The New England Patriots head into the bye week with a 5-2 record following a 35-7 win over Tampa Bay last Sunday in the Patriots' first appearance in the NFL's International Series of regular-season games at Wembley Stadium in London.

New England is off to a 5-2 start in 2009 and has now started the season with at least five wins in their first seven games for the fourth straight season.

Head Coach Bill Belichick will conduct practice sessions on Wednesday and Thursday before giving the team the weekend off. The team will return to work next week to begin preparing for a home game against the Miami Dolphins on November 8 at Gillette Stadium.

**PRO BOWL BALLOTING BEGINS**

**NFL Pro Bowl balloting begins this week** and runs from Oct. 26 through Dec. 22. Fans may vote for their favorite NFL players to represent the AFC and NFC in the 2010 Pro Bowl on Sunday, Jan. 31 at the site of the Super Bowl in South Florida. Fans may vote online at [nfl.com/probowl](http://nfl.com/probowl) or on Web-enabled mobile phones by going to NFL.com. The AFC and NFC All-Star squads are determined by the consensus votes of fans, players and coaches. Each group's vote counts one-third towards determining each conference's 43-man roster. NFL players and coaches will cast their votes on Dec. 22-23. The Pro Bowl teams will be announced at 4:00 p.m. EST on Tuesday, Dec. 29 in a Pro Bowl Selection Show on NFL Network.



**STRONG IN THE SECOND HALF**

The Patriots have traditionally stepped things up a notch as the calendar has flipped to November. Since 2001, New England has done a remarkable job of finishing the season strong, compiling a 70-17 (.821) record after Nov. 1, including playoff games. Additionally, since 2001, the Patriots are 52-10 (.839) in games played after Thanksgiving Day and are 23-4 (.852) in games played after Christmas.

# LAST WEEK: PATRIOTS-BUCCANEERS

## Patriots 35, Buccaneers 7

The New England Patriots may have played on foreign soil in their first appearance in the NFL's International Series of games, but in front of over 84,000 fans at London's historic Wembley Stadium, the Patriots put on a show. QB Tom Brady threw for over 300 yards and three touchdown passes in a 35-7 win over the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

The Buccaneers gave up a home game to host the Patriots in London, and fell out of favor quickly as the Patriots built a 21-0 lead with New England winning in blowout fashion for the second straight week. New England outgained Tampa Bay 414 total yards to 240 total yards and held the Buccaneers to just 78 total yards in the second half.

Brady had touchdown passes to WR Wes Welker (14 yards), WR Sam Aiken (54 yards) and TE Benjamin Watson (35 yards) to counter two interceptions in the second quarter, his first intercepted pass since Week 2. He finished 23 of 32 for 308 yards before being replaced by backup QB Brian Hoyer late in the game.

Safety Brandon Meriweather set the tone for New England when he intercepted a Tampa Bay pass and returned it 39 yards for a touchdown to end Tampa Bay's first drive. Tampa Bay drove to the New England 33-yard line on the next series before Meriweather struck again with his second interception.

The Patriots increased their lead to 14-0 when Welker caught a screen pass from Brady and weaved in and out of traffic for a 14-yard touchdown. Welker finished the game with 10 receptions for 107 yards and the one touchdown.

New England was primed to score again on their next drive, but Brady was intercepted in the end zone on a pass attempt to WR Randy Moss. The miscue was not enough to dampen the day. Brady responded on the next series with a pass to WR Sam Aiken, who broke two tackles on his way to a 54-yard touchdown and a 21-0 lead.

Tampa Bay finally got on the scoreboard with 1:21 left in the first half but was held scoreless in the second half. New England extended their lead to 28-7 on their first drive of the third quarter when Brady completed a 10-play, 73-yard drive with a 35-yard scoring pass to Watson. RB Laurence Maroney added a one-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter to complete the scoring for the Patriots.

New England earned their first road win of the 2009 season and increased their streak to 17 straight over NFC opponents.

### MERIWEATHER SCORES ON AN INT. RETURN

Brandon Meriweather scored his first NFL touchdown on a 39-yard interception return in the first series of the game. It is the first interception returned for a touchdown for New England since Eugene Wilson scored on a five-yard interception return vs. N.Y. Jets on Dec. 16, 2007.

