TEXANS WRAP UP THE REGULAR SEASON WITH A HOME DATE AGAINST PATRIOTS

The Houston Texans return home after two road wins seeking their first winning season as they face the New England Patriots on January 3, 2010 at Noon at Reliant Stadium. The Texans enter Sunday in the playoff hunt. Houston looks to extend its winning streak to four straight which would tie its franchise-best mark from 2008.

The Texans face the Patriots for the third time in team history. Houston looks to gain their first win in the series. Houston last hosted New England in 2003 when the eventual Super Bowl champions escaped town with a 23-20 win in overtime.

Houston's 379.3 yards of total offense per game ranks fifth in the NFL. The Texans are paced by a pair of league leaders. WR **Andre Johnson** leads the NFL with 1,504 receiving yards. He became only the second receiver in league history to post back-to-back 1,500 yard seasons. He is 71 yards shy of matching his career best in receiving yards from last season. Johnson looks to become the first player in over a decade to lead the league in receiving yards in consecutive seasons. QB **Matt Schaub** leads the NFL with a career-high 4,467 yards. If Schaub and Johnson can finish the season at the top of their respective categories, they would become the eighth set of teammates since the 1970 NFL merger and first since 1998 to lead the league in passing and receiving yards in a single season.

During the month of December, Houston finished with a 3-1 record. Johnson led all receivers with 559 receiving yards. He finished with eight catches of 25 or more yards. Schaub passed for 1,225 yards and a quarterback rating of 103.2. Schaub was injured on the first play at Jacksonville (12/6) when he was dropped for a nine yard loss. Since then, he has been sacked just twice in 139 pass attempts.

The Texans defense enters Sunday ranked 14th in the NFL. They are led by Rookie of the Year candidate **Brian Cushing** who leads all AFC linebackers with 128 tackles. He leads all NFL linebackers with four interceptions.

TEXANS LAST GAME AT MIAMI

The Texans got their eighth win of the season with a 27-20 win in Miami. Houston jumped out to a 27-0 lead in the second quarter by scoring on their first five drives. Houston outrushed the Dolphins 126-60 with rookie RB **Arian Foster** running for a career-high 97 yards on 19 carries. Miami native **Andre Johnson** made a team-high five grabs for 71 yards and a 10-yard score. With the win, Houston finished with a franchise- best fifth road win this season.

In just four seasons at the helm, **Gary Kubiak** has become the winningest head coach in Texans history with 30 career victories, including the two best seasons in team history. One of Kubiak's primary goals upon arriving in Houston was to create a home field advantage at Reliant Stadium, and he has made great strides in that direction. The Texans have posted a 19-12 home record since 2006, including 6-2 marks in each of the last two seasons.

The 2008 Texans matched their record from the year before, going 8-8 for a second straight year despite an 0-4 start in the aftermath of Hurricane Ike, which devastated much of Houston and southeast Texas. Houston became just the 10th team in NFL history to start a year 0-4 and finish at or above .500. Houston was one of 11 teams to go 8-4 or better over the last 12 games and nine of those teams were in the playoffs. The offense enjoyed its most productive season, ranking third in the NFL and setting a franchise record with 6,113 total yards.

Year two for Kubiak saw the team achieve the best record in franchise history, finishing 8-8. The Texans won three of their last four and five of their last seven to finish the season at .500. Closing the season strong has become a hallmark of Kubiak's teams. In Kubiak's three seasons in Houston, the Texans are a combined 10-5 in the month of December. Another point of emphasis under Kubiak has been developing a true home field advantage, and the team is well on its way to accomplishing that mission. After going 4-4 at Reliant Stadium in 2006, which was the best home mark at the time, Kubiak's troops posted a 6-2 mark at home the past two years.

Bill Belichick is in his 35th season as an NFL coach and is the only head coach in NFL history to win three Super Bowl championships in a four-year span. In his nine seasons as Patriots head coach, Belichick has won 126 games. Belichick was hired on January 27, 2000 and is in his 10th season as Patriots head coach. Through nine seasons, Belichick has delivered three Super Bowl championships, four conference titles, six division crowns and 14 playoff victories. Belichick returned to the Patriots as head coach after three seasons with the New York Jets (1997-99) as the team's assistant head coach/secondary coach, holding the responsibility of calling the team's defensive plays. Belichick spent five seasons (1991-95) rebuilding the Cleveland Browns. By 1994, the Browns were again one of NFL's best teams, boasting the second-best record in the AFC. Belichick's first head coaching opportunity came following the 1990 season, when his defensive efforts with the New York Giants helped claim a second Super Bowl title in five years.

With **Rick Smith** at the helm of the Texans football operations, Houston has accumulated 30 wins over the four seasons since 2006, giving him the most wins for a general manager in Texans history. Houston posted 16 wins in 2007-08 which ranked fifth-most among AFC teams. Smith has assembled a front office staff that has the Texans pointed towards sustained success in the NFL.

Smith has established himself as a prominent voice around the league in his three years at the helm of the Texans. Smith was honored with the Tank Younger Award in 2008 presented annually by the Fritz Pollard Alliance for outstanding work in an NFL front office. Smith was an original member of the General Managers Advisory Committee that provides advice and other feedback to the NFL Football Operations department on the integrity of the game, expansion of technology and other ways to improve the game, before being appointed to the NFL's prestigious eight-man Competition Committee by NFL Commissioner Roger Goodell.

