## NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (9-2) vs. NEW YORK JETS (9-2)

Mon., Dec. 6, 2010 ★ Gillette Stadium (68,756) ★ 8:30 p.m. EST

The New England Patriots and the New York Jets will meet on Monday Night Football at Gillette Stadium in a battle for first place in the AFC East. Both teams enter this week's contest with 9-2 records following victories on Thanksgiving Day, with the Patriots taking a 45-24 win at Detroit and the Jets beating Cincinnati, 26-10, at home. The Patriots will attempt to avenge a 28-14 loss in the first meeting of the season between the teams at the New Meadowlands Stadium on Sept. 19. The Patriots head into the month of December this week with the NFL's best record in December since the start of the 2002 season with a 29-5 record. Since Gillette Stadium opened in 2002, the Patriots are 16-1 in home games in December. Their only loss was a Dec. 22, 2002 game against the New York Jets. New England has won 15 of their last 16 December games.

## TEDY BRUSCHI NIGHT

The Patriots will honor former LB Tedy Bruschi in a special halftime ceremony. He closed his career as one of the most productive Patriots players in team history. As a team captain, Bruschi's relentless work ethic and on-field intensity helped set the tone for the entire team. Bruschi was originally drafted by the Patriots in the third round of the 1996 NFL Draft. He spent his entire 13-year NFL career with the Patriots. Bruschi left the football field having played a major role in leading the Patriots to 11 winning records, including nine playoff seasons, eight division championships, five conference titles and three Super Bowl crowns.

## PATRIOTS HAVE MOST 9-PLUS WIN SEASONS SINCE 2001

The Patriots are the only team in the NFL to have recorded nine or more wins in each of the last 10 seasons. The Patriots claimed their 9<sup>th</sup> win of the year with a 45-24 win over the Detroit Lions on Thanksgiving Day (11/25).

### **BRADY WINS 25th STRAIGHT START AT GILLETTE**

Tom Brady will attempt to win his 26th consecutive regular-season start at Gillette Stadium. He is currently tied with Brett Favre (1995-98) for the NFL record with 25 consecutive regular-season wins at home. The last time the Patriots lost a regular-season home game in which Brady started was on Nov. 12, 2006 against the New York Jets.



## <u>Patriots vs. Jets</u>

### **SERIES HISTORY**

The Patriots and Jets will meet for the 103rd time since the series between the AFC East rivals began in 1960. The Jets took the lead in the series 51-50-1 following a 28-14 win in Week 2 of the 2010 season at the New Meadowlands Stadium.







beat the Patriots 16-9 at the Meadowlands last season and the Patriots beat the Jets, 31-14, at Gillette Stadium in the rematch.

New England is 6-3 against the Jets all-time at Gillette Stadium. The Patriots have won 12 of their last 16 games against the Jets (including one playoff game). The Patriots have swept the season series 13 times,

including four times under head coach Bill Belichick (2003, 04, 05, and 07). New England is 21-13 against the Jets since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994. New England's 50 victories over the Jets (including two playoff wins) are the second most over any single opponent, trailing only Buffalo with 60 all-time wins.

Quarterback Mark Sanchez threw three touchdowns to lead the New York Jets to a 28-14 victory over the New England Patriots at The New Meadowlands Stadium. New England jumped in front 14-10 in the first half, but in the second half the Jets scored 18, forced three turnovers and held the Patriots to just 80 total yards and no points.

The Patriots dominated the start of the game with a 7:34 drive and an 8:10 drive but came away with just one touchdown on those two possessions. New England opened the game with a 13-play drive that ended at the Jets 19-yard line with a missed field goal. After stopping the Jets on three straight plays on the next series, the Patriots went on a 15-play, 75-yard drive that ended with a 6-yard touchdown pass from QB Tom Brady to WR Wes Welker for a 7-0 lead early in the second quarter.

