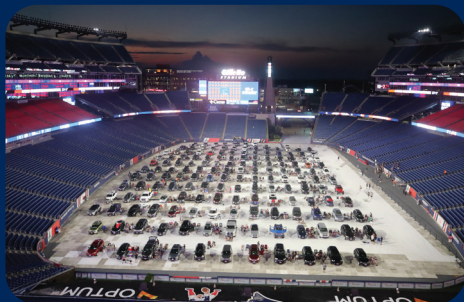

After their season was put on pause due to COVID-19, the New England Revolution and Major League Soccer resumed play with the MLS Is Back Tournament. Held throughout July at the ESPN Wide World of Sports Complex in Florida, the Revs qualified for the knockout stage before falling 1-0 to the Philadelphia Union.

Even though the matches were held in Orlando, Revolution fans still packed Gillette Stadium. The Revs held three drive-in watch parties on the Gillette Stadium field, allowing fans to gather and cheer on their team in a safe and socially distanced fashion. Fans parked on the stadium field and watched the game on the north and south end zone video boards.

Patriots kick off 2020 season

On Sunday, Sept. 13, the New England Patriots kicked off the 2020 season against the Miami Dolphins, securing the 21-11 win. Although the game took place against a familiar division foe and within the friendly confines of Gillette Stadium, this home opener was different from all the others.

Instead of the packed stands on a typical fall Sunday, the Patriots secured their first win of the season in front of just a handful of essential gameday personnel and media members, with the only crowd noise coming from NFL-supplied audio at the league-regulated 70 decibels. Due to COVID-19, Gillette Stadium cannot host fans through at least September, meaning the first two home games of the 2020

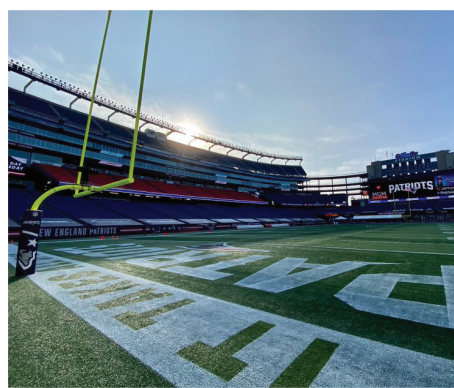
season looked different than the hundreds of other ones before.

PIP Fund Donates \$8,000 to Town Non-Profit Organizations

Kenny Chesney, Rammstein announce 2021 rescheduled Gillette Stadium concert dates

After his 2020 tour was postponed due to COVID-19, country superstar Kenny Chesney recently announced his rescheduled 2021 dates, including two shows at Gillette Stadium. Chesney will headline the birthplace of "No Shoes Nation" for his venue-record 20th and 21st times on Aug. 27 and Aug. 28, 2021.

The 18-stop Chillaxification Tour will feature the same lineup of special guests Florida Georgia Line, Old Dominion and Michael Franti & Spearhead and culminates at Gillette Stadium. Original tickets are automatically valid for the rescheduled dates.

German rock band Rammstein also announced

their 2021 rescheduled dates, including their debut show at Gillette Stadium Sept. 8, 2021. The group, known for their breath-taking pyrotechnics, will perform in the Boston market for the first time as part of their nine-stop North American tour. All tickets for the original shows will be honored at

the rescheduled dates, and tickets are still available at Ticketmaster.com.

Justin Bieber also announced his Gillette Stadium show, originally postponed from Sept. 17, 2020, has been canceled. Purchased tickets have automatically been refunded from point of purchase.

The safe and socially distanced experience features some of the largest dinosaurs to ever roam the earth, including a 50-foot Megalodon and 80-foot Spinosaurus. Paired with an online audio tour, Jurassic Quest is an educational and exciting experience offering fun for the whole family.

The Kraft family teamed up with the Foxboro Working Mothers group to send 17 Foxborough families to this prehistoric event free of charge. Among the families in

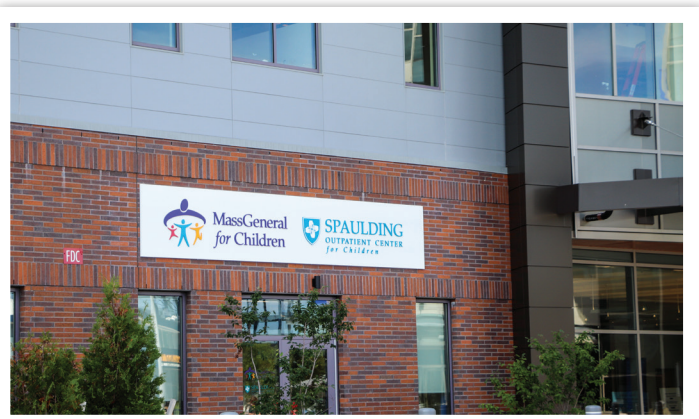

Gillette Stadium, Foxborough Public Safety team up for COVID-19 response training

