THE COACHES

MIKE TOMLIN was named the 16th head coach in Pittsburgh Steelers history on Jan. 22, 2007. Hired at the age of 34, Tomlin became only the third head coach hired by the Steelers since 1969.

Tomlin became the youngest head coach in NFL history to both coach in and win a Super Bowl when he led the Steelers to a 27-23 victory over the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII. By winning the Super Bowl in only his second season as a head coach, he also became the fastest to win a Super Bowl title in Steelers history.

Tomlin is one of only seven coaches in league history to win a Super Bowl within his first two seasons as an NFL head coach.

Tomlin has compiled a 37-19 record in the regular season during his four-year head coaching career. His .661 winning percentage after three-plus seasons is second-best in team history. By leading the Steelers to a 9-7 record in 2009, Tomlin became only the second Steelers' head coach to post winning records after each of his first three seasons.

The Steelers' offense ranked seventh in the NFL (ninth passing, 19th rushing) and became the first unit in team history to boast a 4,000-yard passer, two 1,000-yard receivers and a 1,000-yard rusher in the same season. Pittsburgh's defense ranked fifth in the NFL (third vs. run, 16th vs. pass) while leading the AFC and finishing one shy of the NFL lead with 47 quarterback sacks.

The Steelers continued to be dominant at Heinz Field under Tomlin in 2009. Pittsburgh finished with a 6-2 home record in 2009 after finishing 7-1 (2007) and 6-2 (2008) at home during Tomlin's first two seasons. Tomlin's 20-5 record and .800 winning percentage at home after three-plus seasons ranks second in Steelers' history.

The Steelers' defense was dominant under Tomlin's guidance in 2008, leading the NFL in total defense (237.2), pass defense (156.9), points per game (13.9), total yards per play (3.9), rushing yards per attempt (3.3), passing yards per attempt (4.7) and third down efficiency (31.4), and finished second in league rushing defense (80.3).

Tomlin became only the second Steelers head coach to win his first three games. During 2007, the Steelers became just the fifth team in NFL history to win their first four home games by at least 20 points.

Tomlin led the Steelers to a 10-6 record in 2007, and became just the second coach in team history to post a winning record, win a division title and earn a playoff berth in his inaugural season.

Tomlin was the NFL's second-youngest head coach in 2007, and he became only the second Steelers coach in team history to win at least 10 games during his first year at the helm. The Steelers posted a 7-1 record at home in 2007 and were 5-1 in the AFC North (3-0 at home).

Tomlin was a three-year starter at wide receiver at William and Mary (1990-94) and finished his career with 101 receptions for 2,046 yards and a school-record 20 TD catches. A first-team All-Yankee Conference selection in 1994, he established a school record with a 20.2 yards-per-catch average.

BILL BELICHICK is in his 35th season as an NFL coach and is the only head coach in NFL history to win three Super Bowl championships in a four-year span. In his nine-plus seasons as Patriots head coach, Belichick has won 122 games - which is already more than any other head coach in NFL history through his first 10 seasons with a team.

STEELERS' LAST GAME

Pittsburgh 27, Cincinnati 21

Monday, Nov. 8 • Cincinnati, Ohio (Paul Brown Stadium)

Pittsburgh Team Notes:

- The Steelers improved to 6-2 on the year for the second straight year.
- The Steelers improved to 48-32 all-time in the regular season against the Bengals.
- Pittsburgh improved to 2-1 against AFC North opponents this year.
- The Steelers improved to 22-18 all-time in the regular season on the road in the series history.
- The Steelers improved to 4-1 on the road this year.
- Pittsburgh won its sixth straight game on Monday Night Football and improved to 39-22 in such games. The Steelers are now 16-17 all-time on the road in Monday Night Football games.
- Pittsburgh improved to 13-4 in primetime regular-season games under Head Coach **Mike Tomlin**.
- Tomlin improved to 6-0 on Monday Night Football, joining only Bill Cowher (Steelers), Tom Flores (Raiders), Steve Mariucci (49ers), George Siefert (49ers) and Don Shula (Colts, Dolphins) to win their first six such games.
- After the Bengals fumbled the opening kickoff, **RB Rashard Mendenhall** gave Pittsburgh a 7-0 lead with his team-leading seventh rushing touchdown of the season.
- **CB William Gay** blocked his first career punt on the Bengals' first possession, which led to a 25-yard field goal by **K Jeff Reed**. Gay's blocked punt was the first by a Steeler since LB Andre Frazier blocked a punt at Washington on Nov. 3, 2008.
- Following a fumble by **WR Hines Ward** in the second quarter, Cincinnati trimmed the lead to 10-7 as QB Carson Palmer hit WR Terrell Owens for a 19-yard touchdown with 8:46 remaining in the first half.
- Ward redeemed himself with an eight-yard touchdown reception from **QB Ben Roethlisberger** late in the first half to give Pittsburgh a 17-7 lead with 2:07 to go in the second quarter. It was Ward's fourth receiving touchdown of the season.
- Reed booted a career-high (tied) 53-yard field goal with five seconds remaining in the first half to put the Steelers ahead 20-7. It tied his career high that he previously kicked on Sept. 21, 2008 at Philadelphia. It also marked his second field goal of 50-plus yards on the year, kicking a 52-yard field goal at Heinz Field in Week 1 against the Atlanta Falcons. Reed had two field goals of at least 50 yards in one season one other time in his career, booting two 51-yard field goals in 2004 (9/26 at Miami and 10/17 at Dallas).
- On the first play of the fourth quarter, **WR Antwaan Randle El** tossed a 39-yard touchdown pass to **WR Mike Wallace** to give Pittsburgh a 27-7 advantage. It was Wallace's team-leading fifth receiving touchdown of the year. It was Randle El's fifth career touchdown pass (third with Pittsburgh).

- On the Bengals' ensuing drive, Palmer again found Owens for a touchdown, this time from 27 yards with 13:12 remaining in the fourth quarter to cut the lead to 27-14.
- Following a Roethlisberger interception on the next drive, RB Cedric Benson scored from one yard out with 9:05 to go in the game to slice the lead to 27-21. On the drive, Pittsburgh was flagged for pass interference at the one-yard line.
- The Steelers defense came up with a defensive stand late in the game in their own red zone to seal the victory.
- Pittsburgh finished with 314 yards of total offense (121 rushing, 193 passing) while Cincinnati had 272 yards of offense (54 rushing, 218 passing).
- The Steelers converted 43 percent (6 of 14) of their third-down attempts.
- Pittsburgh was penalized seven times for 73 yards while the Bengals were flagged three times for 30 yards.
- Pittsburgh had four sacks while giving up just one.
- **QB Charlie Batch (3rd QB), CB Keenan Lewis, RB Jonathan Dwyer, CB Crezdon Butler, OT Tony Hills, OG Ramon Foster, WR Antonio Brown and DE Aaron Smith** were inactive for the Steelers.

Pittsburgh Individual Notes:

QB Ben Roethlisberger

- Finished 17-of-27 for 163 yards with one touchdown and one interception (76.6 passer rating).
- Rushed five times for 13 yards (2.6 avg.), including a long of 12 yards.
- Tossed an eight-yard touchdown pass to WR Hines Ward late in the first half to give Pittsburgh a 17-7 lead.
- Improved to 26-7 as a starter against AFC North teams, including a 12-3 record on the road.
- Improved to 12-2 in his home state of Ohio (7-1 at Cincinnati, 5-1 at Cleveland).
- Improved to 63-27 (.700) in his career, tying for the third-best record by a quarterback in his first 90 starts. Only Tom Brady (67-23) and Ken Stabler (66-23-1) had a better record in their first 90 games and he is tied with Jim McMahon, who also had a 63-27 record in his first 90 games.
- Improved to 8-2 on Monday Night Football.