Smith has assembled a team that has closed the season by winning seven out of nine games in the month of December over the last two seasons, the fourth-most in the NFL. This offseason, the Texans acquired DE Antonio Smith from the NFC Champion

Arizona Cardinals to balance the Texans defensive front four. In the 2009 draft, Smith greatly improved the Texans defense using the team's first two selections on LB Brian Cushing and DE Connor Barwin.

TEXANS vs. PATRIOTS GAME PREVIEW



The New England Patriots are 10-5 and in first place in the AFC East heading into Week 17 against the Texans. Last week, the Patriots clinched the division with a 35-7 victory over Jacksonville in Foxborough.

Bill Belichick is in his 35th season in the NFL and 10th as the Patriots' head coach and is the only head coach in NFL history to win three Super Bowl championships in a four-year span. In his nine seasons as Patriots head coach, Belichick has won 126 games - which is already more than any other head coach in NFL history through his first 10 seasons with a team.

QB **Tom Brady** has started all 15 games in 2009 after tearing his ACL in the 2008 season-opener against Kansas City and missed the last 15 games. This season, Brady has completed 354-of-539 passes for 4,212 yards, 28 touchdowns and 12 interceptions for New England, which ranks second in the NFL in total offense. Brady had a career year in 2007 when the Patriots went 16-0 during the regular season. In that season, Brady was named the NFL's Most Valuable Player, setting all-time NFL records for most touchdown passes in a season (50), highest touchdown-interception differential (+42) and most games with three or more touchdown passes

(12). His 117.2 passer rating was the second-highest of all-time, while his 4,806 passing yards were the third-highest single-season total in league history.

New England's obvious strength is their passing game with Brady throwing to two of the top receivers in the league. WR **Randy Moss** is always a deep threat and has 13 touchdown receptions on the season. The six-time Pro Bowler set an NFL record in 2007 with 23 touchdown receptions. WR **Wes Welker** is currently leading the NFL in receptions with 122 catches and is second with 1,336 yards receiving despite missing the first two games of the season. Welker needs just two receptions to pass Herman Moore for the second-most receptions in a season all-time. It's a pretty quick drop-off from there with RB **Kevin Faulk** as the No. 3 receiver with 37 catches for 301 yards and a touchdown.

RB **Laurence Maroney** leads the Patriots' rushing attack. The fourth-year back out of Minnesota has 194 carries for 754 yards and a career-high nine touchdowns. Maroney only played in three games in 2008 before being placed on injured reserve for the rest of the season with a shoulder injury. Backing up Maroney is Faulk, who has added 335 yards on the ground on 62 carries and two touchdowns in his 11th season with the Patriots. New England was expecting big things out of free-agent RB **Fred Taylor**, who came to the Patriots after spending 11 seasons in Jacksonville. Taylor has only seen action in five games this season after sustaining an ankle injury that kept him out of ten games. In his limited action, Taylor has managed to run for 236 yards on 56 carries and two touchdowns.

Defensively, New England is missing many of their big names from their Super Bowl defenses of the decade, but LB **Jerod Mayo** has picked up right where he left off this season, leading the Patriots in tackles with 95 (66 solo) in his sophomore campaign despite missing two games with an injured right knee. In 2008, Mayo led the Patriots with 139 tackles and became the second Patriots player to win the Associated Press Defensive Rookie of the Year Award. LB **Tully Banta-Cain** is having a breakout season as the team-leader in sacks with a career-high 9.5 for 69.5 yards lost. S **Brandon Meriweather** and CB **Leigh Bodden** have picked off five passes each for New England's secondary.

On special teams, K **Stephen Gostkowski** is in his fourth season in New England and the NFL. Gostkowski currently leads the team with 116 points. He has connected on 82.8% (24-of-29) of his field goal attempts, including a long of 53 yards. P **Chris Hanson** is averaging 39.8 yards and netting 34.5 yards on his 53 punts this season which rank last in the AFC. Welker has returned the majority of punts this season, averaging 12.5 yards per return. The Patriots have used eight different players to return kickoffs and as a team are averaging

22.3 yards per return on 48 kicks including a long of 52 yards from Maroney.

TEXANS/PATRIOTS SERIES HISTORY

The Texans and Patriots meet for the third time with New England holding a 2-0 series lead. These two teams meet in Reliant Stadium for only the second time. New England escaped with a 23-20 overtime win in 2003. Texans coach **Gary Kubiak** has led his team against the Patriots once in his career, a 40-7 road loss in 2006. Houston looks to close the season out strong against the AFC East. Houston owns a 2-1 record and with a win would mark the first time the Texans have gone 3-1 against the AFC East and the second time in team history Houston has posted a 3-1 record against an AFC division. 2007 saw Houston go 3-1 against the AFC West.

SUMMARY

The Texans (4-7) fell 23-20 to New England at Reliant Stadium in the club's first-ever overtime game. On the Texans second possession, K **Kris Brown** nailed a 19-yard field goal to put Houston ahead 3-0. The Patriots answered with a touchdown and a field goal to take a 10-3 lead into halftime. In the third quarter, Houston QB **Tony Banks** found WR **Andre Johnson** on a 10-yard touchdown pass to tie the score at 10. New England answered with a 32-yard Vinatieri field goal to pull back in front 13-10. Banks found TE **Billy Miller** on a 16-yard scoring strike to take a 17-13 lead, and Brown kicked a 29-yard field goal to push the lead to 20-13.

