SILVER AND BLACK FRIDAY

The NFL will play on Black Friday for the second consecutive season.

The Raiders will head to Kansas City to play the Chiefs on Black Friday in 2024, just the 12th game in Raiders history played on a Friday - the first since 1966 (W, 23-14 at Mia.).

The Raiders currently own a 4-6-1 (.364) record in Friday games.





RY THE NUMBERS

The Raiders' 2024 opponents had a combined record of 148-141 (.512) in 2023, giving the Raiders tied for the eighth hardest strength of schedule in 2024.

The Raiders will play seven teams that reached the playoffs in 2023, the most previous-year playoff teams as opponents in a single season since the Raiders faced seven teams in 2021 who reached the playoffs in 2020.

The Raiders will look to extend their eight-game win streak against the Denver Broncos in Week 5 on the road at Denver. Their eight-game streak is the longest active win streak against any team for the Raiders and the second-longest win streak against the Broncos in franchise history - the longest since 1965-1971 (14).

SCHEDULE HIGHLIGHTS

- The Raiders will open the season at the Los Angeles Chargers, marking the third-consecutive season the Silver and Black will travel to an AFC West opponent for the season opener and the first time visiting the Chargers in Week 1 since 2022. The Raiders own a 5-4 record against the Chargers in Week 1 matchups.
- Cleveland, Atlanta, Carolina and Jacksonville will each make their firstever visit to Allegiant Stadium in the regular season.
- The Raiders play the Chiefs in Week 13, a Black Friday matchup just the 12th game played in a Friday in Raiders history, the first since 1966 (W, 23-14 at Mia.).
- Las Vegas' schedule includes seven games against playoff teams from 2023 (Chiefs, Browns, Steelers, Ravens, Buccaneers, Dolphins, Rams).
- The Raiders open the season with back-to-back road games for the second-consecutive season previously it was the first time opening up on the road in Weeks 1 and 2 since 2011.
- Las Vegas will play a road game in Tampa Bay for the first time since 2016 and Baltimore for the first time since 2018.
- The Raiders will face the Chargers at home in the season finale the last time the Raiders finished the season at home against the Chargers - Las Vegas clinched a playoff spot with an overtime win over the Chargers in 2021.
- Las Vegas will have two back-to-back road trips this season (Weeks 1-2, 13-14).
- The Raiders will have a bye in Week 10. The last time the Raiders had a Week 10 bye was in 2017.
- The season finale will be at home against the Chargers, marking just the
 fifth time since 2013 the Raiders will conclude their season at home. It is
 also the 14th-straight year in which the Silver and Black will face an AFC
 West opponent in the season finale.
- The Raiders will play their first prime-time game of the season on Black Friday in Week 13, the latest week for the Raiders to have their first prime-time game since 2015 when the Raiders did not have a prime-time matchup until Week 16.


SILVER AND BLACK IN PRIME TIME

- The Raiders are slated for two prime-time games in 2024, hosting one and on the road for the other. The Raiders first prime-time matchup will come in Week 13, where the Raiders will travel to Kansas City for a Black Friday matchup against the Chiefs at 12:00 p.m. The second prime-time game for Las Vegas will be a home game against the Atlanta Falcons in Week 15 on Monday Night Football.
- The Week 13 Black Friday matchup against Kansas City marks the second consecutive season the Raiders will face the Chiefs in Kansas City in prime time. Last season, the Raiders traveled to Kansas City for a Christmas Day game against the Chiefs, pulling out a 20-14 win.
- In the Week 13 matchup against the Chiefs, the Raiders will look to record two consecutive wins at Arrowhead Stadium for the first time since 2011-12.
- The Raiders' Week 15 Monday Night Football matchup against Atlanta will be the Falcons' first trip to Allegiant Stadium.
- The Raiders will not have a prime-time game until Week 13, the latest week for the Raiders to have their first prime-time game since 2015 when the Raiders did not have a prime-time matchup until Week 16.
- The Raiders' two prime-time games are the fewest in a single season since 2019 when the Raiders opened the season on Monday Night Football against Denver in Week 1 (W, 24-16) and played on Thursday Night in Week 10 against the Chargers (W, 26-24). The Raiders won both prime-time games in 2019.
- The Raiders finished with a 4-2 record in their six prime-time games in 2023. Last season Las Vegas finished 2-1 on Monday (including Christmas), 1-0 on Thursday Night Football and 1-1 on Sunday Night Football. The Raiders now own a 78-68-1 (.531) all-time record in prime-time games.
- The Week 15 Monday Night Football game against the Falcons marks the first ever prime-time matchup between the Raiders and Falcons. The Falcons hold an 8-7 edge in the all-time series.
- The Week 13 matchup against the Chiefs on Black Friday will be just the 12th game in Raiders history played on a Friday the first since 1966 (W, 23-14 at Mia.). The Raiders currently own a 4-6-1 (.364) record on Friday.
- The Raiders will not have a Sunday Night Football game in 2024 for the first time since 2019. The Raiders hold an all-time record of 21-23 (.477) in Sunday Night Football Games since their inception in 1978.
- The Raiders will host a Monday Night Football game against the Atlanta Falcons in Week 15. The Raiders host a Monday Night Football game for the second consecutive season. The Raiders own a .571 win percentage (44-32-1) on Monday Night Football since its inception in 1970 their 44 wins on Monday night are the fourth most in the NFL over that span.