RB Rashard Mendenhall

- Finished with a game-high 99 yards rushing on 22 carries (4.5 avg.) with one touchdown.
- Scored his team-best seventh rushing touchdown of the season on a one-yard run in the first quarter. His seventh rushing touchdown ties his career best, set in 2009.
- Had a 20-yard run in the first quarter, which led to a 25-yard field goal by K Jeff Reed, and a 22-yard run early in the second quarter.
- Had three receptions for 31 yards (10.3 avg.), including a long of 17 yards.

WR Hines Ward

- Finished with three catches for 10 yards.
- Caught an eight-yard touchdown from QB Ben Roethlisberger late in the first half, his fourth receiving touchdown of the season. It also marked his 15th career touchdown against the Bengals, the most TDs for Ward against any single opponent.
- Has now caught a pass in a team-record 186 consecutive games, which is the third-longest streak in NFL history.

WR Mike Wallace

- Had a career-high 110 yards receiving on five receptions (22.0 avg.) with one touchdown.
- Marked his third career 100-yard receiving game and the second this season (Week 3 at Tampa Bay).

- Hauled in a 39-yard touchdown pass from WR Antwaan Randle El on the first play of the fourth quarter, giving him a team-best five receiving touchdowns on the year.
- Had a 35-yard reception on third down with less than four minutes remaining in the first half.

WR Emmanuel Sanders

- Forced his first career fumble on the opening kickoff.
- Finished with four kickoff returns for 88 yards (22.0 avg.), including a long of 30 yards.

WR Antwaan Randle El

- Tossed his fifth career touchdown pass (third with Pittsburgh) as he found WR Mike Wallace on a 39-yard connection on the first play of the fourth quarter.

LB James Harrison

- Had an eight-yard sack in the third quarter, giving him a team-best seven on the year (45.5 for his career).
- Finished with six tackles, including three tackles for loss, and one sack.

LB LaMarr Woodley

- Posted a six-yard sack in the third quarter.
- Added a 10-yard sack in the fourth quarter, giving him 5.5 on the year and 34.5 for his career.

LB James Farrior

- Posted a seven-yard sack in the third quarter, his first sack of the year and 28th of his career (22.5 with Pittsburgh).
- Finished with a game-high 10 tackles (nine solo) and one sack.

LB Lawrence Timmons

- Posted his second interception of the season (third career) midway through the second quarter.

Pittsburgh owns a 13-7 all-time record against the New England Patriots in the regular season and a 1-3 mark in the postseason...the Steelers are 9-5 at home and 4-2 in New England in the regular season...Pittsburgh is 1-1 against the Patriots at Heinz Field in the regular season...Pittsburgh is 0-2 all-time at Gillette Stadium...Pittsburgh has not won at home in the regular season against the Patriots since a 34-20 victory in 2004...the Steelers snapped the Patriots' NFL-record 18-game regular-season winning streak with that victory in 2004...New England has won six of the past eight games in the series (including postseason), including victories in the 2001 and 2004 AFC Championship games, both in Pittsburgh...Pittsburgh and New England have met four times in the postseason and the Steelers are 1-3 in those games, including a 1-2 record at home...the Steelers defeated the Patriots, 7-6, on Jan. 3, 1998, in the AFC Divisional Playoffs...however, Pittsburgh lost, 24-17, to the Patriots in the AFC Championship Game Jan. 27, 2002, and 41-27 in the 2004 AFC Championship Game.

TEAM NOTES

If You Build It, They Will Come: The Steelers are averaging 64,502 fans in three home games this year, including a season-high 65,168 in Week 6 versus Cleveland. That mark was the fifth-highest attendance total in Heinz Field history, including the postseason.

Last season, the Steelers broke two attendance records at Heinz Field. In their Week 7 victory over the Minnesota Vikings, the Steelers broke the single-game record. The attendance of 65,597 surpassed the old mark of 65,350 set January 18, 2009, during the AFC Championship Game against the Baltimore Ravens.

For the 2009 season, Pittsburgh averaged 63,458 fans (507,882 total) at home games, breaking the old mark of 63,429 (507,434) in 2005.

Pittsburgh has sold out 296 straight games at home, dating back to Nov. 5, 1972 versus Cincinnati.

The Steelers finished the 1979 regular season with an undefeated home record (8-0) and eventually won Super Bowl XIV. The Steelers were also undefeated at home (7-0) in 1972.

Sunday Night Showdown: The Steelers own a 14-15 all-time record in Sunday Night games and this marks the second of two scheduled Sunday Night Football games this season. The Steelers dropped a 20-10 decision in New Orleans on Halloween night.

In The Spotlight: The Steelers are 13-4 in primetime regular-season games under fourth-year head coach **Mike Tomlin**.

The Steelers had won 12 straight games in primetime under Tomlin prior to their Week 12 setback to the Baltimore Ravens in 2009.

Pittsburgh is scheduled to play five primetime games this year. The Steelers played in primetime in Week 8 (at New Orleans) and in Week 9 (at Cincinnati), as well as Week 10 (vs. New England), Week 13 (at Baltimore) and Week 16 (vs. Carolina).

Imposing Their Will: The Steelers are averaging 117.8 rushing yards per game this season, which ranks eighth in the AFC and 12th in the NFL.

The Steelers have outrushed seven of their eight opponents this year, averaging nearly 60 more yards on the ground than their opponents.

Steelers-Patriots Connections: Several Steelers have ties to the Patriots and the New England area.

Turning Up the Heat: Since 1994, the Steelers have led the AFC in sacks five times and the entire NFL twice. Since 2004, the Steelers have the most sacks in the NFL with 285.

The Steelers have 24 sacks in 2010, including a season-high five in Week 6 versus Cleveland. The 24 sacks rank fourth in the AFC and fifth (tied) in the NFL. In 2009, the Steelers finished with 47 sacks, ranking first in the AFC and second in the NFL.

Holding Their Ground: Over the past 10 years, Pittsburgh's defense has been among the best at holding its opponents to the fewest rushing yards in the league. The Steelers have allowed just 466 yards rushing on the year, an average of just 58.3 yards per game. That average ranks first in the NFL.

In 2009, the Steelers gave up 89.9 yards per game on the ground, which was first in the AFC and third in the NFL.

In the past eight seasons, Pittsburgh has allowed an NFL-low nine 100-yard rushers. Baltimore is second with 16.

Additionally, since 1994 the Steelers have led the AFC in rushing defense eight times and the entire NFL three times.

The Steelers have allowed just 412 rushing yards (63.7 avg.) on the year. Pittsburgh snapped RB Chris Johnson's 12-game streak of rushing for over 100 yards as it limited him to 34 yards on 16 carries (2.1 avg.) in the Week 2 victory at Tennessee. The Steelers finished with seven takeaways (four fumbles, three interceptions) against the Titans.

Pittsburgh gave up 295 yards of total offense in its Week 1 overtime victory against the Atlanta Falcons. The Steelers allowed

The Steelers ranked fourth in the AFC and fifth in the NFL in total defense in 2009 by allowing 305.3 yards per game.

Run Stuffers: The Steelers rank first in the league by allowing just 58.3 yards per game. They allowed a season-low 30 yards rushing in Week 8 at New Orleans.

Pittsburgh has allowed only one 100-yard rusher in the past 42 games. RB Ray Rice had 141 yards in Week 16 of 2009 to snap a previous streak of 32 straight games without allowing a 100-yard rusher.

