NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (6-2) at INDIANAPOLIS COLTS (8-0)

The New England Patriots will travel to Indianapolis to face the Colts on Sunday Night Football for the second consecutive season. Last season, the Patriots fell to the Colts, 18-15. Both clubs are moving near the top regular-season victory total for any team in any NFL decade. New England and Indianapolis are tied with 109 regular-season wins in the 2000s, including the final game of the 1999 season that was played on Jan. 2, 2000, and are within striking distance of the all-time win mark for a decade held by San Francisco of the 1990s with 113 wins. Including playoff games, the 49ers had 125 wins during the '90s. New England has 123 wins and Indianapolis has 116 wins during this decade. It is also a matchup of the top two teams over the last seven seasons, with New England and Indianapolis both entering the game with records of 83-21 in regular-season games since 2003. The Colts and Patriots each won five consecutive division titles (2003-07), before finishing second in their respective divisions last year. Indianapolis and New England are two of nine organizations to win five or more consecutive divisional flags since the NFL Merger.

NATIONAL RADIO: This week's game will be broadcast to a national audience by **Westwood One. Dave Sims** and **James Lofton** will call the game. **Hub Arkush** will be the sideline reporter.

RADIO: 98.5 FM, The Sports Hub, is the flagship station for the **Patriots Radio Network**. A complete listing of the network's 36 stations can be found in this press release. Play-by-play broadcaster **Gil Santos** is in his 33rd season as the voice of the Patriots and will call the action along with Patriots Hall of Famer **Gino Cappelletti**. Santos and Cappelletti are celebrating their 26th season as a tandem.

STRONG IN THE SECOND HALF

The Patriots have traditionally stepped things up a notch as the calendar has flipped to November. Since 2001, New England has done a remarkable job of finishing the season strong, compiling a 71-17 (.807) record after Nov. 1, including playoff games. Additionally, since 2001, the Patriots are 52-10 (.839) in games played after Thanksgiving Day and are 23-4 (.852) in games played after Christmas.

<u>Patriots vs. Colts</u>

SERIES HISTORY

The Patriots and Colts will face off for the 10th time since 2003 and

for the 73rd time in the history of the franchises. The clubs have clashed in each of the last six regular seasons (2003-07) and also faced each other in the playoffs following the 2003, 2004 and 2006 seasons. The two teams share a long-time rivalry, as the Patriots and the Baltimore/Indianapolis Colts played twice each year from 1970 to



2001 as members of the AFC East, with the exception of the 1982 strike season. New England has had more success against the Colts than any other team in the AFC, with the Patriots' .611 winning percentage ranking as their highest against any AFC team they have played more than 10 times. New England is 18-9 against



10 times. New England is 18-9 against Indianapolis since 1993, and has won 14 of the series' last 20 games. The games have tended to be high-scoring affairs, as the Patriots have scored 20 or more points against the Colts in 18 of their last 20 meetings. New England holds an overall record of 14-8 in games played in Indianapolis. The Colts beat the Patriots, 18-15 last season on November 2, 2008 in their first meeting at Lucas Oli

PATRIOTS – COLTS QUICK HITS

- Since the beginning of the 2003 season, the Patriots and Colts are tied with the NFL's best record (83-21)
- In the last six seasons, the Patriots and Colts have met twice in the AFC Championship Game, with the Patriots claiming a 24-14 win in 2003 and the Colts winning 38-34 in 2006.
- Patriots Head Coach Bill Belichick is 8-5 against the Colts as the head coach of the Patriots and is 10-7 against Indianapolis as a head coach overall.
- This week's game will mark the fifth straight year that the Patriots and Colts will play during the first two weeks of November. The Patriots faced the Colts in the first week of November for the last four seasons.
- Despite not being in the same division, the Patriots and Colts will play each other for the seventh straight season.

PATRIOTS AND COLTS HAVE SUSTAINED SUCCESS Both clubs are moving near the top regular-season victory total for any team in any NFL decade. San Francisco won 113 regularseason games during the 1990s. The Indianapolis Colts (109) and New England Patriots (109) are both within striking distance of the all-time win mark for a decade held by the 49ers of the 1990s.

7 Indianapolis Colts 0 8 3 — 18 The Patriots dropped a tight game on the road to the Indianapolis Colts, falling 18-15 after a game-winning 52-yard field goal by Indianapolis in the fourth guarter that broke a 15-15 tie. The Patriots came from behind to tie or take the lead twice in the game. After falling behind 7-0, the Patriots rallied to take a 12-7 lead in the third quarter. The Colts then regained the lead (15-12) with a touchdown, before New England tied the game at 15 early in the final quarter. Despite the loss, the Patriots outgained the Colts 342-301 and outrushed Indianapolis 140-47. Matt Cassel completed 73.5 percent of his passes (25-for-34) and the Patriots rushing attack, led by Kevin Faulk and BenJarvus Green-Ellis, averaged 4.4 yards per carry (140 yards on 32 rushes).

