# **TIGHT ENDS**

### FIRST-AND-10

**ROB BORAS** is in his seventh season as the Bills tight ends coach. He's overseen a position group that has provided support in both the passing and running game, while overseeing the development of Pro Bowl TE Dawson Knox.

### **COACHING SHOUTOUTS**

### 2017-present: (Bills)

• In 2022, helped TE Dawson Knox earn his first career Pro Bowl honor and become the first Bills tight end to represent the team at the Pro Bowl since Paul Costa in 1966.

• In 2021, guided Knox to a franchise record for receiving touchdowns by a tight end (9).

• Oversaw a tight ends room that served as a key part of both the run and passing game for the second ranked offense in the NFL in 2020.

#### 2012-16: (Rams)

 Originally joined the Rams as their tight ends coach in 2012 before being promoted to assistant head coach/offense and eventually offensive coordinator for the final four games of 2015 and all of 2016.

• In 2016, Rams rookie quarterback Jared Goff became the first rookie to throw three touchdowns in his first road start.

• In 2013, he guided tight end Jared Cook to franchise-bests with 141 receiving yards in a single game and 671 receiving yards in a season.

### 2010-11: (Jaguars)

 In his first season in Jacksonville, helped TE Marcedes Lewis to career-highs and franchise-records with 58 receptions for 700 yards and 10 touchdowns en route to his first Pro Bowl appearance and first by a Jaguars tight end.

• Lewis went on to lead the Jaguars in receiving in 2011, the only time a TE led the team in receiving in a single-season.

### **COACHING SHOUTOUTS (CONT.)**

#### 2004-09: (Bears)

• Led the Bears tight ends to an NFL-high 13 receiving touchdowns in 2009 with Greg Olsen leading the way with a career-high eight scores.

• In 2008, Olsen and Desmond Clark combined for 95 receptions, the most ever by a TE duo in team history.

• Was a member of the 2006 Bears NFC Championship squad.

#### 1999-03: (UNLV)

• Served as the offensive line coach for two seasons before finishing his tenure by adding offensive coordinator to his responsibilities.

• Under Boras' watch, the Rebels finished 15th in the NCAA in rushing in 2002, 16th in 2001 and 13th in 2000. From 2000-02, UNLV produced 28 100-yard rushers in a 34-game stretch.

• In the 2000-01 seasons, Boras developed an offensive line that paved the way for consecutive 1,000 yard rushers for the first time since the 1973-74 seasons.

### 1998: (Benedictine)

• Served as the team's head coach for the 1998 season.

#### 1999-03: (Texas)

• Served in a multitude of roles over four seasons with Texas.

### PERSONAL/COLLEGE

 Played center at DePauw University (Division III) from 1988-91. Earned a bachelor's degree in political science from DePauw and a master's degree in sport management from Indiana State University.

• Attended Glenbard West High School in Glen Ellyn, Illinois.

 He and his wife, Amy, have three children: son Jackson and daughters Abigail and Ainsley.