The Pats scored to force overtime and ultimately won the game on a 28-yard field goal with 41 seconds left in extra time.

RELIANT STADIUM INFORMATION



The Houston Texans officially played their first game in Reliant Stadium on September 8, 2002, against the Dallas Cowboys. The \$425 million building is the first retractable roof stadium in the NFL and is also the new home of the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo. Reliant Stadium was also host to Super Bowl XXXVIII in 2004. The roof is composed of two panels - each 240 feet long and 385 feet wide - that meet at midfield. In addition to the roof, another unique feature to the stadium is the removable grass field. The field is composed of 8-foot by 8-foot square modules that are 8 inches deep and include a metal drainage base. There are approximately 1,250 modules in the field, with each one weighing about 3,500 pounds. Here are some other facts about Reliant Stadium: The Texans also added a few more seats to Reliant Stadium for Super Bowl XXXVIII, increasing the seating capacity to 71,054. The stadium entered the 2002 season with 69,500 seats. The two video boards located be-

hind the north and south end zones measure 96 ½ feet by 26 ½ feet and are the largest in the NFL and can display one image or six different images simultaneously.

- The roof weighs a total of 3,000 tons and is covered in translucent fabric. It can open in 7-10 minutes.
- Total size of the building - 1.9 million square feet. The decision to open or close the roof is made one hour and 30 minutes prior to kickoff. If the roof is closed at kickoff, it stays closed for the remainder of the game. If the roof is open at kickoff, it is up to the official to decide whether the roof should be closed at some point during the course of the game. If the roof is open with five minutes left in the game, it must stay open for the remainder of the game.

THE 50-80 RULE

With the roof damage suffered from Hurricane Ike early last season repaired, the Texans again have the option of playing in ideal conditions. The Texans introduced the 50-80 rule in 2005 which implies that the roof will be open when the game time temperature is projected to be between 50 and 80 degrees.

The goal for implementing the "50-80 Rule" is to provide the most comfortable environment possible for fans to enjoy Houston Texans home games. The expected high for Sunday's matchup is in the high-50's at kickoff, with a 40% chance of rain meaning Reliant Stadium could possibly be open.

HOUSTON'S RAVING FANS

The Texans have played to sellout crowds since entering the NFL. The Texans increased the Reliant Stadium capacity following the 2002 season to 71,054, incorporating more "Raving Fans."

Houston has sold out 79 consecutive games and looks to continue the trend in 2009. The Texans are looking to continue their streak of selling out every preseason and regular season game in team history. Sunday's matchup against New England will extend the streak to 80.

STRONG SINCE OCTOBER

Under first-year defensive coordinator **Frank Bush**, Houston's defense is quickly becoming one of the stingiest in the NFL.

Since the beginning of October, the Texans rank fourth in the league, giving up a scant 297.6 yards per game. Houston has dropped its overall ranking from 32nd, at 436.7 yards per game after three weeks, all the way to 14th with a season-long average of 325.4.

DRAMATIC TURNAROUND

The Texans defense struggled early this season, giving up an average of 436.7 yards and 28.7 points per game through the first three weeks of the season. The defense has improved more than any group in the league, giving up 139.1 fewer yards per game in the last 12 games than it did in the first three.

Houston's defense went from allowing a league-worst 436.7 yards per game in the first three to just 297.6 in the last 12, ranking fourth in the NFL. On the ground, the Texans went from giving up 205.0 yards per game over the first three games to 85.2 in the last 12, which is the second-lowest average in the league over that time span.

LIMITING THE BIG PLAY

The Texans are ranked 14th in the NFL in total defense through the first 16 weeks of the season, giving up an average of 325.4 yards per game, and 15th in scoring defense, allowing an average of 20.4 points per game.

One of the biggest reasons for the defense's early struggles was a tendency to give up big plays. Houston surrendered four plays of 50 or more yards in the first three weeks of the season, all of which went for touchdowns. Tennessee RB Chris Johnson scored on runs of 57 and 91 yards and a 69-yard catch, and Jacksonville RB Maurice Jones-Drew scored on a 61-yard run.

Without those four plays, which accounted for 278 yards and 28 points, Houston would rank seventh in total defense and tied for seventh in scoring defense.

THE LAST ORIGINAL TEXANS

There are just two remaining members of the original Houston Texans team from 2002—K **Kris Brown** and G **Chester Pitts**.

Brown is the franchise's all-time leading scorer with 763 points and is the only player to have appeared in every game in franchise history. Pitts had started every game in franchise history before being placed on injured reserve on September 24, ending his streak at 114.

Brown was signed as a restricted free agent in 2002, while Pitts was the second of two second-round picks in the 2002 NFL Draft.

EXTREME (ROSTER) MAKEOVER

When Houston traded DT Travis Johnson to San Diego on 8/31, that left just four players on the roster who were with the team prior to the arrival of head coach **Gary Kubiak** in 2006. **61 of the 65 players (93.8%) on the active roster and injured reserve joined the team since Kubiak took over.**

OFFENSIVE OVERVIEW

The Texans offense came into the 2009 season intent on improving on its performance in 2008 when it turned in the most productive season in franchise history, gaining a franchise-record 6,113 yards, which ranked third in the league.

