2025 FLEX SCHEDULING RULES

This season, "flexible scheduling" for Sunday Night Football may be used up to twice between **Weeks 5-10**, and in the NFL's discretion during **Weeks 11-17**; for Monday Night Football at the NFL's discretion in **Weeks 12-17**; and for Thursday Night Football it may be used up to twice between **Weeks 13-17**. During these Flex Scheduling Windows, the games initially scheduled for Sunday Night Football, Monday Night Football, and Thursday Night Football are tentatively scheduled and subject to change. Only Sunday afternoon games (or those listed as TBD) are eligible to be moved to Sunday night, Monday night, or Thursday Night, in which case the initially scheduled Thursday/Sunday/Monday night game would be moved to Sunday afternoon. Sunday afternoon games may also be moved between 1:00 p.m. and 4:05 p.m. or 4:25 p.m. ET. As in prior seasons, for Week 18, the final weekend of the season, the scheduling is TBD. In Week 18, two games will be played on Saturday (4:30 p.m. ET and 8 p.m. ET) with the remainder to be played on Sunday afternoon (1 p.m. ET and 4:25 p.m. ET) and one matchup to be played on Sunday night (8:20 p.m. ET). Specific dates, start times, and networks for Week 18 matchups will be determined and announced following the conclusion of Week 17.

BY THE NUMBERS

The Raiders will travel 18,055 total miles in 2025, the 18th most in the NFL and the fewest among teams in the AFC West.

The Raiders' 2025 opponents had a combined record of 145-144 (.502) in 2024, giving the Raiders the 16th toughest strength of schedule in 2025.

Las Vegas' schedule includes six games against playoff teams from 2024 (Chiefs, Broncos, Chargers, Commanders, Eagles, Texans) - including both teams from Super Bowl LIX, Kansas City and Philadelphia.

SCHEDULE HIGHLIGHTS

- The Raiders will open the season at New England - the first time since 2021 the Raiders are starting the season against a team not in their own division. The Raiders are 25-30 (.455) in season openers all-time, including 4-2 over the last six seasons.
- The Raiders open the season on the road for the fourth consecutive season.
- Tennessee and Dallas will make their first ever visits to Allegiant Stadium for a regular season game, now leaving only Detroit, Seattle and the LA Rams as the only three teams left in the NFL to not play a regular season game in Allegiant Stadium.
- Las Vegas' schedule includes six games against playoff teams from 2024 (Chiefs, Broncos, Chargers, Commanders, Eagles, Texans) - including the Super Bowl LIX champion Philadelphia Eagles.
- In each of the last six seasons, the Raiders have had to face at least one team that played in the Super Bowl the year prior.
- Las Vegas will play a road game in Houston for the first time since 2019, a road game in New England for the first time since 2020 and road games against NFC East opponents - Philadelphia and Washington - for the first time since 2017.
- The Raiders will face the Chiefs at home in the season finale - the last time the Raiders finished the season at home against the Chiefs was in 2022.
- Las Vegas only has one back-to-back road trip this season (Weeks 15-16)
- The Raiders will have a bye in Week 8. The last time the Raiders had a Week 8 bye was in 2021. The Raiders are currently 13-23 in games the week after a bye since the NFL introduced bye weeks in 1990.
- The season finale will be at home against the Chiefs, marking just the sixth time since 2013 the Raiders will conclude their season at home. It is also the 15th-straight year in which the Silver and Black will face an AFC West opponent in the season finale.
- The Raiders are slated for three prime-time games in 2025 (Week 2, Week 10, Week 11) including two prime-time games against divisional opponents (Week 2 vs. LAC on MNF and Week 10 at Denver on TNF). This is the first time since 2021 that the Raiders have multiple prime-time games against AFC West opponents.
- The Raiders will play 10 games in the Pacific Time Zone, four games in the Eastern Time Zone, two games in the Central Time Zone and one game in the Mountain Time Zone.

2025 SCHEDULE NOTES

SILVER AND BLACK IN PRIME TIME

- The Raiders are slated for three prime-time games in 2025, hosting two with one on the road. The Raiders have played in 149 prime-time games all-time and own a 78-70-1 (.527) record in those matchups - 43-33-1 (.565) on Monday Night Football, 9-10 (.474) on Thursday Night Football, 21-23 (.477) on Sunday Night Football, 4-4 (.500) for Thanksgiving games and 1-0 on Christmas.
- The Raiders are playing two prime-time games against divisional opponents in 2025 (Week 2 vs. LAC on MNF and Week 10 at Denver on TNF). This is the first time since 2021 that the Raiders play multiple prime-time games against AFC West opponents. The Raiders finished 1-1 in those games in 2021.
- The Raiders first prime-time matchup in Week 2 will serve as the team's home opener at Allegiant Stadium, marking the earliest week for the Raiders to have their first prime-time game since 2021 when the Raiders hosted the Baltimore Ravens on Monday Night Football in Week 1 at Allegiant Stadium. The next two prime-time games for the Raiders will fall on Week 10 at Denver on Thursday Night Football, and Week 11 against Dallas on Monday Night Football.
- The Raiders home opener in prime-time against the Chargers will serve as the 30th all-time prime-time matchup between the two AFC West rivals (since 1979).
- The Raiders will play two Monday Night Football games at home (Week 2 vs. LAC and Week 11 vs. DAL), marking the third-straight season Las Vegas will host MNF. The Raiders have played in a Monday Night Football matchup in nine consecutive seasons dating back to 2016. This is also the first time since 2018 that the Raiders are hosting two Monday Night Football games in the same season. The Raiders own a 43-33-1 (.565) record all-time on Monday Night Football since its inception in 1970 - their 43 wins on Monday night are the fifth most in the NFL over that span.
- The Week 11 Monday Night Football game marks the first ever Monday Night Football matchup between the Raiders and Cowboys. The Raiders are 1-3 all-time against the Cowboys in primetime games (1-2 on Thanksgiving and 0-1 on Sunday Night Football).
- The Raiders will play in two consecutive prime-time games, Week 10 (TNF) and Week 11 (MNF). The last time the Raiders played back-to-back prime-time games was in 2020, when the Raiders hosted the Chargers and Dolphins in Weeks 15 and 16, respectively.
- The Raiders will not have a Sunday Night Football game in 2025 for the second consecutive season. Before last season, the last time the Raiders had no Sunday Night Football games was 2019. The Raiders hold an all-time record of 21-23 (.477) in Sunday Night Football Games since their inception in 1978.
- The Raiders finished with a 0-2 record in their two prime-time games in 2024 with a loss on the NFL's first Black Friday game at Kansas City in Week 13 and a loss on Monday Night Football against Atlanta in Week 15.

