## HEADLINES

- The 4-5 Jets have lost four games that have come down to the last possession: 31-27 at MIA, 10/12; 16-13 vs. BUF in OT, 10/18; 30-25 vs. MIA, 11/1; 24-22 vs. JAC, 11/15.
- This game features the Patriots offense, ranked second overall (416.8) and second in passing yardage (302.7) vs. the Jets defense, ranked third overall (281.6) and third in passing defense (170.0).
- Buoyed by **Thomas Jones'** 510 rushing yards over the last four games and an offensive line that has started an NFL-high 25 consecutive games together, the Jets rushing offense leads the NFL at 170.1 ypg with a league-high 324 rushing attempts.
- In the first meeting 9/20, the Jets limited the Patriots to three first-half field goals, with the only touchdown of the game coming on a nine-yard pass from **Mark Sanchez** to **Dustin Keller** in the opening drive of the second half in the Jets 16-9 victory.

## HEAD COACHES

### **JETS HEAD COACH REX RYAN**

(FIRST YEAR AT JETS)  
4-5

Rex Ryan was named the 15th full-time head coach of the New York Jets on January 19, 2009.

For Rex, it is a sort of homecoming, returning to the franchise he first experienced in 1968 when his father, Buddy, was hired as the defensive line coach under Weeb Ewbank. That season culminated in the Jets' Super Bowl III victory in Miami with a six-year-old Rex Ryan watching from the stands in the Orange Bowl.

Ryan spent the last 10 seasons with the Baltimore Ravens, including 2008 as assistant head coach/defensive coordinator. During Ryan's tenure, the Ravens defense never ranked lower than sixth in the NFL. From 1999-2008, the Ravens ranked first for fewest points allowed (17.1 per game), fewest rushing yards allowed per game (87.3), most shutouts (9), most takeaways (337), most interceptions (212), most interceptions for touchdowns (29) and third-down conversion defense (33.9 percent).

Ryan began his Ravens career as the defensive line coach for Brian Billick in 1999, when the Ravens defense finished second in the NFL in total defense and second against the run. In 2000, the Ravens defense allowed the fewest points in a 16-game season in NFL history (165) en route to winning Super Bowl XXXV.

Ryan was promoted to defensive coordinator in 2005. During his four seasons in that role, the Ravens defense finished fifth (2005), first (2006), sixth (2007) and second (2008) in the NFL. In 2006, the defense allowed only 201 points and 264 yards per game as Ryan was named NFL Assistant Coach of the Year by Pro Football Weekly and the Pro Football Writers Association.

In 2008, new Head Coach John Harbaugh named Ryan assistant head coach/defensive coordinator. The Ravens 2008 defense allowed 261.1 yards per game, marking the fourth time since 1999 the Ravens finished second overall in the NFL. Before joining the Ravens, Ryan was a defensive coordinator in college at Oklahoma (1998) and Cincinnati (1996-97). His first NFL coaching stint was with the Arizona Cardinals under his father, when he oversaw the defensive line in 1994 and linebackers in 1995. Ryan has also coached at Morehead State (1990-93), New Mexico Highlands (1989) and Eastern Kentucky (1987-88).

Ryan, 46, graduated from Stevenson High School in Prairie View, IL, and played football at SW Oklahoma State. He earned his Bachelor's Degree and Master's Degree in Physical Education at Eastern Kentucky in 1988.

Ryan was born in Ardmore, OK. He and his wife, Michelle, have two sons, Payton, named for Walter Payton, and Seth.

### **PATRIOTS HEAD COACH BILL BELICHICK**

(TENTH YEAR AT PATRIOTS/FIFTEENTH YEAR OVERALL)  
144-89, 15-4 POSTSEASON

Bill Belichick is in his 35th season as an NFL coach and is the only head coach in NFL history to win three Super Bowl titles XXXVI (2001), XXXVIII (2003) and XXXIX (2004) in a four-year span. In his first nine seasons as Patriots head coach, he has won 116 games – more than any other head coach in NFL history. Belichick's Patriots team own the all-time NFL records for consecutive total victories (21 from 2003-04), consecutive total victories (21 from 2003-04), consecutive regular-season victories (21 from 2006-2008) and consecutive playoff victories (10 from 2001-05). Over a 100-game span from 2003-2008, he directed the Patriots to an 82-18 record – the best record for any 100-game span in NFL history.

Hired by Chairman and CEO Robert Kraft on January 27, 2000, Belichick is in his 10th season as New England's head coach in 2009. Through nine seasons, Belichick has delivered three Super Bowl championships, four conference titles, six division crowns and 14 playoff victories while posting an overall record 116-45. Belichick directed the Patriots to victories in Super Bowls XXVII (2001), XXXVIII (2003) and XXXIX (2004), and in 2007 he became the first NFL head coach to guide his team to a 16-0 regular season. Only one coach (Pittsburgh's Chuck Noll, 4) has won more Super Bowls than Belichick, and his three Super Bowl titles tie Washington's Joe Gibbs and San Francisco's Bill Walsh for second place on the NFL's all-time list. Belichick owns the second best postseason record in NFL history (15-4) and is the winningest NFL head coach since 2001 (117-37). Coach Belichick's overall career winning percentage of .584 (159-93-0) ranks fourth among the 17 NFL coaches with 140 or more wins, trailing only George Halas (324-151-31, .682), Don Shula (347-173-6, .666) and Curly Lambeau (229-134-22, .631). Belichick's recent accomplishments are the latest triumphs in a career during which he has helped produce five Super Bowl titles, seven conference championships and 13 division titles since entering the NFL in 1975. He won his first two Super Bowls as the defensive coordinator for the New York Giants in 1986 and 1990. George Seifert is the only other man to have won multiple Super Bowls both as a head coach and as an assistant coach. Belichick launched his career in 1975 as a special assistant with the Baltimore Colts, then became an assistant special teams coach with Detroit (1976-77) and Denver (1978). In 1979, he joined the New York Giants to begin a 12-season stint in which he contributed to two Super Bowl championships as New York's defensive coordinator. Belichick was named head coach of the Cleveland Browns in 1991, becoming the youngest head coach in the NFL at age 38. By 1994, Belichick brought the Browns back to the playoffs, finishing 11-5 and advancing to the second round of the playoffs, while allowing a league-low 204 total points. In 1996, Belichick joined New England and was a key contributor to the team's rebound from a 6-10 season in 1995 to an 11-5 season and the team's first division title in 10 years en route to the Patriots' appearance in Super Bowl XXXI. Belichick then spent three seasons with the New York Jets from 1997 to 1999, helping New York improve from a 1-15 season in 1996 to an appearance in the AFC Championship Game in 1998.

Belichick was a center/tight end at Wesleyan 1971-74 and was born April 16, 1952, in Nashville, TN.

- **On his philosophy:** We have a philosophy here - you've heard of the K.I.S.S. philosophy, which is 'Keep It Simple Stupid,' that's for somebody else. Ours is a K.I.L.L. philosophy; we're going to 'Keep It Likable and Learnable.'
- **On preparation:** You're going to see our aggressive mentality through our preparation. You're going to see that on the practice field. We either go through it walk-through speed or full speed. That's how you do things here, and that's how we're going to get it done. You can't expect a guy to know how to play on Sunday when he hasn't seen it throughout the week. So we go full speed, and that's the way it's going to get done.
- **On being aggressive:** You're going to see an attack team here. We're going to be aggressive on both sides of the ball and with our special teams. It's all about our team here. It's a team concept that we're going to have with the Jets. Our offense is going to pick up our defense. Our defense will pick up our offense and our special teams will pick us up on both sides of the ball.
- **On the offense and defense:** Our offense is going to build up our defense by the way we work against each other, and vice versa. Some games our offense may need to score 21 points. Sometimes our defense may need to shut them out. We're always going to pick each other up. It's about a team; it's not one side versus the other side, but we're going to compete against each other in practice.
- **On being a physical football team:** We will be an aggressive football team and a physical football team. We want to have an all weather offense and that starts with a running game, being able to run the football, because I think it's important. You've got to win when the snow falls to get where you want to go, and that's to win Super Bowls.

- **On taking on this challenge:** The only way I know how to handle a challenge is to hit that thing head on, and that's what we're going to do. The message to the rest of the league is, 'hey, the Jets are coming, and we're going to give you everything we've got, and that's going to be, I think, more than you can handle.' We're going to find out.
- **On his coaching staff:** There is no way that I could have envisioned putting together this kind of coaching staff. This is an all-star staff that I feel extremely fortunate to have. I am confident in my abilities, but I am a lot more confident in the abilities of these men. It's not something where these guys are working for me, they are working with me. It's our collective efforts that will lead this football team.
- **On going from defensive coordinator to head coach:** They always say until you go through it, you think you understand, but you really don't understand the other commitments that you do have, but it's a great thing. You prepare all your life for it, so these decisions that you're making, all that experience you've had being around great coaches, which I have, it makes it much easier...I'm kind of a head coach/coordinator and I told Mike Pettine he's kind of the same thing also. I'm going to lean on him as well, and (Bill) Callahan can put that on there as slash head coach. So can Schotty (Brian Schottenheimer). So can Mike Westhoff. It's a collective effort, so that's a good thing. It is funny. I even asked (Steve) Spagnuolo if he was calling the defenses and he said 'no' because there are so many administrative things. I have a tough time doing that. You work all your life to get to this spot. One of the reasons you get here is because you're probably pretty decent at what you do and to just turn it completely over and then if it doesn't go right, you have somebody else to blame instead of just putting it on yourself. If our defense doesn't do well, then that's going to be a reflection on me. Of course if our team doesn't (do well), it's a reflection on me also, but I can handle it. I think we'll be successful in all aspects of our team, not just based on me but on the players we have and the coaches we have and our support staff. It's hard for me to imagine us not being successful.