### MERIWEATHER REGISTERS 2 INTERCEPTIONS

Meriweather had two interceptions for 70 yards, including a 39-yard touchdown return, in the first six minutes of the game. He is the first Patriot to have two interceptions in a game since Asante Samuel had two vs. Philadelphia on Nov. 25, 2007.

### FAULK BECOMES 26<sup>TH</sup> RB IN NFL HISTORY WITH 400 RECEPTIONS

Kevin Faulk entered the game needing two receptions for 400. He added two receptions against Tampa Bay and is now the 26<sup>th</sup> running back in NFL history with at least 400 career receptions.

### BRADY GOES OVER 300 YARDS FOR SECOND STRAIGHT WEEK

Tom Brady finished the game 23-of-32 for 308 yards to register his 26<sup>th</sup> NFL 300-yard game, tying Drew Bledsoe (26) for the most 300-yard games in franchise history. It is Brady's third 300-yard game of the 2009 season after finishing with 378 yards passing vs. Buffalo and 380 yards passing vs. Tennessee.

### BRADY SETS RECORD FOR LONGEST STRETCH BETWEEN INTERCEPTIONS

Tom Brady went 183 throws between interceptions, setting a New England record. Drew Bledsoe went 179 consecutive throws without an interception (10/23/95 – 11/26/95). Brady was intercepted in the first quarter against the Jets (9/20) and was not intercepted again until the second quarter against Tampa Bay.

### BRADY THROWS THREE TOUCHDOWN PASSES

Brady threw for three touchdowns against Tampa Bay. He has thrown for two or more touchdowns in a game 66 times. He has thrown for three touchdowns 22 times and New England has a 58-8 record in those games. Brady has thrown for two or more touchdowns in a game four times so far in 2009 with two vs. Buffalo, two at Denver, six vs. Tennessee and the three against Tampa Bay. He has thrown three touchdowns in a game 22 times. The Patriots are 20-2 when he has three touchdowns in a game.

### BRADY AND THE PATRIOTS ARE HOT IN OCTOBER

The Patriots improved to 25-5 since 2003 in the month of October. Since 2006, Brady has a 12-1 (.923) record in October.

### PATRIOTS IMPROVE TO 17 STRAIGHT OVER NFC OPPONENTS

The Patriots improved to 17 straight victories over NFC opponents. The Patriots are now 2-0 in 2009 against NFC opponents with a 26-10 win over Atlanta and the 35-7 win over Tampa Bay. Dating back to October 9, 2005, Brady is 13-0 against NFC opponents.

### 80 UNANSWERED POINTS

The Patriots scored 80 unanswered points, including the 59-0 win over Tennessee and accumulating a 21-0 lead in the second quarter against Tampa Bay. That stretch of scoring is the most in a single season since Buffalo had 86 in 1992. The 80 is the most in Patriots' history.

### AIKEN SCORES FIRST CAREER TOUCHDOWN

Sam Aiken scored when he caught a short pass from Tom Brady and raced 54 yards down the sidelines for his first NFL touchdown to give New England a 21-0 second quarter lead. The 54-yard play is the longest play of the season for New England, besting a 48-yard pass play from Brady to Wes Welker vs. Tennessee (10/18). It was Brady's longest touchdown pass since a 65-yard touchdown pass to WR Randy Moss in the 2007 regular-season-finale at the New York Giants on Dec. 29, 2007.

### MOSS MOVES UP ALL-TIME RECEPTIONS LIST

Randy Moss entered the game ranked 12<sup>th</sup> in NFL history with 881 receptions. He added five receptions to move past Keenan McCardell (883) into 11<sup>th</sup> place on the all-time list with 886 career receptions.

### WELKER KEEPS IT UP

Wes Welker finished with 10 receptions and has now caught six or more passes in 19 of the last 21 regular-season games. Welker has seven career regular-season games with 10 or more receptions. He has three games with 10 or more in 2009, with 12 vs. Buffalo and 10 vs. Tennessee. It is the first time in his career that he has had back-to-back games with 10 or more receptions.