- The Raiders have a 224-268-8 (.456) all-time record on the road.
- Las Vegas will play in eight different stadiums in 2025, including two preseason road matchups.
- In the regular season The Raiders will play 10 games in the Pacific Time Zone, four games in the Eastern Time Zone, two games in the Central Time Zone and one game in the Mountain Time Zone.
- The Raiders have played more road games in GEHA Field at Arrowhead Stadium than in any other stadium, followed by Empower Field at Mile High.

2025 SCHEDULE NOTES



AFC WEST

- The Chiefs finished 15-2 and won the AFC West crown for the ninth-straight season, followed by the club's fifth Super Bowl appearance in the last six seasons.
- The Raiders finished 0-6 against the AFC West in 2024, the first time the Raiders have gone winless in the division since 2006. Before last season, the Raiders finished 3-3 or better against the AFC West in five-straight seasons (2019-23).
- Since divisional realignment in 2002, the Raiders have posted a winning record in the AFC West four times: 4-2 in 2002, 6-0 in 2010, 4-2 in 2020 and 4-2 in 2023.



AFC SOUTH

- The Raiders are 18-26-0 (.409) against the AFC South in the regular season since the division was established in 2002. The Raiders hold an all-time record of 45-46-0 (.495) all-time against teams currently in the AFC South.
- The Silver and Black lead the all-time series against the Titans (26-22) and are tied with the Colts (10-10), but trail the Texans (5-7) and Jaguars (5-6).
- Las Vegas last played the entire AFC South in 2022 and went 1-3, defeating only the Texans at home in Week 7, 38-20.
- The Raiders have defeated the Jaguars in four of their last six meetings, dating back to 2012, including a win in Week 16 of 2024.



AFC NORTH

- Las Vegas owns a 16-10 (.615) all-time record against Cleveland in the regular season, and will face the Browns for the second consecutive season.
- The Raiders have won the last five matchups against the Browns, dating back to 2015, including a 20-16 win in Week 4 of 2024.
- The Raiders are 54-44 (.551) overall against AFC North opponents.



AFC EAST

- Las Vegas owns an 16-18-1 (.471) all-time series record against the Patriots and will travel to Foxborough for the first time since 2020.
- The Silver and Black are currently on a two-game win streak against the Patriots dating back to 2022.
- The Raiders are 80-76-4 (.512) all-time against AFC East opponents.



NFC EAST

- The Raiders are 32-28-0 (.533) all-time against NFC East teams. The Silver and Black lead the all-time series against the Cowboys (7-6) and Giants (9-6), and tied with the Commanders (7-7) and owns a 6-7 record against the Eagles.
- Las Vegas last faced the division in 2021, finishing 2-2 against the NFC East, defeating the Eagles (33-22) and Cowboys (36-33 OT), en route to an AFC Wild Card berth at the end of the season.



NFC NORTH

- Las Vegas trails in the series against the Bears, 8-9 (.471) and are looking for their first win against Chicago since 2019.
- The Raiders are 30-31 (.492) all-time against NFC North teams.

PRESEASON OPPONENTS

- The Raiders are 143-139-2 (.507) all-time in preseason contests.
- The Raiders will travel to Seattle to face the Seahawks for their first preseason game. This will be the 14th total trip to Lumen Field for the Silver and Black since it opened in 2002 - the 11th time for a preseason game. The Raiders own a 6-13 (.316) record against the Seahawks in the preseason, including 1-10 (.100) on the road against the Seahawks in the preseason.
- The Raiders will host the San Francisco 49ers in the second preseason game in 2024. This matchup will be the 43rd meeting between the two teams in the preseason dating back to 1970. The Raiders currently hold a 20-21-1 (.488) overall record in preseason matchups against the 49ers.
- The Silver and Black will travel to State Farm Stadium to play the Arizona Cardinals in the third and final preseason game of 2025. The Raiders have played the Cardinals 17 times in the preseason and hold a 9-8 (.529) record, including a 6-3 (.667) record on the road against the Cardinals in the preseason. This will be the Raiders' seventh trip to State Farm Stadium (4 preseason, 2 regular season) since it opened in 2006.

- The Raiders have played Kansas City 129 times in the regular season, trailing 54-73-2 (.425) in the all-time series.

- The Raiders hold a 28-35-1 (.444) regular season record a home against the Chiefs and look to defeat Kansas City in Allegiant Stadium for the first time and the first home win against the Chiefs since 2017.
