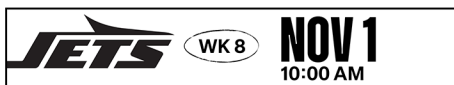
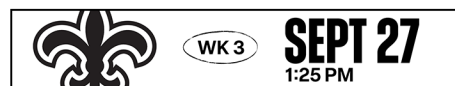

2026 FLEX SCHEDULING RULES

This season, "flexible scheduling" for Sunday Night Football may be used up to twice between Weeks 5-10, and in the NFL's discretion during Weeks 11-17; for Monday Night Football at the NFL's discretion in Weeks 12-17; and for Thursday Night Football it may be used up to twice between Weeks 13-17. During these Flex Scheduling Windows, the games initially scheduled for Sunday Night Football (on NBC), Monday Night Football (on ESPN or ABC), and Thursday Night Football (on Amazon Prime Video) are tentatively scheduled and subject to change. Only Sunday afternoon games (or those listed as TBD) are eligible to be moved to Sunday night, Monday night, or Thursday Night, in which case the initially scheduled Thursday/Sunday/Monday night game would be moved to Sunday afternoon. Sunday afternoon games may also be moved between 1:00 p.m. and 4:05 p.m. or 4:25 p.m. ET. As in prior seasons, for Week 18, the final weekend of the season, the scheduling of the Saturday, Sunday afternoon, and the Sunday night games is not assigned. In Week 18, three games will be played on Saturday (1 p.m. ET, 4:30 p.m. ET and 8 p.m. ET) with the remainder to be played on Sunday afternoon (1 p.m. ET and 4:25 p.m. ET) and one matchup to be played on Sunday night (8:20 p.m. ET). Specific dates, start times, and networks for Week 18 matchups will be determined and announced following the conclusion of Week 17. BY THE NUMBERS

21,099

The Raiders will travel 21,099 total miles in 2026, the 12th most in the NFL and the second most among teams in the AFC West.

The Raiders' 2026 opponents had a combined record of 153-136 (.529) in 2025, giving the Raiders the seventh toughest strength of schedule in 2026.

Las Vegas' schedule includes nine games against playoff teams from 2025 (Broncos, Chargers, Bills, Seahawks, Rams, 49ers, Patriots) - including both teams from Super Bowl LX, Seattle and New England.

SCHEDULE HIGHLIGHTS

- The Raiders will open the season at home against Miami - the second season in a row that the Raiders are starting the season against a team not in their own division. The Raiders are 32-34 (.485) in season openers all-time, including 7-3 (.700) over the last 10 season openers.
- The Raiders are opening the season at home for the first time since 2021 (W vs. Bal., 33-27). The Silver and Black are 15-10 (.600) all-time when opening the season at home, including 2-2 when opening at home since 2015.
- Seattle and the Los Angeles Rams will make their first ever visits to Allegiant Stadium for a regular season game, now leaving Detroit as the only team left in the NFL to not play a regular season game in Allegiant Stadium.
- Las Vegas' schedule includes nine games against playoff teams from 2025 (Broncos, Chargers, Bills, Seahawks, Rams, 49ers, Patriots) - including both teams that played in Super Bowl LX, the Seattle Seahawks and the New England Patriots.
- In each of the last seven seasons, the Raiders have had to face at least one team that played in the Super Bowl the year prior.
- Las Vegas will play a road game against the New York Jets for the first time since 2020 (W, 31-28), a road game in Cleveland for the first time since 2021 (W, 16-14) and road games against NFC West opponents - San Francisco and Arizona - for the first time since 2018.
- Las Vegas has four back-to-back road trips this season (Weeks 2-3, Weeks 8-9, Weeks 11-12 and Weeks 17-18).
- The Raiders will have a bye in Week 13. The last time the Raiders had a Week 13 bye was in 2023. The Raiders are currently 13-24 (.351) in games the week after a bye since the NFL introduced bye weeks in 1990.
- The season finale will be on the road against the Chiefs, marking the first time since 2020 that the Raiders have finished the season on the road.
- This is the second-straight year the Raiders will face the Chiefs to close out the season, last season culminating with a win over Kansas City at home, 14-12. It is also the 16th-straight year in which the Silver and Black will face an AFC West opponent in the season finale. The Raiders have closed the season against the Chiefs 13 times in franchise history and are 7-6 (.538) in those games.
- The Raiders will play 10 games in the Pacific Time Zone, three games in the Eastern Time Zone, two games in the Central Time Zone and two games in the Mountain Time Zone.