## THE BELICHICK ERA

Bill Belichick is one of just four head coaches to win three championships since the Super Bowl era began following the 1966 season. Coach Belichick joins three members of the Pro Football Hall of Fame in the exclusive club (Chuck Knoll 4, Joe Gibbs 3, and Bill Walsh 3). Belichick is the only coach to win three Super Bowls in the post-1993 salary cap era.

**8**

The number of consecutive home-opening wins in Belichick's nine Patriots seasons.

**102-33**

The Patriots' regular-season record since 2001 under Head Coach Bill Belichick. Under Belichick, the Patriots have won 75.4 percent of their regular-season games, recording the highest winning percentage of any major American professional sports team over that span.

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. In 15 seasons of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what many observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.311 pct.) and recording the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won eight division titles, five conference crowns and three Super Bowl championships. The Patriots have made five Super Bowl appearances since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other NFL franchise has earned more than three berths.

## SELLOUT STREAK

In the early 1990s, the Patriots seemed destined for relocation until Robert Kraft's purchase of the team rejuvenated local interest. In 1991, the season ticket base was just 17,635, barely enough to support the club. Now, the season-ticket base stands at a capped total of 61,759 and more than 50,000 fans are on a waiting list. The Patriots have sold out 165 consecutive home games (dating back to the 1994 regular-season opener).

## SUCCESS STORY

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have been one of the NFL's elite franchises. Over the first 15-plus years of Kraft's ownership, the Patriots own the NFL's highest winning percentage and have won more Super Bowl titles, more conference championships and more playoff games than any other NFL team.

Bill Belichick is the only head coach in NFL history to win three Super Bowl titles in a four-year span. Belichick spent 20 years as an assistant coach in the NFL and this is his 15<sup>th</sup> season as a head coach. According to the Elias Sports Bureau he is the only man in NFL history to serve 20 or more seasons as an assistant coach and at least 15 seasons as a head coach. Over a 100-game span from 2003-08, Belichick directed the team to an 82-18 record, marking the best 100-game span for any team in NFL history. In the 2007 season, Belichick led the Patriots to the fourth undefeated and untied regular season in the NFL's 88-year history and the first since the NFL established a 16-game schedule in 1978. He has led the Patriots to the Super Bowl four times in the last eight seasons and has produced six division championships in the last eight seasons, including five straight from 2003-07. Belichick's Patriots teams own the all-time NFL records for consecutive total victories (21 from 2003-04), consecutive regular-season victories (21 from 2006-08) and consecutive playoff victories (10 from 2001-05). Belichick owns the second best postseason record in NFL history (15-4) and is the winningest NFL head coach since 2001 (116-36). From 2003-04, he directed the Patriots to back-to-back Super Bowl titles while posting consecutive 17-win campaigns. Belichick has spent more seasons in the league than any other current NFL head coach, and in that time has been a part of five Super Bowl championship teams. His overall record of 121-47 with the Patriots gives him the most victories and the best winning percentage of any head coach in franchise history.

## ELITE COMPANY

Bill Belichick is one of nine NFL head coaches to win three or more championships since the league began postseason play in 1933. With the Patriots' victory in Super Bowl XXXIX, Belichick joined an exclusive club in which each of the eight other members has been enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

## BELICHICK WINS 100<sup>th</sup> REGULAR-SEASON GAME WITH PATRIOTS

The Patriots' victory over Oakland on Dec. 14, 2008 was Bill Belichick's 100th regular-season victory as Patriots head coach. His 100th victory came in his 142nd regular-season game as head coach, and only three NFL coaches have won their 100th game with a team in fewer tries – Oakland's John Madden (136 games), Miami's Don Shula (137) and Cleveland's Paul Brown (138).