This season, the offense ranks seventh with an average of 379.3 yards per game, which puts it on pace to gain 6,069 yards on the year. The passing attack has been even more prolific this season, averaging 290.6 yards per game, which is the second-highest average in the NFL.

Despite ranking third in the league in yards last year, the Texans were just 17th in scoring, averaging 22.9 points per game. The cause of that disparity was turnovers, and that has been a major point of focus this year.

This season, Houston ranks 11th in scoring, averaging 23.6 points per game. The Texans have a negative turnover ratio with 25 turnovers forced and 27 committed. Houston has won the turnover battle five times on the year and is 4-1 in those games. The Texans are 17-3 under head coach **Gary Kubiak** when winning the turnover battle.

Calling the signals under center once again is QB **Matt Schaub**. In his third year as a starter, Schaub has already thrown for a career-high and franchise-record 4,467 yards and 27 touchdowns through the first 15 games. In Week 15 at St. Louis (12/20), he became the first Texans passer to top 4,000 yards. Schaub is 8-7 as a starter this season and 18-19 overall with the Texans.

Schaub's primary receiving option once again is WR **Andre Johnson**, who has established himself as arguably the best receiver in the NFL. A year after becoming the first receiver to lead the league in yards and catches since 2005, Johnson has once again made history. With 1,504 through the first 15 games, Johnson became just the second receiver in NFL history to gain at least 1,500 yards in back-to-back seasons.

On the ground, Houston has been forced to turn to a running back by committee approach led by **Ryan Moats** and **Chris Brown**, who have combined to run for 608 yards on the year.

In addition to Johnson, Schaub had a number of other weapons to throw to, led by WR **Kevin Walter**, who has caught 111 passes for 1,480 yards and 10 touchdowns over the last two seasons.

The key to the offense's success this year continues to be the offensive line. Under the leadership of T **Eric Winston**, who has started the last 53 games at RT, the line has allowed just 24 sacks on 578 pass plays, or 4.2 percent. That is the fifth-best sack percentage in the league this season.

OFFENSE POSITION BY POSITION

Quarterbacks

The Texans offense is in the highly capable hands of **Matt Schaub** once again in 2009. Schaub started 11 games in 2008, his second season in Houston, throwing for 3,043 yards and leading the Texans to a 6-5 record.

Schaub has posted elite numbers in 2009, ranking among the league's top five passers in six categories. He leads the NFL in passing yards with 4,467 and ranks second in attempts (544) and completions (372). Schaub's 68.4 completion percentage is third in the league, is fourth in yards per attempt (8.21) and he's tied for fifth with 27 touchdown passes. His 99.1 passer rating ranks sixth.

In three seasons as the Texans starter, Schaub has thrown for 9,751 yards with 51 touchdowns and 33 interceptions. Schaub has posted a quarterback rating of 94.2 since joining the team, which is by far the highest in franchise history among quarterbacks with at least 200 pass attempts.



Rex Grossman comes to Houston after spending the first six years of his career in Chicago, where he guided the Bears to Super Bowl XLI in 2006. The Bears' first-round pick in 2003, Grossman has thrown for 6,197 yards with 33 touchdowns and 36 interceptions in his career. Grossman made his Texans debut at Jacksonville (12/6) and completed 3-of-6 passes for 33 yards with one interception in relief of Schaub.

Houston signed **Dan Orlovsky** on the opening weekend of free agency. Orlovsky started seven games in 2008 for the Detroit Lions, completing 143-of-255 passes for 1,616 yards with eight touchdowns and eight interceptions.

Running Backs

Leading the way in Houston's running back by committee approach is veteran **Chris Brown**. After spending all of 2008 on injured reserve, Brown has run for 267 yards on 79 carries this year and has scored three touchdowns. Brown has totaled 3,024 yards and 19 touchdowns in his career.

Fifth-year pro **Ryan Moats** is second on the team with 373 rushing yards on 97 attempts and has a team-best four rushing touchdowns. He has totaled 814 rushing yards and eight touchdowns in his career. Moats also has experience as a kick returner, averaging 21.6 yards on 13 career returns.

Rookie free agent **Arian Foster** was to the active roster (11/17) after spending the first 10 weeks on the practice squad. Foster received his first NFL carry in Week 13 vs. Seattle (12/13) and finished that game with 13 rushes for 34 yards and four catches for 54 yards. In Week 16 at Miami (12/27), Foster ran for 97 yards on 19 carries and scored his first career touchdown.

Houston signed **Chris Henry** to the practice squad on October 7 and promoted him to the active roster on December 9. Henry, a former second-round pick of the Tennessee Titans, has played in 10 games in his career and has gained 122 yards on 32 carries with two touchdowns in his career.

Fullback **Vonta Leach** played in every game and served as a team captain several times late in the 2008 season. His primary function is to clear running room for the Texans' tailbacks. Leach has proven to be a reliable receiver out of the backfield with 67 career receptions for 420 yards and four touchdowns.



Wide Receivers

The Texans receiving corps, led by All-Pro **Andre Johnson**, will look to remain one of the deepest and most dangerous groups in the NFL. Johnson is leading the league in receiving yards for the second consecutive year with 1,504 through 15 games; and he has caught a career-high nine touchdown passes. Johnson has 581 career receptions for 7,883 yards and 42 touchdowns. Since 2006, Johnson has been the most productive receiver in the NFL, averaging 90.7 yards per game.



