BILLS HOST PATRIOTS AT THE RALPH

The Buffalo Bills will host the New England Patriots this week on Sunday, December 20th at 1:00 PM ET at Ralph Wilson Stadium in Orchard Park, NY.

With a win on Sunday, the Bills will:

- **Win their first game against New England since 2003 (Week 1, 31-0 at home)**
- **Finish the 2009 season 3-3 in AFC East division games**



In Week 14 at Kansas City, Buffalo held on to a 16-10 win as the team's defense intercepted Chiefs QB Matt Cassel four times in the second half. Bills RBs Fred Jackson and Marshawn Lynch combined for 183 yards rushing. WR Terrell Owens scored the team's lone touchdown of the game on a nine-yard pass from QB Ryan Fitzpatrick in the first quarter.

The Bills will travel to face the Atlanta Falcons next week in their final road game of the season on Sunday, December 27th at 1:00 PM ET, at the Georgia Dome.

BILLS ON DECEMBER 20th

This week's game will be the seventh time that the Bills have played on December 20th. The last game Buffalo played on December 20th was in 1997 against the Green Bay Packers; the Bills lost that game 21-31.

The Bills record is 2-4 in games played on December 20th. The Bills have faced the Patriots twice before on this date, and have split the series, tied at one game apiece.

50 YEARS OF OWNERSHIP

On October 28, 1959, Ralph Wilson, Jr. was awarded the seventh franchise by the American Football League.

The 2009 season of Buffalo Bills football marks the 50th year for the franchise and 50 years of ownership by Ralph Wilson, Jr.

The Buffalo Bills are the only original American Football League team to have remained in their originating city with their original owner.

THE RALPH

Opened on August 17, 1973, the Buffalo Bills welcomed fans into their new home - Ralph Wilson Stadium.

Over the course of its 36-year existence, Ralph Wilson Stadium has played host to some of the NFL's most memorable games and ranks as one of the oldest stadiums in the NFL.

Given the nickname 'The Ralph', Ralph Wilson Stadium is the seventh oldest stadium in the NFL.

The Bills' 2009 draft class produced seven members of the opening day roster: DE **Aaron Maybin**, OL **Eric Wood**, DB **Jairus Byrd**, OL **Andy Levitre**, TE **Shawn Nelson**, LB **Nic Harris** and DB **Ellis Lankster**.

Buffalo added LB **Chris Draft**, DB **Todd Johnson**, OL **Kendall Simmons**, OL **Christian Gaddis**, DL **Corey Mace** and OL **Andre Ramsey** during the season to their roster.

BILLS-MILITARY CONNECTIONS

- Owner/President **Ralph C. Wilson Jr.** is a veteran of the Navy and served in World War II.
- Head Certified Athletic Trainer **Bud Carpenter** served four years in the Air Force and attended the Defense Language Institute in Monterey, Ca. He served as a Russian linguist while on active duty.
- QB **Trent Edwards'** father, Andy, served in the military during the Vietnam War. During the Vietnam War, Andy flew reconnaissance missions while looking for threats to the United States soldiers both in the water as submarines and on-land infantry units. His maternal grandfather was awarded the Navy Cross for Valor. He shot down several Japanese planes during the bombing of Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941.
- Linebacker **Paul Posluszny** visited United States troops overseas during a 10-day trip in February 2008. Posluszny toured several US military bases in Iraq where he watched the Super Bowl with soldiers.
- WR **Josh Reed's** brother, Norbert, is in the Army and has served overseas in Iraq.
- Defensive end **Chris Ellis** was born into a military family and spent the first three months of his life in Hawaii before moving to Hampton, Va.
- Cornerback **Drayton Florence's** sister, Lakisha Chavis, is currently stationed in Kabul, Afghanistan with the U.S. Army.

BET YOU DIDN'T KNOW...

The Bills became the second team in the NFL this season, joining Dallas (Week Five at KC) to win a road game after trailing by 10 or more points in the second half against the Jets in Week Six (trailed 13-3).

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

LAST GAME - BILLS 16, CHIEFS 10

December 13, 2009 – Arrowhead Stadium – 68,668

Four interceptions in the second half by Buffalo's defense and a strong performance by RBs Fred Jackson and Marshawn Lynch were enough to push the Bills to a 16-10 victory over the Kansas City Chiefs.

Buffalo's defense helped set the tone early as they forced the Chiefs to a three-and-out on their opening drive. On the Bills' second possession QB Ryan Fitzpatrick was sacked and fumbled the ball inside Buffalo's 10-yard line. The Chiefs looked like they would score going for it on fourth and one at Buffalo's one yard line but was unsuccessful as DE Aaron Schobel sacked Chiefs' QB Matt Cassel for a loss of seven yards and a turnover on downs, setting up the Bills first and only touchdown of the game.