## MOSS IS NFL'S PREMIER TD RECEIVER

Since entering the NFL in 1998, Randy Moss has caught 139 touchdown passes, more than any other player over that span. Since joining the Patriots via trade prior to the 2007 season, Moss has caught 38 touchdowns – also the best in the league over that span. In terms of overall touchdowns (rushing, receiving and returning), Moss has totaled 140 scores since entering the league in 1998 (139 via reception and one via punt return), a tally that ranks second only to LaDainian Tomlinson (142 touchdowns) over that span. Last season, Moss's 11 touchdown receptions led the AFC and tied for third in the NFL.

In 2007, he set a Patriots franchise record with 112 receptions, tying him for the NFL lead and setting a league record for most receptions in a player's first season with a new team. In 2008, he nearly replicated that feat, with his 111 receptions placing second in the NFL.



Welker joined the Patriots in a trade with the Miami Dolphins prior to the 2007 season, and since then is the NFL's leading receiver.

## WELKER PILES UP YARDS

Wes Welker led the Patriots with 1,165 receiving yards in 2008 and joined Randy Moss in recording the first back-to-back 1,000-yard receiving seasons in Patriots history. ## WELKER'S ROUTE TO THE NFL

Despite being named the Oklahoma football player of the year by both the *USA Today* and the *Daily Oklahoman*, Wes Welker's only scholarship offer came from Texas Tech, and only after a player that committed to Texas Tech backed out.

"I was thinking I'd get a scholarship somewhere," Welker said. "When it didn't happen when it was supposed to I was pretty hurt by it."

Welker had an impressive collegiate career, accumulating 259 receptions and eight punts returned for touchdowns. He even won a national award as the best special teams player in the country. Despite those accolades, he was passed over in the 2004 NFL draft and signed with San Diego as a free agent. He made the team, then was cut after the first game.

He signed with Miami soon after and was used just on special teams. He caught New England's eye with a 71-yard punt return on Monday Night Football in a game against the Patriots. He was acquired by the Patriots in a trade with Miami in 2007.

## WELKER SETS CAREER HIGH

Wes Welker registered his ninth NFL 100-yard game and set a career-high with 150 yards receiving in the Patriots 59-0 win over Tennessee (10/18). His previous best was a 149 yards vs. Philadelphia (11/25/07).

## MEMBER OF 2000/2000 CLUB FOR THE 2000s

Kevin Faulk is one of just 13 NFL players this decade to total at least 2,000 rushing yards and at least 2,000 receiving yards, and is one of only six players to have at least 2,000 rushing yards and at least 3,000 receiving yards. Faulk has totaled 3,037 rushing yards and 3,363 receiving yards since 2000, joining an exclusive list of elite players who have achieved the feat. Faulk is one of just seven players who reached the milestone with just one team. In the 1990s, there were 13 players who achieved the 2000/2000 milestone; 22 players did it in the 1980s; nine players achieved the feat in the 1970s.

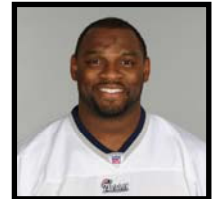

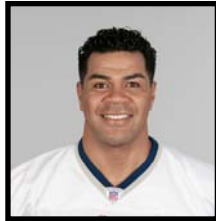

## A JUNIOR ACHIEVMENT: SEAU IS ON A WINNING STREAK

LB Junior Seau has won 24 consecutive regular-season games in which he appeared with New England, tying DT Mauty Moore of the Miami Dolphins (1972-73) for the longest personal winning streak since the merger. Seau's record stretches from two wins in November of 2006 (he finished the 2006 season on IR), 16 regular-season wins in 2007, the final four games of 2008 and the wins over Tennessee and Tampa Bay in 2009. Seau had been tied at 23 with former Patriots RB Patrick Pass, who won 23 straight (2003-4).

## MATT LIGHT AND HIS FOUNDATION

The Light Foundation, a nonprofit founded in 2001 by Matt Light, held its signature fundraising event on Tuesday, September 29 at Addieville East Farm in Mapleville, RI.

The Matt Light Celebrity Shoot-Out, now in its 5<sup>th</sup> year, offers participants the opportunity to match their shooting skills against Light, his teammates, and a host of local and national celebrities. Proceeds from the one-of-a-kind event benefit the Light Foundation, a youth-based organization that strives to install honesty, accountability and responsibility in young people through unique outdoor learning experiences that include a character development football camp, a financial literacy program offered at area schools and academic scholarships. In the eight years since the organization was founded, it has raised over \$1.2 million to support these programs.