The Steelers have given up 20,134 yards of total offense (6,039 rushing, 14,095 passing) since the beginning of 2006. The total yards allowed ranks first in the NFL during that span, while the rushing yards and passing yards each rank third in the league.

Gimme The Ball: On the year, the Steelers have tallied 21 takeaways, which rank first in the AFC and in the NFL.

Pittsburgh posted seven takeaways in its Week 2 victory at the Tennessee Titans. The seven takeaways are the most by the Steelers since they had seven (four interceptions, three fumbles) on Nov. 9, 1997 against Baltimore.

Against the Titans, **S Troy Polamalu**, **CB Bryant McFadden** and **LB LaMarr Woodley** each had an interception while the Steelers also recovered four fumbles.

The Steelers rank first (tied) in the NFL with a plus-nine (+9) turnover advantage (21 takeaways, 12 giveaways).

Picking Your Poison: The Steelers have 11 interceptions on the year, including a team-best two by **S Troy Polamalu**, **CB Ike Taylor** and **LB Lawrence Timmons**.

The Steelers posted two interceptions (**S Ryan Clark**, Timmons) in their Week 6 victory over the Cleveland Browns.

In Pittsburgh's Week 3 victory at Tampa Bay, **DE Brett Keisel** posted his first career interception and returned it 79 yards for a score. It was the first "pick six" for the Steelers since S Tyrone Carter returned an interception 48 yards for a touchdown on Nov. 9, 2009 at Denver.

On The Road Again: The Steelers had a stretch of three straight road games earlier this year (Weeks 7-9).

Pittsburgh won the first leg of the road trip, defeating the Miami Dolphins 23-22 in Week 7, but fell in Week 8, 20-10, at New Orleans. The Steelers concluded the three-game road trip with a 27-21 victory in Week 9 at Cincinnati on Monday Night Football.

The last time Pittsburgh played three straight regular-season road games was in 1994, playing at the New York Giants (W, 10-6), at Arizona (L, 20-17 in OT) and at the Houston Oilers (W, 12-9 in OT).

Our House: Head Coach **Mike Tomlin** owns a 21-6 regular-season record at Heinz Field in his four seasons in Pittsburgh.

The Steelers are 2-1 at home this season. Last year, the Steelers finished 6-2 at home.

In Control: Head Coach **Mike Tomlin** owns a 15-6 all-time mark against teams in the AFC North.

Tomlin owns an impressive 9-2 record against divisional foes at Heinz Field.

Fast Start: Head Coach **Mike Tomlin** owns a 37-19 overall record in his four seasons as head coach. That record marks the best total by a Steelers' head coach in his first four seasons at the helm.

Few And Far Between: Head Coach **Mike Tomlin** became only the second coach in Steelers' history to post winning records in each of his first three seasons. Tomlin is the only coach in team history to win division titles in each of his first two seasons (2007-08).

In 2007, Tomlin became just the second head coach in team history to post a winning record in his first season with a mark of 10-6.

High Honor Roll: Defensive coordinator **Dick LeBeau** was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in August of this year. LeBeau had an outstanding NFL career, finishing with 62 career interceptions (seventh all-time) and 171 consecutive starts (then-NFL record for a cornerback) with the Detroit Lions.

LeBeau was also inducted into the Ohio State University Hall of Fame in 2009. He played at Ohio State as a cornerback and halfback and was a member of the 1957 national championship team.

INDIVIDUAL OFFENSIVE NOTES

Starting In Style: In his first seven seasons, **QB Ben Roethlisberger** owns a 63-27 (.700) record as a starting quarterback in the regular season. That mark is the second-best record in the NFL among all active quarterbacks.

His 63-27 record after his first 90 starts in the NFL ranks third (tied) in league history for the best record in such starts. Only Tom Brady (67-23) and Ken Stabler (66-23-1) had better records in their first 90 starts in the NFL. Roethlisberger's record is tied with Jim McMahon.

Home Cooking: **QB Ben Roethlisberger** owns a 35-10 (.778) mark in the regular season in his career at Heinz Field, including winning his first eight starts.

At Heinz Field, Roethlisberger is 790-of-1,253 (63.0 pct.) for 10,314 yards with 64 touchdowns and 41 interceptions for a passer rating of 92.3. He has thrown for more than 300 yards seven times and has 20 multi-touchdown games at home (16-4 record in such games).

Roethlisberger has twice posted a perfect passer rating at home, including most recently in Week 9 of 2007 against Baltimore. He also had a perfect passer rating (158.3) against Tennessee in the 2005 season opener and has posted at least a 125.0 passer rating seven times.

The Steelers have scored at least 20 points in 37 of the 45 games at home with Roethlisberger as the starter.

Controlling The North: **QB Ben Roethlisberger** owns a 26-7 (.788) record as a starter against AFC North opponents during his career with the Steelers.

Roethlisberger had won 12 straight games against divisional foes as the starter prior to the Week 3 setback at Cincinnati in 2009, which was the longest streak in the NFL and the longest since Peyton Manning won 12 straight from 2004-06.

In his 33 career games versus division opponents, Roethlisberger has posted a perfect passer rating once (11/5/07 vs. Baltimore) and has recorded a passer rating of over 100.0 a total of 13 times.

300-Yard Plateau: **QB Ben Roethlisberger** has thrown for over 300 yards 13 times in his career, including in Week 7 (302 yards) at Miami of this season. The 13 career 300-yard passing games are a team record.

Roethlisberger threw for over 300 yards in 2009 against Tennessee (363) in Week 1, San Diego (333) in Week 4, Cleveland (417) in Week 6, Kansas City (398) in Week 11 and Green Bay (503) in Week 15.

Roethlisberger's five 300-yard passing games in 2009 broke the team record of four previously held by Tommy Maddox (2003) and Neil O'Donnell (1995).

Comeback Kid: QB Ben Roethlisberger has one fourth quarter/overtime game-winning drive this year after posting three in 2009. He now has 21 in his career in the regular season.

Roethlisberger led the Steelers' from a 22-20 deficit late in the fourth quarter to a 23-22 victory in Week 7 at Miami this year.

A listing of all of Roethlisberger's fourth quarter and overtime game-winning drives entering this season are available on page 255 of the Steelers media guide.

Title Man: QB Ben Roethlisberger has led the Steelers to the AFC Championship Game three times in his first six seasons. He is one of only two active NFL quarterbacks to win multiple Super Bowl titles (Tom Brady).

Roethlisberger joined Roger Staubach, Bernie Kosar, Tom Brady and Donovan McNabb as the only quarterbacks to lead their teams to the conference title game at least three times in their first five seasons as the starting quarterback.

Facing The NFC: With a career record of 63-27 as a starter, **QB Ben Roethlisberger** has posted gaudy numbers no matter the opposition.

During his first six seasons, Roethlisberger has feasted on competition from the NFC. In 24 career regular-season games against NFC opponents, Roethlisberger has posted an 18-6 record while completing 362-of-597 passes (60.6 pct.) for 4,921 yards with 32 touchdowns and 17 interceptions for a passer rating of 93.0.

Roethlisberger's statistics against the NFC are more impressive in games at Heinz Field. In 12 career games against NFC opponents at home, Roethlisberger has an 11-1 mark while completing 173-of-303 passes (57.1 pct.) for 2,521 yards with 16 touchdowns and eight interceptions for a passer rating of 90.9.

Roethlisberger won his first seven starts against NFC teams.

Passing Perfection: QB Ben Roethlisberger has achieved a number of outstanding single-season accomplishments in his six-year career, including achieving a feat three times that is rarely done in the NFL.