TRAVELING RAIDERS

The Las Vegas Raiders will travel a total of 23,345 miles in 2024, the seventh most in the NFL.

- The Raiders have a 222-261-8 (.452) all-time record on the road.
- Las Vegas will play in eight different stadiums in 2024, including one preseason road matchup.
- Between the preseason and regular season, the Silver and Black will travel to the Eastern Time Zone four times, the Central Time Zone two times, the Mountain Time Zone one time and the Pacifice Time Zone two times.
- The Raiders have played more road games in Arrowhead Stadium than in any other stadium, followed by Empower Field at Mile High.

DIVISIONAL BREAKDOWN

AFC West: Denver Broncos, Kansas City Chiefs, Los Angeles Chargers

- The Chiefs finished 11-6 and won the AFC West crown for the eighth-straight season, followed by the club's fourth Super Bowl.
- The Raiders finished 4-2 against the AFC West in 2023, tied for the best divisional record among AFC West teams (tied with Kansas City) and the best divisional record for the Raiders since 2020. The Raiders 4-2 divisional record sweeping the Denver Broncos for the fourth-consecutive season, defeating the Los Angeles Chargers at home and defeating the Kansas City Chiefs on the road for the first time since 2020.
- Since divisional realignment in 2002, the Raiders have posted a winning record in the AFC West four times: 4-2 in 2002, 6-0 in 2010, 4-2 in 2020 and 4-2 in 2023.

AFC North: Baltimore Ravens, Cincinnati Bengals, Cleveland Browns, Pittsburgh Steelers

- The Raiders are 52-42-0 (.553) all-time against AFC North opponents in the regular season.
- The Raiders currently have a four-game win streak against Cleveland and haven't lost to the Browns since 2014.
- Las Vegas last played the entire AFC North in 2021 and went 3-1, defeating the Ravens 33-27 in OT, the Steelers 26-17 and the Browns 16-14.

AFC South: Jacksonville Jaguars

- Las Vegas owns a 4-6 (.400) all-time record against Jacksonville, and will face the Jaguars for the first time since 2022 (L, 20-27).
- The Raiders will face the Jaguars at home for the first time since 2019 (L, 16-20) and this is the first game for the Jaguars at Allegiant Stadium.
- The Raiders are 45-45 (.500) overall against AFC South opponents.

AFC East: Miami Dolphins

- Las Vegas owns an 18-19 all-time series record against the Dolphins and will travel to Miami for the second-consecutive season (L, 13-20 in 2023).
- The Raiders are 80-75-4 (.503) all-time against AFC East opponents.

NFC South: Atlanta Falcons, Carolina Panthers, New Orleans Saints, Tampa Bay Buccaneers

- The Raiders are 25-21-1 (.532) all-time against NFC South teams. The Silver and Black lead the all-time series against the Panthers (4-3) and Buccaneers (7-3), is tied with the Saints (7-7-1) and owns a 7-8 record against the Falcons.
- Las Vegas last faced the division in 2020, finishing 2-2 against the division, defeating the Panthers (34-30) and Saints (34-24).

NFC West: Los Angeles Rams

• Las Vegas leads the series against the Rams, 8-7. The Raiders are 50-45 (.526) all-time against NFC West teams.
