## 20 PROSPECTS TO ATTEND NFL DRAFT

Twenty prospects are confirmed to attend the 2022 NFL Draft in Las Vegas, Nevada, the NFL announced.

Alabama, Georgia and Ohio State will each have two players on-site. The Southeastern Conference leads all conferences with six prospects confirmed to attend, followed by the Big Ten (four players), Pac-12 (four) and Atlantic Coast Conference (three).

The draft begins with the first round on Thursday night, April 28, and continues Friday, April 29, with Rounds 2-3. The draft will conclude on Saturday, April 30, with Rounds 4-7.

The NFL Draft, which was held in Cleveland last year, will be hosted in the state of Nevada for the first time.

The 2022 NFL Draft will consist of 262 selections (including 39 compensatory choices) and tie 2003 for the most in a Draft since the NFL instituted the seven-round format in 1994

Entering the 2022 NFL Draft, eight teams have multiple first round selections: **DETROIT** (#2, #32), **GREEN BAY** (#22, #28), **HOUSTON** (#3, #13), **KANSAS CITY** (#29, #30), **NEW YORK GIANTS** (#5, #7), **NEW YORK JETS** (#4, #10), **NEW ORLEANS** (#16, #19) and **PHILADELPHIA** (#15, #18).

The most teams to make multiple first-round selections in a single draft since 1967 is six (four different Drafts, most recently 2020).

Eight teams currently do not have a first-round pick in the 2022 NFL Draft. The most teams to not make a first-round pick in a single Draft since 1967 is seven (four different Drafts, most recently 2020).

## NFL DRAFT FACTS AND FIGURES

**WHAT:** 87th Annual National Football League Player Selection Meeting.

**WHERE:** Las Vegas, Nevada.

**WHEN:** 5:00 PM PT / 8:00 PM ET - Thursday, April 28 (Round 1).  
4:00 PM PT / 7:00 PM ET - Friday, April 29 (Rounds 2-3).  
9:00 AM PT / 12:00 PM ET - Saturday, April 30 (Rounds 4-7).

The first round will conclude on Thursday by approximately 8:30 PM PT (11:30 PM ET). In 2021, the first round consumed three hours and 44 minutes. The second and third rounds will conclude on Friday by approximately 8:00 PM PT (11:00 PM ET). The second and third rounds took a combined four hours and 26 minutes in 2021. The draft will conclude by approximately 3:30 PM PT (6:30 PM ET) on Saturday with the final four rounds. Rounds 4 through 7 took six hours and 42 minutes in 2021.

**ROUNDS:** Seven Rounds - Round 1 on Thursday, April 28; Rounds 2 and 3 on Friday, April 29; and Rounds 4 through 7 on Saturday, April 30.

There will be 262 selections, including 39 compensatory choices that have been awarded to 16 teams that either experienced a net loss of certain quality unrestricted free agents last year or received special selections under a 2020 amendment to the League's Collective Bargaining Agreement, which was agreed upon by the NFL and the NFLPA to promote equal employment opportunities and an inclusive workforce within NFL clubs.

The following 39 compensatory choices will supplement the 223 regular choices in the seven rounds:

**Round 3:** Detroit, 33; New Orleans, 34; Cleveland, 35; Baltimore, 36; Philadelphia (from New Orleans), 37; Miami (from San Francisco), 38; Kansas City, 39; Los Angeles Rams, 40; San Francisco, 41.

**Round 4:** Pittsburgh, 33; Baltimore, 34; Green Bay, 35; Baltimore, 36; Los Angeles Rams, 37; Tennessee, 38.

**Round 5:** Dallas, 33; Detroit, 34; Dallas, 35; Indianapolis, 36.

**Round 6:** Los Angeles Rams, 33; Los Angeles Rams, 34; Atlanta, 35; Los Angeles Chargers, 36; Arizona, 37; Indianapolis, 38; Detroit, 39; Los Angeles Rams, 40; Tennessee, 41; San Francisco, 42; San Francisco, 43.

*Draft Today* continues **Friday, April 29** and **Saturday, April 30** following each day of the 2022 NFL Draft.

On **Sunday, May 1**, *Draft Today* recaps the 2022 NFL Draft and passes out Draft Grades for each team with Smith, Zierlein and **Bucky Brooks**. This edition streams at 5:00 PM ET on NFL.com, the NFL app and YouTube, and airs at 6:00 PM ET on NFL Network.

