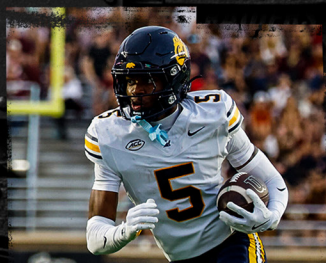

Indiana's first Heisman Trophy winner...Tabbed winner of Maxwell and Walter Camp Award...Earned his bachelor's degree in business administration from Cal in three years...Paid for his final three class at Cal in summer of 2025 while already enrolled at Indiana...Appeared in 36 career games with 35 starts...Played in 20 games with 19 starts over three seasons at California (2022-24) and redshirted initial collegiate season...Threw first touchdown pass as a Hoosier against Kennesaw State (9/6) in Week 2...Combined with brother, Alberto, against Kennesaw State to become the first set of brothers to throw touchdown passes for the same team in the same FBS game since Brady and Austin Allen of Arkansas in 2015 versus UT Martin...**Cal Records:** Finished career as the all-time leader in completion percentage (66.4%) and tied for No. 7 in 250-yard passing games (10) at Cal...Equaled the marks of Gale Gilbert (10; 1980-84) and Aaron Rodgers (10; 2003-04) in career 250-yard passing games at Cal...**Game:** Set Indiana single-game mark for completion percentage at .950 (19-of-20) when he hit his first 14 passes to start the game versus Indiana State (9/12)...Also ranks No. 2 (.917; Wisconsin), No. 3 (.913; Illinois), T-No. 4 (.857; Michigan State) and No. 7 (.850; vs. Oregon) on the completion percentage charts (min. 20 attempts)...Tied for No. 4 on the single-game touchdown passes chart with five against Indiana State (9/12) and equaled that mark versus Illinois (9/20) and Oregon (1/9)...Accounted for six total touchdowns (5 passing, 1 rushing) against Indiana State (9/12) to tie **Bob Hoernschemeyer** (6 passing; at Nebraska, 1943), **Levron Williams** (6 rushing; at Wisconsin, 2001), **Tre Roberson** (6 passing; Purdue, 2013) and **Kurtis Rourke** (6 passing; Purdue, 2024) for the program single-game mark...Set the Rose Bowl Game record for completion percentage (.875) and passer rating (250.17)...**Season:** Broke **Kellen Lewis'** (38; 2006-08) single-season mark for most touchdowns accounted for in a single season at IU against Ohio State (12/6) with No. 39 on a passing touchdown and finished with 48 on the year (41 pass, 7 rush)...Set IU single-season mark for completion percentage (.720)...Tied for No. 1 on the season list in 200-yard passing games (10)...First Hoosier with a 30-passing touchdown season and tied for No. 3 in Big Ten history for season touchdown passes (41)...Posted the sixth 3,000-yard passing season in IU history and finished No. 2 on the single-season list with 3,535 yards passing...Finished No. 3 on the season completions chart (273)...**Career:** Finished No. 6 on the career passing touchdowns list (41)...Ranked No. 14 in both yards passing (3,535) and completions (273) ... Tied for No. 9 in career 200-yard passing games (10).

JUNIOR (2025 with Indiana)

Season: Started all 16 games...Led the FBS in passing touchdowns (41), passing efficiency (182.9) and points responsible for (288)...Had FBS-best 48 touchdowns accounted for...Made Indiana debut in a start of the season opener against Old Dominion (8/30)...Did not played five total quarters on the season (3rd & 4th, Indiana State; 4th, Illinois; 4th, UCLA; 4th. at Purdue) based on game situation.

Notes to Know: Became Indiana's first-ever Heisman Trophy winner and the first in the Big Ten since 2006 (*Troy Smith*, Ohio State)...Is the second Hoosier to earn the Maxwell Award and Walter Camp Award, joining running back **Anthony Thompson** (1989)...First IU quarterback to earn the Davey O'Brien Award and Manning Award...Third Big Ten quarterback since 2000 with three-straight games of at least four passing touchdowns and zero interceptions - *C.J. Stroud* (Ohio State; 2021) and *Kyle Orton* (Purdue; 2004, four straight)...Only FBS quarterback since at least 1996 with multiple games of at least 90 percent completion and four touchdown passes versus Power 4 opponents...Only FBS quarterback with six games of 4-plus touchdown passes and zero interceptions...Led the FBS in highest percentage of passing attempts that result in a touchdown at 10.8%, over two points higher than the next closest passer (*Julian Sayin*, Ohio State; 8.7%).

Old Dominion (8/30): Made Indiana debut and produced 226 yards of total offense...Completed 18-of-31 passes for 193 yards passing...Rushed six times for 33 yards and one touchdown...Scored IU's first offensive touchdown with a 5-yard touchdown run in the second quarter...**Kennesaw State (9/6):** Completed 18-of-25 passes for 245 yards and four touchdowns...Rushed three times for 20 yards...First touchdown pass as a Hoosier came to Elijah Sarratt from 9 yards out in the first quarter...Also found Sarratt on touchdown passes of 3 and 20 yards...Fourth touchdown pass went to E.J. 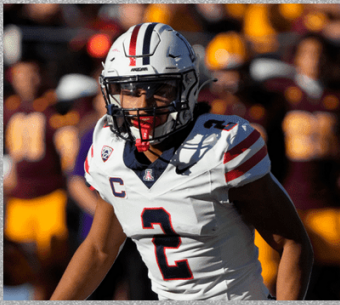

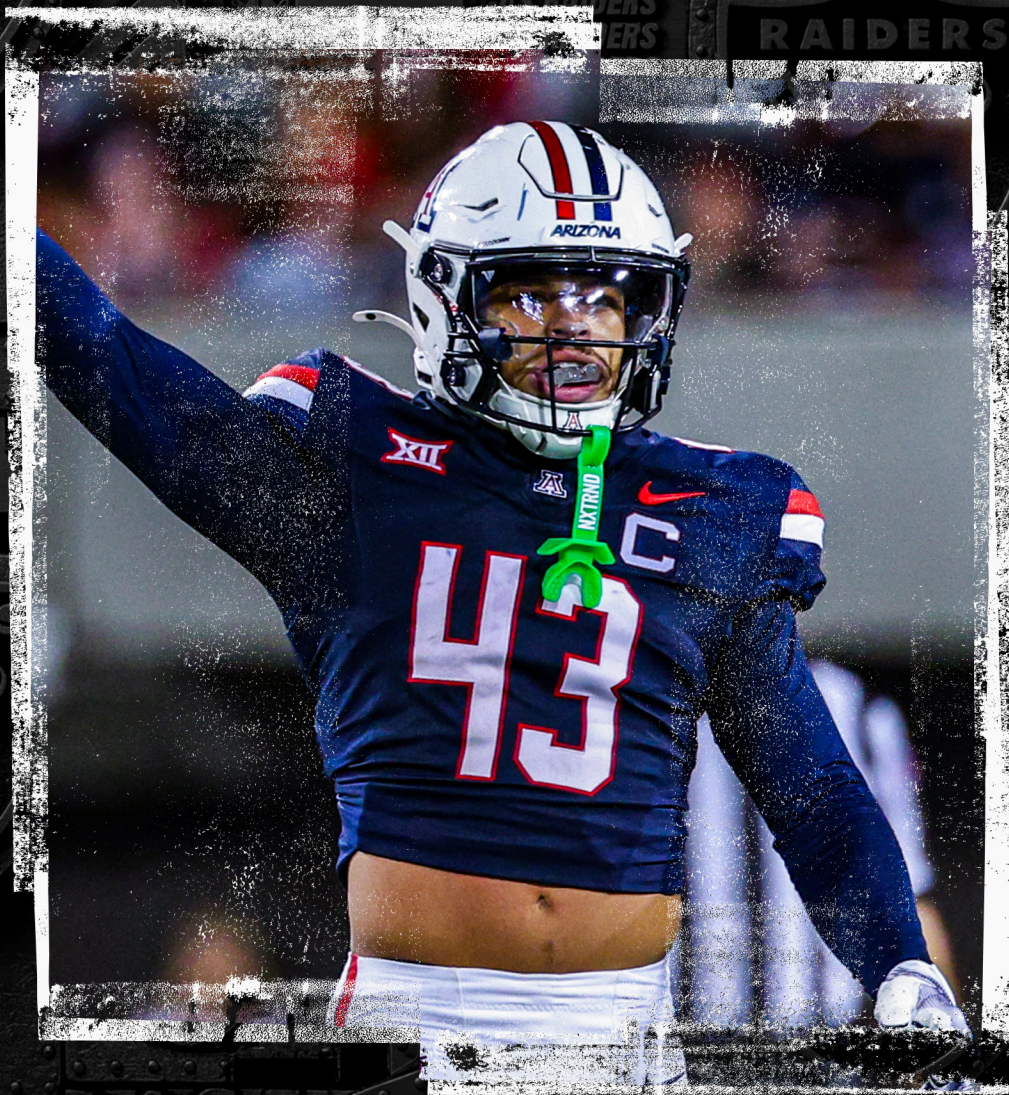

Video Call with First-Round Pick (No. 1 Overall) QB Fernando Mendoza

Q: Number one, congratulations. Number two, just what's going through your mind right now? There's been a lot of talk out there that you were linked to the Raiders, but now that it's official, what's going through your mind?

Fernando Mendoza: "First of all, Mr. Gutierrez, pleasure to meet you. I look forward to a lot of conversations with you. It means the world. There's been a lot of anticipation whether I was going to end up here. And nothing was ever for certain except for tonight, so when I saw that call, I got a whole lot of chills on my entire body, and I was ecstatic. There's a lot of emotion even right now. However, I understand this is not the end of the journey, although this is a celebration, this is a start of a new thing, and like Coach Kubiak told me on the phone, to stay humble and hungry and to keep on trying to learn every single day."

Q: Where in this process did you feel like the Raiders would be a good fit for you?

Mendoza: "Whatever team was going to select me would be a good fit, but deep down, in my heart I knew the Raiders are most likely going to be the best fit because of the coaching staff. I think it really fits my play-style great, with all the great teammates on offense and defense, they're stacked. And then the great ownership whether it's Mr. [Mark] Davis, Mr. [Tom] Brady, what a better situation to walk into. So, I think all the stars are aligning here, and this is a blessing, this position"

Q: You mentioned Mr. Brady. I've seen you over the years talk about how much you looked up to him ever since you started playing football. What does it mean for him to be part of the group that drafted you, and what have your interactions been with him so far?

Mendoza: "It means a ton, and I think it's a huge edge for the football club to have such a source of knowledge, intelligence, and experience all in one, especially as an owner. It's something very rare that you get. So, I'm looking forward to diving in, getting all the resources I can from him and learning from him, the great coaches and the other great players we have on the team."

Q: When you look back at your career through high school to Cal to Indiana University to the Raiders, it's really been a journey of faith, both your personal faith, but also betting on yourself. How much is faith in you, and not just your spiritual faith, but your faith and trust in you and what you do in your team, part of who you are as a man?

Mendoza: "Well, first off, I'm a man of God, and I believe that God has a plan. He's blessed my family, blessed me. I just can't thank Him enough. And second of all, I also think that fortune favors the bold, and that sometimes when you're bold and you bet on yourself, it'll work out most of the time. And if it doesn't work out, at least you'll be able to at least sleep easy at night 20 years down the road, knowing you did everything possible to accomplish your goals. And that's what I look forward to doing, doing everything possible to accomplishing my goals with this football club and helping any way I can."

Q: Fernando, we know that the journey is just now beginning in the NFL. What is it that you're most excited about the opportunity that you bring to this team and just what you want to learn and what you're going to bring when you get boots on the ground?

Mendoza: "Well, I'm really excited to meet everyone at the Silver and Black organization, Raider Nation, and just really excited to learn what a great ownership group we have, what a great coaching staff and what great players. I mean, this roster is stacked with talent and intelligence. I'm looking forward to diving in, being one of the guys and helping the team in any way possible to win."

Q: You said you felt like it was a perfect fit with this staff. We've heard that you've been working on installing this offense. I'm just curious, with what you know about Klint Kubiak's scheme, why is it you feel you fit perfectly into this offense?

Mendoza: "Well, I watched a lot of film. I wasn't necessarily installing this offense. I was installing a general NFL offense, getting more accustomed to under center play and general West Coast concepts, which does fit under this tree, which now paid off in taking that risk. Talking about fortune favors the bold, rolling the dice on that a little bit. But this scheme, it really allows the quarterback to be a point guard. I believe that my job – we have so many great playmakers, whether from the outside, tight end, running back or offensive line, I just need to get the ball to the playmakers and do my part of the offense and be my 1/11th. And at that point, I believe this offense allows the quarterback to do that with such great coaches. I look forward to immersing myself into it."

