HEADLINES

- Monday night's matchup of the 9-2 Jets at the 9-2 Patriots **marks the first time division opponents that are tied for the best record met in the 12th game of the season or later since 12/9/01** when San Francisco played St. Louis -- both teams were 9-2 and tied with Pittsburgh and Chicago for the NFL's best record.
- The Jets travel their **fourth ranked scoring defense** to Foxborough, Massachusetts to face the NFL's highest scoring offense. Last week the Jets held the Bengals to 34 yards on 28 plays in the second half en route to a 26-10 victory on Thanksgiving day. For the season, the Jets allow 296.9 yards a game, third best in the NFL, and 5.97 yard per pass play, fifth best in the league.
- This game features two of the seven top kickoff returners in the NFL, Jets **KR Brad Smith** (29.2 avg.) and NE **KR Bradon Tate** (26.6 avg.). Smith leads the NFL and is coming off a week in which he returned a kickoff 89 yards for a score. Tate ranks seventh in the NFL and second in the AFC. The Jets kickoff coverage unit ranks fourth in the NFL (20.4 avg.), while the Patriots stand twenty first (23.7 avg.).

Quarterbacks (3), Returning Starter (1)

Coach Matt Cavanaugh:

Mark Sanchez made his 25th regular season start vs. HST (11/21) and completed 22-of-38 passes for 315 yards and three touchdowns with one interception for a 100.2 passer rating. It was his second career 300-yard passing game. As a starter, Sanchez owns a record of 17-9 during the regular season and an 19-10 mark, including the postseason. During Weeks 9-11, all Jets wins, Sanchez threw for 950 yards on 71-of-121 passing with six touchdowns and three interceptions for an 89.9 rating. For the season, Sanchez has registered an 81.9 passer rating, connecting on 201-of-364 passes for 2,472 yards and 16 touchdowns with eight interceptions. His first career 300-yard passing game came in Week Nine at DET (11/7), when he recorded 336 yards, one touchdown and one interception on 22-of-39 passing. Eight touchdown passes and no interceptions during the first five games of the season, made him the youngest passer in NFL history to throw eight touchdown passes without an interception. Veteran **Mark Brunell** signed with the Jets as a free agent (7/28/10). Coming off a Super Bowl victory with NO last season, the three-time Pro Bowler enters his 18th NFL season and has thrown for 31,928 yards and 182 touchdowns and rushed for 2,421 yards and 15 touchdowns. He saw his only action of the season at BUF (10/3). Fifth-year passer **Kellen Clemens** has been the inactive third quarterback for every game this season. For his career, Clemens has completed 146-of-282 passes for five touchdowns with 11 interceptions.

Running Backs (5), Returning Starter (1)

Coach Anthony Lynn:

Both considered by Head Coach Rex Ryan as starters, running backs LaDainian Tomlinson and Shonn Greene form a 1-2 punch that has enabled the Jets to rank second in the NFL in rushing yards per game. **Tomlinson** leads the team with 741 yards and five rushing touchdowns on 166 carries. He recorded 133 yards and two touchdowns on 19 carries at BUF (10/3), his first 100-yard effort since 10/26/08 at NO (19-105). His 45 receptions also lead the club. Second-year runner **Greene** has rushed for 575 yards and one touchdown on 140 carries. Three-time Pro Bowl fullback **Tony Richardson** has helped his teams rush for 20-or-more touchdowns in seven of the past eight seasons, including league-highs in 2002 (KC), 2003 (KC), 2004 (KC) and 2007 (KC). Selected by the Jets in the fifth round from Kentucky, rookie fullback **John Conner** sees action as a key reserve on offense and on special teams. Fourth-round selection out of USC, **Joe McKnight** earned his first NFL rushing attempt at BUF (10/3) and also seen time on special teams.

Wide Receivers (4), Returning Starters (2)

Coach Henry Ellard:

Returning veterans **Jerricho Cotchery**, **Braylon Edwards** and **Brad Smith** have been joined by Super Bowl XLIII MVP **Antonio Holmes** who made his New York Jets debut in vs. MIN (10/11). Edwards leads Jets in touchdowns (6) receiving

yards (618) and yards per reception (17.7). Four of his six touchdowns receptions have occurred on plays of 30 yards or longer. Cotchery, who has led the team in receiving the previous three seasons, has recorded 29 receptions for 315 yards. He missed games vs. HST (11/21) and CIN (11/25) due to an injury. Smith has caught four pass for 21 yards and rushed for 216 yards and a touchdown on 27 carries. Vs. CIN (11/25), he recorded the Jets longest run of the season, a 53-yard touchdown, and scored on an 89-yard kickoff return. He threw the first touchdown pass of his career at BUF (10/3), a three-yard toss to TE Dustin Keller. Smith has scored his seven career touchdowns in five different ways (reception (2), rushing (2), kickoff return (2) and blocked punt return and a pass). He is the only player in the modern football era (since 1933) to have scored touchdowns via: receiving, rushing, kickoff return, blocked punt return in addition to throwing a TD pass. Holmes has 32 catches for 491 yards and four touchdowns for the season, recording two 100-yard contests, totalling 114 yards at DET (11/7) and 126 vs. HST (11/21). In four Jets wins, Holmes has registered the game's key play. At DEN (10/17), Holmes drew a 46-yard penalty with 1:26 remaining to set up the final touchdown in the 24-20 victory. At DET (11/7), Holmes had a 52-yard catch in overtime set up a game-winning field goal in a 23-20 win. In CLV (11/14) he notched a game-winning 37-yard touchdown with 16 seconds remaining in overtime, for the 26-20 victory. Vs. HST (11/21) he caught the game-winning six-yard touchdown pass with 10 seconds remaining in regulation.

Tight Ends (4), Returning Starter (1)

Coach Mike Devlin:

Third-year TE **Dustin Keller** ranks second on the team in touchdowns (5), receptions (39) and receiving yards (528). **Ben Hartsock** helps key the rushing attack. **Matthew Muligan** has seen action in eight games, making a start in the season opener vs. BLT (9/13) and plays primarily on special teams. Undrafted rookie free agent **Jeff Cumberland** has been inactive for every game this season.

Offensive Line (8), Returning Starters (4)

Coach Bill Callahan:

Four of the five starters return for their third consecutive season for an offensive line that has helped the 2010 Jets average 148.1 yards per game, second best in the NFL. In 2006, Jets General Manager Mike Tannenbaum focused on the offensive line selecting **LT D'Brickashaw Ferguson** fourth overall and **C Nick Mangold** 29th overall in the NFL draft. The two players have started 75 consecutive games together, making them the only two players who entered the league together to start their team's first 75 regular-season games on the same offensive line since 1970. Ferguson has earned 2010 *Pro Football Weekly's* Midseason All-Pro team honors, 2009 Pro Bowl honors and 2006 All-Rookie Team honors by *Pro Football Weekly* and the Pro Football Writer's Association. During his first four seasons, Mangold has earned 2009 *Associated Press* All-Pro honors, consecutive Pro Bowl selec-

tions (08-09) and all-rookie recognition in 2006 as voted by *Pro Football Weekly* and the Pro Football Writer's Association. The lone new starter on the offensive line is second-year man **LG Matt Slauson** earned the starting job after an impressive offseason and has started every game this season. **RG Brandon Moore** leads the group, was selected to 2010 *Sports Illustrated's* Midseason All-Pro team and has started 100 consecutive games for the Jets. 12-year veteran **RT Damien Woody** has started all 43 games he has played in with the Jets. The former Pro Bowl center won two Super Bowl championships as a member of the New England Patriots. Second-round selection **G/T Vladimir Ducasse** saw action in his first NFL game at BUF (10/3). **T Wayne Hunter** missed two games (MIA 9/26 and BUF 10/13) due to a shin injury, but returned to action vs. MIN (10/11). **C/G Robert Turner** serves as the primary reserve at center and guard. Hunter and Turner play in the Jets jumbo package.

Defensive Line (7), Returning Starters (2)

Coach Mark Carrier:

The front has helped hold opposing rushing attacks to 3.4 yards per carry, which stands second-best in the NFL. This group is led by two-time Pro Bowl defensive end **Shaun Ellis**, whose 71.5 career sacks rank third all-time in team history. On the season, Ellis has recorded 3.5 sacks, 25 tackles and one forced fumble. **Mike DeVito** has earned seven starts following the loss of **Kris Jenkins** and is tied for the lead among Jets' defensive linemen with 29 tackles. **Sione Pouha** has started every game (ten at NT and one at DT), moving over the center to replace the injured Jenkins and has recorded 29 tackles and has recovered two fumbles and one sack. Versatile defensive lineman **Vernon Gholston** earns snaps on the line and at linebacker, started in the victory at DET (11/7) and has seen action in all 11 games this season. **Trevor Pryce** signed as a free agent (9/29/10) after being released by BLT and has helped the interior pass rush, recording ten quarterback hits and a safety, that was recorded vs. CIN (11/25). Providing depth are **Matt Kroul**, who spent the 2009 season on the practice squad and **Marcus Dixon** was awarded to the Jets off of waivers (9/5/10) and has been inactive for every game this season.

Linebackers (8), Returning Starters (4)

Coach Bob Sutton and Jeff Weeks

Led by inside linebackers **David Harris** and **Bart Scott**, this unit features the NFL active sack leader **Jason Taylor**, versatile linebacker **Bryan Thomas** and 2009 Jets leading sacker **Calvin Pace**. Harris leads the team with 90 tackles and has registered two sacks, a FR and two passes defensed, while Scott is second on the club with 67 tackles, one sack, one forced fumble and one pass defensed. The reliable Thomas has 33 tackles, three sacks, one pass defensed, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. Taylor has added four sacks this season to bring his career total to 131.5. **Lance Laury** provides depth inside while second-year man **Jamaal Westerman** does the same on the outside. Both reserves have key roles on special teams. First-year LB **Josh Mauga** joined

the active roster from the practice squad on (10/25) and earned his first NFL action vs. GB (11/31).

Defensive Backs (10), Returning Starters (2)

Coach Dennis Thurman and Jim O'Neil

This group, directed by sixth-year player **Jim Leonhard** and All-Pro **Darrelle Revis**, have limited opposing teams to a 48.0 completion percentage during the last eight games, the best in the NFL during that span. The unit has also ranks first in the NFL during the same time span in limiting teams to 186.6 net passing yards a game. The secondary welcomed three new players, **Brodney Pool**, who has started seven games and has recorded 34 tackles and an interception, **Antonio Cromartie**, who leads the team with three interceptions, and rookie first-round selection **Kyle Wilson**, who earned starts in the first three games of the season as well as at CLV (11/14). Fifth-year veteran, **Drew Coleman**, began training camp as the sixth corner on the depth chart, but has played his way into the rotation, earning starts at BUF (10/3) and at DEN (10/17). For the season he has 21 tackles, 4 passes defensed, 1 sack, 2 FF and recorded the second interception of his career when he sealed the Jets second victory in Week Three at Miami. His second FF came in Week 10, when he stripped CLV WR Chansi Stuckey in overtime. **Eric Smith**, who has started four games at safety, rounds out the secondary with young-veterans **Marquice Cole**, **James Ihedigbo** and **Dwight Lowery**. All three players serve significant roles on special teams. Lowery clinched the Jets Week Five and Six wins, returning an interception for a touchdown with under 2:00 to play against MIN (10/11) and recovering a fumble at DEN (10/17) on the Broncos final play.

