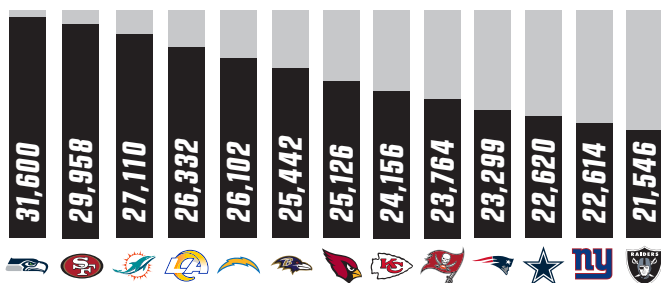

Las Vegas opponents in 2023 had a combined record of 150-136-2 (.524) in 2022, giving the Raiders the 10th hardest strength of schedule in 2023.

The Raiders will play two Monday Night Football Games in 2023, Week 5 vs. GB and Week 8 at DET. The Raiders own a .574 win percentage (42-31-1) on MNF since its inception in 1970 - the sixth-best mark in the NFL (min. 20 games).

The Raiders will look to extend their six-game win streak against the Denver Broncos in the season opener on Sept. 10. Their six-game streak is the longest active win streak against any team for the Raiders and tied for the second-longest win streak against the Broncos in franchise history - the longest since 1992-94 (6).

SCHEDULE HIGHLIGHTS

- The Raiders will open the season at the Denver Broncos, marking the second-consecutive season the Silver and Black will travel to an AFC West opponent for the season opener and the first time visiting the Broncos in Week 1 since 2011.
- Green Bay, Minnesota, New York Giants, New York Jets and Pittsburgh will each make their first-ever visit to Allegiant Stadium in the regular season.
- Las Vegas' schedule includes six games against playoff teams from 2022.
- The Raiders open the season with back-to-back road games for the first time since 2011. In 2011, the Raiders also opened with the Broncos in Week 1 and the Bills in Week 2.
- Three of the team's first four games of the season will come on the road for the first time since 2017.
- Las Vegas will play road games in Chicago and Detroit, the first time in each of those cities since 2015.
- Las Vegas will have three back-to-back road trips this season (Weeks 1-2, 7-8 and 15-16).
- The Raiders will have a bye in Week 13, the team's latest bye week during a season since 2017. Dating back to 1998, the Silver and Black have never had a bye week later than Week 10 (three times).
- The season finale will be at home against the Broncos, marking just the fourth time since 2013 the Raiders will conclude their season at home. It is also the 13th-straight year in which the Silver and Black will face an AFC West opponent in the season finale.
- The Raiders will play their first prime-time game of the season on Sunday Night Football in Week 3 against the Steelers, marking their earliest appearance on SNF during the regular season since Week 3 of 2017.
- The Raiders won't face the Kansas City Chiefs for the first time this season until Week 12, marking the latest they will have faced the Chiefs for the first time in a season since Week 13 of 2018.
- The Raiders have six prime-time games in 2023, the most the team has played in the franchise's history. The team's previous high was five games back in 2017. Las Vegas will play one prime-time game in September, two in October, one in November and two in December.

2023 SCHEDULE NOTES

SILVER AND BLACK IN PRIME TIME

- The Raiders are slated for six prime-time games in 2023, hosting four and playing two on the road. The Raiders will face Pittsburgh at home for an NBC Sunday Night Football matchup in Week 3 and will play in two ESPN Monday Night contests, one at home against Green Bay (Week 5) and another at Detroit (Week 8). In Week 10, the Raiders will host the Jets for an NBC Sunday Night Game. For the last prime-time game, the Silver and Black will host the Chargers in an Amazon Thursday Night Football game for Week 15, then face the Chiefs at Arrowhead Stadium on Christmas Day in Week 16.
- The Raiders' six prime-time games in 2023 are the most in a single season in franchise history. The teams' previous high was five prime-time games in 2017. Las Vegas will play one prime-time game in September, two in October, one in November and two in December. The Raiders own a 74-64-1 (.536) all-time record in prime-time games.
- The Week 3 contest against Pittsburgh will mark the first Sunday Night Football matchup with the Steelers since 2002. This marks the fifth all-time prime-time game between the two clubs with Las Vegas holding a 3-1 record.
- The Raiders two contests on Sunday Night (Week 3 vs. Pittsburgh and Week 10 vs. New York Jets) are their most SNF contests in a single-season since 2017. The Raiders hold an all-time record of 20-23 (.465) in Sunday Night Football Games since their inception in 1978.
- Las Vegas will host Green Bay on Monday Night Football for the first time since 2003. This will mark only the second-ever prime-time game between the two franchises, with the Packers holding a 1-0 record. The Week 5 matchup will also be the first time Davante Adams will face the Packers since Adams was traded from the Green Bay in March 2022.
- The Silver and Black will travel to Detroit for Monday Night Football in Week 8, marking the third MNF game between the two teams and first since 1990. The Raiders own a .574 win percentage (42-31-1) on Monday Night Football since its inception in 1970 - the sixth-best mark in the NFL (min. 20 games).
- The Silver and Black are set to host the Chargers in a Thursday Night Football matchup in Week 15. This contest will be the eighth meeting between the AFC West rivals on a Thursday since 1979, where the Raiders hold a 6-2 all-time advantage over the Bolts. The Raiders own a 12-13 (.480) all-time record in Thursday games.
- The Raiders will face Kansas City for a Week 16 matchup on December 25, 2023, the third Christmas day game in Raiders history and the second against Kansas City. The Raiders' last game on Christmas was in Philadelphia in 2017, a 19-10 loss to the Eagles. The Raiders' first game on Christmas came in 2004 at Kansas City - a 31-30 loss to the Chiefs.

