Although the team fell short against Lane Tech High School in the postseason, Hammerschmidt made sure to uplift her teammates by encouraging them and recognizing their collective growth and effort throughout the year.



On the basketball court, Hammerschmidt plays guard and was named team captain, helping guide the Huskies to the regional semifinals. In softball, she is the team's starting center fielder and currently maintains a .380 batting average. Through her contributions, the team currently holds a 14-4 season record and is ranked among the top 25 teams in Illinois as they continue their pursuit of an IHSA state championship appearance. Across all three sports, her coaches consistently highlight her work ethic, versatility and commitment to putting her team in the best position to succeed.

Alongside athletics, Hammerschmidt balances a 4.57 weighted GPA while taking a challenging academic schedule that includes four Advanced Placement courses and a college-level physics course during her junior year. She has earned High Honor Roll recognition every semester and is a member of the National Honor Society, which recognizes students who demonstrate excellence in scholarship, leadership, service and character.

Beyond the classroom and playing fields, Hammerschmidt is deeply involved in community service through her work with Beyond Hunger, a nonprofit organization serving 13 ZIP codes in Cook County, including parts of Chicago and its near-west suburbs. Her volunteer efforts include leading food drives, packing and distributing meals and participating in public outreach events to raise awareness about food insecurity and encourage broader community involvement.