CONNECTIONS

- Patriots head coach Bill Belichick began his NFL coaching career as a special assistant for the Baltimore Colts in 1975 under head coach Ted Marchibroda.
- Patriots assistant head coach/offensive line coach Dante Scarnecchia was the offensive line coach for the Colts from 1989-90. Outside of those two seasons, Scarnecchia has been on the Patriots sidelines for each year since 1982.
- Colts kicker Adam Vinatieri played for the Patriots for 10 seasons from 1996-2005 and is New England's all-time leading scorer with 1,158 points and also holds the team record with 263 successful field goals.
- Patriots tackle Matt Light earned four letters at Purdue University (1996, 1998-2000), earning All-Big Ten conference first-team honors in 2000.
- Colts defensive end Dwight Freeney was born in Hartford, Conn., and attended Bloomfield High School, where he was a SuperPrep, Prep Football Report, USA Today, New Haven Register, Hartford Courant and Blue Chip Illustrated All-American selection.
- Patriots DL Ty Warren and Colts DB Melvin Bullitt were both born in Bryan, Texas. Both players also attended Texas A&M.

- Colts Special Teams Coordinator Ray Rychleski served as Northeastern's defensive coordinator/inside linebackers coach from 1989-90.
- Colts Strength and Conditioning Coach Jon Torine attended and played football for Springfield (Mass.) College from 1991-95.
- Indianapolis Area Scout Bob Guarini worked as Western Connecticut State University's offensive coordinator/assistant athletic director from 1992-93.

THIS WEEK IN PATRIOTS HISTORY

November 10-16

Nov. 10, 1968 - Gino Cappelletti became the first player in AFL history to score more than 1,000 points in his career, reaching the milestone on a 19-yard touchdown catch.

Nov. 12, 1970 - John Mazur replaced Clive Rush as head coach. **Nov. 13, 1994** - Patriots quarterback Drew Bledsoe set NFL records with 70 attempts and 45 completions in a 26-20 overtime victory over the Minnesota Vikings at Foxboro Stadium. Bledsoe found fullback Kevin Turner for a 14-yard touchdown in overtime to complete a comeback from a 20-0 deficit.

Nov. 16, 2003 - The Patriots shut out the Dallas Cowboys, 12-0, at Gillette Stadium in a battle of 7-2 teams. New England, wearing its silver uniforms for the first time, defeated a Dallas team coached by former Patriots head coach Bill Parcells. The shutout was the first for the Patriots under Bill Belichick.

PRO BOWL BALLOTING BEGINS

NFL Pro Bowl balloting began last week and runs from Oct. 26 through Dec. 22. Fans may vote for their favorite NFL players to represent the AFC and NFC in the 2010 Pro Bowl on Sunday, Jan.

31 at the site of the Super Bowl in South Florida. Fans may vote online at nfl.com/probowl or on Web-enabled mobile phones by going to NFL.com. The AFC and NFC All-Star squads are determined by the consensus votes of fans, players and coaches. Each group's vote counts one-third towards



determining each conference's 43-man roster. NFL players and coaches will cast their votes on Dec. 22-23. The Pro Bowl teams will be announced at 4:00 p.m. EST on Tuesday, Dec. 29 in a Pro Bowl Selection Show on NFL Network.

The Patriots improved to a 6-2 record with a 27-17 victory over AFC East Divisional rival Miami. QB Tom Brady and WR Randy Moss connected on two big plays and the New England defense stopped the dangerous Wildcat offense to claim the win and extend the team's lead in the division.

Moss set up New England's first touchdown with a 36-yard reception at the one-yard line. Then in the third quarter, Moss caught a pass from Brady and broke one tackle en route to a 71-yard touchdown. Moss finished the day with six receptions for 147 yards. Brady had his third-straight 300-yard game after completing 25 of 37 pass attempts for 332 yards. It was also his team-record 27th career 300-yard game.

Miami took a 3-0 lead on a 52-yard field goal before Moss's 36-yard reception to the one-yard line on the next series set up a one-yard touchdown run by RB Laurence Maroney to give New England the lead.