The Jets converted two third-down plays on the ensuing drive to get into position for Sanchez's first touchdown pass of the day, a 10-yard pass to WR Braylon Edwards, to tie the game at 7-7. New England took a 14-7 lead later in the second quarter following a 46-yard pass from Brady to rookie TE Aaron Hernandez on a 3rd-and-10 play for a first down at the Jets 34-yard line. Hernandez finished the game with six receptions for 101 yards. On the next play, Brady went deep for WR Randy Moss for a 34-yard touchdown pass. The touchdown marked the 150<sup>th</sup> touchdown of Moss' career, as he became just the fourth NFL player to reach at least 150 touchdowns. Jets CB Darrelle Revis aggravated his hamstring on the play to Moss and did not return to the game.

The Jets got the ball back with 53 seconds left in the first half and Sanchez completed 3-of-4 passes for 41 yards to move to the 31-yard line where K Nick Folk connected on a 49-yard field goal to cut the New England lead to 14-10 at the break.

Brady threw two interceptions and lost a fumble on a sack in the second half. The first turnover came when Jets CB Antonio Cromartie intercepted a Brady pass at the New York three-yard line on a pass intended for Moss in the end zone. The Jets took over and engineered 10-play, 80-yard drive that ended in a field goal to cut the lead to, 14-13. A 31-yard run by RB LaDainian Tomlinson on the Jets next series helped set up a 2-yard touchdown pass from Sanchez to WR Jerricho Cotchery and a Sanchez 2-point play to Edwards put the Jets in front, 21-14.

Early in the fourth quarter Brady was intercepted by Jets S Brodney Pool on a deep pass to Moss. After two pass interference penalties against the Patriots aided a drive that ended in a 1-yard touchdown pass from Sanchez to TE Dustin Keller for a 28-14 lead, Brady moved the Patriots to the New York 16-yard line. A strip sack by LB Jason Taylor ended the scoring threat. New York ran out the final four minutes to win the game.

## GAME NOTES FROM THE FIRST MEETING DL GERARD WARREN REGISTERS TWO SACKS

DL Gerard Warren registered his second career two-sack game after a 10-yard sack of Jets QB Mark Sanchez in the second quarter and a 6-yard sack in the third quarter. Warren's other two-sack game was December 14, 2003 at Denver while playing for Cleveland.

## **ROOKIES GOOD IN NEW YORK**

Rookie TE Aaron Hernandez registered six receptions for 101 yards at New York (9/19/10). It was the first 100-yard receiving game by a New England tight end since Ben Watson had 107 yards receiving on Oct. 7, 2007 vs. Cleveland. Last season, WR Julian Edelman made his NFL debut at the Jets (9/20/09) and caught eight passes for 98 yards.

### PATRIOTS ON MONDAY NIGHT FOOTBALL

The New England Patriots are 18-22 all-time on Monday Night Football, including 11-5 under head coach Bill Belichick and 3-1 at Gillette Stadium. The Patriots are 1-0 in 2010 on Monday Night Football, following a 41-14 win at Miami on Oct.4. The Patriots are 8-8 in home Monday Night Football games and 10-14 on the road.

### **BRADY AGAINST THE AFC EAST**

As a starter against the AFC East, Tom Brady owns a 41-11 (.788) record. He is 16-1 against Buffalo, 12-4 against the New York Jets, 11-6 against Miami and was 2-0 against Indianapolis when they were in the AFC East (2001 season).

### **BRADY ON MONDAY NIGHT FOOTBALL**

QB Tom Brady owns a 9-4 record when playing on Monday Night Football. His best statistical performance on Monday Night Football was the 2009 season opener when he went 39-of-53 for 378 yards and two touchdowns to lead the Patriots to a 25-24 win over Buffalo. He earned AFC Offensive Player of the week for his performance. He has thrown three or more touchdown in a Monday Night game six times, including a four-touchdown performance in a 31-7 win at Minnesota (10/30/06).

The New England Patriots offense was too much for the Detroit Lions in a 45-24 victory in a Thanksgiving matchup that guaranteed the Patriots a winning record for the tenth consecutive season. The Patriots improved to a 9-2 record with the victory.

