



## **DETROIT'S THANKSGIVING DAY TRADITION**

*It was, legend says, a typically colorful, probably chilly, November day in 1622 that Pilgrims and Native Americans celebrated the new world's bounty with a sumptuous feast.*

*They sat together at Plymouth Plantation (they spelled it Plimouth) in Massachusetts, gave thanks for the goodness set before them, then dined on pumpkin pie, sweet potatoes, maize, cranberry sauce, turkey and who knows what else.*

*Actually, fish was just as predominant a staple. And history books say pumpkin pie really debuted a year later. But regardless of the accuracy of the details, that's how Thanksgiving Day is seen by Americans -- except Detroiters.*

*They may have most of the same images as everyone else, but with a new twist that began in 1934.*

*That's when Detroiters and their outstate Michigan compatriots found themselves at the dawn of an unplanned behavior modification, courtesy of George A. "Dick" Richards, owner of the city's new entry in the National Football League: The Detroit Lions.*

Four generations of Detroiters have been a proud part of the American celebration of Thanksgiving. The relationship between Detroit and Thanksgiving dates back to 1934 when owner G.A. Richards scheduled a holiday contest between his first-year Lions and the Chicago Bears. Some 75 years later, fans throughout the State of Michigan have transformed an annual holiday event into the single greatest tradition in the history of American professional team sports. Indeed, if *football* is America's passion, *Thanksgiving football* is Detroit's passion.

### **DETROIT AND THANKSGIVING DAY**

---

No other team in professional sports can claim to be as much a part of an American holiday as can the Detroit Lions with Thanksgiving. When you think of Thanksgiving, you think of football and the Lions.

The Thanksgiving tradition is older than 24 current NFL franchises, and Detroit's passionate affair with the annual Thanksgiving Day game is evidenced by its growing popularity. Year after year, Detroiters look forward to not only spending Thanksgiving with their families, but they also enjoy sharing that time with the Lions.

The most recent illustration of this love affair has been shown by the support of the thousands of Lions' fans who have flocked to the gates on Thanksgiving Day. With a sell out in this year's game, the Lions have extended their Thanksgiving Day sellout streak to 17 consecutive games (since 1994).

November 25, 2010 will mark the 71st edition of Detroit's Thanksgiving Day tradition, and the passion continues to burn brighter than ever before. The 2010 game will be the ninth played at Ford Field after playing the previous 27 at the Silverdome.

## THE ORIGIN OF THE LIONS' THANKSGIVING DAY GAME

---

The game was the brainchild of **G.A. Richards**, the first owner of the Detroit Lions. Richards had purchased the team in 1934 and moved the club from Portsmouth, Ohio to the Motor City. The Lions were the new kids in town and had taken a backseat to the baseball Tigers. Despite the fact the Lions had lost only one game prior to Thanksgiving in 1934, the season's largest crowd had been just 15,000.

The opponent that day in 1934 was the undefeated, defending World Champion Chicago Bears of **George Halas**. The game would determine the champion of the Western Division. Richards had convinced the NBC Radio Network to carry the game coast-to-coast (94 stations) and additionally, an estimated 26,000 fans jammed into the University of Detroit Stadium while thousands more disappointed fans were turned away.

Despite two **Ace Gutowsky** touchdowns, the Bears won the inaugural game 19-16, but a classic was born. Since 1934, 70 games have been played with the Lions holding a 33-35-2 (.485) record in the series. And each game, in its own way, continues to bring back memories of Thanksgiving, not only to Lions fans, but to football fans across the nation.

## LIONS THANKSGIVING LOGO

---

Detroit's Thanksgiving Day logo commemorates the club's holiday tradition, which dates back to 1934.

"We believe our Thanksgiving Day game is the oldest and greatest tradition in the NFL," said Lions Vice Chairman **Bill Ford, Jr.** "This is a tradition that was started by the fans in Detroit and belongs to the fans in Detroit."

"The Thanksgiving Day game is a family-oriented event that has been enjoyed by Detroiters for many decades. This logo is intended to appeal to our youngest fans while reminding our older fans of the great tradition established generations ago."

The logo features a cartoon lion and turkey sharing a football on a platter. Accompanying the design is the inscription "Lions Football @ Thanksgiving: A Detroit Tradition since 1934." The Lion featured in the logo is based on animated characters utilized by the club in the 1930s and '40s.

## THANKSGIVING DAY THOUGHTS

---

### A compilation of comments on the Detroit Thanksgiving Tradition through the years:

"This game belongs to the fans. It belongs to the fans who grew up in Detroit and no longer live there, but plan their Thanksgivings around the game. It's a 65-year-old tradition. Most of the teams weren't even in existence 65 years ago. It's a big, big tradition in our area, and I think it would be absolutely criminal to lose it."

"The longer it has continued, the more intrinsic the tradition has become, and now you have four generations of people who have made the Thanksgiving tradition a part of their lives. I am really excited about the fact that moving back to the city of Detroit, we will have an opportunity to hook up with the other great Detroit Thanksgiving tradition, which is the Thanksgiving Day parade. We have the opportunity to make it really an incredibly special day for metro Detroiters."

"We started it here in Detroit and it's been a tradition ever since to play a game on Thanksgiving. I don't understand why anybody would complain about it. There's no particular advantage to play that game at home as any other game. It's been a tradition that (the fans in Michigan) want to keep."

--**Glen Presnell**, who passed away in 2004, was the last surviving member from the original Thanksgiving Day classic. Presnell was a back for the Lions from 1934-36.

"This is one thing that has been steady and a lot of people really look forward to it. It's just part of the day to watch the Lions play and, hopefully, watch the Lions win. It wouldn't be right (to take the game way from Detroit). It wouldn't be right to change it. No, that's not going to happen. Now, it is sort of a normal part of life playing on Thanksgiving. It's like it is a normal part of the Thanksgiving tradition. It's like that is what I am supposed to do."

--**Barry Sanders**, inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2004 and Lions' all-time leading rusher.

"Thanksgiving and the Lions are like coming home to me. I have many fond memories of going to Tiger Stadium to watch the Lions. I grew up during the championship years of the '50s and I can remember a cold, cold Thanksgiving in 1956 when my father and my brother, Dennis, watched **Tobin Rote** bring the Packers from behind to beat the Lions. My family was as fine group of Lions' fans as you could find. The first time I ever broadcast a Lions game was when I was doing the Rams' game on Thanksgiving in '67. Yes, coming to Detroit on Thanksgiving is very special to me."

--**Dick Enberg**, A native of Armada, Mich., and a Central Michigan University graduate, Enberg called the play-by-play action during several Thanksgiving Day games for NBC.

"It's such a tradition here in metropolitan Detroit. I think (the Lions) earned it going all the way back to the era with Green Bay when the Packers were favored year after year, and the Lions were always there to give them a tough game. I think the people in Detroit earned the right to still play on Thanksgiving Day. This is the day of the Detroit Lions."

--**Charlie Sanders**, Lions Assistant Director of Pro Personnel and all-pro tight end from 1968-77.

"It's always been great because of the tradition of it. Unfortunately, (certain owners) have tried to dismantle the great tradition that Detroit always had by installing other teams to play the Thanksgiving classic. But thank God for Mr. Tagliabue who said the Lions, as well as the Cowboys, will continue that tradition of Thanksgiving Day play."

--**Lem Barney**, inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1992. Barney was a cornerback for the Lions from 1966-76.

"I feel the Lions' Thanksgiving Day series had a lot to do with the overall popularity growth of professional football through the years. It literally has been a way of life for people in Detroit."

--**Russ Thomas**, played tackle for the Lions from 1946 through 1949 and later served as a coach, scout, Executive Vice President and General Manager for the club. He passed away in 1991.

"The Thanksgiving Day game is always special to the players. I know it's one of 16 games on the schedule, but I can't help but get a little more excited for that game."

--**Doug English**, defensive lineman for the Lions from 1975-79 and 1981-85. He was the Lions' defensive MVP in 1979 and was selected to the Pro Bowl in 1979 and 1982-84.

"There have been a lot of big games at Thanksgiving. That game in '62 (the Lions' 26-14 win over the Packers) sticks in my mind as a great one, the 'Mud Bowl' against the Eagles in '68 and the year we beat the Raiders ('70) when **George Blanda** and that team were pulling out the miracles week-after-week. I particularly recall the 'Mud Bowl' game against the Eagles. The mud was ankle-deep even before the game started and **Sam Baker** (Philadelphia kicker) made sure the ball was covered with mud before the opening kickoff."

--**Wayne Walker**, standout linebacker for the Lions from 1958-72 and previous holder of the Lions' individual record for most seasons played with the club (15).

"It was always Green Bay when I was playing and we always looked forward to the game. It was a short week of practice, then you'd have to gut it up and play on Thursday. Then, after the game, the whole team and coaches and our wives would enjoy the evening together."

--**Jim David**, defensive back for the Lions from 1952-59 who played on three of Detroit's World Championship teams (1952, 1953 and 1957).

"I don't know what it is about the Thanksgiving game. Maybe it's the holiday or that it's on national television, but there's magic in that game for the Lions."

--**Keith Dorney**, played on Detroit's offensive line from 1979-98. He was voted Co-Offensive MVP in 1986 and earned Pro Bowl honors in 1983.

"When I was drafted by the Lions (in '82), one of the first things I thought of was that I would be playing on Thanksgiving Day every year. It's really an honor to be a part of such a great sports tradition and it's the game we all look forward to."

--**Jimmy Williams**, outside linebacker for the Lions from 1982-90. He was the Lions' Defensive MVP in 1985 and 1987.

"When the Lions and Bears meet here Thanksgiving Day they will play before nearly 27,000 persons, the largest crowd ever to witness a football game in University of Detroit Stadium. The crowd would doubtless be much greater but the stadium has already been stretched to the limit with 1,400 additional seats at the ends."

"With a swollen advance sale that has broken all precedents, a capacity crowd of more than 54,000 persons is indicated for the pro football game between the Lions and Cleveland Rams at Briggs Stadium this coming Thursday (Thanksgiving Day) afternoon. The sale practically assures that a new all-time attendance record for a football game in Detroit will be smashed. Thus far, the best turnout was something over 48,000, which saw a game between the Lions and Bears two years ago. The game Thursday will start at 11:00 a.m., renewing an old pre-war custom in which the Bears played here annually at that time on the holiday."

## TURKEY DAY TRIVIA

- The series began with a 19-16 loss to the Chicago Bears on November 29, 1934.
- A total of 70 games have been played with the Lions owning a 33-35-2 record in the annual holiday classic.
- More than 3.9 million fans have witnessed the Lions' 70 Thanksgiving Day games. The total attendance for the first 70 games is 3,922,027, an average of 56,029 fans per Thanksgiving game.
- The Lions have played 23 different teams since the first Thanksgiving Day game. The most common opponent has been the Packers, who the Lions played in 2009 for the 19th time in the Thanksgiving series. Their second most common opponent is the Chicago Bears (15 times).

**Note:** Prior to 1972, a team's winning percentage was calculated using wins and losses, disregarding ties. For example, Detroit's record in the 1960s was 2-6-2 and their winning percentage was .250 (two wins/two wins + six losses). Since 1972, ties have been calculated in winning percentage as a half-a-win.

## THANKSGIVING DAY HIGHLIGHTS

### A look at some of the more memorable Thanksgiving Day contests

#### 1930s

- **1934:** The Bears took a 19-16 win in the series opener. Chicago went on to post a 13-0 record, an NFL mark that stood until the 1972 Dolphins captured 17 straight wins.
- **1935:** The Lions took revenge from '34 by beating the Bears, 14-2, to clinch the Western Division title. Detroit went on to beat New York, 26-7, for the club's first NFL Championship.
- **1938:** Detroit beat the Bears 14-7 to end a streak of five straight Thanksgiving games vs. Chicago. The game also was the last holiday game until 1945 due to the outbreak of World War II.

#### 1940s

- **1945:** Cleveland Rams QB **Bob Waterfield** passed for 329 yards including an NFL-record 303 yards to E **Jim Benton** in a 28-21 Detroit loss.
- **1949:** The Bears whipped the Lions, 28-7, before 24,835 frozen fans. DB **Bob Smith** intercepted a pass and returned it 102 yards for a then-NFL record. It was the Lions' lone score.

#### 1950s

- **1950:** B **Bob Hoernschemeyer** rushed for 198 yards in a 49-14 win over the New York Yanks. Included in his big day was a 96-yard TD run, the longest in club history and the third longest ever recorded in the NFL. The Lions' offense racked up 582 yards of total offense, the most in team history in Detroit's first Thanksgiving Day win since 1938.
- **1951:** The highest scoring Thanksgiving Day game in history was the first of 13 straight Turkey Day appearances in Detroit by the Packers. QB **Bobby Layne** passed for four TDs and B **Jack Christiansen** returned two punts for a TD (89 and 72-yarders) to spark Detroit to a 52-35 victory. B **Bob Hoernschemeyer** also chipped in with an 85-yard touchdown run.
- **1953:** Green Bay led 15-7 at halftime but QB **Bobby Layne** connected with E **Cloyce Box** on a 97-yard TD play (now the third-longest in club history) and the Lions won 34-15 on the way to their second straight NFL crown.
- **1954:** Detroit beat Green Bay, 28-24, extending its streak of consecutive wins over the Packers to 12. It was the second time in five days the Lions defeated Green Bay as the clubs met the previous Sunday with Detroit edging the Packers at Lambeau Field, 21-17. Detroit finished the season 9-2-1 but lost the World Championship to Cleveland, 56-10, in a rematch of the 1953 contest.
- **1956:** A late-game QB **Tobin Rote** TD pass erased the Lions' title hopes in a 24-20 loss to the Packers. It was the first Thanksgiving Day game shown on national television, something now that is taken for granted.

#### 1960s

- **1962:** The famed "grudge match" saw the Lions' "Fearsome Foursome" (DE **Darris McCord**, DT **Alex Karras**, DT **Roger Brown** and DE **Sam Williams**) sacked Packers QB **Bart Starr** 11 times for 110 yards in a 26-14 Detroit destruction of Green Bay. The Packers were 10-0 coming into the game and the Lions' win avenged a 9-7 last-second Green Bay win earlier in the season. It was the only loss of the season for the Packers, who went on to claim the World Championship.
- **1968:** The Lions fell to Philadelphia, 12-0, in the "Mud Bowl" at Tiger Stadium, the lowest scoring game in the series' history.