Q: Obviously, when you heard your name called, what were the emotions and feelings that came with that? And who were some of the people that came to your mind as that moment came and rushed to you?

Mendoza: "It was great. I didn't know to celebrate when I got the phone call or when I heard it on the TV, so that was a little bit of a mix up there. But when I first got the call, the emotions, it was before the draft I was about to just burst out with emotion. And I told myself, hey, hold it in. Hold it in. It hasn't even happened yet, and then once it happened, I was ecstatic, and heard my mom say, 'I'm so proud of you,' and so that kind of broke me there. And I'm just so happy to have such a great support system, and so grateful and blessed for the opportunity."

Q: What excites you the most about the city of Las Vegas and getting your boots on the ground here as you become a Raider?

Mendoza: "My top-30 visit, I had a fantastic time. I believe that from an outside perspective, especially me being in and growing up in Miami, Las Vegas, it had a little bit of a different vibe than I thought. But when I touched down at Las Vegas and I saw what the city was all about. My first time being there, I was like, 'Wow, this is amazing,' and this is everything that's lived up to be an even better than that. So, I look forward to the city, it looks like everyone's really friendly. There's a lot of great cities outside of the Strip and the Strip talks for itself."

Q: You've always been sort of the underdog through your college career, having to prove yourself. How does that help you now being the number one pick overall, as far as just keeping that mentality?

Mendoza: "Well, I believe I'm still the underdog. Although the draft was today, once I got drafted, I'm now part of the NFL, and I can tell you right now I am not one out of 32 - although I was picked today one out of 32 - I'm not one out of 32 quarterbacks at this moment. So, I need to work every single day possible, because I'm on the bottom of the totem pole. Whatever everyone is ranking me, I don't know those specifics, but I'm at the bottom of the totem pole right now, and I've got to first earn the respect to my teammates, earn that equity, and I've also just got to immerse, and I'm just ready to do whatever the team needs and calls me to do to help them win."

Q: The underdog from high school who might not have continued football, and I read somewhere you were like the 288th recruit in the state of Florida, then you go on to be the number one pick in the NFL Draft. I guess that message to young kids to never give up, to follow your dreams, to continue to pursue whatever you dream of becoming? And then kind of the second part is that your work ethic I guess is unmatched, maybe next to Maxx Crosby, maybe talk about that?

Mendoza: "Well, I need to prove my work ethic, and I've heard Maxx Crosby has the best work ethic and it's second to none. So, I look forward to learning from him and a lot of other leaders and players on the team. However, that underdog mentality is always still there, but it's having unwavering optimism, and the message that my mom gave me that helped unlock the exponential growth is, don't put a ceiling over your head. Although they ranked me 288th in Florida, I didn't see myself as that, because I didn't see myself as a ranking, I just saw me as me. And I try to work on myself every single day as I look forward, whatever Coach [Klint] Kubiak, Coach [Andrew] Janocko and Coach [Mike] Sullivan say, 'Hey, you've got to work on,' and Maxx Crosby, whatever he says, 'Hey, you got to work on this,' I'm all for it. So, it'll be awesome."

Q: The Raiders are one of the most historic franchises in the NFL. What does it mean to be wearing the shield right now, and what was it like putting that hat on your head?

Mendoza: "It means everything. The legacy that the Raiders has here. I mean, it's a cornerstone franchise of the NFL. And just researching all the history, I got to meet Jim Plunkett at the Heisman ceremony, another Latino QB, it was awesome to connect with him. Look forward to connecting with more of the history. I wore number 15 in college, so if I get the opportunity to wear number 15 on the Raiders, that'd be fantastic. But I don't know if I've earned that yet, because of the legendary Tom Flores, who also played quarterback and evidently was just a Raiders icon. So, I have a lot of earning and proving to do, but I look forward to diving more into the Raiders history, whether it's having the commitment to excellence, whether it's honoring silver and black and Raider Nation, I'm excited to dive head first into it."

Q: You mentioned the players that are going to be surrounding you with the Raiders. They spent a ton in free agency this past March. What's it like being the number one pick, going into a situation where the team has already invested so much to be around you and kind of help you start your NFL career?

Mendoza: "I don't think it's just investing in me, I think it's investing in the entire team, everybody on the team. Whether it's offensive line position, quarterback position, defense, it just shows a commitment to excellence that the Raiders have, so I'm stacked to be a part of it and to play a small part into it."

Q: How important was it for you to stay home to celebrate this with your family? And also, is there really a matanza going on in your backyard right now?

Mendoza: "Yeah, it meant a lot. Although, to be quite honest, although I love Pittsburgh and would love to be there, I want to be a great rep of the NFL. I mean, the Raiders are number one for me and it's really easy for my mom to go here to Las Vegas tomorrow. And so, that was number one. To be honest, I chose the Raiders over Pittsburgh, or whatever team I was going at this point. I chose the Raiders over Pittsburgh because I wanted my mom to be there. It'd be hard for her to take two trips like that, really back-to-back. So, that was one of the main reasons. And then, yeah, they are doing a pig in the backyard, so everyone's eating it right now. So, hopefully they leave some for me, but if not, I'll still get something in my system."

Q: You made history becoming the first Cuban American quarterback to be drafted first overall. Your family, being a Latino is super important to you. I don't know if you know this, but Raider Nation has a lot of Latino fans. How excited are you to connect with them and to continue to put your culture forward as you make your ways in the NFL?

Mendoza: "Culture is everything, and I believe that it makes the person who they are and how they were raised. Latinos like to do it big, and that's what we did at the party. A lot of family, a lot of hugs, and I know the Raiders have, if not the most, I mean, they definitely have the most Hispanic following. Or if they don't have the most, it's definitely in the top two or three. So, I look forward to immersing myself in that community, giving back any way I can."

Q: What would you say is the best attribute that you're bringing to the Raiders?

Mendoza: "I would say the best attribute I'm bringing to the Raiders is resilience. I still need to earn it every single day and prove that I can play at this level, at high level, but the resilience, whether it's a bad practice and be able to take that bump and falling down and using that bump as an accelerator to then learn from it, improve. And so, every step along the way, I pride myself on exponential growth every single year. I've done it through all my college years, so look forward to keeping that trend up, and that trend is met by hard work, discipline, and unwavering optimism."

Q: Seeing you hug your mom was so special with your guys' relationship. It's awesome to see. Can you take me back to a memory you have and a conversation you had when you thought this dream was possible?

Mendoza: "Yeah, the dream of playing in the NFL, we thought was going to be possible, especially at the end of the College Football Playoff, and at that point, we were ecstatic. However, we wanted to focus on the task at hand. Then after the College Football Playoff, we were at home in Miami and kind of realized, especially this week, like, 'Wow, I'm about to play on an NFL team.' So, that opportunity -- it's great, and it's very surreal, very surreal, hasn't sunk in yet, and I don't know if it'll sink in in the next couple of days, but whenever it'll sink in, that will not change. I'm ready to get to work."

Post Round 1 Press Conference with General Manager John Spytek

Q: What are the qualities of Fernando Mendoza that made the Raiders want to draft him?

General Manager John Spytek: "Just a great person. Raised the right way, great family. He's about the right things, it's about his team, it's about winning, it's about doing the right thing, being accountable to the whole organization. It's very little to do with all the accolades he got after they won all those games. And he's really smart. He works really hard. This means a lot to him. And I don't that being the first overall pick and winning the Heisman and all the things that he's gotten will change him. I think that it'll actually make him work harder to prove that he's worth all that and then earn even more."

Q: You look at everything, he could have gotten more money, gone to schools that maybe had a bigger tradition than Indiana, but chosen because of [Curt] Cignetti's tough coaching, how much did that stick out to you?

Spytek: "I mean, it's part of it, like everything we do. I just saw a kid that was hungry and willing to bet on himself and wanted a great opportunity to compete against the best. I think the Big Ten is the best conference in football right now. And he showed exactly that, that he was that."

Q: Everybody in the world thought, when you guys went to the championship game, the decision was already made that this process was done. When was it done for you?

Spytek: "It was certainly not done in Miami that night, it was great to be there and great to see him play like that. When was it really done? It started to feel better and better when we met him in person. I'm a big believer in the interactions. You only get so many opportunities in front of them. They're not as long as you want, but I think you can tell a lot about a person in those in those interactions, and he was just always authentically himself. He was endearing. You could see the driven, almost the maniacal, driven part of it that makes a great QB. So, I don't, I don't necessarily have a final-final when it was decided, but it wasn't today."

Q: Knowing as you do now, how do you think he'll respond to playing with Kirk Cousins and learning Kirk? Is he a sponge? What kind of kid is he comparative now, learning from a veteran like that?

Spytek: "My experiences with him are just that he's so hungry for anything football that anybody's around that he can draw something from or learn something from that person, he's into it. And there's a humility to him that I really respect, too, I think that can maybe be a little bit underrated in our profession, especially with the players. But there's a humility and a self-awareness to him that he knows that this is a really big jump, and we're going to support him organizationally the best that we can. And he knows that those guys in that room, Kirk [Cousins] and Aidan [O'Connell] have played a lot of good football in this league, and I'm sure that he'll learn a lot from them and he knows that."

Q: At the combine, he said that during his interview with you guys, you sat him down and you went over a few plays with him. Just with that process, what were some things that really stood out to you in terms of his processing, and some things that really kind of impressed you about him?

Spytek: "Well, first of all, his recall was incredible. You could just put the play up there, and it would be from Week Two, and before you even push play, he knew what it was. He could talk you through it. They weren't all sunshine and rainbow plays either. There were some of them he screwed up, 'Oh yeah, I should have made this read.' And there was an honesty and a self-awareness to it, but also, I mean, it was like that, and he had it. And I've been a part of a few other quarterback interviews like that before, but not very many."

Q: From another skill set standpoint, how does that fit what your guys are trying to do offensively here in Las Vegas?

Spytek: "It's a great scheme fit for us. He's big. He can see downfield. He can see over the middle of the field. He can throw those balls. He's athletic, so all the boots and the keepers that we like to run, he'll do well with. He has a good arm. He can throw the ball all over the field wherever it needs to be, and he's extremely accurate, which whatever system you play in as a quarterback is important. So, I mean, it's another exciting piece to why he's here."

Q: He said he watched all of Kirk Cousins' games in Minnesota. How much does his work ethic impress you during this process?

Spytek: "Well, I think that's more of a testament probably to just that he's a football junkie, which I think is awesome. He told us that on Sundays he's watching football with his teammates, his o-line. There's a lot of players, it probably would astound you, that actually don't watch a lot of football, but I've kind of found that the best ones are always watching football. And so, the fact that he went back and watched all Kirk's [Cousins] games, I think is cool, and doesn't entirely surprise me either."

Q: You said at the NFL Combine that you're always listening to anything. And then the other day, you said teams know where they stand when they called, maybe shutting down some of the phone calls. How many calls did you take? And was there ever any real discussions about potentially moving out?

Spytek: "We had a few calls. The answer was no. No was in a complete sentence."

Q: As you look at how the draft board fell out, there's still so much talent there, but did it fall the way you think it would? Or can you just kind of give me your quick assessment of what you saw looking ahead to tomorrow, please?

Spytek: "Yeah, it fell pretty along the lines of what we thought. You know, there's always surprises, or maybe there's teams that need something that we don't need so they would value them a little bit more than maybe we would. I think we expected there to be a big run on offensive lineman, and there was. And we're still in a good spot. We are going to go up here in a little bit and check out the strategy for 36 tomorrow, but our board is still in a good spot."

Q: Anything come up tonight where you looked into trading into the back end of the first round?

Spytek: "We had a few discussions late there, and just nothing materialized."

Q: When you completed your evaluation of Fernando Mendoza, did you ultimately draw any comparisons to anybody?

Spytek: "Not really. I'm not a big comparison guy. I tell my kids all the time, 'Comparisons are thieves of joy.' So, I don't do that."

Q: What are you looking forward to most about seeing his personality in the locker room and watching how he becomes a leader to this team?

Spytek: "Well, I don't know if I'm looking forward to it. I just think he'll be like he always is, you know. And I think when he gets here tomorrow, you'll get a chance to sit in front of him, probably some of you for the first time, and get to see it, but I would just encourage him to be himself. That's plenty good enough."

Q: He seems so authentic, like you were saying. How does that translate onto a football field?

Spytek: "I think in any locker room I've been in, I think what you're always looking for is people to just be who they are. Locker rooms are interesting places. There's people from all over the world, different demographics, races, ages, etc., especially in an NFL locker room. But the guys that have success, the greatest teammates that I've been around or witnessed on teams, they have a maniacal work ethic and drive to them, but it is authentically who they are. They're not trying to fool anybody, they're not trying to be anybody that they're not. And that's been my experience with Fernando [Mendoza]. That's who he is."