New England made it 10-3 on the first of four field goals by K Stephen Gostkowski six minutes into the second quarter. On Miami's ensuing drive. it used its wildcat offense on five runs for 66 yards in a series that ended in a 15-yard touchdown run by RB Ricky Williams to tie the game at 10-10. The Patriots responded with field goals on their next two drives to gain a 16-10 halftime lead.

Miami used the Wildcat formation to open the third quarter and engineered a 16-play, 66-yard touchdown drive that took 10 minutes off the clock. RB Ronnie Brown culminated the drive when he took a direct snap and completed a one-yard touchdown pass to TE Joey Haynos.

The Patriots wasted little time recapturing the lead, scoring two plays later when Brady connected with Moss on the 71-yard touchdown. A successful two-point play extended the Patriots lead to 24-17.

New England added a field goal late in the fourth quarter for a 27-17 final.

BRADY SETS FRANCHISE RECORD WITH HIS 27TH 300-YARD PASSING GAME

Tom Brady had 332 passing yards, registering his 27th career 300-yard passing game and passing Drew Bledsoe (26) for the most 300-yard games in New England history. The 300-yard game was his fourth of the 2009 season and was his third straight. The 300-yard game was Brady's 12th in his last 23 regular-season starts.

BRADY EQUALS HOTTEST STRETCH OF CAREER WITH THIRD STRAIGHT 300-YARD GAME

With 332 passing yards, Brady had his third consecutive 300yard game, equaling the hottest streak of his career. The only other time in his 10-year career that he had three consecutive 300-yard games was during a three-game stretch in 2007 when he had 388 yards at Dallas (10/14/07), 354 yards at Miami (10/21/07) and 306 yards vs. Washington (10/28/07).

BRADY COMPLETES 71-YD TD PASS TO MOSS

OB Tom Brady's 71-yard touchdown pass to WR Randy Moss is the third longest touchdown pass of Brady's career. He had a career-long 91-yard touchdown pass to WR David Patten at Indianapolis (10-21-01) and an 82-yard touchdown pass to WR Troy Brown in overtime at Miami (10-19-03). The 71-yard touchdown pass to Moss is the longest pass of Brady's career at Gillette Stadium, besting a 63-yard touchdown pass to WR Randy Moss vs. Pittsburgh (12-9-07).

GOSTKOWSKI TIES CAREER-HIGH WITH 4 FGS

Stephen Gostkowski was a perfect four-for-four on field goals today, tying his career high with four successful kicks in a game. Gostkowski also had four field goals against Atlanta on Sept. 27 and had four successful boots in two games in 2008 (at N.Y. Jets on 9/14/08 and vs. Arizona on 12/21/08).

MOSS MOVES UP ALL-TIME RECEIVING LIST

Moss passed Henry Ellard and Cris Carter and moved into seventh place on the NFL's All-Time receiving yards list. Moss finished with 13,913 career receiving yards. Moss entered the contest ranked ninth with 13,766 career receiving yards and moved past Ellard (13,777) and Carter (13,899). James Lofton ranks sixth in NFL history with 14,004 career receiving yards. Jerry Rice is the NFL's all-time leader with 22,895 career receiving yards.

MOSS BECOMES THIRD PLAYER TO REACH 140 OR MORE RECEIVING TDS

Randy Moss tied Buffalo's Terrell Owens for second place on the NFL's all-time list with 140 career touchdown catches. Moss became the third player in NFL history to catch 140 or more touchdown passes when he scored on a 71-yard touchdown in the third quarter. Jerry Rice holds the NFL record with 197 career touchdown receptions.

MOSS MOVES UP ALL-TIME RECEIVING LIST

Moss passed Henry Ellard and Cris Carter and moved into seventh place on the NFL's All-Time receiving yards list. Moss finished with 13,913 career receiving yards. Moss entered the contest ranked ninth with 13,766 career receiving yards and moved past Ellard (13,777) and Carter (13,899). James Lofton ranks sixth in NFL history with 14,004 career receiving yards. Jerry Rice is the NFL's all-time leader with 22,895 career receiving yards.

MOSS MOVES UP ALL-TIME SCRIMMAGE YARDS LIST

Moss passed Cris Carter and moved into 24th place on the NFL's all-time scrimmage yards list. Moss entered the game ranked 25th in NFL history with 13,925 yards from scrimmage (159 rushing and 13,766 receiving) and added 147 yards to push his career total to 14,072 and move past Carter's total of 13,940 yards. James Lofton ranks 23rd in league history with 14,250 scrimmage yards.

MOSS GOES OVER 100 YARDS

Moss exceeded 100 receiving yards for the fourth time in 2009. He now has 63 100-yard games, which is second to Jerry Rice's NFL record 76 100-yard games.