### ONCE YOU'RE A JET, YOU'RE A JET ALL THE WAY...

Coach Ryan, who first experienced the Jets at age six when his father Buddy was an assistant coach from 1968-75, has embraced the Jets history:

- Historic team pictures adorn the hallways.
- Individual record holders and Pro Bowlers are honored on the walls outside the meeting rooms.
- Framed jerseys of Joe Namath, Winston Hill and Gerry Philbin hang in his office.
- The all-time numerical roster hangs outside the locker room so that current players see who wore their numbers before them.





## THE WORLD ACCORDING TO REX

Excerpts from Rex Ryan's Monday Press Conference (11/16/09)

### Opening Statement...

As far as being in this position right now, after another tough game, this is four games that we've lost basically on the last play of the game. They always say that, (if) you stay in the league long enough, it will even out. I certainly hope so because it's tough. I think it's my responsibility to find a way for this football team to do the things to win the game at the end, (so) that we're celebrating, on the last play of the game (with a) victory. That's up to me. That's what I'm searching for. It's tough because when you look at it, is it one or two plays that really affect the game? It absolutely is. Is it one or two mental mistakes that can cost you a game? Is it a penalty that can cost you a game? All those things, yes, it is. It's on me to find that answer. Trust me, I'm gonna work to the best of my ability to find answers. Whatever it is, I believe we'll find them. I know our task is hard, but it's not impossible.

### On if he saw the Patriots/Colts game last night...

I actually went to sleep. It was 31-21 when I went to sleep with under five minutes left. I just turned it off. I had no idea the game turned out the way it did until late this morning after we watched our entire film. I was with the defensive staff. We watched the entire film. Then Mike (Pettine) made a comment, "Yeah, it's pretty amazing, you think about it, we win this game, we're one game out." I thought he was crazy. I said, "No, they won the game." He was like, "No, they didn't." Doesn't feel like it, but that's where we're at.

### On if he thinks there is any way Jim Leonhard could play this week...

Yeah, (it's) still up in the air. We'll know better when the doctors call later and let us know how the surgery went.

### On the defense not being able to make a play to end the game...

It's been disappointing. My only thing is, can we learn from it? Let's focus on how do we get it fixed? That's what I'm focusing on now. It is my job to get it fixed. It is unfortunate. We got beat the last play of the game four times. We've just got to find a way to reverse it. I really challenged our guys to find the answer. Let's find the answer. Preparation is the only thing that I can think of. If I'm Kerry Rhodes, do I get with Jim Leonhard and we watch extra film together? Those are the things, the communication, that's the thing. It's not necessarily an individual thing. If it was one individual, that would be easy. It's more of just knowing the defense like the back of your hand. This is our defense. This is not my defense. It's got to be our defense. In those situations, that's when we got to tighten it up. That's when you become New York Jets. You sell out for this organization. You do it exactly by the books. That's what we've got to have. We've got to get it done. Does it burn me to think that we're going to give up a score like that? Absolutely. The times you go back, that's hard for me to live with, but those are the facts.

### On how to correct mental errors ...

Well, that's easy. That's through preparation. That's through going over it. We went over the mistakes today, both on offense (and) defense. We went over and walked through the mistakes. It's easy. (A) second team All-American, it's easy to stop, but we're going to fix them. You don't get any do-overs. For us to make a mental mistake like that in a critical situation, it's not acceptable. Again, it's on me. I'm not pointing it at anybody else. I know where to look, and it's in the mirror. It starts with me, and I've got to get it fixed.

### On burning two timeouts during the second half of the game yesterday...

We had two bad ones there. The one on the offense, that's my decision. Schottly never thought it was going to be a successful play. We called a timeout. I thought there were 12 guys on the field, to be honest with you, because it looked like there was some confusion there. I think it's better to call the timeout. We needed to score down there. If there were 12, like I initially thought, then obviously you can't afford that kind of penalty. On the defensive end, when we had to take the timeout, unacceptable. (It was) totally unacceptable.

### On if there was miscommunication between Kerry Rhodes and Jim Leonhard during Mercedes Lewis' 33-yard reception...

There was miscommunication there. It just never got done. Let's just put it that way. Are you on the closed side of the formation or the open side of the formation? I think Kerry thought he was on the open side of the formation. Then, Jim thought he was on the open side of the formation. So that was the issue.

### On if he heard the details of Belichick's fourth-down call against the Colts...

I don't know all the specifics of it, but I understand that apparently Belichick went for it on fourth-and-two at the 28-yard line. That's what I understand. I don't know what the time was or anything else. (It) sounds like he put it in his offense's hands instead of the defense's hands. He's won a heck of a lot more games than I have. I'm not going to criticize the guy one way or the other.

### On the 4-5 record considering a rookie head coach and quarterback and injured players...

Well, it's not so bad when you still got a chance. When you look at it, obviously we can't look past anything. Like we're going to look past the Patriots? It is right there. I understand what the facts are. We're 4-5. I understand all that. Those are facts, but if we do beat New England, we're one game out with six games left. Those are facts. One thing about us, until they say we're officially dead, we're going to give everything we have - we're going to give it anyway. That's all I know, so I guess if you look at it that way, with how many games left, we're still in it. We get to play New England again, a team we already beat, that we'll have a tiebreaker with. That's huge. It sounds like an opportunity to me.

### On how to prevent coming out "flat" in the first half...

I guess we can say we were flat, but I think you got to give credit to the opponent. Jacksonville came out, their running back broke some tackles, did all those kind of things. I guess we're looking at it. I think our preparation was great. The best practice we had was the last Friday for the whole season. I thought we'd come out, we wanted to start fast. First play of the game we throw an interception, they drive the length of the field, score a touchdown. That was obviously something that never got accomplished there. I knew we were fresh, I knew we'd be ready to go, it just never happened.

### On if he will rethink his bye week schedule next year...

I think every year's different. You've got to approach everything differently. The fact that we lost a game the last play of the game, was that a mistake? It's easy to say that it was. I know I left myself open for criticism. The fans have a right. Everybody has the right to criticize now that we didn't get it done.

### On Sanchez having two turnovers this game...

I thought the first throw of the game might have been under-thrown a little bit. The kid made a great play on it. The screen pass, that's a rare thing. I think I've only seen that maybe one or two other times, that a guy intercepts a screen pass like that. I thought he did a great job of leading the team down the field. Hit some huge third-down calls. I thought Mark played well.

### On if the play was similar to a play in preseason...

That's true. But at least we tackled them. (We) gave ourselves a chance. They're not in it until they're in. I will say this, Darrelle Revis, he makes an unbelievable play, him and Kerry Rhodes save a touchdown, then he (Jones-Drew) fumbles the next play. That was huge, absolutely huge for us. The other thing, too, we have to find a way that once we get momentum, to keep momentum. Just because we have something go good, okay, now we'll just play at whatever. We need to keep it rolling. I think that's something that Schottly (Brian Schottenheimer) and I were talking about. We don't have to go three-and-out, we don't have to do whatever, let's keep this thing rolling. It's just like in that case, the defense stopping them, making them go three-and-out, then we had that interception. It just seems like we're stubbing our toe as a football team in those kinds of situations. Those are things that we just have to find a way to get better at. Obviously to finish games is absolutely critical.

### On if he talks to other NFL coaches...

I'll be placing a lot of calls because I want the answers. I'll lean on several guys that I really respect. Right now, trust me, I'm not above taking advice. I'll lean on some guys that we have here, Bill Callahan has been through it, Bob Sutton, several of my other coaching guys. It's a frustrating thing because normally we finish those games. I've been used to finishing when I'm on defense. The stats say one thing, but we're still not there yet. We have to find a way to get there. And I think as a unit, I know these guys are hurting, these guys want to win, trust me. I feel the fans' pain. I understand that. But this is a group of competitive people, competitive men. We're searching for answers. We're going to give our best shot. That I can guarantee you.