#### 1970s

- **1970:** The Lions scored 14 fourth quarter points on the way to knocking off the high-flying Oakland Raiders, 28-14. RB **Mel Farr** rushed 21 times for 121 yards propelling Detroit from a 14-0 deficit. It was the Lions' first Thanksgiving Day win since 1962.
- **1974:** In the last Lions game at Tiger Stadium, Detroit lost to Denver, 31-27.
- **1976:** Bills RB **O.J. Simpson** rushed for a then-NFL-record 273 yards but the Lions defeated Buffalo, 27-14.

- **1978:** DT **Doug English** went on a rampage by sacking Denver QB **Craig Morton** four times in a 17-14 Detroit win over the defending AFC Champions.

## 1980s

- **1980:** QB **Vince Evans** scored on the last play of the game, and KR **David Williams** returned the overtime period's opening kickoff for a 95-yard touchdown as Chicago stunned Detroit, 23-17. The game, at the time, was the shortest OT (21 seconds) in NFL history.
- **1983:** RB **Billy Sims** scored two TD's and rushed for 106 yards as the Lions stunned the heavily favored Pittsburgh Steelers, 45-3. The Lions' defense also did their part by picking off five Steelers' passes. It was Detroit's first win over Pittsburgh since 1962.
- **1984:** The Lions came from behind to trim the Packers, 31-28, in Green Bay's first Turkey Day appearance since 1963.
- **1985:** The Lions bombed the playoff-bound New York Jets, 31-20, as QB **Eric Hipple** passed for four touchdowns, including three to WR **Leonard Thompson**. The Lions' defense overshadowed the New York Sack Exchange by sacking Jets QB **Ken O'Brien** seven times.
- **1986:** A wild 44-40 Packers' win saw the come-from-behind Green Bay victory clinched when KR **Walter Stanley** returned a punt 85 yards for the winning score with 41 seconds left in the game. The 40 points are the most points ever scored by the Lions in a loss.
- **1989:** The 50th Thanksgiving Day game revealed an inspired Lions effort in a 13-10 upset victory over the heavily favored Cleveland Browns. Rookie RB **Barry Sanders** rushed for 145 yards and caught two passes for 44 yards in the Detroit victory.

## 1990s

- **1990:** The Lions posted their second straight Thanksgiving win as RB **Barry Sanders** ran for 147 yards and scored twice in a 40-27 thumping of Denver. QB **Bob Gagliano** threw three touchdown passes for Detroit as the Lions piled up 421 total yards.
- **1991:** The Lions turned back the Bears 16-6 in Detroit's third consecutive Thanksgiving victory. The Lions' cause was aided by six Chicago turnovers -- four interceptions and two fumbles. K **Eddie Murray** booted three field goals, from 21, 50 and 37 yards and QB **Erik Kramer** connected with WR **Robert Clark** on a nine-yard touchdown pass to provide the Lions' scoring.
- **1993:** The Chicago Bears tripped up the Lions, 10-6, with the help of a 42-yard TD pass from QB **Jim Harbaugh**-to-WR **Terry Obee**. Detroit RB **Barry Sanders** sustained a knee injury in the game that forced him out of action for the remainder of the regular season.
- **1994:** Detroit easily controlled the four-time AFC Champion, Buffalo Bills, 35-21, with reserve QB **Dave Krieg** at the helm for the injured QB **Scott Mitchell**. The Lions set the tone on the second play of the game as Krieg used the flea-flicker to connect with a streaking **Herman Moore** (seven receptions for a then-career-high 169 yards) on a 51-yard touchdown strike. DT **Kelvin Pritchett** sacked Bills QB **Jim Kelly** three times and Lions S **Willie Clay** intercepted the first two passes of his career, returning the second 28 yards for a touchdown.
- **1995:** A record-breaking offensive explosion paved the way for a 44-38 win over Minnesota. The Lions' gobbled up 534 yards of total offense and QB **Scott Mitchell** (30-45 for 410 yards and four TDs) set records for most passing yards in a game and most completions and attempts in a season. And for the first time in club history, three players eclipsed the 100-yard mark in receiving yards -- WR **Brett Perriman** with 12 receptions for 153 yards and two touchdowns, WR **Johnnie Morton** with seven catches for 102 yards and a touchdown, and WR **Herman Moore** with eight grabs for 127 yards and a score.
- **1997:** The Lions used 38 second half points to cruise to a 55-20 win over Chicago. The 55 points are the most ever scored by a Lions team in regular season play, and are the most points ever allowed by a Bears club. Also, RB **Barry Sanders'** 167 yards rushing (and three TDs) allowed him to pass Eric Dickerson into second-place on the league's all-time rushing list.
- **1998:** It marked only the second time in 59 games that the Thanksgiving Day contest went into overtime. The Lions, on a 42-yard Jason Hanson kick, defeated the Pittsburgh Steelers 19-16 in front of a sold out Silverdome audience. Though RB Barry Sanders was held to only 20 yards rushing, he became only the second back in NFL history to reach 15,000 career-rushing yards during the contest.

## 2000s

- **2000:** Detroit won its third-straight game under new Head Coach Gary Moeller (replaced Bobby Ross Nov. 6, 2000), as the Lions dominated the New England Patriots 34-9. The win was solidified when CB Bryant Westbrook intercepted a Drew Bledsoe pass and returned for a Silverdome-tying record 101 yards (also second longest in team history) with 4:13 left to play in the fourth quarter.
- **2003:** The Lions' defense forced a season-high five turnovers and limited the Packers' league-leading rushing attack to just 52 yards en-route to a 22-14 holiday victory. CB Dré Bly intercepted Green Bay QB Brett Favre twice and forced a WR Javon Walker fumble, earning FOX's inaugural '*Galloping Gobbler*' award for his efforts. Detroit K Jason Hanson contributed with five field goals, including three in the fourth quarter.

**THANKSGIVING DAY IS FOR THE LIONS**  
**Lions Renew their Lease on Thanksgiving Day Game**

Lions football is as much a part of Thanksgiving Day in Michigan as the turkey and stuffing.

And if the support of NFL owners to keep it that way is any indication, it's not going to change anytime soon.

Thanks to the efforts of Lions' vice chairman Bill Ford, Jr., who made a passionate plea to the NFL owners at the league meetings last March, a resolution to rotate the Thanksgiving Day game among the league's 31 teams was defeated by a whopping 26-5 margin.

"This is a tradition," Ford said after the discussion and informal vote by league owners. "It's 65 years. We don't have a tradition in the NFL that goes back that long. It predates 23 of the franchises that voted on the issue. It goes back to the very first day the Lions began playing in Detroit.

"Everybody stood up - new owners and old owners alike - and said, 'this is ludicrous. We shouldn't be tampering with one of the great traditions.'"

Ford also pointed out that playing on Thanksgiving Day wasn't always as glamorous as it has become in recent years.

"Our fans built this tradition over the years when it was not a popular game; when nobody wanted it," Ford said. "And there was a recognition by several cities that it would be tough to host this game because you're asking your fans to break their family traditions that don't include going to a football game."

But in metropolitan Detroit, it's part of Thanksgiving Day. Families attend the game, then head home to eat the traditional dinner.

It's been like that since 1934 when the Lions moved to Detroit from Portsmouth, Ohio.

It was the idea of the team's first owner, G.A. Richards, who was trying to drum up interest in the new team in town. The Lions had been taking a back seat to the Tigers, who were the hot topic in Detroit after taking the St. Louis Cardinals' vaunted Gashouse Gang to seven games before losing the World Series.

Although the Lions had lost only one game before their Thanksgiving Day meeting with the unbeaten Chicago Bears on Nov. 29, 1934, they were averaging only about 12,000 fans a game at the old University of Detroit Stadium. Granted, it was the middle of the Great Depression, but the highest ticket price was \$1.10 and some seats were available for 40 cents.

Richards, wondering if folks were still holding to old traditions of not attending sporting events on Sundays, decided to try something different. He knew that a number of high schools and colleges were playing on Thanksgiving, so why not the pros?

Although the Lions suffered their first defeat - 3-0 to Green Bay - the Sunday before Thanksgiving, it didn't take any of the luster from the showdown with the two-time defending NFL Champion Bears.

Syndicated columnist Damon Runyon wrote: "These two teams will meet in Detroit on Thanksgiving Day in what may prove to be the greatest pro game in history."

There was so much anticipation for the game that Richards, who owned radio station WJR in Detroit, worked out a deal with his good friend Deke Aylesworth, the president of NBC, to carry the game on 94 radio stations throughout the country. The broadcasters were Graham McNamee, who did the play-by-play, and Don Wilson, who handled the color commentary. Wilson later gained fame as Jack Benny's announcer on the comedian's long-running radio and television shows.

But apparently, Detroit's football fans wanted to see the game, not listen to it on the radio.

More than 26,000 fans jammed U-D Stadium, filling every seat and decent standing area. And reports said that as many as 50,000 others were turned away.

The Lions lost 19-16 on a two-yard pass from the Bears' Bronko Nagurski to Bill Hewitt in the closing minutes of the fourth quarter, but the game certainly lived up to its advance billing.

"(It was) a thrill-saturated pigskin tussle - a tussle the like of which has been rare, if equaled on the gridirons of a football-minded nation," Leo MacDonell wrote in the Detroit Times.

MacDonell went on to call it a "storybook game and a heartbreaker for the Lions and their followers and with heavy heart today they feast over the crumbs of a game that put the Detroit team out of the running for the championship honors."

But with that game, a tradition was born. The Lions' popularity increased, not only in the Detroit area, but around the country. And when the first Thanksgiving Day game was nationally televised in 1956, a new generation of Lions fan was born. Folks who had no allegiance to a home NFL team adopted the Lions, who dominated the NFL during most of the 1950s.

"I feel the Lions' Thanksgiving Day series had a lot to do with the overall popularity of professional football through the years," said the late Russ Thomas, the longtime executive vice president and general manager of the Lions. "It literally has been a way of life for people in Detroit."

It's a special event for Lions players, too. It's a game they look forward to each season. It's a contest where they know they'll be on the national stage. Friends, family and other players will be watching, so players get a little more fired up for the game.

"The Thanksgiving Day game is always special to the players," says former Pro Bowl defensive lineman Doug English. "I know it's one of 16 games on the schedule, but I can't help but get a little more excited for that game."

One of English's former teammates echoed his words.

"I don't know what it is about the Thanksgiving game. Maybe it's the holiday or that it's on national television, but there's magic in that game for the Lions," says former offensive lineman Keith Dorney, who was the club's co-Offensive MVP in 1986 and was a Pro Bowl selection in 1983.

When All-Pro running back Barry Sanders heard that there was a movement to take the game away from the Lions, he spoke out in favor of keeping the tradition alive.

"This is one thing that has been steady and a lot of people really look forward to it," Sanders said. "It's just part of the day to watch the Lions play and, hopefully, watch the Lions win. It wouldn't be right (to take the game away). It wouldn't be right to change it."

Charlie Sanders, who was an outstanding tight end for the Lions from 1968-77 and now is a scout in the pro personnel department, said, "It's such a tradition here in metropolitan Detroit. This is the day of the Detroit Lions."

Ask a college player on draft day what he knows about the Lions and one of the first things he'll mention is watching the Thanksgiving Day game.

"When I was drafted by the Lions, one of the first things I thought of was that I would be playing on Thanksgiving Day every year," said two-time Defensive MVP Jimmy Williams.

One of the arguments that Kansas City Chiefs owner Lamar Hunt, who has been the leading advocate in rotating the game among the other NFL teams, presented is that the Lions have an unfair advantage by hosting the game each year.

Although Detroit has posted some memorable victories over the years, the Lions have only a 30-27-2 edge over their Thanksgiving Day opponents.

The Lions have hosted a Thanksgiving Day game every year since 1934 with the exception of 1939-44, when it was interrupted by World War II.

Here are a few of the highlights from the seven decades of Thanksgiving football in Detroit.

In 1935, the Lions avenged their previous year's loss to Chicago by beating the Bears 14-2 to clinch the Western Division championship.

In 1945, the series resumed after the wartime interruption but the Lions suffered a 28-21 loss to the Cleveland Rams when their quarterback, Bob Waterfield passed for 329 yards, including an NFL-record 303 of them to end Jim Benton.

In 1950, Bob Hoernschemeyer rushed for 198 yards, including a club-record 96-yard touchdown, in Detroit's 49-14 victory over the old New York Yanks. The Lions had a record 582 yards in total offense as they won their first Thanksgiving Day game since 1938.

In 1951, Bobby Layne passed for four touchdowns and Jack Christiansen returned two punts for touchdowns as the Lions beat Green Bay 52-35 in the highest-scoring Thanksgiving Day game.

In 1962, the Lions' "Fearsome Foursome" of Darris McCord, Alex Karras, Roger Brown and Sam Williams sacked Green Bay quarterback Bart Starr 11 times in Detroit's 26-14 win over the previously-unbeaten Packers.

In 1968, the Lions lost 12-0 to Philadelphia in the infamous "Mud Bowl" as the Eagles' Sam Baker kicked four field goals.

In 1976, O.J. Simpson set an NFL record with 273 rushing yards, but Simpson's Buffalo Bills lost to the Lions, 27-14.

In 1980, Chicago quarterback Vince Evans scored on the final play of regulation and David Williams returned the overtime kickoff 95 yards for a touchdown as the Bears stunned the Lions 23-17 in the shortest overtime in NFL history.

In 1983, the Lions crushed the favored Pittsburgh Steelers 45-3 as Billy Sims scored two touchdowns and rushed for 106 yards and the Detroit defense intercepted five passes.

In 1985, Green Bay won a wild 44-40 game on Walter Stanley's 85-yard punt return with 41 seconds remaining. The 40 points are the most the Lions have ever scored in a defeat.

In 1995, Scott Mitchell passed for 410 yards and four touchdowns and the Lions had 534 yards in total offense as they beat Minnesota 44-38. Detroit receivers Brett Perriman, Herman Moore and Johnnie Morton each had more than 100 yards in receptions.

In 1997, Detroit set a regular-season point record with a 55-20 pasting of Chicago. Barry Sanders rushed for 167 yards to move past Eric Dickerson into second place on the NFL career rushing list.

In 1998, the Lions beat Pittsburgh 19-16 on a field goal by Jason Hanson in overtime.

Lions fans have many other memories of Thanksgiving Day football, whether they attended the game or watched it or listened to it with their families at home. Bill Ford, Jr. has memories of his own. That's why he fought so hard to keep the tradition alive, getting resolutions from the Michigan Senate and House of Representatives and enlisting the aid of many of the NFL's biggest corporate sponsors.

"In an era where the public is so cynical of professional sports, to tamper with one of the great traditions is only going to heighten that cynicism," Ford said after the league meetings. "Our fans built this game through blood, sweat and tears and they have been rewarded."