MOSS SCORES ON 71-YD TD PASS FROM BRADY

Moss scored on a 71-yard touchdown pass from Tom Brady is the third quarter. It is the second longest catch of Moss' Patriots career and the longest from Brady. He had a 76-yard touchdown pass from QB Matt Cassel vs. Arizona (12/21/08).

WELKER IS SIXTH PLAYER IN TEAM HISTORY WITH THREE STRAIGHT SEASONS OF 50-PLUS RECEPTIONS.

Wes Welker had nine catches to finish the game with 55 receptions on the season, becoming the sixth player in Patriots history with 50 or more catches in three straight seasons. Welker had 112 receptions in 2007 and 111 in 2008, making 2009 his third straight season with 50 or more catches for the Patriots. Welker joins Ben Coates, Irving Fryar, Marv Cook, Terry Glenn and Troy Brown as the only players in Patriots history to achieve the feat. Randy Moss, who finished today's game with 49 catches in 2009, can join the club with one more reception.

Robert Kraft News & Notes

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. In 15 seasons of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what many observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five



seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.311 pct.) and recording the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won eight division titles, five conference crowns and three Super Bowl championships. The Patriots have made five Super Bowl appearances since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other NFL franchise has earned more than three berths.

SELLOUT STREAK

In the early 1990s, the Patriots seemed destined for relocation until Robert Kraft's purchase of the team rejuvenated local interest. In 1991, the season ticket base was just 17,635, barely enough to support the club. Now, the season-ticket base stands at a capped total of 61,759 and more than 50,000 fans are on a waiting list. The Patriots have sold out 166 consecutive home games (dating back to the 1994 regular-season opener).

SUCCESS STORY

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have been one of the NFL's elite franchises. Over the first 15-plus years of Kraft's ownership, the Patriots own the NFL's highest winning percentage and have won more Super Bowl titles, more conference championships and more playoff games than any other NFL team.

Bill Belichick is the only head coach in NFL history to win three Super Bowl titles in a four-year span. Belichick spent 20 years as an assistant coach in the NFL and this is his 15th season as a head coach. According to the Elias Sports Bureau he is the only man in NFL history to serve 20 or more seasons as an assistant coach and at least 15 seasons as a head coach. Over a 100game span from 2003-08, Belichick directed the team to an 82-18 record, marking the best 100-game span for any team in NFL history. In the 2007 season, Belichick led the Patriots to the fourth undefeated and untied regular season in the NFL's 88year history and the first since the NFL established a 16-game schedule in 1978. He has led the Patriots to the Super Bowl four times in the last eight seasons and has produced six division championships in the last eight seasons, including five straight from 2003-07. Belichick's Patriots teams own the all-time NFL records for consecutive total victories (21 from 2003-04), consecutive regular-season victories (21 from 2006-08) and consecutive playoff victories (10 from 2001-05). Belichick owns the second best postseason record in NFL history (15-4) and is the winningest NFL head coach since 2001 (117-36). From 2003-04, he directed the Patriots to back-to-back Super Bowl titles while posting consecutive 17-win campaigns. Belichick has spent more seasons in the league than any other current NFL head coach, and in that time has been a part of five Super Bowl championship teams. His overall record of 122-47 with the Patriots gives him the most victories and the best winning percentage of any head coach in franchise history.

ELITE COMPANY

Bill Belichick is one of nine NFL head coaches to win three or more championships since the league began postseason play in 1933. With the Patriots' victory in Super Bowl XXXIX, Belichick joined an exclusive club in which each of the eight other members has been enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

BELICHICK WINS 100th REGULAR-SEASON GAME WITH PATRIOTS

The Patriots' victory over Oakland on Dec. 14, 2008 was Bill Belichick's 100th regular-season victory as Patriots head coach. His 100th victory came in his 142nd regular-season game as head coach, and only three NFL coaches have won their 100th game with a team in fewer tries – Oakland's John Madden (136 games), Miami's Don Shula (137) and Cleveland's Paul Brown (138).

Moss has caught 140 touchdowns out of 892 career receptions. He is ahead of Lance Alworth, who played 11 seasons for San Diego and Dallas from 1962-72, caught 85 touchdowns out of



542 career receptions for an average of one score every 6.38 receptions.

