

KEEP POUNDING DRUMMER

DAN MORGAN

Dan Morgan is in his third season as Carolina's assistant general manager. A former Panthers first-round pick (2001), he returned (May 2021) to the club after 10-plus seasons in NFL front offices. Morgan has assisted General Manager Scott Fitterer in reshaping Carolina's roster, including a trade for the first overall pick in the 2023 NFL Draft where the team selected quarterback Bryce Young. Prior to re-joining Carolina, Morgan spent three years (2018-20) with the Bills as director of player personnel. While with Buffalo, the team made two playoff appearances, including a trip to the AFC Championship. Morgan's front office experience started in Seattle (2010). In his second season with the Seahawks, he was named assistant director of pro personnel, a position he held for four seasons (2011-14) including their Super Bowl XLVIII victory.

Later promoted to director of pro personnel (2015), he was responsible for guiding the pro and advance scouting efforts for the club. Selected 11th overall by Carolina in the 2001 NFL Draft, Morgan played seven seasons for the Panthers (2001-07) and tallied 390 tackles and 11 takeaways. Selected to the Pro Bowl (2004) after posting a single-season high 102 tackles, he concluded that season with 25 tackles in Super Bowl XXXVIII, a franchise postseason record. Inducted in the College Football Hall of Fame (2021), Morgan became the first player to be named captain as a sophomore at the University of Miami (Fla.). He won the Nagurski Trophy, the Butkus and Bednarik Awards (2000), becoming the first player in NCAA history to win all three in a career, while he also earned All-America honors and was named the 2000 Big East Player of the Year.





HALFTIME David garibaldi

Beginnings...

Growing up in Sacramento, Calif., Garibaldi created from a young age in various forms. From playing the trumpet, graffiti, animation, and even dance, each would later play a role in kicking off his art career. Though a high school animation teacher inspired Garibaldi to pursue art as a career and attend college, a meeting with his high school counselor changed his plans. The young artist didn't have enough credits to graduate high school on time, which was devastating and life altering at that time. From age 18-20, Garibaldi was trying to figure out what's next while working odd jobs and moving from place to place. Then at age 20, he started painting live at local jazz clubs and selling his paintings to make ends meet. This live painting quickly transformed into a live show experience after being inspired by the performance painting legend, Denny Dent.

The Career...

From 2003 to 2012 Garibaldi set out to put performance painting on the map while doing 100-plus live shows per year for large corporations, schools, non profits and even an arena tour opening for Blue Man Group. He was determined to keep leveling up and setting a personal challenge to raise \$1 million for charity through his art by age 30 which he accomplished. In 2012, Garibaldi was a finalist on America's Got Talent and that status took him to a whole new level for almost a decade after. From collaborations with Disney and Cirque Du Soleil, to being the opening act for KISS's Farewell World Tour, there was a momentum that seemed like it couldn't be stopped.

Present...

Since early 2020 and post pandemic, Garibaldi has grown his online presence to millions of followers, and had continued doing live shows on tour. In addition, the 39-year-old artist started teaching his techniques online, launched a podcast, and even does weekly live streams to create and inspire the next generation of artists. This current path has led to founding PAINT +, an on-demand course and coaching platform for artists. PAINT is built on the foundation of what Garibaldi calls a life method.

"We are somewhere on our PAINT journeys of Passion, Action, Intent, New, and Teach. The goal is to discover where we are, and create where we go next. PAINT + is one vehicle to teach and inspire future creators." - David Garibaldi



Carolina returns home in Week 11 to take on the Dallas Cowboys in Bank of America Stadium. All time, this will mark the 14th regular-season matchup between the two teams with the Cowboys leading the series 10-3, including a 5-1 record in Carolina. The two teams last squared off in 2021 at AT&T Stadium where Dallas defeated Carolina, 36-28. This will mark the Cowboys first trip to Charlotte since 2018. The Panthers lone regular-season victory against the Cowboys at home came in the last meeting when the Panthers defeated Dallas. 16-8, in the 2018 season opener. Carolina enters Week 11 with a 1-8 record after falling to the Chicago Bears, 16-13, Carolina is 21-35 against the NFC East all time and looking for their first win against the division since 2020 when they defeated the Washington Commanders in Week 16, 20-13. Dallas enters the contest with a 6-3 record after a 49-17 victory against the New York Giants in Week 10. The Panthers will mark the lone NFC South opponent for the Cowboys this season.