QB Tom Brady threw a season-high four touchdowns, all in the second half, and finished 21-of-27 for 341 yards for his second career perfect passer rating at 158.3.

Brady connected on two touchdown passes each to WR Wes Welker and WR Deion Branch, and RB BenJarvus Green Ellis scored on touchdowns runs of 15 yards and 1 yard to lift the offense to a season-high 45 points. On defense, LB Jerod Mayo led the team with 14 total tackles, and rookie CB Devin McCourty had his first two-interception game. Both of McCourty's interceptions were followed by long returns that helped set up touchdowns.

New England fell behind, 14-3, early in the first half and was behind, 17-10, at the break. After Green-Ellis scored on the 15-yard run to make it 14-10 with 53 seconds to play in the first half, Detroit managed to drive for a field goal to extend the lead.

After being stopped on their first drive of the second half, the Patriots rallied for five straight touchdown drives and outscored Detroit 35-7 in the second half.

In the third quarter, McCourty picked off a pass from QB Shaun Hill and returned it 23 yards to give the Patriots a first down at the Detroit 26-yard line. Two plays later, Brady connected with Welker on a 5-yard touchdown to tie the game at 17-17. Detroit responded with a touchdown drive to re-take the lead. But on the ensuing drive, Brady went deep to Branch for a 79-yard touchdown that tied the game at 24-24 heading into the fourth quarter.

Early in the final quarter, Brady threw the go-ahead touchdown on a 22-yarder to Branch for a 31-24 lead. The Patriots padded their lead with a 7-play, 84-yard drive that finished in a 16-yard touchdown pass from Brady to Welker.

The Patriots final touchdown was set up when McCourty returned his second interception 50 yards to the Detroit 20-yard line to set up a 1-yard scoring run by Green-Ellis.

## SUSTAINED SUCCESS: PATRIOTS TO HAVE WINNING RECORD FOR 10<sup>TH</sup> STRAIGHT SEASON

With their ninth win of the 2010 season, the Patriots guaranteed a winning record for the 10th straight season. The Patriots have now won nine or more games in 14 of the 17 seasons that Robert Kraft has owned the team. They are the first team to win more than half of their games in 10 straight seasons since free agency began in 1993. The Patriots are the fourth team to win more than half of their games in 10 straight seasons since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, joining the 49ers (16 straight from 1983-1998), the Cowboys (16 straight from 1970-85), and the Raiders (11 straight from 1970-80). At the conclusion of the 2010 season, the Patriots will be the only NFL team to finish with a record of .500 or better in each of the last 10 years (2001-2010). Each of the other 31 NFL teams had at least one losing season between 2001 and 2009.

## BELICHICK LEADS TEAM TO 10<sup>TH</sup> STRAIGHT WINNING RECORD

Bill Belichick has led the Patriots to a winning record for 10 consecutive seasons. The only other NFL coach to have at least 10 consecutive winning seasons with one team since the 1970 merger was Tom Landry, who led the Dallas Cowboys to 16 consecutive winning seasons (1970-1985).

# BRADY SETS TEAM RECORD FOR MOST CONSECUTIVE PASS ATTEMPTS WITHOUT AN INTERCEPTION

Tom Brady extended his streak to 199 consecutive pass attempts without an interception to break his old record of 183 consecutive pass attempts without an interception set in 2009. He entered the Detroit game with 172 consecutive pass attempts without an interception. His 199 pass attempts without an interception stretches from the overtime period vs. Baltimore (10/17) through the Detroit game. His last interception was on the last play of regulation vs. Baltimore (10/17). He broke the record with an 18-yard pass to TE Aaron Hernandez on a third-and-one play in the second quarter. Brady had previous streaks with 183, 175 and 173 consecutive pass attempts without an interception.