Q: You brought in Tyler Linderbaum to help with the offensive line -- Klint Kubiak, Andrew Janocko, Rick Dennison, how well do you think you've set Mendoza up for success?

Spytek: "I guess we'll find out coming up. Did we do those things just for the quarterback? It would have been premature to do that necessarily. What we really tried to do was solidify a part of the football field and the football team that I think is vitally important to success, and that's what the signing of Tyler Linderbaum was about. That's what Spencer Burford was about. And to have a coach like Rick Dennison, Andrew [Janocko] and Klint [Kubiak], who have been successful in running the football and protecting the quarterback pretty much everywhere they've been, trying to put all those things together and then have the opportunity to get a quarterback, hopefully it sets it up the right way. That's what we were shooting for, the totality of it."

Q: It seems like Klint Kubiak kind of tried to stay tight lipped about what he's thought about Fernando Mendoza and how excited he would be to work with him. What was just his reaction, and how does he see him fitting in his offense?

Spytek: "He's super excited to work with him. I think any coach is excited to work with a big, athletic, talented thrower that is extremely smart and a very driven worker, and that's been our experience with Fernando [Mendoza]. I mean, that's a great starting spot for any quarterback."

Q: Looking at his tape and everything, what stood out to you in the obvious third-down passing situations and just late-game scenarios when you're watching him?

Spytek: "It was just the moment was never too big for him, whether it was the fourth downs in the national championship game, the throw down the field in the Big Ten Championship to really kind of solidify it. It didn't really matter what he had done before that, he doesn't have the personality or really the thought, I don't think, to get caught up. He's just always kind of in the moment, and he's trying to execute that play in a way that is required for him to win the game. And the fact that he's big and there's a fearlessness to him in those moments because he's prepared, and he's, I think, convicted in what that play call is about, and he's put in a lot of work to know that those plays are coming in those situations. So, I think that the level of preparation for him and his ability and the belief in himself to execute and the moment to not be too big for him, really stood out. And it stood out again and again throughout the course of the season."

Q: Fernando Mendoza said that he was looking forward to diving into the history of the Raiders, brought up some names like Jim Puckett, Tom Flores. What's it like to have a guy that's interested and buying into kind of the history of the team and wants to carve out his own chapter?

Spytek: "I think that's really cool, and I think it's who he is, especially with an organization like the Raiders that is so rich with history and great players. And I know Mr. [Mark] Davis appreciates that too. Those of you that have been up in kind of the scouting way over here, you can see all the Hall of Fame posters that are up and the great Raiders that have played, and when we walked him through that, I mean, he stopped and looked at all of them. And it's not because he should do it. It's because he really is interested in it, and I think when you come to organizations like this that have those players and that rich history, it it should mean a little more to be here and to have the great fortune to be a Raider, and I don't think that's lost on him."

Q: Were you taking any more potential offers on Maxx Crosby leading up to the draft?

Spytek: "No."

Q: What are you expecting tomorrow, and again, is it just kind of let the draft come to you? Do you see some moves happening? What do you think from your perspective?

Spytek: "To me, it's always let it come to us, and any call we get or option we have has potential value, and there's a great team around me that will put our heads together, and we'll decide if it makes sense at 36 to stick and pick tomorrow or if it makes sense to move up if we want to get one of those guys or if to move back. So, I kind of go into them with no expectations but a level of preparation to be able to handle any scenario that might be thrown at us."

Q: What do you think about pairing Fernando Mendoza with two guys alongside of on offense in Ashton Jeanty and Brock Bowers? All three of them so young with so much upside. How do you feel about that foundation moving forward?

Spytek: "I'm excited about it. They're talented, they're good football players, they're good humans, they're good teammates, and they're young. I love that, and so, my vision would be that all three of those guys are here for a long time."

Q: Obviously, with Fernando Mendoza, he had more than 30 starts in college. Just in your years as a scout, draft evaluator, how confident are you within quarterbacks that have more playing experience when you're trying to evaluate their tape versus guys that you know haven't played as much? And did that lead to you drafting Fernando as well?

Spytek: "It's a big help. I mean, the more you can see a guy do anything, kick a football, catch a football, throw a football, it's helpful. We all know it's a hard position to play, and so the more time on task, the better. Especially in playing against really good competition like Fernando [Mendoza] has, but just because a guy hasn't played or started a ton in college, I mean, there are always examples of those guys that succeed as well. But we only had to worry about the guy that we have right now, and he's played a lot of football and a lot of good football."

Press Conference with First-Round Pick (No. 1 Overall) QB Fernando Mendoza

General Manager John Spytek Opening Statement: "Okay, I want to thank everybody for coming this afternoon to an exciting day for the Raiders organization and the Las Vegas community. The long mystery has finally been solved. We got our guy here and just want to thank everybody that was a part of this process in this building to arrive to the selection of Fernando [Mendoza] was not a coronation here and did every bit of the way with his play and the way that he conducted himself and all of our one-on-one interactions during the draft process. So, we're thrilled to welcome Fernando to Las Vegas. To have his family here today is really special. I hope it's been a special 24ish hours for them. I know it's been a whirlwind, but we are thrilled to welcome Fernando Mendoza to the Las Vegas Raiders."

Q: Fernando, it's been a long process, you've talked about that. The college season, the draft process, now you're actually here. Does it kind of feel more real now that you're in the building and part of the team, and then the second part, did you have to apologize to your brother for snubbing him with the high five after the draft?

Fernando Mendoza: "Yeah, first of all, my brother, we actually had two post celebrations when we got the call and then when the pick went in on the TV. But I apologized to him, and he knows I love him, so I hit him with a dap and a hug afterwards. And there's a lot of anticipation coming to this pick, but now I'm really glad that all of the outside noise is done. I'm officially a Raider. I'm excited to be humble and hungry and get to work."

Q: I read that you trained with Brian Griese ahead of the draft. I was curious, what kind of led to that and what was it like working with him?

Mendoza: "Yeah, Coach [Brian] Griese is a great guy, and we both went to the same high school, Christopher Columbus, down in Miami, Florida. And with him, he's someone that I reached out to because I needed some guidance on how to become the best NFL quarterback, not just for like a pro day or the combine for September, whenever it is, in October, December, to be NFL quarterback. And with that, we just went over some general under center concepts and just installed basic bread and butter concepts that any team would have. So, it was great working with him and he kind of gave me an adjustment, because he's been an NFL quarterback coach in the past."

Q: You're now a first round selection with a \$55 million guarantee deal that's coming on the table. Has the enormity of the responsibility and the blessing hit you yet?

Mendoza: "Yeah, it's a huge blessing. However, I feel like I still need to earn it, and I haven't proved anything. My college career was very blessed. It was a great, a very significant career, however, in the NFL I'm on the bottom of the totem pole again, so I'm really looking forward to proving every single day to everybody in the building."

Q: You mentioned yesterday that you had been looking into the West Coast offense. I'm curious what part of the West Coast offense, or what part of your game are you looking forward to improving the most?

Mendoza: "I think the part of the West Coast offense I found the most interesting was the run tracks, especially how important that is off the system of making sure you're on the right track for outside zone, getting the ball as deep as possible to the running back, so you can have the best vision possible, which then helps out the offensive line. And I'm always trying to do my 1/11th in the offense. I believe it allows the quarterback to be a great point guard and with such a great scheme that coach [Klint] Kubiak has. And I just want to do my 1/11th whether it's hand the ball off, throwing, making a check, whatever it may be."

Q: I was curious as how much familiarity do you have with Kirk Cousins and his career, and what are you hoping to learn from him?

Mendoza: "Yeah, I was blessed this morning and last night I was able to get a text from a couple of guys like Maxx Crosby, Tyler Linderbaum, Kolton Miller and Kirk Cousins. I'm sure there's been more, I'll be looking forward to reaching out to all my new teammates and most of those guys. It's been a whirlwind in the past couple hours, but Kirk sent me really nice text, looking forward to working with him, learning anything I can from him, and just a great not only teammates that I will learn from but also the great coaches."

Q: John Spytek talked about last night the offense and how Fernando Mendoza fits. When you watch tape and everything, where does his skill set fit? Where do you like him most in your offense?

Head Coach Klint Kubiak: "Yeah, his skill set fits with any offense in professional football. Obviously, the number one thing that I love about Fernando [Mendoza] is his leadership, the way that he relates to his teammates and his ability to win. We're looking for a competitor to be our quarterback, and he went 16-0 last year with a heck of a team, and he led that group. So, love his athleticism, his ability to throw accurately down the field, he's very accurate, but at the end of the day, he's a bright, intelligent leader."

Q: Fernando, what does the responsibility of being a Raider mean to you? When you look to your left and you got Jim Plunkett, the last man to win the Super Bowl as a quarterback for the team, and to your right, you got Fred Biletnikoff, the first Super Bowl MVP in the history of the franchise, and then you got the Vince Lombardi trophies right in front of you as well.

Mendoza: "It's a huge responsibility, but it's also a huge honor to honor the legacy. The Raiders are a core historic franchise and one of the faces of the NFL, and I feel like, again, I need to prove it and earn it every single day. If I wear number 15 this year, whether or not that happens, I mean, Tom Flores was able to coach and win two Super Bowls and also wear number 15 as a quarterback. He has cemented that number. So, I feel like every corner you turn, you see Mr. [Jim] Plunkett, Mr. [Tim] Brown, Mr. [Marcus] Allen, like everybody, Mr. [Fred] Biletnikoff, and I really appreciate all the legends coming out here today. It means so much to see the alumni and really shows what a first class organization this is. So, I'm stoked and ready to prove it."

Q: We know you're a planner. You're a preparer in everything you do. Going back to your teammates, what's the sort of plan to connect with the guys kind of once you get into the locker room here with the Raiders?

Mendoza: "I think it's familiarity, and especially as a rookie, nothing's given, and my belief in that everything is earned. So, I'm going to come in humble, try to establish myself with my work ethic and lead by example, but at the end of the day, it's all great saying these words, but I got to do it. So, I'm looking forward to connecting with them, and I'm just excited to learn from them as well and care about them as people."

Q: You're starting this fund. Can you talk about what that means to you?

Mendoza: "Yeah, it's great. My mom's there in the back. Can't thank her enough for everything. So, we started the Mendoza Family Fund, which we were able to get a good donation to. Starting off and have been blessed in my journey and I believe one of my pillars and my identities is giving back and helping fighting MS, giving to the community. So, that was a huge part of my identity, and it's something that our family really wanted to do."

Q: First, congratulations and welcome. You've talked over the past few months about how you're proud of your heritage. What's something you're looking forward to within the Raiders as a franchise with a history of Latino pride?

Mendoza: "Yeah, I mean, the history of the Raiders, especially the Hispanic history, is like no other. I believe it's probably the most Hispanic fan base and legends like Mr. [Jim] Plunkett, like Mr. [Tom] Flores. I mean, all those legendary Hispanic idols and cornerstones of the franchise. It means a lot as a Cuban American to come to this franchise and help try to carry the torch. But again, I got to prove it, and I'm really looking forward to connecting with the Hispanic community here."

Q: You were talking about the alumni presence, and you obviously walk in and you see three Heismans when you walk in, coming off of a Heisman Trophy win. How did that feel, and also the sense of that pressure of winning the Heisman trophy, is that added coming into the NFL team, or is it not anything you really think about?

Mendoza: "Yeah, I think it was in the last chapter. It was a great chapter, and don't get me wrong, the Heisman is an awesome trophy, and I'm really happy that I won it. However, that not I won it; the team won it. The Indiana team won it. But that's in the past chapter. But there's a great history of Heisman Trophy winners here for the Raiders. I mean, I think there's around nine to 11 in the total history. So, that commitment to excellence, that goes not only from the college but also to the NFL level, is shown by all the Heisman Trophy winners here. I'm lucky to be a part of it."

Q: You have the unique opportunity to play for a team with a large Latino fanbase. How important is it to you being Latino, and do you speak Spanish or only understand it?

Mendoza: "Well, I definitely understand it. I would say I'm really confident in my understanding ability. For example, I repeat back what you said. Speaking it, I still need to get better on that. I need to learn every single part of my journey. But I will say I'm working on learning my Spanish back, it was my first language, but being Hispanic is everything to me. I believe culture is the thing that sets a person and their identity. I'm lucky enough to be raised by four Cuban American grandparents, and my parents also instilling the Cuban culture in me. So, it means a lot to be a part of this Hispanic community, looking forward to embracing it at every moment I can."

Q: I remember hearing you in some interviews talking about when you were looking about where you wanted to transfer, about your brother to Indiana, and how he was learning and developing in terms of reading defenses and stuff like that at kind of a different level. I'm curious now, in hindsight, in that area, what you really took away that prepared you the most for this job now with the Raiders?