Light says he wanted to develop a unique high-profile charity event that would raise funds and exposure for his foundation, and his love of the outdoors naturally came into play.



## PATRIOTS WIN GAME NUMBER 400

The Patriots recorded the franchise's 400<sup>th</sup> all-time victory, including postseason games, with the 26-10 win over Atlanta (9/27). The 400 victories rank third among the eight original AFL teams, behind Denver and Oakland. The eight original AFL teams, including the Patriots, began play in 1960. The Patriots recorded their milestone 400<sup>th</sup> victory in their 50<sup>th</sup> season and in their 777<sup>th</sup> overall game. Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have 177 victories, more than any other NFL team during that span.

## MOSS ON PACE FOR 1,000 YARDS

Randy Moss has recorded a 1,000-yard receiving season nine times in his 11-year career. Moss can join Jerry Rice (14) as the only players in NFL history with 10 seasons with 1,000 receiving yards with a 1,000 yard season in 2009. Moss currently has 565 receiving yards, which puts him on pace for 1,291 receiving yards.

## BRADY ON PACE FOR 4,644 PASSING YARDS

Tom Brady currently has 2,032 passing yards through seven games, putting him on pace for 4,644 passing yards. That mark would tie Drew Bledsoe for seven seasons of 3,000 or more yards and give Brady his third season with over 4,000 passing yards. Bledsoe and Brady are tied with two 4,000 yard seasons.

## BRADY ON PACE FOR 34 TDS

Brady is has 15 touchdown passes through the first seven games, putting him on pace for 34 touchdown passes. It would mark his third season of 30 or more touchdowns. He set a franchise record with 50 touchdown passes in 2007. Brady has thrown for 25 or more touchdowns in a single season four times.

## BRADY WAS THERE FOR "THE CATCH"

In the 2003 AFC Divisional Playoff Game against Tennessee on January 10, 2004, QB Tom Brady threw for 201 yards and one touchdown, leading the Patriots to a narrow 17-14 victory en route to their second Super Bowl. That wasn't the first time Brady has seen a major playoff game come down to the wire on a game played on January 10. A native of the Bay area, Brady was at Candlestick Park for the 1981 NFC Championship game between the 49ers and Cowboys, as a four-year-old fan, witnessing Dwight Clark's "The Catch" from Joe Montana. According to Gary Myers' book *The Catch*, Brady wept after the play. Said Brady, "Not because I was happy or excited, but because everybody stood up and I couldn't see!" While Brady has been recognized for his stellar credentials, he said Montana, "was and will always be the greatest quarterback ever to play."

## LIKE FATHER LIKE SON

WR Matthew Slater spent his college days in Los Angeles on the offensive side of the ball at UCLA. The second-year promising young talent was born in 1985, when another Slater in The City of Angels was named to his second of seven Pro Bowls. Matthew's father, Jackie Slater, a Hall of Fame offensive tackle, spent his entire career with the Rams organization in LA. He was voted the NFC Offensive Lineman of the year four times—1983, 1986, 1987, and 1989. Matthew Slater, drafted in 2008, is one of six sons of Hall of Fame members to be drafted in NFL history.

## LIKE FATHER LIKE SON, PART 2

CB Shawn Springs has always been a speedster. No doubt, the gift of fast feet was a hereditary gift from his father, Ron Springs, an 8-year NFL running back for the Dallas Cowboys and Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Ron, who tallied over 2500 rushing and 2200 receiving yards in his career, became ill in 1990 with type 2 Diabetes. By 2004, Shawn was a respected NFL veteran, but he was willing to give up his career and offered to donate his kidney to his father, who needed a transplant. Ron declined, saying in a 2005 *Washington Post* article, "I think that was a tremendous gesture, and it just justifies the fact that he's a loving son. But I couldn't have let him do that, because I always prayed and wanted him to be a professional athlete, so I would not have shortened his career by no means necessary."