Although nothing is guaranteed - the Lions were surprised when the matter came up for discussion this year after NFL commissioner Paul Tagliabue said it was a 'dead issue' last fall - Ford is confident that Thanksgiving will belong to Detroit football fans for years to come.

"I think there's such overwhelming sentiment to keep it with us," Ford says. "I think we're safe for the foreseeable future - even if it comes up again."

## DETROIT LIONS VS. NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS

The Detroit Lions welcome the New England Patriots to Ford Field this Thursday, November 25 at 12:35 p.m. ET. It marks the 71st annual Thanksgiving Day game in Detroit and the third against the Patriots. The Lions are looking to get on track after their 35-19 loss at Dallas while the Patriots aim to extend their winning streak to three after a 31-28 victory over the Colts. Thursday's game will be televised nationally on CBS with **Jim Nantz** handling play-by-play and **Phil Simms** adding color commentary. The game will also air on the Lions Radio Network (97.1 FM) with announcer **Dan Miller** handling play-by-play, **Jim Brandstatter** adding color commentary and **Tony Ortiz** reporting from the sideline.

### QUICK TURNAROUND

NFL teams typically live by the 24-hour rule, allowing 24 hours following the game to reflect, and then move on, win or lose.

In the Lions' case for this week, they don't have that kind of time.

Following their 35-19 loss at Dallas, Detroit has only three days of preparation for the New England Patriots, who they'll face in the annual Thanksgiving Day game at Ford Field.

#### Head Coach Jim Schwartz following Sunday's game at Dallas:

"Today's Tuesday. We're going to get back tonight and tomorrow is a workday. Tomorrow is a regular Wednesday. We have to put it behind (us). We play on Thursday. Usually we have a 24-hour rule; we can't afford a 24-hour rule here. Our 24 hours has already passed. 48 hours has already passed. We're on the clock and we're getting ready for New England."

Despite having to turnaround so quickly, players are doing well at putting this loss behind them, eager to get back onto the practice field and prepare for the Patriots.

**G Rob Sims:** "This team works. We go out every single day and work. We don't have lulls in practice, we're attentive in meetings and it's coming. It's going to be there, I still believe that. We just have to continue believing in each other and not get down."

DE **Kyle Vanden Bosch** has made the quick turnaround in the past, and moving forward to Thursday's game is something that he simply says they have to do.

Vanden Bosch is confident that this team will be able to move forward and learn from the mistakes that were made at Dallas.

**Vanden Bosch:** "You don't have a choice. You move on. We have to come in tomorrow and get ready for a tough team in New England. There are a lot of things that we can learn from in this game, but I don't know if we have much time to look back on this game. We have to move forward. We can get on the right track and we're capable of winning games and beating good teams, but we can't dwell on this one."

WR **Nate Burleson**, who had 7 catches for 97 yards, including a touchdown at Dallas, added that this team will continue to fight and work towards winning more games this season.

## LIONS TEAM CAPTAINS

The team's captains for 2010 are QB **Matthew Stafford** (offense), C **Dominic Raiola** (offense), DE **Kyle Vanden Bosch** (defense) and K **Jason Hanson** (special teams).

- Stafford, Raiola, Vanden Bosch and Hanson will wear a team captain patch, that includes a block "C," on the right shoulder of their game jerseys.
- Being named team captain in 2010 marks the fifth-straight season for Raiola and the fourth consecutive year for both Hanson and Vanden Bosch (2007-09 at Tennessee).
- The "C" patches for Raiola and Hanson have four gold stars under the "C" signifying their four years of being a Lions captain since the NFL began its captain initiative in 2007.
- This is the fifth-straight year the Lions selected team captains for the entire season. Prior to the launch of the NFL's initiative, the team captains in 2006 were recognized with a gold "C" on their practice jersey and a sign in their locker.

**Burleson:** "I'm not going to lose faith and I hope that nobody else in this locker room does. I was brought here to be a leader and help this team, so if I lose faith, people will follow suit and I'm not going to allow that to happen. I still believe we're a good team and we'll continue to work and prove that we are. I know that everybody sees glimpses, but in the NFL, glimpses don't get you victories, so we're going to continue to work for wins, and they're going to come.

"Nobody is going to give up. Especially around me, I'm not going to let anyone on this team give up. That will never be the case; you'll never see the Lions pack it in."

## BIG PLAYS CHANGE MOMENTUM

One thing that the Lions have said time and time again is that big plays can be the deciding factor between a win and a loss.

Against the Cowboys, two series in particular really swung the momentum in Dallas' favor.

**Schwartz:** "This game came down, really, to two straight series. We've done a really good job of getting balls downed inside the 10-yard line. (John) Wendling makes a great play and we just really get a bad bounce, everybody converges on the ball and the guy is able to get out and go 99 yards. Then coming around on offense with a fumble that ball backed us up – you're talking about a 14-point swing in the blink of an eye and we never recovered from that.

"We didn't play very well up front on offense. The quarterback didn't have a whole lot of time. We were never able to get a consistent run game going, and it showed throughout the game. We were able to make some plays. We got some yards, we converted some third downs, but there were too many instances, particularly on that two-play turnaround, the long return and then the fumble."

**S John Wendling** did a good job of batting the ball down from the end zone, but CB Bryant McCann was able to grab the ball and create a 97-yard punt return for a touchdown which had a huge impact on the mentality of the Cowboys' offense, as well as the crowd.

**Burleson:** "Up until then, I felt that we had a control on the crowd, we had control on the team. Offensively, we could pick and choose what we wanted to do; but after they got the big return, then going back out there on offense, it was clear that they had more energy.

"Standing there during the commercial break, I saw the DBs jumping up and down, waving their arms, getting the crowd going, but three minutes before that, they weren't doing those things. Those are the types of things that change games. It wasn't only the crowd that got back into it, but they got their confidence back and you just can't allow that to happen."

While the back-to-back-back scores in the third quarter hurt Detroit, WR Calvin Johnson didn't see any quit in the receiving corps and the offense stayed focused on attempting to score quickly.

**Johnson:** "That big 14-point swing was a big change in momentum. That one hurt. But it shouldn't (take the wind out of our sails). I mean, it can, but it definitely shouldn't. It's a whole different part of the game. There's three phases to the game: offense, defense and special teams, so if something bad happens in one of those phases of the game, we have to keep plugging away. We're going to keep fighting."

## CLOSE ISN'T GOOD ENOUGH

While the Lions have continued to play with fight, and for the most part play well, there remain issues that have caused them more losses than victories this season.

**Vanden Bosch:** "It's just different things. You can't put your finger on one thing and say, 'This is what's killing us.' It seems to be something different every game that's killing us.

"We had an opportunity to seize control of the game and really take control, but the game flipped pretty quickly and we found ourselves in a hole and we weren't able to come out of it. It was tough. It was really quickly that the game flipped on us."

There's no question that coming close isn't good enough.

**Schwartz:** "There's no doubt, it's not good enough. We need to win the game, but both of those were physical errors. Again Wendling, it's hard to blame him. He did a great job getting balls down in there. It was affecting their offense, having them backed up.

"Other than the first series of the game when they went 99 yards, we did a great job when they were backed up. He's trying to make another play and their guy, heads up, grabs the ball and we had converged to try to down the ball inside the 10. That swing right there – really after we got the safety and we didn't get any momentum going on offense after that, that started that swing and then it continued with a long return and then the fumble on offense."

The Lions have the talent and the capability to win games, but it's the little mistakes that have continued to be the cause of them coming out on the wrong end.

**Burleson:** "In my heart, deep down inside, I believe that we're a good team. But when you're facing other good teams, which is just about every other team in the NFL, small mistakes can bite you quickly and that's what it is. It's the same story; I keep saying it week-to-week, but you cannot make errors, because teams like Dallas will take advantage of it."

## POSITIVES ON OFFENSE

Despite the loss, there were things that the Lions were able to do well, including QB **Shaun Hill's** two passing touchdowns to Burleson and Johnson for 9 and 14 yards respectively.

The offense seemed to have the momentum early in the game, moving the ball and converting third downs through the first half.

**Hill:** "I felt like we were moving the ball. We weren't sustaining drives enough to get points. We have to convert those drives into points. We had a thing here and there that would slow us up, but I don't know, I felt like we were moving it and finished 10-7 at halftime and that was due to great field position by our defense, getting a turnover for us."

TE **Brandon Pettigrew** also made an impact in moving the ball down the field, finishing as the team's leading receiver with 8 catches for 75 yards.

**Hill:** "He played wonderful for me. He made every play that he had a chance to make. He even got some tough yards after the catch a couple of times. He played a great game today."

The main focus has continued to be establishing a balanced attack in both the passing and running game.

With RB **Kevin Smith** being placed on injured/reserve and RB **Jahvid Best** being limited with a toe injury, the Lions turned to RB **Maurice Morris** to take most of the carries. Morris finished with 71 yards from scrimmage (31 rushing, 40 receiving).

**Hill:** "We wanted to be balanced if we could; if we could stay in that game. Mo did a great job of running for us. He really played well. We had some chunks and some things like that in the run game which is great. We had some sixes and some eights. I got the big reverse to Nate, things like that were really good for us in the run game."

## BUILT TO LAST

Building upon an extremely successful draft class from 2009, the Lions front office looked to continue adding pieces to an organization that has seen a complete overhaul since the 2008 season. The Lions have utilized nearly ev-

ery avenue to upgrade the team, including free agency, trades, draft and the waiver wire. By the end of last season, 66-percent of the roster had been with the team for less than a year and the Lions continue to transform the club's roster. In 2010, the opening day active roster included only 14 players (74-percent turnover) remaining with the team from two years ago, including four players who were regular starters.

#### THROUGH THE DRAFT

- Seven of the team's 22 starters (32-percent) are players acquired either in the 2009 NFL Draft (QB **Matthew Stafford**, TE **Brandon Pettigrew**, S **Louis Delmas** and LB **DeAndre Levy**) or the 2010 NFL Draft (DT **Ndamukong Suh**, RB **Jahvid Best** and S **Amari Spievey**). Overall, 17 players (32-percent) on the team's 53-man roster have been added as draft picks or as undrafted rookie free agents the past two years.
- In 2009, the Lions started four rookies (Stafford, Pettigrew, Delmas and DT **Sammie Hill**) on opening day for the first time since 1978. This year, three rookies were in the opening starting lineup: Suh, Best and Berry.
- The Lions expected starting lineup features six players who were drafted in the first round of the past four drafts (since 2007), including WR **Calvin Johnson**, T **Gosder Cherilus**, Stafford, Pettigrew, Suh and Best.

#### TRADING BLOCK

- General Manager **Martin Mayhew** has led the Lions as, perhaps, the most active participant when it comes to trades in the entire League. In Mayhew's first 24 months (October 2008-September 2010) after assuming the role of general manager, the team has completed 18 trades for personnel or draft picks, including 10 since the end of the 2009 season.
- Involved in the team's trades during that time is the acquisition of veteran talent that has produced expected starters for the 2010 season: DT **Corey Williams**, CB **Chris Houston**, G **Rob Sims**, TE **Tony Scheffler**, CB **Alphonso Smith** and LB **Julian Peterson**. Other veterans acquired via trade include QB Shaun Hill and DE Lawrence Jackson.
- Two trades generated additional first round draft picks in each of the past two drafts. It marked the first time in franchise history that the Lions have made two selections in the first round of the draft in back-to-back seasons.* Those two transactions involved the Lions drafting Pettigrew with the 20th pick in the 2009 NFL Draft and Best with the 30th pick in the 2010 NFL Draft.

#### D-LINE EXEMPLIFIES

- The one unit on the Lions roster that may best represent the Lions transformation is the team's defensive line unit. In an effort to upgrade the team's defense, the Lions bolstered their front by acquiring three new starters (DE **Kyle Vanden Bosch**, DT **Corey Williams** and DT **Ndamukong Suh**).
- All three players were acquired three different ways. Vanden Bosch was signed shortly after the start of free agency this past off-season as one of the team's biggest targets.
- As free agency started, the Lions also finalized a trade with Cleveland to bring Williams to Detroit and move him back into a 4-3 defense where he previously succeeded.
- On draft day, the team selected Suh with the second pick in the 2010 NFL Draft. Suh was an All-American at Nebraska and finished fourth in the Heisman Trophy race—a rarity for a defensive lineman.

#### 2010 KEY ACQUISITIONS

**March 6:** The Lions sign WR **Nate Burleson** and DE **Kyle Vanden Bosch**. Team also acquires DT **Corey Williams** in exchange for a 2010 fifth round draft pick.

**Burleson** (6-0, 198) is coming off one of his best statistical years during his seven-year career. He started 12 games for Seattle in 2009, catching 63 balls, five shy of his career best, and compiling 812 yards receiving - the second highest total of his career.

**Vanden Bosch** (6-4, 278) played for Coach Schwartz while he was a member of the Tennessee Titans and brings veteran leadership to an young Lions defense. During his nine-year playing career, he has amassed 42.0 sacks and built a reputation as one of the hardest working men in the NFL. In 2009 he finished third among Titan defenders with 20 quarterback pressures.

**Williams** (6-4, 320) was brought to the team to give much needed support to Detroit's interior defensive line. Familiar with the NFC North, Williams spent four years (2004-07) with the Green Bay

Packers and had career seasons in 2006 and 2007, collecting 7.0 sacks each year and recording his only career interception.

**March 13:** Lions acquire CB **Chris Houston** in trade with the Atlanta Falcons in exchange for 2010 sixth round draft pick.

Detroit added another piece to the secondary with Houston (5-11, 178) who started in 10 games for the Falcons last season and all 16 in 2008. After being selected in the second-round in the 2007 NFL Draft, he led all Falcons rookies with 55 tackles and had nine pass defenses. In 2008, he took his first career interception into the endzone which also marked his first career touchdown.

**April 6:** Lions acquire G **Rob Sims** from Seattle in exchange for a 2010 fifth round draft pick and DE Robert Henderson.

**Sims** (6-3, 312) is a big, athletic guard who spent his first four years in the league with the Seattle Seahawks. He started 14 games last year and 34 of the 45 he has played in. A fourth-round draft pick in the 2006 NFL Draft, he saw his first action in the third game of the season and didn't allow a sack.

**April 20:** Lions acquire TE **Tony Scheffler** from Denver in a three-team trade that sends LB **Ernie Sims** to Philadelphia.

Scheffler (6-5, 255) provides QB Matthew Stafford with yet another big offensive weapon to add to his arsenal. Drafted in 2006 out of Western Michigan, he set a Broncos record for touchdown receptions (4) by a rookie tight end and recorded 18 catches for 286 yards (15.9 avg.). Over the span of his four-year career, Scheffler has recorded 138 receptions for 1,896 yards and 14 touchdowns through 57 games with 28 starts.