MOSS IS NFL'S PREMIER TD RECEIVER

Since entering the NFL in 1998, Randy Moss has caught 140 touchdown passes, more than any other player over that span. Since joining the Patriots via trade prior to the 2007 season, Moss has caught 39 touchdowns – also the best in the league over that span. In terms of overall touchdowns (rushing, receiving and returning), Moss has totaled 141 scores since entering the league in 1998 (140 via reception and one via punt return), a tally that ranks second only to LaDainian Tomlinson (142 touchdowns) over that span. Last season, Moss's 11 touchdown receptions led the AFC and tied for third in the NFL.

WELKER RECORDS 12 CATCHES Wes Welker tied his second-highest single-game reception total with 12 catches in the season-opener vs. Buffalo (9/14). His dozen receptions trail only his career-high 13 catches vs. Philadelphia on Nov. 25, 2007. Welker's other 12-catch game was last season at Seattle on Dec. 7, 2008. Wes Welker's 111 receptions in 2008 stand as the secondhighest single-season total in team history. Welker's 111 catches were just one shy of his franchise-record 112 catches in 2007. Welker can join Jerry Rice (3), Herman Moore (3) and Marvin Harrison (4) as the only players to catch 100 passes in three consecutive seasons. Welker has 55 receptions in 2009 (9.2 catches per game) and is on pace for a team-record 128 receptions if he can keep up his pace. Wes Welker led the Patriots with 1,165 receiving yards in 2008 and joined Randy Moss in recording the first back-to-back 1,000yard receiving seasons in Patriots history. Moss also had 1,000 receiving yards in 2007 and 2008. Welker's 1,165 yards in 2008 rank sixth on the Patriots' all-time single-season list. In 2007, Welker totaled 1,175 receiving yards – a performance that ranked fourth in team history. WELKER'S ROUTE TO THE NFL

Despite being named the Oklahoma football player of the year by both the *USA Today* and the *Daily Oklahoman*, Wes Welker's only scholarship offer came from Texas Tech, and only after a player that committed to Texas Tech backed out.

"I was thinking I'd get a scholarship somewhere," Welker said. "When it didn't happen when it was supposed to I was pretty hurt by it."

Welker had an impressive collegiate career, accumulating 259 receptions and eight punts returned for touchdowns. He even won a national award as the best special teams player in the country. Despite those accolades, he was passed over in the 2004 NFL draft and signed with San Diego as a free agent. He made the team, then was cut after the first game. He signed with Miami soon after and was used just on special teams. He caught New England's eye with a 71-yard punt return on Monday Night Football in a game against the Patriots. He was acquired by the Patriots in a trade with Miami in 2007.

WELKER SETS CAREER HIGH

Wes Welker set a career-high with 150 yards receiving in the Patriots 59-0 win over Tennessee (10/18). His previous best was a 149 yards vs. Philadelphia (11/25/07).

KEVIN FAULK IS HIGH ON THE CHARTS

Kevin Faulk has fit in well as a member of the Patriots since joining the team in 1999. He ranks sixth in rushing (3,279), fourth in receptions (404), eighth in pass receiving yards (3,496), 21st in scoring (188), sixth in total punt return yards (932) and first in kickoff return yards (4,098). Faulk owns the longest non-touchdown kickoff return in team



history when he covered 95 yards on a return against the New York Jets (11/15).

He is one of just 13 NFL players this decade to total at least 2,000 rushing yards and at least 2,000 receiving yards, and is one of only six players to have at least 2,000 rushing yards and at least 3,000 receiving yards. Faulk has totaled 3,052 rushing yards and 3,398 receiving yards since 2000, joining an exclusive list of elite players who have achieved the feat. Faulk is one of just seven players who reached the milestone with just one team. In the 1990s, there were 13 players who achieved the 2000/2000 milestone; 22 players did it in the 1980s; nine players achieved the feat in the 1970s.

He moved past Irving Fryar into fourth place during the Patriots' game against the Pittsburgh Steelers on Oct. 30, 2008. He passed Terry Glenn for fifth place against San Francisco on Oct. 5, 2008. He is the 26th running back in NFL history to reach 400 receptions.

PATRIOTS ELECT FIVE SEASON CAPTAINS

The New England Patriots announced their 2009 captains prior to the start of the regular-season. Quarterback Tom Brady and WR Randy Moss will serve as offensive captains. Nose tackle Vince Wilfork and LB Jerod Mayo will serve as defensive captains. Wide receiver Sam Aiken will serve as special teams captain. The Patriots' 2009 captains were elected by their teammates.

On offense, Brady will serve as an offensive captain for the eighth straight season, having first been elected in 2002. Moss, in his third season with the Patriots after joining the team via trade in April 2007, will serve as a Patriots captain for the second straight season.