## GUYTON HAS THE WORK ETHIC

Gary Guyton was not drafted into the NFL, but through a solid work ethic was able to make the 53-man roster and earn a starting job in his second year. Taking a peak into his work history shows his work ethic goes beyond the football field. At the end of the season last year, Guyton went back to Georgia Tech and worked as an office assistant at the school's research institute.



"I was an office assistant, right there at the desk," said Guyton, who worked for a small wage at Georgia Tech Research Institute. "Just a regular office assistant. Tech is my school, and I enjoyed it."

"He's smart, well prepared," Bill Belichick said. "He understands. He's got a real good understanding of football. Not just his role but where other people have to be. That's what you really want in a defensive signal-caller, someone that understands how it all works."

"It's been a long road," Guyton said. "I have come far. I've achieved some things. But I don't look back, just forward."



# Patriots News & Notes

## SANDERS EARNED HIS REPUTATION AS A HARD WORKER

James Sanders has earned the reputation as one of the Patriots' hardest workers. Said Bill Belichick on Sanders, "I think he's very professional. You would like to have 53 players like James on your team in terms of his work ethic, his toughness, and being a teammate. He's a high-character player."

## BRANDON MCGOWAN IS A WELCOMED ADDITION

Brandon McGowan puts literally everything he has into making big tackles. Said McGowan, "I don't really care about my body and I'll expose my body to some messed-up positions to make a play." And exposed he has; McGowan has fought his way back from three season-ending injuries in four years in Chicago. The University of Maine standout, who is one of three active players (Stephen Cooper, SD; Lofa Tatupu, SEA) to come out of the Football Championship Subdivision school, signed with the Patriots in May and forced a game-changing fumble off of Falcons' running back Michael Turner on September 27<sup>th</sup>. He also recovered a fumble at Denver that helped position the Patriots for a field goal.

## FREE AGENTS MAKE AN IMPACT

Fifteen players on the New England 53-man roster entered the NFL as rookie free agents. Two that came to the Patriots as rookie free agents are making an impact on the defense. Mike Wright came to New England as a rookie free agent in 2005. He registered his first career two-sack game, dropping Joe Flacco twice for total losses of 17 yards vs. Baltimore (10-4). He currently has a single-season career high with 4.0 sacks. Gary Guyton came to New England as a rookie free agent in 2007. He is second on the team with the team with 40 total tackles and is on pace to finish the season with 91 tackles.

Said Bill Belichick about players coming to the Patriots as a free agents, "I think Mike's similar to some of the other players that would fall into that category. Players like Gary Guyton and guys like that who weren't high picks that came in at a pretty early point — Pierre Woods, [Brian] Hoyer — came in and showed that they belonged, both physically and athletically from a football standpoint, recognizing things, reacting, kind of knowing what to do."

## TOUGH AT HOME

The Patriots own an overall record of 55-12 (.821) at Gillette Stadium. Since their state-of-the-art facility opened at the beginning of the 2002 season, the Patriots own the NFL's best record at home. Now in their seventh season at Gillette Stadium, the Patriots have finished three seasons undefeated at home since the stadium opened (2003, 2004 and 2007) and own a perfect 7-0 playoff record at the venue.

## STEPHEN NEAL TAKES A DIFFERENT ROUTE TO THE NFL

Guard Stephen Neal knows how to use his 6'4", 305-pound frame. He has used it to gain leverage and overpower defensive linemen since 2001. The three-time Super Bowl Champion arrived in Foxborough with two NCAA titles of his own, except the only padding he saw was on the matted floors.

A championship wrestler at Cal-State Bakersfield, he compiled a 151-10 record, winning titles his junior and senior year, including a title win over NCAA wrestling and UFC heavyweight champion Brock Lesnar. In 1999, Neal won the Dan Hodge Award, known as the Heisman Trophy of wrestling.

Neal is one of only two active NFL players that did not play football in college before turning pro. The other is San Diego Chargers tight end Antonio Gates, a basketball star at Kent State. Gates led the Golden Flashes to the Elite Eight in 2002, averaging 21 points in his senior season.