Mendoza: "I think it's the ability to get coached, the ability to get coached and always come in with a low ego and be open to new coaching. That was a big thing at California. It was a successful season. But coming to Indiana, I realized there's so much more to learn, and I always want to have exponential growth every single year, and that is made by the process, the work ethic, and the inputs I do every single day. And this is going to be a whole new chapter, and I have so much more to grow, and I know my best football is ahead of me, so I'm really excited for the opportunity."

Q: You were just talking about the legacy of the Raiders. This team has struggled in recent seasons, had four-straight losing seasons. Does the challenge of restoring that legacy and bringing success back to this franchise kind of excite you?

Mendoza: "Well, I'm just looking forward to doing my 1/11th every single play, every single game, every single season. So, I'm just really honored to be a part of this historic franchise, and looking forward to being a small part of the success in the future."

Q: Yesterday, you said that you were emotional all day. You had to tell yourself to hold it in, and then what really broke you was when your mom told you that she was proud of you. Just why was that and what does it mean for you to have her in the building with you here today?

Mendoza: "It means a lot. Family is everything. I think it's the motto of the Raiders, 'Once Raider, Always a Raider.' And it means a lot to have my family by my side, whether it's in Miami or here in Las Vegas. I'm ecstatic to be a part of it. There's a lot of emotions, especially as a young kid who always wanted to play in the NFL, and finally getting that call, there's going to be a lot of emotions, but it's not about just making the NFL. It's not the finish line. It's about playing well in the NFL, lasting long in the NFL, and making an impact in the NFL. So, with the support of my family, new teammates, and coaches, I'm looking forward to doing that."

Q: We often asked John Spytek and Klint Kubiak their impressions about players through the draft process. What was your impression of the Raiders organization as you went through the draft process?

Mendoza: "Well, I'll say it was top notch. When I came on my top 30 visit, I was blown away with everybody in the building. Top to bottom, you can see some, for sure, trickledown effect where everyone's first class, everyone's first class. That starts with Coach [Klint] Kubiak, Mr. [John] Spytek, Mr. [Mark] Davis, all the other owners. I'm really excited to be a part of this organization and this professionalism and the way that it's detail-oriented, how they give incredible effort and just the process."

Q: You and your mom's relationship is so beautiful, and you've mentioned that she's your "why." Is there a memory you have during a hard time when she pushed you? Or a conversation you guys had to keep following this dream that you're now living out?

Mendoza: "Yeah, it was after my third season at Berkeley, or at Cal. I just graduated, and at that point, my mom always saw more in me than I saw myself, at that time, and she essentially pushed me to take a swing at trying to become a great NFL player. And that first step was transferring and challenging myself by being in an uncomfortable environment. Because when you're uncomfortable, you're able to grow. She said, 'Hey, if you step to the plate, if you swing and you miss, at least in 20 years you knew you did everything possible to try to accomplish your dream.' And I stepped to the plate, and luckily enough, I was able to hit a home run last year. So, she taught me to have unwavering optimism, and that fortune favors the bold. And you got to have unwavering optimism to believe in yourself and then achieve those goals."

Q: We just heard Klint Kubiak talk about how impressed he was with your leadership in the 16-0 season. John Spytek said something similar last night. I'm guessing that couldn't have been easy, showing up in a new place and doing that. What was the hardest part about that? And what did you learn from that experience that you can bring to the Raiders as a rookie?

Mendoza: "Well, I think the great thing about Indiana last year and Las Vegas Raiders this year, is I'm showing up to a new place with fantastic leaders in every corner of the building, whether it's offense, defense, special teams, coaches, operations, owners. At every corner there's fantastic leaders, and I'm excited to be a part of that and learn from those leaders. And that's what I did at Indiana, I stepped in there and tried to have the lowest ego possible, work my butt off and earn it, because I believe that leadership is earned. It's not given. And so, I look forward to learning from all the fantastic people in this organization, and hopefully one day becoming a good leader."

Q: Klint, was there a time through the process that you just knew for certain that Fernando Mendoza was your guy, whether that be watching him, observing him at one of the Pro Day, or an interaction that you had with him?

Coach Kubiak: "Yeah, when we went to the Pro Day and we got to see Fernando [Mendoza] throw live, and the way he ran that Pro Day, he bossed his teammates around, told him what route they were running and how accurately he threw the ball. Obviously, his stature, and then took him upstairs and talked football with him and just listened to him communicate the game and how quickly he picked things up. We already liked how he played the game on film, but seeing him in person was really helpful, and it allowed us to watch film on a lot of other guys. We knew we had the guy."

Q: You played at two schools, Berkeley and Indiana, but you actually played in three different conferences. How much did that help you in the process to become a pro being in three different styles, with the Pac-12, ACC and the Big Ten?

Mendoza: “Yeah, not only did I play in three different conferences all four years of college, I've had a new system. I think it's been a great opportunity to learn every single year, rather than find myself comfortable. Evidently, like every quarterback and every coach wants to be in a system for a long time so it can grow in the system. But that change, whether it's conference, systems, it gave me an opportunity to learn, grow and establish a process on how to learn new systems, which I'm looking forward to using in this. I'm looking forward to taking all the coaching I can, and I just feel like it's made me a versatile player that I can adapt to new game plan plays, new systems. I'm just really excited to learn.”

Video Call with Second-Round Pick (No. 38 Overall) S Treydan Stukes

Q: First of all, welcome to Las Vegas. My question for you is, what were your interactions like with the Raiders during the pre-Draft process, how many visits did you have with them through the combine, or 30 visits, could you talk us through your interaction with the Raiders during the pre-Draft process.

Treydan Stukes: "Yeah, I had a chance to sit down with them in the formal and that went really well. I had a chance to connect with some of the coaches and stuff. After that, I didn't hear much, and sometimes that's how it goes in the process. But I'm super excited to be here, super excited to get to work with these coaches and some of the players on the squad already."

Q: They announced you as a safety, and your speed is overwhelming. It's extremely fast. But you are also a hitter, you're a thumper. Can you talk about that unique mix of speed and highly aggressive nature of play?

Stukes: "I think the speed comes from a physical standpoint, working out hard and training my whole life, honestly. And then I think, bringing that thump, like you said, it's kind of more of a mentality. And I've decided to go out there and play with that mentality every time. And it's helped me elevate my game to the next level. And I can't wait to keep expanding on that, keep building it at this next level."

Q: You played outside corner early in your career, played some safety, played nickel. What do you see your role being at the next level?

Stukes: "Yeah, I mean, I'm willing to play any of them. Like you said, I've got some good reps at pretty much every defensive back position. So, wherever the coaches want me, whatever the coaches see me fitting best, I'm willing to do, and whatever I can play to help the team win games, that's where I'm at."

Q: Getting interceptions and PBUs is not an accident, it's a skill set. What is it that goes into the mindset and what is it that makes you so good at seeing the ball and getting the ball?

Stukes: "Yeah, I think, like you said, mindset is a huge part of that. I think getting the ball back to your offense is obviously going to be the most important thing you can do as a defender. And being a defensive back, you get the most opportunities in the pass game. And that's how I think every time that ball's in the air, I want to get it back for our offense because scoring points wins games, and if we can hold them to zero, all our offense needs to do is score three points, and it's good. So, I think a lot of teams, and honestly, football as a whole has kind of recognized the value of turnovers, and I value that as highly as anything on the football field."

Q: What do you think it is about you as a player and as a young man that took you from being a walk-on at Arizona all the way to this position now, pretty high up in the Draft, early in the second round in the NFL now?

Stukes: "Yeah, I think it all falls down to my values. I kind of go by motto, 'Heart, humility, efficacy, accountability, resilience and trustworthiness.' I've used those values at every level in every stage of my life. It's just helped me grow and keep striving to be my best in all aspects of my life. And right now, football is number one for me, and I'm pouring everything I've got into football, and I think that's what's allowed me to have the growth that I've had from being a walk-on to now."

Q: Of your skill set, what do you think translates the best to what modern safeties are asked to do in the NFL now?

Stukes: "Yeah, I think having the speed, range, and processing ability to get to cover ground on the field. There are a lot of good quarterbacks and a lot of fast receivers, and they want those shot plays, and those are the plays that you've got to make if you want to win football games. And I think I'll be able to come in and help the team defend those type of shot plays and make plays on the football when I get a chance."

Q: Going from a walk-on to a second-round pick, when did you realize that this was possible for you and when did you set the NFL as your goal?

Stukes: "Yeah, I mean, the NFL has been my goal as far back as I can remember. But I think it became realistic for me probably around my junior season. I realized that the game was kind of slowing down for me, and I was playing at a level where I felt like I could compete with anybody in the country. And I had a couple setbacks even from then, but I never wavered in my trust and in my values. And I think it allowed me to just keep that mentality, knowing the player I am, the person I am, that I'm ready to compete at the highest level, and help a team win a Super Bowl."

Q: What do you think people got wrong about you?

Stukes: "I don't know. I mean, I was a little under recruited. I don't think everyone knew how fast I was. I don't think they knew I was that fast. So, running the 4.33, it was fun. That was cool."

Q: I'm going to give you a chance to brag on your alma mater, but they believed in you, and you really developed there under the coaching. Will you talk about what Arizona has meant to you, and just, quite frankly, the quality of coaching that you got there that saw you go from a walk-on to a highly valued top end second rounder?

Stukes: "Absolutely. I got a lot of love for Arizona. I grew from a boy to a man in my time over there, and my path wasn't exactly perfect. We had three head coaches, five defensive coordinators, but I saw that as a blessing. I got to pick knowledge from five different high level coaches. I've had different position coaches throughout all those times, and I got to pick the brains of a lot of high level football coaches, and I think the ones that they have in the building now are fantastic developers. They do it the right way. It's not about the money or this and that. They're bringing you in, they're going to try to develop you, and you can see the rewards of having a having a staff like that. We got three safeties that are going to be drafted this year, so if anyone's looking out there trying to get right, go to Arizona, man."

Q: You were a 4.0 student in high school, graduated two years ago Academic All-Big 12. How much is your intelligence and your brain kind of played into your development and helps you on the football field?

Stukes: "No, yeah, 100%. We used to have a coach that said, 'The days of the dumb jock are over,' and it's very true. You have to be smart to play high level football. There's a lot of moving parts. There's a lot of things going on, and if you want to be able to keep up and adjust in real time, you got to have the brain processing power to do so, especially playing safety. You're the quarterback of the defense. So, yeah, I think just having that higher intellect and keep continuing to train my brain just helps me process things faster and digest and do different things on the field and be able to make those real time decisions, snap decisions in seconds."

Q: Can you talk a little bit about your leadership qualities? Thought I read that you're a three-time team captain, helped coach the team a little bit when you tore your ACL. How do you approach being a leader on the team, and what do you expect kind of that role to be like when you go to the Raiders?

Stukes: "Yeah, I did have a chance to be a three-time captain over there. That was a really growing moment for me and probably past few years. I was never really out there, like speech guy or anything like that, but I did take it very seriously when I got voted captain for the first time, and I tried to develop those leadership skills that you can have because I think it's a trait and it's a skill that you can't practice at. And just learning from that, learning everything that I got, I'll be able to go into a locker room and get to know the guys, get to know the people that have been doing it for some years and learn from them. And whenever my time comes to step up and be that leader, I've got some experience at that, so I can do it."

Q: Any guys in particular that you modeled your game after?

Stukes: "Not necessarily modeled, I would say I'm a fan of a few guys of how they play the game and what they're able to do on the field, guys like Kyle Hamilton or Cooper DeJean, Jalen Pitre, those type of guys. I really respect the way that they go about their business and the way that they show up on Sundays. So, but I would say my game is kind of a little bit different from all of theirs. It's kind of a unique style of football."

Q: Obviously a walk-on to Arizona, if you had to give any advice to the former self coming up through that process or any young player that had to go through what you went through to get to where you were, what would it be?

Stukes: "Yeah. I mean, you kind of talked about the process. In short, I would say just trust the process. Kind of understand that being a walk-on, it is a little bit different. You're going to have to work a little harder. You're going to have to show up when you get your opportunity and just be prepared for that moment. Don't let it come and go. Football is all preparation, and if you are going about all your business the right way, when you get that opportunity, you have got to be there to show up and go get it. And I think anybody's capable of it. If a guy like me with zero stars out of high school can make it to this point, anybody is capable of doing whatever they want if they are disciplined and they put in the work and effort that it takes to be prepared for their moment to shine."

Video Call with Third-Round Pick (No. 67 Overall) DE Keyron Crawford

Q: We saw a video of you jumping in the pool after celebrating getting picked, so just take us through that moment when you got that phone call saying it was the Las Vegas Raiders?

Keyron Crawford: "I was already planning on that, it was predetermined, just before the Draft. So, it was more so something I already planned, just because the excitement, something to see, but also just momentum built up. So, it was really more so like a relief. So, that was really all it took in that very moment. And I was just really happy as hell."

