly into the third quarter, until Roethlisberger connected with wide receiver Hines Ward for an eight-yard score to put the Steelers up 14-3. After a muffed punt in the fourth quarter gave Pittsburgh the ball at the Cleveland 13-yard line, running back Rashard Mendenhall was able to punch the ball in on a two-yard touchdown run. The touchdown ended streak of 33 consecutive quarters that the Browns had not allowed a rushing score. Cleveland was able to tack on a touchdown of their own on their next possession after quarterback Colt McCoy found tight end Benjamin Watson for a 12-yard pass, the first of McCoy's career, and cut the lead to 21-10. The Steelers were able to seal the victory when linebacker Lawrence Timmons intercepted McCoy deep in Cleveland territory, with Roethlisberger hooking up with tight end Heath Miller for a 14-yard touchdown pass three plays later. In his NFL debut, McCoy was 22 of 33 passing for 281 yards, the second-most by a Browns rookie in franchise history.

The Browns forced four interceptions, including two returned for touchdowns, to secure a 30-17 road victory over the defending Super Bowl champion New Orleans Saints. After a three and out on the Saints' first possession, wide receiver Joshua Cribbs lateraled the ball on the ensuing punt return to cornerback Eric Wright, who took it 62 yards to the New Orleans 19 yard line, which set up a 23-yard field goal by Phil Dawson. Cleveland extended its lead to 10-0 when running back Peyton Hillis scored on a four-yard scamper, his fifth rushing touchdown of the season. After both teams traded field goals in the second quarter, Browns linebacker David Bowens deflected a pass to himself and took the ball 30 yards for the score, giving the Browns a 20-3 halftime lead. Following a scoreless third quarter, the Saints narrowed the gap to 20-10 after quarterback Drew Brees hit tight end David Thomas for an 11-yard touchdown. Cleveland then extended its lead to 23-10 after Dawson converted his third attempt of the day, this time from 48 yards out. Later in the fourth, the Browns were able to seal up the victory when Bowens took his second interception back 64 yards for a touchdown. New Orleans added another touchdown late in the game to make the final score 30-17. Browns punter Reggie Hodges ran a fake punt for 68 yards in the second quarter, the longest rush by a punter since the AFL-NFL merger in 1970.