Kevin Walter will once again line up opposite Johnson. Walter enjoyed the best season of his career in 2008, catching 60 passes for 876 yards and tying Johnson for the team lead with a career-high eight touchdown catches. Since joining the Texans in 2006, Walter has caught 193 passes for 2,440 yards and 15 touchdowns.

David Anderson played in all 16 games last season, catching 19 passes for 241 yards and two touchdowns – all career highs. Anderson has continued to expanding his role in the offense in his fourth season, catching 38 passes for 370 yards thus far.

André Davis returns as one of the preeminent deep threats in the league. Since joining the Texans in 2007, Davis has caught 51 passes for 845 yards and three touchdowns. He has nine receptions of 25 yards or longer, meaning nearly one out of every five catches results in a big gain.

Third-year pro **Jacoby Jones** has made his mark returning punts, but made strides toward turning his tremendous athleticism into consistent playing time in the offense this season. In three seasons, Jones has caught 38 passes for 523 yards and four touchdowns.

Veteran **Glenn Martinez** joined the Texans as a free agent after spending the first three years of his career with the Denver Broncos. Martinez has played in 22 games with one start and has caught 18 passes for 218 yards in his career.

Tight Ends

The tight end position was dealt a tough blow with the loss of Pro Bowler **Owen Daniels** to a season-ending knee injury in Houston's Week 8 win at Buffalo (11/1). Daniels was on pace for a career year, with 40 catches for 519 yards and five touchdowns through eight games. In four seasons, he has caught 207 passes for 2,501 yards and 15 touchdowns.

Joel Dreessen emerged as a terrific complement to Daniels as a receiver in 2008 and will take on a bigger role in the base offense in Daniels' absence. Dreessen played in all 16 games a year ago and caught 11 passes for 77 yards. After re-signing with the Texans over the offseason, Dreessen has caught 20 passes for 239 yards this year.

In the fifth round (152nd overall) of the 2009 NFL Draft, Houston nabbed **James Casey** out of Rice. A sure-handed receiver with surprising speed, Casey has the ability to line up anywhere on the field. Casey notched his first two career receptions in Week 8 at Buffalo (11/1) and has caught six passes for 64 yards this season.

Offensive Line

The Texans offensive line has paved the way for another prolific season this year. The passing attack ranks second in the NFL, averaging 290.6 yards per game. The line is on pace to allow just 26 sacks on the season, which would be the second-lowest total in team history.

Fifth-year veteran **Chris Myers**, who joined the team via trade last year, has started the last 45 straight games, including 31 straight at center for the Texans. Myers will be the man tasked with setting the protection schemes on each play.

Rookie **Antoine Caldwell**, the team's third-round draft pick (77th overall) out of Alabama, has the versatility to play any of the three interior line positions. He was also the only player in Alabama history to graduate in under three years, a testament to his intelligence. Caldwell made his first career start at RG in Week 13 vs. Seattle (12/13).

Fifth-year veteran **Chris White** moved into the starting lineup in Week 6 after Mike Brisiel was placed on the reserve/injured list. White served as the primary backup at center and guard early in the season. He has seen action in 19 games with seven starts over the last two seasons.

Kasey Studdard, the team's sixth-round pick in the 2007 draft, made his first career start in Week 3 vs. Jacksonville (9/27) after G Chester Pitts was placed on the reserve/injured list. Studdard took the majority of the reps with the first team at LG in Pitts' place during

training camp. He saw action in two games in the 2008 season and has played in 17 games with 13 starts in his career.

Duane Brown, Houston's first-round pick in 2008, started every game in his rookie season at LT after he won the job during training camp. In his sophomore campaign, Brown will look to become more consistent.

At RT, **Eric Winston** has started 54 consecutive games for the Texans. Winston, a third-round pick in the 2006 draft, has started every game over the last three seasons and is widely considered one of the best right tackles in the league.

Fourth-year pro **Rashad Butler** is slated to be the primary backup at both tackle spots. Butler has played in eight career games but was inactive for all 16 contests a year ago. His strength and quickness allow him to block edge rushers on either side.

12th-year veteran **Ephraim Salaam** rejoined the team in Week 16 after spending most of the season with Detroit. Salaam was thrust into the starting lineup in Week 3 of 2006 and fought through a variety of injuries to hold down the spot for the next 30 games.

80 AIMING TO MATCH 80

WR **Andre Johnson** led the NFL in both receptions and receiving yards last season with 115 catches for 1,575 yards. Through 14 games this season, Johnson is back on top of the league with 1,433 yards and is fourth in receptions with 90.

Johnson is attempting to join future Hall of Famer Jerry Rice as the only receivers since the AFL-NFL merger in 1970 to lead the league in yards in back-to-back seasons. Rice did so in 1989-90 and again in 1994-95.

DEFENSIVE OVERVIEW

Houston's defense in 2009 has taken on a new look thanks to the addition of new defensive coordinator **Frank Bush**. Bush was promoted from his previous post as senior defensive assistant on January 13. This season marks Bush's first opportunity to call plays on defense. He has advocated an aggressive philosophy intent on making plays in the offensive backfield.

One of the biggest keys to any successful defense is strength up front, and the Texans have the pieces in place to field one of the best defensive fronts in team history, led by the Pro Bowl tandem of DE **Mario Williams** and LB **DeMeco Ryans**.



