

WATER CONSERVATION

Since 2015, the Eagles have eliminated the use of more than one million plastic water bottles with the installation of water filtration fountains at the team's facilities. In addition, the installation of simultaneous flush urinals throughout Lincoln Financial Field saves more than **5,000 gallons of water per event**.

-500,000 PLASTIC STRAWS

With Aramark's help in 2018, the Eagles became the first team in the South Philadelphia Sports Complex to phase out traditional plastic straws for a plastic alternative made from 100% renewable resources. This **helps eliminate the use of roughly 500,000 plastic straws annually**.

EARTH WEEK CLEANUP

In celebration of Earth Week, the Eagles teamed up with Sports Complex Special Services District and West Pharmaceutical Services to plant trees around the Greater Philadelphia area. Players, staff, and volunteers rolled up their sleeves to help beautify historic FDR Park and Tyler Arboretum.

CYCLE REVERSE VENDING MACHINES

The Eagles joined Anheuser-Busch's National Recycling League - a multi-sports league coalition aiming to reduce waste on gamedays - by installing two Cycle Reverse Vending Machines (RVMs) at Lincoln Financial Field. The installation made Lincoln Financial Field the first NFL stadium to utilize the machines, which are designed for beverage container recycling.



SPORTSBEAMS LED LIGHTING

With the help of Sportsbeams, the Eagles replaced the stadium lights at Lincoln Financial Field with the company's patented, high-powered LED lighting technology. Thanks to the installation of 484 RGBW Sportsbeam fixtures, a wattage reduction of nearly 50% has been achieved, lowering both energy consumption and utility costs.

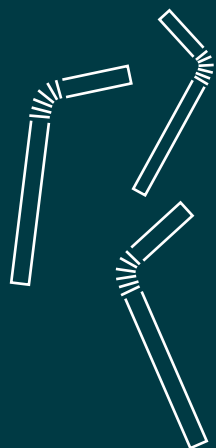

BIRDS SUPPORTING BIRDS

New in 2025, the Eagles and National Marine Sanctuary Foundation teamed up to support the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Association's Stellwagen Bank National Marine Sanctuary Shearwater Tagging Project, a research initiative dedicated to studying great shearwater seabirds and their migration across the Gulf of Maine ecosystem.

SUSTAINABLE RAIN GEAR

With the help of Braskem, the Eagles purchased sustainable rain ponchos to be used by Eagles Gameday Staff. Made from sugarcane ethanol, a renewable raw material that has a carbon-negative life cycle, the ponchos were produced by GreenGear Supply Company and can be reused or recycled through the Eagles Go Green program.



CLOSED-LOOP RECYCLING PROGRAM

The Eagles and Braskem collaborated to develop a closed-loop recycling program for bottle caps and other plastic products collected from Eagles events. The bottle caps have been repurposed into various products, which include a six-foot tall Lombardi Trophy displayed in Pepsi Plaza and bikes for the Eagles Autism Challenge.