Lynch broke away for a 47-yard run to put the Bills in position. Fitzpatrick connected with WR Terrell Owens for a nine-yard touchdown pass as Owens reached across the pylon to give the Bills a 7-0 lead. On their ensuing drive, the Chiefs drove down the field but Buffalo's defense held them to kick a 21-yard field goal making the score 7-3. Before heading into halftime, the Bills put together a drive that gave them a 10-3 lead as K Rian Lindell made a 41-yard field goal.

To begin the second half, both teams exchanged a pair of interceptions. After finding a spark in its offense, Buffalo put together a six-minute drive that ended with a Lindell 24-yard field goal to give the Bills a 10-point lead, 13-3. Kansas City answered back on the first play of their ensuing drive as RB Jamaal Charles broke away for a 76-yard rushing touchdown to pull the Chiefs within three, 13-10.

Buffalo's defense had a strong fourth quarter as they intercepted Cassel three times during the Chiefs final three drives. The Bills converted another three points after a LB Paul Posluszny interception.

Fitzpatrick went on to complete 12-of-20 pass attempts for 86 yards, an interception, and a touchdown. Jackson rushed 20 times for 99 yards while Lynch ran 12 times for 84 yards.

Defensively, Bryan Scott lead the team in tackles with 10 and also had a sack and a tipped pass that led to DB Jairus Byrd's interception. This was Byrd's ninth interception and set a team rookie record for interceptions in a season, and currently leads the NFL.

LAST MEETING - BILLS 24, PATRIOTS 25

Monday, September 14, Gillette Stadium - 68,756

The Buffalo Bills kicked off their 2009 season on Monday Night Football with a 24-25 loss to the New England Patriots at Gillette Stadium in Foxboro, MA.

Buffalo rookie tight end Shawn Nelson put the Bills on the board late in the first quarter when he caught an 11-yard pass from QB Trent Edwards and leaped over the pylon into the end zone to put the Bills ahead 7-0. Nelson finished the game with two receptions for a total of 13 yards. For the game, Edwards was 15 of 25 for 212 yards and two touchdowns.

Halfway through the second quarter, Patriots QB Tom Brady led his offense downfield to end the drive with RB Fred Taylor rushing into the end zone to tie the game at seven. The Patriots would try to charge back to take the lead after a Buffalo punt until Brady's screen down the middle intended for RB Sammy Morris was intercepted by Bills DE Aaron Schobel. Schobel returned the pick 26 yards before being tackled in the end zone to give the Bills a 14-10 lead going into the half. The play marked the 15th time in Schobel's career that he's faced Brady and 12.0 career sacks on the all-pro quarterback.

The Bills held the Patriots scoreless in the third quarter and added three points of their own with a K Rian Lindell 40-yard field goal to increase their lead 17-10. In the fourth quarter, the Bills answered a Patriots K Stephen Gostkowski field goal (17-13) with a 10-yard touchdown pass from Edwards to RB Fred Jackson (24-13). He finished with 83 yards receiving and 57 yards rushing.

The Patriots came back strong in the fourth quarter with Brady finding TE Benjamin Watson twice in the red zone. After each touchdown, New England went for a two point conversion but was unsuccessful in both attempts. With just under two minutes remaining in the fourth, Buffalo was set to have possession until CB Leodis McKelvin fumbled the ball on a kick off return at the Buffalo 31-yard line and was recovered by New England.

FITZPATRICK SNAPSHOT

Fifth-year QB Ryan Fitzpatrick completed 12 of 20 passes for 86 yards with one touchdown and an interception in Sunday's 16-10 win against Kansas City, and added 17 rushing yards on three attempts.

In Week 13 vs. the Jets, Fitzpatrick completed nine of 23 passes for 98 yards with one interception in Thursday night's loss to the Jets. Fitzpatrick added 32 yards rushing on five attempts.

Against Miami in Week 12, Fitzpatrick completed 17 of 26 passes for 246 yards with one touchdown and an interception for a QB rating of 92.8. Fitzpatrick added 50 yards rushing on seven attempts, including a 31-yard touchdown run - marking the longest TD rush by a Bills QB in team history and of his career.

At Jacksonville in Week 11, Fitzpatrick completed 18 of 31 passes for 297 yards with one touchdown and two interceptions for a QB rating of 74.3.

Fitzpatrick connected with WR Terrell Owens on a 98-yard scoring strike in the third quarter, setting a personal-best and a new franchise record for the longest play from scrimmage.

Fitzpatrick has appeared in eight games in 2009 with six starts, throwing for 1,089 yards on 94 of 177 passes with five touchdowns and nine interceptions.