Roethlisberger, who set the team's single-season mark for passer rating (104.1) in 2007, has had a perfect passer rating (158.3) three times in his career, tying him with QB Peyton Manning for the most in NFL history (minimum 10 attempts).

Roethlisberger's 38 career 100-plus passer rating games in the regular season rank first in team history, surpassing Terry Bradshaw, who had 31 such games since the passer rating rule was implemented in 1973.

Seasoned Veteran: QB Byron Leftwich owns a 24-25 all-time record as a starting QB, having started 44 games for the Jacksonville Jaguars (2003-06), two for the Atlanta Falcons (2007) and three for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers (2009).

Leftwich played in five games for the Steelers in 2008, but did not start any of those contests. In those five games for Pittsburgh, he was 21-for-36 for 303 passing yards with two touchdowns and no interceptions (104.3 passer rating). Leftwich also had one of his nine career rushing touchdowns as a backup with the Steelers.

For his career, Leftwich has 10,218 career passing yards with 58 touchdowns and 41 interceptions (79.6 passer rating).

Best of the Batch: QB Charlie Batch started two games this year for the Steelers (Weeks 3-4) and went 1-1 in those two starts.

Against the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in Week 3, Batch finished 12-of-17 for 186 yards passing with three touchdowns and two interceptions (106.5 passer rating). He tied a career high with his three touchdown passes.

Batch now has a 23-29 record as a starting quarterback, including a 4-2 record in his nine seasons with Pittsburgh.

In his six career starts with the Steelers, Batch is 77-of-129 (59.7 pct.) for 969 yards with eight touchdowns and six interceptions (84.4 passer rating).

Batch did not start the Week 2 game at Tennessee earlier this year, but he came on in the second quarter and finished the game following a knee injury to starter Dennis Dixon. Batch finished 5-for-11 for 25 yards against the Titans.

Ward Still Has It: WR Hines Ward surpassed 11,000 receiving yards for his career in the 2010 season opener against the Atlanta Falcons. Ward finished with 108 yards receiving on six catches and became the first receiver in team history to post 900 career receptions.

Ward had a season-high 131 yards receiving on seven receptions in the Week 7 victory at Miami. He also added his 81st career receiving touchdown against the Dolphins.

Ward has two 100-yard receiving games this year, giving him a club-record 27 in his career. He had five 100-yard receiving games in 2009 and also posted his club-record sixth 1,000-yard receiving season of his career.

Ward, who is in his 13th year in the league, proved he is still one of the elite wide receivers in the game by closing out the 2009 campaign ranking eighth in the NFL in receptions (95) and ninth (tied) in receiving yards (1,167).

Ward currently ranks third among active wide receivers (12th overall in NFL history) with 925 career receptions. The following is a list the top three active wide receivers with the most career receptions:

Top Dawg: WR Hines Ward leads the Steelers in at least 14 different career receiving categories.

Ward is the team's all-time leader in receiving yards (11,322), receptions (925) and receiving touchdowns (82).

Ward is the only wide receiver in Steelers history to be voted to four Pro Bowls. Ward's 1,167 receiving yards in 2009 made him the first Steelers receiver to reach 1,000 yards six times during his career with the team. No other Steeler has more than three.

Additionally, Ward has 26 career 100-yard receiving games, which is first on the team's all-time list.

In 2002, Ward became the first receiver in Steelers history to catch 100 passes (112) in a season. He also became the first Steelers receiver with three consecutive games with at least 100 yards receiving. His 12 touchdown receptions in 2002 tied him with Louis Lipps (1985) and Buddy Dial (1961) for the highest single-season total in team history.

Ward was selected to the 2002-05 AFC Pro Bowl squads.

Ward became just the fifth player in NFL history to reach 11,000 receiving yards while playing on only one team in their career. Additionally, Ward, who has 925 career receptions, became just the 12th player in NFL history to record 900 receptions and 11,000 yards in a career.

Ward On The Run: WR Hines Ward's versatility makes him a threat to run the football as well as catch a pass.

Ward has 428 career rushing yards to mark the most by a Steelers wide receiver in team history.

Ward scored his first (and only) career rushing touchdown in 2004 against Philadelphia.

Wallace Ready For More: WR Mike Wallace leads all Steelers with 507 receiving yards and five receiving touchdowns. Wallace continues to be one of the NFL's top deep threats, averaging 23.0 yards per catch, after leading the NFL in receiving average as a rookie in 2009.

Only two receivers in NFL/AFL history have led the league in receiving average in their first two seasons, Bill Groman (1960-61) and Wesley Walker (1977-78).

Wallace had a career-high 110 yards receiving in the Steelers' Week 9 victory at the Cincinnati Bengals, marking his third career 100-yard receiving game. He finished with 110 yards on five catches (22.0 avg.) with one touchdown, a 39-yard reception from WR Antwaan Randle El.

Wallace had a 53-yard touchdown catch in the Week 7 victory at the Miami Dolphins and hauled in a 50-yard reception in the Week 6 victory over the Cleveland Browns. He finished with three catches for 90 yards, including a 29-yard touchdown, against the Browns.

Wallace caught a 46-yard touchdown and a 41-yard touchdown from QB Charlie Batch in the Steelers' Week 3 victory at Tampa Bay. He became the first Steelers' receiver to have two 40-plus-yard touchdowns in the same game since Louis Lipps on Dec. 4, 1988 at Houston. Only five times in club history has a receiver had two touchdown catches of at least 40 yards. Wallace finished with three catches for 100 yards and two touchdowns.

Wallace finished with two catches for 62 yards (31.0 avg.) in the Week 1 overtime victory over the Atlanta Falcons. He hauled in a 52-yarder from QB Dennis Dixon in the third quarter. It marked the third-longest catch of his career and the fourth reception of over 50 yards.

During his rookie year, Wallace had 39 catches for 756 yards (19.4 avg.) with six touchdowns. His 19.4 yards per catch average led the NFL. Wallace led all AFC rookies with 756 receiving yards and ranked fourth among all AFC rookies with 39 receptions.

Mendenhall Makes The Most Of It: RB Rashard Mendenhall began the 2010 season in the same fashion he ended the 2009 campaign...in style. He currently ranks fifth in the AFC and seventh in the NFL with 702 yards rushing, and he leads the team with seven touchdowns (all rushing).

Mendenhall has two 100-yard rushing games on the season, including most recently in Week 3 at Tampa Bay. He finished with

143 yards rushing on 19 carries (7.5 avg.) with one touchdown against the Buccaneers.

In Week 4 versus the Baltimore Ravens, Mendenhall posted his second career multi-rushing touchdown game. He finished with 79 yards rushing on 25 carries (3.2 avg.) with two scores.

Mendenhall helped the Steelers' to a 15-9 overtime victory over the Atlanta Falcons in Week 1 as he posted a 50-yard, game-winning touchdown run on Pittsburgh's first offensive play in overtime. The run capped off a 120-yard rushing performance on 22 carries (5.5 avg.).

Mendenhall had a breakout season in 2009 as he posted his first career 1,000-yard rushing season with 1,108 yards on the year.

Miller Time: TE Heath Miller moved into second place on the Steelers' all-time receiving yardage list for tight ends in Week 7 at Miami. He now has 2,964 career receiving yards, trailing only Elbie Nickel (5,133 receiving yards) on the team's all-time list for tight ends.

Miller has 28 career touchdowns, which is second on the team's all-time list for touchdowns by a tight end. Pittsburgh is 19-6 when Miller finds the end zone.

Miller was named an offensive co-captain for the first time in his career this year and plans to piggy-back his 2009 Pro-Bowl season with another impressive year.