- Panthers QB Andy Dalton is a native of Katy, Texas, and attended Katy HS. He went on to play four seasons at TCU from 2007-2010.
- Cowboys S Jayron Kearse played at Clemson from 2013-2015.
- Cowboys CB Stephon Gilmore is a native of Rock Hill, S.C., and attended South Pointe HS. He then played at South Carolina from 2016-19. Gilmore played for the Carolina Panthers in 2021.
- Panthers P Johnny Hekker and Cowboys Special Teams Coordinator John Fassel spent the 2012-2019 seasons together at the St.Louis/Los Angeles Rams.
- Cowboys Head Coach Mike McCarthy was the head coach for the Green Bay Packers from 2006-2018. Over that time span, several Panther coaches were on his staff, including Defensive Coordinator Ejiro Evero (defensive quality control, 2016), Senior Defensive Assistant Dom Capers (defensive coordinator, 2009-2017), Offensive Line Coach James Campen (assistant offensive line coach, 2009) (offensive line coach, 2007-2017) (offensive line coach/run game coordinator, 2018).

AFTER 294 DAYS, "IT ALL POURED OUT IN THAT MOMENT" By Darin Gantt

CHARLOTTE — For some, the things they felt might have been as simple as relief. For most, it at least bordered on joy.

But for Panthers right guard Austin Corbett, the emotions following Carolina's 15-13 victory over the Houston Texans on October 29 became overwhelming, and the only thing he could do was let them out.

It was hard for Corbett to say the words at times, but the message was clear. Since tearing his anterior cruciate ligament in the 2022 regular-season finale at New Orleans, everything has built to this day, this moment. And even if the Panthers lost, that game would have been a big day for Corbett. But not only did they not lose, they did it with a drama that matched the moment.

So, when that moment included a walk-off field goal to trigger the first celebration of the year for a team that

really needed it, all Corbett could do was wince and cry and hug and thank people who helped get him to this place.

"Yeah, it's been a while. What was that? Like, 294 days or something? I don't know," Corbett began. (He's lying; he knows that number precisely because he's counted them.)

"Really, getting home early (Saturday before the game) after the walk-through, my wife and I tried not to think about what it would be," he continued, barely prompted but opening the floodgates. "If you go in there with any expectations, you get let down some way or the other. And so, we really just tried to come in (Sunday), . . . We knew this was the gold date (for his return), and yeah, we don't want to get our own hopes up, though, just in case. And so I had to be able to look at it and just count down those days and it all, . . . it all just poured out there as that ball went through the uprights.



"It's really hard to put into words."

If words don't suffice, pictures and video can certainly help. That photo at the top of this article is Corbett, kneeling on the sidelines watching the final sequence after Bryce Young drove them into position, and then Panthers kicker Eddy Piñeiro had to hit the gamewinner three times. It was emotionally draining for all of them. But you can see it on his face.

And over his left shoulder, with the red ponytail, that's assistant athletic trainer Katy Rogers, standing over him like a guardian angel. Which is exactly what she has been for Corbett for the last nine months and change. She was alongside him from the moment he fell to the turf in New Orleans, and 284 days ago, she boarded a plane to Los Angeles with him to help him through reconstructive surgery, which was the beginning of a long process for both of them. So, of course she was nearby.

Center Bradley Bozeman was right by his side, too, as he was for all 67 offensive snaps versus the Texans. The two of them, together again as they were for the last 11 games of last season when the offensive line became the Panthers' identity.

When the final kick went through, Bozeman put a hand on Corbett's shoulder and patted him a few times. While everyone else was celebrating like crazy (with Johnny Hekker giving Piñeiro a piggyback ride across the field), Corbett tucked his face into his jersey for a moment and then rose to receive the first of many hugs.

"So glad to have you back. I love you," Bozeman said to him. "I love you. You're a f---ing warrior. I love you, dog."

The next person to cross his field of vision, of course, was Rogers. The massive offensive lineman reached over to hug her, and all he could get out was a barely audible 'Thank you' as they both began to well up.


