INSIDE OUT INITIATIVE



SECTION 1 KICKOFF

After a successful first year of the New York Giants and NFL Foundation bringing the InSideOut Initiative (ISOI) to Section 1 of New York State, the second year kicked off with athletic directors and coaches in attendance. Giants Legend and Super Bowl Champion David Tyree shared his experiences with the group prior to the start of programming.

ISOI is a non-profit that works to inspire and equip school leaders and communities to transform lives through purpose-based sports.







GIANT STEPS THROUGH ATHLETICS

The New York Giants partnered with My Sisters' Place to create Giant Steps Through Athletics, a holistic and youth led program that aims to equip student athletes and their coaches with the skills, vocabulary, confidence, and leadership to promote healthy relationships on and off the field in the spirit of interpersonal violence prevention. This is made possible through a \$100,000 grant contributed by the New York Giants.








Kayvan Thibadeaux is this season's Week 9 NFLPA Community MVP for working to make dreams come true for youth in under-resourced areas. The New York Giants second-year defender hosted the inaugural fundraiser gala for his JREAM Foundation at MetLife Stadium. Several of his teammates joined the impactful event, which raised more than \$120,000 and featured a financial literacy panel that highlighted the need for those types of discussions and resources in underserved communities.

Thibodeaux also visited the Harlem Boys & Girls Club, spending the day with 50 kids to share his journey and answer questions. He also brought in financial literacy experts to serve as mentors and teach them how to earn and manage their finances from a young age.

These are the latest examples of Thibodeaux living out the JREAM (Journey to Readiness in Enrichment and Academic Mentorship) Foundation mission – to educate, mentor, empower and instill confidence and wisdom in underprivileged youth. The linebacker does this through youth development (tutoring, personal development workshops), community building (investing in the New York and South Los Angeles communities through rec sports and team building) and career exploration (workshops on financial literacy, budgeting, resume building and more).

Saquon Barkley is this season's Week 10 NFLPA Community MVP for making a personal

impact with those experiencing homelessness in Allentown, PA. The New York Giant and

members of his Michael Ann & Saquon Barkley Hope Foundation met with the staff at

OATH (Operation Address The Homeless) to tour their facility and discuss solutions for

the rising issue of home insecurity and homelessness among adults and school-age

children. Barkley then went out to the middle of the woods to meet with some individuals living in homeless camps, hear more about their journey and find out their immediate

needs as the winter months approach. He also donated supplies such as sleeping bags

and backpacks filled with essential care items, emergency supplies, hats and gloves.

As someone who was homeless for nearly a year while in elementary school, Barkley has a passion for helping youth overcome tough circumstances and making a positive