## BRADY HAS SIX STRAIGHT STARTS WITHOUT AN INTERCEPTION TO TIE FRANCHISE RECORD

QB Tom Brady has now gone six straight starts without an interception, tying the franchise record for most consecutive starts without an interception. Tony Eason also had six straight starts without an interception in 1986.

## BRADY HAS HIS SECOND CAREER PERFECT PASSER RATING

Brady finished with a perfect rating after finishing 21-of-27 for 341 yards with four touchdowns and no interceptions for a 158.3 rating. It is the second time in his career that he has finished with a perfect rating. He also had a perfect rating on Oct. 21, 2007 at Miami. He is the sixth player ever to have more than one game with a perfect rating, joining Ben Roethlisberger (3), Peyton Manning (3), Kurt Warner (3), Ken O'Brien (2) and Craig Morton (2).

## **DEION BRANCH HAS CAREER LONG**

The 79-yard touchdown pass from Tom Brady to Deion Branch is the longest reception of Branch's career. His previous best was a 66-yard touchdown pass from Brady at Denver on Nov. 3, 2003.

## BRANCH FINISHED WITH FOURTH CAREER 2-TD GAME

Branch scored on a 79-yard touchdown pass in the third quarter and a 22-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter. It is his fourth two-touchdown game of his career and second as a member of the Patriots. His last time with two-touchdowns in a game was Dec. 28, 2008 at Arizona while with Seattle. It is his first two-touchdown game as a member of the Patriots.

## BRANCH REGISTERS EIGHTH CAREER 100-YARD GAME

Branch finished the game with three receptions for 113 yards and two touchdowns for his eighth career 100-yard game and first of the season. It was his fifth 100-yard game as a member of the Patriots.

## DEVIN MCCOURTY RECORDS FIRST CAREER 2-INT. GAME AND INCREASES TOTAL TO FIVE

Rookie CB Devin McCourty registered his first career twointerception game and now has five interceptions for the season. The five interceptions are tied for the second most by a Patriots rookie. McCourty is the first Patriots rookie to have a twointerception game since Mike Haynes had three in a game on Nov. 21 1976 at the New York Jets.

## THREE WITH TWO-TDS, QB WITH 4 TDS AND A PERFECT RATING

For the second time in team history the Patriots had three players finish with two touchdowns and a four-touchdown effort by the quarterback with a perfect rating. Wes Welker, Deion Branch and BenJarvus Green-Ellis each had two touchdowns and Tom Brady had four touchdowns with a perfect rating. On Oct. 29, 1978 the Patriots defeated the Jets 55-21. Harold Jackson, Horace Ivory and James McAlister each had two touchdowns in the win. Steve Grogan threw four touchdowns in the game and finished with a perfect rating.

## Robert Kraft News & Notes

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. In 17 seasons of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what many observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93),



the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.311 pct.) and recording the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won nine division titles, five conference crowns and three Super Bowl championships. The Patriots have made five Super Bowl appearances since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other NFL franchise has earned more than three

#### **SELLOUT STREAK**

In the early 1990s, the Patriots seemed destined for relocation until Robert Kraft's purchase of the team rejuvenated local interest. In 1991, the season ticket base was just 17,635, barely enough to support the club. Now, the season-ticket base stands at a capped total of 61,759 and more than 50,000 fans are on a waiting list. The Patriots have sold out 177 consecutive home games (dating back to the 1994 regular-season opener).

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have been one of the NFL's elite franchises. Over the first 16 seasons of Kraft's ownership, the Patriots own the NFL's highest winning percentage and have won more Super Bowl titles, more conference championships and more playoff games than any other NFL team. The Patriots have now won nine or more games in 14 of the 17 seasons that Robert Kraft has owned the team.