### On if he is surprised in how the last several games have gone...

Absolutely, I am. I thought we were rolling. I know we have a good football team. It's just finding ways to get it done. It's a comedy of errors, but it's not funny. We're finding different ways to not be successful. But the great thing is, we believe in each other. There's no question about that. I believe in our players, there is no doubt. I believe in the competitiveness. I believe in the professionalism. I think we're going to get it done. I haven't wavered off of that. At the end of the day, I always say, somebody is going to have egg on their face. So far it looks like me. But I'm betting on me. I'm betting on our football team. So we'll see at the end of the day



# JETS NOTES

## PROFILING THE DEFENSE

- The Jets defense is third in the NFL overall (281.6 yards per game allowed) and third in pass defense (170.0 ypg).
- The Jets have allowed 17.6 points per game (11 field goals, 18 touchdowns), ranking sixth in the NFL.
- The defense has allowed 116 offensive points in nine games (12.9 ppg), second in the NFL
- The Jets have yielded opponents 4.62 yards per play, least in the NFL.
- The Jets have held their opponents to a passer rating of 68.7 (six TD, seven INT, 54.7 completion percentage), which is third in the NFL.
- The Jets blanked OAK, 38-0, the 10th regular season shutout in franchise history and first since 12/14/03, a 6-0 win over PIT. The 38-point shutout was the most lopsided shutout in Jets regular season history. The Jets defeated IND, 41-0, 1/4/03, in the 2002 Postseason.
- At OAK, 10/25, the Jets recorded three takeaways in the first quarter for the first time since 10/7/01, at BUF.
- The Jets did not allow an offensive touchdown in the first nine quarters of the 2009 season. This marked the first time an NFL team had accomplished this to start a season since 2006. The last time the Jets held opponents without an offensive touchdown for at least nine quarters was Nov. 2000 (11/12 at IND, 11/19 at MIA, 11/26 vs. CHI).
- The Jets shut down TEN QB **Kerry Collins** in the second half, not allowing a completed pass in his last 13 attempts.
- The Jets held NE to 0-for-3 in the red zone after not allowing HOU into the red zone at all. The last time NE was 0-for-3-or-more in the red zone, according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, was 10/26/03 vs. CLE.
- The HOU offense only crossed into Jets territory twice all game. The deepest penetration was the Jets 35-yard line, and that drive ended after **Donald Strickland** knocked the ball loose from **Steve Slaton**. The fumble was recovered by **Mike DeVito**. On their last drive, HOU marched to the Jets 38 on nine plays, but that drive ended with a **Lito Sheppard** interception.
- The Jets held the potent HOU offense to only 183 total yards. The last time they held a team under 200 yards, they allowed 171 yards vs. CIN, 10/12/08. Last season, the Texans averaged 382.1 yards per game.

## REVIS ISLE TOUGH ON OPPONENTS

Third-year CB **Darrelle Revis**, off his first Pro Bowl berth in 2008, is charged each week with matching up with the opponent's best receiver, and has been up to the task. He leads a group of cornerbacks, including new acquisitions **Lito Sheppard** and **Donald Strickland**, veteran **Drew Coleman** and second-year man **Dwight Lowery**, that has helped the Jets stand second in passing defense and third in opposing QB efficiency.

Revis blanketed **Andre Johnson** at HOU (4-35) during Week 1. Johnson broke out for 10 catches for 149 yards and two scores in Week 2 vs. TEN. Revis limited **Randy Moss** (4-24) 9/20, the week after Moss torched BUF (12-141) on opening weekend. Revis held **Marques Colston** to 2-33 at NO.

Week 3 vs. TEN, Revis registered a season-high eight tackles and was a key part of the secondary that shut down QB **Kerry Collins** during most of the second half, forcing him into 13 consecutive incompletions to close the game.

In Week 6 vs. BUF, Revis limited **Terrell Owens** to three receptions for 13 yards. When asked about Revis' coverage, Owens said, "He followed me everywhere I went."

Revis has two interceptions in 2009, picking off **Tom Brady** vs. NE, 9/20, and then on Sunday at OAK, he picked off **JaMarcus Russell** in the end zone.

## A PAIR OF SAFETIES

The Jets looked to improve the back end this offseason when they signed unrestricted free agent **Jim Leonhard** to pair with veteran **Kerry Rhodes**.

Leonhard originally signed with BUF as an undrafted free agent in 2005, then moved to BAL as a free agent in 2008, where he posted 85 tackles, a sack and an interception in 13 starts.

Leonhard posted his first interception, picking off JaMarcus Russell and returning the ball a career-long 44 yards before Russell bumped him out of bounds inside the five yard line. Leonhard now has accumulated 139 interception return yards on his four career regular season interceptions (34.8 per return), including a 35-yard interception return for a touchdown at CIN, 11/30/08.

Rhodes, the 123rd player selected by the Jets in the fourth round in 2005, has 12 career interceptions and nine career sacks while starting every game in his career.

The nine sacks is the most by any defensive back in Jets history, and is also third among all defensive backs since he came into the NFL in 2005.

## JETS NOTES

### THE ODD COUPLE INSIDE

The loquacious **Bart Scott** and quiet **David Harris** make an interesting pair in the middle of the defense, but the tandem ranks among the best combos in the NFL. Harris and Scott rank first and second on the Jets in tackles and for the first time, vs. MIA, 11/1, they each recorded a sack in the same game.

- Scott is a 2006 Pro Bowler who signed with the Jets as a UFA this offseason. He has recorded 68 tackles and leads the team with eight tackles-for-loss and is tied for the team lead with eight quarterback hits.
- Harris is a third-year pro who leads the team with 89 tackles, and has recorded 3.5 sacks, one interception, six QB hits, three TFL, two passes defended and a forced fumble.

In their first game together at HOU, 9/13, both Harris and Scott more than made their mark:

- Harris led the Jets with 12 tackles, and added a pass breakup and two quarterback hits, including an eight-yard sack on **Matt Schaub** as he was named AFC Defensive Player of the Week.
- Scott was credited with three tackles, but he set the tone with four hits on Schaub, as the Jets hit the QB nine times in the 24-7 win.

In the Jets win vs. TEN, both Scott and Harris made significant contributions as the defense shut down the TEN passing game, forcing incompletions on the final 13 pass attempts:

- Scott led the Jets with nine tackles, including seven solo stops, and a tackle-for-loss.
- Harris recorded five tackles, but saved his best work for the fourth quarter, when he recorded an interception and a sack of **Kerry Collins** in the fourth quarter, working to preserve the 24-17 victory.

### HARRIS NAMED AFC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK, 9/13

- Harris registered a team-high 12 tackles, one sack and one pass defended in a 24-7 road win at HOU on Kickoff Weekend, 9/13.
- Harris helped limit the Texans' offense to 183 total yards (145 passing yards, 38 rush yards).
- He recorded his first sack of the season in the third quarter taking down HOU quarterback **Matt Schaub**.
- Part of Jets defensive unit that did not allow an offensive touchdown for the first time since 11/9/08, vs. STL.
- In his third year from Michigan, this is Harris' first career Player of the Week Award. Harris was named NFL Rookie of the Month in Nov. 2007.
- The last Jets linebacker to be named AFC Defensive Player of the Week was linebacker **Eric Barton** in 2004 (Week 15 vs. SEA). The last Jets defensive player to be named AFC Defensive Player of the Week was defensive tackle **Kris Jenkins** in 2008 (Week 9 at BUF).

### THE POWER OF PACE

**LB Calvin Pace** forced two fumbles by OAK quarterbacks (**Ja-Marcus Russell**, **Bruce Gradkowski**) on sacks that the Jets recovered. Since 1990, Pace is only the fourth Jet to execute two strip sacks that resulted in Jets fumble recoveries in the same game. All have occurred since 2005.

This offseason, the Jets signed unheralded eight-year veteran **DE Marques Douglas** as a free agent. Douglas, who spent 2008 with BAL after the Ravens re-acquired him from TB in training camp in 2008, has played every game (105) since 2003 and has been among the most effective players in the league in tackling rushers behind the line of scrimmage. He has recorded 37 tackles, 1.5 sacks and a fumble recovery this season. Douglas entered the league as an undrafted rookie free agent with BAL in 1999, and at one point was given very little chance of making the NFL by then BAL defensive line coach **Rex Ryan**.

Ryan's first hire was Ravens OLB Coach **Mike Pettine** as the Jets defensive coordinator. Next came **Dennis Thurman**, who had left the Ravens in 2008 after six years in Baltimore, to coach the Jets defensive backs and he brought in **Matt Cavanaugh**, the Ravens offensive coordinator during their Super Bowl win, to coach the quarterbacks.

Once the free agency period began, the Jets showed up on **Bart Scott's** doorstep to sign the LB, followed by **S Jim Leonhard**, **DE Marques Douglas** and **DL Howard Green**. Douglas, Scott and Leonhard entered the League as undrafted free agents.

# JETS NOTES

## RUSHING TO THE TOP OF THE NFL

- The Jets rushing attack is No. 1 in the NFL, averaging 170.1 yards per game (4.7 yards per rush). The 1,531 rushing yards through nine games are the Jets second-highest total at this point in the season in franchise history (1,626 - 1979) and the 324 carries is the most in the NFL.
- The Jets rushed for 316 yards and four touchdowns on 54 carries in the victory at OAK, 10/25, a week after posting 318 rushing yards and a touchdown on 40 carries (7.95 per rush) in the loss to BUF, 10/18.
- The Jets are the sixth team in NFL history to rush for over 300 yards in back-to-back games and first since 1975 (34 seasons).
- The 318 yards vs. BUF, 10/18 is the second-highest rushing total in franchise history. The Jets single-game record is 333 yards rushing (54 attempts at NE, 10/15/72).
- The 316 yards at OAK, 10/25 are the third-highest rushing total by the Jets in franchise history. The 54 carries are tied for the second-highest carries in a single game (record: 58, at NE, 10/14/73).
- The last time the Jets exceeded 300 yards rushing before these two games, they gained 302 yards on 42 attempts vs. IND, 9/20/98 (11 seasons ago).
- The 7.95 yards per carry vs. BUF is tied for the second-highest single game per carry effort in franchise history. The Jets also averaged 7.95 yards per carry (20-159) at DEN, 11/8/92. The Jets record is 9.1 yards per carry vs. CHI, 9/25/94 (18-164).
- The Jets current offensive line has started the last 24 consecutive games together, the longest streak in the NFL.
- The unit includes two 2008 Pro Bowlers (**LG Alan Faneca** and **C Nick Mangold**), four first-round picks (Faneca, Mangold, **LT D'Brickashaw Ferguson**, **RT Damien Woody**) and three players who have started 57 consecutive games together (Mangold, Ferguson, **RG Brandon Moore**).
- Moore, the longest-tenured Jet of the linemen, has started 82 consecutive games for the Jets.
- The unit is coached by Assistant Head Coach/Offensive Line **Bill Callahan**, a former head coach on both the NFL (OAK) and college levels (Nebraska).