On defense, Wilfork is a captain for the second straight season, while Mayo will serve as a captain for the first time. He joined the Patriots as a first-round pick in 2008 and earned the AP Defensive Rookie of the Year award.

Aiken will serve as the Patriots' special teams captain for the first time. A special teams standout, Aiken has accumulated 71 special teams tackles during his six NFL seasons, entering the 2009 season.

Adalius Thomas has 52.0 career sacks and is one of six active linebackers with 50 or more sacks. (Joining Joey Porter, Junior Seau DeMarcus Ware, Mike Vrabel and Chike Okeafor).

PIERRE WOODS STAYS ON THE RIGHT PATH

On the field, linebacker Pierre Woods is respected for being one of the grittiest players on the Patriots. Woods emerged from an impoverished area of Cleveland and steered away from a life of crime by the father of one his closest friends, Ted Ginn, Jr., now a Miami Dolphins wideout. Ted Ginn, Sr. explained to the *Boston Herald* that, "it took a lot of conversations he didn't want to have to get him to understand. I had to be that protector for him. I had to be that flashlight so he could see that what I was telling him was true."

Woods credited Ginn, Sr. with having such a powerful impact on his life that when he won the Big Ten Championship at Michigan, he gave the ring to his father figure, Ginn, Sr. "As I grew as a young man, I learned to respect and love the man like a father," Woods said to the *Boston Herald*. As Woods celebrates his fourth season in Foxborough, he takes the opportunity to reflect, especially now as a father of three. "(My son) should never have to go through the things that I went through," he said. "But, I wouldn't want my kids to be blind to the fact that this is what happens in the inner cities in America."

A JUNIOR ACHIEVMENT: SEAU IS ON A WINNING STREAK

LB Junior Seau has won 24 consecutive regular-season games in which he appeared with New England, tying DT Maulty Moore of the Miami Dolphins (1972-73) for the longest personal winning streak since the merger. Seau's record stretches from two wins in November of 2006 (he finished the 2006 season on IR), 16 regular-season wins in 2007, the final



four games of 2008 and the wins over Tennessee and Tampa Bay in 2009. Seau had been tied at 23 with former Patriots RB Patrick Pass, who won 23 straight (2003-4). Seau was active but did not play vs. Miami (11/8).

FRED TAYLOR AMONG NFL'S BEST

Fred Taylor ranks 15th in NFL history for most rushing yards with career totals of 2,473 carries for 11,472 yards and 64 rushing touchdowns in 144 games. He trails only San Diego's LaDainian Tomlinson (12,049) among active running backs in rushing yards. Taylor ranks among the NFL's all-time best in several categories.

His perseverance in the face of despair led him to the NFL, while off the field he became closer with his now strongest companion, his wife, Bianca who helped him through his losses. While he has many accomplishments on the football field and will always cherish his National Championship and Super Bowl rings, his constant reminder lies closest to his heart, a picture of his late parents at their high school prom.

"I carry them with me wherever I go," Wilfork said of his parents' keepsake. "They're with me. The only regret that I have in life is that my parents are not with me today to see where I am today. But I wouldn't be anywhere today without my wife."

MATT LIGHT AND HIS FOUNDATION

Foundation, The Light а nonprofit founded in 2001 by Matt Light, held its signature fundraising event on Tuesday, September 29 at Addieville East Farm in Mapleville, RI.

The Matt Light Celebrity Shoot-Out, now in its fifth year, offers participants the opportunity to match their shooting skills against Light, his teammates, and a host of local and national celebrities. Proceeds from the



one-of-a-kind event benefit the Light Foundation, a youth-based organization that strives to install honesty, accountability and responsibility in young people through unique outdoor learning experiences that include a character development football camp, a financial literacy program offered at area schools and academic scholarships. In the eight years since the organization was founded, it has raised over \$1.2 million to support these programs.

Light says he wanted to develop a unique high-profile charity event that would raise funds and exposure for his foundation, and his love of the outdoors naturally came into play.

PATRIOTS WIN GAME NUMBER 400

The Patriots recorded the franchise's 400th all-time victory, including postseason games, with the 26-10 win over Atlanta (9/27). The 400 victories rank third among the eight original AFL teams, behind Denver and Oakland. The eight original AFL teams, including the Patriots, began play in 1960. The Patriots recorded their milestone 400th victory in their 50th season and in their 777th overall game. Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have 178 victories, more than any other NFL team during that span.

Randy Moss has recorded a 1,000-yard receiving season nine times in his 11-year career. Moss can join Jerry Rice (14) as the only players in NFL history with 10 seasons with 1,000 receiving yards with a 1,000 yard season in 2009. Moss currently has 712 receiving yards, which puts him on pace for 1,424 receiving yards.