Specialists (3), Returning Starter (1)

Coach Mike Westhoff and Ben Kotwica

The only player to return in this group is punter **Steve Weatherford**, who joined the Jets before the season opener in 2009. On the season, his 26 punts inside the opponents' 20-yard line rank first in the NFL while his 40.0-yard net average is second in the AFC. The Jets welcomed a former Pro Bowl kicker, **Nick Folk**, this offseason. Folk set a Jets record when he connected on a 56-yard field goal attempt at DEN (10/14). For the season, Folk has connected on 22-of-30 field goal attempts. He connected on a 36-yard field goal to force a sudden-death period at Detroit (11/7) and made a 30-yard field goal in the extra period for the win. It was the second game-winning field goal of his career, with the first coming at BUF (10/8/07) on Monday Night Football. For the first time since 2001, the Jets long snapping duties are not being handled by James Dearth. This season, first-year player **Tanner Purdum** has assumed the role.



INDIVIDUAL SERIES HIGHLIGHTS



QB MARK SANCHEZ

In just his second-career start, Sanchez helped the Jets snap a string of eight straight home losses to the Patriots. In the game, Sanchez completed 14-of-22 passes (63.6%) for 163 yards, one touchdown, no interceptions and a passer rating of 101.1. In the first matchup against New England this season, Sanchez completed 21-of-30 passes for 220 yards, three touchdowns, no interceptions and a regular-season career-best 124.3 passer rating. In three games against the Patriots, Sanchez has thrown for 519 yards on 58.9% passing with five touchdowns, four interceptions and an 80.8 rating.

RB LaDAINIAN TOMLINSON

In eight contests against New England, Tomlinson has rushed for 746 yards and seven scores on 150 carries (5.0 avg.), adding another 217 yards on 24 receptions. His best game against the Pats came on September 29, 2002, when he gained 217 yards and two touchdowns on 27 carries. Those 217 yards are the most yards allowed by the Patriots since they surrendered 219 yards on the ground to OJ Simpson (12/09/73) and are the most allowed in the Bill Belichick era. In his first game against New England as a member of the Jets, Tomlinson collected 76 yards rushing on 11 attempts (6.9 avg.), adding 26 more yards on four receptions.

Tomlinson has gained over 100 yards rushing three times against New England, once in the postseason (1/14/07) and his seven rushing touchdowns represent the most rushing touchdowns any active player has scored against the Patriots.

WR JERRICHO COTCHERY

No Jets offensive player has faced the Patriots more than Cotchery. In 14 games against the division rival, he has collected 50 receptions for 771 yards (15.4 avg.) and six touchdowns. He has twice gone over 100 yards receiving, the first time on 09/17/06 when he caught six passes for 121 yards and a touchdown, scoring on a 71-yard pass from Chad Pennington. The second time he achieved the century mark against the Pats came in that season's playoff contest against New England (01/07/07) when he used a 77-yard touchdown pass as part of his four receptions for 100 yards.

WR SANTONIO HOLMES

In two career games against the Patriots, Holmes has caught three passes for 41 yards (13.7 avg.) and a 19-yard touchdown.

WR BRAYLON EDWARDS

Edwards appeared against the Patriots as a member of the Browns and then as a member of the Jets for the second Jets-Pats contest last season. As a member of the Browns, Edwards hauled in six catches for 110 yards in a 10/07/07 game. In his first game against New England this season, Edwards caught five passes for 45 yards and his first career touchdown against New England and later a two-point conversion reception. In three career games against the Patriots, Edwards has totaled 12 receptions for 165 yards (13.8 avg.) and one touchdown.

TE DUSTIN KELLER

Drafted in 2008, Keller has now seen five Jets-Patriots contests. In those games, he has caught 22 passes for 281 yards and two touchdowns, with seven receptions for 115 yards and a touchdown coming in this season's first matchup. On a Thursday night in Foxborough, he pulled in eight passes for 87 yards, highlighted by a 16-yard reception with the Jets facing a third-and-15, helping to keep the game-winning drive alive. Those eight receptions are also the most of any current Jet in a game against New England.

CB DARRELLE REVIS

In seven career games against New England, Revis has amassed 31 tackles, two interceptions and seven passes defended. In the first matchup this season, he departed at halftime after injuring his hamstring. This Monday's game will feature the first Jets-Patriots game since Revis entered the league that will not feature Revis guarding Randy Moss.

CB ANTONIO CROMARTIE

Cromartie, the former San Diego Charger, has matched up against the Patriots five times in his career, twice in the postseason. In those five games, he has three starts, 11 tackles and two interceptions. In his first game as a Jet against New England, Cromartie switched onto Randy Moss for the second-half after an injury to Darrelle Revis and also intercepted a Tom Brady pass.

S BRODNEY POOL

Monday's matchup will mark the third time Pool will face the Patriots in his career. In two career games, he has posted four tackles and one interception, coming in the first Jets-Patriots matchup when he intercepted a Tom Brady pass that was deflected by Antonio Cromartie.



INDIVIDUAL SERIES HIGHLIGHTS



LB BRYAN THOMAS

Thomas, a Jet since he was drafted in the first-round in 2002, has played in all 18 Jet-Patriot matchups since entering the league. In those 18 games, he collected 57 tackles, four sacks and three fumble recoveries, recovering a Tom Brady fumble after a Jason Taylor strip-sack and returning for 16 yards in the first game against New England this season.

LB JASON TAYLOR

With 26 matchups against the Patriots, Taylor has seen New England more than any other current Jet. In those 26 matchups, Taylor has amassed 13 sacks, three interceptions, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. He also scored two touchdowns in the series, one on a 36-yard interception return and the other on a one-yard fumble return.

In his first game against New England as a Jet, Taylor sacked Tom Brady for a loss of nine yards, forcing a fumble that would be recovered by Bryan Thomas to halt a potential Patriots scoring drive.

DE SHAUN ELLIS

Now in his 11th season with the Jets, Ellis has faced the division rival Patriots 21 times in his career, missing just the final matchup in the 2005 season. He has collected 86 tackles, 12 sacks, two passes defended and three forced fumbles in his career against New England. He has posted two sacks in a game against New England twice, initially in his first game against the Patriots (09/11/00) and then again last season (11/22/09).

DE TREVOR PRYCE

Monday's matchup will mark the first time Pryce has faced the Patriots as a Jet, as he was still a member of BLT at the time of the first game against New England this season. He has faced the Patriots 10 times prior in his career, twice in the postseason, collecting 4.5 sacks total in those 10 games.

Ten percent of the evening's sales benefitted the New York Jets Foundation.

On Monday, November 1, **Santonio Holmes** partnered with former teammate David Clowney to host Bowling with the New York Jets. The event included dinner, a silent auction and two-hours of bowling with Jets players at Jersey Lanes in Linden, NJ. Proceeds from the event benefitted Holmes' III & Long Foundation, whose mission is to help in the research and finding a cure for Sickle Cell Disease along with assisting families that have been affected by SCD, and the David Clowney Foundation.



On Tuesday, November 2, **Matt Slauson, Shonn Greene, Jamaal Westerman, Joe McKnight, Rob Turner**, and **Matt Kroul** unloaded and delivered two Satalight Learning Stations, one SMART Board and four Lasso Sound Systems to P.G. Chambers School in Cedar Knolls, NJ. The equipment was donated by the Jets, Teq and Front Row and is designed to improve the learning environment for students with disabilities.

Travelling to the game is easier than ever with three times the number of roadways and the New Meadowlands rail stop just outside the MetLife Gate. Once at the stadium, fans have many options for entertainment and tailgating before the game.

One element that sets this venue apart is the integration of key partners into the game experience. Each cornerstone – Bud Light, MetLife, Pepsi and Verizon – have more than 20,000 square feet to engage and entertain fans.

REX RYAN



DEFENSE = RYAN

Like most sons, **Rex Ryan** always knew he wanted to be in the family business. For the Ryan's, the family business is stifling defense. In 1985, his father, **Buddy Ryan**, led what is widely considered to be the best defense in NFL history. Known simply as the '85 Bears, Buddy's unit allowed 12.6 points a game. For the season, they allowed 20 touchdowns (9 rushing, 10 passing and 1 on a return).

Rex has been a part of some of the NFL's best defenses himself. In 2000, he served as the defensive line coach for a Baltimore Ravens team that allowed an NFL's best 10.3 points a game. In 16 games, the 2000 Ravens allowed 18 touchdowns (5 rushing, 11 passing and 2 on returns). As a defensive coordinator in 2006, Rex matched his father's 1985 feat allowing 12.6 points a game with the Ravens. Rex's 2006 team led the NFL in 11 categories: yards per game (264.1), yards per play (4.51), rushing yard per game (75.9), rushing yards per play (3.31), interception rate (5.5%), sacks per pass attempt (11.79%), first downs per game (14.8), third-down conversions allowed (28.9%), red zone pct. (33.3%) and points allowed a game (12.6).

In 2009, Rex returned the family business to the Jets, where his father earned his first NFL job. Rex took a defense that ranked 10th in scoring for the 2008 season to the top of the NFL rankings in seven categories: yards per game (252.3), yards per play (4.24), passing yards a game (153.7), passing yards per play (4.91), first downs allowed (14.8), third-down conversions allowed (31.5%) and points allowed (14.8).

Thomas enjoyed his two best seasons in his only two seasons with Pettine when he notched 9.0 sacks in 2005 and 11.0 sacks in 2006.

Calvin Pace (NYJ 09-)

In Pace's first season with Pettine as Defensive Coordinator, he posted a career-high with 8.0 sacks in just 12 games played.

Terrell Suggs (BLT 05-08)

In four seasons under Pettine, Suggs posted his four highest tackle totals, collected four of his five career interceptions and posted three seasons of at least eight sacks, leading the team in sacks twice.

SCHOOLED BY SCHOTTY

Drew Brees (SD 02-05)

Schottenheimer arrived in San Diego for Brees' second season and quickly became a large part of his development with 2002 marking his first season as a starting quarterback. In four seasons with Schotty, Brees averaged over 3,000 yards a season, completing 62.3% of his passes and compiling an 84.7 passer rating.

Chad Pennington (NYJ 06-07)

Schottenheimer's first season with the Jets coincided with the return of Chad Pennington from a season-ending injury the year before. Under Schotty's direction, Pennington posted a then career-best 3,352 yards passing, completing 64.5% of his passes for an 82.6 passer rating. Pennington also took home Comeback Player of the Year honors as he keyed a Jet return to the postseason.