Q: You started at Arkansas State with Butch Jones, but you've only been playing five years, which is really a testimony to your want. Can you discuss your upside?

Crawford: "So, it's more so just the upside is my skill still being able to grow, still develop, still learn, just like all the pieces that you would want as a young player. So, the peak that you saw far as Arkansas State and Auburn, it was a very small piece. Just knowing the mindset and the person that I am, it's more so that you're going to end up getting 10 times more of that. So, they know they're going to get a dog, and I'm willing to put all my foot, all 10 toes down, and everything; my best foot forward for as long as I'm a Raider."

Q: The Raiders are starting a brand-new chapter, sustainability for the future. How exciting is it for you to be a part of the beginning stages of this?

Crawford: "It's very exciting. I'm happy to be a part of it. It was one of my best formal interviews, one of my best 30 interviews as well. So, it was more so just a very uplifting moment, just because they were already on top of my list. So, they immediately checked the box off that. So, it's more so I'm just ready to put the work in."

Q: You just mentioned they're at the top of your list. Why were they at the top of your list? Why was that a team that you were interested in?

Crawford: "The people that's in the building. I felt the family-oriented vibes and it was more so just like still being about them but also taking care of your business at the same time. As long as you got the good people that's in that facility, and you bring in more of those good people that got the same mindset and the same outcome, it's going to be 10 times more a winning establishment, because we all want to see success and hold each other up to a certain standard."

Q: A new defensive coordinator in Rob Leonard, he hasn't done that job before, so everybody's kind of wondering what exactly his scheme will look like. What did they talk to you about, maybe potentially, what your role could be, and where do you see yourself fitting in at the NFL level?

Crawford: "We'll talk more about that once I get down there. So, it's more so they know that they're getting a dog at the end of the day. So, we're going to end up working as far as putting everything forward. And then they tell me what to do, exactly how to do it. I'm going to study and do exactly that."

Q: We talked about you being new to the sport. We know that you were a basketball player before you started playing football. How do you think your skills and kind of starting with that sport have helped you develop as a pass rusher?

Crawford: "Just as far as I would say the wiggle and far as like the twitchy part of my game, it's definitely one that most don't have, but also something that could still also be improved. So, it's just more so just carrying it onto the football field and being able to be flexible and also move the way I move. It's just hand-in-hand as far as being on the court."

Q: The scouting report on you is about work ethic. Almost every scout that's looked at you or watched you said, "He worked so hard, works even harder when he's not being watched." Where does that come from, and why is it important to you?

Crawford: "I would definitely say probably my upbringing, just being able to be a part of a single parent home and just seeing my mom work, so that's all I saw. So, it was more so just taking that over, not even trying to, but it happened naturally. So, that always has been a part of me as well. It's always been part of the way I carry myself, even if I'm not getting praise, I'm going to still end up showing up day in and day out, and from the end of lights off, I'm going to turn the lights on, and I'm also going to go to work. I'm going to put the work in, so it's more so just I don't care who's watching. I don't care who's talking about me, but long as I put my work in, as long as I feel good about myself and I know I achieved today, it was always a check mark."

Q: What was your experience like? How important was it to be there at Auburn at the time that you were there, and then playing alongside Keldric Faulk as well, who obviously is a hell of an edge rusher too?

Crawford: "It was definitely a moment that I wouldn't take back. I know we didn't win as much, but it was more so, just like the experience, it was more so the learning and being around the SEC culture and just being able to develop me more mentally. So, it was more so that, and then just being able to be a part of a culture just as far as trying to win, but we know we didn't win as much, so it's more so carrying that over to the NFL. So, being a part of a program that's willing to put the work in and has the good people that's around."

Q: How much do you embrace the opportunity to play alongside Maxx Crosby, and I wonder how much have you studied his game up to this point?

Crawford: "Maxx [Crosby] is, he's definitely one of my favorite players as far as just how he attacks the field, how he carries himself. So, I can't lie, I'm going to pick the ins and outs, everything about him. So, it's more so just taking that apart and just translating that to my game, translating that to my routine and my schedule, and just trying to be the best person as well. Just being able to learn from him at a young age, but also still being able to bypass him at the same time. So, it's more so if I can't bypass him, I definitely want to play alongside on the other edge."

Q: You've been quoted once by saying that when you step on the field, you have a "killed or be killed" kind of dog mentality. When you make a statement like that, what does that look like? Where do you have to take yourself within your mentality of how you play the game to even get to that point?

Crawford: "I can't lie. I just don't like losing. I don't like losing at all. So, it's more so like, I would rather run my ass back in the locker room than let you win. So, it's more so that."

Video Call with Third-Round Pick (No. 91 Overall) G Trey Zuhn III

Q: You have experience playing left tackle and center, but the Raiders announced you as a guard. How comfortable are you playing guard at the next level, and how much have the Raiders talked to you during a pre-Draft process about the possibility of switching to that position?

Trey Zuhn III: "Yeah, I'm comfortable playing all five positions at the highest level. So, I've gotten to play a bunch of guard in practice, and I'm ready to play it at the highest level. So, whatever they need me to play to get on the field, is what I'm going to play."

Q: How do you think your skill set aligns with Klint Kubiak's system, and are you excited to work with Rick Dennison?

Zuhn: "Yeah, I'm just so excited and so honored to get to play for him. And yeah, there's not a better system I could play for that I could ask for. So, it's just an honor to get to be a part of the Raiders. So excited."

Q: What do you what do you feel is your best attribute, or what do you feel you bring to an NFL roster?

Zuhn: "I think I bring my consistency and my quick feet, and I'm a smart player. I love to learn the playbook, and I love to learn about football and have a high football IQ, so I'm going to learn the playbook as soon as they get it out to me, and I'm just going to be a consistent player and get on the field as quick as I can."

Q: The Raiders obviously had the number one overall pick in Fernando Mendoza. I'm wondering if you have any familiarity with him, and what you make of the possibility of blocking for him?

Zuhn: "I do not, but I am very excited to play for him and yeah, block for him. I can't wait, and I can't wait to meet him, and I can't wait to protect him back there. So, I'm just excited."

Q: Klint Kubiak did a lot of zone running in his running game. What do you think of that kind of style and approach to the running game, and how well do you think you'll fare in it given your skill set and attributes?

Zuhn: "I'm a perfect fit for that kind of scheme, and I just can't wait to get going. So yeah, I can't wait to prove myself here coming up in rookie minicamp, and I can't wait to earn a spot."

Q: Can you talk about your stamina during games?

Zuhn: "Yeah, I think that's a super important thing to train, because picking up the running back down the field, or a receiver, or the ball carrier, it's super important to me, and it was important to us at A&M. So, that's something I'll definitely continue as being a Raider, and I'll definitely, yeah, keep that as part of my game."

Q: What does it mean to be on the same page as a center, especially someone like Tyler Linderbaum?

Zuhn: "I mean, it means so much. It's going to be such an honor, and I just can't wait to meet him and to get going."

Q: You grew up in Fort Collins and went to Texas A&M. I know Klint Kubiak has ties to both Colorado State and Texas A&M. Did you have familiarity with him at all before this, and how much did you talk to the Raiders throughout this process?

Zuhn: "I did not have a ton of familiarity before the process. But yeah, I got to talk with them quite a bit throughout the process and I'm just excited to get going. Really just can't wait to get there and get started."

Q: Is this a team you thought you'd end up with?

Zuhn: "Yes, sir. Definitely."

Post Rounds 2-3 Press Conference with General Manager John Spytek and Assistant General Manager Brian Stark

Q: You've talked a lot about versatility in the past in talking about prospects. You've got a guy like Trey Zuhn III who's played left tackle and center. Treydan Stukes has played outside, nickel, and can play safety. How important is that quality when looking at prospects?

General Manager John Spytek: "It's a part of it for sure. They're just really good football players that are selfless and do whatever's asked of them. [Treydan] Stukes has played outside corner, nickel, safety. We went to the Miami-Texas A&M game this year, we watched Trey [Zuhn] play center, left tackle, center, left tackle, I mean, he moved all around that game against a pretty damn good front, too. So, versatility is awesome, but wherever they were put, they were okay with and they proved themselves to be pretty good football players."

Q: What do you feel like this group needed defensively that led you to getting another edge rusher?

Spytek: "Just another good football player. He's [Keyron Crawford] tough, he's rugged; we had a great visit with him when we were here. And the places I've been where you have really good pass rushers that keep hitting quarterbacks, you've got a chance. We felt like he helped us there."

Q: When you look at Keyron Crawford's athleticism and his desire to be coached, was it a gift being able to get him?

Assistant General Manager Brian Stark: "Yeah, what I think is exciting is that we see it that way, but when you talk to Key [Keyron Crawford], he feels that way. When you talk to him, he's really intense, very motivated, he's driven. He's overcome a lot and he kind of found football late. And his experience at Arkansas State and his transition to Auburn gave him some confidence. And he's really motivated, he knows he's not at his ceiling, he's far from it. He had to and that's the way we feel. We feel he's going to bring a lot as far as competitive edge. And like Spy [John Spytek] said, anytime you can add someone that can affect the quarterback, and he's got the upside to do that at a high rate."

Q: You traded back to get an additional pick in the top 100. Can you just take us through that process of making the deal with Houston?

Spytek: "Yeah, we had conversations throughout the day as you kind of expect to happen when you have one of those picks toward the tops of rounds two and four tomorrow - we've got 102. So, expecting similar action tomorrow, we've just got to evaluate them all as they come in and from the ability to move back two spots and move up 26, we just felt it was a great move for us. We were pretty confident [Treydan] Stukes would still be there, but we had a group of players that we really liked at that spot too. So, for some reason, if he had gone, you only have to survive really two picks at that point to move up that many spots and still get your guy. Definitely worth it. Excited about it."

Q: You guys mentioned the versatility that Treydan Stukes brings to the secondary, but outside of that, what other parts of his game do you guys like and fits the defensive scheme you guys are trying to run?

Stark: "Yeah, Treydan [Stukes] is a very intelligent football player. He also was a really good communicator on the field. So, this is a player, he was a late bloomer, right? He was a walk-on, became a three-time captain. He's played all those positions we talked about. So, he's another player that's going to come in immediately and compete to play, bring some leadership, bring some communication ability. As good of a player as he is, as talented he is, he's that good or better of a person. We're bringing a lot to that room, not just in ability, but in character, leadership and work ethic. We're really excited about him."

Q: When you look at Trey Zuhn III, I mean, I know it's not the Big Ten, but SEC Offensive Lineman of the Year. You look at him in third and fourth quarters, he's 20 yards down the field on passing plays, 25-30 yards on rushing, but his stamina is freakish. Did you notice that in your evaluation?

Stark: "Yeah, and [Trey] Zuhn's a player, he's been a good player there for a couple of years. So, he's a guy that has kind of been on the radar for a couple of years and kind of added some more versatility to his game by not just playing tackle now, but showing the versatility to go to center in-game, like Spy [John Spytek] was saying. So, he's always shown that. He's always played with that temperament, and then now with that added versatility to his game, I mean, it just increased his value as a player. But you watch him, all he does is block people, which is what you want those guys to do."

Q: You just mentioned Treydan Stukes and his leadership. Trey Zuhn III was also a team captain. Klint Kubiak brought up earlier today that Fernando Mendoza's leadership is the quality that sticks out the most with him. How much does character go into the fact of picking a guy, and how do you weigh character versus traits when you're evaluating prospects?

Spytek: "It's a magic equation that there's no perfect science to, but since the day I got here, and really Starky [Brian Stark] too, we've just tried to load this roster up with guys that love it, that have leadership traits, that are great teammates, that will do the right thing, that will do the extra thing, and I think we all really felt like the four guys that we have so far in the 2026 Draft, they fill those buckets up pretty well."

Q: With Treydan Stukes, what was it that jumped off the tape to you, just about his skill set as it translates to what safeties are asked to do in the league nowadays?

Stark: "I think with him, he's got really good man-to-man coverage skills, which is hard to identify in those safeties sometimes. But with his versatility, with him lining up at the nickel spot, you have a chance to see him exhibit those, and he's got really good ball skills. He's also a good tackler. He's a physical player, so he kind of shows, he checks every box kind of for the skills that you're looking for at that spot. And you got a chance to see him kind of display all of them because of the versatility in the way he played."

Q: How do you feel like Maxx Crosby's and Keyron Crawford's skill sets will complement each other?