# FOOTBALL IS FAMILY

## 1ST ROUND FATHERS & SONS

In 2019, the San Francisco 49ers selected Ohio State defensive end **NICK BOSA** with the second overall pick and he joined his brother, **JOEY BOSA** (No. 3 overall in 2016, San Diego Chargers), and his father, **JOHN BOSA** (No. 16 overall in 1987, Miami) as first-round selections.

Additionally, Pittsburgh selected linebacker **DEVIN BUSH JR.** 10th overall in 2019, who joined his father, **DEVIN BUSH SR.** (No. 26 overall in 1995, Atlanta), as a first-round selection in the NFL Draft.

Bosa and Bush became the 10th and 11th players to join their fathers as first-round selections since 1967.

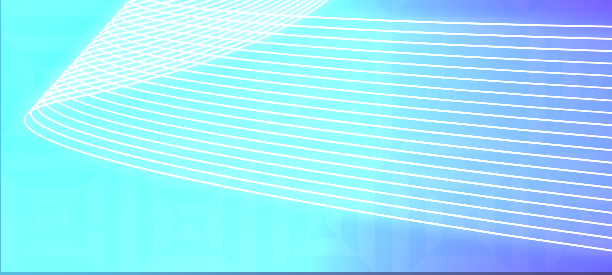

# INTERNATIONAL TIES



Among the draft-eligible prospects for the 2022 NFL Draft, many have international ties, including:

- **ARNOLD EBIKETIE** (ebb-uh-KAY-tee; DE, Penn State): A native of Yaoundé, Cameroon, he moved to Maryland with his family when he was 12. He began playing football as a sophomore in high school.



- **JOHN METCHIE III** (WR, Alabama): Born in Taiwan, his family moved to Ghana when he was young before emigrating to Canada when he was six years old. Moved from Brampton, Ontario, Canada to Maryland for high school.



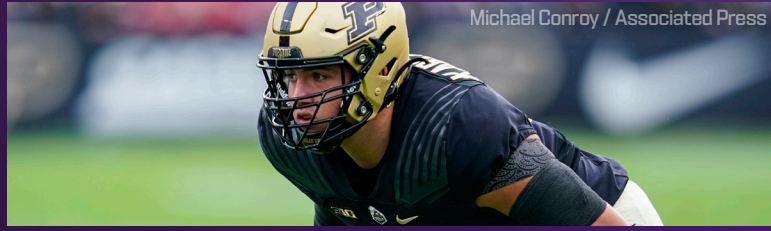
- **DANIEL FAALELE** (FAH-ah-LAY-lay; OL, Minnesota): A native of Melbourne, Australia, he moved to Florida for high school. He grew up playing rugby before switching to football when he moved to the United States.



- **DAVID OJABO** (oh-JOBB-oh; DE, Michigan): Born in Port Harcourt, Nigeria, his family moved to Aberdeen, Scotland, in 2007 before he came to the United States for high school. He began playing football in the 10th grade.



- **GEORGE KARLAFTIS** (kar-LOFT-iss; DE, Purdue): A native of Athens, Greece, he moved to Indiana with his mother and two siblings in 2014. He started playing football in the eighth grade.



- **BERNHARD RAIMANN** (BERR-nard RY-man; OL, Central Michigan): A native of Steinbrunn, Austria, he moved to Michigan as part of a high school exchange program. He previously played American football in Austria before moving to the United States.



- **JESSE LUKETA** (loo-KETT-uh; LB, Penn State): A native of Ottawa, Ontario, Canada he moved to Pennsylvania when he was 15 for high school.



## HISTORY AT THE 2021 NFL DRAFT

During the 2021 NFL Draft, a record-tying four Canadian players were selected: **JEVON HOLLAND** (36th overall by Miami), **BENJAMIN ST-JUSTE** (74th by Washington), **JOSH PALMER** (77th by the Los Angeles Chargers) and **CHUBA HUBBARD** (126th by Carolina).

# DRAFT TRENDS

## QUARTERBACKS

The 2022 NFL Draft has as many as five quarterbacks who could be selected in the first round, including Pittsburgh's **KENNY PICKETT** and Liberty's **MALIK WILLIS**. This can become the ninth consecutive draft with multiple quarterbacks selected in the first round, the second-longest streak in the common draft era.

If three quarterbacks are selected, it would be the seventh consecutive draft with at least three quarterbacks drafted in the first round, extending the longest streak in the common-draft era.