In preparation for a season operating under the new normal and as part of a continued partnership, Foxborough Public Safety, led by Fire Chief Kelleher and Police Chief Grace, Gillette Stadium, Fallon Ambulance and Brigham and Women's Hospital teamed up for COVID-19 training at the stadium. The group came together at Gillette Stadium to test their comprehensive medical public safety plan.

The three-hour session covered five in-depth scenarios that included fans, media and game day staff. Each scenario was different and allowed each group to get in a test run of how they would respond should a similar situation arise on an event day. The training also covered the use of personal protective equipment, and recognizing how each entity can work together to solve any issues that may arise.

Each exercise was treated like it took place during an actual game day, with a call for service going out and each agency responding to

the area just like they would on a game day. Actors made up of Foxborough High School students and members of the Foxborough Fire Explorers post, portrayed people needing assistance in each scenario, and each actor was given specific instructions on how to behave, ensuring the exercise accurately reflected a potential game day scenario. Doctors from Brigham and Women's Hospital, including Dr. Eric Goralnick, Brigham's medical director of emergency preparedness, were on hand to monitor each scenario and provide feedback.

Overall, the training exercise was a great success, surpassing evaluation standards set forth by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Massachusetts Department of Public Health and each participating agency. As the town and Gillette Stadium prepared for a unique season, the training proved to be a great example of the strong public-private partnership between Gillette Stadium and the Town of Foxborough.



Foxboro Station Service Update

As part of system-wide changes across the MBTA and commuter rail, Foxboro Station service will be temporarily paused effective Nov. 2, 2020 until May 2021, contingent on COVID-19. Prior to these extenuating

circumstances, Foxboro Station under the partnership of the Town of Foxborough, MassDOT, MBTA and the Kraft Group, demonstrated monthly growth in key metrics, including ridership, and remains a key economic

Among the fans in attendance were residents Linda Fortier and her daughter; Jessica Thompson and her two sons; Mark Boucher and his wife and son; and Sean Mulligan and his family.

Fortier lives a mile from Gillette Stadium and has been a Season Ticket Member for 15 years. Fortier and her daughter, also a Season Ticket Member, attended two watch parties.

"It's always exciting when you get to watch a game with other fans," Fortier said. "It was a really cool, unique idea to be able to drive on the field and watch the game on the big screens."

Thompson has lived in town and held season tickets for the past three years. She attended the first watch party, a Revolution 1-0 win over the Montreal Impact, with her two sons Noah and Henry. Thompson's sons enjoyed the game from the roof of her minivan and the Boston Herald even snapped a photo of them that made it into the paper.

"The Revolution is my bonding time with my boys, that's our thing," Thompson said. "To be able to watch a game with them after months was just so great. I had taken them up to use the



restroom, and we paused up at the top and looked down at the field and it looked incredible with all the cars. And then when the Revs scored, they dimmed and flashed the lights like they do in a regular game, and everybody was honking their horns. My boys thought that was the greatest thing ever."

Boucher also attended the first watch party with his wife and son. The family has lived in Foxborough since 2016 when Boucher retired from the Air Force, and has been a Revolution Season Ticket Member for two seasons. Boucher described the experience of being

around the fans again for a match as special.

"We were excited to go because who gets to drive on the field at Gillette Stadium?" Boucher said. "We wanted to be around fans again because watching the games from home isn't nearly as exciting. The whole experience was awesome and we all really enjoyed it."

Mulligan is a longtime resident and attended the first and third watch parties with his wife, son and daughter. The family enjoyed the unique nature of the event, and the ease of getting in and out of the stadium.

"We thought it was such a neat opportunity to go inside the stadium, watch the Revs on the big screen, and do something a little different," Mulligan said. "The Revs front office is great about trying to keep things exciting and new and engage fans. It was amazing that all proceeds went to charity too."

Tickets to each event were \$40 per vehicle, with all proceeds benefiting the United Negro College Fund's Virtual Walk for Education, the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People Boston Branch, and Special Olympics Massachusetts.