## BIG RUN PLAYS PLENTIFUL

The Jets are tied for second in the NFL with ATL and MIN behind TEN (13) with 11 runs of 20-or-more yards, including four such rushes vs. BUF, 10/18, and three more at OAK, 10/25.

- **Shonne Greene** hit on a 26-yard run early, and in one drive in the fourth quarter, reeled off a 21-yard run and then a 33-yard TD run at OAK, while **Thomas Jones** beat the Raiders for a 26-yard run as well.
- Against BUF, **Jones** ripped off the longest runs of his career, a 71-yard touchdown run as well as a 64-yard run on consecutive carries, while **Leon Washington** had rushes of 25 and 33 yards vs. the Bills.
- At MIA, 10/12, punter **Steve Weatherford** hit a 26-yard run for a first down on a fake punt.
- In the opener at HOU, 9/13, **Jones** posted a 38-yard touchdown run and a 39-yard run, again on consecutive carries.

# JETS NOTES

## RUNNING BACK THOMAS JONES

- In his 10th year, he has picked up 781 yards rushing (fourth in the AFC/eighth in NFL) and eight rushing touchdowns (tied for second in the AFC/tied for fourth in NFL).
- Posted three straight 100-yard rushing games (210 vs. BUF, 10/18; 121 at OAK, 10/25; 102 vs. MIA, 11/1), leading the NFL in that span (75-433, 5.8 yards per carry).
- Recorded four 100-yard games in 2009, 13 with the Jets, 29 in the regular season, 31 in his career.
- He rushed for 210 yards and a touchdown on 22 carries vs. BUF, 10/18, a Jets franchise record and a career high for Jones. He was named the *FedEx Ground Player of the Week* for this performance, which occurred in Week 6. Jones' previous career high was 173 yards rushing on 24 carries for ARI at SEA, 9/15/02.
- Jones ran for 121 yards and a touchdown on 26 carries at OAK, his second consecutive 100-yard game and third this season. Jones and **Shonn Greene** (144 yards) at OAK, were the first pair of Jets backs to rush for 100 yards in the same game since **Curtis Martin** (115 yards) and **LaMont Jordan** (115 yards) vs. MIA, 11/1/04.
- Jones' 71-yard touchdown run vs. BUF, 10/18, was the fifth-longest run in Jets history and the second-longest touchdown run in Jets history. Only **Bruce Harper's** 78-yard touchdown run vs. ATL, 10/23/83 (26 seasons ago) was longer. The 71-yard run was also the longest by a Jet since **Adrian Murrell** (brother of **Marques Murrell**) ran 78 yards at ARI, 10/27/96 (13 seasons ago).
- Jones posted 107 yards and two touchdowns on 20 carries in the opener at HOU, 9/13. He gained 106 yards in 15 carries in the second half for the best opening day of his career.
- Jones has scored two touchdowns twice this season (at HOU, 9/13; at MIA, 10/12) and has now scored two-or-more touchdowns in a regular season game 10 times, including five times as a Jet. The Jets are 12-6 in games where Jones scores a touchdown.
- Jones has played in 64 consecutive games, the longest active streak for a running back.
- Jones became the 40th RB to eclipse 8,000 yards rushing at NO, 10/4.

### ROOKIE RUNS TO THE END ZONE

Sanchez has shown the ability to make things happen by running the football so far this season.

He scored his third touchdown of the season vs. MIA, 11/1, walking into the end zone from one yard out after a beautiful play fake to **Thomas Jones** up the middle. He's the first Jets quarterback since **Richard Todd** in 1980 to run for as many as three touchdowns in one season.

He picked up his first NFL score on the opening drive of the game vs. TEN, 9/27, scoring on a 14-yard touchdown run on third-and-10, capping a 10-play, 73-yard scoring drive (5:20) to put the Jets ahead, 7-0.

The 14-yard touchdown run was the longest scoring run by a Jets quarterback since 10/27/80, when Todd ran 16 yards for a touchdown in a 17-14 victory over MIA at Shea Stadium on Monday Night Football, and fourth-longest scoring run by a quarterback in franchise history.

He picked up his second rushing touchdown of the season on a three-yard run at OAK.

- Completed 12-of-15 for 191 yards and a touchdown (141.0 passer rating) on third down, converting nine first downs. Ran seven yards for an additional first down on third down.
- Led the Jets on three possessions that exceeded seven minutes, a first for the Jets in 16 seasons (12/11/93 vs. WAS).

- Sanchez is the first Jets rookie quarterback to start a game in 32 seasons. The last time a Jets rookie QB started a game was 11/27/77, when **Matt Robinson** started for the Jets vs. PIT. The Jets lost that game, 23-20.
- The last Jets rookie QB to win his first start was **Richard Todd**, who beat BUF, 19-14, on 10/31/76. Todd threw for 87 yards on six-of-20 passing, one touchdown and two interceptions. The Jets defense caused five turnovers (three interceptions, two fumbles), got four sacks and a blocked punt for a touchdown. RB **Clark Gaines** rushed for 119 yards on 24 carries.

- In the history of the NFL, according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, only three quarterbacks have thrown for more yards than Sanchez when making their debut on opening weekend, and only one rookie (**Peyton Manning**) has done so.

## SHONN THE LIGHT ON GREENE

Rookie third-round pick **Shonn Greene** led the Jets with 144 yards rushing and two touchdowns on 19 carries at OAK, 10/25. He entered that game with seven carries for 30 yards.

- Greene's 144 yards represent the third-highest rushing total for a Jets rookie in franchise history. As a rookie, **Matt Snell** ran for 168 vs. OAK and 180 vs. HOU in back-to-back weeks in 1964.
- Greene is the sixth Jets rookie to rush for more than 100 yards in a game (11th time) and third since 1990. The roster: **Snell** - twice, 1964; **Clark Gaines** - four times, 1976; **Scott Dierking** - once, 1977; **Blair Thomas** - once, 1990; **Leon Washington** - twice, 2006.

## JERRICHO'S TIME

After leading the Jets in receptions the last two seasons, **Jerricho Cotchery** has paced the Jets in 2009 with 33 catches for 498 yards and two touchdowns. Cotchery was limited at MIA and inactive for games vs. BUF and at OAK (hamstring) before returning vs. MIA, 11/1 and posting three catches for 70 yards, including a 53-yard reception.

- In 2008, he posted 71 catches for 858 yards and five touchdowns (team-leading 12.1 yards per catch) last year, surpassing 70 receptions for the third straight season.
- Cotchery was the second WR in franchise history to record three consecutive 70-or-more catch seasons (**Keyshawn Johnson** - 1997, 98, 99) and the fourth to record at least three seasons of 70-or-more receptions (**Laveranues Coles** - 2002, 05, 06, 08 and **Al Toon** - 1986, 88, 91).

## KELLER A BIG TARGET AT TE

Second-year **TE Dustin Keller** has caught 29 passes for 347 yards and two touchdowns.

- Led the team with 8-76-1 vs. MIA, 11/1, including a 16-yard touchdown catch, his first score since Week 2.
- Caught a nine-yard touchdown pass from **Mark Sanchez** vs. NE, 9/20, the only touchdown of that game.
- At HOU, 9/13, he caught four passes for 94 yards from Sanchez, including a 40-yard catch-and-run, the Jets longest play of the game, on third down. He had two third-down receptions for 58 yards.

## BRAYLON BIG IN JETS DEBUT

The Jets traded for **Braylon Edwards** on 10/7, acquiring the fifth-year wideout from CLE in exchange for **WR Chansi Stuckey**, **LB Jason Trusnik** and two undisclosed draft picks. In four games with the Jets, Edwards has recorded 16 receptions for 271 yards and two touchdowns. On the season, including four games for CLE, Edwards has 26 receptions for 410 yards and two touchdowns.

- Immediately inserted into the starting lineup, Edwards led the team with five receptions for 64 yards and a touchdown at MIA, 10/12.
- His first catch as a Jet came on a three-yard touchdown reception from **Mark Sanchez** on the Jets opening drive at MIA to tie the score, 7-7.
- On the Jets first drive of the fourth quarter at MIA, Sanchez hit Edwards deep down the left sideline, a play that was originally ruled a touchdown but then reversed by replay and ruled down at the one-yard line, officially a 34-yard play.
- Later in the fourth quarter, Edwards drew a 49-yard pass interference penalty on **Will Allen** in the end zone, setting up a first-and-goal at the three-yard line. **Thomas Jones** scored on the next play to give the Jets a 27-24 lead.

