The Patriots will face the Cincinnati Bengals on Thursday in the 2009 preseason home-opener at Gillette Stadium. The Patriots opened the preseason last Thursday with a 27-25 win over the Philadelphia Eagles at Lincoln Financial Field. Cincinnati opened the preseason last Friday with 17-7 loss at New Orleans.

JIM NANCE INDUCTED INTO PATRIOTS HALL OF FAME

In a year that the franchise is celebrating its 50th anniversary, Patriots fans had an opportunity to vote for one of three hall of fame finalists, each of whom were perennial American Football League (AFL) All-Stars for the then Boston Patriots. Fullback Jim Nance has earned the honor of becoming the 14th player and the first running back to be inducted into the team's hall of fame. Nance passed away on June 17, 1992. He is survived by his daughter, Rachel, who will represent her father at the Patriots Hall of Fame induction ceremony. In a fitting tribute to the Patriots 50th anniversary, Chairman and CEO Robert Kraft has inducted the Patriots original owner Billy Sullivan into the hall of fame as a contributor. Nance and Sullivan will be honored in a ceremony on August 20 at 4:30 p.m. on the Plaza outside The Hall at Patriot Place presented by Raytheon.

PATRIOTS VS. BENGALS

SERIES HISTORY

The Patriots and Bengals will meet this week for the sixth time in preseason play and the first time since the 2005 preseason when the Patriots beat the Bengals, 23-13, in Cincinnati.

New England is 2-3 in preseason contests against the Bengals but has a 13-8 advantage in the regular-

season series between the clubs, including a three-game winning streak in regular-season play. The Patriots have scored over 30 points in the last three games with a 35-28 win in 2004, a 38-13 win in 2006 and a 34-13 win in 2007.

Meeting for the third time one year, the Patriots defeated the Bengals 23-13 in the first preseason game of 2005. Several new Patriots received significant playing time, with three rookies having a hand in the Patriots two touchdowns.

Seventh round draft pick Matt Cassel and free agent acquisition Monty Beisel were among the new Patriots on the field, and both contributed strong debut performances. Cassel completed 13 of 21 passes for 135 yards and one touchdown, posting a quarterback rating of 96.3 in his first NFL action. Beisel, who made several demonstrative hits on Bengals receivers, led the Patriots defense with five tackles (three solo), Beisel also added a special teams tackle.

The first quarter was a defensive struggle, with both teams turning over the ball and neither scoring. On the first play from scrimmage, Patriots cornerback Asante Samuel made an acrobatic play to intercept a Carson Palmer pass intended for Chad Ochocinco. After a six-play drive led by starting quarterback Rohan Davey ended in a Josh Miller punt, the Bengals responded with a heavy dose of running back Rudi Johnson, driving 58 yards to the Patriots 25 yard line, where kicker Carter Warley missed a 43-yard field goal. On the subsequent Patriots drive, Davey was intercepted by Cincinnati cornerback Deltha O'Neal on a pass intended for rookie free agent Bam Childress.

The teams began the second quarter trading field goals, with Warley redeeming himself on a 43-yarder to start the scoring. Adam Vinatieri responded with a 48-yard field goal to tie

the game 3-3. A 35-yard Shayne Graham field goal put the Bengals ahead with just over four minutes left in the half, but Matt Cassel, in for Davey, drove the Patriots 82 yards downfield, capping the drive with a 20-yard touchdown strike to rookie receiver Jason Anderson.

Cassel and rookie running back Kory Chapman led the offense in the third quarter, as the Patriots scored six points via two Vinatieri field goals. The Patriots defense again shut down the Bengals, who earned only one first down in the quarter.

With mostly first and second year players on the field for both teams, the fourth quarter featured eight of the game's 14 total penalties. After a Patriots punt, the teams traded fumbles before second year quarterback Casey Bramlet hit receiver Chris Henry for a 3-yard touchdown. After Cassel drove the Patriots from their own 32 yard line, rookie fullback Kyle Eckel scored on a 4-yard run to seal the Patriots victory.