Thomas Jones (NYJ 07-09)

Jones, was considered a journeyman for the earlier part of his career, after spending his first seven seasons in the league with three different teams. In that time, he averaged 769.1 yards and 4.9 touchdowns per season. In 2007, he was acquired by the Jets in an off-season trade and instantly became an integral part of Coach Schottenheimer's offense. In three seasons under Schotty, Jones averaged 1,277.7 yards rushing and 9.3 rushing touchdowns a season and set career-highs in rushing yards and rushing touchdowns last season.

Mark Sanchez (NYJ 09-)

Sanchez, the Jets 2009 first-round pick, was chosen to direct Schottenheimer's offense in his rookie season and responded by setting franchise rookie records for completions and passing yards. His rookie season wasn't without its low points, but under Schotty's tutelage, Sanchez helped lead the Jets to two postseason victories, the third rookie quarterback in the AFC to accomplish that feat since 1970.

WONDERFUL WORLD OF WESTHOFF

No team in the league has had more kickoff return touchdowns since **Mike Westhoff's** tenure with the Jets began in 2001. Since then, the Jets have scored 12 times on kickoff returns. Perhaps even more remarkable than the fact that the Jets lead the league with 12 scores, is that those scores have come from six different players. **Leon Washington** (4), **Justin Miller** (3), **Chad Morton** (2), **Jerricho Cotchery** (1), **Brad Smith** (1) and **Jonathan Carter** (1) have all brought a kick back for a score under Westy.

MARK SANCHEZ

From Week Nine through Week Eleven, all Jets wins, **QB Mark Sanchez** threw for 950 yards on 71-of-121 passing with six touchdowns, three interceptions and an 89.9 rating. In those contests, Sanchez has posted the three highest single-game totals for passing yards in his career, throwing for a career-high 336 yards in an overtime win at DET (11/7), 299 yards in an overtime win at CLV (11/14) and 315 yards vs. HST (11/21). His 100.2 passer rating vs. HST marked the eighth time in his career that Sanchez has posted a passer rating of 100-or-more, while his three touchdown passes equal a career-high, achieved twice previously, most recently at MIA (9/26/10).

100 or GREATER PASSER RATING

QB Mark Sanchez recorded a 100.2 passer rating vs. Houston (11/21), marking the eighth game in his career that he posted a passer rating of 100.0 or greater. Five of his 100.0 or greater passer ratings have come against division foes Miami, New England and Buffalo.

SANCHEZ IN OVERTIME

In consecutive weeks, at DET (11/7) and at CLV (11/14), Sanchez led his team to overtime road victories, becoming the first team in NFL history to win road games in overtime in consecutive weeks. At CLV (11/14), Sanchez connected with WR Santonio Holmes with 16 seconds remaining for a 37-yard touchdown to give the Jets the 26-20 win against the Browns. The touchdown was the third-latest regular-season touchdown in overtime since the overtime system was instituted in 1974. San Diego defeated Kansas City with no time remaining (11/12/78) and Baltimore defeated St. Louis with 10 seconds remaining (10/27/96).

ON THE MARK IN THE WINS

In the Jets' nine victories, **QB Mark Sanchez** has completed 159-of-277 passes for 1,976 yards and 15 touchdowns with five interceptions and a passer rating of 90.2.

• **11/25 vs CIN:** Led the Jets to their ninth win of the

season, completing 16-of-28 passes for 166 yards, a touchdown and an interception.

- **11/21 vs. HST:** In the 25th regular season start of his NFL career, Sanchez completed 22-of-38 passes for 315 yards and three touchdowns with one interception for a 100.2 passer rating. Over the last four games, he has thrown for 1,206 yards and six touchdowns on 87-of-159 passing with five interceptions.
- **11/14 at CLV:** QB Mark Sanchez opened the first half completing 9-of-13 passes for 83 yards and one touchdown and recording a passer rating of 112.0. He added a one-yard touchdown run to give the Jets a 17-13 half-time lead. It was his second rushing touchdown in as many weeks. Sanchez led the Jets to the game winning touchdown in overtime when he connected with WR Santonio Holmes for a 37-yard touchdown with 16 seconds remaining in the game. Finished the game with his second most passing yards in a game (299) on 27-of-44 passing. Also threw two touchdowns and one interception on the day.
- **11/7 at DET:** Sanchez recorded the first 300 yard passing game of his career, completing 22-of-39 passes for 336 yards with one touchdown and one interception for a passer rating of 82.9 as the Jets staged their second fourth quarter comeback of the season when they scored 10 points in the final 4:26 of regulation to tie the game at 20. On the last three scoring drives, Sanchez connected on 10-of-12 passes for 144 yards and a passer rating of 116.7
- **10/17 at DEN:** Sanchez recorded the first victory of his career in which he led the Jets to the winning points with two minutes or less remaining in the game. He threw his first interception of the season to DEN OLB Jason Hunter on his third pass of the game. The interception ended his streak of 184 pass attempts without an interception, the second longest in Jets history, trailing only Ken O'Brien who registered 211 pass attempts without an interception from 1987-88.
- **10/11 vs MIN:** Sanchez spearheaded an offense that scored points in every possession within the opponents-20 and established a new career-high for passing attempts with 44. His previous high of 35 attempts came vs. MIA on 11/1/10.
- **10/3 at BUF:** Sanchez connected with WR Braylon Edwards for a 41-yard touchdown pass with 2:32 remaining in the second quarter. It is the third time this season the two have combined for a score. In their 15 regular season games together, the pair has completed four passes of 40 or more yards. Sanchez finished the game 14-of-24 for 161 yards and two touchdowns with a passer rating of 106.4. It is the seventh time in his career that he recorded a 100 plus passer rating. Sunday's game at Buffalo marked the eleventh contest in his 19 regular-season games that Sanchez has not thrown

an interception. The Jets are now 9-3 when Sanchez doesn't throw an interception.

- **9/26 at MIA:** Sanchez completed 15-of-28 passes for 256 yards, three touchdowns and no interceptions for a 120.5 passer rating. Sanchez matched his career-high with three touchdown passes that he set the week before vs. New England.
- **9/19 vs. NE:** Sanchez completed 21-of-30 passes for 220 yards, three touchdowns and no interceptions for a 124.3 passer rating. Sanchez set career-highs with three touchdown passes (previous high: two set twice, last 11/1/09 vs. MIA), completions with 21 (previous high: 20 set 11/01/09 vs. MIA), the highest regular-season passer rating of his career with 124.3 (previous high: 107.0 set 10/25/09 at OAK), his career-high passer rating of 139.4 came in last season Wild Card game at CIN. Sanchez completed 50-of-82 for 637 yards, with eight touchdowns, no interceptions and a passer rating of 117.8 in consecutive games from Week Two through Week Four against NE (9/19), MIA (9/26) and BUF (10/3). His passer rating ranked first in the NFL in that three week span while his eight touchdown passes tied with Peyton Manning for most in the NFL.

OFFENSIVE LINE

After eleven games in 2010, the New York Jets rushing attack is averaging 4.5 yards an attempt. Through 11 games in 2009, the Jets averaged 4.6 yards a game, when the club finished the season leading the NFL in rushing with 2,756 yards on 607 carries (4.5 avg.).

In 2010, the Jets rushing offense:

- **vs. CIN (11/25):** Recorded the clubs third best rushing output of the season, 170 yards on 37 carries (4.6 avg.) in the Jets ninth win, a 26-10 victory. The output has put the Jets league-high consecutive 100-yard rushing games to 13. **RB Shonn Greene** led the team in rushing for the third consecutive game with 70 yards on 18 carries.
- **vs. HST (11/21):** Finished with 103 rushing yards on 31 attempts in the Week 11 30-27 win. The 100-yard performance pushed the Jets streak of 100-yard contests to 12, the longest current streak in the NFL. For the second time this season, **RB Shonn Greene** led the Jets with 42 rushing yards on 15 carries.
- **at CLV (11/14):** Finished with 172 rushing yards and one touchdown on 45 attempts in the Week 10 OT win. The 100-yard performance pushed the Jets streak of 100-yard contests to 11, the longest current streak in the NFL. For the first time this season, **RB Shonn Greene** led the Jets with 72 rushing yards on 20 carries.
- **at DET (11/7):** Finished with 110 rushing yards and one touchdown on 30 attempts in the Week Nine victory. The 100-yard performance pushed the Jets streak of 100-yard contests to 10.
- **vs. GB (10/31):** Allowed the Jets to earn their ninth consecutive 100-plus yard rushing game (29-119), dating back to 2009. The nine consecutive games is the second-longest current streak in the NFL to Kansas City's 11 consecutive games.
- **at DEN (10/17):** Led the way for the team to rush for 129 yards on 30 carries. It marked the 20th time in 22 games that the Jets have rushed for 100 or more yards under Head Coach Rex Ryan. **RB LaDainian Tomlinson** recorded two rushing touchdowns on 16 carries, including one on a 20-yard run. It marked the 38th game in his career that he has rushed for at least two touchdowns, the most in the NFL. **RB Shonn Greene** averaged 4.8 yards a carry and finished with 43 yards on nine carries.
- **vs. MIN (10/11):** Helped the Jets rush for 155 yards on 32 attempts. It marked the first time in 52 games that a team has rushed for more than 150 yards against the Vikings. The streak of 51 games was the second longest streak in NFL history. **RB Shonn Greene** registered his first touchdown of the season on a 23-yard run in the fourth quarter, he finished the game with 57 yards on 10 carries (5.7). **RB LaDainian Tomlinson** finished the

game with 94 yards on 20 carries (4.7).

- **at BUF (10/3):** Led the Jets to their first 200-plus rushing game of the season and sixth time under **Head Coach Rex Ryan**. Allowed **RB LaDainian Tomlinson** to rush for 133 yards and two touchdowns on 19 carries. It marked Tomlinson's first 100-yard performance since recording 105 yards on 19 carries at NO (12/26/08). His 133 rushing yards are the most since he recorded 146 yards on 26 carries at TEN (12/24/07). The offensive line also opened holes for **RB Shonn Greene** to earn his first 100-yard game of the season, when he collected 117 yards on 22 rushes. Including the playoffs, the performance marked his fourth-career 100 yard effort.
- **at MIA (9/26):** Helped Jets avg. 5.0 yards a rush on 29 carries. Led the way for **RB LaDainian Tomlinson's** 70 yards on 15 carries and the Jets first rushing touchdown of the season, a one-yard run to put the Jets up eight with 2:00 remaining.
- **vs. NE (9/19):** Rushed for 136 yards on 32 carries (4.3 avg.) in Week Two win. Allowed **RB LaDainian Tomlinson** to lead all rushers in the game with 76 yards on 11 carries. Starting **RB Shonn Greene** led all rushers with 15 carries and finished the game with 52 yards.
- **vs. BLT (9/13):** Allowed Jets runners to average 5.5 yards per carry on 21 attempts in the season opener. **RB LaDainian Tomlinson** opened his career with the Jets rushing for 62 yards on 11 carries (5.6 avg.).