FITZPATRICK IN FIRST HOME START

Fifth-year quarterback Ryan Fitzpatrick became the 31st QB in team history to start a home game for the Bills in Week 9 vs. Houston. Fitzpatrick completed 15 of 23 passes for 117 yards with two interceptions against the Texans in the Bills' 31-10 loss.

FITZPATRICK MAKES BILLS STARTING DEBUT

Fifth-year quarterback Ryan Fitzpatrick started his first game for the Buffalo Bills in Week Seven at Carolina, after replacing an injured Trent Edwards at the New York Jets in Week Six.

Acquired in 2009 as an unrestricted free agent, Fitzpatrick became the 34th starting quarterback in Bills history and completed 11 of 22 passes for 123 yards with one touchdown for a QB rating of 82.2 in the team's 20-9 win over the Panthers.

Fitzpatrick is the 12th QB in team history to have led Buffalo to a victory in their first start with the team. Buffalo has now won their last four games when starting a different quarterback (Ryan Fitzpatrick W, 20-9 at CAR 10/25/09, Trent Edwards W, 17-14 vs. NYJ, 9/30/07, Kelly Holcomb W, 20-14 vs. MIA, 10/9/05 and JP Losman W, 22-7 9/11/05 vs. HOU).



FITZPATRICK IN LAST NINE STARTS

Fitzpatrick has posted a 6-3 record in his last nine starts dating back to December 14, 2008 while with Cincinnati.

In his previous nine starts, Fitzpatrick has completed 135 of 202 passes for 1,360 yards with six touchdowns and seven interceptions for a QB rating of 81.3.

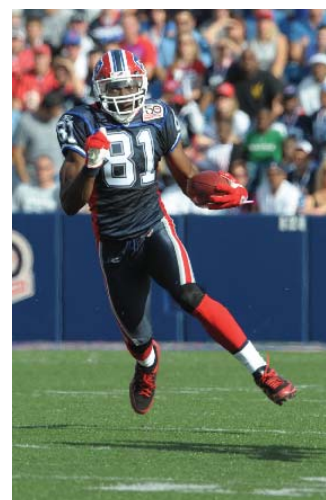
OWENS APPROACHING 1,000 CATCHES

REVAMPED OFFENSIVE LINE

The Bills began the season with a new look offensive line with veterans C Geoff Hangartner and RT Brad Butler, first-year play LT Demetrius Bell and two rookie draft choices - first-round (28th overall) RG Eric Wood and second-round (51st overall) pick LB Andy Levitre.

Buffalo's o-line has been revamped through the first 11 games of the season. Most recently the team signed free agent RG Kendall Simmons on November 24. Simmons started his first game as a Bill in Week 11 vs. Miami.

Hangartner and Levitre have been the two mainstays along the o-line for the team this season, as both have started each game. Levitre is one of four rookie offensive linemen to have started each game in 2009.

Butler was placed on Injured Reserve after suffering a leg injury against Tampa Bay in Week Two. Wood suffered a season-ending injury at Jacksonville in Week 11.

At New England in Week One, the Bills became the first non-expansion NFL team since the 1981 Washington Redskins to start three offensive linemen who never played in a game.

Wood, Levitre and OL Jamon Meredith were three rookies who started on the o-line, marking the first time since 2001 (9/30 vs. PIT) that the Bills featured three rookies upfront.

Moorman, the only active member of the Bills' 50th Anniversary Team, had four punts for 212 yards for a 53-yard average and net average with no returns in Week 14, also had three punts inside the 20. Moorman booted the longest punt in the NFL this season on Sunday of 73 yards. He has 73 punts this season for 3,448 yards and a 47.2-yard average and 22 inside the 20.

Moorman threw his second career touchdown pass on a fake field goal against the Saints in week three. He hit DE Ryan Denney for a 25-yard touchdown pass early in the second quarter. Lindell joined the Bills after signing an offer sheet with the franchise as a restricted free agent in March of 2002 and officially become a Bill a week later when Seattle opted not to match it.