Spytek: "Well, I know when Key [Keyron Crawford] was here, he's a big fan of Maxx [Crosby], and he made it known that if we would take him, he would try to replicate Maxx as much as possible. I would encourage Key to be his own person too. I mean, Maxx is Maxx, as we all know. So, they're just two rugged, tough players that really love the game of football. And probably similar with Maxx, he obviously wasn't at his ceiling when he got here as a fourth-round pick. And I'm not comparing - I said it last night, comparison is the thief of joy - but we're excited about just the rugged toughness and the passion with which Key attacks the game of football. And I think that will resonate in our D-line room and our defensive meeting room in general. I think when you find guys like that, and they have a high ceiling that they haven't reached it, they start to climb that ladder pretty quick."

Q: I know you got to go up and have meetings after this, but there are a lot of very talented football players left on this board. How excited are you with how your board has flowed looking forward to tomorrow?

Spytek: "Yeah, we've got a big night of meetings tonight, just kind of stack the board. It's early tomorrow, we're going to be off and running with the second pick. But we're just going to keep trying to identify the really good football players that want to be Raiders and lay it on the line for their teammates. We've got a lot of really good ones left too. We've got six picks left tomorrow, and we're thrilled and excited about that challenge and that opportunity tomorrow."

Q: When you look at your draft class so far, there's a theme kind of with Fernando Mendoza kind of being under recruited, and then obviously Treydan Stukes not even being recruited at all coming out of high school. Is that kind of an underdog theme that you kind of sense? And is that something that you gravitate towards knowing that you're drafting players that kind of have this chip on their shoulder coming into the league?

Spytek: "We didn't necessarily identify them because they were under recruited or not very much recruited at all, but just, I love the chip. The good ones I've been around, they find a chip, and if the chip is seemingly wearing off, they find a new one. And they really never forget kind of where they came from and maybe that they were disrespected or under appreciated at some point in their career. I just appreciate these guys for the way they attack and play the game of football."

Q: Stark, as you go into these meetings with John Spytek, you guys are setting up the board for tomorrow. What is your input? What is your part in how you're advising John? Can you kind of take us into your role, please?

Stark: "There's a group of us that'll be in there together, and we've all kind of watched a lot of these players independently, and then we watched them together as a group. So, John [Spytek] is great about encouraging everyone to speak up, and everyone's very confident to give their opinions on the players. And what it kind of does is it allows Spy to hear us kind of work through the differences maybe we saw in the player, and then he can kind of compare that to his vision of the player when he watched him. And it really allows us to come to a consensus, to where we all kind of have an understanding for how that player, where his value ranks among the other players available, and the vision for them to fit with our roster. So I think it's just a it's a big collaborative process. Now specifically Brandon Yeargan, our college director and I, a lot of times are working closely with the college scouts who aren't here all the time. So a lot of times we kind of serve as the mouthpiece for the college scouts too when they're not available to be in those meetings."

Q: Sounds like the Texas A&M staff really like Trey Zuhn III. There's a quote out there that said that he's one of the most pro ready offensive linemen they've ever had. I'm just curious why you think they would say something like that about him?

Spytek: "Started 54 games in the SEC. All he did was block the guy in front of him, it didn't matter who it was, where it was, and obviously they played a lot of really good football this year too. I like that they say that. That's a good staff down there. It's a really good program. And that makes me happy that they would think that way."

Q: What do you maybe foresee Keyron Crawford's role being in the defense? He's a little bit smaller of a guy, but he's been pretty good against the run in his career. Where do you maybe see him fitting in?

Spytek: "Well he's not that small. Six-four, long, maybe a little leaner than some traditional DEs, but we're just going to get him here and know that he's going to work hard, and he's got a couple cool skill sets, which is he can rush the passer, and he plays his tail off. And I like being around guys like that."

Video Call with Fourth-Round Pick (No. 101 Overall) CB Jermod McCoy

Q: First of all, welcome to Las Vegas. There's been a lot of talks throughout the Draft about regards to your knee. I just want to check in and see how is your knee is feeling, and do you anticipate getting a second surgery as a lot of reports suggest?

Jermod McCoy: "Yeah, I mean, I feel good, but as far as another surgery and all that, that would just be strictly based on what the team wants me to do. So, whatever the team's plan for me is, is what I'll be doing."

Q: How difficult has it been the last couple days knowing that your talent is what it is and probably justified a much higher draft pick, but things beyond your control caused you to have to wait this out?

McCoy: "Yeah, I mean, it's definitely difficult for me, but I know God has a plan for me. [Inaudible]."

Q: Did you go into this Draft knowing that this likely could happen, did you prepare yourself mentally that you might not go as high as you wanted to, and if so, did that kind of ease a little bit or was that still difficult to deal with?

McCoy: "I mean, I was prepared for whatever happened, but, I mean, I would've been excited to go higher, for sure, because, I mean, I had a good Pro Day, ran some good times, and just did good things like that. But, I mean, I was prepared for whatever happened. Because, I mean, it's not in my control, and I'm just truly blessed that the team took me anyways, because it's an achievement to get here in the first place."

Q: Obviously, wasn't necessarily expected to slide this far, but in terms of the team that drafted you, the Raiders, did you have any previous conversations with the Raiders throughout the draft process, or was them picking you and hearing them call your name was that a surprise to you?

McCoy: "I had a zoom with them the day before the draft. So, I mean, they kind of got on my radar a little bit. I was kind of thinking like something was up. But, I mean, I didn't really have a clue where I was going to go, to be honest. So, I mean, it's just a blessing to get picked by the Raiders."

Q: There's no doubt about your talent, the tape just tells the story. But there's another guy connected to this franchise who was picked in the sixth round, Tom Brady, that ended up being the greatest player of all time. Can you use guys like him as motivation to go prove the rest of the league wrong at being selected in the fourth round with the talent you have?

McCoy: "Oh yeah. I feel like all of it's just motivation just fueling me. Like, it's just fuel, to be honest."

Q: I'm just wondering what excites you the most right now about the team that the Raiders have been putting together through the draft and the offseason and what you've seen?

McCoy: "Yeah, from what I've seen, I see a great team to be honest. I mean, I got some teammates, old teammates on the team right now, and they're kind of telling me what the organization is like. So, just knowing that I'm going to a great organization, I feel good going into it."

Q: Sitting out last year with the torn ACL, was there anything that you learned about yourself as a player?

McCoy: "Yeah, something I feel like I learned about myself, it's just like, I feel like I'm super mentally strong. I feel I've just been through a lot. I got a story that I'm still trying to tell. So, I mean, that's what it is, to be honest."

Q: I understand your first career pick was against Fernando Mendoza. Just curious what you remember about that moment and now the opportunity to play with him here in Las Vegas?

McCoy: "Yeah, it was probably one of the top moments in my life, my first college pick. We talked after that game too, just chopped it up a little bit, but I mean, it was good. Good to know we are going to be on the same team too. We got the best quarterback in college football and now going to be the best in the league."

Q: Just on the knee issue, what is your understanding of where it is health-wise, and what were you telling teams about where you believed you are? I know you said you want the team to look at it, but where do you think you are, and what have you been told about it?

McCoy: "Yeah, I mean, all my doctors that did my surgery, they told me I'm good. I feel like I'm good, but I mean, but if there's something that they're wanting me to do for the longevity of my career, I'm willing to do that. I'm going to listen to the team, because I feel like they have my best interest for me. So, honestly, just whatever the team's plan for me is, I'm going to do that."

Q: Also, you kind of just previously brought up, kind of getting the vibe on the team, the temperature from former teammates. What's your relationship like with Dont'e Thornton Jr., and what is it going to be like to be able to test your talents against him once again?

McCoy: "We got a good relationship. He had just texted me like we reunited again, back in the same locker room, get to be cool with each other again and all that, but I mean, getting to go against him again in practice, I feel like me and Dont'e [Thornton Jr.], me and him would battle every day. So, we made each other way better, I feel like throughout that season. He's part of the reason why I had the season I had, just guarding him every day and making me better. And then I feel like the same with me, him having to go against me, I'm making him also better. So, I mean, I think getting to do that again is just going to improve both of our games."

Q: Were you watching the draft as it played out? Were you paying attention to what was going on, or was it maybe too difficult as the picks kept coming off the board and you weren't hearing your name? What was the call like when you finally got it?

McCoy: "No, I was watching for sure. I mean, this isn't something you could take for granted, like this is everyone's dream. So, it's not something you could just say, 'I didn't get drafted where I wanted, so I'm not going to watch the draft anymore.' Like, this is still a blessing to get drafted. So, I mean, I was in there watching it, got the call, super excited, ready to get to work."

Video Call with Fourth-Round Pick (No. 122 Overall) RB Mike Washington Jr.

Q: What do you like about the opportunity of pairing with Ashton Jeanty in the backfield? I know Klint Kubiak mentioned before that he kind of wants to have a wingman for Jeanty, so how happy are you to kind of join this backfield with him?

Mike Washington Jr.: "I mean, I'm super excited to get rolling with him. All I could think of is thunder and lightning. So, super excited to be the one-two punch with him. And to really, like I said before, be a sponge and learn from him also at the same time."

Q: What is the best that you've ran the 40-yard dash?

Washington Jr.: "So, my PR time was at the combine. So, about a week and a half before that, I ran a 4:34, and I had PR'd at the combine with a 4:33."

Q: What is it about your skill set that you think fits into this scheme that Klint Kubiak's going to be running here with a lot of that wide zone looks and stuff like that?

Washington Jr.: "Well, coming from pro-style offense at Arkansas, we excelled at wide zone, also inside zone, so, I have a familiar familiarity with it. So, I believe that I could come in and really, that would be my advantage, having a familiar with running wide zone at Arkansas."

Q: What was it about Arkansas that enabled you to kind of break out and really find yourself last year as a player and excel in the way that you did?

Washington Jr.: "I believe it was a maturity thing. Understanding the game more, the ins and outs of it, and really just being detailed about what I need to. And what I mean by that, obviously, inside zone is inside zone, but really taking a step further on who I need to read, what are my steps looking like, how I need to do my steps before I get the ball, who I'm reading. So, things of that nature. I feel like, once I dove deep into that, the detail piece, that's what made me really excel."

Q: When you look at Klint Kubiak and what he's done with running backs, particularly like Kenneth Walker, Christian McCaffrey and Zach Charbonnet, just wondering what you think about the styles of the running backs and what he does with the position?

Washington Jr.: "I think it just speaks a lot about what he can do. Like I said before, my goal, I've been telling everybody, I'm looking to be a legend, and I'm going to be a legend. So, I definitely believe whatever he pulled out of them, he can do the same with me also."

Q: When you think about the journey, obviously, you had to go to two other group of six schools in Buffalo and New Mexico State before you got to Arkansas. Throughout that journey getting to the SEC, what were some things that were instilled in you that kind of helped you keep going. And do you feel like, even now going into the league, you still have that chip on your shoulder?

Washington Jr.: "Yeah. I mean, I'm from New York. So, like coming up, I've always had that chip on my shoulder, always just having that competitive spirit and that willingness to just want to do better. And that's something that won't fade away. Also, I'm sure you guys probably seen but my brother, he's an ex-Marine, and growing up, all I would see was him being disciplined. Not motivated, but disciplined, because motivated are emotions, they come and go. But discipline is me seeing him get up at 6am in the morning every single day, and go work out before going to high school, going to class. So, me seeing that, that kind of just been instilled in me. That's just who I am now. So, that's something that just won't fade away."

Q: I know you're working on your master's at Arkansas. Are you going to get that?

Washington Jr.: "Yeah, so the plan is to get it next spring, 2027. I should be done with it next spring."

Q: One of the things that's been said about you is that you're just quiet, put your head down, just go to work. And that's how you like to go about your business. I guess where did that come from? And why is that?

Washington Jr.: "Really just being misunderstood I feel like, always just being overlooked, always just being the last person to be picked. It's something that stems from when I was younger, and I kind of just developed that mindset where it's like, okay since I'm being overlooked and nobody's looking at me, I'm going to make you look at me by my work ethic."

Q: In doing my evaluation of you before the draft, I heard a story that after a big game at Arkansas, somebody was talking about your stats, and you talked about it didn't matter because you guys had lost the game. They said that you're extremely selfless, it's about team. Does that come from your brother's background with the Marines? Where does that come from with you?

Washington Jr.: "Yeah. Well, a lot of my core values stem from my brother, him being a Marine. And also my parents, them being just hard workers. My dad is an investigator, and my mother, she has her PhD in psychology and had a total of seven of us. I have six other siblings, so just seeing them work hard. But really outside of that, on a personal level, I know as though I just have a competitive spirit, so, regardless of me having a good game, it doesn't matter if we didn't win. I'm going to look at the Texas A&M game. I had 140 and something yards, and we didn't win. I was pissed, I was hurt, that game hurt. Yeah, I had a big game, but we didn't win. That was a ranked opponent that I knew we should have beat, we didn't win. And that's just that passion and that hunger to just want to succeed and just want to win, not only for myself, but as a team."