**April 22-24:** The team drafted six players, including DT **Ndamukong Suh** (2nd overall) and RB **Jahvid Best** (30th overall).

**Suh** (6-4, 307) looks to make an immediate impact on a defensive line that has received an extreme makeover since last year. One of the most highly touted players in college football, Suh was named the Associated Press College Player of the Year, CBSSports.com National Defensive Player of the Year, Big Twelve Conference Defensive Player of the Year/Defensive Lineman of the Year and was a finalist for the Walter Camp National Player of the Year Award. He was also presented with the 2009 Rotary Lombardi Award, Outland Trophy, Bronko Nagurski Trophy, Chuck Bednarik Award, Bill Willis Award and Guy Chamberlin Award. On the field for Nebraska in 2009, he led the team with 12.0 sacks and 24 stops for losses.

**Best** (5-10, 199) was one of the top running backs available in the 2010 NFL Draft. One of Cal's all-time greatest rushers, Best started 18-of-31 games at California, where he gained 4,045 all-purpose yards, an average of 130.48 yards per game. An extremely versatile player, Best not only rushed the ball but was active in the return game and also caught 62 passes for 533 yards. In 2008, he rushed for a Cal record 311 yards, which ranks fourth all-time in Pac-10 Conference history.

**September 4:** Lions acquire CB **Alphonso Smith** from Denver in exchange for TE Dan Gronkowski. Teams also exchanged undisclosed 2011 draft picks.

Smith was drafted by the Broncos in the second round (37th overall) of the 2009 NFL Draft and played in 15 games as a rookie. He showed a knack for finding the ball at Wake Forest while setting an Atlantic Coast Conference record with 21 interceptions (254 yards) and 61 pass defenses in 51 career games. As a senior, Smith tied for first in the nation in both interceptions (7) and pass defenses (20).

## CALVIN ON THE RISE

Fourth-year WR **Calvin Johnson** is benefitting from stability in the offense scheme this season, playing a second season under offensive coordinator Scott Linehan. During his first three seasons (2007-09) in the NFL, he had three different offensive coordinators. Johnson currently leads the team in receptions (55), receiving yards (725) and touchdowns (10) and is on pace to finish as the team's leading receiver for a third straight year.

- Johnson is third in the NFL (first in the NFC) in scoring (nonkickers) with 62 points (10 TDs and a 2-pt conversion). He is also tied for sixth in the NFC in receptions and is fifth in receiving yards.
- In Week 11 at Dallas (11/21), Johnson scored his 10th touchdown of

## DEFENSIVE IMPROVEMENT

One area that has improved thus far in 2010 is the Lions ability to pressure the quarterback, generate turnovers and get off the field.

- Through Week 11, the Lions are tied for sixth in the League with 21 takeaways (9 interceptions and 12 fumble recoveries. Compared to 2009, the Lions had 13 takeaways (6 interceptions, 7 fumble recoveries) at this point last season.
- Detroit recorded two interceptions in three games this year (at Minnesota 9/26, at Green Bay 10/3 and vs. St. Louis 10/10). The last time the Lions intercepted 2 passes in three-straight games was when they recorded two interceptions in four-straight games in 2005 (3 at TB 10/2/05; 2 vs. Baltimore 10/9/05, 3 vs. Carolina 10/16/05 and 3 at Cleveland 10/23/05).
- In the team's 44-6 win over St. Louis, the Lions did not allow a touchdown. The last time the Lions did not allow the opponent to score a touchdown was vs. Seattle September 10, 2006 when they allowed just three field goals against the Seahawks. The Lions lost on a late field goal 9-6.
- The team's defensive effort vs. the Rams marked the first time the Lions allowed six points or less since they defeated Green Bay 17-3 September 11, 2005.
- Heavy pressure on the quarterback work hand-in-hand with generating interceptions. In 2010, the Lions are tied for eighth in the NFL with 34 combined sacks and interceptions. Last year at this point, the team recorded 23 (17 sacks and 6 interceptions).
- Detroit is also tied for second in opponent fourth down percentage with 25.0.

Through Week 11, the Detroit Lions offense is first in the League in Red Zone efficiency. In 27 trips, the Lions have converted 19 touchdowns.

- With QB **Matthew Stafford** at the helm, the Lions have scored a touchdown on 9 of 10 trips in the redzone, and one resulted in a FG.

the season in the third quarter. He finished with 6 receptions for 46 yards.

- With his 14-yard touchdown reception against the Cowboys (11/21), Johnson became the first Lions player to register 10 total touchdowns in the first 10 games played in a season since Hall of Fame RB Barry Sanders (9 rushing, 1 receiving) in 1991. All 10 of Johnson's touchdowns have been pass receptions, and he is the first Lions player to record 10 receiving touchdowns in the first 10 games he played in a season since WR Terry Barr in 1963.
- Johnson joins Barr and E Leon Hart (1951) as the only players in team history with 10 receiving touchdowns through their first 10 games of a season.
- By reaching 10 receiving touchdowns in 2010, Johnson becomes only the third player in Lions history to register 10 receiving touchdowns in two different seasons. Johnson recorded 12 touchdowns in 2008. He joins E Cloyce Box (11 in 1950 and 15 in 1952) and WR Herman Moore (11 in 1994 and 14 in 1995) as the only receivers in franchise history to accomplish this feat.
- Johnson also moved his career tally of receptions to 248 and surpassed WR Roy Williams (245 from 2004-07) for the most pass receptions by a Lions receiver in their first four seasons with the Lions.
- Johnson's 46 receiving yards moved his four-year career tally to 3,796, which is the highest among all Detroit receivers in their first four seasons with the Lions.
- His touchdown catch vs. the Cowboys moved his career total to 31, just one shy of the mark for the most receiving touchdowns by a Lions receiver in their first four seasons with the club held by E Cloyce Box (1949-50, '52-53).
- At Buffalo (11/14), Johnson set a career high with 10 receptions. His previous high was 9 catches done three times in his career including this year against Washington (10/31).
  - His 10 receptions marked the first time a Lions' receiver caught 10 passes in a game since WR Mike Furrey (11) at Dallas December 31, 2006.
  - Along with 10 receptions, Johnson accumulated 128 receiving yards. It was his 12th career 100-yard receiving game, and third in the past four games. With 12 career 100-yard games, Johnson tied WR Gail Cogdill for the sixth-most career 100-yard receiving games by a Lions' receiver.
  - Johnson caught a 20-yard touchdown pass from QB Shaun Hill with 0:14 left in the game to set up a potential game-tying two-point conversion. The touchdown reception was Johnson's 30th career TD reception and he joined WR Cloyce Box (32 from 1949-50, '52-53) as the only players in Lions history to register 30 receiving touchdowns in their first four years with the Lions.
  - Johnson's 128 receiving yards pushed his career total to 3,750 yards which moved him past WR Roy Williams (3,652 from 2004-07) for the most receiving yards by a Lions' receiver in the first four years with the club.
- Johnson had a career day against the Redskins (10/31) with his first three-touchdown performance which included the winning touchdown reception – a 10-yard catch in the endzone on 4th-and-1 with 3:12 remaining in the fourth quarter. All three of his touchdown receptions helped the team either take the lead initially in the game or re-take the lead. Johnson was the only player in the NFL to have three touchdowns in Week 8.
  - The game marked the fourth time in Johnson's career that he caught at least two touchdowns in a game and the first time against a team other than Green Bay.
  - Johnson has caught a touchdown pass in four consecutive games.
  - Johnson's 101 receiving yards marked the 11th time in his career that he has recorded 100 yards in a game and he has had 100 receiving yards in each of the past two games (146 at New York Giants 10/17) for a two-game tally of 257 yards.
  - It was the second time in Johnson's career that he recorded 100 yards in back-to-back games and the first since 2008 (107 at Atlanta 9/7 and 129 vs. Green Bay 9/14).
  - Johnson's 9-catch day tied a career-high and marked the third time he has registered 9 receptions in a game.
- Despite a shoulder injury that limited him in practice all week, Johnson

had a strong performance against the Giants (10/17). He finished with five receptions for a season-high 146 receiving yards and a touchdown.

- Johnson's performance was highlighted by an 87-yard touchdown catch and run in the fourth quarter.
- He became the first player in franchise history to record two receptions of 85-plus yards. His career long was a 96-yard touchdown at Houston (10/19) in 2008.
- At Green Bay (10/3), Johnson finished with six receptions for 86 yards and two touchdowns. It marked his third multi-touchdown performance, each of which have come against the Packers. Three of his other four receptions were for first downs.
- Johnson scored his first touchdown and added two-points on the conversion in the fourth quarter against the Eagles (9/19). He finished the day with four catches for 50 yards.
- Johnson opened the season with a four-catch, 45-yard performance at Chicago (9/12). He also caught what appeared to be a game-winning touchdown with 0:31 seconds left, but due to NFL's rule regarding 'the process of a catch,' the pass was ruled incomplete.

## STAFFORD'S PROGRESS

Lions QB **Matthew Stafford** is in his second NFL season and directs an offense that features weapons like WRs Calvin Johnson and Nate Burleson, TEs Brandon Pettigrew and Tony Scheffler and RBs Jahvid Best and Kevin Smith. He and the offense benefit from the continuity within the offensive scheme and coaching staff.

- Stafford has been inactive the past two games (at Buffalo, 11/14 and at Dallas, 11/21) due to a shoulder injury.
- In a showdown with the New York Jets (11/7), Stafford threw two touchdown passes and ran in another before leaving the game in the fourth quarter with a shoulder injury.
  - Against one of the NFL's best defenses, Stafford led Detroit's offense on touchdown drives of 80, 47 and 90 yards respectively. With the 11-play, 80-yard drive on the games opening possession, the Lions were the first team to score a touchdown against the Jets on their first offensive possession in 2010.
  - Detroit has scored touchdowns on nine of 10 trips in the redzone with Stafford at quarterback.
  - Stafford was 20-for-36 for 240 yards and had a quarterback rating of 94.7 against the Jets. With a 90.2 passer rating the previous week vs. Washington (10/31), it marked the first time in his two-year career he has registered passer ratings of 90.0 in back-to-back games.
- Stafford returned to action against Washington (10/31) and after showing some rust early, he emerged to lead the Lions to a 37-25 win over the Redskins. He completed 26-of-45 passes for 212 yards and 4 touchdowns, while accumulating a 90.2 passer rating.
  - In the second half, Stafford was 18-of-27 (66.7 pct) for 140 yards and threw for 3 touchdowns. His quarterback rating was 116.3, the highest tally in a second-half of a game during his career.
  - Stafford's 4 touchdown passes were the second-highest single game tally of his career. He joined QB Bobby Layne (4), QB Gary Danielson (2), QB Eric Hipple (2) and QB Scott Mitchell (2) as the only passers in team history with at least two games throwing 4 touchdown passes, and Stafford is the first player in team history to do it twice in his first two years with the club.
  - Stafford is the first quarterback in team history to throw for 4 touchdowns in a game in which each touchdown gave the Lions the lead.
  - On 4th-and-1, with 3:12 left to play in the fourth quarter, Stafford connected with WR Calvin Johnson on a 10-yard touchdown pass to take a 28-25 lead, which the Lions would not surrender. It marked Stafford's second career fourth-quarter come-from-behind win.
  - Stafford was the only quarterback in the NFC with four touchdown tosses in Week 8.
- Stafford started the season completing 11-of-15 attempts for 83 yards against the Bears (9/12) before leaving the game near the end of the second quarter with a shoulder injury. The injury forced him to miss the team's next five games: vs. Philadelphia (9/19), at Minnesota (9/26), at Green Bay (10/3), vs. St. Louis (10/10) and at New York Giants (10/17).
- Before leaving the game at Chicago (9/12), Stafford directed the offense on both of their scoring drives. On the team's first scoring drive, he completed 4-of-5 for 22 yards, including 2-of-2 on third down. For the second scoring drive, he was also 4-for-5, this time for 46 yards, highlighted by a 19-yard completion to WR Nate Burleson that put Detroit at the Bears' 4-yard line.

## BECOMING THE BEST

Rookie RB **Jahvid Best** has showed both speed and versatility since first taking the field for the Lions in 2010. Detroit traded back up into the bottom of the first round of the NFL Draft for Best and so far their investment is paying early dividends as he leads the team in rushing (382 yards) and is third in receptions (49).

- Best was the first rookie in the League to score five touchdowns in his first two career games since Lions RB Billy Sims had 5 TDs (4 rushing, 1 receiving).
- Thru Week 10, Best leads all NFL rookies in receptions (49), is tied for fourth in scoring (30) and is tied for third in rushing yards (380).
- Best finished with a 4.0 yards/carry average against the Redskins (10/31) with 48 yards on 12 carries, including a long of 20. He also had five receptions for 31 yards.
  - Best's 20-yard run in the third quarter was the Lions longest play of the day and put Detroit at the Redskins' 16-yard line. The drive culminated in a touchdown and 14-13 Lions lead.
- In his regular season home debut against Philadelphia (9/19), Best finished the day with 17 carries for 78 yards and two touchdowns on the ground and 9 catches for 154 yards and a touchdown as a receiver. Overall, he accumulated 232 total yards from scrimmage (78 rushing, 154 passing). His effort was good for the fifth-most single-game total yards from scrimmage since 1960 as well as the most by a rookie since 1960.
  - Best is the first rookie in NFL history with at least 75 rushing yards, 150 receiving yards and three touchdowns in a single game. Best is the first player to accomplish the feat since Buffalo RB Joe Cribbs finished with 85 rushing yards and 163 receiving yards vs. Cleveland (11/01/81).
  - Best's 75-yard catch and run for a touchdown against the Eagles (9/19) is tied for the fourth longest by a Lions rookie since 1947.
  - His 9 receptions in versus Philadelphia tied for the third highest rookie tally in team history. He tied WR Roy Williams, who also had 9 receptions vs. Philadelphia (9/19/04). Best is the first rookie since Williams to have at least 9 catches in a game. Best also had the most receptions by a rookie running back in team history.
  - Best is the first Lions player to score three touchdowns in a game since WR Roy Williams caught three touchdown passes vs. Arizona 11/13/05, and he is the first Lions rookie to score three touchdowns in a game since RB Barry Sanders had three rushing touchdowns at Atlanta 12/14/89.
  - On the Lions' scoring drive in the first quarter that tied the game at 7-7, rookie RB Jahvid Best rushed four times for 64 yards, including a 14-yard touchdown. He had runs of 4, 13, 33 and 14 yards.
- In his NFL debut at Chicago (9/12), Best scored both Lions touchdowns on runs of 7 and 4 respectively.