In the Week 1 overtime victory over the Atlanta Falcons, Miller finished with four catches for 40 yards (10.0 avg.), including a long of 17 yards.

In 2009, Miller developed into one of the Steelers' most potent offensive weapons as he was first (tied) on the team with six receiving touchdowns.

Miller was third on the team with a career-high 76 catches, which broke the team's single-season record for receptions by a tight end, and had a personal single-season best 789 receiving yards (10.4 avg.) in 2009. In addition, his blocking ability separates him from many "receiving" tight ends.

INDIVIDUAL DEFENSIVE NOTES

Harrison In Charge: LB James Harrison, the 2008 NFL Defensive Player of the Year, has been a terror on opposing quarterbacks since he became the starting outside linebacker for the Steelers in 2007.

Harrison leads the team with seven sacks in 2010. He also has 54 tackles, four forced fumbles and one interception on the year.

Harrison posted two sacks and finished with a game-high (tied) 14 tackles in the Steelers' Week 6 victory over the Cleveland Browns.

Harrison was all over the field in the Week 2 victory at Tennessee. He finished with nine tackles, two sacks, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Additionally, he was a major reason the Steelers snapped RB Chris Johnson's 12-game streak of at least 100 rushing yards as they limited him to just 34 yards on 16 carries (2.1 avg.). Harrison was named AFC Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts against the Titans.

Harrison posted a sack and seven tackles in the Week 1 overtime victory over the Atlanta Falcons. He also drew an offensive holding penalty on the Falcons first (and only) drive of overtime, which forced Atlanta into a long third down and ultimately led to a punt two plays later.

In 2009, Harrison ranked second on the team and ranked 11th (tied) in the NFL with 10 sacks and earned his third straight start in the Pro Bowl.

Harrison has 45.5 sacks in his career, ninth-most in team history. The Steelers are 21-11 when he posts a sack.

Sack Attack: LB James Harrison has seven sacks on the year to lead the team after posting 10 in 2009.

Harrison had a career-high 16 sacks in 2008, breaking the team record for sacks in a season. Mike Merriweather previously held the record since 1984.

Outside Presence: LB James Harrison forced two fumbles in the Week 2 victory at Tennessee, his first two of the 2010 campaign. He has a team-best three forced fumbles on the year.

Harrison had five forced fumbles in 2009 after leading the NFL with seven forced fumbles in 2008, which was tied for the most by a Steeler during the free agency era (1992-2008).

Double Trouble: The Steelers have a tradition of fielding some of the best pass-rushing linebackers in the NFL, and current linebackers **James Harrison** and **LaMarr Woodley** have accounted for two of the top four sack totals by a Steelers' duo in team history.

This year, Harrison (7.0) and Woodley (5.5) have a combined 12.5 sacks. They totaled 23.5 sacks between them (Woodley 13.5, Harrison - 10) in 2009.

In 2008, Harrison and Woodley broke the team's top sack duo record (since 1982) by combining for 27.5 sacks. The 27.5 sacks by Harrison (16) and Woodley (11.5) broke the record (24) previously held by Jason Gildon (13.5) and Joey Porter (10.5) in 2000 and Kevin Greene (14) and Greg Lloyd (10) in 1994.

Bringing The Wood: LB LaMarr Woodley has been a force defensively since he became a starter in 2008. He has 5.5 sacks, one interception, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery this year.

Woodley had two sacks in the Week 9 victory at the Cincinnati Bengals.

Woodley had posted at least a half-sack in 10 straight games, dating from last year to 2010, and had 13.5 sacks during that span (Week 10 of 2009 through Week 2 of this year). That span of 10 straight games broke the team's all-time record of six, previously held by Greg Lloyd in 1994.

In 2009, Woodley had 84 tackles and a career and team-high 13.5 sacks in 2009. He ranked second (tied) in the AFC and third (tied) in the NFL with his 13.5 sacks, and he earned his first trip to the Pro Bowl following the 2009 season.

Woodley owns an NFL record by posting two sacks in each of his four postseason games.

Elite Company: LB LaMarr Woodley has 34.5 sacks in his first four seasons with the Steelers, which ranks as the best start in franchise history for sacks.

Fantastic Farrior: LB James Farrior has 72 tackles, which is second on the team, and has one sack, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery on the year. He posted his first sack of the season in the Week 9 victory at the Cincinnati Bengals.

Farrior posted 11 tackles and helped the Steelers keep the Falcons out of the end zone in a Week 1 overtime victory over Atlanta.

Last year, Farrior led the team with 126 total tackles (89 solo) and had three sacks and one interception in 2009, marking his seventh straight season with 100-plus tackles for the Steelers.

Farrior has 11 career interceptions, including eight with Pittsburgh and three while playing for the New York Jets.

Timmons Time: LB Lawrence Timmons has exploded onto the scene in 2010 as he leads the team with 87 tackles (61 solo) and also had a team-best (tied) two interceptions. Timmons, the Steelers' No. 1 pick in the 2007 NFL Draft, is in his second season as a starter after a solid 2009 campaign.

Timmons posted 14 tackles and finished with two sacks and an interception in the Week 6 victory over the Cleveland Browns. It marked his first interception of the season (2nd of his career).

In the Week 2 victory over Tennessee, Timmons tallied 15 tackles while helping the Steelers snap RB Chris Johnson's streak of 12 straight games with at least 100 rushing yards. Timmons

posted 11 tackles and added a QB pressure in the season-opening victory over the Atlanta Falcons.

Man Of Troy: **SS Troy Polamalu** is back at it again this year making the “splash” plays that puts him among the elite in the NFL.

Polamalu has two interceptions this year to lead the team, including one in each of the first two games. He picked off a pass in the end zone in Week 2 against Tennessee to put an end to a potential scoring drive.

Polamalu now has 22 career interceptions, the most of any active Steelers, and the team is 18-3 when Polamalu has an interception.

In Week 1 versus Atlanta, Polamalu posted the team's lone interception late in the fourth quarter and finished with six tackles to give Pittsburgh the victory. It marked the fourth season opener in the past five years that he has picked off a pass.

In 2009, Polamalu missed 11 games with a knee injury (Weeks 2-5, 11-17) but still led (tied) the team with three interceptions.

Return of BMac: **CB Bryant McFadden** is back with the Steelers after playing one season for the Arizona Cardinals. He has two forced fumbles on the year.

McFadden had his first sack and forced fumble of the year in Week 8 at New Orleans. He tallied his first interception of the season (eight of his career - all with Pittsburgh) in the Week 2 victory over the Tennessee Titans.

In the season opener against the Atlanta Falcons, McFadden posted a team-best 13 tackles (11 solo) with one pass defense.

INDIVIDUAL SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

Chart Topper: **K Jeff Reed** ranks second on the team's all-time list for career field goal percentage.

Reed is 203-of-247 (.822) for his career in the regular season, which is second in team history. Former K Norm Johnson finished his career with the Steelers making 105-of-127 field goal attempts, an .827 career field goal percentage.

Getting His Kicks: **K Jeff Reed** has booted two field goals of at least 50 yards on the season, marking the second year in his career he has accomplished that feat (2004).

Reed booted a career-high-tying 53-yard field goal in the Steelers' Week 9 victory at the Cincinnati Bengals. He booted a Heinz Field-record 52-yard field goal in Week 1 against the Atlanta Falcons.

Reed has 60 points this year, including 14-for-20 in FGs and 18-for-18 in PATs.

Last year, Reed was a perfect 41-for-41 in PATs and was 27-for-31 in field goals in 2009 for a team-high 122 points. It marked his seventh straight year with at least 100 points.