## OFFENSIVE LINE

Mississippi State's **CHARLES CROSS**, North Carolina State's **IKEM EKWONU**, Alabama's **EVAN NEAL** and Northern Iowa's **TREVOR PENNING** lead a deep offensive line class for the 2022 NFL Draft.

If four offensive linemen are chosen in the top-15 picks, it would mark the fourth NFL Draft since 2000 to feature at least four offensive linemen selected in the top 15, joining 2013 (six), 2020 (four) and 2008 (four).

If two are selected in the top five, it would become the fifth NFL Draft to have multiple offensive linemen selected in the top five since 1967.

## RUNNING BACKS

Iowa State's **BREECE HALL** and Michigan State's **KENNETH WALKER** headline the running back class in the 2022 NFL Draft.

If a running back is selected in the first round, it would mark the eighth consecutive NFL Draft with a running back chosen in the first round (2015-21).

## WIDE RECEIVERS

Arkansas' **TREYLON BURKS**, Penn State's **JAHAN DOTSON**, USC's **DRAKE LONDON**, Ohio State's **CHRIS OLAVE** and **GARRETT WILSON**, and Alabama's **JAMESON WILLIAMS** lead a talent crop of wide receivers for the 2022 NFL Draft.

If multiple wide receivers are selected in the first round, it would be the 14th consecutive draft to do so, the longest streak during the common draft era.

The record for most receivers drafted in the first round is seven in 2004. Since 1967, seven drafts have had six wide receivers selected in the first round with the most recent being 2020.



# DRAFT TRENDS

## DEFENSIVE LINE

Michigan's **AIDAN HUTCHINSON**, Oregon's **KAYVON THIBODEAUX** and Georgia's **TRAVON WALKER** spearhead the 2022 NFL Draft Class for defensive linemen. If they are selected with the first three picks, it would mark the first time in the common-draft era that three defensive linemen were the top-three selections.

Since 1967, seven drafts have had multiple defensive linemen selected in the top-three picks. Four defensive ends have been selected No. 1 overall since 2000.

Georgia's **JORDAN DAVIS** and **DEVONTE WYATT** are expected to be among the first interior defensive linemen taken in the 2022 NFL Draft. Georgia can become the third school to have at least four interior defensive linemen selected in the first round since 2000.

## LINEBACKERS

Utah's **DEVIN LLOYD** and Georgia's **NAKOBE DEAN** highlight the 2022 NFL Draft class of linebackers. A linebacker has been selected within the top 15 picks in eight consecutive Drafts and at least two linebackers have been chosen in the first round in 18 consecutive drafts (2004-21).

## DEFENSIVE BACKS

Cincinnati's **SAUCE GARDNER**, Notre Dame's **KYLE HAMILTON** and LSU's **DEREK STINGLEY** lead the defensive back class for the 2022 NFL Draft.

2022 can become the fourth Draft since 2000 in which three defensive backs were selected in the top-10.

If Stingley is chosen in the top-10, LSU can become the third school since 1967 to have five defensive backs selected with a top-10 pick, joining Ohio State and Texas.

### DRAFT TIMES

*NOTE: The first combined (AFL-NFL) draft in 1967 consisted of 17 rounds. In 1977, the draft was reduced to 12 rounds. There were eight rounds in 1993 and seven since 1994.*

The 1964 Draft was held December 2-3 in Chicago.

Due to competition with the AFL, when NFL teams were on the clock they would negotiate with a player and attempt to get an agreement before announcing their selection. Sometimes if there was no agreement, they would move on to another player and try to get him to sign. It took eight hours and eight minutes to draft 14 players, which was an NFL record at the time.

Consequently, NFL Commissioner Pete Rozelle implemented a 30-minute time limit for Round 2 and a 15-minute limit for Rounds 3 and 4, the first time limits for an NFL Draft.

Underscoring just how leisurely the pace was in the first round of the 1964 NFL Draft, Detroit General Manager Edwin Anderson traveled to Los Angeles to negotiate with Southern California quarterback Pete Beathard after the Lions had selected him with the fifth choice. Upon his arrival in LA, Anderson called the Lions' office for an update on the Draft and was astonished to learn that it was still in the second round.

The first round in 1965 was even longer, nine hours and 56 minutes for 16 selections, a record that presumably will stand forever.

When the first common Draft was held in 1967, the time limits were formalized, initially at 15 minutes for the first two rounds, and five minutes for all other rounds. Adjustments have been made periodically ever since.