Bill Belichick is the only head coach in NFL history to win three Super Bowl titles in a four-year span. He spent 20 years as an assistant coach in the NFL and this is his 16th season as a head coach. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the only man in NFL history to serve 20 or more seasons as an assistant coach and at least 15 seasons as a head coach. Over a 100-game span from 2003-08, Belichick directed the team to an 82-18 record, marking the best 100-game span for any team in NFL history. In the 2007 season, Belichick led the Patriots to the fourth undefeated and untied regular season in the NFL's 90-year history and the first since the NFL established a 16-game schedule in 1978. He has led the Patriots to the Super Bowl four times and has produced seven division championships, including five straight from 2003-07. Belichick's Patriots teams own the alltime NFL records for consecutive total victories (21 from 2003-04), and established the record for consecutive regular-season victories (21 from 2006-08) and consecutive playoff victories (10 from 2001-05). Belichick owns the second-best postseason record in NFL history (15-5) and is the winningest NFL head coach since 2001 (130-43). From 2003-04, he directed the Patriots to back-to-back Super Bowl titles while posting consecutive 17-win campaigns. Belichick has spent more seasons in the league than any other current NFL head coach, and in that time has been a part of five Super Bowl championship teams.

Despite being named the Oklahoma football player of the year by both *USA Today* and the *Daily Oklahoman*, Wes Welker's only scholarship offer came from Texas Tech, and only after a player that committed to Texas Tech backed out.

"I was thinking I'd get a scholarship somewhere," Welker said. "When it didn't happen, when it was supposed, to I was pretty hurt by it."

Welker had an impressive collegiate career, accumulating 259 receptions and eight punts returned for touchdowns. He even won a national award as the best special teams player in the country. Despite those accolades, he was passed over in the 2004 NFL draft and signed with San Diego as a free agent. He made the team, then was cut after the first game. He signed with Miami soon after and was used just on special teams. He caught New England's eye with a 71-yard punt return on Monday Night Football in a game against the Patriots. He was acquired by the Patriots in a trade with Miami in 2007.



## WELKER TIES NFL RECORD FOR FEWEST INDIVIDUAL GAMES PLAYED TO REACH 100 RECEPTIONS

Welker reached 100 receptions in his 11th game of the 2009 season to tie Marvin Harrison for the fewest individual games played to reach 100 receptions in a season in NFL history. Harrison caught 100 passes in his first 11 games of the 2002 season en route to an NFL-record 143 catches. (Welker missed two games in 2009 due to injury).

## DEION BRANCH RETURNS TO THE PATRIOTS

Deion Branch was acquired by the Patriots in a trade with Seattle on Oct. 12, 2010. Originally a second-round pick of the Patriots in 2002, Branch was traded to Seattle in 2006 for a first round pick (Brandon Meriweather). Branch returns to a team that he helped win two Super Bowls. Branch was awarded the Pete Rozelle Trophy as the Most Valuable Player of Super Bowl XXXIX. His 11 receptions in the game tied the Super Bowl record, also achieved by Jerry Rice, Dan Ross and Wes Welker. On the day of Super Bowl XXXIX, Deion called a dozen of his former football coaches to thank them for the support that they gave him throughout his high school, junior college and college careers. Hours after talking to his coaches, he tied the Super Bowl record with 11 receptions and was named MVP of the game. Branch has turned in his biggest performances on the greatest stage in sports, leading all receivers in Super Bowls XXXVIII and XXXIX. He recorded a combined 21 receptions in the two games and owns two of the top seven receiving performances in Super Bowl history. His career reception total in the Super Bowl ranks third all-time, trailing only Jerry Rice (33) and Andre Reed (27).

#### **ROOKIE TIGHT ENDS ARE MAKING AN IMPACT**

Rookie tight ends Rob Gronkowski and Aaron Hernandez are making an impact in the Patriots offense. Gronkowski (6) and Hernandez (3) account for 9 of Tom Brady's 23 touchdown passes in 2010.

## ROB GRONKOWSKI SETS PATS ROOKIE TE MARK

Gronkowski has 6 touchdowns to establish a record for most touchdown catches by a rookie tight end in Patriots history, besting Russ Francis (4 in 1975) and Don Hasselbeck (4 in 1977). Gronkowski became the first Patriots rookie to ever record three touchdowns in a game with a three-TD game at Pittsburgh (11/14). The Patriots record for most touchdown catches by a rookie is 9 WR John Colclough in 1960 and WR Randy Vataha in 1971.