<div>WEEK 1 – BILLS 24, Patriots 25</div> <div>September 14, 2009 – Gillette Stadium – 68,756</div> <p>The Buffalo Bills kicked off their 2009 season on Monday Night Football with a 24-25 loss over the New England Patriots at a sold out Gillette Stadium in Foxboro, Massachusetts.</p> <p>This game marked the return of Patriots QB Tom Brady from a 2008 season ending injury and the first game calling plays for newly appointed Bills Offensive Coordinator Alex Van Pelt.</p> <p>Rookie tight end Shawn Nelson put the Bills on the board late in the first quarter when he caught a short 11-yard pass from QB Trent Edwards and leaped over the pylon into the end zone to put the Bills ahead 7-0. Nelson finished the game with two receptions for a total of 13 yards. For the game, Edwards was 15 of 25 for 212 yards and two touchdowns.</p> <p>Halfway through the second quarter, Patriots QB Tom Brady led his offense downfield to end the drive with RB Fred Taylor rushing into the end zone to tie the game at seven points each. The Patriots would try to charge back to take the lead after a Buffalo punt until Brady's screen pass intended for RB Sammy Morris was intercepted by Bills DE Aaron Schobel. Schobel returned the pick off 26-yards before being tackled in the end zone to give the Bills a 14-10 lead going into the half. Schobel finished the game with a tackle and a sack on Brady for a loss of 10 yards. This was the 15th time in Schobel's career that he's faced Brady he has 12.0 career-sacks on the all-pro quarterback.</p> <p>The Bills held the Patriots scoreless in the third quarter and added three points of their own with a K Rian Lindell 40-yard field goal to increase their lead 17-10. In the fourth quarter, the Bills answered a Patriots K Stephen Gostkowski field (17-13) with a 10-yard touchdown pass from Edwards to RB Fred Jackson (24-13). This was Jackson's first career start as the starting running back. He finished with 83 yards receiving and 57 yards rushing.</p> <p>The Patriots came back strong in the fourth quarter with Brady finding TE Benjamin Watson twice in the red zone. After each touchdown, New England went for a two point conversion but was unsuccessful in both attempts. With just under two minutes remaining in the fourth, Buffalo was set to have possession until CB Leodis McKelvin fumbled the ball on a kick off return at the Buffalo 31-yard line and was recovered by New England. WEEK 3 – Saints 27, BILLS 7

The Buffalo Bills succumbed to penalties and turnovers as they were unable to stop the New Orleans Saints' offense in front of a home crowd of 70,261 as the Saints defeated the Bills, 27-7.

The Saints didn't waste any time, scoring within the first five minutes of the game on an 82-yard drive over 10 plays. Saints RB Lynell Hamilton rushed for the touchdown to give New Orleans an early 7-0 lead.

A trick play in the opening seconds of the second quarter got the Bills on the board. Set up in field goal formation, P Brian Moorman took the snap and threw a pass for 25 yards to DE Ryan Denney for Buffalo's only touchdown of the game, tying the game at seven points each. However, the Saints regained the lead, 10-7, after a late second quarter field goal by K John Carney.

Bills QB Trent Edwards connected with WR Lee Evans four times for a total of 31 yards. Evans now has 304 career receptions and moves into fourth place past Pete Metzelaars (302) on Buffalo's all time receptions list.

Edwards would go on to complete 20 of 35 passing attempts for a total of 156 yards with an interception. Bills RB Fred Jackson gained 97 scrimmage yards (71 rushing and 26 receiving) narrowly missing his fifth straight game with 100+ scrimmage yards.

Buffalo's defense had a solid performance as they held the Saints to 10 points into the fourth quarter. They also held the Saints offense to only 27 points when they've scored over 40 in each of their last two games. DEs Aaron Schobel and Chris Kelsay both registered a sack on QB Drew Brees. Schobel also forced and recovered a fumble on his sack.

By forcing multiple turnovers and executing a successful pass rush, the Miami Dolphins defeated the Bills, 38-10, at Land Shark Stadium. This was the Bills' second loss this season to an AFC East opponent.

Miami was able to get on the board first in the second quarter with a K Dan Carpenter 33-yard field goal after both teams struggled to produce any points in the first quarter.

The Buffalo offense seemed like they could get things started but couldn't quite execute the way they'd like to in the first half. On the Bills' first possession of the second quarter, QB Trent Edwards' pass intended for WR Josh Reed was picked off and returned for a touchdown by Dolphins rookie CB Vontae Davis. The Bills were able to get on the board following the turnover with a 35-yard field goal by K Rian Lindell which was set up by a WR Terrell Owens 39-yard reception. Miami went into the half leading 17-3.

During the second half, Miami was able to produce three more touchdowns, two of them in the third quarter. Buffalo's offense continued to struggle, but was able to score their only touchdown in the early stages of the fourth quarter, Edwards connected with Reed on a short pass to make the score 31-10. Edwards would finish the game with 14 completions on 26 attempts, one touchdown and three interceptions.

Buffalo's defense put up a stout fight after suffering many key injuries during last week's game against New Orleans. Once again the defensive line was able to attack the quarterback early. DEs Aaron Schobel, Chris Kelsay and Ryan Denney, along with DT Marcus Stroud all registered a sack on Dolphins QB Chad Henne. SS George Wilson, filling in for an injured Bryan Scott, recorded his first two sacks of the season. Wilson and Denney each were responsible for forcing a fumble when sacking Henne but the Bills were unable to recover the loose ball.