## 'THE CLOWN' EMERGES

**WR David Clowney** has become a consistent target for **Mark Sanchez**, totalling 12 receptions for 174 yards and a touchdown.

- At MIA, 10/12, he grabbed four receptions for a team-high 72 yards, his first production of 2009. The highlight of that night for Clowney was a 53-yard reception on a pinpoint pass from Sanchez, getting behind two defenders.
- Clowney led the Jets at OAK, with four receptions for 79 yards, including his first career regular season touchdown reception, a 35-yarder from Sanchez in which he made a late adjustment to the ball in order to make the catch.
- Clowney, who has led the Jets in receiving the past two pre-seasons, entered the first MIA game with one career reception, a 26-yarder, 12/14/08 vs. BUF, from **Brett Favre**.



## JETS NOTES

### FIRST DOWN BY FAKE

At MIA, 10/12, the Jets executed two fake punts that led to scores:

- On fourth-and-six out of punt formation in the Jets opening drive, **P Steve Weatherford** ran for 26 yards and a first down. The run marked Weatherford's second carry of his career. He ran five yards for a first down for NO vs. CAR, 10/7/07. The last time the Jets had executed a fake punt for a first down, **Matt Turk** ran 14 yards vs. NE, 9/15/02.
- On a fourth-and-three out of a punt formation in the second quarter, **Brad Smith** ran for 12 yards and a first down. Smith was the upback before the snap. That play led to a 40-yard field goal.

At OAK, 10/25, Weatherford executed another fake punt. On fourth-and-seven from his own 23-yard line, the punter took the snap and drove up the middle for 16 yards and a first down on the last play of the first quarter.

### NOT JUST 'LUCKY' LARRY IZZO

**Larry Izzo**, signed by the Jets as a free agent in 2009, has played 13 seasons in the NFL since signing with MIA as an undrafted free agent out of Rice in 1996.

A three-time Pro Bowl selection on special teams in 2000, 2002 and 2004, Izzo has recorded 265 special teams tackles in 196 regular season games. In 13 seasons, five with Miami and eight with NE, Izzo remarkably has not had a losing season in his NFL career, winning three Super Bowl rings and participating in 21 postseason games.

## OVERVIEW BY POSITION

### Quarterbacks (4)

2009 first-round pick **Mark Sanchez**, who was named the starting quarterback on Aug. 26, has a 66.5 passer rating, going 130-of-244 passing for 1,655 yards, nine touchdowns and 12 interceptions as the Jets are 4-5. He was the first rookie quarterback since 1969 to win his first three starts. He is backed up by fourth-year man **Kellen Clemens**, a veteran of eight starts in 2007, was 10-of-18 for 89 yards, one touchdown and two interceptions in the 2009 preseason. Second-year man **Erik Ainge**, named a captain vs. TEN, 9/27, led the Jets in the preseason with 435 yards and four touchdown passes and **Kevin O'Connell**, a third-round pick of NE in 2008, who was acquired via trade with DET, 9/6. O'Connell was 12-for-26 for 108 yards and two interceptions for NE in the preseason. O'Connell was the third quarterback and named a captain vs. NE, 9/20.

### Running Backs (3)

With the loss of Leon Washington for the season with a broken leg at OAK that required season ending surgery, the Jets are led by a pair of veterans who have been to the Pro Bowl in **Thomas Jones** and **Tony Richardson**. Jones was voted to his first Pro Bowl in 2008, has gained 510 yards in the last four games, including a franchise-record 210 yards vs. BUF, in which he posted his career long rush, a 71-yard touchdown run. He has 781 yards rushing and eight touchdowns. Richardson has played in 211 regular season games, starting 121, earning three Pro Bowl berths. The fullback has blocked for seven 1,000-yard rushing seasons in his career (Thomas Jones, Adrian Peterson, Chester Taylor, Larry Johnson and Priest Holmes- 3). The Jets 2009 third-round choice (No. 65) **Shonn Greene**, the 2008 Doak Walker Award winner from Iowa, exploded for 144 yards on 19 carries at OAK, 10/25, scoring touchdowns on runs of 33 yards and eight yards, and added additional runs of 21 and 26. Greene total was the third-highest for a rookie in the history of the franchise.

### Wide Receivers (6)

**Jerricho Cotchery** leads the team with 33 grabs for 498 yards and two touchdowns. He has logged three consecutive 70-plus catch seasons and has 15 career touchdowns. He was inactive vs. BUF and at OAK (hamstring). Newly-acquired **Braylon Edwards** shined with five receptions for 64 yards and a touchdown (three yards) in his Jets debut at MIA and is 16-271-2 for the Jets. He was acquired from CLE, 10/7, in exchange for Chansi Stuckey, Jason Trusnik and two undisclosed draft picks. Fourth-year veteran **Brad Smith**, a versatile player who has lined up at receiver, running back and quarterback, took a snap in punt formation and gained 12 yards for a first down. Smith has logged five carries for 54 yards and four receptions for 41 yards in addition to five special teams tackles. **David Clowney**, who made his first-career start vs. BUF, has caught 12 passes for 174 yards and a touchdown. He caught four passes for 72 yards at MIA, including a Jets season-long 53-yarder. He caught his first touchdown, a 35-yarder, at OAK, when he led the team with four receptions for 79 yards. **Wallace Wright** caught his first passes since 2007 at OAK, 10/25, grabbing two for 21 yards. He also has recorded a team-leading 11 special teams tackles. **Danny Woodhead** made his NFL debut vs. BUF on special teams. He was converted to a wide receiver, 10/15, but ran the ball at OAK, gaining 24 yards on three carries, including a 16-yard run.

### Tight Ends (2)

Second-year man **Dustin Keller** (29-347-2) has posted two touchdowns this season, a nine-yarder vs. NE, 9/20, and a 16-yarder vs. MIA, 11/1. Keller led the Jets with eight catches for 76 yards and a touchdown vs MIA, 11/1. The Jets drafted Keller after trading up for the 30th pick in the first round in 2008. The Jets signed veteran **Ben Hartsock**, 9/3, after he was released by ATL. Hartsock caught his first career touchdown pass, a two-yarder from Sanchez, in the first quarter vs. TEN, 9/27. As a blocker, he has paved the way for three 1,000-yard rushers: Edgerrin James (2004 and 2005 for IND), LenDale White (2007 for TEN) and Michael Turner (2008 for ATL).

### Offensive Line (8)

The five starters have now started 25 straight games together, the longest current streak in the NFL. The line led the Jets to consecutive games over 300 yards rushing, the first time that has been accomplished in 34 seasons (BUF 1975). They followed up the 318 yards rushing vs. BUF (7.95 per carry) with 316 yards at OAK on 54 carries (5.85 ypc). **C Nick Mangold** was voted to his first Pro Bowl in 2008. The 29th overall pick in '06 from Ohio State has started 57 straight regular season games at center. **LG Alan Faneca**, voted to his eighth Pro Bowl in 2008, has started 178 career games, including 121 consecutive contests. **RG Brandon Moore**, originally signed as an undrafted free agent defensive lineman out of Illinois in 2002, converted to offense in 2003 and has started 82 consecutive regular season games at right guard. **LT D'Brickashaw Ferguson** was chosen as the second alternate for the Pro Bowl in 2008. The fourth-overall pick in 2006 from Virginia has started 57 straight regular season games at left tackle. **RT Damien Woody** started every game at right tackle for the Jets since signing in 2008. He has played in 153 games, earning 146 starts. He previously played four seasons for DET as a guard and tackle and his first six seasons as a center in NE, including a Pro Bowl season in 2002. Reserves include: **T Wayne Hunter**, who has lined up at right tackle and at the TE position, and **C/G Rob Turner**, who got the starting nod lining up at fullback for the first play at MIA, 10/12. Also providing depth is sixth-round pick **Matt Slauson** out of Nebraska, who played three different positions in college, and started all 13 games at right guard as a senior in 2008.



## OVERVIEW BY POSITION

### Defensive Line (6)

**Marques Douglas** and **Shaun Ellis** lead this unit that lost four-time Pro Bowler Kris Jenkins for the season with a knee injury sustained vs. BUF, 10/18. Minus Ellis in the opener at HOU, the Jets limited the Texans to 38 yards rushing on 13 carries (2.9 yards per carry). The Jets also held the MIA second-ranked rushing attack to 52 yards on 23 carries, 11/1. Douglas has logged 37 tackles, including nine vs. BUF, four tackles-for-loss and 1.5 sacks. Ellis recorded two sacks vs. MIA, 11/1. He sat out the opener at HOU due to suspension. In his 10th season, he has played in 148 games, the most by a Jets defensive lineman. **Mike DeVito**, who has a league-high three fumble recoveries, registered his first at HOU, 9/13, catching a ball 20 yards downfield after it was jarred loose from HOU RB Steve Slaton by Donald Strickland. DeVito returned that one seven yards. At the nose, **Sione Pouha**, seeing increased playing time with the injury to Jenkins, has posted 36 tackles on the season. Veteran nose tackle **Howard Green** has 14 tackles and **Ropati Pitoitua**, signed as an undrafted free agent in May 2008, made his NFL debut at HOU and has recorded three tackles this season.