2010 RUSHING VS. 2009 RUSHING

In 2006, Jets **General Manager Mike Tannenbaum** focused on the offensive line selecting **LT D'Brickshaw Ferguson** fourth overall and **C Nick Mangold** 29th overall in the NFL draft. The two players have started 75 consecutive games together, making them the only two players who entered the league together to start their team's first 75 regular-season games on the same offensive line since 1970. Ferguson has

earned 2010 *Pro Football Weekly's* Midseason All-Pro team honors, 2009 Pro Bowl honors and 2006 All-Rookie Team honors by *Pro Football Weekly* and the Pro Football Writer's Association. During his first four seasons, Mangold has earned 2009 *Associated Press* All-Pro honors, consecutive Pro Bowl selections (08-09) and All-Rookie team in 2006 as voted by *Pro Football Weekly* and the Pro Football Writer's Association.

MEET THE LINE

In 2009, the Jets ranked No. 1 in the NFL in rushing yards per game at 172.3 yards. In addition to leading the NFL in rushing the 2009 New York Jets finished the season with a franchise-best 2,756 yards on the ground. In 2010, the Jets return four of the five members of the line. The newcomer is **LG Matt Slauson**, a 2009 6th round draft selection.

LT D'Brickashaw Ferguson, selected 4th overall in the 2006 NFL Draft. Earned his first Pro Bowl appearance in 2009. Named to the 2006 All-Rookie Team by *Pro Football Weekly* and the Pro Football Writers' Association.

LG Matt Slauson, originally selected in the 6th round of the 2009 NFL Draft, he earned a starting position this summer on a unit that helped the Jets lead the NFL in rushing last season.

C Nick Mangold, a two-time Pro Bowl selection, earned his First-Team All-Pro honors in 2009. Selected in the first-round of the 2006 NFL Draft (29th overall), Mangold has started every game of his career.

RG Brandon Moore, has helped pave the way for two of the Jets three best rushing seasons. In 2009, the club rushed for a franchise-best 2,756 yards, while the team's 2004 total of 2,388 ranks third-best in team history. In those seasons, he blocked for two rushing champions: Curtis Martin (1,697, 2004 NFL rushing title) and Thomas Jones (1,312 2008 AFC rushing title). Originally, joined the Jets as an undrafted FA defensive tackle in 2002. Moved to guard during the 2003 offseason and earned the starting right guard position in 2004.

RT Damien Woody, selected 17th overall as a center in the 1999 NFL Draft, earned Pro Bowl honors at that position in 2002. Has started games at center (76), right guard (40) and right tackle (42) during his career.

MOORE SCHOOL

Did you know that Jets **G Brandon Moore** spent a portion of his offseason learning from some of the brightest minds at Harvard? Moore took part in the NFL's Business Management and Entrepreneurial Program at the Harvard Business School. Moore and 70 other NFL players crammed a semester's worth of classes into a week-long overview program. The players learned a few fundamentals of the business world, while brain-

storming entrepreneurial endeavors and listening to guest speakers. Moore doesn't intend on hanging up his pads quite yet, but he knows many former NFL players struggle after their playing days and wants to be prepared for the future.

"I was asked if going to the Harvard seminar meant I was going to be retiring and opening a restaurant this year," Moore wrote in a blog on NewYorkJets.com. "No, no, no. I've got a bit more mileage on me. You get so locked into being a football player and into thinking football is the only competitive venue out there. I don't think I'll be getting the thrill I get running out on Sunday against New England. But the program was good, just to see that there are other options out there after leaving the game."

UNDER CALLAHAN'S DIRECTION

LaDAINIAN TOMLINSON

RB LaDainian Tomlinson signed as a free agent with the Jets during the off-season after spending nine seasons with the San Diego Chargers. During his career, he has rushed for 13,231 yards and 143 touchdowns on 3,046 carries and accumulated 4,284 receiving yards and 15 touchdowns on 575 receptions. In eleven games with the Jets, Tomlinson has been the game's leading rusher in seven of the club's games, producing 741 yards and five touchdowns on 166 carries to key a rushing attack that ranks second in the NFL with an average of 148.1 yards per game.

- His 49 rushing yards helped the Jets win their ninth game of the season vs. **Bengals (11/25)** and pushed his career rushing totals to 13,231, just 25 yards shy of Eric Dickerson for sixth all-time on the NFL rushing list.
- Tied for the team lead with seven receptions for 71 yards vs **Texans (11/21)**. Added 36 yards on 12 carries to help the team to a 30-27 victory.
- Finished the game at **Browns (11/14)** with 18 carries for 57 yards. Finished the game with 110 scrimmage yards (57 rushing, 53 receiving). Tomlinson, who played his 150th career game, has 17,345 scrimmage yards, the third-most in a player's first 150 NFL games. He trails Pro Football Hall of Famer Barry Sanders (18,015) and Marshall Faulk (17,909). He has scored 158 touchdowns, the most by a player in his first 150 career games.
- Finished the game at **Lions (11/7)** with 15 carries for 55 yards, marking the seventh game this season that he led all rushers. Led the team with six receptions, including a 13-yard catch and run to the DET 43. At the end of the play Tomlinson was hit while out of bounds for a 15-yard penalty to put the ball on DET 28. The play set up a 36-yard game-tying FG by **K Nick Folk**.
- Finished the game vs. **Packers (10/31)** with 54 yards on 16 carries. It marked the first game of the season that Tomlinson did not lead all rushers, GB Brandon Jackson's 55 rushing yards was one-yard more than Tomlinson's total.
- Scored two touchdowns, both in the fourth quarter, and rushed for 55 yards on 12 carries at **Broncos (10/17)**. His first score, a 20-yarder, tied the game at 17 with 8:43 remaining. He then scored the game-deciding touchdown on a two-yard carry with 1:13 remaining, giving the Jets a 24-20 lead. Tomlinson now has 38 career games with at least two rushing touchdowns, the most in NFL history.
- Rushed for 94 yards on 20 carries vs. **Vikings (10/11)**, aiding an offense that produced 155 yards rushing and ended a streak of 51 consecutive games that the Minnesota defense had limited its opponents to less than 150 yards rushing, a string of games that ranks as the

second-longest in NFL history.

- Earned second start for the Jets and ran for 42 yards on the opening drive at **Bills (10/3)**. His 15-yard run in the first quarter increased his total to 12,739 career rushing yards, an amount that tied him with Tony Dorsett for seventh on the NFL all-time rushing list. His next carry, a one-yard TD run, moved him into sole possession of seventh place. Tomlinson recorded his first 100-yard game as a Jet, recording 133 yards and two touchdowns on 19 carries. It marked his first 100-yard game since 10/26/08 at NO (19-105) and his highest single-game rushing total since he recorded 146 yards on 26 carries at TEN on 12/24/07. Eighty-nine of his 133 yards came in the first half and he finished with two rushing touchdowns, scoring on runs of one yard and 26 yards respectively to improve his career total to 156 total touchdowns, an amount that ranks third all-time in NFL history
- Scored his first touchdown as a Jet on one-yard run that accounted for the team's final score in a 31-23 win over the **Dolphins (9/26)**. He finished the game with 70 yards on 15 carries (4.7 avg.).
- Generated 76 yards on 11 carries (6.9 avg.) in the club's Week Two victory over the **Patriots (9/19)**.
- Tallied 62 yards on 11 carries (5.6 avg.) in the season opener versus the **Ravens (9/13)**.

DARRELLE REVIS

CB Darrelle Revis, who was named to the All-Pro team this season, was voted the 2009 **Curtis Martin Team MVP** by his teammates. NFL Network credited Revis with 31 PD on the season, the most in the NFL since 1994. For his career, he has recorded 14 interceptions, 222 tackles, one sack, 62 passes defended, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and two touchdowns.

The two-time Pro Bowl CB posted an NFL-high 34 passes defended to go with his team-leading six interceptions and 71 tackles, anchoring a unit that finished No. 1 in the NFL

RETURN TO THE ISLAND

Revis enjoyed his best game of the 2010 season at DET (11/7), when he recorded three tackles and two passes defended in limiting DET WR Calvin Johnson to one reception for 13 yards on the day. It was the first time this season, since Week Two, that Revis has been matched up against the opponents number one receiving threat.

Revis matched up against HST WR Andre Johnson in Week 11 and limited him to four catches for 32 yards. In two games against Revis, Johnson has eight catches for 67 yards and no touchdowns.

On Thanksgiving day vs. CIN (11/25), Revis held Terrell Owens to three receptions for 17 yards.

For the season, Revis has recorded 16 tackles, seven passes defended and two fumble recoveries.

SCOTT SETS THE TONE FOR "THE D"

LB Bart Scott personifies Coach Ryan's personality on the field, where he has registered five-consecutive seasons of 100-or-more tackles. Scott has played in 130 games, missing only three in 2004 and has logged 665 tackles, 18 sacks, three interceptions, 25 passes defended, four forced fumbles and five fumble recoveries.

DAVID HARRIS

"He's (Harris) one of the most complete linebackers in our league. He's an elite player who, for whatever reason, a lot of people don't appreciate." Jets Linebackers Coach Bob Sutton (New York Times, 8/1).

In 2009, Harris led a Jets defense that finished first in the NFL in seven categories (yards per game, yards per play, passing yards per game, passing yards per play, first downs allowed, third-down conversions allowed and points allowed). Harris led the unit with 142 tackles and added 5.5 sacks, two interceptions, three passes defended and two forced fumbles.

In postseason play, Harris remained a dominant force as he led the team in both tackles (29) and sacks (2). He added one pass defended and one forced fumble to his statline. Both of Harris' sacks were of IND QB Peyton Manning.

The Jets signed **LB Jason Taylor** as an unrestricted free agent on April 21, 2010. In 2009, he recorded seven sacks, three FF, five PD, one INT, one FR for a touchdown and 42 tackles with the Miami Dolphins.

SACK LEADER

The six-time Pro Bowler (2000, 02, 04, 05, 06 and 07) joined 2009 NFL's top ranked defense to wreak havoc on the league's quarterbacks. Taylor currently ranks 11th on the NFL's All-Time Sack list and his 131.5 sacks give him the most of any active NFL player.

FORMER DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

In 2006, Taylor was recognized as the league's best defender after notching 62 tackles, 13.5 sacks, 11 passes defended, 10 forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and two interceptions, both of which he returned for touchdowns. His 10 forced fumbles are the most recorded by an NFL defender in a single season.

