



CHRISTIAN TAYLOR NAMED DEFENSIVE QC COACH

CHRISTIAN TAYLOR has been named the Bills defensive quality control coach. Taylor joins the Bills after spending the last four seasons as William & Mary's offensive coordinator/running backs coach. After playing QB in college at William & Mary, Taylor has been a coach on the collegiate level for 16 years.

SHOUTOUTS

- Taylor began his coaching career in 2008 as a tight ends coach for his alma mater, William & Mary. During his 16 years of coaching in the college ranks, Taylor has coached at William & Mary (2008-09/2020-23), San Diego State (2010), Michigan (2011), San Diego (2012-13), Illinois Wesleyan (2014-15) and San Diego (2016-19).
- In his most recent role, Taylor served as William & Mary's offensive coordinator/running backs coach. With Taylor overseeing the Tribe's offense, W&M tied a school record with 11 victories in 2022, winning a share of the Colonial Athletic Association title and advancing to the NCAA Quarterfinals.
- Taylor played quarterback for William & Mary from 2002-06 and was a member of the 2004 team that advanced to the FCS Playoff semifinals.