## END IN SIGHT

During his rookie season, TE **Brandon Pettigrew** started in the first 11 games of his career before suffering a season-ending knee injury at Green Bay (11/26/09) that sidelined him for the remainder of the season. Pettigrew has since returned from his injury, starting each game thus far and is tied for first in the NFL amongst tight ends in receptions (50) and is fifth in receiving yards (412).

- At Dallas (11/21), Pettigrew matched a career-high with eight receptions and had 75 receiving yards.
  - Pettigrew became the first Lions' tight end since 1960 to record at least 8 receptions in a single game twice. The only other tight ends to have 8 receptions in a game for the Lions since 1960 is Hall of Fame TE Charlie Sanders (10 at Washington 12/15/68), Jim Gibbons (9 at Los Angeles Rams 10/30/60) and David Hill (9 vs. Green Bay 10/25/81).
  - He now has 50 receptions on the season and is only the third Lions tight end since 1960 to register 50 receptions in a season (TE David Hill, 53 in 1978 and TE Jim Gibbons, 51 in 1960).
- Pettigrew finished with four receptions for 50 yards at Buffalo (11/14), including a long of 22 in the first quarter. He also had a 14-yard reception on 4th-and-5 on which kept Detroit's fourth quarter touchdown drive alive.
  - With two receptions in the first half against the Bills, Pettigrew moved his season total of receptions to 40. It marked the 13th time since 1960 that a Lions tight end has caught 40 passes in a season.

## TIGHT END PRODUCTION

- Pettigrew becomes the seventh Lions tight end to surpass 40 receptions in a season since 1960, including Jim Gibbons (1960, 1961 and 1964), Charlie Sanders (1968, 1969, 1970 and 1974), David Hill (1978 and 1979), David Sloan (1999), Stephen Alexander (2004) and Marcus Pollard (2005).
- With 42 catches on the season, Pettigrew is tied for eighth place with Hall of Fame TE Charlie Sanders (1969 and 1974) on the team's receptions list by a tight end (since 1960). Pettigrew is 11 receptions away for the most receptions by a Lions tight end since 1960 (TE David Hill, 53 in 1978)
- For the second consecutive week, Pettigrew scored a touchdown with 10-yard reception in the endzone on the opening offensive series against the New York Jets (11/7). He finished the game with three receptions for 18 yards.
- Pettigrew pulled in a 2-yard touchdown pass in the third quarter against Washington (10/31) to give Detroit a 14-13 lead.
- At New York (10/17), Pettigrew led the team with seven receptions and had 61 receiving yards. He currently leads the team with 33 receptions.
- In Week 4 at Green Bay (10/3), Pettigrew's eight catches were a career-high and they were the fourth-most by a Lions tight end in a single game since 1960. He also led the team in receiving yards with 91.
- At Minnesota (9/26), Pettigrew caught 6 passes for 44 yards.
- In the team's home-opener against Philadelphia (9/19), Pettigrew recorded 7 receptions - which tied for a then career-best - for a career-high 108 yards. It was his first career 100-yard game and the first by a Lions tight end since TE Marcus Pollard had 105 yards vs. Carolina (10/16/05). Since the era of the modern day tight end (1960), Pettigrew's 108 yards are the fifth-most by a Lions tight end in a game.

## ON THE HILL

QB **Shaun Hill** was acquired this past off-season in a trade and brought quality, veteran experience to the backup position. In the team's opener, Hill was called from the bullpen after QB Matthew Stafford suffered a shoulder injury in the first half. In his five starts before Stafford's return, he led a Lions offense that improved throughout the early part of the season.

- Hill completed a season-high 68-percent of his passes (32-of-47) against the Cowboys (11/21) for 289 yards and two touchdowns. It marked the fifth time in seven starts for Detroit this season that he has completed 60-percent or more of his passes.
- With 32 completions at Dallas (11/21), Hill tied for the fifth most completions in a single game in franchise history. He had 34 completions at Green Bay (10/3) earlier this season which ranks as the second most single-game completions in franchise history.
- Against the Bills (11/14), Hill had his third 300-yard passing game of the season after completing 29 of 50 passes for 323 yards and a touchdown. His performance was highlighted by a 20-yard touchdown pass on 4th-and-2 with 0:14 left in the fourth quarter. The touchdown put the Lions position to tie with a two-point conversion, but the attempt failed.
- Hill was inactive against the Redskins (10/31) and then was listed as the third quarterback against the Jets (11/7).
- Hill started the Lions' Week 6 game at New York against the Giants (10/17) and began the game completing 9-of-15 passes for 91 yards and a touchdown before leaving the game near the end of the second quarter with a broken (left) forearm.
- Against the Rams (10/10), Hill completed 21-of-32 passes (65.6-percent) for 227 yards and three touchdowns (no interceptions). He spread the ball around evenly, connecting with four different teammates (WR Calvin Johnson, WR Nate Burleson, RB Jahvid Best and TE Brandon Pettigrew) four times each and TE Tony Scheffler three times.
- Hill's passer rating on the day was 117.6, the second highest of his career (142.3 rating vs. St. Louis November 16, 2008). The 117.6 rating was the highest by a Lions' quarterback since QB Jon Kitna registered 137.3 vs. Chicago September 30, 2007. It was also the highest rating by a Lions quarterback with 30 passing attempts since QB Joey Harrington recorded a rating of 121.8 vs. Arizona November 13, 2005.
- With a 65.6 completion percentage against the Rams, Hill has completed 63.0-percent or more of his passes in each of the last three games (63.0 at GB, 10/3; 67.4 at Min, 9/26). The last Lions quarterback to complete 63.0-percent or more of his passes in three straight games was QB Jon Kitna who opened the 2007 season with four straight games completing at least 63.0-percent of his passes: 75.0 at Oak, 9/9; 66.7 vs. Min, 9/16; 63.0 at Phi, 9/23; 83.3 vs. Chi 9/30.

## TURNOVER SPECIALISTS

The Lions' special teams cover units have been opportunistic in the turnover category since the beginning of 2008.

- Detroit has the most special teams takeaways (11) in the NFL since 2008.
- Since 2008, the Lions' special teams are second with a plus-7 turnover margin (10 takeaways, four giveaways).
- In 2010, the Lions have registered 3 takeaway on special teams, including 2 fumble recoveries by WR **Stefan Logan**. The Lions are one of only three teams this season with 3 takeaways on special teams.

- After a shaky first quarter, Hill lead the offense on two consecutive touchdown drives of 81 and 80 yards respectively. He completed 14-of-18 passes for 137 yards and two touchdowns in the second quarter, including a 3-yard touchdown pass with 0:10 left in the half to give Detroit a 24-6 lead.
- On Detroit's first possession in the third quarter, Hill and Burleson connected for a 26-yard touchdown which was the third straight touchdown in three possessions.
- In four starts against the St. Louis Rams, Hill is 4-0 having completed 68-of-110 passes (61.8-percent) for 808 yards and nine touchdowns (three interceptions) for a quarterback rating of 100.1.
- Hill made his third consecutive start at Green Bay (10/3) and completed 34-of-54 passes (63.0-percent) for 331 yards and two touchdowns. The 34 completions and 54 attempts were both career highs. His performance also marked the second time in three starts that he passed for more than 330 yards (335 vs. Phi, 9/19) and the second straight week he completed 63.0-percent or more of his passes (67.4 at Min, 9/26).
  - Hill completed 21 passes in the first half. The last time a Lions passer completed 21 passes in the first half was QB Scott Mitchell (21) vs. Minnesota (11/23) in 1995.
  - He also registered a completion percentage of 80.8 by completing 21-of-26 passes. The last time a Lions' quarterback recorded at least 10 attempts and had an 80.0 completion percentage in the first half was QB Jon Kitna (91.7) vs. Chicago (9/17) in 2006.
  - Hill's 237 passing yards in the first half are the most he has thrown for in the first two quarters of a game in his career.
  - Hill scrambled up the middle and rushed for a 40-yard gain that helped set up a Lions field goal in the third quarter at Green Bay. His 40-yard rush is the longest of his career and it is the longest by a quarterback thus far in 2010.
  - The last time a Lions quarterback rushed for a 40-yard gain was QB Gary Danielson vs. Minnesota (9/23) in 1984. The 40-yard rush tied for the sixth longest rush by a Lions quarterback since 1948.
- At Minnesota (9/26), Hill completed 67.4-percent of his passes (29-of-43) for 237 yards and a touchdown. His 5-yard touchdown pass to TE Tony Scheffler in the first quarter gave Detroit a 7-0 lead.
- Hill started his first game for the Lions against the Eagles (9/19) and completed 25-of-45 passes for 335 yards and two touchdowns. His first touchdown for Detroit was a short completion to RB Jahvid Best who turned it into a 75-yard touchdown run.
- During his career, Hill has accumulated an 8-2 record as a starter at home (11-12 overall). His career marks as a starter are 430-of-704 (61.0) for 4,438 yards and 31 touchdowns (17 interceptions).

## LOGAN'S RUN

WR **Stefan Logan** joined the Lions just before the start of the regular season and has made a huge impact for Detroit's special teams. Logan has been the team's primary kick returner, has contributed on the kick coverage units and has even seen some action on offense.

- Logan ranks second both the NFL and NFC with a 28.2 yards/KOR average and is fifth in the NFL (fourth in NFC) with a 12.3 PR average.
  - His 105-yard kickoff return for a touchdown against St. Louis (10/10) is the longest in the NFL so far in 2010.
- Logan opened the game at Dallas (11/21) with a 40-yard kickoff return. It was his third kickoff return of 40-yard or more which is tied for the third most in the NFL. He is currently tied for first with 26 kickoff returns of 20-plus yards.
- At Buffalo (11/14), Logan had a 24-yard punt return near the end of the first half that gave Detroit the ball at the Bills' 30-yard line. The field position led to the Lions first points of the game as they kicked a field goal to end the half.
- Logan was named the NFC Special Teams Player of the Month for October after contributing on every kick and cover unit, and coming up with huge plays in all four of the Lions' October games.
  - He led the NFL in kickoff return average (35.9) in October as he returned 10 kickoffs for 359 yards and he was second in the League in punt return average (18.4) among punt returners with at least 4 punt returns.
  - Logan had a kick return for at least 50 yards in each of the last three games in October, including a 105-yard kickoff return for a touchdown vs. St. Louis (10/10), a 58-yard kickoff return at New York Giants (10/17) and a 71-yard punt return vs. the Washington Redskins (10/31).
  - His contribution to the team's cover units was highlighted at Green

Bay (10/3) when he became the only special teams player this year to recover two fumbles on special teams in a game so far this season.

- Logan became the Lions first player to earn NFC Special Teams Player of the Month since WR Eddie Drummond in November 2004.
- Logan set up the Lions first score against Washington (10/31) when he returned a Redskins punt for a career-long 71 yards to give the ball to the Lions offense at the Redskins 19-yard line.
- Logan became the first player in Lions history to return a 100-yard kickoff return and a punt return for at least 70 yards in the same season.
- He finished the game with 3 punt returns for 79 yards (26.3 avg.).
- The 71-yard punt return by Logan is the longest by a Lions returner since WR Eddie Drummond returned an 83-yard touchdown at Jacksonville November 14, 2004.
- With only two kickoff return opportunities against the Giants (10/17), Logan made the best out of his limited opportunities. In the fourth quarter, on only his second return of the game, Logan took the ball from Detroit's 2-yard line 58 yards to New York's 40-yard line. The return led to points as K Jason Hanson connected on a 50-yard field goal.
- Logan also had a season-long 21-yard punt return at New York (10/17) that gave Detroit the ball at the 50 yard-line.
- Logan was named the NFC Special Teams Player of the Week for Week 5 after his performance against the St. Louis Rams (10/10) which was highlighted by a 105-yard kickoff-return touchdown.
- His 105-yard kickoff-return touchdown tied for the longest kickoff return in team history (Terry Fair, September 28, 1998) and tied for the sixth-longest in NFL history. It also marked the first non-on-side kickoff-return touchdown by a Lion since Eddie Drummond's 92-yard TD in 2004 (November 21).
- Logan also added 24 punt-return yards (12.0 avg.) and finished with 129 total return yards while also helping the kickoff cover unit allow just 18.3 yards per return.
- In his second season from South Dakota, this is Logan's first career Player of the Week Award.
- At Green Bay (10/3), Logan came up big on kickoff coverage with two fumble recoveries. On his only punt return attempt, he returned the ball 15 yards to the Detroit 43 yard-line. The field position helped the offense get in position for a 49-yard field goal.
- Logan saw his first action on offense at Minnesota (9/26), gaining 21 yards on a rushing attempt in the second quarter. He also had 142 yards on five kickoff returns (28.4 avg), including a 35-yarder.
- In the season opener at Chicago (9/12), Logan debuted as the Lions kick returner with a 32-yard return on his first attempt.

## NOT SUH-PRISED

When the Detroit Lions drafted DT **Ndamukong Suh** with the second-overall pick in the 2010 NFL Draft, the expectations were high. So far, Suh has not disappointed as he leads the team, NFL rookies and all defensive tackles with 7.0 sacks and has 41 tackles (31 solo).

- Suh led Detroit's defense with eight tackles (five solo) and had a half-sack (4 yards lost) against the Cowboys (11/21). He also drew a holding penalty in the endzone which resulted in an automatic safety to give Detroit a 12-7 third quarter lead.
- Suh was named the NFL Defensive Rookie of the Month for October after finishing with 14 tackles, 4.5 sacks (29.5 yards lost), 1 interception, 1 pass defense and a 17-yard fumble return for a touchdown thru four games.
- He had more sacks (4.5) in October than any other rookie in the NFL had tallied for the entire season, and he had the most among defensive tackles in the League (Chicago DT Israel Idonije recorded 4.5 sacks but did so at LDE).
- Suh also became the first rookie defensive tackle to record 4.5 sacks in October since Jacksonville DT John Henderson had 5.0 in 2002 and became the first defensive tackle in the NFL to collect 4.5 sacks during October since Tampa Bay DT Warren Sapp had 5.0 in 2005.
- Suh was a key contributor to a dominating performance by the defensive line against the Redskins (10/31) as he registered 2.0 sacks (17 yards loss), 4 tackles (2 tackles-for-loss) and sealed a Lions victory with a 17-yard fumble return for a touchdown with 1:36 to play.
- In the second quarter, Suh halted a Redskins drive when he registered 2.0 sacks in a span of three plays for a total of 17 yards lost. He became the first rookie to record 2.0 sacks in a game since DE Kalimba Edwards (at Arz, 12/8) in 2002. Suh is also the first Lions

## THE FONZ

After joining the Lions before the start of the 2010 regular season, CB **Alphonso Smith** has emerged as Detroit's starting right corner and leads the team with five interceptions.