2026 SCHEDULE NOTES

PRIME TIME

The Raiders will not have a prime-time game in 2026. Since 1970, the Raiders have had zero prime-time games in a season just twice, 2007 and 2010.

This is the first season since 2010 that the Raiders will not have a single prime-time matchup. The Raiders finished 8-8 in 2010 after having no prime-time games. The Silver and Black finished 4-12 in 2007.

QUICK TURNAROUNDS

Since 1990 (36 straight seasons), at least 4 teams have qualified for the playoffs in every season that were not in the postseason the year before. Here are the last six seasons:

- The Raiders have a 225-275-8 (.451) all-time record on the road.
- Las Vegas will play in 11 different stadiums in 2026, including one preseason road matchup.
- In the regular season, the Raiders will play 10 games in the Pacific Time Zone, three games in the Eastern Time Zone, two games in the Central Time Zone and two games in the Mountain Time Zone.
- The Raiders have played more road games in GEHA Field at Arrowhead Stadium than in any other stadium, followed by Empower Field at Mile High.

2026 SCHEDULE NOTES



AFC WEST

- The Broncos finished 14-3 and won the AFC West crown for the first time since 2015, followed by the club's first appearance in the AFC Championship since 2015.
- The Raiders finished 1-5 against the AFC West in 2025, earning their first division win since 2023. Before 2024, the Raiders finished 3-3 or better against the AFC West in five-straight seasons (2019-23).
- Since divisional realignment in 2002, the Raiders have posted a winning record in the AFC West four times: 4-2 in 2002, 6-0 in 2010, 4-2 in 2020 and 4-2 in 2023.



AFC EAST

- The Raiders are 19-29-0 (.396) against the AFC East in the regular season since the division was established in 2002. The Raiders hold an all-time record of 81-76-4 (.516) against teams currently in the AFC East.
- The Silver and Black lead the all-time series against the Jets (25-18-2) and the Bills (21-20), but trail the Patriots (17-18-1) and Dolphins (18-20-1).
- Las Vegas last played the entire AFC East in 2023 and went 2-2, defeating the Patriots at home in Week 6, 21-17 and the Jets at home in Week 10, 16-12.
- The Raiders have defeated the Patriots in three-straight meetings dating back to 2022 and have beaten the Jets in four of the last five matchups, dating back to 2015.



AFC NORTH

- Las Vegas owns a 16-11 (.593) all-time record against Cleveland in the regular season, and will face the Browns for the third consecutive season.
- The Raiders have won five of the last six matchups against the Browns, dating back to 2015, the last win over Cleveland was a 20-16 win in Week 4 of 2024.
- The Raiders are 54-45 (.545) overall against teams in the AFC North.



AFC SOUTH

- Las Vegas owns a 31-22 (.585) all-time series record against the Titans, including 27-22 in the regular season and 4-0 in the postseason.
- The Silver and Black have won four of the last six matchups against the Titans dating back to 2015.
- The Raiders are 47-48 (.495) all-time against teams in the AFC South.



NFC WEST

- The Raiders are 50-46 (.521) all-time against teams in the NFC West. The Silver and Black lead the all-time series against the Seahawks (29-25) and Cardinals (6-5), tied with the Rams (8-8) and owns a 7-8 record against the 49ers.
- Las Vegas last faced the division in 2022, finishing 1-3 against the NFC West, defeating the Seahawks (40-34) in overtime.



NFC SOUTH

- Las Vegas leads the all-time series against the Saints, 8-7-1 (.531) and have won three of the last four matchups, including a 25-10 win in New Orleans in Week 17 of 2024.
- The Raiders are 26-24-1 (.520) all-time against teams in the NFC South.

- The Raiders are 143-141-3 (.503) all-time in preseason contests.
- The Silver and Black will host the Arizona Cardinals in the first preseason game of 2026. The Raiders have played the Cardinals 18 times in the preseason and hold a 9-9 (.500) record in those preseason games.
- The Raiders will travel to Houston to face the Texans for their second preseason game. This will be the seventh total trip to NRG Stadium for the Silver and Black since it opened in 2002 - the second time for a preseason game. The Raiders own an 0-1 record against the Texans in the preseason.
- The Raiders will host the San Francisco 49ers in the third preseason game in 2026. This matchup will be the 44th meeting between the two teams in the preseason dating back to 1970. The Raiders currently hold a 20-22-1 (.477) overall record in preseason matchups against the 49ers.