TAYLOR WITH THE JETS

"We brought in Jason (Taylor) to give us that pass rush. We knew he could play and rotate in with the other two guys, Calvin (Pace) and BT (Bryan Thomas). He's a closer. He closes out games. That's been his history." Rex Ryan on Jason Taylor

- In **Week 10**, Taylor sacked DET QB Colt McCoy on third-and-8 with 41 seconds left in overtime. The Browns were forced to punt the ball, giving the Jets the ball back and allowing them to score the game-winning touchdown. Also contributed to the defense with two tackles.
- Taylor strip-sacked Brett Favre for a loss of three-yards with 1:01 remaining in the fourth quarter in **Week 5** against MIN.
- In **Week Four**, Taylor recovered the 28th fumble of his career at BUF (10/3), after LB Bryan Thomas knocked the ball loose from Bills RB Marshawn Lynch.
- In his return to Miami in **Week Three**, Taylor sacked Dolphins QB Chad Henne for a loss of eight yards, making Henne the 67th different quarterback to be taken down by Taylor.
- Taylor closed his first game for the Jets in **Week Two** when he strip-sacked Patriots QB Tom Brady with 4:15 left in the fourth quarter and the Jets leading 28-14. Taylor finished the game with five tackles and a QB hurry in addition to the sack and forced fumble.

ELLIS' LEGACY

DE Shaun Ellis, the Jets longest-tenured player (first-round pick, 2000), recorded his first sack of the 2010 season when he took down BLT QB Joe Flacco and forced a fumble. Ellis finished second on the team with 6.5 sacks in 2009.

- Ellis' 71.5 career sacks are third on the Jets all-time sack list, behind only Joe Klecko (77.5) and Mark Gastineau (107.5), two members of the legendary New York Sack Exchange of the early 1980s.
- His 160 regular season games played for the Jets are the most ever by a Jets defensive lineman. He surpassed a third member of the Sack Exchange, Marty Lyons (147, 1979-89) during the 2009 season.
- Ellis has recorded at least two sacks in a game 11 times in his career.
- His eight postseason starts are the most for any Jets player in franchise history.

REX AND THE REX-PERTS

The reshaping of the Jets, specifically the defense, started with the hiring of Head Coach Rex Ryan on Jan. 21, 2009, from the Baltimore Ravens. Ryan spent four seasons (2005-08) at the helm of the Ravens defense, considered one of the best in the NFL.

Ryan's first hire was Ravens OLB Coach Mike Pettine as the Jets defensive coordinator. Next came Dennis Thurman, who had left the Ravens in 2008 after six years in Baltimore, to coach the Jets defensive backs and he brought in Matt Cavanaugh, the Ravens offensive coordinator during their Super Bowl win, to coach the quarterbacks. Ryan added one more former Ravens' coach to the Jets staff in 2010, when he added Mark Carrier to tutor the defensive line.

Once the 2009 free agency period began, the Jets showed up on Bart Scott's doorstep to sign the LB and followed up that signing by agreeing to a deal with by S Jim Leonhard.

THE CLOSER

CB Dwight Lowery has garnered the nickname "The Closer" after causing turnovers on the opponents last offensive drive in two consecutive games. With 35 seconds remaining at DEN (10/17), Lowery recovered an aborted snap at the Broncos 43-yard line to seal the Jets 24-20 victory. A week earlier vs. MIN (10/11), he returned a QB Brett Favre interception for a touchdown to increase the team's advantage to 29-20 with 1:20 remaining in the game. Lowery now has five career interceptions and two career fumble recoveries.

TREVOR PRYCE

The Jets signed **DE Trevor Pryce** as a free agent on September 30, 2010, after he was released by the Baltimore Ravens. Pryce rejoins former BLT defensive coordinator Rex Ryan, who he played under from 2006-2008. For his career, Pryce has 556 tackles, 91 sacks, two interceptions, 15 passes defended, 14 forced fumbles and four fumble recoveries.

The four-time Pro Bowler's (1999-2002) 91 sacks is tied for fourth among active players in the NFL, tied with IND DE Dwight Freeney and behind new teammate LB Jason Taylor (131.5), ATL DE John Abraham (98.5) and ARZ LB Joey Porter (97.0). Pryce has sacked 50 different quarterbacks, with current teammate Mark Brunell being taken down a high of six times when he played for the Jacksonville Jaguars.

BRYAN'S CONTRIBUTIONS

LB Bryan Thomas started the season off with a strong defensive performance after he sacked BLT **QB Joe Flacco** in the second quarter for a loss of eight yards on a third-down play. Additionally, Thomas led the team with nine total tackles (seven solo) against the Ravens. In Week Eight, Thomas sacked DET **QB Matt Stafford** out of bounds early in the second quarter for a loss of two yards. Thomas recorded his third sack of the season vs. HST (11/21) when he brought down **QB Matt Schaub**. For the season, Thomas has recorded 32 tackles, three sacks, one pass defended, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery.

KEEPING PACE

LB Calvin Pace is currently second on the team, only .5 behind the leader, in sacks with 3.5 despite missing the first four games due to injury. For the season, he has 35 tackles. It is the second consecutive season that he has missed the first four games of the schedule. Pace led the Jets in sacks in both 2008 (7) and 2009 (8). If Pace leads the team in sack this season, he will be only the third player in franchise history to lead the Jets in sacks for three consecutive seasons. The two other players are Mark Gastineau and Mo Lewis, both players led the team for four consecutive seasons.

Nick Folk, a former sixth-round pick by the Dallas Cowboys in 2007, made the Pro Bowl his rookie year after finishing fourth in the NFL in points with 131. In 2010, Folk has scored 92 points, connecting on 22-of-30 field goal attempts with a long of 56 yards. In Week Six at DEN, Folk set a new career high and franchise record when he converted a 56-yard field goal.

A week earlier on Monday Night Football (10/11 vs. MIN), Folk set a new single-game career high, when he connected on all five of his field goal attempts vs. MIN (10/11). Additionally, he has made all 26 of his PAT attempts.

GAME WINNER FOR FOLK

Folk made his second-career game winning field goal when he connected on a 30-yard field goal in overtime to give the Jets a 23-20 victory at DET (11/7/10). Folk also made a 36-yard field goal as time expired to force the extra period. Folk connected on a 31-yard field goal in the second quarter to start the Jets scoring. Folk scored 11 of the teams 23 points. His first game winning kick came on a 53-yard attempt at BUF (10/8/07) on Monday Night Football.

SMITH BLOCKS IT

Eric Smith has become an invaluable member of Mike Westhoff's special teams unit, ranking second on the team with 25 special teams tackles in 2009. But just like Brad Smith, Eric Smith is also called upon for a big play from time-to-time.

For the second time in two seasons, Eric Smith blocked a punt attempt when he got to Brandon Fields in the third quarter at MIA (9/26/10) allowing the Jets to take over possession at the Miami 17-yard line.

Smith's first blocked punt came last season when he blocked a Chris Hanson punt that Brad Smith scooped up for a four-yard touchdown at NE (11/22/10). Smith also blocked a Matt Dodge punt in the first preseason game against the Giants (8/16/10).

WR/QB/RB BRAD SMITH

Brad Smith's contributions to Mike Westhoff's special teams unit have ranged from solid to spectacular. The solid came from his 20 tackles on special teams last season, ranking

him fourth on the team. The spectacular came on his two special teams touchdowns, the team's only two special teams scores last season. He scored the Jets first special teams touchdown when he picked up an Eric Smith blocked punt and walked in for a touchdown and scored again after racing 106 yards with the second-half kickoff against the Indianapolis Colts in a must-win game in week 16.

In 2010, Smith has proven to be a game-changer. Through five weeks he has has thrown a TD, recorded kickoff returns of 32, 54, 38, 86, and 47 yards and registered rushes of 22, 16 and 16 yards.

In Week 5 vs. MIN, Smith recorded an 86 yard kickoff return following the Vikings' first touchdown of the game. The 86-yard return gave the offense the ball on the MIN 19-yard line and led to a 31-yard Nick Folk field goal. In Week 4 at BUF, Smith opened the game with a 38-yard kickoff kickoff return. The Jets offense continued down the field on a nine-play, 63-yard touchdown drive, allowing the Jets to set the tone on offense with a 7-0 lead. Later in the game, Smith threw the first touchdown pass of his career when he connected with Dustin Keller for a 3-yard reception, giving the Jets a 24-7 lead. In Week 3 at Miami, Smith's 38-yard kickoff return shifted the momentum back to the Jets after Miami took a 17-14 lead. On the very next play, Mark Sanchez threw a 67-yard touchdown pass to Braylon Edwards, allowing the Jets to reclaim a 21-17 lead.

Smith currently ranks first in the NFL in kickoff return average.

WR Brad Smith is the only player in the modern era (since 1933) to have scored touchdowns in each of the following ways:

Receiving (2), Rushing (2), Kickoff Return (2), Blocked Punt Return (1) and Thrown a touchdown pass (1)

In Week Twelve, Smith's became the third player in NFL history with an 80 plus yard KOR for a touchdown and 50 plus yard rush for a touchdown in the same game after he scored on a 53-yard run and an 89-yard kickoff return. The only other players to accomplish the feat are **Brian Mitchell** (2000), **Dominic Rhodes** (2001).

For the season, Smith has 27 rushes for 216 yards and one touchdown. He also has four receptions for 44 yards.

Winning Ways:

The Jets 9-2 mark is their best record after 11 games since they opened the season 10-1 in 1986. That season they finished with a 10-6 mark and advanced to the Divisional Playoff game.

After producing a five-game winning streak earlier this season, the Jets current streak stands at four games. The last time the team posted two separate four-game winning streaks in a season was 1998 when they won four straight from 10/19/98 to 11/8/98 and then closed the season on a six-game streak from 11/22/98 to 12/27/98. That season the Jets went 12-4 and advanced to the AFC Championship Game.

The team's ninth win of the season guarantees **Head Coach Rex Ryan** winning seasons in each of his first two years. **General Manager Mike Tannenbaum** now has four winning seasons in his five seasons since becoming GM in 2006. **Jets Chairman and CEO Woody Johnson** has now had eight winning seasons in his 11 years as the team's owner.



GAME 11 REVIEW



RG Brandon Moore made his 100th consecutive start for the Jets.

Despite not practicing all week with a knee injury, **RT Damien Woody** started, the 43rd consecutive regular season game **LT D'Brickashaw Ferguson**, **C Nick Mangold**, Moore and Woody have started together. The foursome has started every game together. Beginning with the 2008 regular season opener.

Following a special teams takeaway, **QB Mark Sanchez** found **WR Santonio Holmes** for 13-yard touchdown, the third touchdown connection between the two in the last two games. Sanchez has now thrown touchdown passes in four consecutive games, matching the longest streak of his career, initially set his rookie season from 10/25/09 to 11/22/09.

The Jets posted 170 yards on 37 carries (4.6 average), marking the fourth-time this season they have run for at least 150 yards – 273 at BUF (10/3), 155 yards vs. MIN (10/11) and 172 at CLV (11/14) in overtime.