- Smith registered his fifth interception of the season against the New York Jets (11/7). It was his fifth in six games.
- Smith is the first Lions defender to pick off five passes in a season since CB Dré Bly had six in 2005.
- Smith is the first player in the NFL this season to record an interception in five different games.
- Since 1978 (first 16-game regular season), Smith's 5 picks are tied for the second-most interceptions in the first eight games of a Lions' season (last: S K. Schultz had 6 in 2000).
- Smith is the first Lions player with five interceptions over a six-game span since CB Byrant Westbrook in 2000.

rookie defensive tackle to record 2.0 sacks in a game since sacks became an official statistic in 1982.

- Suh's 2.0 sacks pushed his season total to 6.5, which ties Edwards (2002) for the second most sacks by a Lions rookie since 1982. The record is 7.5 by DE Tracy Scroggins in 1992. Suh has the most by a Lions rookie defensive tackle since 1982.
- Suh became the first Lions rookie defensive lineman to return a fumble for a touchdown since Bob Bell (25 yards) at Green Bay November 1, 1971.
- Suh had 1.5 sacks (7.5 yards lost) at New York (10/17) as well as three tackles against the Giants.
- Against the St. Louis Rams (10/10), Suh's performance was highlighted by his first career interception. He initially tipped the ball at the line-of-scrimmage (50-yard line) and then located the ball in the air before snagging it and returning it 20 yards to give Detroit the ball at the Rams' 30-yard line.
- Suh's interception against the Rams was the first interception by a Lions' rookie defensive lineman since DT Thurman McGraw intercepted a pass vs. the Los Angeles Rams October 15, 1950. Suh is also the first rookie defensive tackle in the NFL to register an interception since Falcons rookie DT Trey Lewis had one at Tennessee October 7, 2007.
- In his first regular season game at Ford Field (vs. Phi, 9/19), Suh led the defense with eight tackles (six solo), including two tackles-for-loss and a sack (7 yard loss).
- Suh made his NFL debut at Chicago (9/12) and opened the season with his first career sack (1 yard loss) on the Bears' second offensive possession in first quarter. He also contributed on a big goal-line stand in the fourth quarter and the Lions defense stopped the Bears for no gain on four straight plays to protect a 14-13 Detroit lead.

## DELMAS MAKING PLAYS IN THE 'D'

Safety **Louis Delmas**, the Lions' second-round selection in the 2009 NFL Draft, proved himself as one of the top rookie defensive players in the league last season. He is a hard hitting safety who made big plays throughout the season. His 91 tackles ranked second on the team, and he ranked first among rookie defensive backs with 94 tackles (including 3 special teams tackles) according to NFL.com rankings. His other defensive tallies included: two interceptions (130 yds), eight passes defended, 1.0 sack and one fumble recovery. Delmas is the only rookie in NFL history to record a safety (vs. GB 11/26/09), an interception return for a touchdown (Arz 12/20/09) and return a fumble for a touchdown (at NO 9/13/09) in a season.

- Against the New York Jets (11/7), Delmas finished with seven tackles and forced and recovered a fumble on the opening drive of the third quarter to give Detroit the ball at the New York 47-yard line. The Lions offense scored a touchdown to pull ahead, 13-10.
- Delmas currently leads the Lions defense with 53 tackles (39 solo).
- For the second consecutive game, Delmas had eight tackles (four solo) at New York (10/17). He led the secondary with eight tackles (five solo) against the Rams (10/10) in Week 5.
- Led team with 6 tackles and had a sack (7 yards) at Green Bay (10/3).
- At Minnesota (9/26), Delmas had four tackles and recovered a fumble in the fourth quarter at the Lions' 26-yard line.
- In the home-opening game against Philadelphia (9/19), Delmas led the secondary with seven tackles and has his first sack of the season in the fourth quarter which forced an Eagles three-and-out.
- Delmas began the season at Chicago (9/12) leading the secondary with eight solo tackles in addition to having a forced fumble.

## GETTING A KICK OUT OF HANSON

The Lions' two-time Pro Bowl kicker **Jason Hanson** is one of the NFL's top all-around kickers. He is in his 19th season and is the franchise leader for most seasons played with the Lions. Hanson continues to show consistent accuracy and distance on both field goals and kickoffs.

- Hanson ranks first in every statistical category for a place kicker in Lions history with longest field goal (56), field goals made (439) and attempted (536), extra points made (573) and extra points attempted (581). He also ranks as the franchise leader in games played (295) and was named to the Lions' 75th Season All-Time Team in 2008.
- Hanson's 1,890 career points rank third in all-time scoring amongst active players (seventh overall) and he is the seventh player in NFL history to reach 1,800 points.
- With 295 games played, Hanson has now tied Hall of Fame CB Darrell

Lions T **Jeff Backus** has the most consecutive starts among active offensive linemen. He has battled through injuries during his career to string together an impressive streak of starting games (154), especially at one of the most physical positions in the game today. Backus has started every game for the Detroit Lions since he was drafted in the first round of the 2001 NFL Draft.

- Backus' 154 consecutive starts are the second most in team history. Hall of Fame CB Dick Lebeau has the most consecutive starts as a Lion with 171.

Green (Washington Redskins, 1983-2002) for the second-most games played by a player with one team and is now one game behind C Bruce Matthews (Houston Oilers/Tennessee Texans, 1983-2001) for the most games played by a player on one team. His 295 games played also second among active players and 11th all-time.

- Hanson (knee) was inactive at Dallas (11/21) and at Buffalo (11/14).
- In Week 9 against the New York Jets (11/7), Hanson was injured (knee) on a field goal attempt after a Jets player was blocked into him after making the field goal. With the penalty, Detroit scored a touchdown on the next play, but Hanson was limited for the remainder of the game.
- With two 50-yard field goals against the Giants (10/17), Hanson tied an NFL record for games with two-or-more 50-yard field goals in a game (4). The kicks marked the 44th and 45th 50-yard field goals of his career.
- Hanson had another productive day, scoring 14 points against St. Louis (10/10) at Ford Field. He was 3-of-3 on field goals, including kicks from 48 and 47 yards respectively. It was the first time he had scored 14-or-more points in back-to-back games during his 19-year career.
- At Green Bay (10/3), Hanson hit 4-of-5 field goal attempts, including a 52-yarder and a 49-yarder. His lone miss came from 55-yards. It was the 22nd time in Hanson's career that he made four field goals in a single game and he is now tied with K Gary Anderson for third place in NFL History for the most games with four field goals.
  - Hanson's 52-yard field goal at Green Bay (10/3) marked his 43rd career field goal of 50-plus yards which extended his NFL record for the most career 50-yard field goals.
  - Hanson's 14-point game against the Packers (10/3) was his best output since the 2007 season when he had 14 points against Green Bay (11/22) on Thanksgiving Day.

## LIONS INSIDER

P **Nick Harris**, who has established Lions career records in punts (598) and yards (25,792), has been solid since joining the Lions during the 2003 season. His forte has been landing punts inside the 20, and he is fourth in the NFL with 169 since 2004. Harris finished 2009 with 20 of his 74 punts downed inside the 20-yard line (27-percent). It marked the third straight season, and fifth in the previous six, that he has finished with 20-or-more punts inside-the-20. Through 10 games, Harris has 15 punts downed inside-the-20.

- Harris was on point at Dallas (11/21), dropping three of his six punts inside the Cowboys' 5-yard line (2, 4 and 4 respectively).
- At Buffalo (11/14), Harris battled the wind and rain and punted eight times for 333 yards with a long of 52. He had two of his kicks downed inside-the-20, including one at the 1-yard line.
- Harris was solid against the New York Jets (11/7), punting nine times for 424 yards (47.1 avg) with three punts downed inside-the-20.
- Harris punted nine times for 415 yards (46.1 avg) against the Redskins (10/31), including a long of 56 yards. He also had one punt downed inside-the-20.
- At New York (10/17), Harris dropped two of his five punts inside the Giants' 20-yard line, including one inside the 10-yard line.
- Harris punted seven times (300 yards) at Minnesota (9/26) with a long of 53. He also downed one punt inside-the-20.
- In the home opener against Philadelphia (9/19), Harris finished with 210 yards on four punts. His best punt of the day was a 66-yarder which he punted from the Lions' endzone. He also downed one of his punts inside-the-20.
- Harris punted eight times (337 yards) for Detroit at Chicago (9/12), including five times from inside the Lions' 20-yard line. Despite punting to Bears WR Devin Hester, he and the punt coverage units held Chicago to only 17 punt return yards.

## PROTECTING THE QUARTERBACK

Through Week 11, the Detroit Lions offensive line has been one of the most reliable pass protecting lines in the league. Detroit is tied most most pass attempts in the NFL (438) and still has only allowed 18 sacks.

### SUMMARY

After taking an early 14-3 lead and forcing four turnovers, Detroit was held scoreless by Chicago in the second half and they fell to the Bears 19-14 in their 2010 season opener. Chicago opened up the scoring on the game's opening possession. The drive was highlighted by Cutler connecting with WR **Devin Aromashodu** for a 20-yard pickup to the Lions' 38-yard line on third and 2. The Bears advanced to the Lions' 1-yard line before they were halted by the Detroit defense and settled for a 20-yard field goal by K **Robbie Gould** and a 3-0 lead. On the Bears' next possession, Lions' CB **Aaron Berry** intercepted a Cutler pass and returned it 23-yards to the Chicago 42-yard line. A roughing the passer penalty by Bears DE **Julius Peppers**, helped set-up a 7-yard touchdown run by Lions RB **Jahvid Best**, making the score 7-3. One quarter and two Chicago fumbles later, the Lions took a 14-3 lead on another scoring run by Best, this time from 4-yards out. Prior to Best's rushing touchdown, Stafford connected on passes of 15 and 19 yards to RB **Maurice Morris** and WR **Nate Burleson** respectively which put Detroit at the 4-yard line. On the ensuing possession, the Bears stopped Detroit's momentum when RB **Matt Forte** took a screen pass 89-yards down the sideline for a touchdown, pulling the Bears within four at 14-10 with under two-minutes to play in the half. An official replay showed that Forte may have stepped out of bounds on the play, but after an inconclusive review, the play stood. On the Lions' next possession, Peppers sacked Lions' QB **Matthew Stafford** and forced a fumble. Then Gould tacked on another field goal as time expired in the first half, making the halftime score 14-13. The Peppers sack late in the second quarter resulted in a shoulder injury for Stafford and he did not return to the game. QB **Shaun Hill** started and played the entire second half for the Lions. Both teams struggled to move the ball in the third quarter and went scoreless. In the final quarter, Bears LB Lance Briggs blitzed up the middle and caused a fumble while Hill was trying to complete a handoff. The Bears recovered on Detroit's 1-yard line. After three unsuccessful tries, Forte tried to run off tackle and was stopped short by DE **Kyle Vanden Bosch** and the Lions' defense to complete Detroit's goal line stand. The scored remained 14-13 until Cutler orchestrated a 6-play 56-yard drive that ended with him hitting Forte on a wheel route in the endzone. The Bears did not convert the 2-point conversion, but had taken a 19-14 lead. With only 1:32 left in the game, Hill completed four consecutive passes to move the Lions from their own 17-yard line to the Chicago 25. On second-and-10, Hill connected with **Calvin Johnson** in the endzone for what appeared to be a 25-yard touchdown pass, but due to NFL's rule regarding 'the process of a catch', the pass was ruled incomplete. Hill unsuccessfully attempted to get the ball to Johnson on the next two plays, and the Bears held on for the 5-point victory.

### SUMMARY

The Lions jumped out to a 17-7 lead, but fell short to the Eagles 35-32, as a result of a standout performance by Philadelphia QB **Michael Vick**. The Lions had the first possession of the game, and moved into Eagles territory thanks to a third down conversion in which Hill was able to elude a sack by flipping the ball to RB **Jahvid Best** as he ran for a 19-yard gain. The Lions advanced to the Philadelphia 33-yard line before Hill went to the end zone and was intercepted by Eagles S **Nate Allen** on a pass that was in the vicinity of both WR **Calvin Johnson** and TE **Tony Scheffler**. On the ensuing possession, Lions LB **Julian Peterson** was flagged for roughing the passer, which put Philadelphia in Lions territory. On the next play, Eagles QB Michael Vick hit WR **DeSean Jackson** over the middle, and watched Jackson outrun the Lions defense for a 45-yard touchdown, putting the Eagles up 7-0. Detroit responded quickly due to the play of Best who tied the game with a 14-yard touchdown, which capped off a drive where Best had 64-yards on 4 carries. In the second quarter, two Eagles penalties helped move the Lions into field goal range. K **Jason Hanson** sent a 49-yard field goal through the uprights to give the Lions a 10-7 lead. After a Philadelphia punt, Best caught a screen and raced past the Eagles defense for 75-yard touchdown, upping the Lions' lead to 17-7. Less than two minutes later, the Eagles moved to within 3 at 17-14 after RB **LeSean McCoy** burst up the middle for a 14-yard touchdown run. Then, with less than two minutes left in the half, Vick connected with Jackson for a 53-yard gain down the middle of the field. That play set up a 9-yard touchdown reception by WR **Jeremy Maclin** to give Philadelphia a 21-17 lead heading into the half. The Eagles scored on their second possession of the third quarter on McCoy's second touchdown run of the game, this time, for 4 yards. The Eagles defense held the Lions scoreless in the third quarter and stretched their lead to 35-17 when McCoy took a shotgun handoff from Vick 46-yards for the score, one play after Vick hit a crossing WR **Jason Avant** for an 18-yard gain on third and 16. The Lions went no-huddle on their next possession and QB **Shaun Hill** went 5-for-6 for 83 yards on the drive before Best punched it in from 2-yards out, making the score 35-24. The Lions defense forced a three-and-out on the ensuing possession, due in large part to a S **Louis Delmas** sack of Vick along the Detroit sideline on third down. Hill's passing anchored another Lions' scoring drive which was capped off with Hill connecting with WR **Calvin Johnson** on a post in the end zone. Hill and Johnson hooked up again for a successful two-point conversion, which brought the Lions within three at 35-32. On the subsequent kickoff, Detroit went for an onside kick and it was recovered by Lions S **Randy Phillips** after an Eagles player bobbled the ball. The Lions did not advance the ball after four incomplete passes and the Eagles escaped with a three-point win.