BRADY ON PACE FOR 4,728 PASSING YARDS

Tom Brady currently has 2,364 passing yards through eight games, putting him on pace for 4,728 passing yards. That mark would tie Drew Beldsoe for seven seasons of 3,000 or more yards and give Brady his third season with over 4,000 passing yards. Bledsoe and Brady are tied with two 4,000 yard seasons.

BRADY ON PACE FOR 34 TDS

Brady has 16 touchdown passes through the first eight games, putting him on pace for 32 touchdown passes. It would mark his third season of 30 or more touchdowns. He set a franchise record with 50 touchdown passes in 2007. Brady has thrown for 25 or more touchdowns in a single season four times.

BRADY WAS THERE FOR "THE CATCH"

In the 2003 AFC Divisional Playoff Game against Tennessee on January 10, 2004, QB Tom Brady threw for 201 yards and one touchdown, leading the Patriots to a narrow 17-14 victory en route to their second Super Bowl. That wasn't the first time Brady has seen a major playoff game come down to the wire on a game played on January 10. A native of the Bay area, Brady was at Candlestick Park for the 1981 NFC Championship game between the 49ers and Cowboys, as a four-year-old fan, witnessing Dwight Clark's "The Catch" from Joe Montana. According to Gary Myers' book The Catch, Brady wept after the play. Said Brady, "Not because I was happy or excited, but because everybody stood up and I couldn't see!" While Brady has been recognized for his stellar credentials, he said Montana, "was and will always be the greatest quarterback ever to play."

LIKE FATHER LIKE SON

WR Matthew Slater spent his college days in Los Angeles on the offensive side of the ball at UCLA. The second-year promising young talent was born in 1985, when another Slater in The City of Angels was named to his second of seven Pro Bowls. Matthew's father, Jackie Slater, a Hall of Fame offensive tackle, spent his entire career with the Rams organization in LA. He was voted the NFC Offensive Lineman of the year four times-1983, 1986, 1987, and 1989. Matthew Slater, drafted in 2008, is one of six sons of Hall of Fame members to be drafted in NFL history.

LIKE FATHER LIKE SON, PART 2

CB Shawn Springs has always been a speedster. No doubt, the gift of fast feet was a hereditary gift from his father, Ron Springs, an 8-year NFL running back for the Dallas Cowboys and Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Ron, who tallied over 2500 rushing and 2200 receiving yards in his career, became ill in 1990 with type 2 Diabetes. By 2004, Shawn was a respected NFL veteran, but he was willing to give up his career and offered to donate his kidney to his father, who needed a transplant. Ron declined, saying in a 2005 Washington Post article, "I think that was a tremendous gesture, and it just justifies the fact that he's a loving son. But I couldn't have let him do that, because I always prayed and wanted him to be a professional athlete, so I would not have shortened his career by no means necessary.

GUYTON HAS THE WORK ETHIC

Gary Guyton was not drafted into the NFL, but through a solid work ethic was able to make the 53-man roster and earn a starting job in his second year. Taking a peak into his work history shows his work ethic goes beyond the football field. At the end of the season last year, Guyton went back to Georgia Tech and worked as an



office assistant at the school's research institute.

"I was an office assistant, right there at the desk," said Guyton, who worked for a small wage at Georgia Tech Research Institute. "Just a regular office assistant. Tech is my school, and I enjoyed it."

"He's smart, well prepared," Bill Belichick said. "He understands. He's got a real good understanding of football. Not just his role but where other people have to be. That's what you really want in a defensive signal-caller, someone that understands how it all works."

It's been a long road," Guyton said. "I have come far. I've achieved some things. But I don't look back, just forward."

SANDERS EARNED HIS REPUTATION AS A HARD WORKER

James Sanders has earned the reputation as one of the Patriots' hardest workers. Said Bill Belichick on Sanders, "I think he's very professional. You would like to have 53 players like James on your team in terms of his work ethic, his toughness, and being a teammate. He's a high-character player."

BRANDON MCGOWAN IS A WELCOMED ADDITION

Brandon McGowan puts literally everything he has into making big tackles. Said McGowan, "I don't really care about my body and I'll expose my body to some messed-up positions to make a play." And expose he has; McGowan has fought his way back from three season-ending injuries in four years in Chicago. The University of Maine standout, who is one of three active players (Stephen Cooper, SD; Lofa Tatupu, SEA) to come out of the Football Championship Subdivision school, signed with the Patriots in May and forced a game-changing fumble off of Falcons' running back Michael Turner on September 27th. He also recovered a fumble at Denver that helped position the Patriots for a field goal.