Brad Smith, Bengal Hunter:

WR Brad Smith became the third wide receiver in NFL history since 1950 to record a rushing touchdown and kick return for a touchdown in the same game, joining Billy "White Shoes" Johnson achieved the feat for HOU in 1977 and Bobby Mitchell for CLE in 1960.

Smith took an end-around handoff and ran 53 yards for a touchdown. It is the second rushing touchdown of Smith's career (last 1/3/10 vs. CIN), the longest touchdown run of his career and the second-longest run of his career (57 yards vs. CIN, 1/3/10). It was Smith's 57-yard run out of wildcat formation that led to the first Jets points in last season's regular-season finale against CIN.

After a CIN field goal cut the Jets lead to seven in the fourth-quarter, Smith took the ensuing kickoff 89 yards for a touchdown. On the play, Smith lost his shoe and ran the last 50 yards without it. It was Smith's longest return this season and second-longest kickoff return of his career (106 yards, at IND 12/27).

Smith finished the game with 55 yards rushing, 23 yards receiving and 122 yards on kickoff returns, for 200 all-purpose yards, only the second time in his career he has tallied at least 200 yards. The only other time he collected 200 all-purpose yards was earlier this season at MIA when he collected 11 yards receiving, 41 yards rushing and 150 yards on kickoff returns.

After scoring on both a kickoff return and rushing attempt, Smith registered the first multi-touchdown game of his career. He has now scored seven total touchdowns in his career, including two receiving touchdowns, two rushing touchdowns, two kickoff returns for touchdowns and a blocked punt return for a touchdown. Smith has also thrown a touchdown pass.

Defense:

The Jets defense held CIN to season-lows of 163 total net yards and 46 rushing yards. Tonight's game marks the second time this season the Jets have held their opponent to under 50 yards rushing and third time in Coach Ryan's first two seasons as head coach. The 163 yards of total offense are the fewest allowed by the Jets since they gave up 124 yards of total offense at TB (12/13/09).

The Jets defense limited CIN WRs Terrell Owens and Chad Ochocinco to a combined 58 yards receiving on seven receptions. Owens caught three passes for 17 yards while Ochocinco had four catches for 41 yards.

S Jim Leonhard intercepted a QB Carson Palmer pass in the second quarter, the Jets first interception since **CB Dwight Lowery** picked off QB Brett Favre vs. MIN (10/11). It is the first interception of the season for Leonhard, and fifth of his career.

With the Bengals deep in Jets territory, **CB Antonio Cromartie** intercepted his third pass of the season when he picked off Palmer in the end zone. His three interceptions lead the team this season, and are the most Cromartie has had since 2007, when he intercepted 10 passes.

With three takeaways (two interceptions, one fumble recovery), the Jets matched their season-high for takeaways set three other teams, last vs. MIN (10/11).

LB Calvin Pace sacked Palmer for a four-yard loss in the fourth quarter. On the season, Pace now has 2.5 sacks on the season and 32.5 for his career.

Later in the fourth quarter, **LB David Harris** sacked Palmer for a loss of eight yards, his second sack this season, giving him 13.5 for his career.

After sacking Palmer in the end zone, **DE Trevor Pryce** recorded the first Jets safety since 12/28/03. It was the first sack for Pryce as a Jet and the 91st of his career.

Special Teams:

On a **P Steve Weatherford** punt, CIN WR Andre Caldwell touched a punt that bounced all the way down to the 14-yard line before **S James Ihedigbo** recovered the fumble. It was the Jets second special teams takeaway this season and first since BUF (10/3).

Winning Ways:

With their 30-27 win, the Jets ran their record to 8-2, their best record after 10 games since the team posted a 9-1 mark in 1986. That season, the Jets finished 10-6 and reached the AFC Divisional Playoff Game.

After becoming the first team in NFL history to advance to the postseason with two separate losing streaks of three games, the Jets have now posted two winning streaks of at least three games this season, the second time in **Head Coach Rex Ryan's** tenure with the club they have accomplished that feat. Prior to Rex Ryan, the last time the Jets had two separate three-game winning streaks was 2004, when

they opened the season 5-0 and then won three consecutive games from 11/21/04 to 12/5/05 and ended the year with a 10-6 record.

Close games:

Today's game marked the third consecutive game and fifth overall contest this season that has been decided by seven points or less. The Jets have posted a 4-1 record in those games, earning a 24-20 victory at Denver (10/17), 23-20 win at Detroit (11/7), 26-20 win at Cleveland (11/14) in addition to today's win versus the Texans. The sole loss was a 10-9 defeat versus Baltimore (9/13) in the season opener. Also, the Jets are 2-1 in games decided by three points or less.

In 2009, the Jets played eight games decided by seven points or less, registering a 3-5 mark in those contests, and three games decided by three points or less, going 0-3 in those contests. The last time the Jets played three consecutive games decided by seven points or less was 2007 when they lost 20-13 at BLT (9/16/07), won 31-28 vs. MIA (9/23/07) and lost 17-14 at BUF (9/30/07).

Comeback Trail:

The fourth-quarter comeback with 55 seconds remaining in the game marks the third time this season the Jets have won the game with a touchdown in the final two minutes of the game this season. Previously, they scored on a two-yard **RB LaDainian Tomlinson** run with 1:13 remaining after a 10-play, 80-yard drive to beat DEN (10/17) on the road and again when they scored on the final play of the game on a 37-yard touchdown pass to **WR Santonio Holmes** with 16 seconds remaining in overtime last week against CLV (11/14).

Offense:

WR Santonio Holmes totaled seven catches for 126 yards and two touchdowns, including a game-winning six-yard touchdown pass with 10 seconds remaining in the game. It marked his tenth career 100-yard receiving game and his second consecutive such outing for the Jets. It marked second consecutive game that he scored the decisive touchdown. Holmes scored his first touchdown of the game on a 41-yard reception. Holmes 126 receiving yards represented his highest single-game total since he caught eight passes for 149 yards vs. OAK (12/6/09) and he scored two touchdowns in a game for the first time since he played at BLT (12/14/07). Last week at CLV (11/14), Holmes scored the winning touchdown on a 37-yard reception in overtime. Today's effort also marked the fourth game this season that Holmes has been involved in a key play that led to a Jets victory. At DET (11/7), his 52-yard reception in overtime set up Nick Folk's game-winning 30-yard field goal. At DEN (10/17), Holmes drew a pass interference call that set up the winning touchdown in a 24-20 victory.

In the 25th regular season start of his NFL career, **QB Mark Sanchez** completed 22-of-38 passes for 315 yards and three touchdowns with one interception for a 100.2 passer rating. Over his last three games, all Jets wins, Sanchez has thrown for 950 yards on 71-of-121 passing with six touchdowns, three interceptions and an 89.9 rating. In those contests, Sanchez has posted the three highest single-game totals for passing yards of his career, throwing for a career-high 336 yards in an overtime win at DET (11/7), 299 yards in an overtime win at CLV (11/14) and 315 yards today vs. HST. His 100.2 passer rating in today's game marked the eighth time in his career that Sanchez has posted a passer rating of 100-or-more, while his three touchdown passes equal a career-high, achieved twice prior to today, most recently at MIA (9/26/10). Sanchez entered today's game with a league-leading 891 yards passing over the last three weeks. Over the last four games, has thrown for 1,206 yards and six touchdowns on 87-of-159 passing with five interceptions. As a starter, Sanchez owns a record of 16-9 during the regular season and an 18-10 mark, including the postseason.

On the drive that produced the Jets first touchdown of the game, **WR Patrick Turner** recorded his first career NFL reception, a 21-yard gain and, on the following play, FB Tony Richardson, gained two yards on his first rushing attempt of the season.

With his four-yard touchdown reception that provided the Jets with a 10-7 advantage, **WR Braylon Edwards** now has a team-leading six touchdown catches. Edwards ended the game with four receptions for 86 yards to increase his totals to 33 receptions for a team-high 598 yards and six touchdowns.

The Jets totaled 103 rushing yards on 31 attempts to increase their streak to 12 consecutive 100-yard rushing performances, the longest active streak in the NFL.

LaDainian Tomlinson:

With his eighth carry of the game, Tomlinson moved past both Edgerrin James (3,028) and Marcus Allen (3,022) for sixth place on the all-time rushing attempts list. Tomlinson finished the game with 12 carries, giving him 3,033 for his career. Tomlinson needs 30 rushing attempts to surpass Barry Sanders (3,062) for fifth all-time.

With 36 rushing yards and 71 receiving yards, Tomlinson surpassed 100 yards of total offense for the second consecutive game after gaining 110 yards of total offense at CLV (57 rushing, 53 receiving). The last time Tomlinson had consecutive games with 100 yards of total offense was 2008, when he gained 170 yards (105 rushing, 65 receiving) at NO (10/26/08) and then 117 (78 rushing, 39 receiving) vs. KC (11/9/08).

With those 107 yards from scrimmage, Tomlinson surpassed former Jets RB Curtis Martin (17,430) for seventh-place on the all-time yards from scrimmage list. Tomlinson now has 17,452 yards from scrimmage (13,182 yards rushing, 4,270 yards receiving). Tomlinson needs 202 yards from scrimmage to pass Marcus Allen (17,654) for sixth-place all-time.

This season, Tomlinson has totaled 688 yards and five touchdowns on 153 carries (4.5 avg.) and 315 yards on a team-leading 43 receptions. He leads the Jets in rushing yards, rushing attempts, rushing touchdowns and receptions.

Defense:

On the final play of the first half, **LB Bryan Thomas** sacked QB Matt Schaub for an eight-yard loss, his third-sack this season and second in the last three weeks. Thomas now has 28 career sacks.

DT Mike Devito forced a RB Arian Foster fumble that was recovered by **S Jim Leonhard**. It was the first forced fumble of Devito's career

and first fumble recovery for Leonhard this season and the third of his career. This was the Jets 12th fumble recovery of the season. The entered the game with an NFL high 11 opponents' fumbles recovered.

After winning the toss and electing to defer, the Jets defense produced a three-and-out, leading to a 37-yard **K Nick Folk** field goal. This was the fourth-time this season the Jets have forced a three-and-out on the opponents' opening drive. The Jets would go on to force four HST three-and-outs in the game.

Special Teams:

Following an opening possession three-and-out, **S. Jim Leonhard** returned a Matt Turk punt 30 yards, setting up a Jets opening drive at the HST 29-yard line that resulted in a field goal. The return was the longest punt return by the Jets since Leonhard returned a punt 32 yards in the season-opener against BLT and the Jets fourth punt return of 20+ yards this season.

After his 37-yard field goal to opening the scoring, **K Nick Folk** has now scored the game's first points four times this season. The Jets (at CLV, at DET and vs. MIN) have won three of those contests and lost one (vs. BLT). Folk finished the game three-for-four on field goal attempts, connecting on kicks from 37, 33 and 30 yards away.