The Patriots defeated the Bengals 34-13 on Monday Night Football to improve to 4-0 on the season. New England gained a total of 173 rushing yards on 34 carries, while Tom Brady threw three touchdown passes – two to Randy Moss – to provide the offensive spark. Brady's passer rating exceeded 100.0 and Moss's receiving total exceeded 100 yards for the fourth consecutive week. Sammy Morris paced the rushing attack with 117 yards on 21 carries. On defense, the Patriots came up with two interceptions and held the Bengals to 57 rushing yards as the team allowed 14 or fewer points for the fourth straight week.

The Patriots got on the board first, taking a 3-0 lead on a 31-yard field goal by Stephen Gostkowski to cap off the game's opening drive. After swapping punts, the Patriots got the ball back and marched 65 yards on five plays to take a 10-0 lead on a 1-yard touchdown reception by linebacker Mike Vrabel, who lined up as a tight end on a goal-line play. A 49-yard run by Morris was the key play of the drive as the first quarter ended with New England up by 10. On the Patriots' first drive of the second quarter, the Bengals' Leon Hall intercepted a Brady pass to set up a quick-strike drive directed by Carson Palmer that ended in a 1-yard touchdown toss to T.J. Houshmandzadeh and cut the Patriots' lead to 10-7. But New England answered back, compiling an ensuing drive of 62 yards and 12 plays to take a 17-7 lead on an acrobatic 7-yard scoring grab by Moss. On the next possession, the Bengals drove into Patriots territory, but Asante Samuel intercepted a Palmer pass at the Patriots' 2-yard line to preserve the 17-7 lead going into halftime.

After a Cincinnati punt to open the second half, the Patriots extended their lead to 24-7 on a 7-yard scoring run by Morris. The teams then embarked on three successive field goal drives – two by Cincinnati and one by New England – to leave the score at 27-13 midway through the fourth quarter. But the Patriots then went 85 yards on nine plays to put the game away on a 14-yard touchdown from Brady to Moss that made the score 34-13.

The New England Patriots opened the 2009 preseason with a 27-25 victory over the Philadelphia Eagles at Lincoln Financial Field.

Quarterback Tom Brady looked sharp in his return from a season-ending knee injury that occurred in the first game of the 2008 season. Brady engineered touchdown drives of 77 and 75 yards that culminated in touchdown passes to help New England to a 21-6 halftime lead. Brady, who finished 10-of-15 for 100 yards with two touchdown passes to TE Chris Baker, exited the game with 46 seconds left in the first half when he was replaced by QB Andrew Walter.

New England's first scoring drive was aided by a 46-yard pass interference penalty when Brady attempted a long pass to WR Randy Moss. Five plays later, Brady connected with Baker on a four-yard touchdown pass for a 7-0 lead.

After Philadelphia got on the scoreboard with a David Akers field goal, rookie WR Julian Edelman returned a second quarter punt 75 yards for a touchdown. Edelman, a seventh-round draft pick in 2009, saw significant action as the third receiver in place of Wes Welker, who did not suit up for the game. Edelman finished with five receptions for 37 yards.

Following a second Akers field goal in the second quarter, Brady completed a 35-yard pass to Moss to give the Patriots a first down at the Philadelphia 12-yard line. Three plays later, Brady and Baker hooked up for a second touchdown on a nine-yard completion to put the Patriots in front, 21-6. Later in the second quarter, rookie S Pat Chung helped preserve the 21-6 lead when he blocked a 44-yard field goal attempt with 50 seconds to play in the first half.

Walter opened the third quarter for New England and moved the team 61 yards to get in position for a 37-yard field goal by PK Stephen Gostowski to extend the Patriots lead to 24-6. Philadelphia scored 16 points in the third quarter to make it a 25-22 New England lead heading into the final quarter.

