Germaine Padilla

This past week, Head Coach Germaine Padilla and his Taft Eagles won the Chicago Public League (CPL) City Championship. After an impressive 20-3 season and a perfect 7-0 conference record, Padilla and the Eagles now aim to continue their success in the regional playoffs, On Sept. 28, the Eagles delivered a strong defensive performance against Kenwood High School in the first round, securing a 14-8 win, followed by a second-round victory of 35-16 over Phillips High School. On Oct. 1, the Eagles defeated Whitney Young High School 20-6 in the semifinals, advancing to the finals. On Oct. 4, Padilla and the Eagles faced their cross-town rivals, Lane Tech High School, for the CPL championship. Led by running back Lily Sarli, winner of the Chicago Bears Girls' Flag Football Player of the Week in week two, and quarterback Maylin Nunez, the Eagles put on an outstanding defensive performance, claiming a 28-6 victory and their second CPL City Championship in three years. In his post-game speech, Padilla celebrated the victory but emphasized the pursuit of greatness, encouraging his players to strive for excellence, not only on the football field, but in every aspect of their lives. Padilla's exceptional leadership has been a key factor in the success of Taft's Girls' Flag Football program. Since its inception in 2021, Padilla's dedication has not only resulted in successful seasons, but has created a culture of respect, integrity and perseverance amongst his athletes. He is committed to developing well-rounded individuals, instilling values such as discipline, teamwork and personal growth. This past week, senior quarterback Emily Ovaska led the Lakes Eagles to a perfect 4-0 record, boosting their overall season to an impressive 19-3 and 13-1 in conference, all in the program's inaugural season. On Saturday, Sept. 28, the Eagles defeated Grant Community High School 28-6, with Ovaska throwing for 212 yards and four touchdowns. On Oct. 1, she led the Eagles to an 18-12 victory over Stevenson High School, completing 11 of 15 passes for 140 yards and one touchdown, maintaining a 73% completion rate. The following day, on Oct. 2, the Eagles dominated McHenry High School 28-6, with Ovaska completing 19 of 27 passes for 191 yards and throwing three touchdowns. Overall, Ovaska recorded 51 completions, 589 yards and nine touchdowns for the week. For the season, she has totaled 2,562 yards and 41 touchdowns. Ovaska's leadership extends beyond her impressive stats, as she also excels as a team captain, building team chemistry and camaraderie. A three-sport athlete in flag football, softball and basketball, she exemplifies versatility and commitment. The Eagles are now focused on their path to the state championship, starting the postseason strong with a 31-0 shutout victory over Dundee-Crown High School in the first round of the IHSA Regionals on Oct. 8.