P Steve Weatherford established a career high with a net average of 45.3 yards, surpassing the 45.0 net average he posted on four punts against IND in the AFC Championship game (1/24/10). On his first punt of the game, Steve Weatherford punted 50 yards, pinning HST at the five-yard line. Weatherford finished the game with four punts for 190 yards and two punts inside the 20-yard line, giving him 21 punts inside the 20 this season.

Offense:

With his eight-yard carry at 10:29 in the second quarter, **RB LaDainian Tomlinson** surpassed 13,000 career rushing yards, joining Walter Payton as the only two players in NFL history to record more than 13,000 yards rushing and 4,000 yards receiving in their career. Tomlinson has amassed career totals of 13,034 rushing yards and 4,097 receiving yards.

WR Jerricho Cotchery recorded a season-long 49-yard reception in the third quarter, that also stands as the second-longest pass he has ever caught from **QB Mark Sanchez**. The longest is a 53-yarder (11/1/09 vs. MIA).

With 256 yards passing, Sanchez tied his season-high, set 9/26 at MIA. He also completed three passes of at least 30 yards, tying a career-high set in his first game at HST on 9/13/09, connecting on passes of 49 yards to Cotchery, 40 yards to TE Dustin Keller and 32 yards to WR Braylon Edwards.

Defense:

Green Bay QB Aaron Rodgers completed 15-of-34 passes for 170 yards with no touchdowns and no interceptions for a passer rating of 59.7. Today's single-game totals represented his lowest of the season for passing yards, completion percentage and passer rating. It also marked the first time this season that he did not throw a touchdown pass. Moreover, today's effort marked his first game as a starter that the offense did not produce a touchdown. There were four three-and-outs forced by the Jets defense.

With the Packers driving deep in Jets territory, **LB David Harris** came through the middle to record a nine-yard sack of Aaron Rodgers and

register his first sack this season, giving him 12.5 for his career.

CB Dwight Lowery sacked Rodgers for a five-yard loss. It is Lowery's second sack this season, and second of his career.

The Jets defense held the Packers without a third-down conversion in the first half, marking the third time this season and second consecutive home game that the Jets have held their opponent without a third-down conversion in the first half. The Packers finished the game converting just 2-of-14 third-down attempts.

The Jets held the Packers under 100 yards rushing as a team, the sixth time this season the Jets have held an opponent to less than 100 yards rushing. The Jets also held the Packers to just 156 yards passing, the second-lowest total allowed by the club this season (128 by BUF on 10/13) and almost 100 yards less than the Packers average of 250.7 yards. The Packers entered the game ranked eighth in the NFL in passing yards per game.

LB Josh Mauga, added to the active roster from the practice squad earlier in the week, made his NFL debut.

Special Teams:

On the opening kickoff of the second half, **WR Brad Smith** returned the ball 47 yards into Packer territory. It was the third-time this season Smith has returned a kickoff more than 40 yards.

P Steve Weatherford averaged 43.2 yards on five punts and helped limit the Packers to no punt returns. His effort marked the fourth game of the season that he posted a net punting average of 40 yards or more.

His first score, a 20-yarder, tied the game at 17 with 8:43 remaining and marked the third consecutive game that the Jets scored a touchdown on a run of 20 or more yards. His second score was a two-yarder with 1:13 remaining to provide the team with a 24-20 advantage. For the season, Tomlinson leads the team with 490 yards on 92 carries and his five touchdowns tie for team honors.

QB Mark Sanchez recorded the first victory of his career in which he led the Jets to the winning points with two minutes or less remaining in the game. He threw his first interception of the season to DEN OLB Jason Hunter on his third pass of the game. The interception ended his streak of 184 pass attempts without an interception, the second longest in Jets history, trailing only Ken O'Brien who registered 211 pass attempts without an interception from 1987-88.

Offense:

Starting their second drive at the Vikings' 40-yard line, the Jets used runs of 12 and 17 yards by LaDainian Tomlinson to set up a field goal drive and take a 3-0 lead in the first quarter.

QB Mark Sanchez established a new career-high for passing attempts in the first half with 29. His previous high of 20 attempts came in his first career game at HST on 9/13/09.

RB Shonn Greene scored his first touchdown of the season on a 23-yard run that increased the Jets advantage to 22-13 with 4:30 remaining in the fourth quarter. He finished the game with 57 yards on 10 carries, contributing to the team's 155 yards as the Jets became the

first team in 52 games to rush for at least 150 yards against the Vikings, ending the second-longest streak in NFL history.

With 94 yards on 20 carries, **RB LaDainian Tomlinson** was the game's leading rusher for the fifth consecutive week.

Defense:

After winning the toss and electing to defer, the Jets produced a three-and-out on a penalty-laden Viking drive. New York has not allowed a score on an opponents' opening drive this season.

With the Vikings facing a third-and-four on their second drive, **CB Drew Coleman** sacked QB Brett Favre for a seven-yard loss to force the Vikings second-consecutive three-and-out to start the game. The sack was Coleman's first of the season and the third of his career.

For the third time in their first four possessions, the Jets defense forced a three-and-out, forcing the Vikings to punt from their own 12-yard line. The defense forced six three-and-out possessions during the game.

After an aborted snap by Brett Favre, **LB Bart Scott** recovered the ensuing fumble. It was the Jets sixth fumble recovery this season and the Jets have recovered fumbles in four of their first five games.

The Jets shutout their opponent in the first half for the first time under Head Coach Rex Ryan, as they held the Vikings to 52 total yards and zero third-down conversions on five attempts.

The Jets recovered their second fumble of the game on a botched hand-off by Favre. The fumble was recovered by **CB Darrelle Revis** who returned the ball 10 yards to the Vikings 45-yard line.

Holding a two-point advantage with under two minutes to play in the game, **CB Dwight Lowery** sealed the win when he intercepted a Favre pass intended for TE Visanthe Shiancoe and returned it 26 yards for a touchdown. It was the first interception of the season for Lowery and fifth of his career. It was the first touchdown of his career and the first score the Jets have recorded on a return this season.

Before the Vikings converted on a third-and-15 with 5:10 remaining in the third quarter, The Jets defense had not allowed a third-down conversion in 21 consecutive opportunities, stretching back to the third quarter of the third regular season game at MIA.

Special Teams:

K Nick Folk opened the scoring by connecting on a 25-yard field goal in the first quarter. Folk later connected on a 53-yard field goal in the second quarter, his longest field goal as a Jet and first of 50-or-more yards in two attempts. That 53-yard field goal, ties the longest kick of his career, set in his rookie season when he kicked the game winner against BUF on Monday Night Football on 10/18/07.

With his fifth field goal of the game, Folk established a new single-game career-high, surpassing his previous best of four field goals made, set on two occasions. For the season, Folk has converted 12-of-14 field goals and has scored at least seven points in all five Jet games.

Both of **P Steve Weatherford's** first two punts pinned the Vikings inside the 20-yard line. The first kick was fair caught at the 11-yard line and the second was downed by **CB Marquice Cole** at the six. For the game, Weatherford placed four punts inside the 20-yard line, tying his career-high, set in the first game of the season versus Baltimore. For the season, Weatherford is tied for second in the NFL with 12 punts inside the 20 yard line, trailing on Donnie Jones of SL who has registered 13. Through five games, he has almost achieved half of his single-season career high of 25.

Following the first Vikings points of the game, **WR Brad Smith** return the kickoff 86 yards to the 19-yard line. That 86-yard return represented his longest this season and the second-longest return of his career (106 yards at IND, 12/27/09).

Offense:

For the second consecutive week the Jets scored a touchdown on their opening drive of the game. The drive covered 63-yards in nine plays in 4:18 and was capped by a one-yard touchdown run by RB LaDainian Tomlinson.

RB LaDainian Tomlinson earned his second start as a Jet and ran for 42 yards on the opening drive. His 15-yard run with 11:24 left in the first quarter increased his total to 12,739 career rushing yards, an amount that tied him with Tony Dorsett for seventh on the NFL all-time rushing list. His next carry, a one-yard TD run, moved him into seventh with 12,740 yards.

Tomlinson recorded his first 100-yard game as a Jet, recording 133 yards and two touchdowns on 19 carries. It marked his first 100-yard game since 10/26/08 at NO (19-105) and the most he has recorded since he recorded 146 yards on 26 carries at TEN on 12/24/07. Tomlinson rushed for 89 of his 133 yards in the first half. Tomlinson scored two rushing touchdowns, scoring on runs of one yard and 26

yards respectively to improve his career total to 156 total touchdowns, an amount that ranks third all-time in NFL history.

RB Shonn Greene finished with 117 yards on 22 carries. Including the postseason, he has recorded four 100-yard rushing games during his career.

Today's game marked the second time under Head Coach Rex Ryan that the Jets produced two 100-yard rushers in the same game. The previous contest occurred on 10/25/09 at Oakland (Thomas Jones 26-121-1 TD and Shonn Greene 19-144-2 TD). Prior to 2009, the last time the Jets achieved this feat was 11/1/04 versus the Miami Dolphins when both Curtis Martin and LaMont Jordan surpassed the century mark. Also, today's effort marks the sixth contest under Ryan that the team has rushed for at least 200 yards and the ninth time the Jets have recorded 40-or-more rushing attempts.

Long Scoring Drives: **K Nick Folk** capped an 18-play, 87-yard drive with a 19-yard field goal. The drive marks the second longest scoring drive of the season by the team (7-plays, 90-yards at MIA 9/26). On the season, the club has scored on nine drives of 70 or more yards (seven touchdowns and two field goals)

Long passes: **QB Mark Sanchez** connected with **WR Braylon Edwards** for a 41-yard touchdown pass with 2:32 remaining. It is the third time this season the two have combined for a score. In their 15 regular season games together, the pair has completed four passes of 40 or more yards. Sanchez finished the game 14-of-24 for 161 yards and two touchdowns for a passer rating of 106.4. It is the seventh time in his career that he recorded a 100 plus passer rating.

The Jets 261 yards in the first half, are the most by a Jets offense since they recorded 268 yards in the first half against Buffalo (10/18/09).

WR Brad Smith completed a 3-yard touchdown pass to **TE Dustin Keller**. It is the first touchdown pass of Smith's career. Smith now has five career touchdowns, scored in four different ways (two receiving, one rushing, one returning and one passing)

Keller caught his second touchdown pass of the day on a two-yard pass from Sanchez. It is the fifth touchdown reception for Keller in three weeks.

Today's game is the third time this season the Jets have scored 28-points or more, it equals the club's 2009 total. The Jets have scored 28 or more points in five of their last six regular season games. Since scoring nine points and registering 176 total net yards in the season opener versus BLT (9/13), the Jets have averaged 32.2 points and 394 yards a game. The Jets 21-points in the third quarter extended their lead from 17-7 at the half to 38-7. The 21 points in the third quarter represented more points scored than the combined total of the first three games

Defense:

S Brodney Pool earned his first start as a Jet.