## BRANDON TATE HAS TWO KICKOFFS RETURNED FOR TOUCHDOWNS IN 2010

Brandon Tate has blossomed into a dual threat in both the return game and the receiving game. He has returned two kickoffs for touchdowns to provide the Patriots a spark on special teams, after returning the second half kickoff vs. Cincinnati 97 yards for a touchdown and the second half kickoff at Miami 103 yards for a touchdown. He is the first Patriots player to return two kicks for a touchdown in a season since Kevin Faulk returned two for a touchdown in 2002. The Patriots record for most kickoff returns for a touchdown in a season is three by Raymond Clayborn in 1977. His prowess for returns carries over from his collegiate days where he holds numerous NCAA and ACC career records including the NCAA career record for combined kick and punt return yards with 3,523. A native of North Carolina, Tate was a four-year return man for the Tar Heels. Tate suffered a knee injury against Notre Dame as a senior and missed the final seven games of the season. Tate joined the Patriots in the third round of the 2009 draft, but his rookie year was derailed by injury as he was placed on injured reserve on Nov. 14 after seeing action in only two games

### WOODHEAD GOES FROM DIVISION II TO THE NFL

Danny Woodhead was a standout at Division II Chadron State in Nebraska. He averaged 178.9 yards per game and totaled 101 rushing touchdowns during his collegiate career. Woodhead's outstanding junior and senior seasons earned him two Harlon Hill Trophies, the Division II equivalent to the Heisman Trophy. He is one of just three players to ever win two or more Harlon Hill Trophies, joining Texas A&M University-Kingsville running back Johnny Bailey, who won it three times (1987-89) before playing six seasons in the NFL for the Bears, Cardinals, and Rams. Valdosta State University's Dusty Bonner was the only other player to win the Harlon Hill Trophy multiple times (2000 and 2001). Cincinnati Bengals running back Bernard Scott (2008—Abilene Christian) joins Woodhead as active NFL running backs who have won the award. In his first game with the Patriots, Woodhead scored on a 22-yard run in the win vs. Buffalo (9/26).

#### EDELMAN GOES FROM STANDOUT QB TO WR

Julian Edelman began his college football career with a year at the College of San Mateo (Ca.) before transferring to Kent State where as a senior he completed 56% of his passes (153 of 275 passes for 1,820 yards) with 13 touchdowns. He was also the leading rusher, gaining 1,551 yards on 215 attempts (an average of 7.5 yards per carry) and scoring 13 touchdowns. His offensive numbers broke Kent State's single-season record for total offense set by Joshua Cribbs in 2003.

### WILFORK WEARS HIS HEART ON HIS NECK

Vince Wilfork wears No. 75 over his shoulder pads. Underneath hangs a gold chain locket for those who were number one in his heart: his parents. In 2002, parents David and Barbara Wilfork both passed away within five months of each other, leaving the then University of Miami star without his greatest support system. Wilfork, who lost his father to diabetes, has raised hundreds of thousands of dollars for diabetes-related causes. His annual draft day fundraiser, a bowling event he has held for seven years, is one of the signature fundraising events held by a pro athlete in New England. For his charity work, Wilfork was awarded the 2010 New England Patriots Ron Burton Community Service Award. While he will always cherish his National Championship and Super Bowl rings, his constant reminder lies closest to his heart, a picture of his late parents at their high school prom. "I carry them with me wherever I go", Wilfork said of his parents' keepsake. "My parents pushed me to be the best I could be. The things I do and my wife does, we do out of the kindness of our heart, and we do it for the community. I never look for anything in return. My teammates are my second family. My kids, my wife, the New England Patriots - that's all I have."

