### 2020 HIGHLIGHTS

- Registered 15 receipts. for 183 yds. and 1 TD vs. Phi. (10/4), his 13th career TD and 9th career game with 100-or-more rec. yds.
- Became the first TE in NFL history to register 15-or-more receipts. and 175-or-more yds. in a single game.
- His 15 receipts. were the most in a single game by a TE in franchise history and the most by any member of the 49ers since WR Terrell Owens registered 20 receipts. vs. Chi. (12/17/00).

- Hauled in 7 receipts. for 109 yds. and 1 TD vs. LAR (10/18), including a 44-yd. TD receipt. on 4th-and-2. His 109 rec. yds. marked his 2nd 100-yd. rec. game of the season and 10th of his career. His 10 games with 100-or-more rec. yds. are the 4th-most 100-yd. games by a TE in their first 50 career games (TE Rob Gronkowski - 12, TE Kellen Winslow - 14, TE Mike Ditka - 14).
- Registered 100-or-more rec. yds. in 3 of his past 4 games against the Rams. Also scored a TD in 4 of the past 5 matchups against the Rams.

### KITTLE'S GOLDEN NUGGETS

- In 2019, was the recipient of the 49ers Len Eshmont Award, which is voted on by the players and is given to the 49er who best exemplifies the inspirational and courageous play of Len Eshmont, an original member of the 1946 49ers team.
- Named the recipient of the 2018 Bill Walsh Award, which was established in 2004 in honor of San Francisco's Hall of Fame Head Coach. The award, which is voted on by the coaching staff, is given to the 49er who has best represented the standard of professional excellence established by Walsh. Walsh served as the team's head coach for 10 seasons from 1979-88. In that time, he compiled a record of 102-63-1 and led the team to three Super Bowls. He was twice named Coach of the Year (1981, 1984) and was later named Coach of the Decade for the 1980s.
- His father, Bruce, was an offensive lineman at Iowa where he played in the 1982 Rose Bowl before suffering a career-ending injury in training camp with Washington in 1982. Following his football career, Bruce went on to become an assistant coach at Oklahoma University (2010-12).
- After more than five years as a criminal defense attorney, Bruce Kittle is the offensive line coach at Lipscomb Academy (Nashville, TN) HS, under former 49ers QB Trent Dilfer.
- Bruce writes George a letter prior to each game he plays that he reads on the bus on the way to the stadium.
- Kittle's cousin, Henry Krieger-Coble, signed with the Denver Broncos as an undrafted free agent TE in 2016. The two were teammates at Iowa.

## GOLDMINE

- During the 2020 NFL Combine, Kittle teamed up with Rich Eisen in support of the Run Rich Run event. Each combine, Eisen runs the 40-yard dash to raise money for St. Jude's Children's Research Hospital. Kittle joined Eisen, with the assistance of Von, a St. Jude's patient, and Jerry Rice, in timing his 40-yard dash. George then presented a \$10,000 donation to St. Jude's on behalf of him and his wife, Claire. "I'm just such a fan of Rich and that he does that every year through St. Jude's," Kittle said. "I'm a big fan of the Iowa Children's Hospital, so any time I can give back, I'm just a fan of that, any time I can give back to help kids, they deserve it, and I just love what Rich is doing, and so I thought I could help out a little bit."

- Kittle partnered with the Jessie Rees Foundation to pass out JoyJars filled with toys and games at a local children's hospital. Kittle spearheaded the event and was joined by several of his teammates including, TE Garrett Celek, TE Ross Dwelley, TE Daniel Helm, QB Nick Mullens and LB Fred Warner who helped him spread holiday cheer and lift the spirits of everyone they met.



- The 49ers and their families hosted 450 underserved boys and girls from the Bay Area for the first-ever 49ers Hope for the Holidays event. Each child had a once-in-a-lifetime experience traveling through Levi's Stadium and left with a brand new bike, helmet, lock, haircut, shoes, toys, glasses, backpack, dinner and more.



- NFL players had the opportunity to participate in the NFL's annual My Cause, My Cleats campaign during Week 14 of the 2019 season. Kittle and his teammates represented their respective causes with custom-designed cleats in an effort to raise awareness and funding. Kittle represented TAPS, saying, "I play for the fallen heroes and their families."



- The 49ers hosted the third annual Crucial Catch Fashion Show presented by Dignity Health in October of 2019, featuring cancer warriors representing all cancers as they modeled apparel donated by Levi's. Kittle and his teammates were paired with each of the warriors to share their stories of strength and courage with the audience and walk the runway.



- Kittle is an avid fan of the WWE. In May of 2017, he took time to visit the Black and Brave Wrestling Academy in Iowa, which is co-owned by one of Kittle's favorite wrestlers, WWE superstar Seth Rollins. At a pro wrestling event on the same weekend, Kittle got to live out one of his dreams and get into the ring, where he delivered a Stone Cold Stunner, a move made famous by his favorite wrestler of all-time, Steve Austin. "I felt like a kid," Kittle said.



- The 49ers worked alongside the humanitarian-relief organization Convoy of Hope in December of 2018, and hosted 1,500 guests in-need from Bay Area nonprofits and schools at Levi's® Stadium for a free holiday resource fair. Kittle and his 49ers teammates distributed groceries, toys, books, shoes and other holiday offerings to the guests. The attendees also received haircuts, utilized health resources and took family portraits or professional headshots. Convoy of Hope is a nonprofit organization that directs children's feeding initiatives, hosts community outreach programs and provides disaster response resources to those in need in the Bay Area and throughout the world.