DB Dwight Lowery recorded his first career sack.

DE Shaun Ellis recorded his third sack of the season, when he dropped Bills QB Ryan Fitzpatrick for a 10-yard loss in the third quarter. Ellis left the game injured on the play

LB Bryan Thomas forced a fumble by Bills RB Marshawn Lynch in the third quarter that was recovered by LB Jason Taylor. For Taylor, it was his 28th career fumble recovery.

The Jets held the Bills without a third down conversion (0-for-10) for the entire game. It is the second time under Ryan that the team has not allowed a third down conversion (at TB 12/13/09).

For the fourth consecutive game the Jets defense has not allowed a score in the first quarter.

The Bills did not complete their first pass until 6:45 remained in the second quarter, a one-yard pass from QB Ryan Fitzpatrick to FB Corey McIntyre.

Special Teams:

The Bills muffed their first kickoff return. It was recovered at Buffalo's 39 yard-line by **LB Lance Laury**. The drive resulted in a **K Nick Folk** missed 30-yard field goal attempt.

Offense:

OL Vladimir Ducasse was active for the first time.

RB LaDainian Tomlinson made his first start as a Jet.

WR Brad Smith made his first start since 12/13/09 at TB.

QB Mark Sanchez led the Jets on an opening-drive touchdown for the first time this season when he completed four-of-five passes for 58 yards, culminating in a 24-yard touchdown pass to TE Dustin Keller, marking Keller's second consecutive game with a touchdown reception. Sanchez converted two key third downs on the drive, first with a 16-yard pass to Keller on third-and-four and again with an 11-yard hookup with WR Brad Smith on third-and-10.

The Jets took a 14-point lead early in the second quarter when Sanchez capped a seven-play, 90-yard drive when he again found Keller for the touchdown, this time on a 12-yard pass. RB LaDainian Tomlinson set the Jets up in the red zone on a 21-yard run on the heels of

a Dolphins personal foul penalty against WR Jericho Cotchery. Tomlinson was freed with two key blocks, first from WR Braylon Edwards who had entered the game just two plays earlier and second from Keller who allowed him to get to the sideline.

The Jets responded to a go-ahead Dolphins third-quarter score when Sanchez found Edwards for 67 yards on the ensuing drive's first play. That 67-yard connection ranks as the second-longest Sanchez-Edwards completion and longest regular-season completion, surpassing a 65-yard touchdown between the two against ATL on 12/20/09 (longest: 80 yard on 1/24/10 at IND – AFC Championship game). Sanchez has now thrown three touchdown passes for consecutive weeks.

The Jets capped a 12-play, 80-yard touchdown drive with a Tomlinson one-yard score. The score marked the first rushing touchdown of the season for the Jets and the first touchdown for Tomlinson as a Jet. Sanchez kept the drive alive when he found Edwards for a gain of 20 yards on third-and-10 to convert at mid-field.

Sanchez is now 36-of-58 for 476 yards, with six touchdowns, no interception and a passer rating of 158.3 in the past two games.

Defense:

On the Dolphins second play from scrimmage, DE Shaun Ellis sacked QB Chad Henne for a loss of three yards. It was Ellis' second sack in three games.

In his first game in Miami as a visitor, LB Jason Taylor sacked Henne for a loss of eight yards in the first quarter.

CB Drew Coleman sealed a Jets victory intercepting Henne in the end zone with 34 seconds left in the game. It marked the first interception of Coleman's career.

Special Teams:

WR Brad Smith recorded the Jets longest kickoff return this season when he returned a kick 54 yards in the second quarter.

P Steve Weatherford pinned the Dolphins at the 5-yard line on a third quarter punt, his second punt inside the 20-yard line in the game and seventh in the season's first three games.

S Eric Smith blocked a P Brandon Fields punt late in the third quarter, the second blocked punt of his career. Smith's first block came last season when he blocked a Chris Hanson punt that was returned by B. Smith for a touchdown against NE on 11/22/09.

K Nick Folk followed the E. Smith blocked punt with a 30-yard field goal, his six of the season. With his 60-yard field goal attempt blocked right before the end of the first-half, Folk is now six-of-seven on the season.

Offense:

QB Mark Sanchez completed 21-of-30 passes for 220 yards, three touchdowns and no interceptions for a 124.3 passer rating. Sanchez set career-highs with three touchdown passes (previous high: two set twice, last 11/1/09 vs. MIA), completions with 21 (previous high: 20 set 11/01/09 vs. MIA), the highest regular-season passer rating of his career with 124.3 (previous high: 107.0 set 10/25/09 at OAK), his career-high passer rating of 139.4 came in last season Wild Card game at CIN. Sanchez also posted a 70% completion percentage, the second-highest percentage of his career (high: 76.5% set 11/29/09 vs. CAR). Today's game marks the ninth contest in his 17 regular-season games that Sanchez has not thrown an interception. The Jets are now 7-3 when Sanchez doesn't throw an interception.

Including the postseason, this marks the fifth game that Sanchez has posted a passer rating of 100.0 or better. He also posted a passer rating of 100.0 or better in last season's home victory over New England when he completed 14-of-22 passes for 163 yards and one touchdown with no interception to post a passer rating of 101.1. Sanchez's other games with a 100.0 or better passer rating occurred at OAK on 10/25/09 (107.0), vs. MIA on 11/01/09 (101.3) and at CIN during the postseason on 1/9/09 (139.4).

Sanchez was a perfect 11-for-11 passing on the Jets three touchdown drives, completing six passes for 64 yards on the first score, three passes for 33 yards on the second and two passes for six yards on the third. His passer rating on the three scoring drives was 145.3.

Following the Patriots first touchdown, Sanchez led the Jets on a 12-play, 77-yard drive in the second quarter, converting all three third downs on passes to WR Braylon Edwards, including the 10-yard touchdown pass.

In the third quarter following a three-and-out by the Patriots, the Jets marched 70 yards on six plays to take a 21-14 lead on a two-yard touchdown pass from Sanchez to WR Jerricho Cotchery that was followed by a two-point conversion reception by Edwards.

In the fourth quarter, Sanchez orchestrated the game's final scoring drive to give the Jets a 28-14 advantage. Aided by two pass interference penalties, Sanchez connected with TE Dustin Keller for a one-yard score, his third touchdown pass of the game.

For the season, Sanchez has completed 31-of-51 passes for 294 yards and three touchdowns with no interceptions and passer rating of 96.4.

Down 14-10 at half-time, the Jets closed the game on an 18-0 run and controlled the ball for 20:02 in the second-half.

The Jets converted six times on 13 third-down chances vs. New England, just a week after going one-for-11 on third down vs. BLT.

Defense:

CB Antonio Cromartie intercepted his second pass in his second game as a Jet when pulled in a QB Tom Brady pass intended for WR Randy Moss at the three-yard line.

In his Jets debut, S Brodney Pool intercepted Brady on a ball intended for Randy Moss that was initially tipped by Moss, then deflected off Cromartie's helmet before Pool reeled it in as he slid out-of-bounds.

LB Jason Taylor recorded his first sack and forced fumble as a Jet, dropping Brady for a nine-yard loss and jarring the ball loose before it was scooped up by LB Bryan Thomas, who returned it 16 yards.

DTs Sione Pouha and Mike Devito again keyed a defensive line that held the opposition to under 60 yards rushing for the game. After holding BLT to 49 yards rushing on 35 carries (1.4 average), the Jets held New England to 52 yards on 20 carries (2.6 average).

After struggling on third down vs. BLT, allowing 11-of-19 third-down conversions (57.9%), the Jets held New England to five-of-11 (45%) on third down. Entering the game, the Patriots had posted the league's best third-down conversion rate, enjoying success on nine-of-13 opportunities.

In the second-half, the defense limited the Patriots to 80 yards, eight first downs, one-of-four on third down and a time of possession of 9:58. QB Tom Brady threw for completed 7-of-16 passes for 69 yards. WR Randy Moss did not record a reception and WR Wes Welker had two catches for five yards.

Special Teams:

K Nick Folk made a 49-yard field goal to end the half, his longest field goal as a Jet and added another 36-yarder in the third quarter. For the season, he is a perfect five-for-five on field goal attempts.

CB Kyle Wilson opened the second half with a 15-yard kickoff return, his first as a Jet.

P Steve Weatherford punter four times for an average of 51.3 yards per punt, his best average as a Jet and the second-best average of his career (57.0 average on two punts with the Saints at DEN on 9/21/08).

Offense:

RB Shonn Greene made the first start of his NFL career and recorded the first regular-season reception of his NFL career when he caught a nine-yard pass from QB Mark Sanchez on the game's second play.

Defense:

On the first offensive play for the Ravens, DE Shaun Ellis and LB Bryan Thomas split a seven-yard sack of QB Joe Flacco, forcing a fumble that was recovered by NT Sione Pouha for a two-yard return. The fumble recovery by Pouha was the first of his career.

Rookie CB Kyle Wilson recorded the first pass defense of his career when he broke up a pass intended for WR Anquan Boldin in the end zone.

The Jets forced a second fumble, when LB Bart Scott wrestled the ball free from RB Willis McGahee after a tackle for a two-yard loss. The fumble was again recovered by Pouha.

Thomas, who already split a sack with Ellis, recorded another when he dropped Flacco for a loss of eight yards.

CB Antonio Cromartie intercepted a Flacco pass for his first interception as a Jet. Cromartie then returned the ball 66 yards to the 31-yard line. The 66-yard return marked the second-longest of his career (longest: 70 yards off QB Matt Schaub on 10/28/07).

Special Teams:

K Nick Folk opened the scoring when he connected on a 23-yard field goal to cap the Jets second drive. The field goal marked Folk's first as a member of the Jets. He would later add two more field goals, including a 48-yard field goal to pull the Jets within one point at the start of the fourth quarter.

S Jim Leonhard returned a punt 32 yards into Baltimore territory. For Leonhard, that return marked his longest punt return since he returned a punt 37 yards against Tennessee on 9/27/09. He later added another long return with a 22-yarder, that set up a field goal drive to help pull the Jets within a point.

After a 56-yard P Steve Weatherford punt, S James Ihedigbo tackled S Tom Zbikowski for a loss of four yards at the one-yard line. Weatherford pinned the Ravens inside the five again, when he punted 38 yards to the two-yard line before CB Marquice Cole and Ihedigbo downed the ball. For the game, Weatherford had four punts inside the 20, a career-high.

Miscellaneous:

Kickoff was delayed 25 minutes due to inclement weather (7:25 Kickoff)

The Jets finished with 14 penalties for 125 yards, the most they've had in a game since 10/18/09 against Buffalo last year. The Jets record for most penalties in a game is 17, committed vs. Miami on 10/18/1987 and the record for most penalty yards is 161, record against Cleveland on the first-ever Monday Night game on 9/21/1970.