Video Call with Fifth-Round Pick (No. 150 Overall) S Dalton Johnson

Q: Yesterday the Raiders drafted your teammate Treydan Stukes, I was wondering how much are you looking forward to an opportunity with playing with him at the next level?

Dalton Johnson: "Yeah, I'm super excited. That's my boy. We're best friends. And being drafted is one thing but being drafted to a team that I get to go somewhere with my best friend and continue this Bear Down brotherhood, I'm super excited and ready to take that leadership and turn Las Vegas up."

Q: Can you talk about your physicality and also your speed in going against running backs and tight ends?

Johnson: "Yeah, I always say I was brought up in football too late because I love to hit. There's no more eye power, no more full bags. So, you've just got to develop as the game goes and it's changing to more spread offenses. So, I really had to develop my pass coverage side of the game. And shout out to Coach [Danny] Gonzalez our DC at Arizona. He put me in great opportunities to allow me to expand my defense to that standpoint. And like I mentioned, the game is changing, so, I've got to be ready for it. Always had the tackling ability and just the physical side, so being able to showcase my ball skills and all that, just wanted to be a complete DB; didn't want to just be put in a box, as a run fit safety or anything like that."

Q: What excites you about coming to the Raiders, and what was the call like that you got today?

Johnson: "Yeah, I mean, the Raiders are building something special. Young team, up and coming, and we're going to do it the right way. I'm excited to be a part of it. Just a phone call I've seen it pop up, Las Vegas, Nevada, and just seeing that pop up, and it instantly hit me that I'm going to be there with [Treydan] Stukes and it was one of kind. Could barely hear the call because my mom was crying so loud, but just that moment, something I'm going to remember forever."

Q: You played for four different defensive coordinators at Arizona. That's obviously a lot. How much did that kind of help you just wrap your head around a bunch of different schemes and also, how did it help you grow your game in so many different areas?

Johnson: "Yeah, I would say it was huge because through the whole draft process, just all the zones and the scheme installs, it made it fairly easy because it was just defenses that I've ran and seen. From knowing whether it was different lingo, but it all was the same in its own aspect. And the growing part, which is more opportunities to play different positions, just boundary, whether I was in the post or roll down safety, or even going a little bit of nickel. It was a crazy story, and just in the moment seemed like hectic but I don't want my story to be any other way, and I'm just so thankful for the opportunity and the coaches that have come through Arizona and just taught me and grew my football knowledge."

Q: What does it say about the current staff at Arizona? There's been so many there, but the fact that they're putting two of you guys in the NFL and there's a lot of talent brewing there. What's it say about the future of UA football?

Johnson: "Yeah, they say Arizona is a basketball school but we're bringing football to Tucson. We're a football and basketball school. And shoutout to the coaches, Coach [Brent] Brennan came in, new team, new staff, had to throw together something real quick. That 2024 season didn't go our way, and I'm just glad me and the guys got to stick together and trust him. I love the way he coaches, and I love the way he just lets his players be his players and treats us like his sons, all 110 of us. He lets his coaches, his OC, Coach [Seth] Doege and his DC, Coach [Danny] Gonzales, he lets them do their job and he has full trust in them. And seeing that trust in his coaches and he also trusts his players the same way it just allows us to trust him and just really be a family that just wants to succeed together."

Q: You talked about your relationship with Treydan Stukes. Has he reached out? What was that conversation like?

Johnson: "Yeah, I called him real quick, and he just couldn't believe it. He was like, 'I think this the best day of my life.' Like I mentioned earlier, it's one thing to be drafted, and I'm so grateful to be a Raider. And then on top of that, I get to do it with Stukes. So, this is probably the best day of our lives for both of us."

Q: You have always been pretty physical and good against the run throughout your career. Looks like you took a pretty big step forward in your coverage last year. I was wondering if that was just personal improvement, or is that scheme? What was the development there?

Johnson: "Yeah, I would say it's a bit of both. I mentioned earlier, the game is moving fast, and it's going to spread offenses and it's all about the ball. So, I was really working on that in the offseason and made that a big emphasis in my mindset going into practices and games, like I got to get the ball. I got get picks, PBUs, whatever it is. And then I would say that also comes with scheme, Coach [Danny] Gonzales put me in great opportunities to make plays and be in the right position to get actions and get my hand on the ball. So, I would say a mix of both. I'm so thankful that I put in the work and was able to get around the ball more, plus Coach G believing in me and trusting me to be in those opportunities to do it."

Q: You just brought up your versatility, and Treydan moved around a ton at Arizona as well. I'm just wondering where you feel that your best fit in the NFL is going to be? And also, kind of just how that versatility adds another aspect to your game.

Johnson: "Yeah, I would just say, whatever my role is, special teams, backup, starter, I'm bringing 100% and I feel like I can play anywhere. I'm not going to say anywhere as far as outside at corner, but whatever my role is, I'm there to do it, whether that's nickel, boundary safety spot, free safety spot. I'm just ready to be a Raider and get rolling."

Q: What was your interaction like with the Raiders throughout the pre-Draft process?

Hezekiah Masses: "The interaction, it was smooth. We had a couple of phone calls, talks with the quarterback coach. We just had a couple interactions that went well."

Q: You had 18 pass breakups last season, can you just talk about the ball skills that you have and what you can bring to this secondary?

Masses: "Oh yeah, man, I just feel like my IQ and my instincts when I'm out on the field, it just unmet. So, ended up last season with 18 pass deflections."

Q: What changed for you at Cal? Because you were productive when you were FIU, but at Cal, you obviously took it to another level.

Masses: "I'd just say that all season, I just got bigger and stronger and faster, man. So, I just feel like when I was out on the field, that would just help me improve my last year."

Q: When you look at the defense that the Raiders are starting to put together, how much does that excite you?

Masses: "Oh, that excites me. There are a couple young guys, but we're coming in. They brought me, and I'm coming to change the program."

Q: You talked about going to Cal and getting stronger, how much did it do for your confidence knowing you could play at that level and step up to the level that you did last year and still be able to perform?

Masses: "Yeah, I just say, man, coming in in January, I just want to say thanks to Coach [Jason] Novak. He had a plan for me, and then we executed a plan, and I just really got bigger like we had planned."

Q: Are there any other coaches that you could think of, either at FIU or even at Cal, that you feel contributed to you being able to take that leap your senior year?

Masses: "Oh, yeah, sure definitely Coach Adam Brown. Really, I think I was fortunate throughout my whole college career I had nothing but great coaches, everyone taught me something different. So, I just say thanks to all my coaches who coached me."

Q: What does it mean to you now to be officially a Raider and be part of the Silver and Black?

Masses: "Man, the Raiders -- this is crazy. Just the franchise history, the Raiders are just an excellent foundation. So, it just surreal. Growing up, I always wanted to be in the NFL, and I'm finally here. So, I'm not taking it lightly, all gas, no brakes."

Q: You didn't cross paths with Fernando Mendoza at Cal, but I assume you had a lot of teammates that played with him there. I was wondering if you picked anything up from them on what he's like as a player and as a person?

Masses: "Oh yeah, man, yeah, definitely. They had talks around the locker room, they just say Fernando is a great guy and he's always himself; he's himself and great leadership."

Q: How do you vision your role in the next level? You play with a ton of speed and you also provide quality support on special teams. What do you envision your role to be here with the Raiders?

Malik Benson: "Man, what I vision my role to be? Man, just coming in and do whatever they need to do, whether that's coming in to be the deep threat, whether that's coming in to be a special teams guy. Just do whatever I can to put the team in the best light."

Q: You're entering a team that just took Fernando Mendoza with the number one overall pick. I know you played against him this year with Oregon and Indiana. I just want to know any impressions you have of him, or any memories that you know of that game just watching it?

Benson: "Yeah, man, the memories, I let them go out the out the window once the game ended. But I was able to speak with him for a little bit at the combine. And just me being able to talk to him for those 10-15 minutes I just realized how humble he is. And it's just like, obviously, he works super hard, but past football, he's just a great person. I can't wait to be alongside teammates with a guy like that. So, it's going to be super exciting. It's going to be super fun, I can't wait. Obviously, he got the best of Oregon those two times. But shoot, we're going to be able to put those aside, and we're going to have an electric year this coming year."

Q: You started out at community college, Alabama, Florida State. So, you moved around each year. What would you say that you found at Oregon to have the breakout season that you did?

Benson: "Man, I feel like at Oregon I was playing with super confidence. And shoot, when you're out there with super confidence, I feel like nobody could stop me. Just be able to carry that mindset over to this next level. Man, it's super fun to show what I could do."

Q: I was reading about your youth and not being able to get into football. Part of it, obviously, it's kind of expensive to even enter into the sport. What does it feel like now to reach this point, to make it to the NFL?

Benson: "Man, it's a blessing. Man, God is amazing. Just knowing that he wouldn't put no task in front of my face that I'm not able to handle. So just knowing that I started so young, to see that this dream that I had since I was 12 years old, obviously, I didn't get started playing till my sophomore year, but to hear my name called today, man, was just nothing but a blessing. It was a very cool experience to be able to celebrate with my friends and family."

Q: How much pride will you take in showing at the next level -- some of the scouts that maybe had some negatives on you were not the full route tree, deep ball guy. How excited are you to be able to show maybe you can do everything as a wide receiver?

Benson: "Man, I know I'm coming to a system that's going to allow me to perform, and so just whatever they ask me to do, I'm going to come out there and do it with my best ability. And coming up in the next couple years, I'm going to be able to put that stamp and show people who Malik Benson is. So, it's going to be super fun."

Q: Kind of playing off of that a little bit, in some of your scouting reports, and they talk about your ability to go over the middle and the fact that you're not afraid to go over the middle and catch those balls. In a system that has a lot of West Coast principles and stuff like that, how much do you think you can shine and kind of show that area of your game?

Benson: "Yeah man, just knowing that they picked me, so they're going to ask me to come in and do a lot of things, and I just know that my preparation is going to take over. Benson: "Man, so it's crazy. One thing, I'm from Kansas City, so growing up, I always have my hate for the Raiders, but to finally be on the side to where it's us versus anybody and us against the world, man, I love it. Just knowing the history, I'm just glad that I'm able to come in and just make my mark and just be a part of this great tradition and be a part of the -- we're going to turn this thing into the right direction and do what we need to do so that confetti is falling, the banner is rising at end of the year."

Q: Speaking of the confetti and the banner, you're in Eugene, but kind of close to you with Seattle, and that offense is kind of coming here with Coach Klint Kubiak. Did you pay any mind to what Seattle was doing on their Super Bowl run last year, or were you just totally focused in on what you were doing?

Benson: "So yeah, Seattle was one of the teams that I liked to watch a lot, just seeing motions, how they use the receivers and just their plays, and I feel like they had really good plays just being able to watch them, and shoot, getting a guy like me in this offense with us being able to do that, it's going to be super exciting just to be able to show that I can obviously go deep, but I can run every single route, go around the middle and do whatever it takes for this offense. I'm just super excited, super blessed for this opportunity."

Cleveland: "Yeah, the Raiders were definitely in the process. I met with the D-line coach on Zoom, and had good talks with the scouts and stuff, so I knew there was definitely the option for them to get me. So, I'm really excited and really happy."

Q: I know you were a really good baseball player too, and you had the opportunity to play that collegiately. How much thought was given to that, and I mean, I guess now you're pretty happy with the decision that you made?

Cleveland: "I'm 300-something plus pounds. So, I think I made the right decision to play football, not baseball."

Q: What would you say is one of the biggest qualities that you would bring to the locker room and the strengths that you bring to this team?

Cleveland: "Yeah, I think I just care for the guys in the locker room. I'm going get there, I'm a new guy, but I'm going to love everybody and care for everybody in locker room. And I think that's the most important thing, and I think that's the best thing I bring to the table, just being a good person and caring about everybody."

Q: I was reading your bio -- said you put on nearly 50 pounds when you enrolled at NC State, so you slid around the defensive line. I'm just curious your experience playing multiple positions along the D-line there?

Cleveland: "Yeah, I played freaking every position on the D-line, and I think I found what I'm best at, which is nose tackle. And I'm just ready to get out there and get to Las Vegas."

Post Rounds 4-7 Press Conference with VP of Player Personnel Brandon Hunt and Director of College Scouting Brandon Yeargan

Brandon Hunt Opening Statement: "As we're talking about the ground that we covered, just want to talk about, obviously, the reports. We did 3,926 reports this year that netted these 10 picks. I think that's a number that is very, very big, and a whole lot of work that goes into these 10 picks that are going to come support the future of this organization. And we think that's a really, really special thing to welcome these new dudes to the Dark Side. So, with that, we'll take questions on this group."