Moving On Up: **K Jeff Reed** ranks second on the team's all-time scoring list with 915 career points.

Reed has 203 field goals (second in team history) and 306 PATs during his eight-year career with the Steelers. He is just the second kicker in team history to boot at least 200 field goals in a career, joining Gary Anderson (309), and just the second player in team history to reach 900 points (Anderson).

Punt And Pin: **P Daniel Sepulveda** ranks third in the AFC and seventh in the NFL with a 46.1 punting average. He also ranks fourth in the conference and sixth in the league with a 39.7 net punting average.

On the year, Sepulveda has downed 11 punts inside the 20-yard line and has a career-best 62-yard punt to his resume this season.

PITTSBURGH — Steelers' QB **Dennis Dixon** threw a 68-yard touchdown strike to rookie **WR Antonio Brown** in the fourth quarter to seal the 23-7 victory over the Detroit Lions in the 2010 preseason opener.

In a game that featured rain delays and a pregame ceremony to honor recent Pro Football Hall of Fame inductee, defensive coordinator **Dick LeBeau**, the Steelers relied on their stout defense and their young talent to propel them to victory.

S Ryan Clark's interception of Lions' QB Matthew Stafford set up the Steelers' first score. **K Jeff Reed** connected from 35 yards out to put the Steelers on the board 3-0. But early in the second quarter, QB Matthew Stafford found WR Calvin Johnson for a two-yard score. It would be the last time the Lions would put up any points.

K Jeff Reed put the Steelers within one (7-6) with a 37-yard field goal. On the next drive, Steelers' **RB Isaac Redman** scored on a one-yard touchdown run, capping off a six-play 75-yard drive. Redman finished with 60 yards on 15 carries.

After a one-hour and 13-minute rain delay, the Lions drove to the Pittsburgh 12-yard line on their opening drive of the second half. However, **CB Anthony Madison** forced a fumble and the Steelers took over from their own seven-yard-line. On the ensuing drive **K Jeff Reed** hit a 32-yard field goal, his third of the game, shortly before the third quarter expired.

K Aaron Pettrey missed a 42-yard field goal midway through the fourth quarter, and the Steelers took over on their own 32-yard-line. On the first play, Dixon found Brown in the middle of the field for a 68-yard score. Dixon was 6-for-7 for 128 yards and one touchdown. He also rushed for 31 yards.

The Steelers gained 286 yards of total offense, but it was their defense that held the Lions in check. The Steelers defense forced two Lions' turnovers and held them to only 79 yards rushing, while limiting the Lions to only 2-for-9 on third-down conversions.

Pittsburgh 24, New York Giants 17

Aug. 21, 2010

New Meadowlands Stadium (76,469)

EAST RUTHERFORD, N.J. — QB **Byron Leftwich** found **WR Mike Wallace** streaking down the middle of the field late in the second quarter for a 68-yard touchdown, and a pair of Steelers' rushing touchdowns in the third quarter sealed the 24-17 victory against the N.Y. Giants at the New Meadowlands Stadium. Pittsburgh improved to 2-0 in the preseason and 12-3 in such games under Head Coach **Mike Tomlin**.

Tempers flared early in the game resulting in two ejections. On the first possession of the game, **CB Ike Taylor** and WR Hakeem Nicks exchanged punches and were immediately ejected from the game. The game would remain scoreless until early in the second quarter when **K Jeff Reed** connected from 26 yards to put the Steelers up 3-0.

The Giants would take a 7-3 lead on RB Ahmad Bradshaw's nine-yard touchdown run midway through the second quarter, but it would be the last time they would lead. The Steelers would go up 10-7 on the 68-yard touchdown pass by Leftwich to Wallace. **CB Joe Burnett's** interception of QB Rhett Bomar put the Steelers in good field position to add to their lead, but the Giants stopped the Steelers on the one-yard line just as the clock expired before halftime.

On the Steelers first possession of the second half, **RB Isaac Redman** capped a nine-play, 78-yard drive with a 12-yard rushing touchdown. **RB Dwayne Wright** scored from two yards out late in the third quarter and the Steelers were up 24-7. The Giants would cut the lead to seven late in the fourth quarter, but the Steelers simply ran the clock out to secure the win.

Despite a slow start in the first quarter, the Steelers racked up 412 yards of total offense. **QB Ben Roethlisberger**, **QB Dennis Dixon** and Leftwich combined for 253 yards passing and one touchdown. Steelers running backs accumulated 161 yards on the ground, and five Steelers had at least 25 yards rushing.

For the second consecutive week the Steelers defense limited their opponent to less than 30 percent on third-down conversions, forced at least one turnover and controlled time of possession.

DENVER — Pittsburgh dropped its first game of the preseason as it fell to the Denver Broncos, 34-17, at INVESCO Field at Mile High, thanks in part to three interceptions thrown by Steelers' quarterbacks, two of which were returned for touchdowns. The Steelers fell to 2-1 in the preseason while the Broncos improved to 1-2.

The Broncos struck first when RB LenDale White scored from two yards out on their opening drive. The Steelers responded when **K Jeff Reed** connected on a 33-yard field goal to cut the lead to 7-3.

QB Dennis Dixon drove the Steelers to the Denver nine-yard line in the second quarter, but was picked off by CB Perrish Cox. On Denver's ensuing drive, K Matt Prater booted a 39-yard field goal to put the Broncos ahead 10-3.

CB William Gay's interception late in the first half put Pittsburgh in position to possibly cut the advantage, but Dixon was picked off by CB Andre Goodman, who returned it 77 yards for a touchdown to give Denver a 17-3 halftime lead.

The Steelers scored early in the fourth quarter on a five-yard touchdown run by **RB Jonathan Dwyer** that cut the lead to 20-10.

QB Tim Tebow tossed a three-yard touchdown pass to WR Eric Decker on the next drive to give the Broncos a 27-10 lead. However, **QB Charlie Batch** found **WR Antonio Brown** for a seven-yard touchdown to trim the lead to 27-17.

After forcing a Denver punt, the Steelers gained possession on their own 23-yard line. However, on the second play, Batch was picked off by CB Syd'Quan Thompson, who returned it 48 yards for a touchdown to seal the victory, 34-17.

The Steelers finished with 355 yards of total offense, including 175 yards on the ground and 180 in the air. Denver tallied 268 yards of offense (128 rushing, 140 passing).

Dwyer led all rushers with 89 yards on 13 carries (6.8 avg.), including a long of 40 yards, and one touchdown. **WR Mike Wallace** had a team-high three receptions for 59 yards (19.7 avg.), including a 47-yarder from **QB Ben Roethlisberger** on the team's first offensive play of the game.

PITTSBURGH — The Pittsburgh Steelers capped off a successful 2010 preseason with a strong defensive victory over the Carolina Panthers 19-3 at Heinz Field. The Steelers finished the preseason with a 3-1 record for the second consecutive year and improved to 13-4 all time in preseason under Coach **Mike Tomlin**.

Both teams got off to a sluggish start in the first quarter as neither team could really do much offensively. The Panthers looked poised to strike first during their opening drive, but K John Kasay hit the crossbar on a 51-yard field goal attempt. Towards the end of the first quarter Steelers **K Jeff Reed** connected from 33 yards to put the Steelers up 3-0.

Midway through the second quarter Steelers' **QB Bryon Leftwich** found **WR Emmanuel Sanders** for an 18-yard gain to put the Steelers at the Carolina 34-yard line. Leftwich injured his knee during the play and would leave the game. **QB Dennis Dixon** came in for Leftwich and threw a 23-yard touchdown pass three plays later to **WR Emmanuel Sanders** to put the Steelers up 10-0. It was Dixon's only series of the game.