WEEK 5 – Browns 6, Bills 3
October 11, 2009 – Ralph Wilson Stadium – 70,526

The Bills and Browns struggled to find the end zone in a game that was decided by a field goal on Cleveland's final possession.

After a scoreless first quarter, Cleveland's K Billy Cundiff was able to successfully connect on a 24-yard field goal to give the Browns a 3-0 lead halfway through the second quarter.

This was the first game back at the Ralph for RB Marshawn Lynch since the preseason. Lynch had six receptions for 56 yards and rushed for 69 yards. His longest play came at the beginning of the second half on a drive that led to Buffalo's only score of the game. QB Trent Edwards threw a short pass up the middle to Lynch who broke a tackle took the ball 35 yards before being tackled at the Cleveland 26-yard line. Buffalo was unable to convert the next set of downs after Lynch's play but set up K Rian Lindell for a 36-yard field goal to tie the game at three.

WR Terrell Owens had four catches, his most receptions in a game this season, for 44 yards and even rushed on a play for six yards. However, a turnover by Buffalo's special teams unit with three minutes remaining in the game would be enough for Cleveland to gain the edge after an 18-yard field goal to win the game.

Buffalo's defense held the Browns to 193 total yards of offense, the fewest the team has allowed since 120, vs. Houston on Sept. 11, 2005. The Bills also held the Browns to 22 passing yards, which is the sixth fewest in club history. It is the lowest total since the Bills held the Browns to a Buffalo-record -3 passing yards on Dec. 13, 2004. The Browns managed only two completions, which tied for the fewest ever by a Bills opponent (vs. Cin. on Nov. 30, 1969 and vs. NYJ on Sept. 29, 1974).

WEEK 6 – Bills 16, Jets 13

Buffalo Bills K Rian Lindell hit a 47-yard field goal with 2:44 left in overtime to give the Bills a 16-13 win over the NY Jets at The Meadowlands on Sunday. The Bills ended their 96 game streak without going into overtime. This was the first division game that the Bills have won in nine contests.

On their first possession of the game QB Trent Edwards led the Bills down field on a 10-play, 47-yard drive to enter Jets territory. K Rian Lindell made a 33-yard field goal putting Buffalo on top 3-0. With the game tied, 3-3, in the early stages of the second quarter, Edwards suffered a hit to the head that took him out of the game. Backup QB Ryan Fitzpatrick took over for the injured Edwards.

Coming into the second half, Fitzpatrick looked to bring the Bills back from a 10-point deficit.

In the third quarter, the Bills scored their first offensive touchdown in two games when Fitzpatrick found WR Lee Evans in stride on a slant route for a 37-yard touchdown tying the game at 13-13. This was Evans' 34th career touchdown reception as he is now tied with former Buffalo Bill Bob Chandler for fourth place on the team's all-time touchdown reception list. Fitzpatrick was 10-for-25 for 116 yards with the touchdown and an interception.

Buffalo's defense held the Jets to 96 passing yards as they intercepted Jets rookie QB Mark Sanchez five times and added another interception on a botched field goal attempt. Three of the interceptions came in the second half and two in overtime. S Jairus Byrd recorded two interceptions becoming the first Bills rookie to post interceptions in consecutive games since Nate Clements in 2001. S John Wendling, S George Wilson, CB Reggie Corner and LB Paul Posluszny each had one interception. Wendling's interception came on the Jets muffed field goal attempt in overtime. Posluszny recorded the sixth interception on a key play that gave Buffalo the ball back with 6:25 left in OT and led to the game-winning field goal. The last time the Bills recorded six interceptions in a game was on 12/9/1967 at Boston.

The Buffalo Bills defeated the Carolina Panthers, 20-9, winning their second consecutive road game in back-to-back weeks for the first time since Weeks 15-16 in 2004.

Buffalo's defense had four takeaways with three interceptions and one fumble which led to 17 points. Fourteen of those points came with help from FS Jairus Byrd who intercepted Panthers QB Jake Delhomme twice. This was Byrd's second straight two-interception game giving him five picks in the last three games. Byrd is the third Bills rookie to post an interception in three consecutive games and is the first to achieve the feat since Butch Byrd in 1964 (games 9-12).

Buffalo's offense never turned the ball over as QB Ryan Fitzpatrick started his first game for an injured Trent Edwards. Byrd's first interception set up a RB Marshawn Lynch rushing touchdown to give the Bills an early 7-0 lead.

Fitzpatrick connected with WR Lee Evans five times for a total of 75 yards. Evans caught a two-yard touchdown pass for his 35th career touchdown to increase the Bills lead 14-2. He is now tied for third place with Elbert Dubenion on the Bills' all-time touchdown receptions list and has passed 5,000 receiving yards in his career. Evans' longest reception was a 50-yard catch that helped set up a 29-yard field goal by K Rian Lindell to extend Buffalo's lead 17-2. Fitzpatrick went on to complete 11-of-22 passes for 123 yards and a touchdown.