### **ZOLTAN MESKO: COMING TO AMERICA**

Rookie P Zoltan Mesko was born in Timosoara, Romania, on the Romania-Hungary border. On Many occasions in 1989, during the communist revolutions, his family was forced to take cover by diving on the floor to avoid gun shots from the armies. Even after the fall of the Berlin Wall, his family lived in poverty. His family was finally able to escape Romania when his father won a United States Permanent Resident Card (green card) in the Diversity Immigrant Visa Lottery in 1997 when Mesko was 11.

## MESKO DISCOVERS FOOTBALL

An avid soccer player from his days in Romania, Mesko had a strong leg. It was only when he came to America that he discovered his leg could take him places. In eighth grade, Mesko was playing kickball in the gym when he kicked the ball so high that he broke a light fixture. He was given a choice: pay for the light fixture or play football. With his family still struggling with money and football being a more popular sport than soccer at his school, the choice was an obvious one—Mesko decided to play football. His leg would land him numerous Division I Scholarships and admission offers from Ivy League schools. From these, Mesko chose to play football at Michigan.

## **DOUBLE TROUBLE: CB DEVIN MCCOURTY**

After being selected by the Patriots in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft, CB Devin McCourty became part of a select group in league history. McCourty's identical twin brother, Jason, is a cornerback with Tennessee, selected in the sixth round of the 2009 NFL Draft. The two are the 11<sup>th</sup> set of twins to play in the NFL. Devin and Jason were cornerbacks in the Rutgers secondary from 2005-08. Devin redshirted for the 2005 season and therefore was a year behind his brother in eligibility. McCourty is the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 1998-2000. His twin brother Wasswa played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox.

### ALL IN THE FAMILY: TE ROB GRONKOWSKI

Rookie TE Rob Gronkowski grew up playing football against his brothers in the backyard. Now, he has a chance to play against them in the NFL. Dan Gronkowski, the oldest of the bunch, is currently in his second season as a TE for the Denver Broncos, while 23-year old Chris is currently a rookie with the Dallas Cowboys as a fullback. The Gronkowskis are among 22 different sets of brothers currently in the NFL, yet they are the only family that can claim to have three siblings in the league. According to the Pro Football Hall of Fame, the Gronkowski brothers join nine other familes to have at least three brothers playing at the same time

If the 923 students collectively read more than 2010 books over the summer, a Patriots lineman promised to return for another assembly to reward the students. On Sept. 28, Stephen Neal returned to the school to reward the students who accomplished their summer reading goals. One student received a "game ball" for her efforts after reading 70 books.

## LIKE FATHER LIKE SON

WR Matthew Slater spent his college days at UCLA. The thirdyear promising young talent was born in 1985, when another Slater in The City of Angels was named to his second of seven Pro Bowls. Matthew's father, Jackie Slater, a Hall of Fame offensive tackle, spent his entire career with the Rams organization in LA. Matthew Slater, drafted in 2008, is one of six sons of Hall of Fame members to be drafted in NFL history.

## GREETINGS FROM KAARST, GERMANY: SEBASTIAN VOLLMER MAKES HIS MARK

A native of Kaarst, Germany, Vollmer did not begin playing football until the age of 14 when he started playing for the Dusseldorf club team. Vollmer helped lead his German prep school team to two national football championships. His early football success landed him an appearance in the 2004 Global Junior Championships in San Diego, which led him to a scholarship at Houston. He spoke almost no English when he signed with Houston, but he became fluent in the language as he developed from a 250-pound tight end into a 315-pound lineman who started his final 25 games at tackle for the Cougars. Vollmer's collegiate career created interest from the NFL where the Patriots drafted him in the second round of the 2009 draft. Earned the nickname, Seabass, during his playing days at Houston. The nickname has carried over to the NFL.