## PATRIOTS SET TEAM RECORD WITH 619 YARDS

The Patriots set a franchise record with 619 total net yards against Tennessee (10-18). The 619-yard performance was the fifth highest single-game total by an NFL team since the 1970 merger and was the ninth 600-yard game by an NFL team since 1970. The Patriots are the 6th team since 1990 to register 600 or more yards of total offense.

## AFL LEGACY GAMES

This season marks the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary for the American Football League (AFL), of which the Patriots were an original member. The Boston Patriots, who hosted the AFL's first regular season game on Sept. 9, 1960 at Boston University Field, were featured in the NFL's first "AFL Legacy Game" on the opening weekend of the 2009 season on Sept. 14, 2009, when the Patriots hosted the Buffalo Bills at Gillette Stadium on Monday Night Football. It was the first of four "AFL Legacy Games" in which the Patriots will appear this season (at Den, vs. Ten and at Mia). The Patriots will wear red and white "throwback" uniforms in those games, replicating the uniforms worn by the 1963 team that claimed the franchise's first division title and competed in the franchise's first league championship game. Patriots coaches will also wear apparel featuring the Pat Patriot logo.

## GAMEDAY PROGRAM DESIGN

The original "Pat Patriot" was born in 1960 when newspaper cartoonist Phil Bissell was assigned to sketch a reaction upon the announcement that Boston's American Football League team would be called the Patriots. From his original "Pat" cartoon, Bissell became forever linked with the franchise that wore a copy based off of his original figure on its helmets from 1961 to 1992. Bissell, a resident of Rockport, Mass., also contributed stylized "Pat Patriot" cartoons to the covers of over 50 Patriots game programs throughout the team's AFL seasons from 1960-69. In recognition of the Patriots 50th anniversary, Bissell has been commissioned to create the covers of this season's *Patriots GameDay* magazines in the same style of those early covers.

The Hall at Patriot Place presented by Raytheon is a monument to 50 years of Patriots history. # ONE HISTORIC GAME: 10/18/2009

The New England Patriots set team records for points in a game (59) and total net yards (619) in a 59-0 victory against the Tennessee Titans in snowy conditions at Gillette Stadium. The Patriots 59-point victory ties the largest margin of victory by any team since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, equaling the L.A. Rams' 59-point win over Atlanta on Dec. 4, 1976 (59-0).

QB Tom Brady completed 29-of-34 pass attempts for 380 yards with six touchdown passes, wide receivers Wes Welker (10-150-2 TDs) and Randy Moss (8-129-3 TDs) both went over 100 yards receiving, and RB Laurence Maroney added 123 yards rushing on the ground.

Brady had 345 yards passing in the first half alone, and set an NFL record with five touchdown passes in the second quarter. For his contributions, Brady earned AFC Offensive Player of the Week honors for the second time on the young 2009 season. New England built a 45-0 halftime lead, the largest halftime lead in NFL history.

## What They Said:

### QB Tom Brady

(On the Patriots' historic output)

"You know, some days out there when it's snowy like that, it's actually an advantage for the offense. Today was one of those days because we had good footing and it's just fun to be a part of it. I was saying, when you see the weather forecast on Thursday, you're kind of [angry] and then once the day of the game comes around, everyone is excited because you're out there and you're like, 'This is football. This is how it should be.'"



### WR Wes Welker

(On why the Patriots seem to play so well in the snow)

"I know Coach [Belichick] does a really good job of coaching us up: what's good, what's bad, making sure we have good footing, the right cleats, things like that. And understanding that we need to be in the right type of plays and being able to come off breaks and things like that are going to be a little bit different under the conditions. We need to make sure that in the kicking game we're taking care of our responsibilities and things like that."

### Head Coach Bill Belichick

(On the Patriots' level of execution)

"[It's] good players. The players were the ones out there playing today and they did a good job. They kept their feet. They handled the ball well. They handled it cleanly. We missed some tackles on defense, but we made some. We made some plays defensively, turning the ball over. Some of those were tough catches, good plays, but we got them. The credit goes to the players; they did a great job."

The Patriots are the 6th team since 1990 to register 600 or more yards of total offense.