FREE AGENTS MAKE AN IMPACT

Sixteen players on the New England 53-man roster entered the NFL as rookie free agents. Two that came to the Patriots as rookie free agents are making an impact on the defense. Mike Wright came to New England as a rookie free agent in 2005. He registered his first career two-sack game, dropping Joe Flacco twice for total losses of 17 yards vs. Baltimore (10-4). He currently has a single-season career high with 4.0 sacks. Gary Guyton came to New England as a rookie free agent in 2007. He is third on the Patriots with 44 total tackles and is on pace to finish the season with 88 tackles.

Said Bill Belichick about players coming to the Patriots as a free agents, "I think Mike's similar to some of the other players that would fall into that category. Players like Gary Guyton and guys like that who weren't high picks that came in at a pretty early point — Pierre Woods, [Brian] Hoyer — came in and showed that they belonged, both physically and athletically from a football standpoint, recognizing things, reacting, kind of knowing what to do."

TOUGH AT HOME

The Patriots own an overall record of 56-12 (.823) at Gillette Stadium. Since their state-of-the-art facility opened at the beginning of the 2002 season, the Patriots own the NFL's best record at home. Now in their seventh season at Gillette Stadium, the Patriots have finished three seasons undefeated at home since the stadium opened (2003, 2004 and 2007) and own a perfect 7-0 playoff record at the venue.

STEPHEN NEAL TAKES A DIFFERENT ROUTE TO THE NFL

Guard Stephen Neal knows how to use his 6-4, 305-pound frame. He has used it to gain leverage and overpower defensive linemen since 2001. The three-time Super Bowl Champion arrived in Foxborough with two NCAA titles of his own, except the only padding he saw was on the matted floors.

A championship wrestler at Cal-State Bakersfield, he compiled a 151-10 record, winning titles his junior and senior year, including a title win over NCAA wrestling and UFC heavyweight champion Brock Lesnar. In 1999, Neal won the Dan Hodge Award, known as the Heisman Trophy of wrestling.

Neal is one of only two active NFL players that did not play football in college before turning pro. The other is San Diego Chargers tight end Antonio Gates, a basketball star at Kent State. Gates led the Golden Flashes to the Elite Eight in 2002, averaging 21 points in his senior season.

At Wembley Stadium in London, against Tampa Bay, Meriweather showed that not even a different time zone could throw off his timing, picking off the Buccaneers twice in the first six minutes of the game and returning one for a 39-yard touchdown. His two picks were enough to earn him AFC Defensive Player of the Week honors. To Head Coach Bill Belichick though, Meriweather has been contributing weekly, whether or not the statistics reflect his performance.

"Brandon's had a real good year for us," said Belichick. "From the beginning of training camp he's really been a leader for us back in the secondary, making calls, making adjustments, sometimes taking harder responsibilities with the safeties. He makes plays that don't show up on the stat sheet."

As for Meriweather, living up to an expectation of a repeat performance is a challenge he welcomes. "My level of expectation is already through the roof," Meriweather said. "I expect myself to be great every day. Not good here, good there, great here, great there - I expect to be great every day."

AFL LEGACY GAMES

50th season marks the This anniversary for the American Football League (AFL), of which the Patriots were an original member. The Boston Patriots, who hosted the AFL's first regular season game on Sept. 9, 1960 at Boston University Field, were featured in the NFL's first "AFL Legacy Game" on the opening weekend of the





2009 season on Sept. 14, 2009, when the Patriots hosted the Buffalo Bills at Gillette Stadium on Monday Night Football. throughout the team's AFL seasons from 1960-69. In recognition of the Patriots 50th anniversary, Bissell has been commissioned to create the covers of this season's Patriots GameDay magazines in the same style of those early covers.

Atlanta on Dec. 4, 1976 (59-0).

QB Tom Brady completed 29-of-34 pass attempts for 380 yards with six touchdown passes, wide receivers Wes Welker (10-150-2) both went over 100 yards receiving, and RB

TDs) and Randy Moss (8-129-3 TDs) both went over 100 yards receiving, and RB Laurence Maroney added 123 yards rushing on the ground.

Brady had 345 yards passing in the first half alone, and set an NFL record with five touchdown passes in the second quarter. For his contributions, Brady earned AFC Offensive Player of the Week honors for the second time on the young 2009 season. New England built a 45-0 halftime lead, the largest halftime lead in NFL history.