Williams is joined by a new face on the other end of the line. DE **Antonio Smith** joined the Texans as a free agent after helping the Arizona Cardinals come within seconds of winning the Super Bowl last year. Third-year DT **Amobi Okoye** has also played a vital role in the pass rush and has improved after a frustrating sophomore campaign.

Ryans battled injuries throughout last season but still managed to lead the team in tackles yet again. He has more help in 2009 thanks to first-round draft pick **Brian Cushing** out of USC. Cushing has been widely praised as the best rookie defender in the NFL.

The secondary is led by CB **Dunta Robinson**, the franchise's all-time leader with 13 career interceptions. The secondary is looking to improve upon its interception total of 12 last year, which tied for 21st in the NFL. Second-year FS **Dominique Barber** is calling the shots in the backfield along with free agent addition SS **Bernard Pollard**, who adds a physical presence.

DEFENSE POSITION BY POSITION

Defensive Line

A year after his team-record 14-sack season in 2007, defensive end **Mario Williams** anchored the Texans' defensive line with 12 sacks and was named to his first Pro Bowl in 2008. Williams finished 2008 with more sacks than any other AFC defensive end. Williams owns the franchise's all-time sack record with 38.5 in his four-year career.

Williams has a new face on the opposite end of the line this season. **Antonio Smith** joined the Texans as a free agent after helping the Arizona Cardinals to Super Bowl XLIII. Smith notched 5.5 sacks in each of the last two years, including two in the playoffs last season. He picked up his first sack as a Texan in Houston's Week 8 win at Buffalo (11/1) and has 4.5 on the season.

Tim Bulman earned a spot on the 53-man roster last year and finished second on the team with a career-high four sacks among 17 total tackles. Bulman, a converted defensive tackle, has slimmed down to 275 pounds in hopes of gaining speed and quickness.

Houston spent its second-round pick (46th overall) on **Connor Barwin** out of Cincinnati. Barwin brings tremendous athleticism and versatility to the position. He played tight end for three years before switching to defensive end as a senior, when he recorded 12 sacks and earned All-America honors. Barwin picked up his first career sack in Week 6 at Cincinnati (10/18) and is third on the team with 3.5 on the year.

Rookie free agent **Tim Jamison** rounds out the depth chart at end after being signed to the active roster on October 6. Jamison played in 50 games with 25 starts in his career at Michigan and recorded 129 career tackles and 20 sacks. Jamison has played in two games thus far as a rookie.

Defensive tackle **Amobi Okoye** was slowed by an ankle injury and didn't make the jump in his second season that he had hoped for. He finished the season with 24 tackles and 15 solo stops, one sack and a forced fumble. Now in his third season, Okoye is still the youngest player on the Texans roster. He has recorded 1.5 sacks so far this season to give him 8.0 in his career.

Houston further bolstered the interior of the line by signing **Shaun Cody** away from Detroit as a free agent. A second-round pick by the Lions in 2005, Cody has played in 66 games with 25 starts in his career and is coming off his best season, in which he had 37 tackles, 26 solos and three passes defended.

Seventeenth-year pro **Jeff Zgonina** joined the team at the beginning of training camp and earned a spot on the 53-man roster by virtue of a standout train-

ing camp performance. Zgonina played in every game a year ago, starting twice, and recorded 19 tackles and a fumble recovery. Zgonina has played in 218 career games for eight teams in his career and has recorded 25.0 sacks, three forced fumbles and 13 fumble recoveries.

DelJuan Robinson made his NFL debut in the 2008 season opener at Pittsburgh and got his first start in the home opener against Indianapolis. He finished the year with 27 tackles, including 19 solos, and one forced fumble. Robinson emerged as a solid contributor last year and will look to expand his role on the defense in 2009.

Second-year tackle **Frank Okam** will battle for increased playing time in 2009. Okam finished his rookie season with four tackles in five games. Okam is the biggest of the Texans defensive tackles and has the size and strength to anchor the middle of the line, and he'll look to convert potential in to production in his sophomore campaign.

Linebackers

The Texans linebacking corps will once again be anchored by MLB **DeMeco Ryans**. The fourth-year star is the captain and unquestioned leader. Ryans once again led the team last season with 112 tackles and one sack while fighting a lingering ankle injury the entire season. In Week 15 at St. Louis (12/20), he became the first player in franchise history to record 500 career tackles. Ryans leads in the NFL with 397 solo tackles since 2006 and has registered 10 or more tackles in 22 of his 63 career games.



Eighth-year veteran **Kevin Bentley** is penciled in as Ryans' top backup in the middle. Bentley became the

starting SAM linebacker last year after Zac Diles broke his leg. Bentley started seven of the final eight games and posted 34 tackles, one sack and one fumble recovery. He was voted a co-captain for the special teams and is leading the team for the second consecutive season with 19 special teams tackles.

Ryans will have a new face beside him this year in rookie **Brian Cushing**, Houston's first-round pick (15th overall) in last April's draft. Cushing has started every game his rookie season and leads the AFC with 128 tackles. He also has four interceptions, two forced fumbles, a safety and 3.5 sacks so far this season.



One of the hottest position battles in training camp was at WLB, where **Zac Diles** ultimately won the starting job. Diles opened last year as the starter at SLB but saw his season cut short with a broken leg. Despite missing eight games, he still finished second on the team with 66 tackles. Diles has 118 tackles over the past two seasons.

Second-year linebacker **Xavier Adibi**, a fourth-round pick a year ago, started five games and had 34 tackles and a fumble recovery, earning him PFT/PFWA All-Rookie honors.