Carolina tried to come back as they set up their own touchdown scoring drive to cut the lead to 17-9. On the ensuing drive Buffalo was forced to punt but Panthers' Kenny Moore muffed the catch which was recovered by Bills TE Derek Fine with 5:15 remaining in the game. The turnover ended Carolina's chance to potentially tie the game as Buffalo solidified their lead, 20-9, with a Lindell 22-yard field goal.

WEEK 8 – Texans 31, BILLS 10**November 1, 2009 – Ralph Wilson Stadium – 69,790**

Two key interceptions and a WR Terrell Owens touchdown weren't enough for the Bills to hold on to their early lead as the Houston Texans defeated Buffalo 31-10 at Ralph Wilson Stadium.

Buffalo's defense continued to strive as they recorded two interceptions, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery, and a sack. Bills rookie FS Jairus Byrd recorded his sixth interception when he picked off Texans QB Matt Schaub on Houston's first possession. With 5:26 remaining in the first quarter, LB Paul Posluszny forced Texans RB Steve Slaton to fumble and the ball was recovered by Bills DT Marcus Stroud.

After being unsuccessful at converting on the first two turnovers, Buffalo got another chance when Byrd recorded his second interception of the game and his seventh of the season. It was the third consecutive week that he recorded multiple interceptions. This set up an Owens 29-yard end-around touchdown for his second touchdown of the season giving the Bills a 7-0 lead heading into the second quarter. Houston came back with two field goal drives to cut the lead 7-6, but Buffalo was able to score three points of their own with a K Rian Lindell 21-yard field goal to hang onto a 10-6 lead heading into the half.

Byrd, who was chosen as NFL Rookie of the Month in October, joins San Francisco's Dave Baker (1960) as just the second NFL player to have two or more interceptions in three consecutive games. He is also just the second rookie player in franchise history along with George "Butch" Byrd (1964, games 9-12) to record an interception in four consecutive games. The last time a Bill had a four game interception streak was Jeff Nixon in games 15-16 (1979) and 1-2 (1980).

The Bills were never able to come back in the second half as they allowed 25 unanswered points, 244 yards, and the offense was only able to convert two of 10 third down opportunities. QB Ryan Fitzpatrick completed 15 of 23 passes and threw two interceptions.

WEEK 10 – BILLS 17, Titans 41
November 15, 2009 – LP Field – 69,143

Coming off of their bye week, the Bills offense looked revitalized as they charged into the end zone on a 10-play, 63-yard opening drive. Using a wildcat formation, RB Fred Jackson took the snap, faked a hand-off to RB Marshawn Lynch and then threw a 27-yard touchdown pass to WR Lee Evans for an early 7-0 lead. It was the first touchdown pass of Jackson's career and first by a Bills RB since Lynch connected with former TE Robert Royal for an eight-yard touchdown pass against Cincinnati (11/4/07). This is the first season in Bills history where two non-QBs threw touchdown passes (P Brian Moorman's 25-yard pass to DE Ryan Denney 9/27/09 vs. New Orleans).

The Titans answered back on their next possession with their own touchdown drive. QB Vince Young led his offense 80 yards downfield before RB Chris Johnson rushed 28 yards for a touchdown to tie the game at seven. The Titans tacked on another touchdown and a 38-yard field goal by K Rob Bironas to increase their lead 17-7. But before going into the half, Buffalo cut the lead to three as QB Trent Edwards threw an eight-yard touchdown pass to Evans. Evans now sits alone in third place in team history with 37 career touchdown receptions. Going into the fourth quarter, Buffalo was able to tie the game at 17 overall after a successful 25 yard field goal from K Rian Lindell. However the defense wouldn't have an answer for stopping the Titans' run game.

Johnson rushed for his second touchdown to increase Tennessee's lead to 24-17. As the Bills offense struggled to stay on the field in the fourth, the Titans put another three points on the board with a Bironas 51-yard field goal. The Titans then ran away with the game for a final score of 41-17 after two interceptions were returned for touchdowns.

Bills rookie FS Jairus Byrd tried to seize some momentum for the defense as he recorded an interception for a team-record fifth consecutive game, giving him a total of eight on the season, which leads the NFL. Byrd is the first NFL player with an interception in five consecutive games since Champ Bailey in 2005 and also tied a team record for most interceptions in a season by a first-year player (Archie Matsos – 1960).