### Linebackers (10)

Veterans **Bryan Thomas** and **Calvin Pace** start on the outside, while third-year man **David Harris** and **Bart Scott**, who are first and second, respectively in tackles on the Jets, man the inside. Pace, who missed the first four games due to suspension, broke out for a career-high three sacks, including two forced fumbles and led the team with eight tackles at OAK, 10/25. He leads the team with four sacks. Thomas started in Pace's spot the first four games. He has recorded 40 tackles, a forced fumble, one sack, four TFL, two passes defended and eight QB hits. Scott has had a sack, eight QB hits, eight tackles-for-loss to go with 68 tackles, which included a team-leading nine vs. TEN. Third-year man Harris leads the Jets with 89 tackles and 3.5 sacks, a forced fumble, two passes defended and an INT. He posted 12 tackles, adding a sack (eight yards), a deflected pass and two total QB hits in the win at HOU, 9/13 when he earned AFC Defensive Player of the Week. **Vernon Gholston** registered three tackles and a tackle-for-loss in his first-career start at HOU and has compiled 12 tackles, one TFL and one quarterback hit this season. On the outside, **Marques Murrell** has two tackles, one for a loss, and a QB hit and has added 10 special teams tackles. Veteran special-teamer **Larry Izzo** has recovered two fumbles on punt coverage and has chipped in 11 special teams tackles and one tackle on defense. Rutgers product **Jamaal Westerman** signed with the Jets as an undrafted free agent in 2009, registered two tackles and his first sack on Matt Schaub at HOU, a 13-yard loss, in his NFL debut. Westerman has four special teams tackles and recovered a fumble on a punt return vs. MIA, 11/1. **Ryan Fowler**, who was signed as a free agent, 9/8, has one special teams tackle. **Kenwin Cummings**, a 2008 rookie free agent who spent most of the last season-and-a-half on the Jets practice squad, was signed to the 53-man roster, 11/16.

### Defensive Backs (11)

Highlighted by a pair of cornerbacks that were drafted in the first round and have earned Pro Bowl recognition, **Darrelle Revis** and new acquisition **Lito Sheppard**, when healthy, start alongside safeties **Kerry Rhodes** and newcomer **Jim Leonhard**. Revis snared his first interception of the season from Tom Brady, and limited Randy Moss to 4-24 vs. NE, 9/20. He was matched up against Pro Bowl WR Andre Johnson at HOU, 9/13, holding Johnson to 4-35, earning a game ball. He held Marques Colston to 2-33 at NO and Terrell Owens to 3-13 vs. BUF. He also intercepted JaMarcus Russell at OAK. Revis has recorded 47 tackles and 15 passes defended. Sheppard was acquired by the Jets in Feb. 2009 in a trade with PHI. He was been inactive for five of six games before returning vs. JAC. He registered his 19th career interception on Matt Schaub in the fourth quarter at HOU, 9/13. Rhodes, in his fifth year, has recorded 43 tackles, eight quarterback hits and five passes defended. Leonhard, who recorded his first interception of the season at OAK, has posted 58 tackles, six tackles-for-loss, five passes defended, 1.5 sacks and a QB hit. He also chipped in with a 37-yard punt return vs. TEN. **CB Donald Strickland** has posted 16 tackles, three pass breakups, one QB hit, one tackle-for-loss and one forced fumble this season. He was inactive for four contests (ankle) before returning at OAK, 10/25. Strickland jarred the ball loose from HOU RB Steve Slaton, a fumble that was recovered by Mike DeVito. Later in that game, he hit Matt Schaub as he was throwing, causing the ball to be intercepted by Sheppard. **CB Dwight Lowery**, who made his first 2009 start at TEN, 9/27, has 29 tackles, six passes defended, including a fourth-down pass breakup against NE in the final defensive play of the game. He recovered the fumble caused by Bryan Thomas at NO and intercepted Ryan Fitzpatrick vs. BUF. Versatile safety **Eric Smith**, who can play a number of positions in this defense, recorded five tackles, three QB hits and two pass breakups, including a diving pass breakup on fourth down to end a Texans drive at HOU, 9/13. Smith received a game ball for his play vs. TEN, which included four tackles and an interception. Smith has logged a team-leading 13 special teams tackles. **S James Ihedigbo** has recorded 10 special teams tackles. **CB Drew Coleman** has registered eight tackles and two passes defended, along with six special teams tackles this season. **CB Marquice Cole**, re-signed, 9/22, made his NFL debut vs. TEN, has recorded four special teams tackles and a QB hit on defense. The Jets re-signed veteran **CB/KR Justin Miller** 10/27. Miller has returned five kickoffs for a 23.0 avg.

### Specialists (3)

Ninth-year **K Jay Feely** is 16-of-18 on field goals this season, including a team-record tying 55-yarder vs. MIA, 11/1. He had a franchise record 24 straight FG made over the last two seasons. Veteran **P Steve Weatherford**, who was signed, 9/7/09, has hit 45 punts for a 41.9 average and 37.7 net, with 14 punts inside-the-20. He has executed two successful fake punts with runs of 26 yards at MIA and 16 yards at OAK. **LS James Dearth** has appeared in 137 consecutive games over nine seasons.



## JETS IN THE COMMUNITY

The New York Jets take great pride in playing an active role in making a year-round commitment to the tri-state community.

Programs funded by the **New York Jets Foundation** touch the lives of countless young men and women in the tri-state area. Over the past nine years, the Jets and their charitable foundation have raised or contributed more than \$9 million to promote youth health, fitness and education, particularly in disadvantaged communities. From fighting childhood obesity through the *Generation Jets: Be Lean & Green* initiative to launching a foot-



ball team in an urban high school, urging students to eat right and move more, and supporting the efforts of the *Alliance for Lupus Research*, the New York Jets invest in programs that make a difference in the lives of others. In addition to the Jets Foundation, which supports our

own extensive youth initiatives, the Jets partner with numerous established charitable organizations and participate in causes sponsored by the NFL.

### Alliance for Lupus Research

The New York Jets organization is deeply committed to supporting the *Alliance for Lupus Research (ALR)*, an independent nonprofit organization dedicated to raising the profile of lupus and the scope of lupus research. The ALR was founded in 1999 through the vision of **Woody Johnson** and the support of the *Arthritis Foundation*. The ALR has one mission: to prevent, treat and cure lupus through research.

Since 2001, the New York Jets have raised more than \$6 million for the ALR through *Walk With Us To Cure Lupus* events throughout the tri-state area as well as proceeds from the Jets' annual kickoff luncheon.

### Eat Right, Move More

Launched in 2006, the *Eat Right, Move More* campaign is a joint effort between the Jets, the New Jersey Department of Agriculture and the American Dairy Association & Dairy Council, Inc.'s *Fuel Up to Play 60* campaign to encourage New Jersey school children to take advantage of healthy foods in their school cafeterias and become more active. The campaign also challenges schools to submit their meal menus to determine the six schools with the most creative meal selections each year. One of the six winning schools will be awarded the grand prize of a \$5,000 grant, sponsored in part by the American Dairy Association & Dairy Council, Inc., for a cafeteria makeover and be recognized on field at a Jets home game. Jets tackle **D'Brickashaw Ferguson** is featured on posters in every NJ school telling students, "Eating helping meals helps me play my best. Your school cafeteria has a variety of nutritious foods to keep you going all day long. So get up, eat right and move more!"

### Heads Up

In 2001 the New York Jets formed a community partnership with the Public Schools Athletic League (PSAL) to provide support to New York City public school football programs. The Jets

and the PSAL expanded this partnership in 2005 and titled it *Heads Up!* Through an annual matching grant from the NFL's Youth Football Fund, the New York Jets donate \$100,000 to the PSAL's football programs. This grant has helped to create nine new and developmental football teams and expand the C.H.A.M.P.S. Middle School Flag Football League to over 75 programs throughout the New York City public school system.

Beyond these grants, the Jets continue to support the PSAL in a variety of other ways. Beginning with the 2009-10 school year, the Jets will award a \$5,000 college scholarship to a PSAL athlete that excels on the field and in the classroom. In addition to providing funding, the Jets' support for the PSAL has included hosting PSAL high school football coaches at team practices, creating "Captains' Day" for PSAL football team captains to spend a day at training camp each summer, and honoring PSAL football champions at a selected home game during the NFL season.

### Play 60

Designed to tackle childhood obesity, *NFL Play 60* is national youth health and fitness campaign that brings together the NFL's long-standing commitment to health and fitness with an impressive roster of partner organizations—*Action for Healthy Kids, Ad Council, American Heart Association, National Dairy Council, Nickelodeon, United Way*, and the *U.S. Department of Health and Human Services*. *NFL Play 60: The NFL Movement for an Active Generation* will focus on the health and wellness of young fans by encouraging them to be active for at least 60 minutes a day. In addition to national PSAs and online programs, Play 60 will also be implemented locally, as part of the NFL's in-school, after-school and team-based programs, from youth football to the *Play 60 Challenge*. The *Play 60 Challenge* is an in school curriculum sponsored by the National Football League, American Heart Association and locally by the American Dairy Association & Dairy Council, Inc.'s *Fuel Up to Play 60* campaign. The Jets launched the initiative in 2006 and **Brad Smith** serves as the spokesperson.

### School Food

Beginning in 2004 the New York Jets partnered with the *New York City Department of Education's SchoolFood* program in an effort to encourage all New York City public school students to eat healthy and take advantage of the nutritious meals that are served throughout the schools.

