KYLE SHURMUR joined the Buffalo Bills in 2022 after being announced as a defensive quality control coach. Shurmur, who spent time playing for Kansas City, Cincinnati and Washington, began his coaching career in 2020 as a volunteer offensive quality control coach at Vanderbilt.

PLAYING SHOUTOUTS

- Played four seasons (2015-18) at Vanderbilt. Completed 722 of 1264 career passes for 8865 yards and 64 TDs. As a senior in 2018, completed 254 of 406 passes (62.6 percent) for 3130 yards and 24 TDs.
- Signed with the Kansas City Chiefs following the 2019 NFL Draft, spending the 2019 season with the Chiefs and then joining the Cincinnati Bengals towards the end of the 2020 season. Played for Washington in 2021.

PERSONAL/OTHER EXPERIENCE

- Originally from Philadelphia, PA, Shurmur attended La Salle College High School in Wyndmoor, PA. In addition to playing football, was also a standout swimmer in high school, and helped team to 2014 state title and was a member of state record-setting 200 medley relay.
- His father, Pat Shurmur, is former head coach of the Cleveland Browns (2011-12) and N.Y. Giants ('18-19).
- Married Lexi Shurmur in March of 2023.