Edwards went on to complete 18-of-28 pass attempts for 185 yards, with a touchdown and an interception, before being replaced by back-up QB Ryan Fitzpatrick with a little under three minutes remaining in the game. Fitzpatrick finished 2-for-7 for six yards and an interception.

WEEK 11 – BILLS 15, Jaguars 18

After a grueling week that included a head coaching change and losing more starters to injuries, Buffalo and Interim Head Coach, Perry Fewell, were looking to find some answers and earn a much needed win. They were at least able to find an answer to a struggling run defense by shutting down Jacksonville's run game. The defense managed to keep Jaguars leading RB Maurice Jones-Drew to only 66 rushing yards when he's averaged 132.5 yards in the last four games. The defense also caused Jacksonville to turn the ball over twice with an interception and a fumble. S George Wilson was credited with the INT for his third of the season. LB Paul Posluszny forced his second fumble of the season when he stripped Jaguars QB David Garrard of the ball at the Bills 21 stopping their scoring drive halfway through the fourth quarter. DT Spencer Johnson recovered the ball.

Offensively, Buffalo still struggled to convert on third downs. On the first possession of the game, QB Ryan Fitzpatrick threw an interception that was intended for WR Josh Reed. The Jaguars converted on the turnover with a 29-yard field goal by K Josh Scobee to take a 3-0 lead. Buffalo was able to drive downfield into field goal territory and get three points of their own with a K Rian Lindell 26-yard field goal to tie the game at three a piece. After Wilson's interception, the Bills converted on the turnover with a second field goal to give them a 6-3 lead at the end of the first quarter. Buffalo would go into the half trailing the Jaguars by a point, 10-9, after Lindell made a 22-yard field goal as time expired.

Buffalo showed signs of life coming into the second half. On the first play of their first possession in the third quarter, Fitzpatrick connected with WR Terrell Owens for a 98-yard touchdown reception to give the Bills a 15-10 lead. They were unsuccessful on a two point conversion following the touchdown. Owens had nine receptions for 197 yards and a touchdown. He passed Marvin Harrison for fourth place on the NFL's all-time receiving list and set a personal and team record with his 98-yard scoring reception.

However, the Bills weren't able to hold on for the win as the Jaguars charged down field and scored a touchdown with 56 seconds remaining. Garrard connected with WR Mike Sims-Walker to give Jacksonville a 18-15 victory. Fitzpatrick went on to complete 18-of-31 pass attempts for 297 yards, with a touchdown and two interceptions.

WEEK 12 – Dolphins 14, BILLS 31**November 29, 2009 – Ralph Wilson Stadium – 70,155**

The Buffalo Bills clinched their second win at home this season with the help of three interceptions that led to 24 unanswered points in the fourth quarter to defeat the Miami Dolphins, 31-14.

Buffalo looked like they were going to get on the board first early in the first quarter as they tried to capitalize on Dolphins RB Ricky Williams' turnover (LB Chris Draft – INT). However, K Rian Lindell's 44-yard field goal attempt was wide right. Miami's ensuing possession turned into a 9-play 66-yard scoring drive as WR Brian Hartline caught a four-yard touchdown pass from QB Chad Henne to take the lead 7-0.

The Bills were able to answer back and tie the game at 7-7 before going into halftime when QB Ryan Fitzpatrick rushed 31 yards for a touchdown. It was the longest rushing touchdown by a Bills quarterback in team history and the longest of his career. In the third quarter, the Dolphins regained the lead, 14-7, with a Williams one-yard rushing touchdown.

However, the fourth quarter belonged solely to the Bills. RB Fred Jackson earned his first of two rushing touchdowns this season on a 13-play, 75-yard drive that took seven minutes off the clock. Jackson finished the drive with a three yard touchdown run to tie the game at 14. With 3:35 remaining, Buffalo decided to kick a 56-yard field goal and Lindell split the uprights to give Buffalo the lead for the first time, 17-14. This was the longest field goal of Lindell's career and the second longest in team history (59-yards, Steve Christie, 9/26/93 vs. MIA).

With the clock winding down, Buffalo's defense helped secure the win. The defense held Williams to 36 yards in the second half and tamed the Dolphins wildcat offense holding them scoreless in the fourth. After Lindell's successful field goal, each of Miami's final three drives resulted in interceptions by the Bills. CB Drayton Florence, FS Donte Whitner, and DL Corey Mace were each credited with an INT. Florence's INT, led to a Fitzpatrick 51-yard TD pass to WR Terrell Owens (24-14) while Whitner's INT lead to Jackson's second rushing TD from seven yards out (31-14), and Mace's INT ended the game. Whitner and LB Paul Posluszny both lead the team with 10 total tackles and Spencer Johnson had a sack on Henne.