Through the SchoolFood program the Jets support an outreach campaign to encourage parents to submit school meal applications and help increase the amount of students who take advantage of free and reduced-price meals in New York City's public schools. The campaign also aims to educate parents and children about the nutritional reforms taking place in public school cafeterias, where a variety of healthy meals now are included on the menu. The campaign includes posters encouraging students to eat healthy foods and stay fit as well as a Jets a sponsored sweepstakes for a trip to the Pro Bowl.





## NEW JETS STADIUM - OPENING 2010

For 50 years, the Jets – the fans, the players, the organization – have been tenants in each of the stadiums in which the team has played its home games. In 2010, for the first time in Jets history, the team will have a stadium they can call home, a stadium that on Jets gamedays will bleed green. From the external LED signage to four massive video boards inside the bowl, to the new plaza and tailgating options, there will be no doubt that this building is the home of the Jets.

Getting to the game will be easier than ever with triple the amount of roadways

and a brand new rail stop just outside one of the entrances to the building, opening for the 2009 season.

Once at the stadium, fans will have many options for entertainment and tailgating before the game begins. The pregame radio show will be broadcast live from the new plaza area, where fans can also enjoy a vast array of food and shop for the newest Jets gear. At an entrance at the 50-yard line, fans will experience the Great Hall, a massive display of images of Jets greats past and present.

Inside the building, there will be wider concourses, eight times the number of concession stands and three times the number of restrooms than in the current building, offering fans options and convenience throughout the game. The intimate bowl seating, uncompromised sidelines, cutting-edge video boards and LED signage and state-of-the-art sound systems will

enhance the game-watching experience.

One of the biggest upgrades in the new stadium is the availability of club seats. These offer the best seats in the stadium with unbelievable access un-

like anything available in lower-level and mezzanine-level clubs in sports venues. There are two types of clubs in the new building — the East and West Clubs, located on the mezzanine level sideline and the Coaches Club and the Great Hall Club, located on the east and west sides in the lower bowl between the 30-yard lines. Club seats offer access to VIP reserved parking, a private club entrance into the stadium as well as a host of other amenities and benefits. ## **Scobee's FG as time expires lifts Jags over Jets**

EAST RUTHERFORD, N.J. - EAST RUTHERFORD, N.J. (AP) — Jack Del Rio took Maurice Jones-Drew aside on Jacksonville's sideline and drew up the winning game plan for the Jaguars.

"I told him that when he popped free to stop on the 1," the Jaguars coach said, "and take the air out of this game."

And possibly the New York Jets' playoff hopes.

Jones-Drew took a handoff from the 10 and had a clear path to the end zone, but took a knee at the 1 to keep the clock ticking and set up Josh Scobee's 21-yard field goal that gave the Jaguars a 24-22 victory Sunday.

"Sorry to my fantasy owners," Jones-Drew deadpanned. "I apologize. I had myself today. It was a tough call, but whatever it takes to get the victory, that's what counts."

Jacksonville (5-4) has won two in a row and three of its last four to remain in the playoff conversation.

"I didn't want to be the one to just go out there and score," said Jones-Drew, who has 12 TDs. "I wanted to be the one to seal the victory."

Meanwhile, the Jets (4-5) have lost five of their last six following a 3-0 start, and travel to AFC East-leading New England next week.

"We have no excuses," Jets coach Rex Ryan said. "I know we have a good football team and I believe that. I know hearing me say that each week is getting old if we're going to lose, but this is a good football team and we're not dead yet."

With the Jaguars facing second-and-6 from the 10, Jones-Drew took a handoff up the middle and then stopped and knelt to give Jacksonville first-and-goal from the 1 with about 1½ minutes left.

"Smartest play of the game," said Jets quarterback Mark Sanchez, who curiously read from a prepared statement before taking questions. "That's an MVP play right there."

It reminded Jaguars quarterback David Garrard of when Philadelphia's Brian Westbrook also took a knee at the 1 to seal a late-season win over Dallas in 2007.

"There are a lot of questions to be asked about what if this doesn't go right, or that doesn't go right?" Garrard said. "Everything went right, so we can smile on the way back to Jacksonville."

New York had no timeouts left, and the Jets' offense could only watch from the sideline as time melted away. Garrard took a knee on the next two plays, giving Scobee the opportunity to kick the winner and make up for an earlier 49-yard miss.

"It came down to the last drive and that's why you play the game," Garrard said. "Hopefully, that will give us the confidence moving forward knowing that we can go down in two or three minutes and score points on anybody."

The Jets came out of their bye week making the same mis-

takes that plagued them in the first eight games.

"Now we're 4-5 and we're not impressive," wide receiver Braylon Edwards said. "We're not scaring anybody."

Thomas Jones gave the Jets a 22-21 lead on a 1-yard touchdown dive with 5:04 remaining. It capped a 16-play drive that included three third-down conversions and a fourth-and-1 conversion. New York went for the 2-point attempt, but Edwards dropped the pass when he was hit hard.

Given a lead, the Jets' defense, which came in ranked No. 2 overall, couldn't hold it.

"Maybe we're not one of the best defenses in the league," a smug Bart Scott said.

New York's defense had trouble tackling in the first half, allowing Jacksonville to gain 250 yards. With the game on the line in the fourth quarter, the Jets allowed a 15-yard catch by Mike Thomas and a 33-yard grab by Mercedes Lewis on consecutive plays to help set up Scobee's kick.

"For the defense we think we are, we needed to make that last stop and get the win," safety Jim Leonhard said.

Jones-Drew had 123 yards and a TD on 24 carries, becoming the first player to rush for 100 or more yards against the Jets this season. Garrard was 16 of 26 for 221 yards and a touchdown to Mike Sims-Walker, and also ran for a score.

The Jets didn't get off to the start they were looking for when Sanchez was intercepted by Rashean Mathis on New York's first play.

"It might as well have been a pick-6," Sanchez said. "That's the way you feel as a quarterback and that's the way you look at the game."

Jacksonville took advantage immediately, giving the ball to Jones-Drew five straight times with the final carry a 33-yard scamper up the middle for a touchdown.

## **Last-second field goal lifts Jags over Jets**

EAST RUTHERFORD – It looked like a potentially stirring victory for the Jets.

But the Jacksonville offense had other ideas. David Garrard completed four of four passes for 68 yards to set up Josh Scobee's 21-yard field goal as time expired, giving Jacksonville a 24-22 victory over the Jets at Giants Stadium on Sunday.

The Jaguars (5-4) reached the 14-yard-line on Garrard's 33-yard pass to tight end Mercedes Lewis, who beat free safety Kerry Rhodes over the middle. Maurice Jones-Drew's 9-yard run to the 1 set up the field goal. Jones-Drew went down on purpose to set up the kick, and deprive the Jets of a chance to get the ball back. The Jets (4-5) have lost five of their last six games.

On the previous drive, the Jets had a fourth-and-1 at the Jacksonville 15-yard-line with perhaps their season on the line. But instead of running into the line, the Jets used a pitchout to the left side to Shonn Greene. He took it 14 yards to the 1 before being bumped out of bounds. Thomas Jones leaped over on the next play to put the Jets ahead with 5:04 to go.

Jones' score gave the Jets a 22-21 lead, but the attempted two-point conversion pass to Braylon Edwards was broken up. That proved to be the difference in the game.

The Jets had cut their deficit to 21-16 on Jay Feely's 40-yard field goal 21 seconds into the fourth quarter.

The Jaguars twice blew a sure touchdown on one bizarre sequence in the third quarter. Defensive end Quentin Groves picked off a short screen pass by Mark Sanchez and had a clear path to the end zone, but clearly laboring, he tripped himself up and was touched down by Jerricho Cotchery at the 4-yard-line for a 37-yard return. Jones-Drew almost scored on the next play, but was stopped a half-yard short of the goal line by Darrelle Revis and Kerry Rhodes.

This proved to be significant when David Garrard and running back Jones-Drew didn't handle the exchange on the handoff cleanly on second-and-goal. The ball popped loose and Mike DeVito recovered for the Jets at the 3. But the Jets gave the ball back when Edwards, on only his second catch of the game, was stripped of the ball by Rashean Mathis at the Jets' 45 and John Henderson recovered for the Jaguars at the Jacksonville 47.

The Jets' first offensive play of the game set up Jacksonville's first touchdown. Sanchez tried to throw deep to Jerricho Cotchery, but the pass was underthrown and cornerback Mathis picked it off. Mathis returned it 29 yards to the Jaguars' 45-yard-line.

Five plays later, on third-and-2 from the 33, Jones-Drew went off left tackle for a 33-yard score, his 12th rushing touchdown of the season. That gave Jacksonville a 7-0 lead 3:04

into the game.

The Jets answered with scores on their next two drives. First, Feely's 32-yard field goal capped a short 30-yard drive after the Jaguars' onside kickoff went out of bounds. Then, after Scobee's 49-yard field-goal try bounded off the left goalpost, the Jets went 61 yards in only five plays, with Sanchez connecting with Cotchery for a 7-yard touchdown for a 10-7 lead.

But Jacksonville responded quickly, and regained the lead on quarterback Garrard's 11-yard scramble 4:08 into the second quarter. The Jaguars extended their lead to 21-10 on their next drive, as Garrard hit Mike Sims-Walker on a short slant pattern that turned into a 26-yard touchdown. The key play occurred on fourth-and-4 from the 34. Garrard threw a short pass to Mike Thomas, who evaded a potential tackle by Donald Strickland and gained 7 yards on the play.