## PATRICK CHUNG'S JOURNEY TO THE NFL

Long before S Patrick Chung picked up flag football as a teen, his mother, Jamaican recording artist Sophia George, had preached about being a tough man in a song. Her hit single, "Girlie Girlie" - a traditional reggae song about poking fun at a boy who was not man enough - topped the charts in 1985. Chung is aware that among his talents he was born with, speed and agility, singing is not one of them. Chung, who possesses a great sense of pride in his unique heritage - his mother is Jamaican and his father is half Jamaican and half Chinese, was born in Jamaica and moved to California at age 12 where he started to play football as a freshman in high school. Chung went on to star at Oregon, where he holds the distinction of starting more games than any other defensive player in school history with 51 starts. He original entered the draft as junior but ultimately decided to return for his senior season. Pinned to the back of his locker is a reminder of the support he has gotten to this stage, a Jamaican flag that indicates his family's importance to him.

#### **BENJARVUS GREEN-ELLIS – THE LAW FIRM**

BenJarvus Green-Ellis, who earned the nickname the Law Firm from his Patriots teammates because of his multi-part name. was signed by the Patriots as an undrafted free agent in 2008 out of the University of Mississippi. As a rookie, he recorded touchdowns in four straight games after being called up from the practice squad in October. His knack for finding the end zone has continued this season as he has reached the end zone a career-high nine times, including his first two-touchdown performance vs. Minnesota (10/31). Green-Ellis also had a 112-yard rushing performance against the Vikings with 62 yards on the Patriots' final fourth quarter touchdown drive that extended a 3-point lead to a 10-point cushion in a 28-18 victory.

### PATRIOTS HAVE TOP TELEVISION RATINGS

The Patriots are on a record-setting pace for household ratings through 11 weeks in their designated market area with a 32.4 HH rating. This season, the Patriots have also been part of two record-setting NFL broadcasts. New England's 23-20 overtime victory over Baltimore on Sunday, Oct. 17 helped CBS set the mark for the highest rating for its single game window since it acquired the current AFC package in 2008. The Patriots-Jets game on Sunday, Sept. 19 was the most watched September CBS game ever.

## FREE AGENTS MAKE AN IMPACT

Eighteen players on the New England 53-man roster entered the NFL as rookie free agents. Two that came to the Patriots as rookie free agents have been consistent contributors on offense. Stephen Neal has been a regular in the starting lineup at right guard since 2004. BenJarvus Green-Ellis, who came to the Patriots as a rookie free agent in 2008, has nine rushing touchdowns this season. Defensively, the Patriots have five players who have made a big impact. Mike Wright came to New England as a rookie free agent in 2005. He has a career-high 5.5 sacks so far in 2010. Gary Guyton came to New England as a rookie free agent in 2008. In the opening game of the season, Guyton recorded his first career interception, which he returned for a touchdown. Both Sergio Brown and Dane Fletcher are rookie free agent signees from this past offseason who have made regular defensive and special teams contributions. Brown had five tackles including one that saved a first down against San Diego TE Antonio Gates that helped preserve the Patriots 23-20 victory over the Chargers. Fletcher had a forced fumble and three defensive tackles in that same game against the Chargers

Many kickers have quite a journey before landing a roster position on an NFL team. Such has been the case during kicker Shayne Graham's road to a 10-year NFL career. He originally signed with New Orleans as a rookie free agent in 2000 and went to camp with Seattle in 2001 before finally securing a roster spot with Buffalo later that season. He then spent time with Carolina before a seven-year stint with Cincinnati. Graham went to camp with Baltimore in 2010 and had a week stint on the Giants roster. He spent time in between jobs practicing at the Virginia Tech campus with two pieces of packed luggage in his car at all times as he waited for a call for a team in need.



## THE TEAM OF THE DECADE

hen Robert Kraft purchased the New England Patriots in 1994, few would have thought that just 16 years later the franchise would be the undisputed team of the decade in the first decade of the new millennium. Kraft brought a winning vision to the organization and dedicated his resources to building a consistent winner. On Jan. 27, 2000, Kraft hired Bill Belichick to coach the team, and three months later the team drafted then-unheralded quarterback Tom Brady, putting the final pieces in place for the Patriots to become the most successful NFL team of the 2000s.