Fitzpatrick went on to complete 17-of-26 pass attempts for 246 yards, a touchdown, and an interception. He also rushed seven times for 50 yards. Owens led receivers with five receptions for 96 yards and a touchdown.

Buffalo improves to 4-7 and will host the New York Jets at Rogers Centre as part of the Bills Toronto Series on Thursday, December 3rd at 8:20 PM in a Thursday Night Football game.

The Buffalo Bills succumbed to third down inefficiencies and a struggling run defense as the New York Jets defeated the Bills, 19-13, at Rogers Centre in Toronto.

Both teams exchanged field goals in the first quarter, with the Bills drawing first blood on a 49-yard field goal by K Rian Lindell. The Bills nearly went into halftime with a 10-6 lead over the Jets after Lindell's field goal and a 15-yard rushing touchdown from RB Marshawn Lynch, but the Jets tacked on a touchdown in the last minute of the first half.

In the second quarter, the Jets kicked a field goal and added the last minute touchdown. Jets rookie QB Mark Sanchez connected with WR Braylon Edwards on a 13-yard pass play to give the Jets a 16-10 lead going into the half.

Coming into the second half the Jets were in full command. Their defense brought immense pressure to QB Ryan Fitzpatrick as they held the Bills to only 98 passing yards and 194 total yards on the night. They also stopped the Bills offense on 10-of-11 third down attempts keeping the offense on the field for only 24 minutes. The Jets run game was also strong rushing for 249 yards. Both teams were each able to get a field goal in the fourth quarter as the final score ended 19-13 in the Jets favor.

The Bills' defense registered five sacks, including two by DT Kyle Williams, and one each by DE Chris Kelsay, LB Paul Posluszny and DE Aaron Schobel.

Fitzpatrick went on to complete 9-of-23 pass attempts for 98 yards, and an interception.

Buffalo falls to 4-8 and will go back on the road to play the Kansas City Chiefs on Sunday, December 13th for a 1:00 PM kickoff.

WEEK 14 – BILLS 16, Chiefs 10**December 13, 2009 – Arrowhead Stadium – 68,668**

Four interceptions in the second half by Buffalo's defense and a strong performance by RBs Fred Jackson and Marshawn Lynch were enough to push the Bills to a 16-10 victory over the Kansas City Chiefs.

Buffalo's defense helped set the tone early as they forced the Chiefs to a three-and-out on their opening drive. On the Bills' second possession QB Ryan Fitzpatrick was sacked and fumbled the ball inside Buffalo's 10-yard line. The Chiefs looked like they would score going for it on fourth-and-one at Buffalo's one yard line but was unsuccessful as DE Aaron Schobel sacked Chiefs' QB Matt Cassel for a loss of seven yards and a turnover on downs, setting up the Bills first and only touchdown of the game.

RB Marshawn Lynch broke away for a 47-yard run to put the Bills in position. Fitzpatrick connected with WR Terrell Owens for a nine-yard touchdown pass as Owens reached across the pylon to give the Bills a 7-0 lead. It was Owens' 146th career touchdown moving him into sole possession of fourth place on the NFL's all-time touchdown list. On their ensuing drive, the Chiefs drove down the field but Buffalo's defense held them to kick a 21-yard field goal making the score 7-3. Before heading into halftime, the Bills put together a drive that gave them a 10-3 lead as K Rian Lindell made a 41-yard field goal. To begin the second half, both teams exchanged a pair of interceptions. After finding a spark in its offense, Buffalo put together a six-minute drive that ended with a Lindell 24-yard field goal to give the Bills a 10-point lead, 13-3. Kansas City answered back on the first play of their ensuing drive as RB Jamaal Charles broke away for a 76-yard rushing touchdown to pull the Chiefs within three, 13-10.

Buffalo's defense had a strong fourth quarter as they intercepted Cassel three times during the Chiefs final three drives. The Bills converted another three points after a LB Paul Posluszny interception and were able to hang onto their 16-10 lead as Cassel's Hail Mary pass was intercepted by S George Wilson in the end zone.

Fitzpatrick went on to complete 12-of-20 pass attempts for 86 yards, an interception, and a touchdown. Jackson rushed 20 times for 99 yards while Lynch ran 12 times for 84 yards.

Defensively, Bryan Scott lead the team in tackles with 10 and also had a sack and a tipped pass that led to DB Jairus Byrd's interception. This was Byrd's ninth interception and set a team rookie record for interceptions in a season, and currently leads the NFL. Schobel, DE Chris Kelsay, and DT Spencer Johnson each tallied a sack. Posluszny followed Scott with nine tackles and an interception. CB Terrence McGee also had an interception.

Buffalo improves to 5-8 and will head home to Ralph Wilson Stadium to face the New England Patriots for their last division game on Sunday, December 20 for a 1:00 PM kickoff.