RAIDERS ON CHRISTMAS

The Raiders will face Kansas City for a Week 16 matchup on December 25 in 2023, the third Christmas day game in Raiders history and the second against Kansas City.

The Raiders' last game on Christmas was in Philadelphia in 2017, a 19-10 loss to the Eagles.

The Raiders' first game on Christmas came in 2004 at Kansas City - a 31-30 loss to the Chiefs.

SUPER BOWL REMATCH

The Raiders will face the Minnesota Vikings in Week 14 (December 10), the first time the Raiders faced the Vikings at home since 2015.

The Week 14 game against the Vikings also marks a rematch of Super Bowl XI, a 32-14 win for the Raiders - the Raiders' first ever Super Bowl victory, led by Head Coach John Madden.



STADIUM STATS

- The Raiders have a 220-255-8 (.464) all-time record on the road.
- Las Vegas will play in 10 different stadiums in 2023, including two preseason road matchups.
- Between the preseason and regular season, the Silver and Black will travel to the Eastern Time Zone four times, the Central Time Zone three times, the Mountain Time Zone one time and the Pacific Time Zone three times.
- The Raiders have played more road games in Arrowhead Stadium than in any other stadium, followed by Empower Field at Mile High.

DIVISIONAL BREAKDOWN

AFC West: Denver Broncos, Kansas City Chiefs, Los Angeles Chargers

- The Chiefs finished 14-3 and won the AFC West crown for the seventh-straight season, followed by the club's third Super Bowl.
- The Raiders finished 3-3 against the AFC West in 2022, sweeping the Denver Broncos for the third-consecutive season and defeating the Los Angeles Chargers at home.
- Since divisional realignment in 2002, the Raiders have posted a winning record in the AFC West three times: 4-2 in 2002, 6-0 in 2010 and 4-2 in 2020.

AFC East: Buffalo Bills, Miami Dolphins, New York Jets, New England Patriots

- The Raiders are 78-73-4 (.516) all-time against AFC East opponents in the regular season and will face the Jets at home for the first time since 2017.
- Las Vegas last played the entire AFC East in 2020 and went 1-3, defeating the Jets 31-28 on Dec. 6, 2020.

AFC South: Indianapolis Colts

- Las Vegas owns a 10-9 (.526) all-time advantage against Indianapolis, and will face the Colts for the sixth-consecutive season after hosting Indianapolis in Week 10 last season (L, 20-25).
- Over the last five seasons, the Raiders have recorded a 2-3 record (.400) against the Colts and a 2-0 record in Indianapolis.
- The Raiders are 45-44 (.506) overall against AFC South opponents.

AFC North: Pittsburgh Steelers

- The Raiders are 52-41 (.559) all-time against AFC North opponents. Las Vegas leads the all-time series against the Steelers, 14-11, and will host the Steelers for the first time since 2018 after traveling to Pittsburgh last season.

NFC North: Chicago Bears, Detroit Lions, Green Bay Packers, Minnesota Vikings

- The Raiders are 29-28 (.509) all-time against NFC North teams. The Silver and Black lead the all-time series against the Vikings (9-6), Lions (7-6) and are tied with the Bears (8-8).
- Las Vegas last faced the division in 2019, finishing 2-2 against the division, defeating the Lions and the Bears.

NFC East: New York Giants

- The Raiders are 28-26 (.519) all-time against NFC East teams. Las Vegas leads the series against the Giants, 8-6.
- The Raiders host the Giants for the first time since 2017 (W, 24-17 on Dec. 3, 2017).

PRESEASON OPPONENTS

- The Raiders are 139-135-1 (.507) all-time in preseason contests.
- The Raiders will host the San Francisco 49ers for the first preseason game of 2023. This matchup will be the 41st meeting between the two teams in the preseason dating back to 1970. The Raiders currently hold a 19-21 (.475) overall record in preseason matchups against the 49ers.
- The Raiders will travel to Los Angeles for their second preseason game of 2023. The Silver and Black hold a 14-9 (.609) all-time advantage over the Rams in the preseason.
- The Silver and Black conclude the preseason with a roadtrip against the Dallas Cowboys. Since 1974, the Raiders have played the Cowboys 30 times in preseason, and hold a 19-11 all-time record.
- Last season (2022), the Raiders went 4-0 in the preseason, marking the only time in franchise history the Raiders have finished the preseason undefeated. The Raiders also went the entire preseason in 2022 without committing a turnover, the only team in the NFL since 2011 to accomplish the feat.