After both teams exchanged field goals in the fourth quarter, Philadelphia was in position to take the lead with a 43-yard field goal attempt with 57 seconds to play in regulation. Akers attempt sailed wide to the left and the Patriots ran out the final seconds to secure the victory.

OPENING

The Patriots opened the preseason on the road for the fourth time in the last five seasons. The Patriots' 27-25 victory over Philadelphia marked the first time the Patriots opened the preseason with a win since beating the Bengals at Cincinnati, 23-13, in 2005 (8-12-05).

BRADY IS BACK

QB Tom Brady started the game and played until the last set of downs in the first half. He finished the night 10-of-15 for 100 yards with two touchdowns, for a 97.2 quarterback rating. He engineered scoring drives of 77 yards and 75 yards that both ended with touchdown passes to TE Chris Baker. Brady threw a four-yard touchdown pass to TE Chris Baker in the first quarter, his first since completing a six-yard touchdown pass to WR Randy Moss in the fourth quarter of Super Bowl XLII. He also completed a nine-yard touchdown pass to Baker in the second quarter.

TWO TOUCHDOWNS FOR BAKER

TE Chris Baker had a two-touchdown performance in his Patriots debut. He has never had a two-touchdown game in the regular season. He caught a four-yard TD pass in the first quarter and a nine-yard TD pass in the second quarter. Baker started at tight end in place of TE Benjamin Watson, who did not dress for the game. Baker finished with three receptions for 22 yards.

EDELMAN GOES 75 YARDS

Seventh-round draft pick WR Julian Edelman returned a punt 75 yards for a touchdown in the second quarter. The Patriots have not had a punt returned for a touchdown in the regular season since Troy Brown returned a punt 68 yards for a touchdown at Carolina (1-6-02) during the last game of the 2001 season. Edelman finished the game with five receptions for 37 yards, one punt return for a 75-yard touchdown and one kickoff return for 24 yards. Edelman was a college quarterback at Kent State.

PAT CHUNG IS SPECIAL

Second-round pick S Pat Chung blocked a 44-yard field goal attempt by PK David Akers in the second quarter. Chung was a two-time special teams player of the year during his collegiate career at Oregon.

QUICK HITS

- Ray Ventrone saw action at wide receiver after working as a safety for part of his NFL career. In the 2008 preseason he also worked at wide receiver and had nine receptions.
- 10 of the Patriots 12 2009 draft picks saw action against Philadelphia. Sixth-round draft pick DL Myron Pryor was in the starting lineup.
- CB Shawn Springs, LB Paris Lenon, LS Nathan Hodel, LB Tedy Bruschi, T Mark LeVoi, OL George Bussey, TE Benjamin Watson, WR Wes Welker, DL Ty Warren and DL Mike Wright did not dress for the game.
- QB Andrew Walter relieved Brady and started the second half and played until five minutes left in the fourth quarter. Walter finished 5-of-9 for 62 yards. QB Kevin O'Connell finished the game and completed his only pass attempt for a six-yard gain.
- LB Jerod Mayo led the team with five total tackles.

PATRIOTS-EAGLES GAME IS A RATINGS TOUCHDOWN

Tom Brady's return to the field was a ratings touchdown for Kraft Sports Productions and WBZ-TV in the first year of their partnership broadcasting Patriots preseason games.

The Patriots' preseason game versus the Philadelphia Eagles on Thursday night earned a 14.6 rating and a 27 share. The game was the top program in total households and total viewers in every demographic among all broadcast and cable networks last Thursday. The broadcast averaged 524,300 total viewers, ranking second in total viewers for a preseason game since the introduction of Local People Meter ratings in 2002. The game peaked at 8:45 p.m. with 643,290 total viewers. Patriots-Eagles ranked among the top five television events of the summer (June 1 to Aug. 13, 2009) for adults and men 18-49 and 25-54 in the Boston market.