## SUMMARY

Detroit could not sustain their early advantage and fell to Minnesota 24-10 in Minneapolis. After forcing the Vikings to punt on their first two possessions, the Lions made the first impact play of the afternoon when DT **Corey Williams** intercepted a screen pass from Vikings QB **Brett Favre** that was intended for RB **Toby Gerhart**. Williams returned the ball 27 yards to the Minnesota 12-yard line. Three plays later, Lions QB **Shaun Hill** was flushed out of the pocket and found TE **Tony Scheffler** in the end zone from five yards out to give Detroit a 7-0 lead. The momentum shifted after the Vikings' next possession, on which the Lions had forced another punt. Lions WR Stefan Logan muffed the punt by Vikings P **Chris Kluge**, and Minnesota recovered at the Detroit 24-yard line. On the ensuing play, Favre found WR **Percy Harvin** streaking to the end zone for a 24-yard touchdown, which evened the score at seven. On their next possession, the Lions moved down the field quickly, in large part due to a 16-yard run by RB Jahvid Best and a leaping 21-yard grab by WR **Calvin Johnson**. FB **Jerome Felton** had a 16-yard run of his own to the Minnesota eight-yard line that would've given the Lions a first and goal, but it was negated by a holding call on C **Dominic Raiola**. As a result, Detroit was ultimately forced to attempt a 44-yard field goal, which K **Jason Hanson** missed wide left. On the Vikings next possession, the Lions appeared to have forced another Favre turnover when the quarterback fumbled and the Lions recovered, but an unnecessary roughness penalty on Detroit LB **Julian Peterson** nullified the Lions recovery. The Vikings proceeded to score on that possession when RB **Adrian Peterson** punched it in from 6-yards out which gave the Vikings a 14-7 lead. The Vikings held that lead until an interception by Lions' CB **Alphonso Smith** helped to set up a 33-yard field goal by Hanson as time expired in the first half, making the score 14-10 Vikings. On the first drive on the second half, the Lions forced another Minnesota turnover when CB **Chris Houston** made a diving interception. Houston was flagged for illegal contact, and the Vikings capitalized with a 31-yard **Ryan Longwell** field goal upping the Vikings lead to 17-10. After Minnesota stopped Lions RB **Maurice Morris** for negative yardage on a third and two, the Vikings hastily extended their lead on the first play of their next series as Peterson broke free for an 80-yard touchdown run that allowed the Vikings to open up a 14-point lead at 24-10. As they did in the first two games, the Lions fought back valiantly in the fourth quarter. With less than eight minutes left, the Lions went to the shotgun exclusively and Hill methodically moved the Lions down the field with the passing game to the Minnesota four-yard line before being intercepted in the end zone by Vikings LB **Ben Leber**. The Lions' next possession looked similar to their last, with Hill finding an array of receivers as they moved the ball into the redzone on the Minnesota defense. With about a minute left, Hill targeted Scheffler in the end zone and was intercepted by Vikings CB **Antoine Winfield**, which sealed the victory for Minnesota.

## SUMMARY

In Green Bay, Detroit fought valiantly and controlled the ball for the vast majority of the game, but came up two-points short as they lost to the Packers 28-26. The Packers benefited from a 15-yard face mask penalty on the opening kickoff and opened their first possession at their 45-yard line. They capitalized on the good field position when QB Aaron Rodgers found WR Donald Driver in the end zone for a 29-yard touchdown giving the Packers a 7-0 lead. The Lions' first possession featured two third down conversions by TE's Brandon Pettigrew and Tony Scheffler for 13 and 18 yards respectively, before Packers LB A.J. Hawk intercepted a pass from Lions QB Shaun Hill. Early in the second quarter, the Lions got on the scoreboard with a 23-yard touchdown reception by Lions WR Calvin Johnson. Hill found Johnson three times for 44 yards on the drive. The score tied the game at seven. Later in the quarter, a fumble by Detroit RB Jahvid Best that was recovered by Green Bay helped set-up a 13-yard strike from Rodgers to TE Jermichael Finley putting the Packers back up by seven at 14-7. The Packers forced the Lions into a three-and-out, and tacked on another seven points as WR Greg Jennings brought in a 17-yard touchdown, upping the Packers' lead to 21-7. The score was setup by a 48-yard catch by Driver. The Lions closed the gap to seven before halftime due to a 13-play, 80-yard drive that culminated with Johnson catching his second touchdown of the game. This time he scored from 21-yards out. Hill connected on 10-of-11 passes on the drive. On the first possession of the second half, Packers CB Charles Woodson made a diving interception and returned it 48-yards for a touchdown. The play was upheld after a challenge by Detroit and the Packers led 28-14. The Lions used a balanced attack to move down the field quickly on their ensuing drive, which ended with a 39-yard field goal by Lions K Jason Hanson, taking the score to 28-17. On the next possession, Lions CB Chris Houston intercepted a Rodgers pass at the Detroit 11, but the play was nullified due to an offsides penalty against Lions DE Turk McBride. Three plays later, Houston picked off Rodgers again as he tried to connect with Jennings. The Lions recovered at the Rams' 41-yard line and moved quickly into field goal range opening up the scoring with a 30-yard field goal by K **Jason Hanson**, putting the Lions on top 3-0. After each team punted the ball away, the Rams put together a drive that took them to the Detroit 9-yard line. Appearing to be on the brink of scoring, the Rams' drive ended when Rams WR **Danny Amendola** fumbled after receiving a pass from QB **Sam Bradford**. Lions CB **Alphonso Smith** recovered the ball and then fumbled it himself, and it was finally picked up and returned to the Lions' 27 by CB **Jonathan Wade**. After a Lions' punt, the Rams drove 62 yards in 12 plays in a drive that culminated in a 28-yard field goal by K **Josh Brown**, making the score 3-3 as the first quarter ended. On the ensuing kickoff, Lions WR **Stefan Logan** caught the ball five yards into his own end zone and maneuvered his way through the Rams' coverage team as he made the score 10-3 with a 105-yard return touchdown. Giants' RB **Ahmad Bradshaw** broke a 45-yard run which set up another score by Jacobs, this time for six-yards, extending the Giants' lead to 28-17. Lions WR **Stefan Logan** returned the ensuing kickoff 58 yards to the New York 40. ### SUMMARY

The Lions go their second victory with a 37-25 win over the Washington Redskins at Ford Field. In the first quarter, both offenses were relatively ineffective. The best scoring chance came in on the Lions second possession when QB Matthew Stafford, who was making his first start in six games, threw an interception to Redskins CB DeAngelo Hall while trying to hit Lions' WR Calvin Johnson in the corner of the end zone. Stafford didn't let the mistake sit with him very long. After a 71-yard punt return by Lions' WR Stefan Logan, Stafford found WR Calvin Johnson who spun out of a tackle and extended the ball across the goal line for a 13-yard Lions touchdown and 7-0 Detroit lead. Redskins WR Brandon Banks returned the ensuing kickoff 46-yards to the Lions for 47, which helped to setup a 6-yard touchdown pass from Redskins QB Donovan McNabb to RB Ryan Torain to even the score at 7-7. Washington took a 10-7 lead later in the second quarter when K Graham Gano hit a 38-yard field goal. Gano added a 46-yard field goal before the half to up Washington's lead to 13-7 heading into the locker room. The Lions started their second drive of the second half at their own 48-yard line after a 23-yard punt by Washington P Hunter Smith. A 20-yard run to the Washington 16 by Lions' RB Jahvid Best put the Lions in the red zone for the second time. Detroit capitalized when Stafford completed a short pass to TE Brandon Pettigrew for the score, which allowed the Lions to regain the lead at 14-13. The Redskins answered quickly as Banks returned Lions' K Jason Hanson's kick 96-yards for what would be Washington's final six points of the game. Again, the Redskins failed to convert the two-point attempt and the score sat at 25-20, Washington. The Lions were forced to punt on their next possession, but CB Alphonso Smith helped them get the ball back when he intercepted McNabb and gave the Lions the ball at the Washington 37. On fourth-and-one from the Washington 10-yard line, Stafford threaded-the-needle when he found Calvin Johnson for their third touchdown of the afternoon. On the two-point try, Stafford hit WR Bryant Johnson to put the Lions up 28-25. On the ensuing possession, McNabb was sacked by Lions DE Cliff Avril on fourth down at the Redskins' 20-yard line. The turnover resulted in a 32-yard field goal by Hanson, extending the Lions lead to 31-25. The Redskins opted for backup QB Rex Grossman, who was sacked on his first play by Lions DE Kyle Vanden Bosch and fumbled; the ball was scooped up by Detroit DT Ndamukong Suh who proceeded to strut into the end zone for the final score with under two minutes left. Though the two-point conversion attempt fell incomplete, the Lions had the game in hand and held onto win, 37-25.

New York S Brodney Pool was flagged for illegal contact on a third-and-9, which gave the Lions a first-and-goal at the New York 10-yard line. Detroit got on the scoreboard when Stafford connected with TE Brandon Pettigrew for a 10-yard touchdown, which put the Lions ahead 7-0. The defenses for each team took control of the game until late in the second quarter. Jets' K Nick Folk culminated a nearly four minute New York drive with a 31-yard field goal that made the score 7-3. After a Lions punt, Jets' QB Mark Sanchez successfully threw a bomb to WR Braylon Edwards for a 74-yard score with one minute remaining in the first half. The Lions had the ball as the quarter began and quickly moved the ball to the New York 1-yard line due to a 36-yard pass-and-catch from Stafford to Burleson and then a blatant pass interference call on Jets' S Eric Smith in the end zone. On third-and-goal from the two, Stafford lobbed a pass to Burleson for another Lions touchdown. Hanson returned and tacked on the extra point to give Detroit a 20-10 advantage. While Hanson could try short kicks, the kickoff duties were relegated to P Nick Harris. Later in the quarter, while trying to escape pressure, Stafford scrambled up the middle and landed hard on his right shoulder. He left the game and did not return. He was replaced by QB Drew Stanton. On third-and-six, on the ensuing Lions' possession, Detroit ran a bootleg with Stanton that the Jets covered well. Stanton's pass to FB Jerome Felton fell incomplete, stopping the clock at 1:54. The Jets took over with 1:40 remaining, and used short passes to move close to midfield. New York moved into field goal range after Lions LB Julian Peterson was flagged for a late hit on Jets RB LaDainian Tomlinson. Four snaps later, Folk hit a 36-yard field goal as time expired to send the game into overtime at 20-20. The Jets won the toss and got the first possession of the extra stanza. On their second play, Sanchez found WR Antonio Holmes on a dig route across the middle, and he raced 52-yards before he was dragged down by Lions' LB DeAndre Levy at the Detroit 16. In his career, he has played 35 games (22 starts), collected 79 tackles (53 solo), registered 13.5 sacks (92.5 yards lost), knocked down 6 passes, recovered 2 fumbles, forced 8 fumbles and has 3 special teams tackles.

- It didn't take long for Avril to prove himself as a pro during his rookie season as he quickly emerged as a regular contributor in the defensive end rotation. Among all rookie pass rushers in 2008, he finished tied for first with 5.0 sacks and was first with four forced fumbles.

Backus has been the Lions' mainstay at left tackle since being drafted in the first round (18th overall) in the 2001 NFL Draft, and has never missed a game or start (154 consecutive starts) in his career. He has more consecutive starts than any Lions offensive lineman in team history.

- He has the longest streak among active interior (offense and defense) linemen in the League and his streak is the fifth longest in the NFL among active players.
- His 154 consecutive starts rank second all-time in team history behind Hall of Fame CB Dick LeBeau (171).
- He is the only player drafted in 2001 who has started every game as a pro.
- Backus and teammate C Dominic Raiola had started more consecutive games (105) than any active offensive line pair in the NFL until Raiola missed his first career game vs. Jacksonville (11/9/08).

Best started 18-of-31 games at California, carrying the ball 364 times for 2,668 yards (7.33 yards per carry) and 29 touchdowns. Also caught 62 passes for 533 yards (8.60 yards per catch) and six scores. His 2,668 yards rushing rank seventh in school history behind Russell White (3,367, 1990-92), Marshawn Lynch (3,230, 2004-06), Justin Forsett (3,220, 2004-07), Joe Igber (3,124, 1999-02), Chuck Muncie (3,052, 1973-75), and Paul Jones (2,930, 1975, 77-79). His 1,580 yards on the ground in 2008 rank second on Cal's season-record chart, topped by J.J. Arrington (2,018 in 2004).

**2010:** Through ten games, Best has gained 757 all-purpose yards (382 rushing, 375 receiving) and has scored 5 touchdowns (4 rushing, 1 receiving). With 5 touchdowns, Best is the first rookie in the league to score five touchdowns in his first two career games since Lions RB Billy Sims (4 rushing, 1 receiving).

- In regular season opener at Chicago (9/12), carried the ball 14 times for 20 yards and 2 touchdowns for 7 and 4 yards respectively. Best also caught 5 passes for 16 yards. Best's 2 rushing scores are the most by a Lions rookie running back in their first game since RB Billy Sims had three at the Los Angeles Rams September 7, 1980. Both Best and Sims performances occurred on opening day.
- Best was the only rookie on opening day to record two rushing touchdowns.
- Against Philadelphia (9/19) rushed for 78 yards and 2 touchdowns and caught 9 passes for 154 yards and a touchdown. Best is the first rookie in NFL history with at least 75 yards, 150 receiving yards and 3 touchdowns in a single game. He is also the first player to accomplish the feat since Buffalo RB Joe Cribbs vs. Cleveland 11/1/81 (85 rushing, 163 receiving).
- Best's 232 all-purpose yards and 3 touchdowns are the fifth-most single-game total yards from scrimmage since 1960 and his 232 yards are the most by a rookie since 1960.
- With 154 receiving yards, Best has most receiving yards in a game by a rookie running back during the Super Bowl era and the most single-game receiving yards by a Lions rookie running back in team history. His 154 yards are the most since Dave Middleton recorded a team record 168 yards vs. Chicago (11/20/55). Best's 9 receptions are the most by a rookie running back in team history.
- Best's 75-yard screen pass for a touchdown in the second quarter ties for the fourth longest reception by a Lions rookie since 1947.
- Rushed 7 times for 26 yards and caught 2 catches for 13 yards at Minnesota (9/26) before having to leave the game with a toe injury.
- Combined for 96 yards against St. Louis (10/10), including 59 rushing yards and 37 receiving yards. It was his second-highest tally of total yards from scrimmage on the season. Career high 18 rushing attempts.
- Combined for 88 total yards (48 rushing, 40 receiving) against the New York Jets (11/7).

The 19-year veteran, and one of the NFL's most productive kickers, is the Lions' all-time scoring leader with 1,890 points as well as the all-time leader in field goals (439) and extra points (573). Hanson is only the sixth player in NFL history to connect on 400 career field goals. With a 51-yarder at Indianapolis (12/14/08) Hanson recorded his 41st 50+-yard field goal and set the all-time record for 50+-yard field goals in his career by surpassing Morten Andersen.