K Jeff Reed would add to the lead just before halftime with a 43-yard field goal to put the Steelers up 13-0. Reed would add to his total in the third quarter with a 31-yard field goal and towards the end of the fourth quarter with a 32-yard boot. Reed finished the game a perfect 4-for-4 on field goals and finished the preseason a perfect 9-for-9. Carolina's only score came on Kasay's 51-yard field goal at the beginning of the fourth quarter.

Though the Steelers only managed 105 passing yards as a team, Steelers' running backs racked up 168 yards on the ground. For the second consecutive game **RB Jonathan Dwyer** led the team in rushing and carries. He finished the game with 20 carries for 86 yards, including a long of 36 yards.

After a shaky performance in Denver last week, the Steelers defense responded with a strong showing against the Panthers. The Steelers held Carolina to only 123 yards on offense, had four sacks and held them to only 4-of-16 on third down conversions.

PITTSBURGH — The Steelers won their eighth straight game on Kickoff Weekend with a dramatic 15-9 overtime victory against the Atlanta Falcons at Heinz Field. The eight-game winning streak in season openers is the longest current streak in the NFL.

The Falcons won the coin toss in overtime and elected to receive. After two costly holding penalties the Falcons were forced to punt from their own 14-yard line. The Steelers took over at midfield and on the first play **RB Rashard Mendenhall** broke free for a game-winning 50-yard touchdown run. Mendenhall finished the game with 120 yards on 22 carries and one touchdown, his fourth career 100-yard rushing game.

On the Steelers' opening drive in the first quarter, **QB Dennis Dixon**, making only his second career start, marched the team to the Atlanta 35-yard line. **K Jeff Reed** connected from 52 yards out to put the Steelers up 3-0. It was the longest field goal in Heinz Field history and Reed's second longest of his career.

Neither team moved the ball effectively, exchanging punts for most part of the half. Reed missed a 55-yard field goal with 22 seconds left in the half, which left enough time for Atlanta to strike. Falcons' QB Matt Ryan found WR Eric Weems for 17 yards and WR Roddy White for another seven yards to put the Falcons at the Steelers' 32-yard line. K Matt Bryant connected from 49-yards out just as the halftime clock expired and the game was tied, 3-3.

On the opening drive of the second half, Bryant connected from 39 yards out to put the Falcons up 6-3. Reed would connect on two more field goals, and Bryant added another, and the game was tied, 9-9. The Falcons took over at their own 21-yard line with 1:45 left in the game, but on the first play **S Troy Polamalu** picked off QB Matt Ryan. The Steelers looked like they had the game in hand but Reed's 40-yard field goal attempt went wide right and the game headed into overtime.

WR Hines Ward finished the game with 108 yards receiving on six catches. He became the first Steelers receiver to surpass 11,000 yards receiving, and he broke the record for most 100-yard receiving games in team history (26), passing former WR John Stallworth.

The Steelers' defense held the Falcons to only 58 yards rushing and posted two sacks (**LB LaMarr Woodley**, **LB James Harrison**) and an interception.

NASHVILLE — The Steelers improved to 2-0 on the year with a dominating defensive performance against the Tennessee Titans at LP Field. The Steelers' 19-11 victory was only the second win for the Steelers in 10 tries in the state of Tennessee.

The Steelers wasted no time scoring, using a little trickery to return the opening kickoff for a touchdown. **RB Mewelde Moore** took the ball at the two-yard line and handed it off to rookie **WR Antonio Brown**, who took it 89 yards for the touchdown. In his first career game, Brown became the first Steelers rookie to return a kick for a touchdown since **WR Antwaan Randle El** returned a 99-yard kickoff in 2002.

Two drives later, the Titans marched 39 yards to the Steelers two-yard line before K Rob Bironas connected from 21 yards out and cut the lead 7-3.

The Titans drove to the Steelers' 16-yard line on their next drive, but **S Troy Polamalu** picked off QB Vince Young in the end zone. The interception was the first of four turnovers the Steelers forced in the first half. On the ensuing drive **K Jeff Reed** connected from 36 yards out to put the Steelers up 10-3. RB Chris Johnson's fumble allowed the Steelers to capitalize right before halftime, and Reed connected from 34 yards out to put the Steelers up 13-3.

Neither team scored in the third quarter, and after Young committed his fourth turnover of the game he was pulled for QB Kerry Collins. **CB Bryant McFadden** picked off Collins on his second pass attempt. Reed connected from 25 and 27 yards out in the fourth quarter, his third and fourth field goals of the game and the Steelers were up 19-3.

The Titans made it interesting late in the fourth quarter. Collins found WR Nate Washington for a two-yard touchdown and WR Kenny Britt for the two-point conversion. The Titans recovered their onside kick attempt and were in Steelers' territory, but the defense stopped the Titans at the 41-yard line as time expired.

Though the Steelers couldn't get their offense going, (127 total yards) the defense forced seven turnovers (four fumbles, three interceptions) and held Johnson to only 34 yards rushing. **LB James Harrison** had two sacks, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery.

TAMPA — The Pittsburgh Steelers offense exploded for four first-half touchdowns and never looked back, beating the Tampa Bay Buccaneers 38-13 at Raymond James Stadium. The Steelers improve to 3-0 while Tampa Bay fell to 2-1.

QB Charlie Batch, making his first start since December 30, 2007, was picked off on the Steelers' first drive of the game. On the ensuing drive, K Connor Barth connected from 40 yards to put the Buccaneers up 3-0.

The Steelers would respond on their next drive. Batch found **WR Mike Wallace** deep in the end zone for a 46-yard touchdown. The Buccaneers cut the lead to 7-6 on Barth's 24-yard field goal early in the second quarter, but the Steelers would score the next 31 points.

Midway through the second quarter, the Steelers faced a third-and-six from the Tampa Bay 48-yard line. On that play, Batch scrambled for 24 yards, the longest run of his career, to give the Steelers a key first-down. Two plays later **RB Rashard Mendenhall** scored from three yards out to put the Steelers up 14-6. Mendenhall finished the game with 19 carries for 143 yards and one touchdown.

Batch found Wallace again for a 41-yard touchdown in the second quarter. It was Wallace's second career game with two receiving touchdowns. Wallace finished the game with three catches for 100 yards and two touchdowns.

Just before the half, Batch threw his third touchdown, a nine-yard strike to **WR Hines Ward** to put the Steelers up 28-6. Batch finished the game 12-of-17 for 186 yards, three touchdowns and two interceptions.

K Jeff Reed connected from 24 yards near the end of the third quarter to put the Steelers up 31-6, which were the first points Tampa Bay had allowed in the second-half all season. On the first play of the fourth quarter, **DE Brett Keisel** picked off QB Josh Freeman and returned it 79 yards for a touchdown. It was Keisel's first career interception and first career touchdown in his nine seasons in the NFL.

The Steelers offense tallied more than 200 rushing yards and nearly 400 yards of total offense. The Steelers defense continued its stellar play, holding Tampa Bay to only 74 yards rushing while forcing two turnovers and posting four sacks.

PITTSBURGH — QB Joe Flacco found WR T.J. Houshmandzadeh for an 18-yard touchdown pass with 36 seconds left in the game to beat the Pittsburgh Steelers 17-14 at Heinz Field. The Steelers fell to 3-1 heading into their bye week, while the Ravens improved to 3-1 with the victory.