ROBERT KRAFT NEWS & NOTES

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. In 15 seasons of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what many observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.311 pct.) and recording the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won eight division titles, five conference crowns and three Super Bowl championships. The Patriots have made five Super Bowl appearances since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other NFL franchise has earned more than three berths.

SELLOUT STREAK

In the early 1990s, the Patriots seemed destined for relocation until Robert Kraft's purchase of the team rejuvenated local interest. In 1991, the season ticket base was just 17,635, barely enough to support the club. Now, the season-ticket base stands at a capped total of 61,759 and more than 50,000 fans are on a waiting list. The Patriots have sold out 159 consecutive home games (dating back to the 1994 regular-season opener).

Bill Belichick is the only head coach in NFL history to win three Super Bowl titles in a four-year span. **Over a 100-game span from 2003-08, Belichick directed the team to an 82-18 record, marking the best 100-game span for any team in NFL history.** In the 2007 season, Belichick led the Patriots to the fourth undefeated and untied regular season in the NFL's 88-year history and the first since the NFL established a 16-game schedule in 1978. He has led the Patriots to the Super Bowl four times in the last eight seasons and has produced six division championships in the last eight seasons, including five straight from 2003-07. Belichick's Patriots teams own the all-time NFL records for consecutive total victories (21 from 2003-04), consecutive regular-season victories (21 from 2006-08) and consecutive playoff victories (10 from 2001-05). Belichick owns the second best postseason record in NFL history (15-4) and is the winningest NFL head coach since 2001 (111-34). From 2003-04, he directed the Patriots to back-to-back Super Bowl titles while posting consecutive 17-win campaigns. Belichick has spent more seasons in the league than any other current NFL head coach, and in that time has been a part of five Super Bowl championship teams. His overall record of 116-45 with the Patriots gives him the most victories and the best winning percentage of any head coach in franchise history.

ELITE COMPANY

Bill Belichick is one of nine NFL head coaches to win three or more championships since the league began postseason play in 1933. With the Patriots' victory in Super Bowl XXXIX, Belichick joined an exclusive club in which each of the eight other members has been enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

BELICHICK WINS 100th REGULAR-SEASON GAME WITH PATRIOTS

The Patriots' victory over Oakland on Dec. 14, 2008 was Bill Belichick's 100th regular-season victory as Patriots head coach. His 100th victory came in his 142nd regular-season game as head coach, and only three NFL coaches have won their 100th game with a team in fewer tries – Oakland's John Madden (136 games), Miami's Don Shula (137) and Cleveland's Paul Brown (138).

AMONG THE GREATS

Coach Belichick has recorded 153 career wins and is one of 17 coaches in NFL history to win 150 or more games. Belichick owns a career winning percentage of .630, placing third in NFL history among all NFL coaches with at least 150 career victories. Brady needs 3,554 yards to reach the 30,000-yard milestone. Four players may hit the 30,000-yard mark in 2009: Brady, Donovan McNabb (Philadelphia, 29,320), Kurt Warner (Arizona, 28,591) and Drew Brees (New Orleans, 26,258). If all of those players reach the milestone then the NFL List will expand to 33 players in NFL History.

200 TOUCHDOWNS

With three more touchdown passes Brady will become the 27th NFL player to throw 200 touchdown passes. He needs 15 to tie Terry Bradshaw and Y.A. Tittle for 21st place, 17 to tie John Brodie for 20th place and 35 to tie Steve Young for 19th place in NFL history.

Brady has 23 regular-season 300-yard passing games. Drew Bledsoe has a team-record 26 300-yard regular-season passing games.

BRADY'S COMEBACKS

Tom Brady has engineered 28 career game-winning performances to lead his team to a victory from a fourth-quarter deficit or tie. He has accomplished the feat 22 times in the regular season and six times in the playoffs.