Cornerbacks

This offseason, **Dunta Robinson** became the first player in Texans history to be designated as a franchise player. Robinson signed the franchise designation on September 6 and immediately reclaimed a spot in the starting lineup. Robinson is the franchise's all-time leader with 13 career interceptions and is regarded as one of the hardest pound-for-pound hitters in the NFL.

Rookie fourth-round draft pick **Glover Quin** moved into the starting lineup in Week 4 vs. Oakland (10/4) and has started 11 games this season. Quin was a three-time All-Mountain West selection at New Mexico, where he finished his career with 156 tackles, seven interceptions and a school-record 32 passes defended.

Jacques Reeves suffered a broken fibula in the first week of training camp which sidelined him for the first two games of the year, but he has played his way back into shape. Reeves led the team in interceptions a year ago with four and returned one for a 44-yard touchdown at Minnesota. He was the only member of the secondary to start all 16 games and had 50 tackles and a team-high 19 passes defended, a testament to his ability to keep pace with most any receiver in the league.

Fred Bennett played in every game last season, starting six, and finished with 41 tackles, two interceptions and two forced fumbles. Bennett has the size and strength to jam receivers at the line and also to excel in run support.

Another rookie, **Brice McCain**, a sixth-round draft pick, worked extensively with the first team throughout training camp. McCain played in 49 games with 39 starts at Utah and was a three-time All-MWC pick, helping the Utes to a perfect 13-0 record. McCain picked up his first career interception in Week 12 vs. Indianapolis (11/29).

Rookie free agent **Mark Parson** played in 48 games at Ohio and registered 150 career tackles and five interceptions. As a senior last year, he finished the season with 45 tackles, two interceptions and one forced fumble. Parson went through training camp with the Texans and spent the early part of the season on the practice squad for the New Orleans Saints.

Safeties

Second-year safety **Dominique Barber** played mostly on special teams as a rookie but stepped up on defense in the final two games of last season, recording three tackles, a pass defended and his first-career sack. He scored his first career touchdown in this year's season opener on a 48-yard fumble return for touchdown. Barber returned to the starting lineup in Week 13 vs. Seattle (12/13) at FS and picked off his first career pass a week later at St. Louis (12/20).

Veteran **John Busing** joined the Texans in the offseason and has seen action in every game this season. Busing has played in 42 career games with three starts, all of which have come this season. He recorded his first career interception in the season opener vs. the New York Jets (9/13).

Bernard Pollard joined the Texans as free agent in the season's third week and made his debut in Week 4 vs. Oakland (10/4). Pollard has played in 59 career games and has seven interceptions, five forced fumbles and five fumble recoveries. He notched a career-high two interceptions in Week 9 at Indianapolis (11/8) and scored his second career touchdown in Week 13 vs. Seattle (12/13) on a 70-yard interception return for touchdown.



Tenth-year pro **Nick Ferguson** has the ability to play both safety spots. Ferguson played in 14 games with nine starts in his first season in Houston. Ferguson provided a physical presence in run support and finished the year with 52 tackles and a forced fumble.

BETTER WITH BERNARD

Houston's defense has played considerably better over the last 10 weeks than it did in the season's first three games. That improvement can be attributed to many things, but one significant change during that time was the addition of SS **Bernard Pollard** to the starting lineup.

Since the hard-hitting Pollard was inserted into the starting lineup, Houston has seen its run defense go from a league-worst 205.0 yards per game to a staunch 85.2 per game in the last 12, which is second in the league. Overall, the defense has improved by nearly 140 yards per game since Pollard joined the starting lineup.

SPECIAL TEAMS OVERVIEW

K **Kris Brown** has led the team in scoring every year of the franchise's existence and is the team's all-time leading scorer with 763. Brown's 124 points last season were the most in Texans history and his .879 field goal percentage was the highest of his career.

P **Matt Turk** has averaged 42.4 yards per punt in his career and has averaged better than 41 yards per attempt in all but one season. Turk's 42.3-yard average last season set a Texans record, topping his 41.7-yard average from 2007. Only 399 of Turk's 1,035 career punts (38.6 percent) have been returned.

WR **Jacoby Jones** holds the Texans career record for punt return average at 10.7 yards per return over the last three seasons. He set the Texans career and season records with two punt returns for touchdown last year.

WR **André Davis**, like Jones, holds the franchise record for career kickoff return average at 25.3 yards per return. He also owns the single-season record for kickoffs returned for touchdown with three in 2007.

SPECIAL TEAMS BY POSITION

Kicker

Kris Brown remains the only kicker the Texans have ever known. Brown scored 124 points last season, which was a Texans record and tied his career high set in 2001. Brown has scored 1,099 points in his 11-year career.

Punter

14-year veteran **Matt Turk** averaged a franchise-record 42.3 yards per punt last season, besting his own mark of 41.7 yards per punt in 2007. Turk's 53 punts in 2008 were the fewest in team history, again bettering his mark of 55 from 2007.

Punt Returner

WR **Jacoby Jones** emerged as one of the most dangerous return men in the league last season. He averaged 12.1 yards per punt return, which ranked fifth in the NFL and was a franchise record. He returned two punts for touchdowns last year, which put him in a tie for third in the league.