A missed 46-yard field goal by K Billy Cundiff set up the Steelers first score in the game. **QB Charlie Batch** led the Steelers on a seven-play, 52-yard drive that was capped off by a one-yard touchdown run by **RB Rashard Mendenhall**.

The Ravens marched 78 yards on eight plays on their first drive of the second quarter. RB Willis McGahee scored from nine yards out to tie the game at 7-7. The Ravens capitalized on the Steelers offensive struggles and took a 10-7 halftime lead on Cundiff's 36-yard field goal as time expired.

The Steelers defense turned up the heat in the third quarter forcing two turnovers. **LB James Harrison** forced a McGahee fumble that put the Steelers at the Raven's 27-yard line. But Batch was sacked for a seven-yard loss on third down, and **K Jeff Reed's** 49-yard field goal attempt hit the right crossbar.

Near the end of the third quarter **CB Ike Taylor** picked off Flacco, and the Steelers took over at the Baltimore 33-yard line. The Steelers though could not move the ball and Reed's 45-yard field goal try went wide left.

PITTSBURGH — In his first game back since serving his four-game suspension, **QB Ben Roethlisberger** threw three touchdown passes to beat the Cleveland Browns, 28-10, at Heinz Field. The Steelers improved to 4-1 on the season, while the Browns fell to 1-5.

On the Browns opening drive of the game, rookie QB Colt McCoy drove to the Steelers 45-yard line. After being sacked by **LB LaMarr Woodley**, McCoy was intercepted by **S Ryan Clark** on the next play. The Steelers took over and marched to the Cleveland 14-yard line. Rookie CB Joe Haden though picked off Roethlisberger and returned it 62 yards to set up the Browns first score. K Phil Dawson connected from 39 yards and the Browns led 3-0.

The Steelers though would respond on their ensuing drive. Roethlisberger led the offense on an 11-play, 81-yard drive that was capped off by a 29-yard touchdown pass to **WR Mike Wallace**. The Steelers would take that 7-3 lead into halftime.

Clinging to their slim lead midway through the third quarter, the Steelers took over at their own four-yard line. Five plays later, the Steelers grabbed a 14-3 lead on an eight-yard touchdown pass from Roethlisberger to **WR Hines Ward**. On the drive Roethlisberger found Wallace for a 50-yarder and **TE Heath Miller** for 36 yards.

WR Chansi Stuckey's muffed punt set the Steelers up at the Cleveland 13-yard line midway through the fourth quarter. **RB Rashard Mendenhall** scored from two yards out and the Steelers increased their lead 21-3. But the Browns responded quickly on their next drive. McCoy found TE Benjamin Watson for a 12-yard touchdown, and the Browns cut the lead 21-10.

The Steelers recovered Cleveland's onside-kick attempt but went three-and-out, and were forced to punt. Colt McCoy though was picked off by **LB Lawrence Timmons** and he returned it to the Cleveland 18-yard line. Timmons finished the game with two sacks and an interception. Three plays later Roethlisberger found Miller for a 14-yard touchdown, his first of the season.

The Steelers defense continued its stellar play. It had six sacks, two interceptions and one forced fumble. The offense had its best showing thus far in the 2010 season, finishing with a season-high in total yards (378) and passing yards (257). MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. — **K Jeff Reed's** 18-yard field goal with 2:26 left in the game sealed the 23-22 victory for the Steelers against the Miami Dolphins at Sun Life Stadium. With the win the Steelers improved to 5-1, including 3-0 on the road. The Dolphins fell to 3-3.

The Steelers got off to a shaky start fumbling the ball twice on their first two possessions. **WR Emmanuel Sanders** was stripped on the opening kickoff and the Dolphins took over at the Steelers' 22-yard line. K Dan Carpenter connected from 39 yards out and the Dolphins led 3-0. On the Steelers' ensuing drive **QB Ben Roethlisberger** fumbled as he was being sacked and the Dolphins took over at the Pittsburgh 13-yard line. Carpenter would connect from 23 yards out and the Dolphins led 6-0.

The Steelers' offense would settle down and finally got on the board early in the second quarter. Reed's 22-yard field goal cut the lead 6-3, and on the Dolphins' next drive **LB James Farrior** recovered a Dolphins' fumble to set the Steelers up in Miami territory. A few plays later, Roethlisberger found **WR Hines Ward** for a 21-yard touchdown to put the Steelers up 10-6. Ward finished with seven catches for a game-high 131 yards and one touchdown.

NEW ORLEANS — QB Drew Brees' eight-yard touchdown toss to WR Lance Moore with 2:37 left in the fourth quarter sealed the 20-10 victory for the New Orleans Saints over the Steelers at the Louisiana Superdome. Steelers fell to 5-2 on the season with the loss, while the Saints improved to 5-3.

Both teams struggled moving the football as neither one scored in the first quarter. **K Jeff Reed** got the Steelers on the board early in the second quarter connecting from 19-yards out for a 3-0 lead. The Saints though would tie the game 3-3 with only eight seconds left before halftime on K Garrett Hartley's 31-yard field goal.

On the Saints' first possession of the second half, Brees led the offense on a 12-play, 51-yard drive that was capped off by Hartley's 23-yard field goal that increased their lead 6-3. Early in the fourth quarter Brees found WR Marques Colston for a 16-yard touchdown to put the Saints up 13-3. However, on the Steelers' ensuing drive **RB Rashard Mendenhall** found a seam and went 38 yards untouched into the end zone to cut the lead to 13-10. Mendenhall finished the game with 15 carries for 71 yards and one touchdown.

The Saints looked poised to add to their lead on their next drive when Brees found WR Robert Meachem for a 50-yard gain, which set the Saints up at the Steelers' 26-yard line. But two plays later, **CB Bryant McFadden** sacked Brees and forced a fumble that was recovered by **LB LaMarr Woodley**, and the Steelers took over at the Saints' 27-yard line.

The Steelers had the momentum and were marching into Saints' territory, but a costly turnover sealed the Steelers' fate. **QB Ben Roethlisberger** found **TE Heath Miller** for 20-yard gain, but Miller was hit hard and fumbled the football. The Saints then marched 55 yards for the game-clinching touchdown pass by Brees. Brees finished the game 34-of-44 for 305 yards and two touchdowns.

The Steelers' rush defense continued its dominance, allowing a season-low 30 yards rushing. The defense as a whole had two sacks, a forced fumble and an interception. The Steelers' offense though struggled, only having 279 total yards (108 rushing, 195 passing).

CINCINNATI — WR Antwaan Randle El's 39-yard touchdown pass to WR Mike Wallace early in the fourth quarter sealed the Steelers' 27-21 victory over the Cincinnati Bengals at Paul Brown Stadium. With the win the Steelers improved to 6-0 on Monday Night Football under **Mike Tomlin**, and for the second consecutive year the Steelers started their season 6-2. The Bengals fell to 2-6.

LB Jason Worilds' fumble recovery on Cincinnati's opening kickoff set the Steelers up for their first score. **RB Rashard Mendenhall** scored from one-yard out and the Steelers were up 7-0. On the Bengals' ensuing drive, **CB William Gay** blocked a punt to set the Steelers up for their second score. **K Jeff Reed** connected from 25-yards out, and the Steelers increased their lead 10-0.

The Bengals though would strike after a rare fumble by **WR Hines Ward**. QB Carson Palmer found WR Terrell Owens for a 19-yard touchdown pass to cut the lead 10-7. Near the end of the half **LB Lawrence Timmons** picked off Palmer and the Steelers' took over at their own 48-yard line. **QB Ben Roethlisberger** led the offense on a six-play, 52-yard drive that was capped off by an eight-yard touchdown pass to Ward to put the Steelers up 17-7.