MOSS: ALL-TIME LEADER IN RECEPTIONS PER TD

Over his 11-year NFL career, Randy Moss has averaged one touchdown for every 6.24 receptions, a total that is the best in NFL history among any receiver with at least 500 receptions. Moss has caught 135 touchdowns out of 843 career receptions. Lance Alworth, who played 11 seasons for San Diego and Dallas from 1962-72, caught 85 touchdowns out of 542 career receptions for an average of one score every 6.38 receptions.

MOSS IS NFL'S PREMIER TD RECEIVER

Since entering the NFL in 1998, Randy Moss has caught 135 touchdown passes, more than any other NFL player over that span. Since joining the Patriots via trade prior to the 2007 season, Moss has caught 34 touchdowns – also the best in the league over that span. In terms of overall touchdowns (rushing, receiving and returning), Moss has totaled 136 scores since entering the league in 1998 (135 via reception and one via punt return), a tally that ranks second only to LaDainian Tomlinson (141 touchdowns) over that span. Last season, Moss's 11 touchdown receptions led the AFC and tied for third in the NFL.

WELKER LEADS NFL IN RECEPTIONS SINCE 2007

Wes Welker leads the NFL with 221 receptions over the last two seasons. In 2007, he set a Patriots franchise record with 112 receptions, tying him for the NFL lead and setting a league record for most receptions in a player's first season with a new team. In 2008, he nearly replicated that feat, with his 111 receptions placing second in the NFL. Welker joined the Patriots in a trade with the Miami Dolphins prior to the 2007 season, and since then is the NFL's leading receiver.

WELKER NAMED TO PRO BOWL SQUAD

Wes Welker was named to his first career Pro Bowl after the 2008 season and is the fifth Patriots wide receiver to earn Pro Bowl honors since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, joining Randy Moss (2007), Troy Brown (2001), Terry Glenn (1999) and Stanley Morgan (1979-80 and 1986-87). Welker finished second in the NFL with 111 receptions in 2008 – the second highest single-season total in team history behind his franchise-record 112 receptions in 2007. Welker became the eighth player in NFL history to record back-to-back 100-catch seasons and is the first player to achieve the feat with the Patriots.



WELKER RECORDS 12 CATCHES

Wes Welker had 12 receptions for 134 yards at Seattle on Dec. 7, 2008 recording the second-highest reception and yardage totals of his career. In addition to his 12 receptions, Welker also caught a 2-point conversion pass to give the Patriots a 24-21 fourth-quarter lead. Welker's 12 receptions trail only his career-high 13-catch performance against Philadelphia on Nov. 25, 2007. His 12 receptions tie the fifth-highest single-game total in team history, behind Troy Brown's team-record 16 catches on Sept. 22, 2002 and three 13-catch performances (Welker, 11/25/07; Deion Branch, 9/29/02; Terry Glenn, 10/3/99).

WELKER PILES UP YARDS

Wes Welker led the Patriots with 1,165 receiving yards in 2008 and joined Randy Moss in recording the first back-to-back 1,000-yard receiving seasons in Patriots history. Moss also had 1,000 receiving yards in 2007 and 2008. Welker's 1,165 yards in 2008 rank sixth on the Patriots' all-time single-season list. Wes Welker has exceeded the 100-reception mark for two straight seasons, totaling 112 catches in 2007 and recording 111 receptions in 2008. 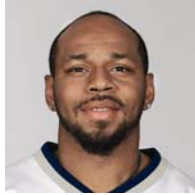

MEMBER OF 2000/2000 CLUB FOR THE 2000s

Kevin Faulk is one of just 11 NFL players this decade to total at least 2,000 rushing yards and at least 2,000 receiving yards, and is one of only six players to have at least 2,000 rushing yards and at least 3,000 receiving yards. Faulk has totaled 2,943 rushing yards and 3,206 receiving yards since 2000, joining an exclusive list of elite players who have achieved the feat. Faulk is one of just six players who reached the milestone with just one team. In the 1990s, there were 13 players who achieved the 2000/2000 milestone; 22 players did it in the 1980s; nine players achieved the feat in the 1970s.