Center and Foxboro Alumni Association to display the names and photos of graduating seniors on the MRPAC sign;

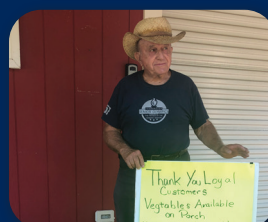
- **Joe Erhard** and **Ryan Kelley** from the Foxboro Skatepark Association for their work maintaining, repairing and fundraising for the Skatepark;

PIP Fund Boosts Bartel Family with \$7,000 Grant

When Cherie and Kevin Bartel decided to move to Foxborough with their three children this past December, they had similar reasons to many other families: the town's reputation for great schools, sports teams, and family-friendly neighborhoods. However, one unexpected benefit was the assistance of the Partners in Patriotism Fund (PIP Fund).

Cherie and Kevin Bartel applied to the PIP Fund on a whim to cover the cost of an Amico Safe Patient Handling Ceiling Life Track System for their 14-year-old daughter Bella. Bella was born with hydrocephalus, which is the buildup of fluid in the brain, creating extreme pressure. To relieve this pressure, doctors needed to put a VP shunt in her brain, leaving Bella paralyzed, non-verbal and legally blind on the entire left side of her body.

As Bella has gotten older, the family realized the need for the Life Track System to help them with transfers and to keep her safe, and decided to apply to the PIP Fund for assistance. After hearing Bella's story, the PIP Fund granted the Bartel family's request, funding them \$7,063 to completely cover the cost of the new system. Installed this fall by 101 Mobility, the Amico Safe Patient Handling Ceiling Life Track System operates on a track around the perimeter of Bella's room. The Life Track System is installed in the ceiling as an overhead

lift, and is equipped with a lifting mechanism and harness that manually or automatically transfers Bella safely to and from her wheelchair and around her room.

"This system is a game-changer for our family, and a game-changer for Bella," Cherie said. "It enables us to get her up out of bed every day and into her wheelchair, to get her to school, to get her to her therapy and to get her outside to enjoy fresh air. Even more than that, it will enable her to stay in her home with her family and let us keep her safe, which is incredible."

Bella attends the Kennedy Day School in Brighton,

where she receives full therapy services including physical therapy, occupational therapy, and speech, vision and music therapy. When she's not at school, Bella enjoys spending time outside and listening to a wide variety of music ranging from classical to Taylor Swift. And Bella has settled into her new town nicely. Even though the Bartels have only lived in Foxborough since December, they already feel embraced by the community.

"When you settle into a new home in a new town, you always think, 'Am I making the right move?' And I have to tell you, Bella

receiving this grant and the people of Foxborough, our neighbors and people on the street who just stop and say hi to Bella – it's just so overwhelming," Cherie said. "What an incredible organization to give back like that to the community and to people like Bella who truly could use a hand to change and impact her life."

"We would like to say thank you to the Partners in Patriotism Fund for choosing Bella to receive this grant," Kevin said. "We're truly grateful and appreciative from the bottom of our hearts. This is huge for Bella and it will impact her life tremendously."

Gillette Stadium, Boston Continue Push to Host 2026 Men's World Cup

Gillette Stadium's push to host matches for the 2026 World Cup took another step forward earlier this summer. Members of Boston's 2026 Bid Host Committee met virtually with FIFA and U.S. Soccer to present a shared vision to be one of the final 10 United States host cities for the 2026 FIFA Men's World Cup™.

The meeting was the first opportunity for Boston to make its pitch directly to FIFA officials. The comprehensive plan calls for fan activations and team training sites throughout the city, and all World Cup matches would be played at Gillette Stadium. Gillette has been a mainstay of international soccer throughout the years, hosting matches for the 1994 FIFA Men's World Cup and the 1999 and 2003 FIFA Women's World Cups, and hosting the International Champions Cup in recent years.

Boston is one of 17 potential U.S. host cities (from an original 23 U.S. candidate cities), along with Atlanta, Baltimore, Cincinnati, Dallas, Denver, Houston, Kansas City, Los Angeles, Miami, Nashville, New York/New Jersey, Orlando, Philadelphia, San Francisco Bay Area, Seattle and Washington, DC.

The 2026 FIFA Men's World Cup™ will be the largest to date with 80 matches (60 in U.S., 10 in Canada, and 10 in Mexico), featuring 48 national teams. The international tournament was last held in the United States in 1994, with Gillette Stadium hosting matches featuring Argentina, Bolivia, Greece, Italy, Korea Republic, Nigeria and Spain.

As a next step in the selection process, FIFA will conduct site visits to all candidate host cities and venues. The timeline for these visits are still unknown due to COVID-19 travel impacts, but a final decision on the host city locations is expected sometime in mid-2021.