- After posing for a photoshoot, Kittle and his teammates joined Levi's in support of breast, colon and pediatric cancer warriors at the Crucial Catch Fashion Show presented by Dignity Health in October of 2018. 49ers players and cancer warriors took to the runway to show off their attire and share their stories of strength and courage with the audience.

- The 49ers joined forces with Martha's Kitchen of San Jose as part of their Community Tuesday kickoff event in September of 2018. Kittle and teammates took part in the event by serving dinner to nearly 200 residents in need, refilling beverages and bussing tables. Both the 49ers and Levi's Stadium partner with Martha's Kitchen throughout the year by donating excess food after stadium events. Martha's Kitchen's mission is to "feed the hungry with dignity, no questions asked, no judgements made."
- In April of 2018, along with several teammates, Kittle attended the eighth annual UCSF Benioff Children's Hospital Prom in San Francisco.

## 2019

- Started all 14 games in which he appeared and registered 85 recpts. for 1,053 yds. and tied his single-season career-high 5 TDs. Also added a single-season career-high 5 carries for 22 yds. Started all 3 postseason games and notched 8 recpts. for 71 yds.
- Registered 3 recpts. for 54 yds. at Cin (9/15). With 54 rec. yds. on the day, he reached 2,000 career rec. yds. in 33 career regular season games, which ranks t-3rd in NFL history as the fastest TE to reach 2,000-or-more career rec. yds.
- Registered 6 recpts. for 70 yds. and 1 TD vs. Cle. (10/7). He also had 1 carry for 18 yds., which marked the longest rush of his career.
- Tallied 8 recpts. for 103 yds. (12.9 avg.) at LAR (10/13). It marked his first 100-yd. game of the season.
- Ended the game at Arz.(10/31) with 6 recpts. for 79 yds. and 1 TD.
- Registered 6 recpts. for a season-high 129 yds. and 1 TD vs. GB (11/24). It marked his 7th career 100-yd. game and 2nd of the season.
- Registered 6 recpts. for 67 yds. and 1 TD at NO (12/8). On 4th-and-2, with 0:39 seconds left in the game, he hauled in a short pass from Garoppolo and rumbled 39 yards down the sideline, helping to set up the game-winning FG.
- Registered a then career-high 13 recpts. for 134 yds. vs. Atl. (12/15).
- Registered 5 recpts. for 79 yds. and 1 TD vs. LAR (12/21). His 7-yd. TD recpt. was his 5th on the season and 12th of his career.

- Registered 100-or-more yds. 4 times on the season, the most 100-yd. games by a TE in a single season in franchise history. It also marked the first time a member of the 49ers has registered four games of 100-or-more yds. in a season since WR Michael Crabtree accomplished the feat in 2012 [113 yds. vs. Buf. (10/7/12), 101 yds. at StL. (12/2/12), 107 yds. at NE (12/16/12) & 172 yds. vs. Arz. (12/30/12)].
- He is the first 49ers TE to register at least 6 games with 90-or-more rec. yds. [6 games - 90 at Min. (9/9); 125 at LAC (9/30); 98 vs. LAR (10/21); 108 vs. Oak. (11/1); 210 vs. Den. - Registered 7 recpts. for a career-high 210 yds. and 1 TD vs. Den. (12/9). His 210 rec. yds. are the most in a single game by a TE in franchise history and the 8th-most among all players. His 210 rec. yds are also the 3rd-most by a TE in a single game in the NFL since 1960.
- Hauled in a career-long 85-yd. TD versus the Broncos, matching the 11th-longest play from scrimmage in franchise history, in addition to matching the 7th-longest pass play in team history [QB Jim Plunkett to RB Delvin Williams - 85t vs. Was. (11/7/76)]. His 85-yd. TD recpt. was the longest by a 49ers player since 9/25/05 (QB Tim Rattay to WR Brandon Lloyd - 89t vs. Dal.).
- According to Elias Sports Bureau, his 210 rec. yds. in the 1st half against Denver were the most in the first half of an NFL game since Seattle Seahawks WR Steve Largent registered 224 rec. yds. in the 1st half at Det. (10/18/87).
- With 210 rec. yds. on the day, became the first 49ers TE to eclipse the 1,000-yd. receiving mark and set the franchise record for most yds. in a single season by a 49ers TE. He became the first member of the 49ers to register at least 1,000 rec. yds. in a single season since WR Anquan Boldin registered 1,062 rec. yds. in 2014.
- With 3 recpts. of 70-or-more yds. this season, joins WR Odell Beckham Jr. (3 in 2015 with NYG) and WR Torrey Smith (3 in 2015 with SF) as the only players to have 3-or-more recpts. of 70-plus yds. in a single season since 2015.
- Tied a career high with 9 recpts. for 149 yds. and 1 TD at LAR (12/30), finishing the season with 1,377 rec. yds., the most in a single season by a TE in NFL history.

## 2017

- Played in 15 games (7 starts) and notched 43 receipts. for 515 yds. and 2 TDs. His 515 rec. yds. are the most by a 49ers rookie TE since the merger in 1970.
- Started in his NFL debut vs. Car. (9/10) in the season opener and registered 5 receipts. for 27 yds.

- Registered his 1st career 100-yd. game at LAR (12/31), hauling in 4 receipts. for 100 yds., including a career-long 44-yd. receipt. It marked the 1st 100-yd. game for a 49ers TE since 10/13/13 (TE Vernon Davis - 8 receipts. for 180 yds. and 2 TDs vs. Arz.). He was the only rookie TE to record a 100-yd. rec. game in 2017.

As a sophomore, earned Academic All-Big Ten honors. Played in 12 games and registered 1 receipt. for 25 yds. In 2013, played in 12 games and recorded 5 receipts. for 108 yds. Also earned Academic All-Big Ten honors. Redshirted in 2012.