The Jets cut the deficit to 21-13 on Feely's 37-yard field goal with 36 seconds left in the half.

And when the Jets weren't supposed to tackle Jones-Drew, they did. Go figure.

**Politi: NY Jets talked a good game before they played a few, and it's cost them**

The brash new coach was not talking about shaking hands with the President after his latest defeat.

"We're barely breathing," Rex Ryan said.

The star linebacker was not filling notebooks with colorful boxing analogies to describe this overhyped defense.

"Maybe," Bart Scott said, "we're not one of the best defenses in the league."

The veteran safety? The one who hoped to humiliate the powerhouse Patriots a few weeks ago?

"We're 4-5," Kerry Rhodes said. "That's not good."

This 24-22 Jets loss to a second-rate Jacksonville team didn't just end any realistic playoff chances for this team. It knocked the chip of the Jets' shoulders and stomped it into the Giants Stadium turf.

Let this be the lesson learned from the 2009 Jets, the words chiseled onto the latest tombstone in a graveyard filled with four decades of failures: You have to earn your bravado in the NFL.

Swagger cannot be installed like a new offensive system in this league. It must be proven, over a full season and probably much longer, before anyone should take it seriously.

The Jets tried to do it backward, like they always do, trying to talk a good game before they played a few. It almost seemed prophetic when they were rolling along at 3-0, but it looked downright silly after the fifth loss in the last six games.

Those brash-talking days were just a month ago, but they might as well have been from a grainy NFL Films video. The rest of the league is giggling at their dramatic fall, but they're speechless.

"Gotta watch the film," Scott, the so-called Mad Backer himself, said when asked to assess the latest loss.

A couple of months ago, Scott was comparing his defense to a championship boxer with the way the Jets had knocked around New England quarterback Tom Brady. Now he was offering up the lamest loser clichés.

"I'm a little upset right now," Scott said. "I'm trying not to say anything inflammatory."

Well, that's a switch.

These Jets were colorful and loud, brash and fun. Ryan was the anti-Mangini who called out opposing players and called fans at home and told them to be loud. Mark Sanchez ran down the field with his arms in the air, christened the new Joe Namath before he got through September.

Who didn't eat that up? We in the media sure did. The talk was mostly harmless, and hey, they seemed to back it up.

We should have known better. They probably should have known better. It is one thing to talk like a champion, but it is entirely something else to actually become one.

The hotshot rookie quarterback was exposed. The tough-talking head coach looked worn and beaten.

The vaunted defense had been utterly emasculated, forced to stand back and let Jacksonville score a late touchdown to get the ball back for the offense.

And, in what will go down as the perfect Same Old Jets moment for 2009, it even failed at that.

"Please score!" the Jets begged, and the Jags countered, "No thanks." Maurice Jones-Drew broke through the indifferent defense and smartly took a knee at the 1-yard line, allowing his team to burn off the final two minutes on the clock before kicking the winning field goal.

It might have been the smart decision to win the game, but it went against everything this defense was built on, and the players seemed stunned. The first time they tried, Jones-Drew was tackled after a 4-yard gain.

"It's tough to tell somebody, 'Let them score,'" linebacker Calvin Pace said. "I can't think of a situation even in my career that's been said."

But it was that kind of day. The Jets had to win this one for a chance at the playoffs. They knew it, too. The coach all but announced it to the world. "We just spent all our room for error," Ryan said. "It's ridiculous."

His team has done just about everything wrong in the past few weeks, and it was much of the same against the Jaguars.

The defense let Jones-Drew get free for one big run after another in the first half. Sanchez, the rounded shoulders of defeat replacing his Namath cool, had two more interceptions. Braylon Edwards seems intent on proving that the one thing the Browns have done right this season was trading him away, dropping a two-point conversion and fumbling the ball after a potentially game-changing catch.

The bravado, it turns out, was the last thing to go. Ryan looked clearly humbled as he came to the podium after the game, lamely thanking the crowd for doing its part when, mostly, it just booed.

"We expect to win this game," the coach said of the upcoming trip to New England, but he sure sounded less convincing that he did a month ago. That handshake with the President is on hold.

- This was the 39th regular season meeting with this franchise. The Jets now trail, 21-17-1 in the series.
- **Rex Ryan's** 3-0 start as Jets head coach is the second-best start by a Jets head coach. **Al Groh** started 4-0 in 2000, his only year as Jets head coach.

On the opening drive of the game, **Mark Sanchez** scored on a 14-yard touchdown run on third-and-10, capping a 10-play, 73-yard scoring drive (5:20) to put the Jets ahead, 7-0.

- The 14-yard touchdown run was the longest scoring run by a Jets quarterback since 10/27/80, when **Richard Todd** ran 16 yards for a touchdown in a 17-14 victory over MIA at Shea Stadium on Monday Night Football, and fourth-longest scoring run by a quarterback in franchise history.

The Jets allowed their first offensive touchdown of 2009 with 9:24 remaining in the second quarter on a five-yard scoring run by **LenDale White**.

- The Jets held opponents (at HOU, NE, TEN) out of the end zone on offense for nine quarters to start the 2009 season.
- The last time the Jets held opponents for nine quarters was in Nov. 2000. (11/12 at IND, 11/19 at MIA, 11/26 vs. CHI).

In the first quarter, the Jets controlled the ball for 12:01 (23 plays for 128 yards, nine first downs, two touchdowns), while the Titans ran six plays for five yards, no first downs (2:59 time of possession) as the Jets ended the quarter with a 14-0 lead.

The Jets' defense forced **Kerry Collins** to throw 13 consecutive incompletions to end the game. His last completion came on a nine-yard TD pass to **WR Nate Washington** with 11:34 remaining in the third quarter.

## JETS WEEK 2 NOTES

### NOTES FROM THE RADAR

Lange compiled the following after the Jets' 16-9 win vs. NE:

- NE was held to only three **Stephen Gostkowski** field goals in the first half. Thus the Patriots went 0-for-3 in red zone touchdowns, ending a 16-game streak against the Jets of the Pats scoring at least one red zone touchdown.
- The Jets put together a two-game win streak without giving up a defensive touchdown for the first time since 1993. As for giving up no touchdowns on defense and one total in the first two games of a season, the Jets have never allowed fewer than two touchdowns in their first two games in franchise history (1964, 1994, 2000).
- The defense posted two three-and-out series in the Patriots' 11 drives today. In **Tom Brady's** previous four games against the Jets, dating to 2006 and covering 38 series, the Pats were held to only one three-and-out.
- The Jets opened 2-0 for the ninth time in franchise history. Only the 1968 Super Bowl team and the 2004 team that lost at Pittsburgh in the AFC Divisional Round made it to the playoffs after such a start.
- This was only the second time in the last 28 regular season and postseason games (since 2006) that Tom Brady completed less than 50 percent of his passes (23-for-47). The only other time: 12/3/07, at BAL. Against the Rex Ryan-coached Ravens defense, Brady was 18-for-38 (47.4 percent).

### WEEK 2 GAME NOTES

- Off to a 2-0 start for the ninth time in franchise history.
- Last started 2-0 in 2004, when they won their first five games en route to a 10-6 record.
- The Jets now lead the regular season series, 50-47-1 and the overall series, 50-49-1.
- The Jets snapped an eight-game losing streak to the Patriots at the Meadowlands. The Jets last beat the Patriots at home, 9/11/00, 20-19.
- **Mark Sanchez** is the first Jets rookie quarterback to win the first two starts of his career.
- **Rex Ryan** is the third Jets coach in franchise history to win the first two games of his head coaching career with the Jets. **Pete Carroll** won his first two in 1994 and finished 6-10; **Al Groh** won his first four in 2000 and finished 9-7. Both Carroll and Groh coached the Jets for one season.
- The Jets have not allowed an offensive touchdown in two consecutive games for the first time in 16 seasons, according to the Elias Sports Bureau. The last time the Jets did not allow an offensive touchdown in at least two straight games: 11/28, 12/5 and 12/11 in 1993. They won at NE, 6-0, 11/28/93; lost to IND, 9-6, 12/5/93 and won at WAS, 3-0, 12/11/93.
- The Jets held the Patriots to 0-for-3 in the red zone. The last time NE was 0-for-3 or more in the red zone, according to the Elias Sports Bureau, was 10/26/03 vs. CLE.
- **Darrelle Revis'** interception of **Tom Brady** in the first quarter was his first of the season, ninth of his career and second on Brady. Revis also intercepted Brady, 12/16/07 at Foxboro.
- **Dustin Keller** caught a nine-yard touchdown pass from **Mark Sanchez** with 13:57 left in the third quarter (three plays, 56 yards, 1:03). The play marked the fourth touchdown of Keller's career and second touchdown pass of Sanchez's career.
- **Leon Washington** finished the game with 20 touches for 203 combined yards, the fifth time in his career he has surpassed the 200-yard mark in a regular season game in his career, and third time against NE.
- **Jay Feely** scored 10 points on 3-for-3 field goals and an extra point. He is 4-of-4 this season and has converted his last 18 consecutive field goal attempts dating back to the 2008 season, the third-longest streak in Jets history.