Q: I had two college head coaches, I asked them if anything was different this year about the evaluation process, and they said that the Raiders, both mentioned private from each other, scouts were probably the best listeners this year, more than they've ever been and the best of all the NFL. Was that something that you guys specifically targeted to encourage them, maybe teaching more about listening, or is it just happened to be it got noticed this year?

Brandon Yeargan: "That's a cool observation. I think that's a critical part of being a great scout is being a great listener and asking the right questions and giving space to get the information and make your own interpretation of that information. So, that's a really cool observation. I mean, that's something we prioritize for our scouts, is figuring out what questions to ask and also being receptive to the information too. So, that's a cool observation for sure."

Q: What went into the decision to trade up for Jermod McCoy, as far as from a health standpoint that you were confident enough to do that?

Hunt: "Yeah, so confidence was not a problem. We felt good about it at where we took him, and it was opportunity to get value. This is probably arguably the best corner in the draft, and we feel like we have great, great people and a great process to make sure we get the best out of this player."

Yeargan: "I was just going to add to that. I have a lot of confidence in the player, and our medical staff is outstanding here. So, just to echo what B [Brandon] Hunt said. Alex Guerrero, Chris Cortez, our doctors, we'll have a great plan in place for him, and like you said, he's a high quality person and football character makeup too."

Q: Jermod McCoy told us on the Zoom call that he's leaving it to you guys to determine whether he needs additional surgery on the knee. I was wondering, have you guys made a decision on whether he will get another procedure?

Hunt: "Yeah, so right now, before he even gets with our people, we didn't even get that far. We have a great medical staff, like we said, [Chris] Cortez and Alex G [Guerrero]. We're going to get him in the building make all those decisions, but right now, we're really excited about celebrating this kid and getting him in the building. He's 20 years old, he's twitchy, he's fast, he's a cover guy, he's got some punt return skills, and we're really excited to see what he does. And the future is bright for this guy."

Q: He also said that you guys had a Zoom call with him the day before the draft. Did you guys have a sense that there was a shot of him potentially falling in the draft ahead of time?

Yeargan: "Yeah, that's a fair question, and we do our diligence on every prospect. I would say he wasn't the only one we did a Zoom with this week. We touch base with a lot of players. We do a lot of confirmation calls too to make sure their contact information is accurate. But there are a group of players that we Zoomed this week just to follow up and touch base, because you have the ability to use three Zooms with each player, and we're continuing to get to know these guys, and that's a really critical part of our process is just all the different touch points you can have. So, we did. Joe Woods, our corners coach, and our DC Robbie Leonard Zoomed him this week. And again, it wasn't just him, but it was a lot of players."

Q: Were you guys shocked that Jermod McCoy fell this far to day three? This was someone that was considered, even with the knee concern, a potential top-10 pick. Were you shocked that he got this far in the draft?

Hunt: "That was the thing that had us most excited about moving up one pick. We say it all the time, you go into day two, you go into day three at the top where we are, people have time to kind of chew on it overnight, and we felt like this was a player that 32 teams or so we're going to look at and he'd be the same guy up on the board that kind of stuck out like a green thumb. We didn't want to take a chance on missing on him."

Q: Mike Washington Jr., that's a terrific running back when you watch him on film. His value was higher than where you were able to pick him. Was it like Christmas when you're sitting there with that pick and he's still on the board?

Yeargan: "Yeah. I mean, we were excited to get him for sure, 6-1, 225, 4.3, ran for over 1,000 yards this year, super productive, high character. Yeah, we were really excited. We feel like he's a really good fit for Coach [Klint] Kubiak and Andrew's [Janocko] scheme in the wide zone system. So, pretty fired about him and the person he is too."

Hunt: "It's awesome. This guy is going to generate explosives for us and just another weapon that's going to add to our offense. And Klint [Kubiak] and [Andrew] Janocko are going to do a great job of utilizing them and help us score the football."

Q: You mentioned character when evaluating him. It seems like a common theme among a lot of your picks, both this year and even going back to last year is the character, intelligent, smart. That factor, how much does that play into your evaluations when you're looking at players?

Hunt: "Yeah, it plays a lot. That was our theme this whole entire process through the draft, it's been our theme in free agency. It's been our theme the whole time. We had a shield system where we were looking and we wanted to put a shield on some players. We have different tiers and we wanted to make sure that we not only get the best players that are going to come in here and be awesome contributors on the team, but they're going to be great people. Like I said when we started, we talking about the culture. The culture is driven by these people that we bring in, and it was awesome to get a person like this to add to the group."

Q: When it comes to the X's and the O's of it all, it seems like the other theme was the versatility of a lot of the different players. How important was that as well?

Yeargan: "Yeah, that was critical, especially in the secondary. A lot of the guys we added in the secondary group can play different spots between Treydan Stukes, Dalton Johnson, Zeke [Hezekiah Masses] and Jermod [McCoy] too. All those guys are pretty versatile, they've played nickel, they've played deep, they've played outside, even Stukes has played outside corner in his career too. So, it really helps, especially we're going to have a pretty versatile scheme under Robbie Leonard, so that's a critical component too."

Q: What went into the decision to move on from Tyree Wilson?

Hunt: "Yeah, so we're just going to say it was just an opportunity for a fresh start. Fresh start for him, fresh start for us. The phone's ringing the whole entire Draft, and where we were when the phone call rang, we were looking at where we were as a team, we were looking at the decisions that we'd made in free agency, the decisions we'd made in a Draft, and we thought it'd be an awesome opportunity for him, awesome opportunity for us. We wish him all the best. We're thankful for his contributions as a Raider, and we think he'll do a great job for New Orleans."

Yeargan: "Yeah, I'll just speak to that too. I was fired up just because we moved up to get Dalton Johnson, so that trade allowed us that opportunity. We have a lot of conviction and belief in Dalton Johnson's ability to play defense and special teams, too. So, that was pretty exciting for me as a college scouting director."

Q: From a pro personnel perspective, how excited are you that most of the players you drafted are already "NFL ready"?

Hunt: "Yeah, it's pretty awesome. I'm glad you did your research, I do have my PhD in Pro, but I've been doing college since I've been in the league, which is pretty awesome. And it's really exciting to get these players that are ready to play. When we're looking at these guys and we're looking at evaluation, we're looking at their ceiling and their floor, a lot of these guys have really high floors. We really think that a lot of these will be ready to come in and contribute, and come in and compete. The main thing we're looking at was to try to get as many people that we can to compete on every level in every room, just to bring up the competition in every room. So, it's super exciting."

Q: How did the process come about that you ended up with two of the secondary players from Arizona with Treydan Stukes and Dalton Johnson? Were they targets all along, was something that you saw, and how much do you think they'll help each other build through the process of being rookies together?

Yeargan: "Yeah, we're excited about both. It was a cool circumstance that they're both from Arizona, and I would say we have a cool relationship with their head coach, too, Brent Brennan. Our assistant GM, Brian Stark, worked with him in the past, too. So, we had great information on those guys, in addition to Kyle [Caballero] and Lenny [McGill] going through Arizona. But we had a pretty clear vision for both those players and affinity for them separate from them as a package deal. We would have been interested in both players at different spots, but we're really excited to add both those guys."

Q: With both of those guys in particular, what were they tasked with in that Arizona defense that you think is really going to translate well for you guys?

Yeagan: “Yeah, that defense, when you study it, it's pretty cool. Danny Gonzales, their defensive coordinator, they're very versatile with how they use those players. All three safeties got picked today, which is really unique in itself. But all three of those guys have played different spots. You'll see Dalton [Johnson] roll down and play a big nickel. You'll see Treydan [Stukes] play a lot of nickel. He also plays deep, and same with the other player too. So, it's really cool. You know there's a certain level of football intelligence those guys have to be able to handle that amount of duties and tasks.”

Q: It comes with the current landscape of college football, but you drafted a lot of guys that transferred from school to school. How much more attention to detail when it comes to scout evaluating do you have to do in terms of getting to know a player, not just where he went to school and where he succeeded, but also the other locations as well?

Hunt: “Yeah, that's the cool thing about our scouts, man. I think historically, back in the day really, you're getting a late start, because these guys have been there. But we're getting to know these guys right away. You know, I mentioned our area scouts right away. The area scouts get all the background from the totality of their career. So, let's say a guy played his junior season at Clemson, his senior year at Penn State. We're going to talk to John Hill in the draft and say, ‘Hey, how did he do? What was the story for his first three years there?’ And then we're going to talk to Ryan [Gravel] and say, ‘Hey, what was your thoughts at Penn State?’ And see if those things match up. And we kind of, like you said, where we're at now with not only these COVID kids, but also the portal kids, this is pretty much every single player. Whereas back in the day, we might punish a guy for that, like, ‘Where were you going? Why did you go? What was the reason?’ And now, just with an eye on everything, it's pretty common with a lot of these guys. So, it's up to us to get with the picture and get with that being the new normal.”

Q: Why do you think Brandon Cleveland really fits in with what Rob Leonard wants to do on the interior of the defense?

Yeagan: “Yeah, we're excited about Brandon Cleveland. He's been a multi-year starter at NC State. He's a strong, heavy-handed player that plays the run well. He's got initial quickness, and we really like his makeup too. So, we're excited to add him into that group and see him being able to play on all three downs.”

Q: When you watch Keyron Crawford, this is a guy you literally have to remember he's only been playing five years. When you look at that bend, he's just almost like a Stretch Armstrong type guy. When you see that and then you think about him only playing five years, where does your mind go when you think about where he can end up?

Hunt: “Man, it's super exciting. When you look at this dude, you just see upside because he's so green. And the most exciting thing about Robbie is you know that everything you teach him is going to be new. And he doesn't have any bad habits, if that makes sense. This guy is a football lover, first and foremost. He's violent. He can rush a passer and he can smack guards, and he's going to take on pulls and set the edge. When I was in Philadelphia, we took a player similar to this, it was Jalyx Hunt with a similar kind of background. And he's done a great job for them, and I really believe Key can do the same thing plus.”

Q: It looks like you guys signed Kansei Matsuzawa after the draft? Is that an I.P.P signing? Or is that how that would work?

Yeargan: "Yes. We're still processing those UDFA contracts, so I probably shouldn't comment on those until they're official. But I would say he is I.P.P eligible, and he was a really productive kicker for Hawaii. So, we'll probably wait until that becomes official, just by the league rules. But yeah, he is, to confirm that."

Q: When you made a plan for the draft, how closely were you guys able to fill the needs that you wanted to address, getting the best available players are on your board and all those things in terms of sticking to what you want to do going into the process?

Hunt: "Yeah, I think we had an awesome process. Spy [John Spytek] laid out the vision for us. And the cool thing is, he pretty much lets us cook and do our job. And I feel like today we won. Now it all starts on Thursday with rookie minicamp we're going to get a chance to see but I think we put, like we said before, we got competition in every room. We're really excited to see these guys get with the vets and see where we at. But today, we feel like we did an outstanding job."

Q: After adding four defensive backs in this year's class, I was wondering how you guys feel about the current depth, and not only just safety, but in the cornerback room as well?

Yeargan: "Yeah, we really wanted to add competition at every level. Super excited about the guys we added today, the undrafted free agents that will compete too, and then the guys we have coming back. So, really the intention was to add some competition and add speed in those rooms and add a level of toughness and special teams value."

Q: Can you talk about what you saw in Malik Benson and what role he could play for this offense and kind of just the wide receiver room all together?

Yeargan: "Sure, yeah, Malik's [Benson] a guy who ran, I think, 4.37, so he's got a vertical speed element to him on the outside, and he's really good on crossing routes, over routes, we feel like he can get open on the move. And then he's had special teams production over his career too. He returned a punt for a touchdown this year. He had a high punt return average this year. So really excited about him and his ability to stretch the field on the outside."

Hunt: "It was really cool with him, he averaged 16.7 yards a catch. And I think he had five catches over 40. So we're just talking about explosives, right? Trying to find more field stretchers guys to make more explosive plays and open up this offense."

Q: Do you feel like he fits Fernando Mendoza's skill sets with him being able to hit those kinds of back shoulder throws, contested catches type plays?

Hunt: "Sure."

Yeargan: "Hell yeah. Absolutely."

Q: When you turn on the film and you look in the fourth quarter and Trey Zuhn III is 25 yards downfield still with that energy, his stamina level. Would you just talk about the gift of him at 91 overall and his freakish athletic ability?

Hunt: "Yeah, we talk about football lovers, right? And being a former lineman myself, when I see stuff like that, it's really exciting. This guy can play every position on the field, which is great. I think I heard Spy [John Spytek] and Starky [Brian Stark] said, all he does is does his job and he blocks everybody. We got a chance to see him live playing against Miami, and they had a couple rushers go in the first round, and he did a good job against them. And it's really exciting to see what he does and adds to this room. Like I said, we're trying to add multiple people to this room that are violent, that are football lovers, that are big people, and he's one of those guys we're really excited about."