Kickoff Returner

WR **André Davis** now holds the Texans franchise record for career kickoff return average at 25.4 yards per return and his three career kickoff returns for touchdown are tied for the most in franchise history. Davis has also turned in three of the five longest kickoff returns in team history.

UNDER COVER

Under the guidance of special teams coordinator **Joe Marciano**, Houston ranks second in average yards allowed on punt returns. The 104 punt return yards allowed by the Texans is the lowest in the NFL by nearly 30 yards.

WR **Jacoby Jones** has emerged in 2009 as one of Houston's most explosive offensive weapons, with four touchdown catches on the year. Jones continues to establish himself as one of the most dangerous return men in the NFL, also.

2009 DRAFT CLASS RECAP

Versatility was the name of the game for the Texans in the 2009 NFL Draft. Five of Houston's seven draft picks played more than one position during their college careers, led by first-round draft pick (15th overall) LB **Brian Cushing** out of USC. Cushing played outside linebacker and defensive end for the Trojans and finished his career with 178 tackles and 8.5 sacks, plus an interception, 12 passes defended and two blocked punts. Cushing was named a starter at SLB the day he set foot on the practice field and will be looked upon to provide a physical presence in the Texans front seven.

Second-round pick DE **Connor Barwin** (46th overall) continued the trend of versatility. Barwin was recruited to Cincinnati as a tight end and played his first three seasons there, catching 38 passes for 539 yards and four touchdowns. Barwin was switched to defensive end before his senior season and earned All-American honors there after recording 53 tackles and 12 sacks. Barwin also played as a walk-on forward for the Bearcats basketball team.

C **Antoine Caldwell**, the Texans third-round pick (77th overall), played four of the five offensive line positions in his career at Alabama. Caldwell started 48 games for the Crimson Tide, including 34 at C, 12 at LG, one at RG and one at RT. He allowed just one sack in his final 23 games. Caldwell was also the only player in Crimson Tide history to graduate in under three years, earning his degree in Human Environmental Sciences.

With their first pick in the fourth round (112th overall), the Texans selected CB **Glover Quin** out of New Mexico. Quin was a three-time All-Mountain West Conference selection at New Mexico and set a school record with 32 career passes defended. Quin was the first Lobos defensive back to earn team Most Valuable Player honors since Brian Urlacher did so in 1999.

Houston drafted TE **Anthony Hill** with its second pick in the fourth round (122nd overall). Hill, who attended Clear Brook High School before transferring to Hargrave Military Academy, caught 61 passes for 614 yards and one touchdown in his career at North Carolina State. Hill's size (6-5, 265) allows him to excel as a blocker in addition to his pass-catching ability. Hill was placed on Injured Reserve with a knee injury late in the season.

After drafting Hill, the Texans picked up another tight end in the fifth round (152nd overall) in Rice TE **James Casey**, who was among the most versatile players in the entire 2009 draft class. A former minor-league baseball player, Casey was recruited to Rice as a linebacker but eventually played seven different positions in one game as a freshman. Casey primarily

played tight end and caught 157 passes for 1,914 yards and 17 touchdowns in his two-year career. He also played quarterback, all three receiver positions and returned punts.

The sixth round (188th overall) yielded CB **Brice McCain** out of Utah. McCain was a three-year starter and three-time All-Mountain West choice as a defensive back and kick returner. He finished his career with 103 career tackles and 21 passes defended for the Utes to go along with 37 career kick returns for 846 yards.

With their seventh-round pick (223rd overall), the Texans selected S **Troy Nolan** out of Arizona State. Nolan started 25 games over two seasons with the Sun Devils and served as a team captain in 2008. He registered 128 tackles, 13 passes defended and 10 interceptions in two seasons in Tempe and scored five touchdowns on defense. Nolan was placed on Injured Reserve with a broken hand suffered during training camp.



TEXANS GET DEFENSIVE IN FIRST

By picking LB **Brian Cushing** with the 15th overall pick, the Houston Texans continued a trend of using their first-round picks on the defensive side of the ball. Including Cushing, the Texans have picked a defensive player with six of their nine first-round picks and in five of the last six drafts.

TEXANS DRAFTING WINNERS

Nearly all of the members of Houston's 2009 draft class enjoyed great team success during the 2008 season. Four of the Texans draft picks played in BCS bowls and three were on the winning side. Two others also went to bowl games, and one led his team to the best record in school history.

First-round pick LB **Brian Cushing** was a vital part of USC's 12-1 Rose Bowl-champion team and was part of one of the most dominant defenses in recent college football history. DE **Connor Barwin** helped lead Cincinnati to the Big East title and an Orange Bowl win over Virginia Tech, finishing 11-3. C **Antoine Caldwell** helped Alabama win the SEC West and finish 12-2 with a berth in the Sugar Bowl. CB **Brice McCain**'s Utah squad beat Caldwell and Alabama in the Sugar Bowl to cap an undefeated 13-0 season.

In addition to those four, TE **James Casey** helped lead Rice to a 10-3 season, giving the Owls their most wins since 1949, and a win in the Texas Bowl which was the school's first bowl victory since 1954. TE **Anthony Hill** helped North Carolina State to a berth in the Papajohns.com Bowl, the school's first bowl berth since 2005.

In the final Associated Press poll of the season, Utah finished second, USC was third, Alabama was sixth and Cincinnati was 17th. The eight members of the Houston Texans 2009 draft class went a combined 73-31 for a winning percentage of 70.2 percent.