- Voted team captain for fourth-straight year (2007-10).
- Hanson is the first kicker in NFL history to go 8-for-8 on 50+-yard field goals in a single season.
- In 2008, he was named to the Lions 75th Season All-Time Team.
- Hanson became only the eighth player in NFL history to surpass the 1,700-point mark in 2008, and with 1,890 career points he ranks second in all-time scoring amongst active players and seventh all-time.
- Also holds NFL record making 24 consecutive field goals of 40+ yards.
- Hanson ranks first in every statistical category for a place kicker in Lions history with longest field goal (56), field goals made (439), field goals attempted (536), points scored (1890), extra points made (573) and extra points attempted (581).
- He is also the franchise leader in games played with 295 and is the franchise's all-time leader in seasons played with 19.
- Is tied for the second-most games (295) played by a player with one team in NFL history.
- Hanson, who made Pro Bowl appearances following the 1997 and 1999 seasons, has led the Lions in scoring in each of his 18 pro seasons, one of two active players to lead his team in scoring for at least 18 seasons. He is the only player in NFL history to lead the same team in scoring for the first 18 years of their career.
- He is a five-time winner of the Lions' Yale Lary Special Teams Player of the Year Award (1993, '99, '03, '06 and '08).
- Has connected on 394-of-453 (.870) career field goal attempts inside the 50-yard line and is a remarkable 276-of-290 (.952) from inside the 40-yard line for his career. From 40+ Yards, he is 163-of-246 (.663).
- Hanson has proved to be a valuable asset to the Lions as the team is 69-63 (.523) in his career when he kicks two-or-more field goals in a game, 40-20 (.667) when he makes three-or-more and 17-5 (.773) when he converts four field goals in a contest.
- In addition, Hanson has made 17 game-winning, fourth quarter or overtime kicks during his career (10 in regulation; seven in overtime).
- The Spokane, Wash., native has only missed eight extra points in his career (570-of-578) and has been perfect in PAT tries in 11 different seasons (1992-93, 1995-96 and 2000-02, 2004-06, 2009).
- Hanson has been quite accurate at Ford Field since the Lions began play there in 2002, going 120-for-136 (.882) on field goal attempts, which include five fourth-quarter or overtime game-winners and a long of 54 yards. He has made the second-most field goals at home (119) in the NFL since 2002.
- On kicks from 40+-yards at home since 2002, Hanson is 50-of-63 (79.4). He has the best field goal percentage at home for that range among kickers with at least 40 attempts.

**2010:** The season opener marked Hanson's 19<sup>th</sup> NFL season and his 288th game. Hanson is tied for third for the most seasons a player has played with the team that originally drafted them. He is behind Hall of Fame T Jackie Slater 20 with L.A. Rams) and Hall of Fame CB Darrell Green (20 with Washington Redskins). He is also 11<sup>th</sup> overall in League history in career games. On the season, he is 3-of-4 (.750) on 50-yard attempts and 7-of-9 (.778) on 40+-yard attempts.

- Was 3-of-3 on PATs and connected on a 49-yard field goal vs. Philadelphia (9/19) in the second quarter to put the Lions ahead, 10-7.
- Was successful on four field goals, including a 52-yarder at Green Bay (10/3). The 52-yarder was his 43rd career 50-yard field which extended his NFL record for the most career 50-yard field goals. Hanson has made

a 50-yard field goal in 16 of his 19 NFL seasons, including the last 6 seasons. He is now tied with K Gary Anderson for third place in NFL History for the most games with four field goals.

- Connected on three field goals against St. Louis (10/10) and was a perfect 5-of-5 on PATs.
- Scored 14 points against the Rams marking the first time in his career he has scored at least 14 points in back-to-back games.
- Connected on two 50-yard field goals (50, 50) at the New York Giants (10/17), his 44th and 45th of his career. Tied an NFL Record with three other players (Josh Brown, Martin Gramatica and John Kasay) by making two 50-yard field goals in a game for the fourth time in his career.
- Played in his 295th career game vs. the New York Jets (11/7) and has now tied Hall of Fame CB Darrell Green (Washington Redskins, 1983-2002) for the second-most games played by a player with one team.
- Was 2-for-2 in PATs against the New York Jets (11/7). Suffered injury on a roughing the kicker penalty following short field goal attempt during the third quarter Was not able to perform normal kickoff duties for rest of game, but kicked extra point in fourth quarter.
- Missed only his second game of his 19-year career (inactive) due to a right knee injury at Buffalo (11/14).
- Inactive for second week in a row at Dallas (11/21), after suffering knee injury at the New York Jets (11/7).

As a proven, veteran quarterback, Hill adds valuable depth to the team's quarterback position. Has a 11-12 record as a starter (8-2 at home).

- Through his first 16 career starts (10-6), his career .625 winning pct. as a starter is the fourth-highest winning percentage among all undrafted quarterbacks since 1970 (min. 10 starts). All 16 starts at quarterback occurred while with the San Francisco 49ers (2006-09) and winning percentage (.625) is the third highest winning percentage in 49ers history.
- In his first NFL start, he set a record for the highest completion percentage in NFL history for a player making his first pass attempts.

One of the league's elite receivers who possesses a unique blend of size, strength and speed. With 3,796 yards, Johnson has the most receiving yards by a Lions player in their first four years with the club. His 248 receptions are also first and his 31 receiving touchdowns are second in that category.

- Career rushing totals include 16 attempts for 128 yards (8.0 avg) and one TD.
- Since the 2008 season, Johnson is third with 27 receiving touchdowns seventh in receiving yards (3,040) and seventh in the NFL with 28 receptions of 25+ yards.
- Since entering the NFL in 2007, Johnson has recorded 33 receptions of 25+ yards.
- Johnson's 12 career 100-yard games are tied for sixth on the Lions' all-time list.
- Johnson is the only player in Lions history with two receptions of 85+ yards.
- With three career receptions of 75+ yards, he is tied with WR Herman Moore and WR Cloyce Box for the second-most receptions of 75+ yards in franchise history behind WR Leonard Thompson (4).
- With four career receptions of 70+ yards, Johnson is tied with WR Herman Moore for the second-most receptions for 70+ yards in team history behind WR Leonard Thompson (5).
- Johnson has now caught passes in all 55 games he has played in his career. His streak of 55-consecutive games with a reception is the longest active streak by a Lions receiver.
- In 2008, he led Detroit with 78 receptions for 1,331 yards (17.1 avg.) and 12 touchdowns. Johnson finished the 2008 season with some of the top offensive statistics in the NFL: tied for first in touchdown receptions (12), fifth in receiving yards (1,331), second in yards per catch among receivers with 60 receptions (17.1), tied for second in 20+-yard receptions (21), tied for second in 40+-yard receptions (seven) and tied for first in 25+-yard touchdown catches (six).

- It is the second time in his career that he has recorded 100 yards in back-to-back games and first since he did so in 2008 (107 at Atlanta 9/7/08 and 129 vs. Green Bay 9/14/08).
- With 101 receiving yards, Johnson passed WR Gail Cogdill (3,534 yards, 1960-63) for the second-most receiving yards by a player in their first four seasons with the Lions.
- Johnson surpassed WR Brett Perriman (226, 2004-07) for the second-most receptions by a Lions' receiver in their first four seasons with the club.
- In the four games he played in October, Johnson was quite formidable throughout the month of October as he caught 24 passes for 387 yards and scored 7 touchdowns in the four games the Lions played in the month. He was a critical piece to the Lions going 2-2 in October and winning both home games.
- Johnson's set a franchise record with 7 receiving touchdowns for the month of October. He broke the previous mark of 6 touchdown receptions by WR Herman Moore in 1995. - His 387 receiving yards are the most by a Lions receiver in October since WR Herman Moore registered 415 receiving yards.
- Named NFC Offensive Player of the Week for his performance against Washington (10/31) in Week 8.
- Had a career high 10 catches for 128 yards and 1 touchdown at Buffalo (11/14). His 10 receptions marked the first time a Lions' receiver caught 10 passes in a game since WR Mike Furrey (11) at Dallas December 31, 2006.
- Johnson's 128 receiving yards was his 12th career 100-yard receiving game, and third in the past four games. With 12 career 100-yard games, Johnson tied WR Gail Cogdill for the sixth-most career 100-yard receiving games by a Lions' receiver.
- Johnson caught a 20-yard touchdown pass from QB Shaun Hill with :14 seconds left in the game to set up a potential game-tying two-point conversion. The touchdown reception was Johnson's 30th career reception and he joined WR Cloyce Box (32 from 1949-50, '52-'53) as the only players in Lions history to register 30 receiving touchdowns in their first four years with the Lions.
- With 128 receiving yards against the Bills, it pushed his career total to 3,750 yards. He moved past WR Roy Williams (3,652 from 2004-07) for the most receiving yards by a Lions' receiver in the first four years with the club.

Pettigrew is a big, athletic tight end who has the ability to stretch the field as a receiver and aggressively block at the line of scrimmage.

- Started in the first 11 games of his career before a knee injury on Thanksgiving Day vs. Green Bay (11/26) forced him out for the remainder of his rookie season.
- Led all NFL rookie tight ends in 2009 with 30 catches for 346 yards, and was tied for the most receiving touchdowns (two).
- Regarded by many as the most complete tight end to enter the 2009 NFL Draft, the Lions selected Pettigrew in the first round (20th overall) of the 2009 NFL Draft.

**2010:** Team's starting tight end. Currently tied for first among tight ends in the NFL with 50 catches and is fifth with 487 receiving yards. His 50 receptions are the third-highest tally by a Lions player in the era of the Modern Tight End (1960).

- Pettigrew became the seventh Lions tight end to surpass 40 receptions in a season since 1960, including Jim Gibbons (1960, 1961 and 1964), Charlie Sanders (1968, 1969, 1970 and 1974), David Hill (1978 and 1979), David Sloan (1999), Stephen Alexander (2004) and Marcus Pollard (2005). He is the first tight end to reach 40 catches in a season since Pollard in 2005.
- Now with 42 catches on the season, Pettigrew is tied for eighth places on the team's receptions list by a tight end (since 1960). He is tied with Hall of Fame TE Charlie Sanders (1969 and 1974). Pettigrew is 11 receptions away for the most receptions by a Lions tight end since 1960 (TE David Hill, 53 in 1978).

As the Lions starting signal caller, Stafford combines great arm strength and accuracy with exceptional ability to read opponent's defenses to lead the team's offense.

- Rookie campaign was highlighted by his 13 touchdowns passes (Lions rookie passing record) and his gritty performance against Cleveland when he threw for an NFL record 422 yards and tied a league single-game rookie record with five touchdown passes.
- Selected by the Lions with the first overall pick in the 2009 NFL Draft and was named the team's starting quarterback to start the regular season. He was the youngest player to start the regular season at quarterback since drew Bledsoe in 1993.

2010: Team's second-year starting quarterback who was named an offensive team captain.

- Started and played the first two quarters of the season opener at Chicago (9/12) before getting hit near the end of the half, forcing him out of the game with a shoulder injury. Finished with 11 of 15 completions for 83 yards.
- Inactive vs. Philadelphia (9/19), at Minnesota (9/26), at Green Bay (10/3) and vs. St. Louis (10/10) due to a shoulder injury suffered in season opener.
- Listed as third quarterback at the New York Giants (10/17).

With a 90.2 passer rating vs. Washington (10/31), it marked the first time in his two-year career he has registered passer ratings of 90.0 in back-to-back games. Also ran for third career rushing touchdown. Left game in fourth quarter due to shoulder injury.
- Inactive (right shoulder) at Buffalo (11/14) and at Dallas (11/21).

Selected in the first round (2<sup>nd</sup> overall) in the 2010 NFL Draft. Suh brings aggressiveness and instinct to the Lions' front four and is expected to become a dominant mainstay in the middle.

- Suh started 39 of 53 games during his five-year career at Nebraska, recording 215 tackles (125 solos) with 24.0 quarterback sacks for minus 187 yards, 57.0 stops for losses of 252 yards and 39 pressures.
- Caused three fumbles and recovered another, intercepted four passes for 79 yards in returns that included two touchdowns and also recorded 15 pass defenses. Also added a two-yard touchdown pass and blocked six kicks.
- His 57 tackles behind the line of scrimmage rank second in school history behind Grant Wistrom (58.5, 1994-97). Those 57 stops for loss lead all active NCAA defensive tackles and rank second overall to defensive end George Selvie of South Florida (69, 2006-09).

- Scored first career touchdown on fumble recovery (17 yards) against Washington (10/31) in the fourth quarter to season Lions' 37-25 victory. Recorded career-high 2.0 sacks, five tackles (4 solo) and became the first rookie to record 2 sacks in a game since DE Kalimba Edwards at Arizona December 8, 2002. He is the first Lions rookie defensive tackle to record two sacks in a game since sacks became an official statistic in 1982.
- With the 17-yard fumble return for a touchdown, Suh became the first Lions rookie defensive lineman to return a fumble for a touchdown since Bob Bell (25 yards) at Green Bay November 1, 1971.
- In the month of October, Suh finished with 14 tackles, 4.5 sacks (29.5 yards lost), 1 interception, 1 pass defense and a 17-yard fumble return for a touchdown. Suh's 4.5 sacks in October are the most for the month by a Lions rookie since sacks became official in 1982. They are the fifth-most among all Lions' defensive players for October and the second-most (DT Doug English in 1983) among Lions defensive tackles.
- With 4.5 sacks in October, Suh became the first rookie defensive tackle to record 4.5 sacks in October since Jacksonville DT John Henderson had 5.0 in 2002. He also became the first defensive tackle in the NFL to collect 4.5 sacks during October since Tampa Bay DT Warren Sapp had 5.0 in 2005.
- Three solo tackles against the New York Jets (11/7). Attempted first career PAT in third quarter (miss, hit right upright).
- Three tackles (1 solo), tackle of loss and quarterback hit at Buffalo (11/14).

Signed with Detroit March 6, 2010 and immediately upgraded the defensive line, on and off the field. Emerged as one of the most productive defensive ends in the NFL in recent years while earning three Pro Bowl invitations.

- Spent his first four NFL seasons with the Arizona Cardinals (2001-04), before signing with Tennessee.
- Was a defensive captain for the Titans each of the past three seasons (2007-09).
- Had a team-high 38.5 sacks during his five seasons (2005-09) in Tennessee in addition to leading the team's defensive linemen in tackles in three of those seasons.
- In 2007, he was named as a starter at defensive end in his second career Pro Bowl after leading the team and finishing sixth in AFC with 12 sacks.
